Six WCHA Series Upcoming for Feb. 18-19; It's UND at SCSU, MTU at DU, UMD at MSU, UNO at UAA, UM at UW, CC at BSU; North Dakota Regains First Place, Clinches Home Playoff Berth

Current Top Four Separated by Two Points; 10 Teams in Hunt for Last Five First Round Home Playoff Slots; Sioux, UNO Mavericks Post Feb. 11-12 Sweeps ... Dean Blais Marks 300th Win; St. Cloud State, Bemidji State Gain Three Points on Road; No. 2 UND Leads Group of Six WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 National Poll ... MADISON, Wis. – Another full complement of Western Collegiate Hockey Association match ups is on tap this Friday (Feb. 18) and Saturday (Feb. 19) as pursuit of the regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup and a top six finish in the final standings continues in earnest with three weeks remaining. The six two-game sets have No. 2-ranked North Dakota at St. Cloud State, No. 4-ranked Denver hosting Michigan Tech, No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth traveling to Minnesota State, No. 13-ranked Nebraska Omaha visiting Alaska Anchorage, No. 12-ranked Wisconsin hosting Minnesota and No. 18 Colorado College heading to Bemidji State. Four of those series – DU vs MTU, UMD at MSU, UNO at UAA and CC at BSU – will be the only head-to-head match ups of the regular season between the respective opponents.

League-leading and pre-season favorite North Dakota (21-8-2, 16-6-0 WCHA) will hit the road for a two-game set at St. Cloud State (12-14-4, 8-11-3 WCHA), with face-offs at the National Hockey Center (5,371) at 7:07 pm CT both evenings. The Sioux, who swept the Huskies in Grand Forks back on Dec. 3-4 by 3-1 and 6-2

scores, have regained first place by one point while the Huskies remain in contention for an upper division, or top six, finish. UND swept visiting Alaska Anchorage last weekend 6-1 and 3-1 while SCSU took an impressive three of four points at UMD with a 8-2 win and 3-3 (ot) draw.

Defending WCHA champion and second place Denver (18-7-5, 14-5-3 WCHA) returns home to Magness Arena (6,026) to take on Michigan Tech (3-23-4, 1-19-2 WCHA) on Friday at 7:37 pm MT and Saturday at 7:07 pm MT. The Pioneers split at Minnesota on Feb. 11-12, winning 2-1 in game one and falling 7-3 in game two while the Huskies tied 2-2 (ot) and lost 1-0 at home to Bemidji State.

Minnesota Duluth (18-6-5, 13-5-4 WCHA), tied for third this week, ventures out to play Minnesota State (13-13-6, 7-13-4 WCHA) at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato, with puck drops at 7:37 pm CT Friday and 7:07 pm CT Saturday. The Mavericks also stayed in contention for a home playoff berth by splitting their league series at Colorado College on Feb. 11-12, winning 5-1 and losing 2-1.

First-year WCHA member Nebraska Omaha (18-10-2, 14-6-2 WCHA), tied for third with UMD but just two points out of first place, will head northwest for a first-time conference series against Alaska Anchorage (10-15-3, 9-13-2 WCHA) at Sullivan Arena (6,251). Face-offs are at 7:07 pm AT both Friday and Saturday. The Mavericks won a big series against Wisconsin last weekend in Omaha by scores of 4-1 and 4-3 and drawing a program-record 15,137 for the Feb. 11 contest.

In Madison, Wisconsin (19-10-3, 11-9-2 WCHA) will entertain arch-rival Minnesota (12-12-4, 9-10-3 WCHA) at the Kohl Center (15,325) at 7:10 pm CT Friday evening and 8:07 pm CT on Saturday night. The Badgers took three points from the Golden Gophers at Mariucci Arena back on Nov. 5-6, winning 6-0 before a 3-3 (ot) tie. The UW lost twice at Nebraska Omaha last weekend (1-4 and 3-4) while UM split with visiting Denver (1-2, 7-3). Wisconsin has a three-point advantage on Minnesota in the standings.

And up at the new Sanford Center (4,258) in Bemidji, Bemidji State (11-14-3, 7-12-3 WCHA) will entertain Colorado College (17-14-1, 11-11-0 WCHA) on Friday night at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The Beavers tied (2-2 ot) and won (1-0) at MTU on Feb. 11-12 while the Tigers split with visiting Minnesota State, 1-5 and 2-1.

This week's WCHA standings show North Dakota in first place with 32 points in 22 conference games played. Denver is second with 31 points in 22 games, and Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska Omaha are tied for third – both with 30 points in 22 games. Standing in fifth is Wisconsin with 24 points in 22 games, followed by Colorado College in sixth with 22 points in 22 games, and Minnesota in seventh with 21 points in 22 games. Alaska Anchorage is currently eighth with 20 points in 24 games, St. Cloud State is ninth with 19 points in 22 games, Minnesota State is 10th with 18 points in 24 games, Bemidji State is 11th with 17 points in 22 games and Michigan Tech is 12th with four points in 22 games.

Outside the WCHA, Alaska Anchorage will play a home-and-home set with Alaska Fairbanks for the Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup. Minnesota State will be idle.

In this week's (Feb. 14, 2011) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA again has six member teams ranked among the nation's top 20. League-leading North Dakota is No. 2, defending WCHA champion Denver is No. 4, Minnesota Duluth is No. 5, Wisconsin is No. 12, Nebraska Omaha is No. 13 and Colorado College is No. 18. Also receiving votes in the poll this week was Minnesota.

In this week's (Feb. 14, 2011) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, North Dakota is No. 2, Denver is No. 4, Minnesota Duluth is at No. 6, Nebraska Omaha is No. 12 and Wisconsin is No. 13.

Through games of Feb. 7, the 12 WCHA men's member teams own a collective 50-24-12 record in games vs other Div. 1 clubs this season for a .651 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 27-10-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-8-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the four other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 6-2-0 (.750) vs independents.

Team records in non-conference play are: Alaska Anchorage (1-1-0), Bemidji State (4-2-0), Colorado College (5-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan Tech (2-4-2), Minnesota (3-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (5-0-1), Minnesota State (6-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (4-2-1), St. Cloud State (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (8-1-1).

WCHA Announces Record Group of 90 Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes for 2010-11 Sixth Annual Class Includes 30 Repeat Honorees

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair, women's league) today (Feb. 10, 2010) announced that a total of 90 men's and women's student-athletes make up the sixth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients. Over the first six

years of the award, there have now been 414 honorees representing all 12 men's member and all eight women's member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 80 in 2009-10.

The prestigious WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

"The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is both thrilled and exceptionally proud to announce this group of men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes for the 2010-11 season," said WCHA Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair – women's league) in a joint statement.

"This annual announcement of our Scholar-Athletes has become one of the highlights for the entire Western Collegiate Hockey Association family of student-athletes, coaches and administrators and gives us an opportunity to showcase the fact that along with being great athletes on the ice, these honorees are truly exceptional students off the ice. The rigorous classroom schedules they maintain, as well as their intense commitments to their sport, are most impressive and to be able to achieve what they have is inspiring to all of us. Together, they represent the very best in collegiate athletics."

Thirty (30) of this season's 90 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including a four-time recipient and 11 three-time winners. Earning the distinguished honor for the fourth time is North Dakota's Chay Genoway (2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11), who becomes only the third student-athlete to do so. The two other four-time recipients have been Scott McCulloch of Colorado College (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09) and Jenna Hewitt of Minnesota State (2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10).

WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha

All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and



honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League–WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will host WCHA newcomer Nebraska Omaha for the first meeting between the teams since 2006-07 and just the second time ever. The series will take place on Feb. 18-19 at the Sullivan Arena. The Seawolves and Mavericks met on Oct. 14, 2006 at the Nye Frontier Classic and skated to a 2-2 tie.
- UAA currently holds a season-high four-game home streak after sweeping Colorado College on Jan. 14-15 and Michigan Tech on Feb. 4-5.
- The Seawolves will face UNO after being swept for the third time of the season with 6-1 and 3-1 losses to then No.5-ranked North Dakota at the Ralph Engelstad Arena. UAA has also been swept by Minnesota Duluth and Denver this season.
- With the losses, the Seawolves dropped from a two-way tie with CC in the WCHA standings to sole ownership of No. 8. UAA has four conference games remaining, including the UNO series. Following the UNO series, UAA will see in-state rival Alaska Fairbanks on Feb. 25-26 in a home-and-away series before facing Minnesota State on the road on March 4-5.
- In the series against UND, the Seawolves only allowed one power-play tally in nine attempts by the Sioux. UAA has kept opponents scoreless on the power-play in seven of the last 11 games and have only allowed four PPG in that span. To date, UAA is 102/125 on the penalty-kill (81.6%).
- Last Saturday at UND, the Seawolves surrendered 43 shots – the third time they have allowed 40+ shots on net. UAA is 1-2-0 when doing so. The most shots UAA has placed on net was 36 on Nov. 26 against CC. The Seawolves are 3-2-1 when placing 30+ on net.
- Individually, freshman F Matt Bailey was the only Seawolf to score against UND. Bailey's 10 goals this season are the most for a UAA freshman since Paul Crowder and Josh Lunden netted 11 in 2006-07. The rookie is currently tied for No. 17 with Keith Morris (1989-90) and Cary Fisher (1986-87). His 19 points rank him second for UAA and tied for 8th for WCHA freshmen.
- Freshman forward Jordan Kwas missed his first game of the season last Friday night with an illness, while classmate Justin Kirchhevel dressed in his fifth collegiate game and for the first time since Dec. 11 against Denver.
- Last Friday, Chris Kamal made his fourth straight start in nets and now owns a 4-4-1 record on the season. On Saturday, Rob Gunderson dressed between the pipes for the first time since Jan. 28 for a 6-11-2 mark on the season.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State men's ice hockey team is coming out of a three-point weekend at Michigan Tech. The Beavers battled back to gain a 2-2 tie last Friday and captured the Winter Carnival championship with a 1-0 victory last Saturday afternoon.
- The three-point weekend marks just the second three-point road series of the season for BSU. The Beavers also traveled to then-No. 10 Nebraska Omaha Jan. 14-15 and garnered a 2-2 tie and a 3-2 victory with both games being extended to overtime.
- The win by the Beavers last Saturday stood as the first victory by the visiting team in the history of the series. BSU also gained control of the all-time series with the Huskies, 3-2-1.
- Ian Lowe scored the Beavers' first goal of the series at MTU last Friday. His goal gave him 10 for the season marking the second straight season the senior forward has collected a double-digit goal scoring total.
- Sophomore Aaron McLeod netted the Beavers' game-tying goal late in the third period last Friday. It was the third of his career, matching his 2009-10 total. It also stood as his first collegiate game-tying goal of his career.
- The BSU blueline accounted for three assists Friday. The last time BSU defensive corps contributed three points in a game was a Jan. 7 win at Alabama-Huntsville. The BSU "D" has contributed at least a point in nine of the Beavers' last 11 games and has averaged 1.81 points per game (1-19=20) during that stretch.
- BSU now has eight overtime games this season and is 2-3-3 in those contests. Twenty-eight games into the 2010-11 campaign, the Beavers have already matched its 2009-10 OT total (8). BSU has played more OT games only one season since making the jump to NCAA Division I for the 1999-2000 season. In 2002-03 the Beavers played 15 OT contests and in 2004-05 and 2009-10 the team played in eight overtime contests.

- BSU's victory last Saturday stands as just the sixth 1-0 in the history of the program and is the first since scoring the only goal of the game Dec. 1, 2006 to defeat Wayne State University.
- Jordan George scored the game-winner last Saturday, breaking the 0-0 deadlock with just 1:33 to play. The game-winner stood as his team-leading third of the season. He was named Winter Carnival MVP. George also appeared in the scoring summary alone. Not only did he net the game's only goal, it was scored unassisted leaving him in the box score with the only point of the game – marking the only time in BSU's Division I history that the team has finished a game with a single, unassisted goal.
- Goaltender Dan Bakala had another stellar performance between the pipes last weekend. The junior backstopped the Beavers to a three-point WCHA road weekend posting a 1-0-0 record as the goaltender of decision each game. A night after making 27 saves in a BSU overtime 2-2 tie, he turned away 23 shots to record his sixth collegiate shut out in a 1-0 victory. In addition, Bakala was key to the BSU penalty-kill unit that snuffed out all eight of MTU's power-play opportunities. Bakala finished the weekend with two goals allowed in 125:00 between the pipes. He totaled 50 saves, while posting a .962 save percentage and a 0.96 goals-against average.
- Following a pair of power-play shut outs by a BSU penalty-kill unit that held MTU scoreless on five man-advantage opportunities last Friday and three more Saturday, the unit has now played back-to-back league series without allowing a power-play goal. The last time BSU conceded a power-play marker was a second period goal scored by St. Cloud State's David Eddy Jan. 22 – a streak spanning five games, 19 man-advantages and 38:19 of penalty time.
- The Beavers have allowed just three man-advantage goals in their last eight games and 37 opponent chances (.919). The unit has now held opponents scoreless on 109-of-131 opponent man-advantage opportunities this season (.832) and ranks fourth in the WCHA at 83.6% during league play.
- BSU out shot the Huskies in each game of last weekend's series. Friday's 34-shot output marked the first time in seven games the team had out shot its opponent – a streak stretching back to Jan. 8 when the Beavers were defeated 4-3 at Alabama-Huntsville. BSU has been out shot in 17 of its 28 games in 2010-11 for a 806-713 differential in total shots. BSU has been out shot 653-533 in WCHA play.
- This weekend the Beavers return to the Sanford Center to host Colorado College in the Tigers' first-ever visit to Bemidji, Minn. In a series that got its start just over 10 years ago, CC holds a 3-1-0 lead over the Beavers.
- The last time BSU and CC met was a single game match up Jan. 18, 2008 in Colorado. The Tigers edged BSU 5-4 to extend its winning streak in the series to two games.

Tigers

Colorado College

- The Tigers have split with three consecutive WCHA opponents – North Dakota, Denver and Minnesota State – since sweeping a non-league series against the University of Alabama-Huntsville the weekend of Jan. 21-22.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson has scored a team-leading five game-winning goals this season after his 17th tally overall midway through the third period last Saturday lifted CC to its 2-1 come-from-behind victory over the Mavericks.
- With an assist on Johnson's red lighter, freshman defenseman Eamonn McDermott became the 19th different Colorado College player to factor in on a game winner in 2010-11.
- Freshman winger Dakota Eveland has helped set up four GWG after also earning an assist on Johnson's tally.
- Sophomore forward Scott Winkler, who sat out 18 outings earlier this season while recuperating from an injury, collected an assist in both games last weekend and now has recorded six points (2g, 4a) in his last seven appearances. One of just two NHL draft picks on this year's roster, Winkler was a third-round selection of the Dallas Stars in 2008.
- Last Friday, when CC averted being shut out thanks to sophomore winger William Rapuzzi's goal at 1:46 of the final frame, marked the fourth time this season that Rapuzzi has scored in the opening two and a half minutes of period. The previous three occasions – against Alaska Anchorage (1:33) on Oct. 15, Minnesota State (2:27) on Oct. 22, and Alabama-Huntsville (2:07) on Jan. 21, all occurred in the first period.
- The Tigers played both games against MSU last weekend with neither freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz nor sophomore center Rylan Schwartz in the lineup. It was the first time this season that they were missing both brothers, who are

recovering from injuries, at the same time.

- Last weekend's split gave Colorado College a 17-7 all-time record on its home ice against the Mavericks.
- CC has gone five consecutive games without scoring a power-play goal, its longest drought of the season, and has converted just twice in 33 opportunities (.061) over the course of its last seven outings.
- Conversely, the Tigers have allowed their opponents to cash in on seven of 22 chances (.318) in their last five games after Minnesota State went 3-for-5 last weekend.
- CC freshmen collectively have accounted for 84 points (32g, 52a) so far in '10-11. Jaden Schwartz, who is expected to start practicing with the team again this week, leads the pack of first-year players with 26 points (15g, 11a) in just 17 appearances. The Tigers have gone 8-7 in 15 games without Schwartz, a first-round draft choice of the St. Louis Blues last summer.
- Colorado College, which remains undefeated (15-0-1) this season when leading at the end of two periods, is winless (0-13) when trailing after 40 minutes of play.
- Last Saturday marked just the fourth time this campaign (4-12) that CC has won after allowing its opponent to score the first goal of a game. The Tigers are 13-2-1 when they've struck first in a contest.

Pioneers University of Denver

- No. 4-ranked Denver (18-7-5, 14-5-3 WCHA) hosts Michigan Tech (3-23-4, 1-19-2 WCHA) in a two-game WCHA series on Feb. 18-19.
- Denver is second in the WCHA with 31 points, while Michigan Tech is 12th with four points.
- The Pioneers are tied for fourth with Merrimack in the latest PairWise Rankings.
- The Pioneers need one point to clinch home ice for the WCHA Playoffs for the eighth consecutive season.
- DU owns a 114-81-18 advantage against Michigan Tech in the all-time series that began in 1951. The Pioneers sport a 76-26-10 mark against the Huskies in Denver, including a 13-game unbeaten streak (12-0-1) at Magness Arena. DU owns an eight-game winning streak against Michigan Tech, outscoring the Huskies 35-13 during the streak.
- Denver is led in scoring by Drew Shore (17-17=34), Jason Zucker (18-13=31) and Anthony Maiani (7-22=29). Zucker leads the WCHA in league goal scoring (18) and points (29) in 22 games, while Shore is tied for fourth with 25 points (10g, 15a). Shore is tied for ninth with 10 goals each during league play. Shore is tied for eighth in WCHA scoring for all games and Zucker is tied for second in goals and tied for 12th in points.
- Freshman Sam Brittain (13-5-5, 2.23 GAA, .923 Sv%) and sophomore Adam Murray (5-2-0, 3.68 GAA, .874 Sv%) have split the five of the last six weekend series in nets for Denver. Brittain ranks third in the WCHA in save percentage and winning percentage and fourth in goals-against average.
- DU has 10 players with 10 or more points.
- The Pioneers lead the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 85.4% and rank fourth on the power-play at 20%. DU has recorded at least one win against its eight WCHA opponents.
- Senior captain Kyle Ostrow (10-12=22) missed the Minnesota series after undergoing vascular surgery in the lower abdominal area on Friday in Minneapolis. Ostrow, who may return to the DU lineup on March 4, has a career-best, eight-game point streak and is one point shy of joining the Pioneer Century Club for 100-point scorers.
- Zucker has seven points (2g, 5a) during his five-game point streak, while Drew Shore has six points (3g, 3a) during his four-game point streak.
- David Makowski, who leads WCHA rookie blueliners with 21 points (4g, 17a), will miss this Friday's game against Michigan Tech after receiving a five-minute major and 10-minute game disqualification for fighting at 8:16 of the third period at Minnesota on Feb. 12.
- Maiani is Denver's current career scoring leader with 119 points (33g, 86a) in 147 games, which ranks 53rd on DU's all-time scoring list.
- DU is 12-0-1 when scoring four or more goals and 16-0-3 when tied or leading after two periods.
- DU travels to Nebraska Omaha on Feb. 25-26 and closes out the regular-season against St. Cloud State on March 4-5.

Huskies Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will travel to the Mile High state for a pair of league games against Denver this weekend (Feb. 18-19).
- The Huskies are 82-115-18 all-time against the Pioneers and 30-79-11 vs. DU in Denver. The last six meetings between the two schools have been played at Magness Arena. The last time the Huskies hosted the Pioneers in Houghton was Dec. 6, 2008.
- Last weekend (Feb. 11-12) Tech earned one point at home against Bemidji State with a 2-2 tie last Friday night. The Huskies held the Beavers 0-5 on the power-play for the weekend.
- Patrick McCadden's goal vs. the Beavers was his second of the season and his first since Oct. 9th.
- Milos Gordic scored his team-leading 13th goal of the season against the Beavers. He also leads the team in points with 19 (13g, 6a).
- Carl Nielsen and Aaron Pietila each returned to the Huskies' line-up after missing a combined 13 games due to injury.
- The freshman class currently leads the team in goals (33), assists (42) and points (75).
- The following players earned WCHA Scholar-Athlete honors: Jordan Baker, Corson Cramer, Kevin Genoe, Brett Olson and Bennett Royer.
- Tech will be on the road next weekend (Feb. 25-26) as well with a conference series at Minnesota.

Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- The Gophers head to rival Wisconsin this weekend for two pivotal WCHA games against the Badgers. Minnesota is 0-1-1 against Wisconsin this year, but owns an all-time record of 152-84-19 against its border foe.
- The Gophers are in seventh place in the WCHA with 21 points, while the Badgers are in fifth place with 24 points. Sandwiched between them with 22 points is Colorado College, so with a strong performance this weekend the Gophers could propel themselves into a home-ice, top-six position in the league with four regular-season games left. Minnesota is 5-6-3 this season against teams who are ahead of them in the WCHA standings.
- The weekend series also has the potential to pit brother against brother once again. Max Gardiner is a freshman forward for the Gophers, while his brother is a junior defenseman for Wisconsin. Max recorded his first collegiate point (an assist) in a 3-3 tie against Wisconsin on Nov. 6 with his brother on the ice for the Badgers.
- Minnesota dropped a 2-1 decision to No. 4 Denver last Friday, but bounced with a resounding 7-3 win against the Pioneers on Saturday. The seven goals were the second-most that Minnesota has scored this year (9-4 win at Colorado College on Oct. 30) and it was also the first time that Minnesota scored seven goals in a home game since a 7-4 win against Colorado College on Feb. 20, 2010.
- The win against Denver was Minnesota's first against the Pioneers since a 5-2 road triumph on Nov. 21, 2008, ending a six-game losing streak. It was the Gophers' first home win against Denver since a 5-4 victory on Jan. 20, 2007, ending a five-game losing streak.
- Minnesota's seven goals were the most they scored against Denver since an 8-5 home win against the Pioneers on March 1, 2003.
- The Gophers scored three goals in both the first and second periods against Denver. It was the fourth time this year that the Gophers tallied three goals in the first 20 minutes (ties the most goals scored in a first period this year) and it was the second time that Minnesota scored three goals in the second period (scored four goals in second period at Colorado College on Oct. 30).
- The Gophers had seven different players score a goal against Denver last weekend. Minnesota had eight goal scorers in its 9-4 win at Colorado College earlier this season. Taylor Matson, Jacob Cepis, Pat White and Cade Fairchild scored against Denver on Saturday and also registered a goal in the rout against Colorado College earlier this season.
- Four Gophers ended some pretty significant goalless streaks last Saturday. Taylor Matson scored his first goal in 14 games, while Pat White's tally was his first in 13 games. Nick Bjugstad scored his first goal in 10 games, and Jacob Cepis ended an eight-game drought without a goal.
- Senior defenseman Cade Fairchild had four points (1g, 3a) last Saturday for his second career four-point game. He also had four points (4a) on Nov. 1, 2008, against Minnesota State. His four-point outburst is the most by a defenseman this year and is the third time a Gopher has had four or more points in a game this

season. Nate Condon had five points (2g-3a) and Jacob Cepis (1g-3a) had four in Minnesota's 9-4 victory at Colorado College on Oct. 30.

- Jay Barriball, who did not play against Denver because of a lower-body injury, has played in 150 career games for the Gophers. He earned his 125th career point last Friday at Minnesota-Duluth when he scored his 51st career goal. Barriball's next assist will be the 75th of his career.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- UMD, on the cusp of securing a WCHA home playoff berth for the second time in as many seasons, will engage in its first road activity in a month this Friday and Saturday when the Bulldogs square off with Minnesota State University, Mankato in the lone two regular season meetings between the two clubs.

- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in their eight matchups with MSU and have reeled off six straight wins at the Mavericks' expense (including four one year ago).

- UMD closed out a four-game homestand this past Saturday night by rallying for a 3-3 overtime tie with St. Cloud State after being down by three goals early in the second period. The Bulldogs dropped the series opener 8-2 – a game in which it led 2-1 at one point in the first period before the Huskies racked up seven unanswered goals. It was UMD's most lopsided loss since it fell 7-0 at Minnesota on March 3, 2006.

- Three Bulldogs currently occupy the top five spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts at the moment – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is first with 42 points, senior right winger Justin Fontaine is third (39) and junior left winger Mike Connolly is tied for fifth (36). That line has combined for 42.5% of the team's scoring this winter.

- Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 112 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog, ranks seventh among all NCAA pucksters in total points and is tied for third assists (a WCHA-leading 30). The 2010-11 WCHA Preseason Player of the Year went over the 100-point mark this past December (he now has 120) and joined Justin Fontaine (145) and Mike Connolly (118) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season.

- Jack Connolly will take a seven-game scoring streak (he has three goals and eight assists during that stretch) into Friday night's clash with Minnesota State.

- Fontaine, a two-time All-WCHA second team selection who is a team-leading +19 this season, has moved up to a share of the No. 20 position on UMD's all-time points list and has a shot at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15.

- Mike Connolly, the reigning WCHA Offensive Player of the Week who one week ago racked up six goals (including a school record-tying five on Feb. 5) against Minnesota, needs just four more points to become just the second Bulldog ever (NCAA I era) to open his career with three straight 40-point seasons. Dan Lempe, the school's all-time scoring leader, is the other UMD skater to accomplish that feat (he did it four times between 1976-80) since the Bulldogs joined the NCAA I ranks in 1961-62.

- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 72-48 margin from the second period on this season and have a NCAA-leading five overtime victories to their 2010-11 credit. They have also given up the fewest third-period goals (21) of any WCHA club this season, sharing that honor with Bemidji State.

- After putting the clamps on an eight-game pointless skid at Michigan Tech on Jan. 21, freshman right winger J.T. Brown has picked up points in each of the six outings since, collecting four goals and five assists over that time. Brown, the Hockey Commissioner's Association National Rookie of the Month for October, resides in the No. 4 spot on the WCHA rookie scoring list with 25 points (9g, 16a) in 29 games.

- The Bulldogs have compiled a better record on the road this season (9-2-3 for a .750 winning percentage) than they have at home (9-4-2; .667) and haven't lost in their last five games away from Duluth, going 4-0-1 with consecutive sweeps over Michigan Tech (Jan. 21-22) and Clarkson University (Jan. 3-4). In addition, UMD hasn't given up a goal on the road in the last 124:11, which includes a pair of back-to-back shutouts – a program first for a series – against Michigan Tech (5-0 and 3-0).

- Justin Faulk is currently the third highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and is second among all NCAA freshmen blueliners in total goals as well. In 26 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn. product has collected six goals (five of which have come on the power-play) and 13 assists for

19 points has the second best plus-minus rating (+16) of any 2010-11 Bulldog. Faulk competed with the U.S. at the recent International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships in Buffalo and paced that team's defense in scoring.

- Last Friday's loss to St. Cloud State marked the first time this season the Bulldogs lost a game in which they scored first (they are now 12-1-1 in that situation).

- Redshirted freshman goaltender Aaron Crandall continues to pace the WCHA in winning percentage (.792 off a 9-2-1 record) and is fourth nationally in that same statistical category. In seven career road appearances, redshirted freshman goaltender Aaron Crandall is 5-1-1 with a 1.88 goals-against average and a .928 saves percentage – a noticeable contrast to his home numbers (4-1-0, 3.52 and .862 in seven outings). His counterpart, junior Kenny Reiter, who started both ends of the St. Cloud State series, is fifth among his league brethren in goals-against average (2.36) and has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.600 off a 22-14-4 record, including a 9-4-4 figure this winter) of any NCAA-era Bulldog in team history. He trails only All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) in that department.

- The Bulldogs are now unbeaten in 25 of their last 27 overtime games (11-2-14) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Eleven of UMD's 29 outings have required an extra session this winter, which ties the team single-season record held by the 2006-07 and 2002-03 club) and the Bulldogs are 5-1-5 in those.

- All five of sophomore right winger Mike Seidel's goals thus far in 2010-11 have been registered on the road.

- UMD will head into this weekend's series with Minnesota State armed with the nation's sixth best winning percentage (.724) and the WCHA's second most potent offense (3.45 goals per game).

- Jack Connolly has amassed 12 points (5g, 7a) in just six lifetime games against Minnesota State.

- Junior defenseman Brady Lamb was scratched from Saturday's rematch with St. Cloud State after suffering an injury the previous night.

Mavericks Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State stands 13-13-6 overall, 7-13-4 WCHA after splitting a WCHA road series at #19 Colorado College last weekend (5-1 win and 2-1 loss).

- The Mavericks continue league action this weekend with No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth (18-6-5, 13-5-4 WCHA) coming to Mankato for games Friday (7:37 pm) and Saturday (7:07 pm).

- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 171-195-53 (471).

- MSU's all-time record in 1,399 games played is 723-544-132 (.564).

- Junior goaltender Austin Lee registered his third win of the year when he stopped 21 shots in MSU's 5-1 victory over Colorado College last Friday. His other wins this year have come against UMass-Lowell (Nov. 26) and American International (Jan. 8). Friday's win over CC is his first win over a WCHA opponent since Dec. 4, 2009 when he had 25 saves in a 3-1 win over Minnesota. In his last four appearances, the Bloomington, Minn., native is 2-2-0 with a 1.77 goals-against average and a .934 save percentage. For the season Lee stands 3-2-2 with a 2.53 GAA and .909 save percentage.

- Junior forward Michael Dorr has totalled 8-7=15 in the last 14 games and with 12-13=25 on the season, has moved to the top of MSU's scoring charts. The Roseville, Minn., native leads MSU in goals (12), game-winning goals (3) and shots (110). He's also tied for the team in power-play goals (4).

- Senior defenseman Channing Boe has 7-16=23 in 125 career games and has played in 71 consecutive games played to stand as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. Boe, whose +12 leads the team, got his first career power-play marker in MSU's 2-1 loss at #19 Colorado College last Saturday.

- Senior forward Andrew Sackrisson collected two assists in Friday's 5-1 win at Colorado College and has 5-14=19 in 31 games this year. Sackrisson, who owns 17-35=52 in 118 career games, was fifth-round (124th overall) NHL draftee by St. Louis in 2006. Sackrisson has 2-9=11 in the last 14 games.

- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis ranks second in team scoring with 8-16=24 in 32 games. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 20-73=93 in 144 career games to rank third on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list. Davis, who also ranks as MSU's all-time top-scoring defenseman for MSU's NCAA Division I era (he's 10th overall), is +7 on the year to tie for third on the team.

- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 6-8=14 in his last 19 games played, has 10-55=65 and is +3 in 139 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring and is tied for 12th on MSU's all-time scoring by defensemen list (he's seventh for the school's DI era). Youds is MSU's team-leader in penalty minutes (46). Youds enters this week's series with Minnesota Duluth owing 2-2=4 in the last six games.

- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht, who was +3 and had an assist in last Friday's 5-1 win over 19th-rated Colorado College, has 0-5=5 in the last 11 games. Elbrecht, who has played in all 32 MSU games this year, has 1-6=7 for 2010-11 and his +7 stands tied for third on the team.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes had his first career two-goal game when he scored twice in the third period of MSU's 5-1 win at Colorado College last Friday. Hayes is tied for fifth on the club scoring charts with 9-9=18. He ranks second on the team in shots (105) and is tied for second in goals (9).
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (9), assists (8) and points (17) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who has had three points in a game twice this year, has registered 3-6=9 in the last 14 games.
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, has had at least one point in ten of his last 16 games and during that time he's totalled 5-8=13. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 29-51=80 in 134 career games. His 80 career points ties him with Steven Johns (8-72=80 in 142 GP from 2001-05) and Joel Hanson (32-48=80 in 149 GP from 2004-08) for 18th overall on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has had at least 30 saves in a game eight times this year (out of his 24 games played), stands 10-10-4 for 2010-11 with a 2.91 goals-against average and .906 save percentage. Cook, who has three assists for his two-year MSU career, has 669 saves tie for 18th in the nation for the year.
- Junior forward Adam Mueller has 0-3=3 in the last six games. With 2-7=9 in 31 games this year, the Roseville, Minn., has reached career-highs for assists and points in a season.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has collected 2-5=7 in the last 13 games. Zuck has 5-10=15 in 28 games this year to rank ninth on MSU's scoring charts.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on MSU's roster with at least ten games played not to have a penalty this year. Lehrke, who had an assist in MSU's 5-1 win at Colorado College, has 1-4=5 in 26 games in his rookie season.
- MSU has outshot its opponents by a 1079 to 982 margin on the year. The Mavericks have had at least 40 shots on goal six times and their 33.7 shots per game ranks 12th in the country. MSU's average of 2.97 goals per game ranks 26th in the nation.
- As a group MSU's blueliners rank seventh in the nation in scoring with a 2.19 ppg mark (23-47=70 in 32 games played).

Mavericks

University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO returns to the road this weekend to play Alaska Anchorage. It will be the first meeting of the two schools since October of 2006 and just the second and third meetings all time.
- In the one prior meeting, the two teams skated to a 2-2 tie at the Nye Frontier Classic on Oct. 14, 2006.
- The Mavericks earned their second consecutive series sweep last weekend, beating Wisconsin 4-1 and 4-3 for the first wins over the Badgers in school history. The Mavericks had been 0-5-0 against Wisconsin prior to last weekend.
- UNO has now won four straight games for the first time since winning five straight to start the season. They now have swept five weekend series this year.
- With the wins, the Mavericks improved to 9-4-0 this season against teams ranked in the top 20.
- UNO has now earned wins against all four teams against whom they had played before and never won (Minnesota, St. Cloud State, Colorado College, Wisconsin).
- UNO drew the largest crowd in school history to a home hockey game last Friday (Feb. 11) when 15,137 were on hand to see the Mavericks play Wisconsin. With an attendance of 10,111 the following night, the Mavericks drew their largest combined crowd for a weekend series in school history (25,248). In the last 53 weeks, UNO has drawn five of the eight largest crowds in school history.
- Saturday's 4-3 win over Wisconsin was the 300th career win for UNO head coach Dean Blais (300-141-41).
- Senior Joey Martin had a goal and an assist last weekend to move within one point of 100 for his career. He is poised to become the 12th Maverick to reach that mark.
- With two goals in last Saturday's 4-3 win over Wisconsin, senior Matt Ambroz has now scored 16 goals this season, just one goal away from cracking UNO's top ten list for goals in a season. The last time a UNO player had more than 16 goals was 2007-08 when Mick Lawrence netted 21. Only five players in UNO history have had 20 or more goals in a season.
- The Mavericks spread out the offense last weekend with four players register-

ing three points each. Ambroz and Alex Hudson each had two goals and an assist while Johnnie Searfoss had a goal and two assists, and Bryce Aneloski had three assists.

- Goaltender John Faulkner earned both wins last weekend and how has compiled a career-high 17 wins this season, putting him in a tie for fourth all-time in school history. The UNO record for wins in a season by a goalie is 21 set by Dan Ellis in 2000-01.
- Martin now leads the Mavericks with 31 points. He and defenseman Eric Olimb are tied for the team lead with 22 assists each. Ambroz leads the team with 16 goals, five powerplay goals and a +18 rating. Hudson and Ambroz lead the Mavs with three game-winning goals each. Matt White, Brock Montpetit and Ryan Walters are tied for the UNO freshmen lead with 18 points each. Freshman defenseman Michael Young leads the team with two shorthanded goals. Sophomore defenseman Bryce Aneloski leads the team with 48 blocked shots.
- UNO's top six scorers have all scored 20 or more points, and they are separated by just eight points. Thirteen players have now registered double digits in points.

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

- The first-place Fighting Sioux (21-8-2, 16-6-0 WCHA), with home ice for the first round of the playoffs already clinched, travel to St. Cloud State for their penultimate road trip of the regular season.
- UND swept the Huskies in Grand Forks earlier this season (3-1, 6-2) and hold a 55-29-10 (.638) lead in the all-time series. That includes a 21-16-5 (.560) edge in Grand Forks.
- UND enters the week with a one-point lead over Denver in the race for the MacNaughton Cup, and a two-point lead over third-place Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska Omaha. The Sioux have won a WCHA-best 14 conference championships and are gunning for their second MacNaughton Cup in the past three years.
- UND has clinched home ice for the ninth straight season, the longest active streak in the WCHA.
- With 21 wins on the season, UND has reached the 20-win plateau in each of head coach Dave Hakstol's seven seasons behind the Sioux bench. Hakstol's streak of seven straight 20-win seasons is the second-longest in UND history, behind only John "Gino" Gasparini's 13 in a row (1978-79 to 1990-91).
- UND is coming off of a two-game sweep of Alaska Anchorage, winning 6-1 and 3-1 last weekend in Grand Forks. Senior forward and Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate Matt Frattin led the way in last Friday's 6-1 win with a goal and two assists. Frattin added an assist Saturday for a 4-point weekend. He leads the WCHA with 22 goals. Evan Trupp, Jason Gregoire and Jake Marto each had a goal and an assist Friday. Gregoire and Brett Hextall had a goal and an assist to key Saturday's win.
- UND has outscored its opponents 15-2 during its current three-game winning streak.
- Last Saturday's attendance of 12,090 was the second-largest in Engelstad Arena history and Friday's crowd of 11,927 was the sixth-largest.
- Since returning from a seven-game injury absence, Gregoire has eight goals and 12 points in eight games. He is riding a six-game point streak that is one short of his career high.
- After allowing just one goal in each game against UAA, Dell took over the WCHA goaltending lead (league games only) with a 2.02 goals-against average. Dell, who has started 18 straight games, as an overall GAA of 1.99, the fourth-lowest in UND single-season history. He is the WCHA first goalie to win 20 games this season, and one of only two in the nation.
- UND leads the WCHA in scoring offense (3.71 goals per game) and ranks fifth nationally.
- The Sioux are 11-1-1 this season against unranked teams.
- UND is 16-1-1 when score at least four goals.
- Trupp has reached the scoresheet in seven of his last games and 13 of his last 15. He has a career-high 13 goals and is six points from matching the career-high 34 he had last season.
- Junior forward Mario Lamoureux scored his second goal of the season last Friday against UAA, improving UND's record to 10-0-0 all-time when Lamoureux scores a goal. Lamoureux has enjoyed his greatest offensive production against UND's next opponent, St. Cloud State, with four goals and three assists in seven games.

- The SCSU men's hockey team enjoyed success in its debut at the AMSOIL Arena in Duluth on Feb. 11-12. The Huskies opened the weekend with a huge 8-2 victory over #3 ranked Minnesota Duluth on Feb. 11. To complete the weekend in the Twin Ports, SCSU tallied a 3-3 tie against UMD on Feb. 12.
- The 8-2 win on Feb. 11 marked the most goals scored by the Huskies in a game since an 8-7 win over Minnesota at the WCHA Final Five on March 17, 2006 at the Xcel Center in St. Paul. The game was also the largest margin of victory for the Huskies since a 6-0 win over UAA on Feb. 6, 2010. This was also the most goals and biggest margin of victory over the Bulldogs since an 8-0 win at UMD on Jan. 28, 2000.
- The victory on Feb. 11 snapped a three-game losing streak for the Huskies and it was their 4th win over a nationally-ranked opponent this season.
- SCSU will face a tough road down the stretch in 2010-11, as the Huskies will complete their regular season with games against nationally North Dakota, Wisconsin and Denver. SCSU's rugged finish this season started on Feb. 4-5 with games at nationally-ranked Nebraska Omaha, followed by the games at nationally-ranked Minnesota Duluth on Feb. 11-12.
- Five players posted multi-point nights in the Huskies' 8-2 win on Feb. 11 at UMD. SCSU players with three points in the victory included Ben Hanowski, Oliver Lauridsen, Garrett Roe and Nick Jensen. Roe and Drew LeBlanc are tied for the team lead this season with 11 multi-point games apiece.
- Junior Jared Festler enjoyed a strong weekend at UMD with two power-play goals, one game-winner and one assist to his credit. Festler's game-winner came on the advantage at 19:14 of the first period on Feb. 11. He now has 11 goals this season and leads the Huskies with five power-play goals in 2010-11.
- Senior Garrett Roe scored his 170th career point on Feb. 11. He already owns the team's career assist record with 109, and he is now 13 points away from the team scoring record of 183 points set by Ryan Lasch from 2006-10.

- Sophomore Ben Hanowski notched two goals and one assist on Feb. 11, to help lift the Huskies past #3 UMD. Hanowski has scored five of his 10 goals this season in just two games. He had two vs. UMD on Feb. 11 and three vs. BSU on Nov. 5.
- SCSU likes to play in new rinks. The Huskies are 3-0-1 this season in games played at the new rinks at Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth in 2010-11.
- The Huskies will celebrate HockeyWeekend Across America on Feb. 18-19 with a pair of home dates against North Dakota. University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (19-10-3, 11-9-2 WCHA) returns home for the first time in nearly a month to take on Minnesota (12-12-4, 9-10-3 WCHA) at the Kohl Center. Friday's game is at 7 p.m., while Saturday's is an 8 p.m. start.
- UW looks to win the season series with Minnesota after winning and tying at Mariucci Arena back in November.
- UW trails 85-152-19 in the all-time series, including 50-62-12 in Madison. UW is 9-12-3 against Minnesota at the Kohl Center.
- The Badgers are 13-4-1 at the Kohl Center this season and are on a nine-game home winning streak and 10-game home unbeaten streak. The winning streak is the longest for the Badgers at the Kohl Center and the longest for the team in a single season since the team won 15 straight home games during the 1985-86

season. UW had a 10-game home winning streak that spanned the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons.

- UW was swept at Nebraska Omaha last weekend, the team's first sweep on the road since Oct. 17-18, 2008 at Denver.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
