It's Colorado College vs Wisconsin Sunday Night for a Berth in the 2011 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five; UND, DU, UMD, UAA, BSU Earn Trips to Saint Paul with First Round Playoff Sweeps Tickets Still Available for Final Five, Set for March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul

MADISON, Wis. – Five teams – North Dakota, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Alaska Anchorage and Bemidji State – posted two-game sweeps in their first round, best-of-three WCHA playoff series to earn berths in the upcoming 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five with one more to be decided on Sunday (March 13) night when No. 6 tournament seed Colorado College hosts No. 7 seed Wisconsin.

The Tigers (20-17-3) and Badgers (21-15-4) will face-off at 7:07 pm MT at Colorado Springs World Arena in a decisive third game. The two teams are 2-2-0 in head-to-head matchups this season.

For the Final Five, the six first round winners are re-seeded No. 1 thru No. 6 based on their regular season finish. So far, North Dakota is the No. 1 seed, Denver is the No. 2 seed, Minnesota Duluth is the No. 3 seed, Alaska Anchorage is the No. 5 seed and Bemidji State is the No. 6 seed. The winner of the CC vs UW first round series will be the No. 4 seed.

At the 2011 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, No. 1 seed North Dakota and No. 2 seed Denver receive a bye. Thursday's two match-ups will have No. 6 seed Bemidji State (14-17-5) vs No. 3 seed Minnesota Duluth (22-9-6) in a 3:37 pm CT face-off. The evening game at 7:07 pm CT on Thursday will have No. 5 seed Alaska Anchorage (16-17-3) vs Sunday night's Colorado College/Wisconsin winner as the No. 4 seed. On Friday, Denver (23-10-5) will play the winner of the Minnesota Duluth vs Bemidji State game at 2:07 pm CT while North Dakota (28-8-3) will play at 7:07 pm CT against Alaska Anchorage, Colorado College or Wisconsin. Then on Saturday, the Final Five will conclude with the Broadmoor Trophy championship

In first round WCHA playoff results, regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion North Dakota won 8-0 and 3-1 over No. 12 seed Michigan Tech on Friday (March 11) and Saturday (March 12). No. 2 seed Denver posted back-to-back first round playoff victories over No. 11 seed Minnesota State, 4-2 and 3-2 (ot). No. 10 seed Bemidji State claimed successive victories at No. 3 seed Nebraska Omaha, 4-2 and 3-2. No. 4 seed Minnesota Duluth upended No. 9 seed St. Cloud State twice, 4-2 and 3-2 (3 ot). No. 8 seed Alaska Anchorage swept at No. 5 seed Minnesota, 4-3 and 2-0. And No. 6 seed Colorado College and No. 7 seed Wisconsin split their first two games, with the Badgers winning 3-1 on Friday and the Tigers coming back for a 4-3 (ot) triumph on Saturday.

In head-to-head matchups this season ... North Dakota was 4-0-0 vs Michigan Tech; Denver was 5-0-1 vs Minnesota State; Bemidji State was 5-0-1 vs Nebraska Omaha; Minnesota Duluth was 2-1-1 vs St. Cloud State; Alaska Anchorage was 3-1-0 vs Minnesota; and Colorado College and Wisconsin were tied 2-2-0 pending Sunday night's encounter.

Saturday, March 12 WCHA Playoff Highlights

#12 Michigan Tech 1 @ #1 North Dakota 3: Left winger Taylor Dicken's first goal of the season at 5:34 of the second period proved to be the game-winner as the host Sioux edged the Huskies 3-1 to claim their first round playoff series before a sellout crowd of 11,689 at Ralph Engelstad Arena. Tech struck first on a goal from left winger Ryan Furne at 6:15 of the opening period and held that lead until UND winger Brett Hextall tied the score at 3:33 of the second. In nets, Aaron Dell had 18 saves for the Sioux while Josh Robinson stopped 35 for the Huskies.

#11 Minnesota State 2 @ #2 Denver 3 (ot): Trailing 1-0 in the third period, the host Pioneers rallied for a 3-2 win over the visiting Mavericks when left winger Jason Zucker lit the lamp at 1:29 of overtime. DU took the first round series, 2-0-0. MSU defenseman Ben Youds' power-play goal at 0:46 of the second period was the only goal in the contest until Denver defenseman Matt Donovan tied things up at 1-1 with a power-play tally at 9:35 of the third. Not to be denied, MSU took a 2-1 lead on left winger J.P. Burkemper's goal at 11:56 but the Pioneers again rallied to tie the game at 13:45 on a power-play tally by defenseman David Makowski. In nets, Sam Brittain had 32 stops for DU while Austin Lee had 31 for MSU.

#10 Bemidji State 3 @ #3 Nebraska Omaha 2: Center Matt Read scored twice, including the game-winner at 8:48 of the third period, and Dan Bakala sparkled with 41 saves to lift the visiting Beavers over the Mavericks 3-2 in WCHA playoff action before 7,783 at Qwest Center Omaha. The victory moved BSU to 5-0-1 vs UNO this season and gave them the first round series, 2-0. The Mavericks, who outshot their opponent 43-20, struck first when right winger Rich Purslow scored at 9:32 of the first period. Read then tied the game on a power-play at 11:34. In period two, BSU left winger Jamie MacQueen's tally at 8:15 put his club up 2-1 before Read's second of the night in the third gave them a 3-1 lead. UNO then closed to within one at 3-2 with an extra-attacker goal from left winger Ryan Walters at 19:52.

#9 St. Cloud State 2 @ #4 Minnesota Duluth 3 (3 ot): It took 101:13 of action to decide the series, but the host Bulldogs prevailed 3-2 following left winger Mike Connolly's game-winner at 1:13 of the third overtime. An AMSOIL Arena crowd of 5,076 saw UMD outshoot the Huskies, 63-39, but unable to foil SCSU goaltender Mike Lee, who finished with 60 saves. Two first period goals from left winger Jack Connolly put UMD up 2-0 before the Huskies closed to within one at 3:06 of the second period on a power-play goal from right winger David Eddy and tied it at 2-2 in the third on defenseman Taylor Johnson's conversion at 9:20. In nets for UMD, Kenny Reiter had 37 saves.

#8 Alaska Anchorage 2 @ #5 Minnesota 0: the visiting Seawolves completed a two-game, first round playoff sweep over the Golden Gophers with a 2-0 victory before 9,346 at Mariucci Arena as left winger Mickey Spencer's first goal of the season at 2:32 of the third period proved to be the game-winner and Chris Kamal stopped all 24 shots on goal. Scoring an insurance goal for UAA at 13:24 of the third was winger Tommy Grant while right winger Brett Cameron had two assists. Between the pipes for UM, Kent Patterson had 23 saves.

#7 Wisconsin 3 @ #6 Colorado College 4 (ot): Left winger Jaden Schwartz's

second goal of the game, coming on a power-play at 5:48 of overtime, enabled the host Tigers to force a decisive third game on Sunday night with a 4-3 win over the Badgers before 6,652 at Colorado Springs World Arena. Wisconsin, with goals from forwards Craig Smith and Podge Turnbull in the first, led 2-0 and again at 3-2 after forward Sean Dolan tallied at 5:44 of the third. But CC rallied to tie it at 2-2 on defenseman Gabe Guentzel's goal at 3:11 of the third and again at 3-3 when Scott Winkler found the back of the net at 16:31. In goal, Joe Howe had 27 saves for the win for CC while Scott Gudmandson had 24 saves for the UW.
