The Badgers' 2006 Frozen Four crown capped a run of five straight national championships for WCHA-member teams, with Minnesota winning in 2002 and 2003, Denver in 2004 and 2005, and Wisconsin in 2006.

WCHA regular season champion (MacNaughton Cup), Final Five (Broadmoor Trophy) champion and No. 1-ranked North Dakota is the top seed and No. 5-ranked Denver is the No. 2 seed for the Midwest Regional in Green Bay. The Sioux enter regional competition with a 13-game unbeaten streak at 12-0-1. No. 11-ranked Minnesota Duluth is the No. 3 seed for the East Regional in Bridgeport, Conn. And No. 14-ranked Nebraska Omaha is the No. 3 seed and No. 13-ranked Colorado College the No. 4 seed for the West Regional in St. Louis. There are no WCHA teams in the Northeast Regional, which will be held in Manchester, N.H.

The schedule for the Midwest Regional, set for March 26-27 at Resch Center in Green Bay, finds North Dakota (30-8-3) taking on No. 4 seed Rensselaer (20-12-5) at 12:30 pm CT on Saturday followed by Denver (24-11-5) against No. 3 seed Western Michigan (19-12-10) at 4:00 pm CT. The championship game will be on Sunday at 4:30 pm CT.

At the East Regional at Webster Bank Arena at Harbor Yard in Bridgeport, Minnesota Duluth (22-10-6) will face-off against No. 2 seed Union College (26-9-4) on Friday at 3:00 pm ET. The other semifinal will have No. 1 seed Yale (27-6-1) taking on No. 4 seed Air Force (20-11-6) at 6:30 pm ET. The championship contest is set for 6:30 pm ET on Saturday.

The West Regional at Scottrade Center in St. Louis, set for Friday and Saturday, will consist of semifinal match ups on March 25 between Nebraska Omaha (21-15-2) and No. 2 seed Michigan (26-10-4) at 4:30 pm CT and No. 1 seed Boston College (30-7-1) and No. 4 seed Colorado College (22-18-3) at 8:00 pm CT. The championship game will be held on Saturday at 8:00 pm CT.

And at the Northeast Regional at Verizon Wireless Arena in Manchester, Saturday semifinal pairings have No. 1 seed Miami (23-9-6) vs No. 4 New Hampshire (21-10-6) at 4:00 pm ET and No. 2 seed Merrimack (25-9-4) against No. 3 Notre Dame (23-13-5) at 7:30 pm ET. The Northeast Regional title contest will be played at 8:00 pm ET on Sunday.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to Saint Paul for the 2011 NCAA Men's Frozen Four, set for Thursday, April 7 and Saturday, April 9 at Xcel Energy Center. The two semifinal games on Thursday will be at 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm CT while the national championship game will get underway on Saturday at 6:00 pm CT.

In this week's (March 21, 2011) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA has five teams in the top 20 and five who received votes. North Dakota is again No. 1, Denver is No. 5, Minnesota Duluth is No. 11, Colorado College is No. 13 and Nebraska Omaha is No. 14. Also receiving votes this week were Wisconsin, Minnesota, Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State and St. Cloud State.

In this week's (March 21, 2011) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, North Dakota is No 1, Denver is No. 5, Minnesota Duluth is No. 12, Colorado College is No. 13, and Nebraska Omaha is No. 14.

for a .648 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 28-10-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-9-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the four other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 17-10-7 (.603) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 6-2-0 (.750) vs independents.

WCHA Issues Statement Regarding Today's Announcement from Big Ten Conference

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association today (March 21, 2011) issued the following statement from Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod following an announcement from the Big Ten conference that they intend to form a men's ice hockey league beginning with the 2013-14 season.

"Today's announcement from the Big Ten conference has been anticipated for some time now," said Commissioner McLeod, "and this will obviously have an impact on the WCHA. But change creates opportunity, too. The timeline of this Association spans seven decades and has included expansion and contraction on numerous occasions, but the success of this organization has remained constant. The commitment to excellence by our member institutions will not waver and working together we will push forward to assure our future remains bright."

Earlier today, the directors of athletics of Big Ten-member institutions that sponsor men's ice hockey announced their intention to recommend to the Big Ten Council of Presidents/Chancellors in June the establishment of men's ice hockey as an official conference sport for the 2013-14 academic year with participation by Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State, Penn State and Wisconsin.

Minnesota was an original founding member of the WCHA, together forming the seven-member Midwest Collegiate Hockey League (MCHL) for the 1951-52 season with Colorado College, University of Denver, University of Michigan, Michigan State University, Michigan Technological University and University of North Dakota. The MCHL then evolved into the Western Intercollegiate Hockey League (WIHL) for the 1953-54 season and then was renamed the Western Collegiate Hockey Association for the 1959-60 season. Wisconsin was granted admission into the WCHA beginning with the 1969-70 campaign.

For the 1965-66 season, the WCHA added the University of Minnesota Duluth as an eighth member team. Wisconsin came on board for the 1969-70 season, followed by the addition of University of Notre Dame for 1971-72. Michigan, Michigan State, Michigan Tech and Notre Dame then left the WCHA following the 1980-81 season to join the CCHA, reducing the WCHA to six teams from 1981-84. For 1984-85, Michigan Tech returned to the WCHA and together with newly-admitted member Northern Michigan University, brought league membership back to eight teams. The WCHA then admitted St. Cloud State University as a ninth member for the 1990-91 season, followed by the University of Alaska Anchorage as a 10th member for the 1993-94 season. Northern Michigan then left the WCHA again following the 1996-97 season to rejoin the CCHA. The WCHA then expanded again for the 1999-2000 season with the admittance of Minnesota State University, Mankato as a 10th member. Then beginning with this 2010-11 season, Bemidji State University and University of Nebraska Omaha joined the WCHA to bring membership to 12 teams.

North Dakota's Matt Frattin, Chay Genoway Honored as WCHA Player of the Year, WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year to Highlight 2010-11 Men's Award Winners Wisconsin's Justin Schultz Voted WCHA Defensive Player of the Year by Head Coaches; Denver's Jason Zucker is WCHA Rookie of the Year; Nebraska Omaha's Dean Blais Honored as WCHA Coach of the Year; UND's Frattin and Aaron Dell Reign as WCHA Scoring, Goaltending Champions; Sioux Place Three Players, Minnesota Duluth Two on All-WCHA First Team; 140

MADISON, Wis. – Two seniors representing regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion University of North Dakota – forward **Matt Frattin** and defensemen **Chay Genoway** – were today (March 10) honored as WCHA Player of the Year and WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year, respectively, to highlight the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association individual awards for the 2010-11 season. Frattin and Genoway were also both voted to the All-WCHA First Team.

Student-Athletes Earn All-WCHA Academic Team Honors

The league's other major individual awards went to University of Wisconsin defensemen **Justin Schultz** as WCHA Defensive Player of the Year, University of Denver forward **Jason Zucker** as WCHA Rookie of the Year, **Frattin** as WCHA Scoring Champion, North Dakota netminder **Aaron Dell** as WCHA Goaltending Champion, and to **Dean Blais** of the University of Nebraska Omaha as WCHA Coach of the Year.

Frattin, who received 58 votes in player of the year balloting, also captured the league's scoring title (conference games only) with 40 points (22g, 18a), the most points by a Sioux player in league games since 2000-01. In 28 league games he averaged 1.43 points per game as the Sioux claimed the regular season championship for a record 15th time overall and second time in the past three seasons. A native of Edmonton, Alberta, Frattin is tied for the NCAA Div. 1 lead with 29 goals, including a nation's-best 19 goals scored away from home, and leads UND in points (49), goals (29), power-play goals (9), game-winning goals (4), and shorthanded goals (2). He is currently riding his second nine-game point streak for the season, scored a goal in eight straight games earlier this season, and has gone consecutive games without a point on only two occasions. Frattin is a draftee of the National Hockey League's Toronto Maple Leafs.

Genoway, who also earned All-WCHA First Team honors, was named the men's WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year in a vote of league member team Faculty Athletic Representatives. A two-time team captain and one of only three individuals to earn WCHA Scholar-Athlete honors four times (the others were Scott McCulloch of Colorado College from 2005-09 and Jenna Hewitt of Minnesota State from 2006-10), Genoway maintains a 3.558 cumulative grade-point average at North Dakota and will graduate in May with a BBA in Management. After a season-ending injury last year, the Morden, Manitoba product went on to earn a 4.0 GPA in the fall of 2010, has done a team-leading 68.5 hours of community service during this academic year and was named an ESPN the Magazine All-American as a junior. He is the fourth highest scoring defenseman overall in the WCHA this season with 26 points (6g, 20a) despite missing eight games, ranked second in the WCHA in points per game by a defenseman at 0.95, leads all active WCHA defensemen with 116 career points, and put together a 12-game point streak earlier this season, tying a 33-year old school record for defensemen. Genoway is also a finalist for the Lowe's Senior Class Award and has earned UND's Archie Krum Memorial Athletic Scholarship for "leadership qualities, high academic standards and athletic excellence" three years in a row.

The WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year Award is determined from nominations made by the member institutions and each institution then has one final vote. The criteria is as follows: 1) must

be a senior student-athlete, i.e. one who is finishing his competition as an eligible player in the WCHA; 2) consistently displays outstanding sportsmanship on and off the ice; 3) is a good student making satisfactory progress toward a degree; and 4) is a good hockey player who has performed consistently as a regular member of the team.

To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

The league's 12 head coaches voted the University of Wisconsin's Justin Schultz as WCHA Defensive Player of the Year. From West Kelowna, British Columbia, Schultz is the first sophomore to win the award and also earned All-WCHA First Team accolades. Schultz is the second straight Badger to earn the league's top defensive award, with defensemen Brendan Smith earning the honor in 2009-10. Schultz's 18 goals so far this season are the most for any defenseman in the country since the 2002-03 season and one off the UW record. He's the nation's leading point scorer among defensemen and also leads the Badgers with 46 points. Among his goals are nine power-play goals, five first goals and three game-winning goals, including an overtime game-winning goal. A draftee of the NHL's Anaheim Ducks, he posted the first hat trick by a UW defenseman since 1991-92 and logs over 30 minutes of ice time per game.

Honored as the WCHA Rookie of the Year was University of Denver forward Jason Zucker, who was named on 78 ballots after leading all first-year conference players in scoring – and finishing third overall – with 36 points (20g, 16a). From Las Vegas, Nevada, Zucker made a strong bid to become just the second freshman in the 59-year history of the WCHA to win a scoring title, with DU's Vic Venasky first accomplishing the feat in 1970-71 with 39 points (14g, 25a) in 22 games. One of only two players to score 20 goals in WCHA action, he ranked second nationally among rookies with 1.12 points per game, had 12 multiple-point games, and tallied 14 points (4g, 10a) during a career-high nine-game point streak. Zucker was named the National Div. 1 Rookie of the Month for February and was a two-time WCHA Rookie of the Week. He is a draftee of the NHL's Minnesota Wild.

Earning the WCHA goaltending crown for 2010-11 was North Dakota's Aaron Dell, who was also voted to the All-WCHA First Team. A sophomore from Airdrie, Alberta, Dell topped all league netminders with a 1.97 goals-against average in conference play, posting a 19-4-1 WCHA mark and a .912 save percentage over 1,432:09 of action. He won the league's goaltending crown by the widest margin since 2001-02 and led the WCHA in league wins (19) and winning percentage (.812). In 33 overall games, Dell is tied for second in the nation in wins (24), ranks second in GAA (1.95), third in winning percentage (.781), and is tied for fourth in shutouts (4). A two-time WCHA Defensive Player of the Week, he put together a shutout streak of 224 minutes,:31 seconds, the second-longest in school history and the longest in nearly 60 years.

The WCHA Coach of the Year for 2010-11 is Dean Blais of the University of Nebraska Omaha. Blais, who earns the award for the fourth time in his collegiate coaching career, led his Mavericks to a 17-9-2 league mark and third place finish, just one point out of second, as well as to a home playoff berth in the team's first season in the WCHA. Named on 49 ballots, he guided UNO to it's best-ever conference finish, to the most conference wins in school history, and as of March 10, the Mavericks have also already secured the second-highest single season win total in school history with 21. Blais, who earned his 300th career win on Feb. 12 against Wisconsin, was previously honored as the league's coach of the year in 1996-97, 1998-99 and 2000-01 as head coach at North Dakota.

WCHA Announces Record Group of 90 Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes for 2010-11 Sixth Annual Class Includes 30 Repeat Honorees

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jeno (Chair, women's league) announced on Feb. 10, 2011 that a total of 90 men's and women's student-athletes make up the sixth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients. WCHA Team Notebooks • 2011 NCAA Men's Div. 1 Hockey Championship

Tigers Colorado College

• Colorado College will participate in the NCAA tournament for the 12th time in the last 17 seasons and 20th time overall in the 73-year history of Tiger Hockey.

- CC, which won national championships in 1950 and 1957, most recently reached the modern-day Frozen Four in 2005 after consecutive appearances there in 1996 and 1997.
- Last Thursday's 4-2 victory over the University of Alaska Anchorage in St. Paul, Minn., was the first for the Tigers at the WCHA Final Five since 2005, when they lost 1-0 to archrival Denver in the championship game after blanking Minnesota by a 3-0 count in the semifinals.
- Despite finishing with a 3-3 record in six meetings with UAA in 2010-11, they now are 51-17-3 (.739) all-time against the Seawolves.
- This season marks the eighth time in Scott Owens' 12 years as head coach that Colorado College has surpassed the 20-victory plateau. CC has accomplished the feat on 14 occasions overall since the 1993-94 campaign.
- Freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz, who assisted on five of the team's seven goals last weekend, has collected 9 points (2g, 7a) in five post-season outings. He already tops all Tigers in career playoff scoring.
- Schwartz, who also leads CC with 13 multiple-point performances in just 28 games, has averaged 1.5 points per outing while amassing 42 (15g, 27a) overall for the season. That's just one fewer than senior winger Stephen Schultz, whose career-high 43 points (16g, 27a) ranks first among Colorado College players heading into NCAAs.
- Schultz has collected at least one point in all five outings so far this post-season, as well as in 10 of the team's last 11 games overall.
- Schwartz and the rest of CC's freshman class have collectively accounted for 110 points (37g, 73a) this season after adding seven assists, including one each by left wing Dakota Eveland and defenseman Eamonn McDermott, in last Thursday's victory over Alaska Anchorage.
- Of sophomore right winger William Rapuzzi's 19 career goals as a Tiger, eight have come at the expense of UAA. An Anchorage native, Rapuzzi has 10 points, including a goal and an assist at last week's Final Five, in 10 all-time appearances vs. the Seawolves.
- Sophomore defenseman Joe Marciano, who tripled his career output with a pair of goals against UAA, became the 12th different Colorado College player to be credited with a game winner in 2010-11 and the 21st to factor in on at least one.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who wears No. 13 on his jersey, had gone 13 outings without a goal before scoring a pair in last Friday's 4-3 loss to North Dakota.
- CC remains undefeated (16-0-1) this campaign when leading after two periods, and is 20-3-3 when ahead or tied after 40 minutes of play.
- Colorado College has scored at least one power-play goal in 10 of its last 11 outings and in 29 of 43 overall for the season.
- The Tigers now are 0-4 against North Dakota at the WCHA Final Four/Five, having lost to the Sioux in 1997 (5-1), 2001 (2-1) and 2008 (4-2) prior to last weekend.

PioneersUniversity of Denver

- No. 2 seed Denver (24-11-5) plays No. 3 seed Western Michigan (19-12-10) at the NCAA Midwest Regional in Green Bay, Wis., on Saturday, March 26 at 3:00 pm MT (4:00 pm CT). No. 1 seed North Dakota (30-8-3) and No. 4 seed RPI (20-12-5) led by former DU assistant coach Seth Appert join Denver and Western Michigan at the regional.
- The Pioneers are making their fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and 22nd overall, while Western Michigan is making its fourth appearance and first since 1996.
- DU looks for its first NCAA Tournament win since posting back-to-back NCAA championships in 2004 and 2005.
- The Pioneers are 26-17 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and are tied for second with seven NCAA titles (1958, 1960, 1961, 1968, 1969, 2004 and 2005).
- Denver has lost its first round NCAA game in each of the last three seasons.
- DU meets WMU for the first time in the NCAA Tournament and is 2-2 all-time against the Broncos.
- DU is 4-1 against North Dakota and is 1-0 against RPI in the NCAA Tournament.
- Denver dropped a 3-2 double overtime thriller against North Dakota in the 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five championship game on March 19. Goaltender Sam Brittain, defenseman Matt Donovan and forward Anthony Maiani earned Final Five all-tournament honors.
- Sophomore Drew Shore leads Denver in scoring with a career-high 45 points (23q, 22a), which ranks sixth in the WCHA.
- Jason Zucker ranks second among WCHA rookies with 41 points (21g, 20a) and second among NCAA rookies with 1.08 points per game.
- Sam Brittain ranks first in the WCHA in save percentage (.923), and is third in goals-against average (2.24) and winning percentage (.661). Brittain is 3-1 in the post-season with a 2.03 goals-against average and .932 save percentage.
- Anthony Maiani and David Makowski lead DU postseason scoring with five points each.
- Head coach George Gwozdecky is 10-7 in the NCAA Tournament at Denver.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The Bulldogs open play in the NCAA East Regional this Friday by taking on second-seeded and reigning Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference regular season champion Union College of New York (26-9-4) at 2 pm CT in Bridgeport, Conn. Regional co-host and No. 1 seed Yale University (27-6-1) and No. 4 Air Force (20-11-6) will clash in the other semifinal Friday night with the championship game set for Saturday at 5:30 pm.
- The NCAA tournament berth is the seventh-ever for the No. 3 seeded Bulldogs and second in the past three years. UMD also qualified for the NCAA postseason in both 2008-09 in Minneapolis (where it made it to the quarterfinal round) and 2003-04 in Grand Rapids, Mich. (where it advanced to the Frozen Four semifinals) under current head coach Scott Sandelin, as well as in 1992-93, 1984-85, 1984-84 and 1982-83.
- UMD has faced Union College just seven times, that last coming on Nov. 22, 2003 when it bested the host Dutchmen 7-4 after the two clubs skated to a 2-2 overtime tie the previous night. The Bulldogs and Union College had four common opponents during the 2010-11 season, including Alaska Anchorage (UMD was 2-0-0; Union was 1-0-0), Bemidj State (1-1-1; 0-1-0), Clarkson University (2-0-0; 2-0-0) and Minnesota (1-1-2; 1-0-0).

Team Notebooks con't

- All-time against the entire East Regional field, the Bulldogs are a collective 14-1-1 6-0-1 vs Union College, 5-1-0 vs Yale and 3-0-0 vs Air Force.
- UMD has compiled a 9-8-0 all-time record in NCAA post season play while advancing to the Frozen Four on three occasions 2004, 1985 and 1984.
- UMD was the only WCHA club which went the entire regular season without being swept by any opponent the first time that has ever happened since the Bulldogs joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1961-62 and picked up at least one point in all of its WCHA series (another program first).
- For the first time since in 25 years (1982-86), the Bulldogs have posted three straight 22-win seasons and will enter the NCAA tournament sporting a .658 winning percentage – the ninth best mark in the nation. Three Bulldogs currently occupy the top four spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is second with 55 points, senior right winger Justin Fontaine is third (52 pts) and junior left winger Mike Connolly is fourth (49 pts). That line has combined for 43.5% of the team's scoring harvest this winter (156 of 358 points). In league games only, Jack Connolly wound up second in the WCHA scoring race with 37 points – just three points back of champion Matt Frattin of North Dakota. No Bulldog has finished as the WCHA scoring leader since Junior Lessard in 2003-04, although Justin Fontaine came within two points of accomplishing that feat as both a sophomore and junior and Jack and Mike Connolly did likewise last winter. UMD hasn't churned out three players with 50 or more points since 1992-93 – Derek Plante (92), Chris Marinucci (77) and Brett Hauer (51).
- 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award Top 10 Finalist Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 121 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog ranks fourth among all NCAA pucksters in total points and is second in assists (a WCHA-leading 39). He has generated the Bulldogs' highest scoring yield (54 points) since the 2003-04 season (Junior Lessard with 63 and Evan Schwabe with 57) and reached the 50-point plateau faster (35 games) than any UMD puckster in 17 years (Chris Marinucci did it in 32 outings on his way to receiving the Hobey Baker Memorial Award). Connolly, the school's first two-time All-WCHA first team pick in 25 years, has amassed more points (104) over the past two winters than any other skater in the WCHA. And talk about being a consistent contributor Connolly hasn't gone pointless for two straight games since the middle of the 2008-09 season and has been held without a goal and/or assist on only five occasions all year. He is also a +35 as a Bulldog.

Justin Fontaine, who is a team-leading +25 this season, was named to the All-WCHA second team for a third consecutive year this winter and joined center Mike Peluso (1995-98) and defenseman Norm Maciver (1983-86) as the school's only three-time all-league honoree of any kind. Fontaine has moved up to 17th place on UMD's all-time scoring list and has a shot – he needs seven points – at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15. Next in line is No. 16 Mike Peluso (163 points between 1994-98) and No. 15 Skeeter Moore (165 pts., 1983-87). Since the opening of 2008-09, no current WCHA combatant has racked up more points (146) than Fontaine, who will bring a career-high eight-game scoring streak into Friday's clash with Union.

Mike Connolly, who picked up his team-leading third shorthanded goal in UMD's 3-2 loss to Bemidji State last Thursday afternoon in the WCHA Final Five, is just the second NCAA I-era Bulldog to ever open his career with three straight 40-point seasons (Dan Lempe, the school's all-time scoring leader, is the other UMD skater to accomplish that feat doing so four times between 1976-80). Over the last 13 games, the 2010-11 All-WCHA first team pick has amassed 13 goals – including a school record-tying five in UMD's 6-4 triumph over Minnesota on Feb. 5 – and seven assists. Connolly leads all current Bulldogs in playoff scoring with 18 points on seven goals and 10 assists in 14 games and is a +11 to boot.

- This past December, Jack Connolly went over the 100-point mark (he now has 133) and joined Fontaine (158) and Mike Connolly (131) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. That marked the first time UMD had at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit since 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season. Jack Connolly, whose 100 points over the last two seasons have no equal among WCHA skaters, had his career-high 11-game scoring streak the longest by a Bulldog in two years snapped last Friday night.
- UMD has cashed in on nine of 28 man-advantage opportunities (32.1%) over the past eight games and currently owns the WCHA's third most efficient power-play (21.9%). The Bulldogs, however, have been limited to just four power play chances during their three-game postseason run, scoring on one of them.
- Justin Faulk, who celebrated his 19th birthday this past Sunday, is currently the third-highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country and is tied for first among NCAA freshmen blueliners in total goals as well. In 35 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn., product has collected eight goals six of which have come on the power-play and 19 assists for 27 points. (The only first-year UMD defenseman to ever turn in a higher scoring yield was Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Tom Kurvers with 30 points in 1980-81). Faulk, a member of both the All-WCHA third team and All-Rookie team, sports the fourth best plus-minus rating (+16) of any 2010-11 Bulldog and has finished with a negative figure in the department in only six games all season. Earlier this winter, he competed with the U.S. at the recent IIHF World Junior Championships in Buffalo and paced that team's defense in scoring.
- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 87-63 margin from the second period on this season and have a NCAA-leading six overtime victories to their 2010-11 credit. They have also given up the fewest third-period goals (28) of any WCHA club this season. In addition, UMD is 17-1-1 when it's taken a lead into the final period of play with that lone loss coming to Bemidj State in the WCHA Final Five opener.
- After putting the clamps on an eight-game pointless skid at Michigan Tech on Jan. 21, right winger and 2010-11 WCHA All-Rookie team selection J.T. Brown has picked up points in 11 of 14 outings since, collecting 10 goals and seven assists over that time. Brown, the Hockey Commissioner's Association National Rookie of the Month for October, resides in the No. 4 spot on the WCHA freshman scoring list with 33 points (15g, 18a) and one of just six Bulldogs to accrue ice time in all 38 games to date the lone newcomer to do so. The last first-year Bulldog to produce more goals in a single-season was NHL legend Brett Hull (32) in 1985-86.
- Even with last Thursday's sudden-death loss to Bemidiji State, UMD is still unbeaten in 27 of its last 30 overtime games (12-3-15) a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. A school-record 14 of the Bulldogs' 38 engagements this winter (36.8 percent) have required an extra session, and UMD is 6-2-6 in those. The six OT victories also bests the previous club standard of five set in 1984-85. Mike Connolly leads all active Bulldogs in career overtime goals with four, including the memorable one that capped off a 5-4 comeback win over Princeton University in the 2009 NCAA West Regional semifinals in Minneapolis.
- Junior goaltender Kenny Reiter, who has started each of the past six games, currently owns the WCHA's fourth best goals-against average (2.36) and the sixth best saves percentage (.911). In seven career playoff appearances (all starts), he has compiled a 4-3-0 record with a stingy 1.91 goals-against average and a .922 saves percentage. During his three years with the Bulldogs, Reiter has posted the second-best career winning percentage (.585 off a 25-17-5 record, including a 12-7-5 figure this winter) of any NCAA I-era Bulldog in team history, trailing All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85).
- The Bulldogs have been outshot only six times all season (including twice at both Colorado College on Feb. 25-26 and at North Dakota on Nov. 5-6) and are the WCHA's most penalized team at the moment, averaging 14.8 minutes of infraction time per game.
- Travis Oleksuk's career-high 13 goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who leads

the WCHA with seven game-winners, has scored three times on the power-play, once while a man down, once on a penalty shot and once with the goaltender pulled. Two of his goals thus far have been registered in overtime.

- Of the six pervious UMD clubs earned a NCAA postseason bid, only one the 1984-85 crew which featured current Bulldog volunteer assistant coach and Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Bill Watson had less losses entering the tournament (they were 33-8-2) than this year's team.
- UMD owns the WCHA's second most potent offense (3.39 goals per game) at the moment.
- All seven of sophomore right winger Mike Seidel's goals thus far in 2010-11 have come on the road.

Mavericks University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO will make its second ever appearance in the 2011 NCAA Division I ice hockey championship when it faces Michigan in the West Regional on Friday, March 25 at 4:30 pm CT. The winner will play the winner of the second game, Boston College against Colorado College, on Saturday night for the chance to advance to the NCAA Frozen Four in St. Paul, Minn.
- The Mavericks are one of five WCHA teams to receive bids to the NCAA Playoffs, the most of any Division I conference.
- The Mavericks' only other trip to the NCAA Playoffs was on March 24, 2006 when they lost to Boston University in the first round of regional play.
- The Mavericks have already played Michigan twice this year in nonconference action. UNO won 4-2 to open the series but lost 6-1 in the finale. The Mavericks have won three of the last four meetings with the Wolverines.
- The Mavericks have not played neutral site game this season.
- UNO's third-place finish in the WCHA is the highest conference finish in school history. The previous high was fourth place in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association in the 2000-01 season.
- The Mavericks set a new school record with 17 conference wins this year (17-9-2). Their previous high was 15, also set by the 2000-01 squad.
- The Mavericks have allowed the fewest shorthanded goals of all WCHA teams for all games played 1.
- John Faulkner has 20 wins this season, just one from tying the school record for wins in a season by a goaltender, a mark held by Dan Ellis.
- Alex Hudson is tied with Brandon Scero for fifth in career game-winning goals with eight.
- The Mavericks have eight players who have scored 10 or more goals, the most among all WCHA teams. They are Matt Ambroz 17, Matt White 14, Alex Hudson 12, Rich Purslow 12, Joey Martin 11, Terry Broadhurst 11, Brock Montpetit 11 and Ryan Walters 11).
- Seven UNO players have set career highs in points this season Ambroz, Martin, Olimb, Hudson, Broadhurst and Brent Gwidt.
- Martin and Ambroz lead the Mavericks with 34 points. Ambroz leads the team with 17 goals, six power-play goals and a +19 rating.
- Eric Olimb leads the team with 24 assists and leads all UNO defensemen with 27 points.
- Alex Hudson leads the Mavs with four game-winning goals.
- Matt White leads all UNO freshmen with 25 points and is second on the team with 14 goals.
- Freshman defenseman Michael Young leads the team with two short-handed goals.
- Aneloski leads the team with 58 blocked shots.

Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

- Top-ranked North Dakota (30-8-3) is the No. 1 seed (No. 2 overall) for the NCAA Midwest Regional in Green Bay, Wis., this weekend and will face No. 4 seed (No. 15 overall) Rensselaer on Saturday afternoon.
- UND's 13-game unbeaten streak (12-0-1) is tied with Miami's (10-0-3) for the longest active streak in the nation.
- The Sioux and the Engineers have not met since the 1989-90 season, when current UND head coach Dave Hakstol and assistant coach Dane Jackson were Sioux teammates. Current associate head coach Cary Eades was then in his first stint as an assistant coach on the UND coaching staff. The Sioux swept that home series by scores of 2-1 and 5-3.
- UND is 7-1-0 (.875) all-time against RPI, including a pair of wins in the 1984 NCAA tournament.
- The Sioux are coming off of their second consecutive Broadmoor Trophy championship after defeating No. 13 Colorado College (4-3) and No. 5 Denver (2 ot) at the WCHA Final Five in St. Paul. UND became the first team since Minnesota in 2003 and 2004 to repeat as champions.
- The Sioux also won their 15th league-leading MacNaughton Cup as WCHA regular season champions. Prior to this season, UND had not won both trophies in the same season since 1996-97, when the Sioux went on to win the national championship.
- Senior forward and Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist Matt Frattin was named the WCHA Final Five Most Valuable Player after scoring the game-winner both nights, including the double-overtime winner in the championship game. The goals were Frattin's NCAA-leading 34th and 35th goals of the season, making him just the second 35-goal scorer (Brandon Bochenski, 2003-04) at UND in the last 21 years. Frattin is riding his second eight-game goal-scoring streak of the season, the fourth-longest in UND history, and is on a career-long 13-game point streak (15g, 12a). He leads the WCHA with 57 points in 41 games.
- Frattin was joined on the WCHA Final Five all-tournament team by senior defenseman and Sioux captain Chay Genoway, who had two assists in the tournament, including an assist on the championship-clincher. Genoway's 122 career points lead all active NCAA DI defenseman, and his next point will tie him fourth all-time among UND rearguards.
- Sophomore goaltender Aaron Dell made 40 saves in last Saturday's 2-OT victory, the first 40-save effort by a Sioux since Jean-Philippe Lamoureux made 41 stops in UND's 3-2 overtime win over at Wisconsin in the 2008 NCAA Midwest Region championship. Dell is riding a 12-game unbeaten streak (11-0-1) and an eight-game winning streak, both of which are the longest of his career. He ranks second in the nation with a 1.88 goalsagainst average.
- Sophomore Danny Kristo returned to the Sioux lineup last weekend after missing 10 straight games due to injury. He scored a goal in each game at the WCHA Final Five, tied for the team lead with three points, and led the team with a +4 plus/minus rating. Kristo has reached the scoresheet in 12 of his last 14 games and his six points in his last three.
- The Sioux reached the 30-win plateau for the first time under seventhyear head coach Dave Hakstol. UND has 34 postseason wins (WCHA and NCAA combined) during Hakstol's seven years, which is 10 more wins than any other WCHA school during that time.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, procede to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
 - e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
