Defending WCHA Champion Denver Wins at UM to Take Over First Place; North Dakota Downs UAA, Sioux Just One Point Back; UNO, SCSU, MSU Post Friday Victories; MTU, BSU Play to Tie Three Points Separate Top Four; Nebraska Omaha Upends Visiting Badgers Before Record Crowd; St. Cloud State Win Big at UMD; Minnesota State Triumphs on Road at CC

MADISON, Wis. – Defending WCHA regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion Denver, showing just two losses in the last 19 games (14-2-3) dating to Nov. 6, is back in sole possession of first place, albeit one point, after a 2-1 conference road victory at Minnesota on Friday (Feb. 11) evening. The Pioneers (18-6-5, 14-4-3 WCHA) have 31 points in 21 league games. Denver and Minnesota (11-12-4, 8-10-3 WCHA) will conclude their two-game regular season series on Saturday at 5:07 pm CT at Mariucci Arena.

Hot on DU's heels is North Dakota. The host Sioux won 6-1 over Alaska Anchorage on Friday night to become the WCHA's first 20-game winner this season and they are just one point back in second. UND (20-8-2, 15-6-0 WCHA) and the Seawolves (10-14-3, 9-12-2 WCHA) will conclude their two-game season set on Saturday at 7:07 pm CT at Ralph Engelstad Arena.

Closing to within three points of first place through games of Feb. 11 was first-year WCHA member Nebraska Omaha, after the Mavericks skated past visiting Wisconsin 4-1 on Friday evening before a crowd of 15,137, the largest to see a UNO game in school history. Nebraska Omaha (17-10-2, 13-6-2 WCHA) and Wisconsin (19-9-3, 11-8-2 WCHA) will play again Saturday evening at Qwest Center Omaha, with puck drop set for 7:07 pm CT.

Two other clubs – St. Cloud State and Minnesota State – posted impressive league road victories on Friday night to keep their hopes for an upper division finish alive, with the Huskies powering past Minnesota Duluth 8-2 and the Mavericks winning 5-1 at Colorado College. Both teams are just two points out of sixth place. The Huskies (12-14-3, 8-11-2 WCHA) and Bulldogs (18-6-4, 13-5-3 WCHA) will face-off at 7:07 pm CT at AMSOIL Arena on Saturday night while MSU (13-12-6, 7-12-4) will go up against the host Tigers (16-14-1, 10-11-0 WCHA)

Looking ahead to next weekend – Feb. 18-19 – there will again be a full complement of six WCHA series contested. Denver will host Michigan Tech, North Dakota travels to St. Cloud State, Wisconsin entertains Minnesota, Alaska Anchorage hosts Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota Duluth ventures to Minnesota State, and Colorado College heads to Bemidji State.

Friday, February 11 Highlights

Denver 2 @ Minnesota 1 (WCHA): Linemates Drew Shore and Jason Zucker scored goals, with Zucker netting the game-winner at 4:01 of the third period, and Sam Brittain made 36 saves as the visiting Pioneers prevailed 2-1 over the host Golden Gophers before 9,711 at Mariucci Arena. Center Erik Haula gave UM a 1-0 lead with a goal at 10:02 of the second but DU's penalty-killers were a perfect 6-for-6. DU leads the two-game season series, 1-0.

Alaska Anchorage 1 @ North Dakota 6 (WCHA): A sellout crowd of 11,927 saw the host Sioux receive a goal and two assists from right winger Matt Frattin and a game-winner and an assist from defenseman Jake Marto in a 6-1 triumph over the Seawolves at Ralph Engelstad Arena. Also with multiple-points for UND were wingers Evan Trupp (1g, 1a) and Jason Gregoire (1g, 1a) and defenseman Derrick Forbort. UNO leads the season series, 1-0.

Wisconsin 1 @ Nebraska Omaha 4 (WCHA): A school record crowd of 15,137 at Qwest Center Omaha watched the host Mavericks claim a 4-1 victory over the Badgers behind a goal and an assist each from centers Alex Hudson and Joey Martin and 31 stops from John Faulkner in nets. The UW took a 1-0 lead on a goal from Jordy Murray at 14:54 of the first. Netting the winner for UNO was left winger Johnnie Seafoss at 2:43 of the second. UNO leads the season series, 1-0.

St. Cloud State 8 @ Minnesota Duluth 2 (WCHA): 14 players had points, with winger Ben Hanowski (2g, 1a), defenseman Nick Jensen (1g, 2a) and center Garrett Roe (3a) leading the way, as visiting SCSU powered past the host Bulldogs 8-2 before 6,530 at AMSOIL Arena. The Huskies, who trailed 1-0 and 2-1 in the first, scored seven unanswered goals and hit on 3-of-6 power-plays to take a 1-0 lead in the season series.

Minnesota State 5 @ Colorado College 1 (WCHA): The line of LW Michael Dorr (1g, 1a), C Andrew Sackrison (2a) and RW Eriah Hayes (2g) provided the offense, with Dorr scoring the game-winner on a power-play at 0:42 of period two, and Austin Lee stopped 21 of 22 shots on goal to lead the visiting Mavericks to a 5-1 triumph over the Tigers before 6,432 at the World Arena. MSU hit on 2-of-4 power-play attempts while blanking CC on all four of theirs to take a 2-1 lead in the four-game regular season series. Tallying for the Tigers early in the third was winger William Rapuzzi.

Bemidji State 2 @ Michigan Tech 2 ot (WCHA): Right winger Milos Gordic scored at 7:13 of the third period to give the host Huskies a 2-1 lead before Beavers' center Aaron MacLeod netted the game-tying goal at 10:16 as the two clubs played to a 2-2 (ot) tie before a Winter Carnival crowd of 2,572 at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena. Neither team could capitalize with the man-advantage, as Tech was 0-of-5 and BSU was 0-of-3. Right winger Ian Lowe scored the game's first goal for Bemidji State at 16:24 of the first with Huskies' center Patrick McCadden knotting the score at 1-1 with an unassisted marker at 8:42 of period two.
