Regular Season Concludes March 4-5 with Full Slate of Six WCHA Series; North Dakota Clinches Share of Conference Championship; UM, CC, UW, SCSU in Hunt for Final Two Home Playoff Berths

Friday-Saturday Match Ups Have UND at MTU, CC at UW, UNO at UMD, UM at BSU, UAA at MSU, SCSU at DU; Feb. 26-27 Weekend Sweep Earns Sioux No. 1 Playoff Seed; UND, DU, UNO, UMD Set to Host First Round Playoff Series; Fifth and Sixth Home Playoff Berths Up for Grabs Between Gophers, Tigers, Badgers and SCSU Huskies; Seven WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Poll ... North Dakota No. 1, Denver No. 5, UMD No. 11, Nebraska Omaha No. 12, Colorado College No. 17, Wisconsin No. 18, Minnesota No. 19 ... MADISON, Wis. – The final weekend of the 2010-11 regular season will carry plenty of intrigue as the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 12 men's member teams engage in a full slate of six league series. The match ups for Friday, March 4 and Saturday, March 5 have North Dakota at Michigan Tech, Colorado College at Wisconsin, Nebraska Omaha at Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota at Bemidji State, Alaska Anchorage at Minnesota State and St. Cloud State at Denver.

At stake are the two remaining first round home playoff berths, up for grabs between Minnesota, Colorado College, Wisconsin and St. Cloud State, and 11 of the 12 first round playoff matchups. What's been decided to date? North Dakota has clinched at least a share of the regular season title and MacNaughton Cup as well

as the No. 1 seed for the conference tournament. Denver can still earn a share of the league title but the Sioux would prevail in the tie-breaking scenario for playoff seeding purposes based on more league wins (UND and DU tied their two-game regular season series, 1-1-0.) If Denver earns a share of the league title, the Pioneers would be the No. 2 playoff seed.

Although there are too many possible scenarios regarding final positions in the standings and first round matchups heading into the final 12 games to list them all, the following is known:

- the current top four – North Dakota, Denver, Nebraska Omaha and Minnesota Duluth – will be the final top four in some order.
- Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State, Minnesota State and Michigan Tech will be traveling for the first round. MTU will be seeded 12th for the WCHA tournament.
- That leaves four teams – Minnesota, Colorado College, Wisconsin and St. Cloud State – for the last two home ice spots. Minnesota, Colorado College and Wisconsin all control their own destinies to get one:
- Minnesota needs one point to clinch home ice, or for St. Cloud State to lose a point.
- Colorado College needs two points to clinch home ice.
- Wisconsin needs four points to clinch home ice. (UW would clinch with three points if St. Cloud State does not sweep at Denver).
- St. Cloud State gets home ice if: they sweep Denver and UW gets exactly three points, OR they sweep Denver, UW gets 0, 1, or 4 points, Minnesota gets 0 points, and St. Cloud State's final goal differential in league play (goals for minus goals against) is greater than Minnesota's.
- If St. Cloud State does not sweep Denver, then the final two home ice playoff slots will go to Minnesota and the winner of the CC-UW series (or CC if the series splits).

On the docket this weekend, March 4-5, five of the six WCHA series being contested – UND at MTU, CC at UW, UNO at UMD, UM at BSU and SCSU at DU – mark the only regular season series between the respective clubs.

North Dakota (24-8-3, 19-6-1 WCHA, 1st) will take on Michigan Tech (4-26-4, 2-22-2 WCHA, 12th) at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton on Friday evening at 7:07 pm ET and Saturday at 5:07 pm ET. The Sioux enter the weekend in the midst of a seven-game unbeaten streak at 6-0-1.

Colorado College (18-15-3, 12-12-2 WCHA, 6th) heads to Madison and the Kohl Center (15,325) to face-off against Wisconsin (19-13-4, 11-12-3 WCHA, 7th) at 7:07 pm CT on both Friday and Saturday.

Nebraska Omaha (20-12-2, 16-8-2 WCHA, 3rd) travels to Duluth and new AMSOIL Arena (6,764) to skate against Minnesota Duluth (19-8-6, 14-7-5 WCHA, 4th) in Friday-Saturday, 7:07 pm CT puck drops.

Up at the new Sanford Center (4,258) in Bemidji this weekend, streaking Minnesota (15-12-5, 12-10-4 WCHA, 5th) goes up against Bemidji State (12-16-4, 8-14-4, tie 10th) in Friday and Saturday 7:07 pm CT face-offs. The Golden Gophers are unbeaten over their last five games at 4-0-1.

In the Mile High City, host Denver (20-9-5, 16-7-3 WCHA, 2nd) will engage St. Cloud State (14-15-5, 10-12-4 WCHA, 8th) at the Pioneers' Magnus Arena (6,026) on Friday night at 7:37 pm MT and Saturday evening at 7:07 pm MT.

And in Mankato, Minnesota State (14-14-6, 8-14-4 WCHA, tie 10th) will entertain visiting Alaska Anchorage (12-17-3, 10-14-2 WCHA, 9th) at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) at Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. The Mavericks are 1-0-1 vs the Seawolves this season after a 3-2 victory and 2-2 (ot) tie at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage back on Oct. 29-30.

In conference action last weekend – February 25-27 – North Dakota, Minnesota and St. Cloud State each gathered four points with home-ice sweeps. The Sioux won 5-2 and 5-1 over Bemidji State on Saturday and Sunday, the Golden Gophers defeated Michigan Tech by 5-2 and 5-2 counts last Friday and Saturday, and the Huskies surprised visiting Wisconsin by 4-2 and 7-3 counts last Friday and Saturday. Colorado College, meanwhile, was able to collect three points in a key series with Minnesota Duluth, winning 5-4 last Friday and tying 3-3 (ot) last Saturday. In the one other WCHA series, host Nebraska Omaha captured a 5-2 victory over Denver on Friday before the Pioneers fired back with a 4-2 triumph on Saturday.

Bemidji State 1 at North Dakota 5 (WCHA)

In non-conference play on Feb. 25-26, Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks split their Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup home-and-home series. The Nanooks won 5-1 at home in game one while the Seawolves claimed game two 4-1 in Anchorage.

The WCHA standings heading into the final weekend of March 4-5 and final 12 games of the regular season show North Dakota in first place with 39 points on a 19-6-1 league mark. The Sioux have clinched at least a share of the MacNaughton Cup and will be the No. 1 seed for the league tournament. Denver is in second place with 35 points and a 16-7-3 mark, first-year member Nebraska Omaha is third with 34 points and a 16-8-2 record, and Minnesota Duluth is fourth with 33 points and a 14-7-5 conference mark. Should the Pioneers gain a share of the regular season championship (DU needs to sweep SCSU and have UND get swept at MTU), they would be the No. 2 playoff seed. Denver, Nebraska Omaha and Minnesota Duluth will, in some order, be the No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4 playoff seeds. Minnesota currently stands in fifth place with 28 points on a 12-10-4 WCHA record, Colorado College is sixth with 26 points and a 12-12-2 league mark, Wisconsin is seventh with 25 points on a 11-12-3 WCHA record, and St. Cloud State is eighth with 24 points on a 10-12-4 league slate. UM, CC, UW and SCSU are all in the hunt for the final two home playoff berths. Alaska Anchorage stands ninth with 22 points and a 10-14-2 WCHA record, Bemidji State and Minnesota State are tied for 10th with 20 points and identical 8-14-4 league marks, and Michigan Tech is 12th with six points and a 2-22-2 WCHA record. The conference season consists of 28 games per team for a total of 168 contests.

In this week's (Feb. 28, 2011) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA has seven member teams again ranked among the nation's top 20. North Dakota is No. 1, Denver is No. 5, Minnesota Duluth is No. 11, Nebraska Omaha is No. 12, Colorado College is No. 17, Wisconsin is No. 18, and Minnesota is No. 19. Also receiving votes in the poll was St. Cloud State.

In this week's (Feb. 28, 2011) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, North Dakota is No. 1, Denver is No. 6, Minnesota Duluth is No. 11 and Nebraska Omaha is No. 12. Also receiving votes were Colorado College, Wisconsin and Minnesota.

Through games of Feb. 28, the 12 WCHA men's member teams own a collective 51-25-12 record in games vs other Div. 1 clubs this season for a .648 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 28-10-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-9-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the four other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 17-10-7 (.603) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 6-2-0 (.750) vs independents.

Team records in non-conference play are: Alaska Anchorage (2-2-0), Bemidji State (4-2-0), Colorado College (5-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan

The annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, held at Xcel Energy Center, has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul and the new format will make it even better.

WCHA Announces Record Group of 90 Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes for 2010-11 Sixth Annual Class Includes 30 Repeat Honorees

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair, women's league) announced on Feb. 10, 2011 that a total of 90 men's and women's student-athletes make up the sixth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients. Over the first six years of the award, there have now been 414 honorees representing all 12 men's member and all eight women's member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 80 in 2009-10.

The prestigious WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

"The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is both thrilled and exceptionally proud to announce this group of men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes for the 2010-11 season," said WCHA Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair – women's league) in a joint statement.

"This annual announcement of our Scholar-Athletes has become one of the highlights for the entire Western Collegiate Hockey Association family of student-athletes, coaches and administrators and gives us an opportunity to showcase the fact that along with being great athletes on the ice, these honorees are truly exceptional students off the ice. The rigorous classroom schedules they maintain, as well as their intense commitments to their sport, are most impressive and to be able to achieve what they have is inspiring to all of us. Together, they represent the very best in collegiate athletics."

Thirty (30) of this season's 90 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including a four-time recipient and 11 three-time winners. Earning the distinguished honor for the fourth time is North Dakota's Chay Genoway (2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11), who becomes only the third student-athlete to do so. All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and



honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League–WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves return to league play this weekend when they travel to Mankato to face Minnesota State in their last WCHA series on March 4-5. The teams met on Oct. 29-30 at the Sullivan Arena, with MSU winning on Friday (3-2), followed by a 2-2 tie on Saturday.
- MSU leads the all-time series record against UAA, 33-20-8 and at Mankato, 16-8-3. UAA will be looking for its first win against MSU since Nov. 21, 2009 (4-1, at UAA) and since Jan. 16, 2009 (4-2, at MSU).
- With two WCHA games remaining, UAA will look to tie its record from 1993-94, when the Seawolves posted 14 conference wins. UAA already has 12 league wins, the most under head coach Dave Shyiak.
- The Seawolves will face-off against the Mavericks after splitting the Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup with in-state rival Alaska Fairbanks on Feb. 25-26 in a home-and-home series. The Nanooks won on Feb. 25 in Fairbanks, 5-1, before UAA retaliated with a 4-1 win in Anchorage on Feb. 26.
- Despite the victory on Saturday, the Seawolves were unable to take back the Cup as the Nanooks won the postgame shootout, 2-0, to decide the tie-breaker. UAF leads UAA with a 10-8 record in the Governor's Cup. On Feb. 26, UAA scored a season-high three goals in the first period, but was kept to a season-low 15 shots in the game. The Seawolves registered two power-play goals on Saturday – the fifth time this season that UAA has scored multiple goals on the man advantage in a game.
- In the non-conference series vs UAF, two Seawolves picked up their first goals of the season – juniors Brad Gorham (Feb. 25) and Jade Portwood (Feb. 26). Gorham's goal, just 25 seconds into the game on Friday, was his first in the Green & Gold and just the second of his career. (First was recorded with Ohio State on Nov. 24, 2007 against Western Michigan.) Portwood's goal was his first since scoring two at Michigan Tech on Jan. 15, 2010.
- Senior F Tommy Grant scored his team-leading 12th goal on a power-play on Saturday night, giving him a career-best 27 points – good for No. 31 on the overall WCHA list. His 41 career goals tie him for No. 24 on the all-time UAA scoring list with Chris LeVasseur (1985-87).
- Senior F Craig Parkinson recorded three assists on Feb. 26 for the first in his career. His 11 assists and 18 points are both career highs. His last three-point game was on Dec. 28, 2007 against UAF.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State men's hockey team, now 12-16-4 overall and 8-14-4 in league play, caps the 2010-11 WCHA season this weekend by hosting the University of Minnesota (15-12-5; 12-10-4 WCHA) in Bemidji, Minn., for the first time since the Golden Gophers made the trip north for a single game Oct. 14, 2000.
- This weekend's series marks BSU's first meeting with Minnesota as WCHA foes.
- The last seven games of the series have taken place at Mariucci Arena.
- The Beavers are 1-6-0 versus the Golden Gophers all-time, but split with Minnesota the last time the teams met Nov. 14-15, 2009. After dropping a 4-1 decision to open the series in Minneapolis, Minn., the Beavers bounced back to gain its first win over the Gophers, 6-2, in the series finale. BSU's Jamie MacQueen led the Beavers with a career-high two goals, which included the game-winner, in the game, while Jordan George added a pair of assists and Shea Walters and Brad Hunt each contributed a goal and an assist.
- The Beavers are coming off a weekend during which they were swept by top-ranked University of North Dakota, 5-2 and 5-1. The series marked the fifth time in 2010-11, the Beavers have been swept in a league series and the third time it happened as the road team.
- Last Saturday's 5-1 final score matched a 4-0 loss at the hands of Northern Michigan for the Beavers' largest deficit of the season.
- The Beavers' struggles in Friday evening contests have continued down the stretch in 2010-11. Last Saturday's afternoon series-opening loss makes BSU 3-10-3 (.281) on Fridays with just one win (1-9-2/.167) in Friday league play.
- In 2010-11 the Beavers have played 13 games against teams holding down one of the nation's top 15 rankings and are 4-7-2 versus those teams. After going 0-5-1 versus nationally-ranked competition during the first two months of 2010-11, the Beavers are 4-2-1 versus the top 15 since Dec. 3. Since the Beavers made

the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks, BSU is 11-44-4 (.220) versus teams in the top-15. With that said, BSU is now 9-9-2 (.500) versus the top 15 since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign.

- Senior forward Ryan Cramer scored his second goal of the season last Saturday. Cramer, who has 2-6=8 points this season, has three points (2-1=3) in BSU's last three outings. The goal was Cramer's 40th collegiate point.
- Matt Read scored his team-leading 17th goal of 2010-11 last Friday. It was Read's team-leading third shorthanded goal of the season and his ninth shorty in the green and white. He is currently tied with Brendan Cook (9) for the top spot in the BSU Division I-era record book for career shorthanded markers.
- Last Saturday's goal also stood as the 60th of Matt Read's career. Including Read, only 20 players in BSU history have scored more than 60 goals during their career. Read now has 17-13=30 points as a senior and trails only Jordan George, who has 15=17=32 points, for BSU's scoring lead. With an assist Saturday, Read cracked the 30-point plateau for the third consecutive season. The last BSU player to post more than 30 points in three consecutive seasons was Luke Erickson from 2003-04 to 2005-06.
- Matt Read will make his 143rd consecutive appearance for the Beavers this Friday. Read has not missed a game since he stepped on campus at BSU in the fall of 2007. The appearance will match Matt Pope and John Haider for the BSU Division I-era record for games played (143). In all likelihood, he will break the record with his 144th appearance Saturday.
- An assist last Saturday marked the 75th point of senior Ian Lowe's collegiate career. He is currently 12th on BSU's Division I-era scoring list with 36-39=75 points.
- Jordan George established a new career-high for goals scored in a season last Saturday netting his 15th of 2010-11. Averaging 1.1 ppg this season, he enters the final regular-season series two points shy of his freshman point totals with 17-15=32.
- In BSU's Division I-era, only one other player has posted back-to-back 30-point campaigns in his first two seasons at the collegiate level. George joins teammate Brad Hunt who totaled 9-23=32 and 7-26=33 his freshman and sophomore season, respectively.
- With an assist in last Saturday's matinee, Brad Hunt matched Jordan George for the team lead with 17 helpers. The defender has been among BSU's top two assist men in each of his first three seasons at BSU. He is currently third during BSU's Division I-era with 66 assists.
- Thirty-one games into the 2010-11 campaign, the Beavers already have nine games that have been extended to overtime. BSU has played more OT games only one season since the 1999-2000 season. The 2002-03 Beavers played 15 OT contests.
- BSU was out shot in each game of its series at UND for a 62-31 weekend shots on goal deficit. BSU's 15 shots on goal last Saturday was just one more than a season-low (14) set in the season-opener (Oct. 15) versus UND. BSU has been out shot 20 times in 2010-11, has been out shot 924-788 overall, and 771-608 in league play this season.
- This Saturday's game versus the Golden Gophers marks the end of an era in BSU hockey. The Beavers will honor their senior class before the game. The 2011 class is class that has been a part of three College Hockey America regular-season championships, a CHA Tournament title, BSU's first at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament a trip to the 2009 Frozen four and the transition into a new building – Sanford Center – and the WCHA. BSU's 2011 senior class includes: Ryan Adams, Emil Billberg, Ryan Cramer, Dan MacIntyre, Matt Read and Ian Lowe.

Tigers

Colorado College

- The Tigers head into this week's series at Wisconsin having lost just once (2-1-2) in their last five outings.
- While going 0-1-1 and scoring a total of four goals the last two Saturdays against Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth, CC has out-shot its opponent by a combined margin of 77-40.
- Third-period goals by sophomore defenseman Joe Marciano and junior center David Civitarese in last Friday's 5-4 victory over UMD came just :18 seconds apart and represent Colorado College's quickest two of the season.
- The Tigers now have scored twice within a minute eight times in 2010-11. They've also struck in the opening three and a half minutes of a contest on nine occasions after sophomore right wing William Rapuzzi's game-tying tally 3:29 into last week's series opener.
- Freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz, who scored an unassisted power-play goal

last Friday after setting up a pair of red lighters on Friday, has recorded at least one point in his last seven appearances for CC. Schwartz has six points (2g,4a) in four outings since returning to the lineup after a 15-game absence, and a total of 14 (4g,10a) during his seven-game streak.

- Civitarese, who wears No. 11 on his jersey, is the 11th different Colorado College player to be credited with a game-winning goal in 2010-11 after netting the GWG in last Friday's triumph.
- Marciano's tally last Friday was his first as a Tiger. He also added an assist on Saturday.
- After entering the third period of both games last weekend deadlocked with the Bulldogs at 3-3, CC is 18-1-2 this season when leading or tied after 40 minutes of play.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson has climbed back into a tie for the national and WCHA lead with 12 power-play goals. Johnson, who leads the Tigers with 20 goals and 37 points overall, has scored twice in a game on four occasions in 2010-11 after rallying Colorado College from 2-1 and 3-2 deficits in last Saturday's 3-3 tie with Minnesota Duluth.
- CC's 23 shots on goal in the second frame of that game was a team season high for a single period.
- Despite being held without a point last weekend, sophomore center Rylan Schwartz won 27 of 42 faceoffs (.642) including 14 of 19 (.736) in Saturday's 3-3 tie. He has prevailed in 54.6% of his draws (255 of 467) for the season, leads the Tigers with a +8 plus-minus rating and has assisted on a team-high five game-winning goals.
- Jaden Schwartz and the rest of Colorado College's freshman class now have collectively accounted for 93 points (34g,55a) this season after adding five (1g,4a) to their total last weekend. Rookie defenseman Eamonn McDermott assisted on two goals in Friday's victory to record his first multiple-point game of 2010-11.
- Twenty different CC players have factored in on at least one game-winning goal this campaign.
- Junior center Nick Dineen, who scored a pair of power-play goals in last Friday's victory, posted his sixth multiple-point performance of the season.
- The Tigers had gone nine games without scoring more than one power-play goal before striking for two in each outings last weekend.

Pioneers University of Denver

- Denver (20-9-5, 16-7-3 WCHA) concludes its WCHA regular season with a two-game home series against St. Cloud State (14-15-5, 10-12-4 WCHA) on March 4-5.
- The Pioneers are second in the WCHA with 35 points, while St. Cloud State is eighth with 26 points.
- DU is fifth in the latest PairWise Rankings.
- DU joined Michigan as the only NCAA Division I team to post 20 or more wins in each of the past 10 seasons with last weekend's 4-2 win at Nebraska Omaha.
- DU will host the first round of the WCHA Playoffs for the eighth consecutive season on March 11-13.
- The Pioneers have defeated 10 WCHA opponents this season.
- DU is 37-31-4 all-time against St. Cloud State in the series that began in 1988. The Pioneers are 19-19-2 against the Huskies in Denver, including four two-game splits in the last four series at Magness Arena. DU is 2-3 against SCSU in the last five games and 5-5 in the last 10.
- Drew Shore (21-20=41) and Jason Zucker (20-18=38) lead DU in scoring. Shore and Zucker rank fifth and ninth, respectively, in WCHA overall scoring. Zucker leads the WCHA in league scoring (36 points) and goals (20). Shore ranks fourth in league scoring with 32 points (14g, 18a).
- David Makowski (5-18=23) is tied for the WCHA scoring lead among rookie blueliners.
- Zucker has 14 points (4g, 10a) during his career-best, nine-game point streak, while Shore has a four-game goal streak and 13 points (7g, 6a) during his career-high, eight-game point streak.
- DU players Jesse Martin (26), Dustin Jackson (12), Nick Shore (9), Adam Murray (6), Kyle Ostrow (6), Beau Bennett (5), Chris Knowlton (4), Paul Phillips (4), and John Lee (3) have missed a combined 75 games due to injury. Drew Shore (2) and Jason Zucker (2) missed a combined four games while playing for Team USA at the World Junior Championship, while David Makowski was suspended one game for fighting.
- DU will honor its senior class of Kyle Ostrow, Jesse Martin, Dustin Jackson, Anthony Maiani, Chris Nutini, Jon Cook, Joey Brehm and Josh Rosenholtz during

the first intermission on Saturday, March 5.

- The Pioneers are first in the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 86.6% and seventh on the power-play at 19%. DU is 42-for-44 on the penalty-kill over its last 11 games. DU has allowed more shorthanded goals (4) than power-play goals (2) in the last 11 games. The Pioneers are a perfect 13-for-13 on the penalty-kill over the last four games.

Huskies Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will close the regular season at home against North Dakota (March 4-5) after dropping a pair of games at Minnesota the previous weekend (Feb. 25-26).
- The weekend series will be the final two games that seniors Bennett Royer and Deron Cousens will play in Houghton. Cousens is currently ranked tied for second on the team in points with 20 (2g, 18a) and has 51 points (9g, 42a) in a team-high 129 career games. He also has three assists in his last four games. Royer has eight points (4g, 4a) in 23 games this season and 32 points (11g, 21a) in 119 career games.
- Freshman Milos Gordic scored a goal in both games at Minnesota to maintain his team lead in points with 21 (15g, 6a). The last time a freshman led Michigan Tech in scoring was Mike Zuke who finished with 53 points (23g, 30a) in the 1972-73 season.
- Freshman Ryan Furne has four points (3g, 1a) in his last four games. He tallied the second multi-point game of his career with one goal and one assist against Minnesota. His first multi-point game was also against Minnesota on Nov. 19 when he scored one goal and added two assists for three points.
- Freshman Jacob Johnstone has tallied four assists in his three games. He currently ranks second on the team in assists with 14.
- Tech was whistled for 50 penalty minutes at Minnesota, second most in a game this season.
- Every player on this year's team has at least one point this season except goalie Corson Cramer who has played 20 minutes this season.
- Tech has six players who have played in all 34 games this season.
- Tech will play at North Dakota in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs March 11-13.

Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- Minnesota wraps up the WCHA regular season this weekend when they travel to face new-WCHA member and in-state foe Bemidji State. The Gophers opened up the WCHA season with the league's other new member Nebraska Omaha and end it against the Beavers.
- Minnesota swept Michigan Tech last weekend for its first home WCHA sweep of the season. The Gophers swept Colorado College (Oct. 29-30) and Michigan Tech (Nov. 19-20) on the road earlier this season and opened the season with a home sweep against Massachusetts (Oct. 8-9).
- The Gophers are 4-0-1 in their last five games, which is the team's longest unbeaten streak of the season. Previously, Minnesota had twice gone three consecutive games without a loss this season. The Gophers were 3-0-0 from Oct. 24-30 and 2-0-1 from Nov. 6-20.
- Minnesota scored 32 goals in eight February games (4.00 goals per game) for its second-most productive offensive month of the season. The Gophers scored 33 goals in eight October games for a 4.125 goals per game average. Minnesota averaged 3.00 goals per game in November (18 goals/6 games), 2.2 goals per game in January (11 goals/5 games) and 2.00 goals per game in December (10 goals/5 games). For the year, Minnesota averages 3.25 goals per game (104 goals/32 games).
- The Gophers are averaging 3.25 goals per game this year. However, 71 of their 104 goals (68.2%) have come in their 15 wins this season. That means Minnesota is averaging 4.73 goals per win this year. Minnesota has scored four or more goals in 12 games this season and is 11-2-0 in those games. They have scored three or more goals in 17 games this year and are 14-2-1 in those games. Minnesota has won only one game this season (2-1 home win against St. Cloud State on Oct. 24) in which they scored less than three goals. Conversely, Minnesota averages 1.94 goals per game in a loss or tie.
- Minnesota has scored 25 combined goals in its last five games, all without Jay Barriball (lower-body injury), who is tied for the team lead in goals with Mike Hoeffel and Jacob Cepis with 12. The Gophers scored a combined 25 goals in their previous 11 games (Dec. 10-Feb. 11) prior to their recent five-game outburst.

- Cade Fairchild led all NCAA defensemen with 12 points (3g-9a) and a 1.50 points-per-game average in February. Only six skaters (all forwards) had more than 12 points in the month. Fairchild has 23 points on the season, which means he registered 52.1% of his season points in February. Fairchild had a point in seven of eight games and took only one minor penalty during the month. Minnesota scored 32 goals in February and with his 12 points Fairchild was directly involved in 37.5 percent of them. Fairchild was on the ice for 17 (53.1 percent) of Minnesota's 32 goals. Fairchild is also on a five-game point streak (1g-9a).
- Kent Patterson recorded his 1,000 career save last Saturday when he stopped a first-period shot from Michigan Tech's Dennis Rix.
- Jacob Cepis is on a six-game point streak (5g, 4a) and a five-game point streak (5g). He is +5 in his last six games.
- Nick Bjugstad, who has 11 points (3g, 8a) in his last 12 games, scored two shorthanded goals last Friday against Michigan Tech. The last Gopher to score two shorthanded goals in a game was Tony Lucia, who accomplished the feat in a 5-1 home win against Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 30, 2009.
- Minnesota has scored 60 goals at home this year and allowed 57. Through Minnesota's first nine home games this season the Gophers were outscored 36-25 at Mariucci Arena (season low -11 goal differential at home). Since then (11 games) Minnesota has outscored opponents 35-21 (+14 goal differential) at Mariucci Arena.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- UMD will put the finishing touches on the 2010-11 regular season this weekend by hosting the University of Nebraska-Omaha. The two clubs have met just five times previously, the last coming on Oct. 12, 2001 in the opening round of the Maverick Stampede in Omaha, and only twice in Duluth (Dec. 4-5, 1997).
- The Bulldogs are 9-4-2 at home this winter, but just 2-3-2 at AMSOIL Arena since moving to that \$80-million, 6,764-seat facility on Dec. 30 from the DECC (where they compiled a 7-1-0 mark).
- UMD and Colorado College skated to a 3-3 draw last Saturday night in the Bulldogs' regular season road finale, one night after the host Tigers took the opener, 5-4. Junior left winger Mike Connolly continued his torrid scoring pace over the weekend, bagging two goals and four assists while linemates Jack Connolly and Justin Fontaine each chipped in another four points.
- Three Bulldogs currently occupy the top four spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts at the moment – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is first with 49 points, and senior right winger Justin Fontaine and junior left winger Mike Connolly own a share of the No. 3 post (44). That line has combined for 433% of the team's scoring harvest this winter (137 of 316 points). In league games only, Jack Connolly (35 points) trails Denver's Jason Zucker by one point in the scoring race while Mike Connolly is tied for third. No Bulldog has finished as the WCHA scoring champion since Junior Lessard in 2003-04 although Justin Fontaine came within two points of accomplishing that feat in each of the past two years.
- Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 116 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog, ranks fourth among all NCAA pucksters in total points and is second in assists (a WCHA-leading 36). The 2010-11 WCHA Preseason Player of the Year went over the 100-point mark this past December (he now has 123) and joined Fontaine (146) and Mike Connolly (120) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season. Jack Connolly will take a career-high 11-game scoring streak (he has four goals and 14 assists during that stretch) into Friday night's clash.
- Fontaine, who is a team-leading +21 this season, is third among his WCHA brethren power-play goals at the moment with 10. The two-time All-WCHA second team selection has moved into 19th place on UMD's all-time points list and has a shot – he needs 15 points – at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci was the last in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15. Since 2008-09, no current WCHA skater has racked up more points (138) than Fontaine.
- With his offensive outburst last weekend in Colorado Springs, Mike Connolly became just the second NCAA-era Bulldog ever to open his career with three straight 40-point seasons. Dan Lempe, the school's all-time scoring leader, is the other UMD skater to accomplish that feat (he did it four times between 1976-80) since the Bulldogs joined the NCAA I ranks in 1961-62. Since the start of February, Connolly has amassed a whopping 10 goals – including a school record-tying five

in UMD's 6-4 over Minnesota three weeks ago, and five assists in eight games.

- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 80-53 margin from the second period on this season and have a NCAA-leading five overtime victories to their 2010-11 credit. They have also given up the fewest third-period goals (23) of any WCHA club this season. In addition, UMD is 14-0-1 when it's taken a lead into the final period of play.
- After putting the clamps on an eight-game pointless skid at Michigan Tech on Jan. 21, freshman right winger J.T. Brown has picked up points in nine of 10 outings since, collecting nine goals and six assists over that time. Brown, the Hockey Commissioner's Association National Rookie of the Month for October, resides in the No. 4 spot on the WCHA rookie scoring list with 30 points (14g, 16a) in 33 games.
- UMD is now unbeaten in 26 of its last 28 overtime games (11-2-15) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. A school-record 12 of the Bulldogs' 33 engagements this winter have required an extra session, and UMD is 5-1-6 in those. The five OT victories equals a UMD standard set in 1984-85.
- Justin Faulk is currently the second-highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and is also second among all NCAA freshmen blueliners in total goals as well. In 29 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn., product has collected six goals (five of which have come on the power-play,) and 17 assists for 23 points. That's the most by a UMD first-year defenseman in 28 years (Norm Maciver with 27 points in 1982-83). Faulk, who has the third best plus-minus rating (+17) of any 2010-11 Bulldog, competed with the U.S. at the recent IIHF World Junior Championships in Buffalo and paced that team's defense in scoring.
- The Bulldogs have not been shut out in 83 straight WCHA games since coming up empty against North Dakota (2-0) on March 1, 2008 in Duluth.
- Junior Kenny Reiter, who made a UMD 2010-11 season-high 39 saves in last Saturday's 3-3 tie at Colorado College, has compiled a 2.23 goals-against average in league play which is second only to North Dakota's Aaron Dell (2.01) and ranks fourth overall in that same department with a 2.39 mark. During his three years with the Bulldogs, he has posted the second-best career winning percentage (.583 off a 22-15-5 record, including a 9-5-5 figure this winter) of any NCAA I-era Bulldog in team history, trailing All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85).
- UMD will head into this weekend's series with Nebraska-Omaha armed with the nation's eighth best winning percentage (.667) and the WCHA's second most potent offense (3.45 goals per game). In addition, no league club has fewer overall losses than the Bulldogs.
- Travis Oleksuk's 11 goals this season (which is a career high) have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up a WCHA-best six game-winning goals this season, has scored twice on the power play, once while a man down, once on a penalty shot and once with the goaltender pulled. Two of his goals thus far have been registered in overtime.
- The Bulldogs have not swept a regular season finale series since 1997-98 (at Denver) and hasn't done so at home since 1990-91 (vs. Denver).
- All seven of sophomore right winger Mike Seidel's goals thus far in 2010-11 have been registered on the road.
- UMD has lost just once (3-2 to visiting Wisconsin on Jan. 15) in its 15 series rematch games this season, going a 10-1-4
- Of the 18 goals the senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. Only two other Bulldogs (Mike Connolly with 22 and Jack Connolly with 18) has more. Schmidt, Kenny Reiter, Aaron Crandall and sophomore center Keegan Flaherty were all recipients of a WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award for 2010-11.
- The Bulldogs have cashed in on six of 17 man-advantage opportunities (35.3%) over the past three games and currently sports the WCHA's fourth most efficient power-play (21.6%).
- UMD's seven juniors (which includes goalie Kenny Reiter) has accrued more points (138) than any other junior class in the country.
- The Bulldogs have been outshot only six times all season (including twice both last weekend at Colorado College and at North Dakota on Nov. 5-6).

Mavericks Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State, which was idle last weekend, stands 14-14-6 overall, 8-14-4 WCHA. In its last action, Feb. 18-19, MSU split a WCHA home series with #5 Minnesota Duluth. The Mavericks claimed a 3-1 win over the Bulldogs before falling 6-2 in the second contest.
- The Mavericks close out the 2010-11 regular season this Friday and Saturday when Alaska Anchorage visits Mankato for a pair of league contests. MSU earned a 3-2 win and a 2-2 tie in a pair of games played in Anchorage Oct. 29-30 in the most-recent games between the two schools. The Mavericks are 34-20-7 all-time

versus UAA.

- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 172-196-53 (471).
- MSU's all-time record in 1,401 games played is 724-545-132 (.564).
- Junior goaltender Austin Lee was named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week after he registered his fourth win of the year when he stopped 40 of 41 shots in MSU's 3-1 victory over #5 Minnesota Duluth. His other wins this year have come against Colorado College Feb. 11) UMass-Lowell (Nov. 26) and American International (Jan. 8). In his last five appearances, the Bloomington, Minn., native is 3-2-0 with a 1.61 goals-against average and a .946 save percentage. For the season Lee stands 4-3-2 with a 2.37 GAA and .918 save percentage.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht has 0-6=6 in the last 13 games. Elbrecht, who has played in all 34 MSU games this year, has 1-7=8 for 2010-11 and his +8 is third on the team.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes, who had a goal and assist in MSU's 3-1 win over UMD and then added another goal in the next game, has 4-1=5 in the last four games. Hayes ranks third on the club scoring charts with 11-10=21. He leads the team in shots (118) and ranks second in goals (11).
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe has tallied 2-1=3 during the last three games. The goals are the first two power-play goals of his four-year MSU career. Boe, who had a goal and an assist in MSU's 3-1 win over fifth-rated Minnesota Duluth Feb. 18th, scored his second career game-winning goal in the 3-1 win over UMD. His other GWG came in overtime came Feb. 4 when the Mavericks bested Bemidji State, 2-1 at home. Boe has 8-17=25 in 127 career games and has played in 73 consecutive games played to stand as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak.
- Junior forward Michael Dorr has totalled 8-7=15 in the last 16 games and with 12-13=25 on the season, stands tied with Kurt Davis at the top of MSU's scoring charts. The Roseville, Minn., native leads MSU in goals (12) and game-winning goals (3). He's also tied for the team in power-play goals (4) and his 115 shots ranks second.
- Senior forward Andrew Sackrison owns 17-35=52 in 120 career games. A fifth-round (124th overall) NHL draftee by St. Louis in 2006, Sackrison has 2-9=11 in the last 16 games.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis assisted on Channing Boe's game-winning goal in MSU's 3-1 victory over UMD and is tied for the team scoring with 8-17=25 in 34 games. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 20-74=94 in 146 career games to rank third on MSU's career scoring by defenseman list. Davis, who also ranks as MSU's all-time top-scoring defenseman for MSU's NCAA Division I era (he's tenth overall), is +4 on the year to tie for fourth on the team.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 6-8=14 in his last 21 games played, has 10-55=65 and is +5 in 141 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and is tied for 12th on MSU's all-time scoring by defensemen list (he's seventh for the school's DI era for defensemen). Youds is +6 for his four-year MSU career.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant has 8-11=19 in 29 games to tie for fourth on MSU's scoring charts. MSU's top-scoring newcomer assisted on Corey Leivermann's goal in as the Mavericks upended #5 Minnesota Duluth, 3-1, Feb. 18.
- Freshman forward Corey Leivermann notched his third goal of the year when he scored MSU's third goal in the 3-1 win over Minnesota Duluth Feb. 18. Leivermann, who has 3-4=7 in 20 games in his freshman season, ranks tenth on the team in terms of points per game with a .350 mark.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (9), assists (8) and points (17) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who has had three points in a game twice this year, has registered 3-6=9 in the last 16 games.
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, has had at least one point in 11 of his last 18 games and during that time he's totalled 5-9=14. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 29-52=81 in 136 career games. His 81 career points ties him with Peter Holoein (22-59=81 in 144 GP from 1998-2001-05) for 17th overall on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era.
- Sophomore defenseman Evan Mosey assisted on a power-play goal by Eriah Hayes in MSU's 3-1 over UMD Feb. 18 and has 0-3=3 in the last four games. Mosey has 1-5=6 in 20 games this year.
- Junior forward Adam Mueller has 0-3=3 in the last eight games. With 2-7=9 in 33 games this year, the Roseville, Minn., has reached career-highs for assists and points in a season.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has collected 2-6=8 in the last 8 games. Zuck has 5-11=16 in 31 games this year to rank ninth on MSU's scoring charts.
- Junior forward Mike Louwerse, who scored his sixth goal of the season in last the 6-2 loss to #5 UMD Feb. 19, has 3-1=4 in the last 10 games. Louwerse has 26-23=49 in 106 career games with the Mavericks.

- MSU has outshot its opponents by a 1131 to 1062 margin on the year. The Mavericks have had at least 40 shots on goal six times and their 33.2 shots per game ranks 15th in the country. MSU's average of 2.94 goals per game ranks 28th in the nation.
- As a group MSU's blueliners are tied for 13th in the nation in scoring with a 2.22 ppg mark (24-52--75 in 34 games played).

Mavericks University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO concludes its first regular season in the WCHA this weekend when it travels to Minnesota Duluth for games on Friday and Saturday, March 4 and 5.
- The two teams have played each other just five previous times and only once in the 21st century. UMD leads the series, 4-1-0. The Mavericks lone win came on Dec. 18, 1999, a 3-2 overtime win at home. They have not been to Duluth, Minn. since December of 1997.
- The Mavericks are 7-8-1 on the road this season and will need to sweep the series to post their first ever winning road record. The Mavs need only a split to secure third place in the WCHA standings. UNO can finish no lower than fourth place.
- The Mavericks are coming off a split of two games with Denver last weekend. UNO won the opener, 5-2 but dropped the rematch, 4-2, the following night.
- Last Friday's win over the Pioneers snapped a seven-game losing streak to Denver.
- With their win on Friday, UNO has now posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the second time in school history and the first time since 2000-01 and 2001-02.
- The Mavericks have 16 wins in conference play, the most in school history. UNO's previous high-water mark for conference wins came in 2000-01 when it had 15 in the CCHA.
- The Mavericks finished the regular season with a home record of 13-4-1. Of their four losses, only Saturday's 4-2 loss to Denver was by more than one goal.
- UNO drew a crowd of 11,504 to its Saturday game against Denver, its third-largest crowd in school history. In the last 13 months, the Mavericks have drawn six of the nine largest crowds in school history including the top four.
- Senior Rich Purslow tied a personal season high with three points in UNO's 5-2 win over Denver on Friday. It's the fourth time he's had three points in a game this season.
- With the win last Friday, John Faulkner now has 19 wins this season, just two from tying the school record for wins in a season by a goaltender, a mark held by Dan Ellis.
- With an assist in Friday's 5-2 win over Denver, Faulkner set a new school record for assists by a goaltender in a season (4).
- Andrej Sustr scored the game-winning goal last Friday night, just his second career goal and his first since Nov. 6 against Minnesota State.
- UNO got shorthanded goals from Rich Purslow and Matt White in Friday's 5-2 win over the Pioneers. It was the second time this season that the Mavericks had scored two shorthanded goals in a game. The other was on Jan. 22 in a 4-2 loss at North Dakota. All five of UNO's shorthanded goals this season have come against two teams, DU and UND.
- The Mavericks are tied with Minnesota for fewest shorthanded goals allowed for all games played - 1.
- UNO has a WCHA-best six players who have scored 10 or more goals this season (Matt Ambroz - 16, Matt White - 14, Joey Martin - 11, Rich Purslow - 11, Alex Hudson - 11 and Brock Montpetit - 10).
- Senior Joey Martin had an assist last weekend and is now tied with Mick Lawrence for 11th all-time in UNO scoring with 102 points.
- Martin leads the Mavericks with 34 points and 23 assists. Ambroz leads the team with 16 goals, five powerplay goals and a +21 rating. Hudson and Ambroz lead the Mavs with three game-winning goals each. Matt White leads all UNO freshmen with 21 points and is second on the team with 14 goals. Eric Olimb leads all UNO defensemen in scoring with 25 points. Freshman defenseman Michael Young leads the team with two shorthanded goals. Sophomore defenseman Bryce Aneloski leads the team with 54 blocked shots.

Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

- Top-ranked North Dakota (24-8-3, 19-6-1 WCHA) will wrap up the regular season with a two-game WCHA series at Michigan Tech ... UND is 104-9-9 (.605) all-time against MTU and has won seven straight meetings.
- The Fighting Sioux have already clinched the No. 1 seed in the WCHA playoffs

and at least a share of the MacNaughton Cup as the WCHA regular season champions. It is UND's league-best 15th conference crown and its second in the last three years.

- The series at MTU will serve as a preview of the first-round of the WCHA playoffs, when UND will host the Huskies. It is the ninth straight year UND has clinched home ice in the first round, the longest active streak in the WCHA.
- The Sioux finished the month of February with a 5-0-1 record, all in WCHA play, including last week's home sweep of Bemidji State (5-2, 5-1).
- Jason Gregoire and Matt Frattin each scored twice in last Saturday's 5-2 win over the Beavers. Jake Marto (1g, 2a) and Corban Knight (3a) keyed Sunday's 5-1 win. Frattin also scored on Sunday, his WCHA-leading 27th goal of the season, two shy of the national lead. He also upped his point total to a team-leading 42, already the most by a Sioux since T.J. Oshie had 45 in 2007-08. UND went 6-for-11 on the power-play in the series against BSU.
- Gregoire extended his career-long point streak to 10 games. He has 10 goals and seven assists during that time. Gregoire enters the final weekend of the regular season with 98 career points.
- Frattin, who reached the 100-career point milestone on Sunday, also pushed his point streak to seven games.
- UND has received 67 goals from its senior class, the most of any team in the nation.
- UND leads the WCHA in scoring offense in both overall games (3.74 goals per game) and league games (3.65), as well as in scoring defense in both overall games (2.34) and league games (2.27). The last team to lead the WCHA in all four categories was Colorado College in 2002-03.
- Last Saturday's attendance of 12,114 was the second-largest home crowd in UND history. It also marked the sixth crowd this season to crack UND's all-time top 10.
- Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell, who has started 22 straight games, leads the WCHA in goals-against average both in league games (2.01) and overall games (1.98). Dell ranks among the top five nationally in wins (2nd, 23), winning percentage (3rd, .774), goals-against average (4th, 1.98) and shutouts (t-4th, 4).
- UND enters its series against Michigan Tech with a 13-1-2 record against un-ranked opponents.
- The Sioux are 17-1-1 when scoring at least four goals in a game and 16-0-2 when leading after the second period.

Huskies St. Cloud State University

- The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team gained its third WCHA sweep of the season with a 4-2, 7-3 sweep of #13/14 Wisconsin on Feb. 25-26 at the National Hockey Center. The pair of wins moves SCSU's record to 14-15-5 overall and 10-12-4 WCHA. The victories also helped the Huskies stay alive in the hunt for home ice in the WCHA playoffs.
- The game on Feb. 26 marked Senior Night at SCSU. The Husky four-year veterans answered the bell in that emotional game by contributing five goals and one assist in the 7-3 victory. Senior forward Garrett Roe scored two goals and the game winner, while senior forward Aaron Marvin also had a two-goal night. Senior Nick Oslund added another goal for the Huskies, while senior Brett Barta notched his 11th assist of the season in the game. To cap the senior showcase, senior goalie Dan Dunn earned the W with 21 saves in the game. Other SCSU seniors to see ice time in the game were Brian Volpei and Nic Rioux.
- SCSU players who received their 2011 WCHA Scholar-Athlete awards from SCSU Faculty Representative Dr. William Hudson at the game on Feb. 26 were Brian Volpei, Drew LeBlanc, Aaron Marvin, Oliver Lauridsen, Mike Lee, Travis Novak and Jordy Christian.
- Garrett Roe finished the weekend against UW with four goals and he posted the game winning goals in both games. On the season, Roe now has 10 goals this season and 34 points. SCSU's all-time assist leader with 111 during his career, Roe now ranks third in team history with 176 points and 7th with 65 career goals. He needs just three points to tie the Huskies' second ranked career scorer Jeff Saterdalen, who had 179 points at SCSU from 1988-92.
- Still on the subject of Garrett Roe. In the month of February, Roe has been on fire with five goals, six assist, 11 points, two game-winners and 25 shots on goal in the last eight games for the Huskies.
- Jared Festler enjoyed a solid weekend in play against Wisconsin. Festler notched one assist in the Huskies' 4-2 win over Wisconsin on Feb. 25, and then completed his busy weekend with a career-high three assists against the Badgers on Feb. 26. Festler had assists in the 7-3 win on goals scored by Travis Novak, Aaron Marvin

and David Eddy. Festler now has 12 assists in 2010-11. He also has 23 points this season, which marks the second consecutive year that Festler has hit the 20-point plateau at SCSU.

- Junior Drew LeBlanc scored two assists on Feb. 26, which moves his team-leading point total to 39 in 2010-11. He also leads the club with 26 assists and 13 goals in 2010-11. In his career, LeBlanc has 85 points, 27 goals and 58 assists.
- SCSU goalie Dan Dunn's start on Feb. 26 was his first for the Huskies since Dec. 11 against Colorado College. Dunn responded with a strong 21-save effort that resulted in a 7-3 win for the Huskies. SCSU sophomore Mike Lee made the start on Feb. 25 and tallied 25 saves in the 4-2 win over nationally ranked Wisconsin.
- The Huskies will finish their 2010-11 regular season on March 4-5 with a pair of games at #5 Denver. The Huskies have face a rigorous schedule down the stretch with consecutive games against nationally-ranked #12 Nebraska Omaha, #11 Minnesota Duluth, #1 North Dakota and #18 Wisconsin. This upcoming series will mark the only time during the regular season that SCSU and DU have played.
- The Huskies own a 31-37-4 all-time record against Denver. SCSU is 3-2-0 in the last five outings against Denver. Last year, the Huskies only played the Pioneers twice in regular season play. The result was a 5-3 loss to Denver on Nov. 27, 2009 and a 3-2 win over Denver on Nov. 28, 2009. Of note, Denver was ranked #2 in the nation when the two teams played in 2009-10.
- Erich Bacher, the long-time sports information contact for men's hockey at Denver, served as a graduate assistant in the Athletic Media Relations office at SCSU many years ago.
- SCSU head coach Bob Motzko served as an associate head coach at Denver from 1993-94. SCSU assistant coach Mike Gibbons served as an assistant coach at Denver from 1990-94.

Badgers University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (19-13-4, 11-12-3 WCHA) completes its regular season with a two-game home series against Colorado College (18-15-3, 12-12-2 WCHA). The games will mark the 175th and 176th in the all-time series. UW is 1-4-1 against CC in the last six games played in Madison. UW's last series win over CC at the Kohl Center came Nov. 11-12, 2005 with a victory and a tie. UW is 7-13-4 against CC under Head Coach Mike Eaves.
- The Badgers are currently in seventh place in the WCHA standings with 25 points, one point behind sixth-place Colorado College for the final home-ice playoff spot. For the UW to gain WCHA first-round playoff home ice, it needs a sweep over Colorado College, or three points and at least one tie or loss by St. Cloud State, who is playing at Denver this weekend.
- One more victory for Wisconsin would give it 20 wins for the third consecutive season, the sixth time in nine seasons under Head Coach Mike Eaves and the 34th time in school history.
- This weekend, Wisconsin celebrates its six seniors – Scott Gudmandson, Brett Bennett, Sean Dolan, Patrick Johnson, Craig Johnson and Podge Turnbull. The Badgers sit 83-57-19 and own an NCAA championship game appearance during the 159 games since all but Bennett joined the program. Bennett is in his second year at Wisconsin after transferring from Boston University.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz, a Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate, tallied his 17th goal of the season last Friday, moving into fourth all alone on UW's single-season list, just two off the UW record of 19 set by Sean Hill during the 1990-91 season. Schultz is one behind the second-place pair of Craig Norwich (1976-77) and Ron Griffin (1979-80).
- Senior forward Patrick Johnson scored two goals last Saturday against St. Cloud State. The contest marked the first two-goal game of his career.
- Junior defenseman Jake Gardiner extended his point-scoring streak to five games (2-5=7) with two assists last Friday at St. Cloud State, but had the streak snapped with a scoreless game on Saturday.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz was held without a point last Saturday at St. Cloud State, snapping a four-point scoring streak (2-4=6). The streak was his fourth this season of at least four games.
- 2010 Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Blake Geoffrion made his NHL debut this past weekend for the Nashville Predators, becoming the 20th former Badger to play in the NHL this season and the fourth to make his NHL debut. Three of the four (Geoffrion, Derek Stepan, Ryan McDonagh) were on the Badgers last season.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
