Minnesota, Colorado College Clinch Final Two Home WCHA Playoff Berths With Wins Friday; North Dakota Claims MacNaughton Cup Outright; Five First Round Match Ups to be Decided Saturday Eve Single Game Tickets on Sale Monday for 2011 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five

MADISON, Wis. – Minnesota and Colorado College have captured the final two first round Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoff berths after the Golden Gophers played to a 3-3 (ot) tie at Bemidji State on Friday night while the Tigers won on the road at Wisconsin by a 3-2 count. Minnesota is unbeaten over their last six contests at 4-0-2. North Dakota, meanwhile, made certain no one else would share the regular season title and MacNaughton Cup with them after the Sioux prevailed on the road at Michigan Tech, 6-1, to stretch their unbeaten streak to eight games (7-0-1).

In other WCHA action on Friday night, Minnesota Duluth downed visiting Nebraska Omaha 4-1 to move into a tie for second place heading into the final regular season games, St. Cloud State upended host Denver, 3-2, to move into seventh place, and Alaska Anchorage defeated host Minnesota State, 4-0, to move within a point of eighth place.

There are more than 60 possible scenarios heading into the last day of the regular season (see page 2 of this release and Saturday's (March 5) schedule of six WCHA games will determine the remaining five first round WCHA playoff match ups. League champion and No. 1 playoff seed North Dakota is already set to host No. 12 seed Michigan Tech next weekend.

The Sioux (25-8-3, 20-6-1 WCHA) and the Huskies (4-27-4, 2-23-2 WCHA) will face-off today at 5:07 pm ET at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton. UND is 1-0-0 vs MTU. Denver (20-10-5, 16-8-3 WCHA) will host St. Cloud State (15-15-5, 11-12-4 WCHA) at 7:07 pm MT at Magness Arena. SCSU leads the season series 1-0-0. Minnesota Duluth (20-8-6, 15-7-5 WCHA) will entertain Nebraska-Omaha (20-13-2, 16-9-2 WCHA) at 7:07 pm

CT at AMSOIL Arena. The Bulldogs lead the season series 1-0-0. Minnesota (15-12-6, 12-10-5 WCHA) will engage host Bemidji State (12-16-5, 8-14-5 WCHA) at Sanford Center for a 7:07 pm CT puck drop. That two-game season series is tied 0-0-1. Wisconsin (19-14-4, 11-13-3 WCHA) will face-off against visiting Colorado College (19-15-3, 13-12-2 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT at the Kohl Center in Madison. CC is 1-0-0 vs the UW this season. And Alaska Anchorage (13-17-3, 11-14-2 WCHA) will take on host Minnesota State (14-15-6, 8-15-4 WCHA) at Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato at 7:07 pm CT. That series is deadlocked at 1-1-1.

Looking ahead to next weekend, the first round of WCHA playoffs, a best-of-three series format, will get underway on Friday, March 11 and continue through Sunday, March 13 (if necessary). Teams hosting first round playoff series are No. 1 North Dakota, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota and Colorado College.

Friday, March 4 Highlights

North Dakota 6 @ Michigan Tech 1 (WCHA): Right winger Matt Frattin scored the game-winning goal and added three assists as the visiting Sioux clinched the WCHA championship and MacNaughton Cup outright with a 6-1 league victory over the Huskies before 2,115 at MacInnes Student Ice Arena. Frattin's winner at 13:58 of the second period snapped a 1-1 tie as UND went on to score the final five goals. Four other UND players had two points each in forwards Brad Malone (1g, 1a) and Jason Gregoire (1g, 1a) and defensemen Ben Blood (1g, 1a) and Jake Marto (2a). Scoring for MTU in the first period to tie the game at 1-1 was center Daniel Holmberg.

Nebraska Omaha 1 @ Minnesota Duluth 4 (WCHA): the line of center Travis Oleksuk (2g) and wingers Kyle Schmidt (2a) and J.T. Brown (2a) combined for six points and Kenny Reiter stopped 29 of 30 shots on goal as the host Bulldogs won 4-1 over the Mavericks before 6,497 at AMSOIL Arena. Oleksuk's goal at 12:02 of the first period held up as the game-winner and UMD went 2-of-4 on the power-play. For UNO, left winger Johnnie Searfoss tied the game at 1-1 with a goal at 11:42 of the opening period.

St. Cloud State 3 @ Denver 2 (WCHA): the visiting Huskies received the game-winning goal from center Aaron Marvin at 18:24 of the third period and goaltender Mike Lee stopped 32 of 34 shots on goal in a 3-2 WCHA road victory over the host Pioneers before 5,398 at Magness Arena. Denver center Nick Shore tied the game at 2-2 with a goal at 3:54 of the third period. SCSU, 1-of-4 with the extra man, held the Pioneers scoreless on all six of their power-play chances.

Colorado College 3 @ Wisconsin 2 (WCHA): Goals from right winger Stephen Schultz (1g, 1a) and center David Civitarese in the final 5:23 of the third period lifted the visiting Tigers to a 3-2 conference victory over the Badgers and to a home-ice playoff berth before 13,493 at the Kohl Center. Wisconsin left winger Patrick Johnson's goal just 0:34 into the final stanza gave his club a 2-1 advantage before Schultz tied it at 14:37. Civitarese's game-winner then came at 17:05 of the third.

Minnesota 3 @ Bemidji State 3 ot (WCHA): center Patrick White scored a pair of goals for the Golden Gophers while defenseman Brad Hunt netted the game-tying goal for the host Beavers on a power-play at 19:41 of the third period as the two rivals skated to a 3-3 overtime draw before a sellout crowd of 4,373 at Sanford Center. The point clinched a first round home playoff berth for Minnesota and stretched their unbeaten streak to six games at 4-0-2. BSU led 2-1 after the first period following center Aaron McLeod's goal at 12:28 of the first. White then gave the Gophers a 3-2 advantage at 16:20 of the third before Hunt's power-play, extra-attacker goal knotted the score at 3-3.

Alaska Anchorage 4 @ Minnesota State 0 (WCHA): Left winger Nick Haddad scored two goals and Chris Kamal stopped all 35 shots on goal for the shutout as the visiting Seawolves blanked the Mavericks 4-0 in WCHA action before 3,247 at Verizon Wireless Center. Notching the game-winner for Alaska Anchorage on a power-play at 18:37 of the opening period was left winger Tommy Grant. UAA blanked MSU on all five power-play chances while the Seawolves went 1-of-3. The win evened the season series at 1-1-1 heading into Saturday night's finale.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
