## Four Week Dash for MacNaughton Cup, Home Playoff Berths Begins with Six Feb. 11-12 WCHA Series; It's BSU at MTU for Winter Carnival, DU at UM, SCSU at UMD, UAA at UND, UW at UNO, MSU at CC One Point Lies Between Top Three as Defending WCHA Champ Denver, Minnesota Duluth Share First Place, North Dakota Third; New Member Nebraska Omaha Three Back in Fourth; Four Points Separate Five Clubs in Middle; UNO, Alaska Anchorage Post Feb. 4-5 League Sweeps, UMD Earns Three Points; Six WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 National Poll ... MADISON, Wis. – With four weeks now remaining in the 2010-11 regular season, races for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup and six first round home playoff berths continue in earnest this coming weekend – Friday, February 11 and Saturday, Feb. 12 – in a full slate of six league two-game series.

Defending WCHA champion and co-leader Denver heads to Minnesota, league co-leader Minnesota Duluth hosts St. Cloud State, pre-season favorite North Dakota entertains Alaska Anchorage, fourth place Nebraska Omaha hosts fifth place Wisconsin, and Colorado College entertains Minnesota State. All six of these two-game sets will also mark the only regular season league encounters between the respective foes.

At Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis, Minnesota (11-11-4, 8-9-3 WCHA) will host No. 4-ranked Denver (17-6-5, 13-4-3 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT Friday evening and 5:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Pioneers are 6-1-3 over

their last 10 games and coming off a Feb. 4-5 home-and-home split with CC (L 2-3 at CC, W 5-3 at DU). The Golden Gophers, meanwhile, earned a 2-2 (ot) tie at UMD last Friday and then fell 6-4 last Saturday.

At new AMSOIL Arena (6,764) in Duluth, the No. 3-ranked UMD Bulldogs (18-5-4, 13-4-3 WCHA) will host St. Cloud State (11-14-3, 7-11-2 WCHA) for a pair of 7:07 pm CT evening face-offs on Friday and Saturday. UMD, sitting tied with DU for first place, is 3-0-1 over the last four games, 6-1-1 over the last eight and 9-3-1 at home. SCSU, 6-3-1 since Dec. 11, lost twice at UNO last weekend (0-3, 3-4) but held a 3-0 lead in game two.

In Grand Forks, No. 5-ranked North Dakota (19-8-2, 14-6-0 WCHA) will return to action after an off week to host on-coming Alaska Anchorage (10-13-3, 9-11-2 WCHA) at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) on Friday night at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. Although this is the only WCHA series between the Sioux and the Seawolves during the regular season, the two clubs did tie 5-5 (ot) in non-conference play back on Oct. 8 in the Kendall Hockey Classic in Anchorage. Although 3-3 over their last six games, the Sioux are still 11-3-1 since Nov. 20 and 9-4-1 at home. UAA sports a three-game league winning streak and is 5-3-1 since Dec. 10.

Another intriguing Feb. 11-12 conference match-up will occur at Qwest Center Omaha (15,595) when No. 16-ranked Nebraska Omaha (16-10-2, 12-6-2 WCHA) welcomes No. 7-ranked Wisconsin (19-8-3, 11-7-2 WCHA) for 7:37 pm and 7:07 pm CT puck drops. The fourth place Mavericks and fifth place Badgers are separated by just two points in the standings. UNO, now 10-3-1 at home, swept visiting SCSU last weekend, 3-0 and 4-3 while the UW, standing 12-1-0 over their last 13 contests, was idle.

Up in Houghton this weekend, one of college hockey's most storied traditions – Michigan Tech's Winter Carnival – continues as the Huskies (3-22-3, 1-18-1 WCHA) take on visiting Bemidji State (10-14-2, 6-12-2 WCHA). Face-offs at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) are set for 7:07 pm ET on Friday night and 5:07 pm ET on Saturday. Michigan Tech is 73-41-10 all-time during Winter Carnival. Tech dropped 4-1 and 4-2 encounters at Alaska Anchorage last weekend while the Beavers split at MSU, 1-2 (ot) and 4-1.

And out west this Friday and Saturday, No. 19-ranked Colorado College (16-13-1, 10-10-0 WCHA) and Minnesota State (12-12-6, 6-12-4 WCHA) will hook up at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) on Feb. 11 at 7:37 pm MT and Feb. 12 at 7:07 pm MT. The sixth place Tigers split their home-and-home set with DU last weekend (W 3-2 at home, L 3-5 on road) while the Mavericks split with visiting BSU, 2-1 (ot) and 1-4. CC is 8-6-1 on home ice this season.

This week's WCHA standings show defending regular season champion Denver sharing first place with Minnesota Duluth with identical 13-4-3 league marks in 20 games for 29 points each. North Dakota (20 gp, 28 points) is one point back in third, Nebraska Omaha (20 gp, 26 points) is fourth and Wisconsin (20 gp, 24 points) is fifth. Colorado College (20 gp, 16 points) and Alaska Anchorage (22 gp, 16 points) are tied for sixth, Minnesota (20 gp, 19 points) is eighth, and St. Cloud State (20 gp, 16

points) and Minnesota State (22 gp, 16 points) are tied for ninth. Bemidji State (20 gp, 14 points) stands 11th and Michigan Tech (20 gp, 3 points) is 12th.

In conference play last weekend (Feb. 4-5), two teams – Nebraska Omaha and Alaska Anchorage – both secured home-ice sweeps and four WCHA points. The Mavericks won 3-0 and 4-3 over St. Cloud State while the Seawolves downed Michigan Tech 4-1 and 4-2. Minnesota Duluth was able to earn three points with a 2-2 (ot) tie and 6-4 victory over visiting Minnesota while the two other conference match ups ended in splits. Arch-rivals Colorado College and Denver both won on their home ice, with the Tigers prevailing 3-2 last Friday and the Pioneers winning 5-3 last Saturday – enabling DU to maintain possession of the Gold Pan Trophy. And in Mankato, host Minnesota State split with Bemidji State as the Mavericks nailed down a 2-1 (ot) decision on Feb. 4 before the Beavers came back to take game two, 4-1. North Dakota and Wisconsin were both idle.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday-Saturday, Feb. 18-19, there will again be a full schedule of six WCHA series as Wisconsin hosts Minnesota, St. Cloud State entertains North Dakota, Colorado College visits Bemidji State, Alaska Anchorage hosts Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota Duluth travels to Minnesota State, and Denver hosts Michigan Tech.

In this week's (Feb. 7, 2011) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA again has six member teams ranked among the nation's top 20. Minnesota Duluth is up to No. 3, Denver is No. 4, North Dakota is No. 5, Wisconsin is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is up to No. 16 and Colorado College is up to No. 19. Also receiving votes this week was Minnesota.

In this week's (Feb. 7, 2011) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, Minnesota Duluth is No. 3, Denver is No. 4, North Dakota is No. 5 and Wisconsin is No. 7. Also receiving votes was Nebraska Omaha.

Through games of Feb. 7, the 12 WCHA men's member teams own a collective 50-24-12 record in games vs other Div. 1 clubs this season for a .651 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 27-10-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-8-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the four other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 6-2-0 (.750) vs independents.

Team by team records in non-conference play are as follows: Alaska Anchorage (1-1-0), Bemidji State (4-2-0), Colorado College (5-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan Tech (2-4-2), Minnesota (3-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (5-0-1), Minnesota State (6-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (4-2-1), St. Cloud State (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (8-1-1).

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will release its 2010-11 WCHA Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes on Thursday, Feb. 10.

The prestigious annual WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. This will be the sixth annual group of winners.

To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also

have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

## WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy,

### Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha

#### All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new

format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday,' hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

## WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

### Seawolves

#### University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves hit the road to face the nationally-ranked North Dakota Fighting Sioux on Feb. 11-12 at the Ralph Engelstad Arena in the only WCHA series meeting between the two this season. The Seawolves and Fighting Sioux met at the 2010 Kendall Hockey Classic for an exhibition game on Oct. 9 at the Sullivant Arena ... the teams tied 5-5 (ot).
- The Fighting Sioux lead the all-time series record against UAA, 41-18-3 and at UND, 24-3-3 (.850).
- Prior to the Kendall Hockey Classic, UND and UAA last met on Oct. 24, 2009, with UAA winning, 2-1 at the Sully. In the last 10 meetings, UND leads, 7-3-0. The last time UAA won in North Dakota was on Nov. 14, 2008 (3-2). The last time UAA swept UND was on Nov. 17-18, 2006 at home and have never swept UND on the road.
- The Seawolves will travel to North Dakota after sweeping the Michigan Tech Huskies, 4-1 and 4-2 in the only regular season series between the two teams on Feb. 4-5. With the wins, the Seawolves lead the all-time series record against Tech, 27-24-10 and at UAA, 17-10-6. UAA now holds a four game streak against MTU and a 7-game unbeaten streak.
- Last weekend, the Seawolves posted their second WCHA sweep of the season – UAA also swept Colorado College on Jan. 14-15 at home. The home sweep was UAA's second straight, coming on the heels of its Jan. 14-15 home sweep of CC – the first time that has happened since the 1998-99 season. The last time UAA swept two series in a season was during the 2001-02 season under head coach John Hill.
- Following the series, the Seawolves have nine conference wins – tying the most for head coach Dave Shiyak. Shiyak has registered nine wins in the last two seasons as well. With six WCHA games remaining, Shiyak could set a career high.
- UAA held the Huskies to under 20 shots on net in both games – the first time of the season that UAA has done so.
- Individually, senior Sean Wiles scored a goal for the first time in the last 15 games and his first multi-goal game since Oct. 10, 2010 against Air Force.
- Also scoring a multi-goal game was junior Curtis Leinweber on Feb. 4 – his first of his career. Leinweber also netted his first shorthanded goal of his career.
- Breaking a six-game pointless streak was freshman Jordan Kwas with a goal on Feb. 5.
- Picking up his first point of the season was sophomore Tyler Currier with an assist on Feb. 4.

### Beavers

#### Bemidji State University

- At the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team is coming off a weekend series split at Minnesota State Feb. 4-5. After dropping a heart-breaking 2-1 overtime loss in the series opener, the Beavers bounced back to earn a 4-1 victory Saturday.
- Last Saturday's victory gave BSU its first victory over Minnesota since Nov. 4, 2006 – a streak spanning seven games.
- BSU goaltender Dan Bakala played a major role in the Beavers' success in Mankato, Minn. The junior turned away a career-high 41 shots in last Friday's 2-1 overtime loss. Last Saturday the junior again hit the 40-save plateau, stopping 40-of-41 shots to lead the Beavers to a 4-1 victory. He finished the weekend 1-1-0 with 81 saves and a .964 save percentage, allowing just three goals for a 1.47 goals-against average in 122:32 between the pipes. With 81 saves on the weekend, Dan Bakala surpassed Layne Sedevie and into third place on BSU's Division I-era career saves list. He now has 1,305.
- Jordan George and Matt Read led the Beavers in scoring at MSU last weekend, recording three points apiece. George netted three goals, including a power-play goal and the game-winner for a career-high two goals in the victory last Saturday. Read recorded three assists in the series finale to match a career-high for helpers in a game.
- Despite getting out shot 84-39 in the series, BSU out scored the Mavericks 5-3. BSU has been out shot 17 times this season, which included its last six consecutive games and has been out shot 754-647 on the season.
- Averaging 24.9 shots per game this season, BSU ranks 55th in the country in shots per game.
- Including last Friday's 2-1 overtime loss, the Beavers now have three overtime

losses in seven extra time games (2-3-2) this season, which matches BSU teams of 2002-03, 2004-05 and 2005-06 for the BSU Division I-era mark for OT losses in a season (3). BSU is 20-20-40 in overtime since the 1999-2000 season. The Beavers have escaped overtime with at least a tie in over 75% (60-of-80) of overtime affairs in the last 11 seasons.

- The BSU power-play entered last Saturday's series finale at MSU in a bit of a slump. In the first nine games back from break, the Beavers had only four goals on the man-advantage (4-for-26), but Brad Hunt scored a power-play marker at the 8:16 mark of the second period snapping a 113:24 streak without a goal on the man-advantage.
- Hunt's was his first of the season and the first since Jan. 22, 2010 – a streak spanning 40 games. In his first 60 games at BSU he recorded 16 goals and his last 40 he has just one.
- BSU's penalty-kill unit was flawless Feb. 4-5 at Minnesota State, snuffing out all 10 of the Mavericks' power-play opportunities, including a 5:00 major midway through the third frame Friday and a 70-second 5-on-3 Saturday. The Beavers have allowed just three man-advantage goals in their last six games and 29 opponent chances (.906). The unit has now held opponents scoreless on 101-of-123 opponent man advantage opportunities this season (.821).
- BSU's four-goal outburst last Saturday put an end to three consecutive games with just one goal scored in each. The last time BSU was held to one or fewer goals in three consecutive games was Oct. 20-27, 2007 versus Merrimack and St. Cloud State.
- Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 150-9-12 when leading after two periods of play, which includes a perfect 7-0-0 mark in 2010-11. BSU has not lost a game when taking a lead into the third period since Jan. 18, 2008 at Colorado College – a streak spanning 47 games (45-0-2), now the longest current streak in college hockey. Quinnipiac saw its 59-game unbeaten streak when leading after two Saturday with an overtime loss to Union, 3-2.
- Picking up a win last Saturday, BSU's bench boss Tom Serratore, who is in his 10th season at BSU, moved to 174-141-35 (.547), leaving his just one shy of 175 wins in his career.
- The Beavers wrap up their current four-game road swing Feb. 11-12 when they travel to Houghton, Mich. for their first WCHA meeting with Michigan Tech. BSU is 2-2-0 all-time versus MTU, but carries a two-game winning streak versus the Huskies into the game. The last time the teams met was Nov. 28-29, 2008 in Bemidji, Minn. BSU earned a sweep in the series with a 3-0 victory followed by a 2-1 win.

### Tigers

#### Colorado College

- With last Friday's 3-2 victory over arch-rival Denver, No. 19-ranked Colorado College beat a top-five ranked opponent on national television (CBS College Sports) for the second week in a row.
- Despite Saturday's 5-3 setback at Magness Arena, the Tigers have lost only five of their last 21 encounters (10-5-6) with DU dating back to the 2005-06 season. They're 18-8-3 in 29 all-time meetings against the Pioneers at the World Arena.
- Colorado College's freshmen collectively have accounted for 82 points (32g, 50a) so far this campaign after adding six more (3g, 3a) to their total last weekend, when rookie forwards Archie Skalbeck, Alexander Krushelnyski and Dakota Eveland each struck for a goal.
- Left wing Jaden Schwartz, who has been out of the lineup due to an injury, leads the pack of first-year players with 26 points (15g, 11a) in just 17 appearances. The Tigers are 7-6 in 13 games without him.
- First-period goals by Skalbeck and sophomore right wing William Rapuzzi against Denver last Friday came just :56 seconds apart and marked the seventh time in 2010-11 that CC has scored twice within a minute.
- The Tigers have erupted for a pair of goals less than three minutes apart on 16 occasions this season after sophomore defenseman Michael Boivin and Eveland lit the lamp within 2:08 of each other in the opening five minutes of last Saturday's loss at DU.
- Colorado College, which remains undefeated (15-0-1) in 2010-11 when leading at the end of two periods, is winless (0-11) when trailing after 40 minutes of play.
- Last Saturday marked just the second time this season that CC has lost after scoring the first goal of a game. The Tigers are 12-2-1 when they've struck first in a contest.
- Krushelnyski became the 10th different Tiger to be credited with a game-winning goal this season with his tally at 14:58 of the second period of last Friday's 3-2

victory. Junior defenseman Gabe Guentzel, who set up the play with a pin-point clearing pass from behind his own net, assisted in on a GWG for the second time in 2010-11.

- Senior forward Tyler Johnson, who picked up an assist in each game last week, has collected at least a point in 18 of the team's last 24 outings. Johnson continues to lead the team in overall scoring, with a career-high 32 points (16g, 16a), and his 11 power-play goals remains a nation best.
- With his unassisted goal and an assist in last Saturday's 5-3 loss to the Pioneers, Eveland posted his fourth multiple-point game of the season.
- CC has gone scoreless on the power-play in three consecutive games heading into this week's series opener against Minnesota State.
- Krushelnyski has factored in on the game-winning goal in Colorado College's last two victories.

### University of Denver

- No. 4-ranked Denver (17-6-5, 13-4-3WCHA) travels to Minnesota (11-11-4, 8-9-3 WCHA) for a two-game series on Feb. 11-12.
- Denver is tied for first in the WCHA with Minnesota Duluth at 29 points, while Minnesota is seventh at 19 points.
- Minnesota has charted a 93-68-12 mark against Denver in the all-time series which began in 1951. The Pioneers are 25-51-6 against the Golden Gophers in Minnesota. DU sports a five-game winning streak against Minnesota and is 4-0 in its last four games against the Golden Gophers at Mariucci Arena. DU is 9-1-1 in its last 11 games against Minnesota.
- DU is sixth in the latest PairWise Rankings.
- The Pioneers retained the Gold Pan Trophy after splitting a two-game series against Colorado College last weekend. DU lost 3-2 at Colorado College on Feb. 4 and won 5-3 in Denver on Feb. 5. DU has won the last two Gold Pan's, but CC leads the all-time Gold Pan series 10-8.
- Denver is led in scoring by Drew Shore (16-15=31), Jason Zucker (17-11=28) and Anthony Maiani (7-21=28). Zucker leads the WCHA in league goal scoring (17) and is tied for first in points (26) in 20 games, while Shore is tied for sixth with 22 points (9g, 12a). Shore and Luke Salazar (13-9=22) are tied for eighth with nine goals each during league play. Shore is tied for ninth in WCHA scoring for all games and Zucker ranks second in goals and tied for 13th in points with Maiani.
- Freshman Sam Brittain (12-4-5, 2.13 GAA, .925 Sv%) and sophomore Adam Murray (5-2-0, 3.60 GAA, .871 Sv%) have split the goaltending duties the last five weekend series.
- Senior captain Kyle Ostrow (10-12=22) needs one point to join the Pioneer Century Club for 100-point scorers. Ostrow has 12 points (6g, 6a) during his career-best, eight-game point streak.
- Freshman Nick Shore (4-11=15) has eight points (3g, 5a) during his career-best, five-game point streak.
- Matt Donovan (6-14=20) and Zucker have three-game point streaks, while Drew Shore and Salazar are enjoying two-game point streaks.
- Maiani is Denver's current career scoring leader with 118 points (33g, 85a) in 145 games, which ranks tied for 53rd on DU's all-time scoring list.
- DU is 12-0-1 when scoring four or more goals and 15-0-3 when tied or leading after two periods.
- The Pioneers lead the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 85.8% and are ninth on the power-play at 18.8%.
- DU hosts Michigan Tech on Feb. 18-19 before traveling to Nebraska Omaha on Feb. 25-26. The Pioneers close out the regular-season against St. Cloud State on March 4-5.

## Huskies

### Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will host Bemidji State for Winter Carnival this weekend after dropping a pair of games at Alaska Anchorage Feb. 4-5.
- This weekend will mark the first time that the Beavers and Huskies have met in WCHA play. The home team has won every game in the four-game series.
- Tech is 73-41-10 all-time during Winter Carnival.
- Only six players on Tech's roster have every played against BSU.
- Deron Cousens tallied an assist each night against UAA to extend his assist streak to three games. He currently has a team-high 15 assists. He also has two goals for 17 points this season, tied for second on the team with fellow defenseman Steven Seigo who recorded a single assist at UAA.
- Evan Witt has scored both of his goals this season in his last four games after lighting the lamp last Saturday vs. the Seawolves. He has seven points (3g, 4a) in 48 career games played.
- Ricky Doriott recorded his first assist of the season last Saturday vs. UAA. He has nine points (1g, 8a) in 76 career games.
- Michigan Tech currently has the eighth hardest schedule in the nation.
- Michigan Tech was whistled for just 16 penalty minutes in the two-game series with UAA, second fewest for a WCHA series this season. Tech is the second least penalized team in the league (12.5 minutes per game).
- Michigan Tech will return to the road Feb. 18-19 for a two-game WCHA series at Denver.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

- Minnesota welcomes No. 2 Denver to Mariucci Arena for two games this weekend. Denver has won five straight games against the Gophers, which included consecutive 3-0 shutouts last year at Mariucci Arena. Denver has outscored Minnesota 18-2 in the last five meetings and has shutout the Gophers three times. The last time Minnesota beat the Pioneers was a 5-2 win on Nov. 21, 2008.
- The Gophers are in eighth place in the WCHA and have played every team ranked above them except Denver, who visits this weekend. Minnesota is 5-6-3 against teams ranked above them in the standings this year.
- Minnesota is 3-2-2 against teams ranked in the top 10 by USCHO.com this year (rankings at the time of the game). They will get the chance to improve that record this weekend against Denver. The Gophers are 1-0-0 against No. 8 Michigan and are 1-1-0 against No. 2 North Dakota. Minnesota is also 1-1-2 against Minnesota Duluth this year (Bulldogs were ranked No. 2 first time the teams played and No. 4 during the second meeting).
- Jay Barringall has played in 150 career games for the Gophers. He earned his 125th career point last Friday at Minnesota Duluth when he scored his 51st career goal. Barringall's next assist will be the 75th of his career.
- The Gophers scored four goals last Saturday at Minnesota Duluth, but lost the game 6-4. It was only the second time this season that the Gophers potted four goals and lost. The other game was a 5-4 setback on Oct. 15 against Nebraska-Omaha. The Gophers are 7-2-0 this season when scoring four or more goals.
- Nick Bjugstad recorded his first multiple-point game (2a) of the year and of his career last Saturday at Minnesota Duluth.
- Seniors Cade Fairchild and Mike Hoeffel have each played 139 career games and both have 82 career points. Fairchild, who had two goals on the weekend at Minnesota Duluth, has 20 goals and 62 assists for his career. Hoeffel who posted a goal and an assist on Saturday at UMD has 44 goals and 38 assists.
- Minnesota and its opponents have taken the same amount of penalties in 12 of 26 games this year, but seven of those 12 games have been the last seven on Minnesota's schedule.

- Seth Helgeson recorded his first career assist as a Gopher in his 42nd career game (Nov. 19 at Michigan Tech). However, the big blueliner now has five assists in his last 10 games, which ties him with Nick Bjugstad for the team lead during that span.

## University of Minnesota Duluth

- AUMD, unbeaten in seven of eight games since the start of the New Year, will remain at home for a second straight weekend to host St. Cloud State University in the lone two regular season meetings between the two clubs.
- After picking up three of a possible four points at the expense of Minnesota last Friday and Saturday night, UMD now finds itself sitting (along with the University of Denver) atop the WCHA standings – something it has not done this late in a season since Feb. 28, 2004 when the Bulldogs shared the league's top spot with the University of North Dakota.
- The Bulldogs followed up a 2-2 deadlock last Friday with the Gophers by derailing their longtime intrastate rivals 6-4 the following evening thanks to the offensive heroics of Mike Connolly. The junior left winger, who scored once in the opener, collected five goals Saturday which equalled the team mark set by Steve "Pokey" Trachsel against Lake Superior State on Nov. 17, 1972 in Duluth.
- UMD will come into this weekend's series armed with the nation's fourth best winning percentage (.740) off an 18-5-4 overall record.
- Three Bulldogs occupy the top five spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts at the moment – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is first with 40 points, senior right winger Justin Fontaine is third (37) and junior left winger Mike Connolly is tied for fourth (35 points). That trio was reunited for the rematch with Minnesota this past Saturday after skating together the first 21 games of the season Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 110 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog, ranks sixth among all NCAA pucksters in points and is third in assists. The 2010-11 WCHA Preseason Player of the Year went over the 100-point mark this past December (he now has 118) and joined Justin Fontaine (143) and Mike Connolly (117) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season. Fontaine, a two-time All-WCHA second team selection who is a team-leading +21 this season, holds down the No. 22 position on UMD's all-time points list (one point behind Hockey Hall of Famer Brett Hull) and has a shot at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15.
- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 69-41 margin from the second period on this season and have a NCAA-leading five overtime victories to their 2010-11 credit.
- Justin Faulk is currently the second highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment (0.75 points per game) and is second among all NCAA freshmen blueliners in total goals as well. In 24 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn., product has collected six goals (five of which have come on the power-play) and 12 assists for 18 points and has the second best plus-minus rating (+16) of any 2010-11 Bulldog. Faulk competed with the U.S. at the recent International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships in Buffalo and paced that team's defense in scoring.
- UMD is 12-0-1 when it has gotten on the scoreboard first in 2010-11 and 13-0-1 when it's taken a lead into the third period.
- After putting the clamps on an eight-game pointless skid at Michigan Tech on Jan. 21, freshman right winger J.T. Brown has collected two goals and five assists in the four games since. Brown, the Hockey Commissioner's Association National Rookie of the Month for October, resides in the No. 4 spot on the WCHA rookie scoring list with 23 points (7g, 16a) in 27 games.
- UMD had its consecutive shutout minutes streak snapped at a school-record 168:39 midway through the first period last Friday when Minnesota's Cade Fairchild scored on the power-play. Bulldog junior goaltender Kenny Reiter wound up making a UMD 2010-11 single-game high 36 saves on the night and was also credited with this third assist of the year on the team's first goal. In his last seven appearances, Reiter is 4-2-1 with a 1.50 goals-against average and a .946 saves percentage with a pair of shutouts. He has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.618 off a 22-13-3 record, including a 9-3-3 figure this winter) in team history. Only All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) has been more prosperous in that statistical category. Reiter's trusty counterpart, redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall, turned aside 32 of 36 shots the following night against the Gophers to boost his 2010-11 record to 9-2-1 which translates into a .792 winning percentage – the fourth best mark of any NCAA puckstopper at the moment.
- The Bulldogs are now unbeaten in 24 of their last 26 overtime games (11-2-13, including a 5-1-4 mark this winter) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season.

- Senior defenseman and team captain Mike Montgomery ended a personal 11-game pointless drought this past Saturday by assisting on a pair of goals in UMD's 6-4 triumph over Minnesota.
- Not only has UMD had dropped only one of its eight games in 2011 (6-1-1), but it's allowed only 10 goals during that stretch. In addition, the opposition has also managed to cash in on just three of 41 power-play opportunities as well (7.3%).
- Senior left winger Kyle Schmidt returned to the Bulldog lineup last Friday night after being sidelined for the previous seven games with a hand injury.
- UMD has lost just once (3-2 to visiting Wisconsin on Jan. 15) in its 12 series rematch games this season, going a 9-1-2.
- Travis Oleksuk's 11 goals this season (which equals his career high) have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up a WCHA-best six game-winning goals this season, has scored twice on the power play, once while a man down, once on a penalty shot and once with the goaltender pulled. Two of his goals thus far have been registered in overtime.
- UMD ranks second among WCHA schools in both in scoring offense (3.52 goals per game) and scoring defense (2.33 gpg).
- The Bulldogs also sport the WCHA's third most efficient power-play (20.6%) and have failed to score at least one man-advantage goal just seven times all season (they are, however, unbeaten in six of those seven contests – 5-1-1).

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State stands 12-12-6 overall and is 6-12-4 WCHA after splitting a home league series with Bemidji State (2-1 overtime win, 4-1 loss).
- The Mavericks are on the road this weekend for a two-game league series at Colorado College. The two teams split in Mankato back in October with MSU claiming a 5-4 win and the Tigers earning a 1-0 victory. CC leads the series by a 23-13-1 margin.
- Last Saturday's loss to Bemidji State is MSU's first loss to an unranked opponent since a 5-2 defeat at Michigan Tech Oct. 15.
- MSU has outshot its opponents by a 1017 to 930 margin on the year. The Mavericks have had at least 40 shots on goal six times this year and MSU's 33.9 shots per game mark ranks tenth in the country.
- As a group MSU's blueliners rank 11th in the nation in scoring with a 2.10 ppg mark.
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 170-194-53 (471).
- MSU's all-time record in 1,347 games played is 722-543-132 (.564).
- The win over BSU last Friday is MSU's first overtime victory this year and the Mavericks are now 1-1-6 in overtime games for 2010-11. The Mavericks, who have had four of their last eight games go into overtime, last claimed an overtime win March 12, 2010 when Kael Mouillierat's marker gave MSU a 5-4 win over St. Cloud State.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe got his first career game-winning goal when he scored in overtime to give MSU its 2-1 win over Bemidji State last Friday. Boe, who has 6-16=22 in 123 career games, has played in 69 consecutive games played to stand as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +12 leads the team.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 8-12=20 in the last 27 games, ranks second in team scoring with 8-14=22 in 30 games. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 20-71=91 in 142 career games to tie for third on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list. Davis, who is tied with Todd George (MSU 1996-2000) as MSU's all-time top-scoring defenseman for MSU's NCAA Division I era, is +7 on the year to rank third on the team.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 6-7=13 in his last 17 games played, has 10-54=64 and is +3 in 137 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and has racked up 9-35=44 in his last 66 games played. Youds is MSU's team-leader in penalty minutes (46). Youds enters this week's series at Colorado College owing 2-1=3 in the last four games.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht has 0-4=4 in the last nine games. Elbrecht, who has played in all 30 MSU games this year, has 1-5=6 for 2010-11 and his +4 ranks fifth on the team.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant, MSU's top-scoring newcomer, has 8-10=18 in 27 GP and is tied for third on the team scoring charts. His +10 on the year ranks second on the team and he's tied for the team lead in game-winning goals with two.
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, has had at least one point in ten of the last 15 games and during that time he's totalled 5-8=13. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 29-51=80 in 133 career games. His 80 career points ties him with Steven Johns

(8-72=80 in 142 GP from 2001-05) and Joel Hanson (32-48=80 in 149 GP from 2004-08) for 18th overall on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era.

- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has had at least 30 saves in a game eight times this year (out of his 24 games played), stands 10-10-4 for 2010-11 with a 2.91 goals-against average and .906 save percentage. Cook, who has three assists for his two-year MSU career, has 669 saves to rank 13th in the nation for the year.
- Junior forward Adam Mueller has 0-3=3 in the last four games. With 2-7=9 in 29 games this year, the Roseville, Minn., has reached career-highs for assists and points in a season.
- Junior forward Michael Dorr has totalled 7-6=13 in the last 12 games. The Roseville, Minn., native stands atop the Maverick scoring charts with 11-12=23 and he leads MSU in goals (11) and shots (105). He's also tied for the team lead in game-winning goals (2) and ranks second in power-play goals (3).
- Senior forward Andrew Sackrisson has 5-12=17 in 29 games this year and owns 17-33=50 in 116 career games. A fifth-round (124th overall) NHL draftee by St. Louis in 2006, Sackrisson has 2-7=9 in the last 12 games.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (8), assists (8) and points (16) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who has had three points in a game twice this year, has registered 2-6=8 in the last 12 games.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has collected 2-5=7 in the last 11 games. Zuck has 5-10=15 in 27 games this year to rank ninth on MSU's scoring charts.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on MSU's roster with at least ten games played not to have a penalty this year. Lehrke has 1-3=4 in 24 games in his rookie season.

## Mavericks

### University of Nebraska Omaha

- No. 16-ranked Nebraska Omaha finishes off a season-high six-game home stand this week when it hosts No. 7-ranked Wisconsin on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 11 and 12.
- This will be the first meeting of the two schools since the 2003-04 season when the teams played in the Mavericks' season-opening Mutual of Omaha Stampede Tournament.
- UNO will be looking for its first win over the Badgers this weekend. The Mavericks are 0-5-0 head-to-head.
- The Mavericks earned their first series sweep since December with a pair of wins over St. Cloud State last weekend. The Mavs picked up a 3-0 shutout on Friday, their second 3-0 win over the Huskies this year. On Saturday, UNO erased a 3-0 deficit and won 4-3 to finish the four-game season series with a mark of 3-0-1 against SCSU. Prior to this season, the Mavericks had never beaten St. Cloud State.
- Last Friday's 3-0 win over St. Cloud State was the sixth shutout of the season for the Mavericks and for goaltender John Faulkner. Faulkner leads the nation in shutouts and is now just one away from tying the school record for career shutouts. Current Tampa Bay Lightning goaltender Dan Ellis holds the record with 7.
- Faulkner posted his busiest shutout last Friday. His 33 saves in the 3-0 win were the most he's had to make in any of his six whitewashes this season.
- Freshman goaltender Mike Taffe earned his first career victory in UNO's 4-3 win over St. Cloud State last Saturday. Taffe came into the game to start the second period and stopped all 17 shots he faced to earn the win and improve to 1-1-0 on the season. In two appearances to this year, he's given up just one goal on 30 shots and earned a 0.87 goals-against average and a .967 save percentage.
- UNO's previous school record for team shutouts in a season was four set during the 2000-01 season.
- UNO had lost the second game of a series in four consecutive outings before earning the 4-3 win over St. Cloud State on Feb. 5.
- UNO's three-goal comeback to win last Saturday's game is the largest comeback for a win in school history.
- With an assist both last Friday and last Saturday night, senior captain Joey Martin moved to within three points of reaching the 100-point mark for his career. Martin is bidding to become the 12th Maverick to reach that mark all-time. With each point, Martin reaches a new career-high for points in a season. He now has 29 while playing in all 28 games.
- Defenseman Eric Olimb led the Mavericks in scoring last weekend with two goals and two assists. He notched the game-winning goal in Friday's 3-0 win over St. Cloud State and had the first goal in Saturday's 4-3 win. Olimb is tied for the team lead in assists with 21 and ranks fourth in team points with 24 to lead all UNO defensemen. He ranks fourth in scoring among WCHA d'men for all games played.

- Senior Matt Ambroz continues to improve his career mark for goals in a season. He scored his 14th of the year in UNO's 3-0 win over St. Cloud State.
- Freshman Matt White became the first Maverick to eclipse the 100-shot mark for the season. With 13 shots in two games last week, he now has 106 for the season. Rich Purslow is the next Maverick poised to crack the century mark in shots. He has 99.
- Martin now leads the Mavericks with 29 points. He and Olimb are tied for the team lead with 21 assists each. Ambroz leads the team with 14 goals and five power-play goals. Martin and Ambroz lead the team with a +15 rating. Alex Hudson leads the Mavs with three game-winning goals. White leads all UNO freshmen with 18 points and is second on the team with 12 goals. Freshman defenseman Michael Young leads the team with two shorthanded goals.
- Six of UNO's 10 freshmen have reached double-digits in points this season, and the Mavericks rank fourth in the country in scoring by their freshman classes with 3.07 points per game.
- With the two wins last weekend, head coach Dean Blais is now just two wins from his 300th career victory (298-141-41).

## Fighting Sioux

### University of North Dakota

- No. 5-ranked North Dakota (19-8-2, 14-6-0 WCHA) returns from an off week to host Alaska Anchorage on Friday and Saturday.
- The Sioux enter the week in third place in the WCHA, one point behind co-league leaders Denver and Minnesota Duluth.
- The Sioux are 40-17-4 (.689) all-time against UAA after a 5-5 tie in the season opener at the Seawolves' Kendall Hockey Classic. UND is 24-3-3 (.850) against the Seawolves in Grand Forks.
- UND opens this final eight-game stretch of the regular season without senior defenseman Chay Genoway (3-5 weeks) and sophomore forward Danny Kristo (indefinitely).
- UND had temporarily climbed back into first place two weeks ago with a split at Colorado College, winning 6-0 on Saturday after a 4-2 loss on Friday. Six different players scored in that Saturday win, with all six snapping goal-scoring droughts of at least five games: Joe Gleason (first goal in 53 career games), Derrick LaPoint (ended 10-game skid), Carter Rowney (seven games), Brett Hextall (six games), Matt Frattin (five games), Brock Nelson (five games). Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell stopped 21 shots for his fourth shutout of the season, tied for fourth-most in UND single-season history. Sophomore forward Danny Kristo had three assists. Dell made a career-high 36 saves in Friday's 4-0 loss. The Tigers built a 4-0 lead through two periods before UND's Jason Gregoire scored twice in the third period. Gregoire's second goal came shorthanded while the Sioux were killing a 5-on-3 CC power-play. Gregoire added an assist on Saturday and now has eight points (6g, 2a) in six games since returning from a seven-game injury absence.
- UND is now 9-4-1 on the road this season, including an 8-2-0 mark in the WCHA.
- After playing 11 games at forward, senior defenseman Jake Marto was moved back to the blueline for the CC series and responded with one assist and a +4 rating.
- Sophomore defenseman Andrew MacWilliam had an assist each night at CC and now has points in three straight games for the first time in his career.
- Dell's win at CC on that Saturday was his NCAA-leading 18th of the season. He has now started each of UND's last 16 games.
- Frattin's goal on Saturday at CC was his WCHA-leading 21st of the season, which ranks third nationally. It also snapped Frattin's five-game skid without a goal and was Frattin's first PPG since Nov. 27 against Notre Dame.
- Senior Brad Malone notched an assist on Saturday at CC to give him 25 points, tying the career high he established last season in 43 games.
- The Sioux lead the WCHA (all games) in goals per game (3.66).
- CC's 40 shots on Jan. 28 marked the first time the Sioux had yielded that many since Jan. 24, 2009 against Denver. On Saturday, the Sioux allowed only 21 CC shots, including two in the first period and six in the second period.
- The Sioux are 15-1-1 when scoring four or more goals and 13-0-1 when leading after two periods.

### Huskies

#### St. Cloud State University

- The St. Cloud State men's hockey team (11-14-3, 7-11-2 WCHA) will be making its debut at the new AMSOIL Arena in Duluth this weekend, as the Huskies will battle the Bulldogs on Feb. 11-12. The Huskies lead the all-time series 53-37-6, which started with an 8-1 win by SCSU during the 1946-47 season. At the NCAA Division I level, the Huskies own a 50-33-5 series record against UMD. In the last five outings against UMD, the Huskies are 3-1-1.
- This will mark SCSU's first game at UMD since a 5-1 setback on Nov. 29, 2008. Last year, the Huskies and Bulldogs only played twice with SCSU charting a 3-3 tie and 3-1 win at the NHC on Oct. 23-24, 2009. SCSU will be looking to snap a three-game losing slide in Duluth. The last time the Huskies posted a win in Duluth was a 4-2 win on Nov. 25, 2006 at the old DECC.
- SCSU coach Bob Motzko is 12-5-1 in action against UMD during his tenure in St. Cloud.
- SCSU juniors Drew LeBlanc and Nate Hardy are both graduates of Hermantown High School, which is a suburb of Duluth.
- The Huskies will finish their regular season with an incredibly tough homestretch. On Feb. 4-5, the Huskies lost a 3-0 and 4-3 series at Nebraska Omaha (the WCHA's fourth place team). On Feb. 11-12, SCSU will travel to first place Minnesota Duluth, followed by a Feb. 18-19 home weekend against third place North Dakota. On Feb. 25-26, the Huskies will host fifth place Wisconsin and they will finish the regular season with a March 4-5 trip to first place Denver.
- SCSU's Drew LeBlanc currently ranks 4th in the league (WCHA games only) with 23 points (9g, 14a). UMD's Jason Zucker and Jack Connolly lead the league with 26 points apiece. LeBlanc scored a goal and an assist at UNO on Feb. 5. His 8-game point streak was snapped on Feb. 4, as the Huskies were shutout by the Mavericks at the Qwest Center. LeBlanc leads SCSU in all offensive categories this winter with 11 goals, 23 assists and 34 points.
- Senior Garrett Roe continues his march up the SCSU scoring charts. In his career, Roe now has 61 goals, a school record 106 assists and 167 points. He ranks 4th in the team record for career points, first in assist and 7th for goals. Roe posted a goal and assist against UNO on Feb. 5, and he now has 6g, 19a in 2010-11.
- Sophomore David Eddy also enjoyed a two-point night at UNO on Feb. 5. He tallied the Huskies' first goal of the game on the PP and also had an assist on Garrett Roe's goal. Eddy has posted 4g, 5a in his first eight games played this season for the Huskies.
- SCSU will be back at the National Hockey Center on Feb. 18-19 for a pair of WCHA dates against North Dakota. Both games are slated to start at 7:07 pm CT. These games will be part of USA Hockey's "Hockey Weekend Across America." Feb. 18 has been designated as "Wear Your Favorite Team's Hockey Jersey" Day and Feb. 19 is "Bring a Friend to the Rink" Day. Fans are encourage to wear their Husky jersey throughout the day on Feb. 18. The National Hockey Center will also host a "Try Hockey for Free Clinic" on Feb. 19.

### Badgers

#### University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (19-8-3, 11-7-3 WCHA) begins the home stretch with its final four weeks after a bye week last week.
- No. 7-ranked UW makes its first WCHA trip to No. 16-ranked Nebraska Omaha (16-10-2, 12-6-2 WCHA) and first since the 2003-04 season. The Badgers are 5-0-0 all-time against UNO, including 2-0-0 in Omaha, Neb.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz scored his 15th goal of the season in UW's last action, tying him for seventh on UW's single-season scoring list for defensemen, just four behind UW's record of 19 set by Sean Hill during the 1990-91 season. Schultz has 11 points (2g, 7a) in his current five-game point-scoring streak and has points in 11 of his last 13 games.
- Senior goaltender Scott Gudmandson has allowed two goals or less in each of his last 13 games played, going 11-2-0 during that stretch. Gudmandson leads the nation with a 1.78 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage.
- Senior forward Patrick Johnson tied his career high with three points on Jan. 29, tallying his first career short-handed goal and adding two assists.
- Three Badgers ended double-digit goal-scoring droughts in their most recent action at Michigan Tech, including freshman forward Mark Zengerle (19 games), freshman forward Tyler Barnes (15 games) and senior forward Sean Dolan (14 games).

- Podge Turnbull scored his 11th goal of the season in Wisconsin's last outing and the Badgers improved to 10-0-0 on the season in games he scores a goal.
- Wisconsin leads the nation with a 2.00 goals-against per game average.
- The Badgers are one of just two teams in the nation (along with Miami) that can boast four players with at least 30 points (Schultz – 39; Smith – 25; Zengerle – 32; Gardiner – 30).

### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
