## Top-Rated Wisconsin Wins First Two in Romp; No. 7 UND on Road to Take on No. 2 BU; No. 4 UM to Host Four-Team East/West Showcase; BSU, MSU Play Non-Conference Series; WCHA Teams to Participate in Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October No. 6 Minnesota Duluth Hosts Minnesota Whitecaps in Sept. 30-Oct. 1 Exhibitions; St. Cloud State Joins Host Gophers, Union College, Syracuse in Minneapolis for Weekend Event; Beavers, Sioux, Ohio State Post Exhibition Victories; USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Poll for Sept. 27 has UW No. 1, UM No. 4, UMD No. 6, UND No. 7 ... MADISON, Wis. – The University of Wisconsin women's hockey team opened the 2011-12 season by raising the national championship banner at the Kohl Center last Friday, Sept. 23 and then went out and showed Lindenwood University the Badgers are a team to be reckoned with again. The top-rated Badgers beat the Lady Lions 11-0 in the opener and then came back to record a 13-0 victory on Sunday, Sept. 25 in a game where they outshot their opponent, 72-3.

The 13 goals scored is tied for third on the National Collegiate Athletic Association women's all-time list for most goals scored in a game by a team. The games were the first played by Lindenwood against a NCAA Division 1 opponent. The Lindenwood program is transitioning from the club level to the D1 level this year.

The two stars on offense for the Badgers were senior Hilary Knight and junior Brianna Decker as the two both recorded three-goal hat tricks, the fifth-career hat trick for Knight, who was voted the pre-con't

season player of the year in the annual Western Collegiate Hockey Association coaches' poll, and third for Decker. For the weekend, all 13 skaters in the UW lineup recorded points. Knight, Decker and Kelly Jaminski all had seven points in the two games.

Most of the rest of the WCHA teams swing into play this coming weekend. No. 7-ranked North Dakota, which scored 10-0 and 11-0 exhibition wins over the University of Manitoba last weekend, visits No. 2-ranked Boston University, the team which lost to Wisconsin in the national title game last March, in the premier matchup of games Sept. 30-Oct. 1.

Bemidji State, which beat the Thunderbay Queens, 10-3, in an exhibition game on Sept. 23, hosts Providence College at Sanford Center while Minnesota State takes on visiting Lindenwood at All Seasons Arena in the other non-conference series. St. Cloud State and host Minnesota compete in the East/West Showcase at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. On Friday, St. Cloud State faces Union College while No. 4-ranked Minnesota meets Syracuse. The two WCHA teams then switch opponents on Saturday. In upcoming exhibition games this Friday and Saturday, No. 6-ranked Minnesota Duluth hosts the Minnesota Whitecaps at AMSOIL Arena.

Both Ohio State and Wisconsin, meanwhile, are idle this weekend. The Buckeyes defeated visiting Wilfrid Laurier, 3-1, in an exhibition game on Sept. 23.

Conference play for 2011-12 begins the weekend of Oct. 7-9. The first WCHA matchups will have Bemidji State at Ohio State (Friday/Saturday), St. Cloud State at Minnesota (Friday/Saturday) and North Dakota at Wisconsin (Saturday/Sunday).

## 2011-12 WCHA Head Coaches Pre-Season Poll

There will be no surprises from the coaches who have seen its league win the last 12 women's national championships. The University of Wisconsin swept to the national championship in a memorable season last year (2010-11) and, according to a preseason poll of league coaches, the Badgers are the pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's title again in 2011-12.

The Badgers, who won the WCHA regular season crown and the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF a year ago before beating Boston University 4-1 to win the national title, return 18 players this season. Wisconsin collected six first place votes and 47 points in the poll of the league's eight head coaches.

Minnesota finished second with 43 votes, including two first place votes. Minnesota Duluth, with 37 points, was selected to finish third. Like Wisconsin, UMD qualified for the NCAA tournament last season.

North Dakota was picked to finish fourth, followed by Ohio State in fifth place, Bemidji State in sixth, Minnesota State in seventh and St. Cloud State in eighth.

Wisconsin senior forward Hilary Knight, a member of the women's

U.S. Olympic Hockey Team in 2010, received six votes and is the head coaches' pick to be preseason WCHA Player of the Year. An AHCA Division 1 First Team All-American as a sophomore and junior, Knight was also a Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award Top 10 finalist in 2010-11 and has scored 112 goals in her first three seasons. Brianna Decker, Knight's teammate on Wisconsin, also received two votes.

Three players – North Dakota forward Michelle Karvinen, Minnesota forward Meghan Lorence and Minnesota Duluth defenseman Brigette Lacquette – are the head coaches' choice as pre-season WCHA Rookie of the Year. Minnesota's Rachel Ramsey and Minnesota Duluth's Jenna McParland also had one vote each.

## Wisconsin Ranked No. 1 in First USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Poll for 2011-12 Minnesota No. 4, Minnesota Duluth No. 6, North Dakota No. 7

The defending national champion Wisconsin Badgers start this season where they ended last season – at No. 1 in the USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Poll ([www.uscho.com](http://www.uscho.com)). Wisconsin received all 14 first-place votes.

Boston University comes in second, edging out No. 3 Cornell by five points.

Minnesota sits at No. 4, while Boston College rounds out the top five.

Minnesota Duluth goes one notch later at No. 6 and North Dakota sits in the seventh rank.

Mercyhurst comes in eighth, while Quinnipiac, not ranked in last season's final poll, starts the year at No. 9.

Dartmouth and Providence tied for the 10th spot in the poll.

## WCHA Announces Women's Composite Schedule for 2011-12 Season

### 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA Women's Frozen Four to be Held at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth; 112-Game Conference Slate to Launch Oct. 7; Wisconsin Reigns as Defending WCHA Regular Season, WCHA Playoff and NCAA Frozen Four Champs; Association Welcomes New Ohio State Head Coach Nate Handrahan

MADISON, Wis. – Coming off an unprecedented 12th consecutive national championship season, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's (WCHA) women's league today (Aug. 10) released its composite schedule for the upcoming 2011-12 season.

As college hockey's most successful women's conference, the WCHA will look to add to that legacy in season No. 13 with what should be a highly-competitive 112-game conference slate among the league's eight member teams that gets underway Oct. 7 and the appearance of both the 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF (conference playoff championship) and the 2012 NCAA Women's Frozen Four (national championship) at 6,764-seat AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn.

"We look forward to our 13th season as a Division 1 women's hockey conference with great anticipation," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, who has been the guiding voice of the league since its founding in 1999. "We should be stronger across the board and we can say with confidence that the WCHA will again be at the forefront of the women's game.

"We are also tremendously excited to showcase both our conference playoff championship (WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF) and the women's national championship (NCAA Frozen Four) at the beautiful new AMSOIL Arena in Duluth; we are thrilled to be able to showcase our great game in one of the sport's most impressive new facilities. We also know UMD will do a wonderful job in hosting these two premier events."

The 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be contested Friday, March 2 and Saturday, March 3 at AMSOIL Arena. There will be two semi-final match ups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship slated for Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. The tournament winner receives an automatic bid to the national tournament.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for Friday, March 16 thru Sunday, March 18, returns to Duluth for the third time since 2001. There will be two semi-final match ups on Friday with the title contest being played on Sunday. Both the 2003 and 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Fours were held in Duluth at the DECC (Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center) with the host UMD Bulldogs capturing the national championship on both occasions. Wisconsin is the defending national champion.

The WCHA would also like to extend a special welcome to new Ohio State head coach Nate Handrahan, who spent the previous five seasons building the program at Robert Morris and succeeds the retired Jackie Barto. Barto had coached the Buckeyes from their first season of 1999-2000.

"We are thrilled to welcome Nate into the WCHA family," said Martin. "He is an energetic, highly-qualified coach who will both continue and expand on the legacy left by Jackie Barto. He is committed to the well-being of his student-athletes, both on and off the ice."

The initial on-ice action of 2011-12 will take place over the Sept. 23-25 weekend. In non-conference play, Wisconsin will host upstart Lindenwood University out of St. Charles, Mo., on Friday and

Sunday. In exhibition contests, Ohio State will host Wilfrid Laurier out of Waterloo, Ont., Bemidji State will entertain the Thunderbay Queens, and North Dakota will host the Univ. of Manitoba.

On the second weekend of the new season (Sept. 30-Oct. 1), non-conference action finds Minnesota hosting the East/West Showcase tournament with St. Cloud State, Syracuse and Union College, North Dakota heading east to take on Boston University, Bemidji State welcoming Providence College, and Minnesota State opening with a home series against Lindenwood Univ. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the visiting Minnesota Whitecaps.

The season long, 112-game conference slate, which consists of each league-member team playing a total of 28 WCHA games (four games vs each of other seven members – two home and two away), opens the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Oct. 7-9, with three two-game series. Defending WCHA regular season champion Wisconsin will host North Dakota, Minnesota will entertain St. Cloud State, and Ohio State will host Bemidji State. Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State, meanwhile, won't open their respective league seasons until Oct. 21-22 when the Bulldogs entertain Wisconsin and the Mavericks play at Minnesota. The conference schedule concludes the weekend of Feb. 17-19.

During the 2011-12 campaign, WCHA-member teams will also engage in some interesting non-conference pairings. By team, those are:

Bemidji State: Sept. 30-Oct. 1 vs Providence College, Oct. 14-15 @ Maine, Nov. 10 vs Lindenwood in Eveleth, MN (U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game), and Dec. 30-31 @ Robert Morris.

Minnesota: Sept. 30-Oct. 1 East/West Showcase (with St. Cloud State, Syracuse and Union College), Nov. 18-19 vs New Hampshire, Nov. 26-27 @ Harvard.

Minnesota Duluth: Oct. 8-9 vs Boston College, Oct. 14-15 @ Connecticut.

Minnesota State: Sept. 30-Oct. 1 vs Lindenwood University, Oct. 7-8 vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 14-15 @ Robert Morris.

North Dakota: Sept. 30-Oct. 1 @ Boston University, Oct. 15-16 vs Vermont, Jan. 4 vs Lindenwood University.

Ohio State: Nov. 18-19 @ Syracuse, Dec. 2-3 vs Niagara, Dec. 30-31 vs Princeton.

St. Cloud State: Sept. 30-Oct. 1 @ East/West Showcase (with host Minnesota, Syracuse and Union), Oct. 28-29 vs Robert Morris, Nov. 18-19 @ Niagara.

Wisconsin: Sept. 23 & 25 vs Lindenwood University, Oct. 28-29 vs Boston University, Nov. 18-19 @ Rensselaer.

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, Feb. 24 thru Sunday, Feb. 26 with four first round, best-of-three, series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 playoff seed at the No. 4 playoff seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, to be held March 2-3 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Wisconsin is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 9 thru Sunday, March 11 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2012 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested Friday, March

16 and Sunday, March 18 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn.

Among the highlights from the 2010-11 season were:

- Wisconsin completed a trophy hat trick, winning the WCHA regular season title, the WCHA playoff crown, and the national championship. It was the fourth NCAA title for the Badgers, who finished as the No. 1-ranked team in the country and a 27-game unbeaten streak, and compiled a 37-2-2 overall record.
- Wisconsin's Meghan Duggan was named the winner of the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, given annually to the top Div. 1 women's player. Also among the Kazmaier top 10 finalists from the WCHA were junior forward Haley Irwin of Minnesota Duluth, junior forward Hilary Knight of Wisconsin, and sophomore goaltender Noora Rätty of Minnesota.
- Four WCHA-member teams ranked among the nation's Top 10 in the final national polls ... Wisconsin was No. 1, Minnesota Duluth was No. 5, Minnesota was No. 6/7 and North Dakota was No. 9.
- WCHA-member teams combined for a 26-12-3 non-conference record in 2010-11, for a .671 winning percentage.
- Five WCHA players were honored as 2011 Div. 1 REEBOK Women's Hockey All-Americans, as announced by the American Hockey Coaches' Association. Wisconsin forwards Meghan Duggan and Hilary Knight, along with Minnesota Duluth defenseman Jocelyne Larocque were named to the first team while UW forward Brianna Decker and Minnesota goaltender Noora Rätty were second team honorees.
- Wisconsin's Mark Johnson was named the Div. 1 women's national coach of the year.
- WCHA post-season award winners for 2010-11 included Wisconsin's Meghan Duggan as player of the year and league scoring champion, Minnesota Duluth's Jocelyne Larocque as WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year and defensive player of the year, Minnesota's Amanda Kessel as rookie of the year, UMD's Kim Martin as league goaltending champion, and the Badgers' Mark Johnson as league coach of the Year.

Last weekend Montana Vichorek and Rachel Kelly each accounted for two goals and MacKenzie Thurston chipped in three assists as the Bemidji State women's hockey team defeated the Thunder Bay Queens 10-3 in an exhibition opener Friday at Sanford Center ... goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova split time with Alana McElhinney ... Tomcikova picked up the win in 30 minutes of action ... Tomcikova allowed three goals and had 10 saves on the game ... McElhinney put up a blank slate and had four saves vs in her 30 minutes in the crease ... The Beavers accomplished many firsts last season (2010-11) including beating a No. 1-ranked team for the first time in program history, recording the program's first-ever win over the University of Minnesota Duluth and snapping a 17-game losing streak to the University of Minnesota on its way to a 14-17-4 (11-13-4-2 WCHA) mark and a fifth-place WCHA finish ... Cody and Bauerfeld both ended their careers as Top 10 scorers in the BSU record books ... With the loss of much of its scoring, BSU will turn to a strong defensive core in All-WCHA goaltender Tomcikova along with seniors Kimberly Lieder, Vichorek and Marlee Wheelhouse and sophomore Erika Wheelhouse ... Tomcikova posted a 1.84 goals-against average and 692 saves last season ... the senior is on the verge of capturing career records in both wins and saves ... On the offensive side, the Beavers will need strong seasons from Emily Erickson and Sadie Lundquist ... They will also turn to several other returnees and newcomers to step up as they look to fill the void of their trio of departed seniors ... The Beavers return 19 players from last year's roster with the team's only losses being the three seniors ... In addition, BSU adds eight freshmen and Maine transfer Kristi King ... Head coach Steve Sertich added former Beaver Amber Frykenlund as an assistant coach.

Joining Handrahan's staff at Ohio State are members of his former staff at Robert Morris in Scott Spencer and Candice Moxley ... A total of 18 letter-winners return from last season – six seniors, five juniors, one redshirt sophomore and six sophomores ... Offensively, the Buckeyes' top three scorers are back on the ice in Laura McIntosh, Natalie Spooner and Hokey Langan ... McIntosh and Spooner enter their senior season as the only current Buckeyes with 100 points or more in their collegiate career ... McIntosh is Ohio State's leader in career assists with 96, while Spooner's 69 career goals put her second in program history ... Langan is just 26 points shy of 100 and is eighth in Ohio State history with 38 career goals ... Defensively, seniors Kelly Wild and Brittany Carlson are set to guide the young group of blueliners ... Joining is a trio of sophomores in Becky Allis, Madison Marcotte and Annie Svedin ... Although it says 'sophomore' next to their names, the duo of Chelsea Knapp and Lisa Steffes bring a wealth of experience to the Buckeye goaltending corps ... Steffes patrolled the net all last season and finished with a 14-19-3 overall mark with a 3.11 goals-against average and a .906 save percentage ... She broke the Ohio State single season record for saves, finishing with 1,085 stoppers on the season ...
