MADISON, Wis. – With North Dakota, Denver, Minnesota Duluth and first-year league member Nebraska Omaha having now clinched the home-ice advantage for the first round of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association Playoffs, the final two weeks and 11 head-to-head series of the 2010-11 regular campaign will determine the regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion, the remaining two home-ice berths for the league tournament and all six first round playoff match ups.

The second to the last weekend will feature five two-game conference series. On Friday (Feb. 25) and Saturday (Feb. 26), Minnesota will host Michigan Tech, Wisconsin travels to St. Cloud State, Nebraska Omaha entertains Denver and Minnesota Duluth ventures to Colorado College. On Saturday and Sunday (Feb. 27), league-leading North Dakota will host Bemidji State.

The No. 20-ranked Golden Gophers (13-12-5, 10-10-4 WCHA) and MTU Huskies (4-24-4, 2-20-2 WCHA) will face-off at Mariucci Arena (10,000) at 6:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:37 pm CT on Saturday. Minnesota is 2-0-0

against Tech this season, with 6-4 and 4-1 victories in Houghton back on Nov. 19-20, and in hot pursuit of a home playoff berth.

At the National Hockey Center (5,371) on Friday and Saturday, host St. Cloud State (12-15-5, 8-12-4 WCHA) and No. 13-ranked Wisconsin (19-11-4, 11-10-3 WCHA) will hook up at 7:07 pm CT each evening in the only two regular season meetings between the two clubs. The Badgers currently occupy fifth place and are looking to lock-up a post-season home slot while the Huskies are four points back of the sixth spot.

At Qwest Center Omaha (15,595), one of the highlight match ups of the weekend will feature host and No. 12-ranked Nebraska Omaha (19-11-2, 15-7-2 WCHA) against defending WCHA champion and No. 6-ranked Denver (19-8-5, 15-6-3 WCHA) with puck drops at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. With both teams still in the hunt for the championship and this the only two regular season meetings between them, the series takes on added meaning.

Out west, No. 19-ranked Colorado College (17-15-2, 11-12-1 WCHA) will go up against visiting and No. 7-ranked Minnesota Duluth (19-7-5, 14-6-4 WCHA) for the only two times this regular season at the 7,380-seat Colorado Springs World Arena in a 7:37 pm MT Friday encounter and 7:07 pm Saturday contest. The Tigers are seventh in the league standings this week but just one point behind sixth place UM and two points back of fifth place UW. The Bulldogs, meanwhile, are still in contention for the regular season title.

On Saturday and Sunday, first place and No. 1-ranked North Dakota (22-8-3, 17-6-1 WCHA) will entertain Bemidji State (12-14-4, 8-12-4 WCHA) in a pair of 3:37 pm CT matinees at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks. Both teams are sporting five-game unbeaten streaks, with the Sioux at 4-0-1 and the first-year member Beavers at 3-0-2. In the first regular season meetings back on Oct. 15-16, North Dakota won twice by 5-2 scores as BSU opened it's new Sanford Center.

Outside the conference this weekend, Alaska Anchorage (11-16-3) will renew its in-state rivalry with CCHA-member Alaska Fairbanks (13-14-5) in a home-and-home Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup series. Face-offs are Friday at 7:05 pm AT in Fairbanks and Saturday at 7:07 pm AT at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage.

In conference action last weekend – Feb. 18-19 – North Dakota, Minnesota and Bemidji State all posted three-point series. The Sioux tied 3-3 (ot) and won 3-2 at St. Cloud State, the visiting Golden Gophers won 5-2 and tied 3-3 (ot) at Wisconsin, and the host Beavers tied 5-5 (ot) and won 2-1 over Colorado College. The other three WCHA series all ended in splits. In Denver, Michigan Tech upended the No. 4 Pioneers 3-2 last Friday before DU came back with a 5-1 win on Saturday. In Mankato, Minnesota State knocked off No. 5 Minnesota Duluth 3-1 in the series opener with the Bulldogs striking back with a 6-2 decision in game two. And up in Anchorage, the host UAA Seawolves stung No. 13 Nebraska Omaha 3-2 on Feb. 18 before the Mavericks prevailed 4-1 on Feb. 19.

The conference season consists of 28 games per team for a total of 168 contests. Heading into this week there are 22 WCHA games remaining.

This week's WCHA standings show pre-season favorite North Dakota in first place with 35 points in 24 league games, defending champion Denver in second place with 33 points in 24 games, and Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska Omaha deadlocked in third with 32 points in 24 games. Wisconsin stands fifth with 25 points in 24 games, Minnesota is sixth with 24 points in 24 games, Colorado College is seventh with 23 points in 24 games, and Alaska Anchorage stands eighth with 22 points in 26 games. Behind UAA, there is a three-way tie for ninth with 20 points between Bemidji State, St. Cloud State and Minnesota State, although the Beavers and Huskies have played 24 games while the Mavericks have played 26 of their 28. Michigan Tech is 12th with six points in 24 games.

Looking ahead to the final weekend of the regular season – Friday, March 4 and Saturday, March 5 – there will be full slate of six WCHA series. North Dakota travels to Michigan Tech, Colorado College heads to Wisconsin, Nebraska Omaha visits Minnesota Duluth, Bemidji State hosts Minnesota, Minnesota State hosts Alaska Anchorage and Denver entertains St. Cloud State.

In this week's (Feb. 21, 2011) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA has seven member teams ranked among the nation's top 20. North Dakota is No. 1, Denver is No. 6, Minnesota Duluth is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 12, Wisconsin is No. 13, Colorado College is No. 19 and Minnesota is No. 20.

In this week's (Feb. 21, 2011) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, North Dakota is ranked No 1, Denver is No. 6, Minnesota Duluth is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 12 and Wisconsin is No. 14.

Through games of Feb. 21, the 12 WCHA men's member teams own a collective 50-24-12 record in games vs other Div. 1 clubs this season for a .651 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 27-10-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-8-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the four other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 6-2-0 (.750) vs independents.

Team records in non-conference play are: Alaska Anchorage (1-1-0), Bemidji State (4-2-0), Colorado College (5-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan Tech (2-4-2), Minnesota (3-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (5-0-1), Minnesota State (6-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (4-2-1), St. Cloud State (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (8-1-1).

WCHA Announces Record Group of 90 Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes for 2010-11 Sixth Annual Class Includes 30 Repeat Honorees

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair, women's league) announced on Feb. 10, 2011 that a total of 90 men's and women's student-athletes make up the sixth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients. Over the first six years of the award, there have now been 414 honorees representing all 12 men's member and all eight women's member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 80 in 2009-10.

The prestigious WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

"The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is both thrilled and exceptionally proud to announce this group of men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes for the 2010-11 season," said WCHA Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair – women's league) in a joint statement.

"This annual announcement of our Scholar-Athletes has become one of the highlights for the entire Western Collegiate Hockey Association family of student-athletes, coaches and administrators and gives us an opportunity to showcase the fact that along with being great athletes on the ice, these honorees are truly exceptional students off the ice. The rigorous classroom schedules they maintain, as well as their intense commitments to their sport, are most impressive and to be able to achieve what they have is inspiring to all of us. Together, they represent the very best in collegiate athletics."

Thirty (30) of this season's 90 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including a four-time recipient and 11 three-time winners. Earning the distinguished honor for the fourth time is North Dakota's Chay Genoway (2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11), who becomes only the third student-athlete to do so. The two other four-time recipients have been Scott McCulloch of Colorado College (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09) and Jenna Hewitt of Minnesota State (2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10).

All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and



honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League–WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves return to non-conference action when they face in-state rival Alaska Fairbanks of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association for the annual Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup in an away-and-home series on Feb. 25-26. Friday's game will take place at the Carlson Center in Fairbanks at 7:05 p.m., while Saturday's contest will commence at 7:07 p.m. at the Sullivan Arena in Anchorage.
- The Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks won the covenant cup last season, ending UAA's chance at a fourth straight title. The Nanooks won both games in the two-game series, 7-4, 3-2. Overall, UAF leads the cup standings, 8-7. In the all-time series between the teams, UAA leads, 80-50-11. UAA also leads in Anchorage (46-20-5) and in Fairbanks (34-30-6).
- The Seawolves will UAF following a WCHA split with then-No. 12/13 Nebraska Omaha at the Sullivan Arena. UAA won on Feb. 18, 3-2, before dropping a 4-1 game on Feb. 19. With the loss, the Seawolves maintain their No. 8 ranking in the conference with 22 points and just two points out of sixth place Minnesota (24 points) and home-ice advantage for the first round of the playoffs.
- With the 3-2 win on Feb. 18, the Seawolves ran their Sullivan Arena winning streak to five games – their longest such string since winning six straight on home ice from Dec. 4, 1998-Jan. 16, 1999. The win was also UAA first time ever winning five straight WCHA games since joining the league in 1993-94.
- The win was UAA's 10th WCHA victory of the season, marking its most ever under sixth-year head coach Dave Shiyak. The Seawolves still have two WCHA games remaining on March 4-5 at Minnesota State. With 22 league points, UAA is one point shy of tying its highest point total under Shiyak. The Seawolves earned 23 points in 2008-09.
- Over the weekend, the Seawolves kept UNO scoreless on the man-advantage and is now perfect on the penalty-kill in 11 games this season. In the last 14 games, UAA has gone 49/54 on the PK (.91) and haven't allowed multiple PPG since Dec. 15 against Wisconsin.
- With the loss on Feb. 19, UAA is now 4-11-2 against ranked opponents this season. Following the series, UAA has picked up at least one point against all opponents this season except Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota.
- Individually, senior F Tommy Grant scored his team-leading 11th goal of the season and first since Jan. 14 against Colorado College on Friday, followed by his team-leading 14th assist on Saturday. The North Vancouver, B.C., native leads UAA in all three categories (11-14=25).
- Last Friday, freshman F Matt Bailey added an assist, improving his point streak to five games (3-3=6) – tying Grant's team-high six-game point streak from Dec. 3 - Jan. 15 (6-4=10). Bailey missed the final two frames on Saturday night after suffering a knee sprain, breaking his point streak. Bailey 20 points ties him for No. 22 on the all-time single-season freshman list for UAA.
- Freshman G Rob Gunderson (.898sv%, 2.72 gaa) suited up for his second and third straight games over the weekend for a 7-11-2 record. Currently Gunderson's GAA is ranked No. 3 on the all-time single-season UAA list; while his save percentage is ranked No. 8.
- Senior D Luka Vidmar missed his first game of the season on Feb. 19 with a pulled groin.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team garnered three of four points last weekend as it hosted Colorado College for a Western Collegiate Hockey Association series. The Beavers came from behind four times last Friday before the teams settled for a 5-5 tie in overtime. Saturday, a pair of power-play goals in the second period were the difference as BSU posted its first win over the Tigers since Dec. 29, 2006.
- Last Friday's 5-5 deadlock marked the Beavers' ninth overtime game of the season and the six in the team's last nine games.
- Sophomore Jordan George registered the first game-tying goal of his career with just three minutes to play, capping a two-goal comeback and tying the game a 5-5. George has now scored the deciding goal in three of the Beavers' last five games. He scored the game-winner in a 4-1 win at Minnesota State (Feb. 5) and added another in last Saturday's 1-0 victory at Michigan Tech.
- The game marked the first time this season the Beavers have managed a point

when their opponent has scored three or more goals. BSU is now 0-9-1 when allowing at least three goals.

- BSU's five-goal offensive explosion marks its highest goal-scoring output of the season and the most goals in a single game since the Beavers posted 6-1 victory over Niagara nearly a year ago – Feb. 20, 2010.
- Four BSU players posted multi-point games in the series-opener. Ian Lowe led the squad with a goal and matched a career-high with two helpers. Jordan George and Matt Read each added a goal and an assist and Brad Hunt contributed a pair of assists.
- Matt Read now has eight multi-point games this season to lead the Beavers.
- With two assists in the home weekend, defenseman Brad Hunt has now scored 0-12=12 of his 1-16=17 points on home ice. That is over 70 percent.
- After conceding a goal late in the first, BSU potted a pair of unanswered goals in the second and Dan Bakala turned away all 22 CC shots in the final 40:00 to earn the 2-1 victory.
- Jeff Jubinville scored the Beavers' first goal of the weekend, marking his first collegiate point. It was his 14th appearance of the season.
- Jamie MacQueen added his second goal of the weekend late in the second. The lamplighter would stand as his first game-winner of the season.
- Shea Walters and Ryan Cramer each had an assist on each of the Beavers' goals Saturday. The assist output matched a career-best for Cramer.
- Last Saturday's 2-1 victory stands as BSU head Coach Tom Serratore's 175th at BSU. He is 175-142-37 (.547) in 10 seasons as a head coach.
- Three of the Beavers' seven goals versus CC came on the power-play as BSU finished the weekend 3-of-6 on the man-advantage and continue to own the league's most efficient power-play converting 19-for-85 (.224).
- BSU has drawn fewer penalties this season than any team in the league which results in fewer power-play opportunities. The Beavers' 85 is 47 fewer than Minnesota State, which leads the WCHA with 132 power-play opportunities.
- On its current five-game unbeaten streak (3-0-2), the Beavers have garnered eight of 10 league points. The five-game streak is BSU's longest since it was unbeaten in an eight-game string to open the 2009-10 campaign (7-0-1).
- Bemidji State's record in 2010-11 is a lesson in symmetry. The Beavers are 5-7-2 at home and 5-7-2 on the road with a 2-0-0 mark in neutral play. The team also has a 4-6-2 mark in league play at home to go with a 4-6-2 WCHA record on the road.
- The Beavers head west to Grand Forks, N.D. this weekend to battle long-time regional foe University of North Dakota in a pair of WCHA matinee match ups. This season BSU is 3-1-0 when playing in the afternoon.
- North Dakota leads the all-time series 19-1-1, while the Beavers are 0-14-1 versus the Fighting Sioux since moving to Division I for the 1999-2000 season. Although seven of the last 12 meetings between the teams have been decided by one goal or fewer, the Beavers enter the weekend, seeking their first victory over UND since Feb. 7, 1970 – a streak spanning 18 games.

Tigers

Colorado College

- The Tigers head into this week's home-ice series against Minnesota Duluth with a 1-3-1 record in their last five outings and 2-4-1 mark in their last seven.
- CC remains winless (0-14) when trailing after two periods in 2010-11.
- Colorado College has scored in the opening three minutes of a period on 16 occasions this season after freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz gave the Tigers a 5-4 lead just 1:09 into the third frame of last Friday's tie at Bemidji State.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson's 18th tally of the season just 2:29 after the opening faceoff last Friday was CC's fourth quickest of the campaign to start a game.
- Schwartz, a first-round pick of the St. Louis Blues in last summer's NHL draft, returned to the lineup last weekend after missing 15 games due to a stint with Team Canada and an injury he suffered at the Junior World Championships. He factored in on half of Colorado College's goals in BSU, scoring one and assisting on a pair.
- Schwartz and the rest of CC's freshman class now have collectively accounted for 88 points (33g, 55a) this season.
- Excluding a 4-3 non-league victory over Alaska Anchorage at the Brice Goal Rush tournament in Fairbanks early in the season, the Tigers are just 7-6-1 against teams below them in the WCHA standings. They're also 0-2 vs. Minnesota, the closest team above them.
- Junior left wing Tim Hall, who scored twice and set up a goal in last Friday's 5-5 tie, has picked up four points (3g, 1a) in the last three games. His first red lighter in the series opener at Bemidji State was the team's first shorthanded tally since

Nov. 26.

- Sophomore forward Scott Winkler, who sat out 18 outings earlier this season while recuperating from an injury, collected an assist in last week's series opener and now has recorded seven points (2g, 5a) in his last nine appearances for CC. One of just two NHL draft picks on this year's roster, Winkler was a third-round selection of the Dallas Stars in 2008.
- Sophomore defenseman Michael Boivin has recorded his season total of 8 points (3g, 5a) in the last 10 games after going his first 10 of the season without one.
- Nineteen different Colorado College players have factored in on at least one game-winning goal in 2010-11. Johnson, who missed his first outing of the season last Saturday after being injured on Friday, has been involved in a team-high six GWG, scoring five and assisting on one.
- Last weekend marked CC's first-ever trip to Bemidji State. The Tigers had played BSU four times previously, all at the Colorado Springs World Arena, and now are 3-2-1 all-time against the Beavers.
- Colorado College had gone five consecutive games without a power play goal, its longest drought of the season, before scoring one in each game last weekend.

Pioneers University of Denver

- Denver (19-8-5, 15-6-3 WCHA) travels to Nebraska Omaha (19-11-2, 15-7-2 WCHA) for a two-game WCHA series on Feb. 25-26.
- Denver is second in the WCHA at 33 points, while Nebraska Omaha is tied for third with Minnesota Duluth at 32 points. The Pioneers are tied for fourth with Merrimack in the latest PairWise Rankings.
- The Pioneers need one win to clinch their 10th straight season with 20 or more wins.
- DU clinched home ice for the WCHA Playoffs for the eighth consecutive season after its 5-1 win and series split against Michigan Tech last weekend.
- The Pioneers are 7-2 all-time against Nebraska Omaha in the series that started in 1997. The Pioneers and Mavericks meet for the first time since Jan. 1, 2009. DU has a seven-game winning streak against UNO, outscoring the Mavericks 32-10 during that span.
- DU is led in scoring by Drew Shore (19-19=38), Jason Zucker (18-16=34) and Anthony Maiani (7-22=29). Zucker leads the WCHA in league goal scoring (18) and points (32) in 24 games, while Shore is tied for third with 29 points (12g, 17a). Shore is tied for third in goals and tied for fourth in WCHA scoring for all games and Zucker is tied for fourth in goals and tied for 11th in points. Shore has 10 points (5g, 5a) during his six-game point streak, while Zucker has 10 points (2g, 8a) during his career-best, seven-game point streak.
- Freshman Sam Brittain (13-6-5, 2.27 GAA, .921 Sv%) and sophomore Adam Murray (6-2-0, 3.88 GAA, .880 Sv%) have split six of the last seven weekend series. Brittain ranks third in the WCHA in save percentage and winning percentage (.646) and fourth in goals-against average.
- DU has 10 players with 11 or more points.
- The Pioneers lead the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 86.2% and rank seventh on the power-play at 19.3%.
- DU has recorded at least one win against its nine WCHA opponents.
- Senior captain Kyle Ostrow (10-12=22) has missed the last four games with a lower abdominal injury. Ostrow, who may return to the DU lineup on March 4, has a career-best, eight-game point streak and is one point shy of joining the Pioneer Century Club for 100-point scorers.
- David Makowski, who leads WCHA rookie blueliners with 23 points (5g, 19a), netted a 180-foot goal against Michigan Tech on Feb. 19. The goal was ESPN's No. 3 play of the night.
- Maiani is Denver's current career scoring leader with 119 points (33g, 86a) in 147 games, which ranks 53rd on DU's all-time scoring list.
- DU is 13-0-1 when scoring four or more goals and 17-0-3 when tied or leading after two periods.
- The Pioneers have allowed the first goal in their last seven games.
- DU is 37-for-39 on the penalty-kill over its last nine games.
- DU players Jesse Martin (24), Dustin Jackson (12), Nick Shore (9), Adam Murray (6), Beau Bennett (5), Chris Knowlton (4), Paul Phillips (4), Kyle Ostrow (4) and John Lee (3) have missed a combined 71 games due to injury. Drew Shore (2) and Jason Zucker (2) missed a combined four games while playing for Team USA at the World Junior Championship, while David Makowski was suspended one game for fighting.
- DU closes out the regular-season against St. Cloud State on March 4-5.

Huskies Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will make its final road trip of the regular season this weekend at WCHA-rival Minnesota. The Gophers swept the two game series earlier in the season in Houghton.
- Tech split at No. 4 Denver last weekend.
- Two of Tech's three goals in last Friday's win were shorthanded. Tech currently ranks tied for fourth in the league with five shorthanded goals.
- Tech allowed just one goal on the power-play in the series with Denver. It was the first power-play goal that Tech had allowed since Feb. 5 at Alaska Anchorage.
- Patrick McCadden scored one goal and added one assist in last Friday's game for the first multi-point game of his career.
- Brad Stebner tallied the first point of his career with an assist in last Friday's win.
- Bryce Reddick scored his first goal of the season last Friday.
- Ryan Furne scored his 10th goal of the season last Saturday for his second goal of the weekend. He currently ranks second on the team in goals with 10.
- Tech was whistled for 18 penalty minutes last Saturday at Denver, the most since it was whistled for 21 Jan. 22nd vs. Minnesota Duluth. The Huskies are the second least penalized team in the WCHA.
- Only six players have played in all 32 games this season for the Huskies.
- Kevin Genoe has played in net in the last seven games for the Huskies.
- Michigan Tech will host North Dakota next weekend in the final series of the regular season.

Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- Minnesota welcomes Michigan Tech to Mariucci Arena for a pair of games this weekend. Friday's contest begins at 6:30 p.m., while Saturday's game begins at 7:30 p.m.
- Saturday is the final home game of the regular season for the Gophers and is also Senior Night. Minnesota will honor seniors Jay Barriball (captain), Mike Hoeffel (assistant captain), Alex Kangas (assistant captain), Jacob Cepis, Cade Fairchild, Kevin Wehrs and Pat White.
- The Gophers are 2-0-0 against Michigan Tech this season, as they won 6-4 on Nov. 19 and 4-1 on Nov. 20 in Houghton, Mich. Minnesota has won five straight against the Huskies and owns a 7-2-1 record between the two teams in the last 10 games. Michigan Tech's last win against Minnesota was a 3-2 overtime decision in Mariucci Arena on Nov. 30, 2007.
- Michigan Tech is the third and final opponent that Minnesota will play two series against in the regular season. The Gophers have already played Minnesota-Duluth and Wisconsin four times each. Minnesota is 1-1-2 (0-1-1 against Minnesota Duluth and 1-0-1 against Wisconsin) in games three and four against opponents this year.
- Minnesota is 3-1-1 against schools from Michigan this year. The Gophers have two wins against Michigan Tech and one win against Michigan. Minnesota tied Ferris State and lost to Michigan State.
- Minnesota beat and tied No. 12 Wisconsin last weekend in Madison. The Gophers are now 5-4-3 against teams ranked in top 12 by USCHO.com this year (rankings at time of game).
- Minnesota outscored Wisconsin 8-5 this past weekend and six different Gophers scored goals. Taylor Matson and Jacob Cepis both scored twice in Madison. Pat White, Mike Hoeffel, Jake Hansen and Wisconsin-native Nate Condon also scored for the Gophers.
- Kent Patterson stopped 36 shots last Friday in a win at Wisconsin and 32 shots in a tie. Patterson has stopped 30 or more shots in 11 games this year and the Gophers are 6-2-3 in those games.
- The Gophers are on a three-game unbeaten streak (2-0-1), which ties their longest unbeaten streak of the season. Minnesota was 3-0-0 from Oct. 24-30 and 2-0-1 from Nov. 6-20.
- Minnesota has scored 15 combined goals in its last three games, all without Jay Barriball (lower-body injury) who is tied for the team lead in goals with Mike Hoeffel with 12. The Gophers scored a combined 16 goals in their previous seven games prior to their recent outburst.
- Minnesota's power-play has been clicking as of late. In the last three games the Gophers have scored six power-play goals in 17 opportunities (35.2%). From Jan. 15-Feb. 11 (six previous games), Minnesota was 2-of-31 (6.4%) with a man-

advantage.

- The Gophers have won 13 games this season and have scored 61 of their 94 goals (64.8%) in those wins. That means Minnesota is averaging 4.69 goals per win this year. Minnesota has scored four or more goals in 10 games this season and is 9-2-0 in those games. They have scored three or more goals in 15 games this year and are 12-2-1 in those games. Minnesota has won only one game this season (2-1 home win against St. Cloud State on Oct. 24) in which they scored less than three goals.
- Minnesota racked up 29 penalty minutes from 13 penalties last Friday but still beat Wisconsin 5-2. Minnesota is 8-3-1 when it takes more penalties than its opponent is 3-1-0 when taking 10 or more penalties.
- Defenseman Cade Fairchild has nine points (3g, 6a) in his last six games. The senior had 11 points (3g, 8a) in his first 23 games of the season. Fairchild now has 68 career assists and is two assists shy of tying Michale Knoke (1979-81) for 17th place all-time in career assists by a defenseman.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- UMD will make its final two regular season road appearances of 2010-11 this Friday and Saturday when the Bulldogs invade Colorado Springs, Colo., to take on Colorado College in the first two meetings of the year between the two clubs.
- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in nine of their last 11 matchups with the Tigers (8-2-1) going back to the start of the 2008-09 season and ousted the Tigers in the opening round of the WCHA playoffs last March in Duluth.
- UMD traded wins with Minnesota State University, Mankato last weekend, following up a 3-1 setback Friday night with a convincing 6-2 triumph the following evening. The Bulldogs outshot the host Mavericks 80-62 on the weekend and set a school record in the opener by putting 27 shots on net in the third period (but failed to score). With Saturday's win, the Bulldogs assured themselves a home WCHA playoff berth for the second time in as many years.
- Three Bulldogs currently occupy the top seven spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts at the moment – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is first with 45 points, senior right winger Justin Fontaine is third (40) and junior left winger Mike Connolly is tied for fourth (38). That line has combined for 41.7% of the team's scoring this winter (123 of 295 points).
- Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 114 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog, ranks fifth among all NCAA pucksters in total points and is second in assists (a WCHA-leading 33). The 2010-11 WCHA Preseason Player of the Year went over the 100-point mark this past December (he now has 123) and joined Justin Fontaine (146) and Mike Connolly (120) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season.
- Jack Connolly will take a career-high nine-game scoring streak (he has three goals and 10 assists during that stretch) into Friday night's clash at Colorado College.
- Fontaine, who is a team-leading +19 this season, is tied for second among his NCAA brethren in power-play goals at the moment with 10. The two-time All-WCHA second team selection has now taken over sole possession of the No. 20 position on UMD's all-time points list and has a shot at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci was the last in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15. Since 2008-09, no current WCHA skater has racked up more points (134) than Fontaine.
- Mike Connolly, who two weekends ago racked up six goals (including a school record-tying five on Feb. 5) against Minnesota, needs just two more points to become just the second Bulldog ever (NCAA I era) to open his career with three straight 40-point seasons. Dan Lempe, the school's all-time scoring leader, is the other UMD skater to accomplish that feat (he did it four times between 1976-80) since the Bulldogs joined the NCAA I ranks in 1961-62.
- The Bulldogs have compiled a better record on the road this season (10-3-3 for a .719 winning percentage) than they have at home (9-4-2; .667) and have been derailed only once in their last seven games away from Duluth, going 5-1-1 with sweeps over Michigan Tech (Jan. 21-22) and Clarkson University (Jan. 3-4).
- After putting the clamps on an eight-game pointless skid at Michigan Tech on Jan. 21, freshman right winger J.T. Brown has picked up points in seven of eight outings since, collecting five goals and six assists over that time. Brown, the Hockey Commissioner's Association National Rookie of the Month for October, resides in the No. 4 spot on the WCHA rookie scoring list with 27 points (11g, 16a) in 31

games.

- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 77-48 margin from the second period on this season and have a NCAA-leading five overtime victories to their 2010-11 credit. They have also given up the fewest third-period goals (21) of any WCHA club this season and only one (to St. Cloud State on Feb. 11) in their last four outings. In addition, UMD is 14-0-1 when it's taken a lead into the final period of play.
- Justin Faulk is currently the third-highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and is second among all NCAA freshmen blueliners in total goals as well. In 27 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn., product has collected six goals (five of which have come on the power-play) and 16 assists (including three this past Saturday night in Mankato) for 22 points and has the second best plus-minus rating (+17) of any 2010-11 Bulldog. Faulk competed with the U.S. at the recent IIHF World Junior Championships in Buffalo and paced that team's defense in scoring.
- The Bulldogs have not been shut out in 81 straight WCHA games since coming up empty against North Dakota (2-0) on March 1, 2008 in Duluth.
- Redshirted freshman goaltender Aaron Crandall, who turned aside 23 of 25 shots in last Saturday's 6-2 in at Minnesota State, continues to pace the WCHA in winning percentage (.808 off a 10-2-1 record) and is fourth nationally in that same statistical category. In eight career road appearances, Crandall is 6-1-1 with a 1.89 goals against average and a .927 saves percentage – a noticeable contrast to his home numbers (4-1-0, 3.52 and .862 in seven outings). His counterpart, junior Kenny Reiter is fifth among his league brethren in goals-against average (2.40) and has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.585 off a 22-15-4 record, including a 9-4-4 figure this winter) of any NCAA-era Bulldog in team history. He trails only All-American Rick Kostl (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) in that department. Reiter has enjoyed more success against Colorado College than any other opponent during his Bulldog career, posting a 5-1-0 record, a 1.97 goals-against average and a .918 saves percentage in six appearances (all starts).
- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 25 of their last 27 overtime games (11-2-14) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Eleven of UMD's 31 outings have required an extra session this winter, which ties the team single-season record held by the 2006-07 and 2002-03 club) and the Bulldogs are 5-1-5 in those.
- All seven of sophomore right winger Mike Seidel's goals thus far in 2010-11 have been registered on the road.
- UMD will head into this weekend's series with Colorado College armed with the nation's sixth best winning percentage (.677) and the WCHA's second most potent offense (3.45 goals per game).
- Travis Oleksuk's 11 goals this season (which is a career high) have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up a WCHA-best six game-winning goals this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man-down, once on a penalty shot and once with the goaltender pulled. Two of his goals thus far have been registered in overtime.
- UMD has lost just once (3-2 to visiting Wisconsin on Jan. 15) in its 14 series rematch games this season, going a 10-1-3.
- Of the 18 goals the senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. Only two other Bulldogs (Mike Connolly with 20 and Jack Connolly with 17) has more. Schmidt, Kenny Reiter, Aaron Crandall and sophomore center Keegan Flaherty were all recipients of a WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award for 2010-11.
- UMD had cashed in on only three of its previous 31 power-play opportunities (9.7%) prior to last Saturday night before going 3-for-9 in its 6-2 triumph at Minnesota State. The still possesses the WCHA's third most efficient power-play (20.8%).
- The Bulldogs' seven-member junior class (which goalie Kenny Reiter) has accrued more points (127) than any other in the country with the exception of Robert Morris (128 points in one more game).

Mavericks Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State stands 14-14-6 overall, 8-14-4 WCHA after splitting a WCHA home series with #5 Minnesota Duluth. The Mavericks claimed a 3-1 win over the Bulldogs before falling 6-2 Saturday.
- The Mavericks are off next weekend before closing out the 2010-11 regular season March 4-5 when Alaska Anchorage visits Mankato for a pair of league contests.
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 172-196-53 (471).

MSU's all-time record in 1,401 games played is 724-545-132 (.564).

- Junior goaltender Austin Lee registered his fourth win of the year when he stopped 40 of 41 shots in MSU's 3-1 victory over #5 Minnesota Duluth last Friday. His other wins this year have come against Colorado College Feb. 11), UMass-Lowell (Nov. 26) and American International (Jan. 8). In his last five appearances, the Bloomington, Minn., native is 3-2-0 with a 1.61 goals-against average and a .946 save percentage. For the season Lee stands 4-3-2 with a 2.37 GAA and .918 save percentage.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht has 0-6=6 in the last 13 games. Elbrecht, who has played in all 34 MSU games this year, has 1-7-8 for 2010-11 and his +8 is third on the team.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes, who had a goal and assist in last Friday's 3-1 win over UMD and then added another goal in Saturday's contest, has 4-1=5 in the last four games. Hayes ranks third on the club scoring charts with 11-10=21. He leads the team in shots (118) and ranks second in goals (11).
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe has tallied 2-1=3 during the last three games. The goals are the first two power-play goals of his four-year MSU career. Boe, who had a goal and an assist in last Friday's 3-1 win over the fifth-rated Bulldogs, scored his second career game-winning goal in the 3-1 win over UMD. His other GWG came in overtime came Feb. 4 when the Mavericks bested Bemidji State, 2-1 at home. Boe has 8-17=25 in 127 career games and has played in 73 consecutive games played to stand as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak.
- Junior forward Michael Dorr has tallied 8-7=15 in the last 16 games and with 12-13=25 on the season, stands tied with Kurt Davis at the top of MSU's scoring charts. The Roseville, Minn., native leads MSU in goals (12) and game-winning goals (3). He's also tied for the team in power-play goals (4) and his 115 shots ranks second.
- Senior forward Andrew Sackrison owns 17-35=52 in 120 career games. A fifth-round (124th overall) NHL draftee by St. Louis in 2006, Sackrison has 2-9=11 in the last 16 games.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis assisted on Channing Boe's game-winning goal in last Friday's 3-1 victory over UMD and is tied for the team scoring with 8-17=25 in 34 games. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 20-74=94 in 146 career games to rank third on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list. Davis, who also ranks as MSU's all-time top-scoring defenseman for MSU's NCAA Division I era (he's 10th overall), is +4 on the year to tie for fourth on the team.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 6-8=14 in his last 21 games played, has 10-55=65 and is +6 in 141 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and is tied for 12th on MSU's all-time scoring by defensemen list (he's seventh for the school's DI era for defensemen).
- Freshman forward Chase Grant has 8-11=19 in 29 games to tie for fourth on MSU's scoring charts. MSU's top-scoring newcomer assisted on Corey Leivermann's goal as the Mavericks upended #5 Minnesota Duluth, 3-1, last Friday.
- Freshman forward Corey Leivermann notched his third goal of the year when he scored MSU's third goal in the 3-1 win over Minnesota Duluth last Friday. Leivermann, who has 3-4=7 in 20 games in his freshman season, ranks 10th on the team in terms of points per game with a .350 mark.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (9), assists (8) and points (17) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who has had three points in a game twice this year, has registered 3-6=9 in the last 16 games.
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, has had at least one point in 11 of his last 18 games and during that time he's tallied 5-9=14. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 29-52=81 in 136 career games. His 81 career points ties him with Peter Holoein (22-59=81 in 144 GP from 1998-2001-05) for 17th overall on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era.
- Sophomore defenseman Evan Mosey assisted on a power play goal by Eriah Hayes last Friday and has 0-3=3 in the last four games. Mosey has 1-5=6 in 20 games this year.
- Junior forward Adam Mueller has 0-3=3 in the last eight games. With 2-7=9 in 33 games this year, the Roseville, Minn., has reached career-highs for assists and points in a season.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who tallied 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has collected 2-6=8 in the last 18 games. Zuck has 5-11=16 in 31 games this year to rank ninth on MSU's scoring charts.
- Junior forward Mike Louwerse, who scored his sixth goal of the season in last Saturday's 6-2 loss to #5 UMD, has 3-1=4 in the last 10 games. Louwerse has 26-23=49 in 106 career games with the Mavericks.
- MSU has outshot its opponents by a 1131 to 1062 margin on the year. The Mavericks have had at least 40 shots on goal six times and their 33.2 shots per game ranks 18th in the country. MSU's average of 2.94 goals per game ranks 27th in the nation.

- As a group MSU's blueliners are tied for ninth in the nation in scoring with a 2.22 ppg mark (24-52--75 in 34 games played).

Mavericks University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO will play its final home series of the regular season this week when it hosts Denver on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 25 and 26.
- The two teams have squared off nine prior times. UNO won the first two meetings during the first year of the program, but the Pioneers have won seven straight including the last meeting on Jan. 1, 2010, a 7-0 victory in Denver.
- The Mavericks have earned a mark of 12-3-1 at home this season. The school record for home wins in a season is 17 set during the 2000-01 season.
- The Mavericks are coming off a split of two games at Alaska Anchorage last weekend. UNO dropped the first game, 3-2 but bounced back for a 4-1 the following night. It was their first win against the Seawolves. The Mavs are now 1-1-1 all-time against UAA.
- With Saturday's win at Anchorage, the Mavericks improved their record to 5-2-1 on Olympic-sized ice.
- UNO has now won five of its last six games and seven of the last ten.
- Senior Joey Martin had a goal for UNO in Friday's 3-2 loss to Alaska Anchorage to become the 12th Maverick to earn 100 career points. He also became the fourth Maverick to score 10 or more goals this year. He added another goal in Saturday's 4-1 win to set a new career high for goals in a season (11).
- Junior center Alex Hudson stretched his point-scoring streak to six games with a goal and an assist in last weekend's split at Alaska Anchorage. He now has three goals and four assists in that time.
- The Mavericks have four players who have registered career highs for points in a season – Martin (33), Matt Ambroz (32), Hudson (28) and Eric Olimb (25).
- With 19 wins overall, the Mavericks are one win away from registering back-to-back 20-win seasons for just the second time in program history. The last time the Mavs turned the trick was 2000-01 and 2001-02.
- Goaltender John Faulkner earned his career-high 18th win this season, putting him fourth all-time in school history. The UNO record for wins in a season by a goalie is 21 set by Dan Ellis in 2000-01.
- With a goal in last Saturday's 4-1 win at Alaska Anchorage, freshman Brock Montpetit became the fifth UNO player to reach 10 or more goals this season. He is also the second freshman to turn the trick behind Matt White who leads all freshmen with 13 goals.
- Martin now leads the Mavericks with 33 points. He and defenseman Eric Olimb are tied for the team lead with 22 assists each. Ambroz leads the team with 16 goals, five powerplay goals and a +20 rating. Hudson and Ambroz lead the Mavs with three game-winning goals each. Matt White leads all UNO freshmen with 20 points. Freshman defenseman Michael Young leads the team with two shorthanded goals. Sophomore defenseman Bryce Anelowski leads the team with 49 blocked shots.
- UNO now has two 30-point scorers for the first time since the 2007-08 season when it had two 40-point scorers and two more who notched 30 or more. UNO has seven players with 20 or more points.

Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

- Top-ranked North Dakota (22-8-3, 17-6-1 WCHA) enters the final two weeks of the regular season with a two-point lead atop the WCHA standings, and is in search of its league-record 15th league title and second in the last three years. The Sioux lead second-place Denver by two points and third-place Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska Omaha by three points.
- UND will host Bemidji State this week in the final regular season home series for the Sioux. The Sioux swept BSU earlier this season, winning twice by identical 5-2 scores (Oct. 15-16) in the first games played in the new Bemidji Regional Event Center. UND is 17-1-1 all-time against the Beavers and have won the last nine meetings. The Sioux are 12-1-1 against BSU in Grand Forks.
- UND most recently took three of four points from its series at St. Cloud State last weekend, tying 3-3 on Friday and winning 3-2 on Saturday.
- Senior forward and Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate Matt Frattin scored twice in last Friday's tie, including the game-tying goal with 3:31 remaining in regulation. The goals were Frattin's WCHA-leading 23rd and 24th of the season.
- Junior forward Brett Hextall scored three goals in the SCSU series, including a two-goal effort in last Saturday's win. All three of Hextall's goals in the series

gave the Sioux the lead. Hextall is now riding a five-game point streak, and has five goals and seven points during that stretch.

- Hextall's linemate, junior Jason Gregoire, is riding a career-long eight-game point streak. He has collected seven goals and 13 points during that time.
- Frattin (97 career points), Trupp (96) and Gregoire (94) are all on the verge of joining UND's 100-point club. Frattin has 17 goals in 17 road and neutral games this season, and seven goals in 16 home games.
- After last weekend's series at SCSU in which the Sioux won and tied, UND is now 10-4-2 on the road this season, including a stellar 9-2-1 mark in the WCHA. Last season the Sioux were 8-7-1 on the road, including a 7-6-1 conference record.
- After enduring a 2-for-20 skid on the power-play over the previous four games, UND went 2-for-6 in Saturday's victory.
- Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell, who won his WCHA-leading 21st game last Saturday night, has started UND's last 20 games. Dell leads the WCHA in goals-against average in both league games (2.06) and all games (2.02).
- During league games, UND leads the WCHA in both scoring offense (3.54 goals per game) and defense (2.33). Overall the Sioux rank first in overall scoring offense (3.67 goals per game) and second in scoring defense (2.39).
- Junior forward Mario Lamoureux is on pace to play in his 100th career game on Saturday. He would become the 10th active Sioux to reach that milestone.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- The Huskies will finish their 2010-11 regular season home schedule on Feb. 25-26 with a pair of home dates at the National Hockey Center against nationally-ranked Wisconsin. This marks the fourth consecutive weekend that the Huskies have played a nationally-ranked team. The tough game stretch for the Huskies started with games at nationally ranked Nebraska Omaha, followed by series against #3 ranked Minnesota Duluth and #2 North Dakota. SCSU will end its regular season with a trip to nationally ranked Denver on March 4-5.
- Junior forward Drew LeBlanc ranked 8th among WCHA players (overall games played) with 37 points this season. He leads the Huskies with 13 goals and 24 assists this winter. In his career, LeBlanc has 83 points as a Husky.
- Senior forward Garrett Roe also ranks first on the team with 24 assists this winter. The Huskies' all-time career assist leader, Roe now has 111 career assists at SCSU. He is now tied for third in the team records with 172 career points along with Tim Hanus (1988-92). Next up on the point ladder for Roe is Jeff Saterdalen, who had 179 points for the Huskies from 1988-92. SCSU's all-time point leader is Ryan Lasch, who accounted for 183 points from 2006-10.
- SCSU will honor its senior class on Feb. 26, when the Huskies host Wisconsin at the National Hockey Center. SCSU seniors this season include Brett Barta, Dan Dunn, Aaron Marvin, Nick Oslund, Nic Rioux, Garrett Roe and Brian Volpei. This group has led the Huskies to two NCAA tournament appearances and two WCHA Final Five appearances.
- The game on Feb. 26 will also mark "Throwback" Jersey night at SCSU, as the Huskies will wear a special retro sweater that harkens back to the uniforms the Huskies wore in the late 1960s. An in-game silent auction will be held on Feb. 26, with the auction winners receiving the game-worn jerseys after the game.
- Freshman forward Cam Reid owns a four-game point streak for the Huskies. He has posted assists in the last four games for the Huskies. Reid ranks third on the team this season with 25 points (8g, 17a) and he leads SCSU's freshmen class in points this season. Reid leads the club with a +10 ranking in 2010-11.
- SCSU's Little Falls connection ranks second on the team in goals scored this season. Junior Jared Festler and sophomore Ben Hanowski, both grads of nearby Little Falls H.S., each ranked second on the team with 11 goals apiece this winter. Festler tops the Huskies with three game-winners and five power-play goals in 2010-11.
- For the second consecutive weekend, SCSU managed to gain a point against one of the nation's top three ranked teams. On Feb. 11-12, the Huskies earned three points against #3 Minnesota Duluth. On Feb. 18, the Huskies scored a 3-3 tie at the NHC against #2 ranked North Dakota.
- Since his return to ice after the holiday break, sophomore forward David Eddy has been a force for the Huskies. In 12 games played this season, Eddy has 6g, 6a and is averaging 1.00 points per game in 2010-11. He scored goals in both games against #2 UND on Feb. 18-19.
- Sophomore Mike Lee owns a 2.85 goals-against average with a .906 save rate this winter. He has posted 701 saves and now has 1,459 saves in his career. He ranks 8th in the team records for career saves, and he ranks second in the team records with an average of 27.53 saves per game.

Badgers

University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (19-11-4, 11-10-3 WCHA) makes its final regular-season road trip of the year when it visits St. Cloud State (12-15-5, 8-12-4 WCHA) on Friday and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT.
- Heading into this weekend, eight of the last 11 games in the series have been played in St. Cloud, Minn.
- The Badgers sit 5-5-2 in WCHA road games this season.
- Wisconsin captured a 5-3 victory in the 2010 NCAA West Regional Final at the Xcel Energy Center to advance to the 2011 NCAA Frozen Four in the last meeting between the Badgers and Huskies. This will mark the 78th and 79th games in the all-time series between the schools. The Badgers have captured the last two meetings in the series, three of the last four contests and five of the last seven meetings. This weekend's games are the only two scheduled this season between the schools. The teams have split the last three regular-season series played in St. Cloud.
- UW Head Coach Mike Eaves served as a St. Cloud State assistant coach for the 1987-88 season.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz, a Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate, has points in eight of his last nine games, including six multi-point games during that stretch, and has points in 26 of Wisconsin's 34 games this season. Schultz scored his 16th goal of the season last Saturday, which is five more than the nation's next closest defenseman and his 44 points and 1.29 points-per-game mark also lead the nation's rear guards. Schultz' 16 goals are tied for fourth on UW's single-season goal-scoring list for defensemen with some household names, including Bob Suter (1978-79), Chris Chelios (1982-83) and Bruce Driver (1982-83). His goal total is three shy of the UW record of 19 set by Sean Hill during the 1990-91 season. Schultz' next goal will move him into fourth all by himself on UW's all-time list. A defenseman has never led Wisconsin in goal scoring for a season, though Schultz is one off the UW lead.
- Freshman forward Jefferson Dahl scored his first career goal as a Badger last Saturday against Minnesota.
- One more goal for junior defenseman Jake Gardiner would give Wisconsin its first season with two defenseman in double figures for goals since the 1989-90 campaign, when Sean Hill (14) and Barry Richter (13) reached the mark. Wisconsin has had just five seasons with at least two defensemen in double figures for goals, including 1974-75 (3), 1976-77 (2), 1982-83 (2), 1984-85 (3) and 1985-86 (2).
- Freshman forward Michael Mersch leads the WCHA in all games with a plus-22 rating, while junior defenseman Jake Gardiner is tied for second at plus-21.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
