## Unbeaten Minnesota, Wisconsin Set to Meet in Early WCHA Showdown this Weekend in Madison; Ohio State Hosts SCSU Bemidji State Heads to Maine; Minnesota State Visits Robert Morris; Minnesota Duluth Travels to Connecticut; North Dakota Hosts Vermont; Buckeyes Give New Coach Handrahan First Win; MSU Splits with No. 8 Mercyhurst; UMD Splits with No. 5 Boston College; Four WCHA Teams Ranked in USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Hockey Poll ... UW No. 1, UM No. 3, UMD No. 6, UND No. 7 ... OSU, BSU Receive Votes

MADISON, Wis. – Minnesota and defending national champion Wisconsin, both coming off conference-season opening sweeps, renew their long-time rivalry this weekend in Madison. The Western Collegiate Hockey Association early season lead will be at stake when the No. 3-ranked Golden Gophers travel to top-rated Wisconsin for games Friday night at 7:07 pm CT and Sunday afternoon at 2:07 pm CT the Kohl Center.

Both Minnesota and Wisconsin are 2-0-0-0 in league play with six points and 4-0-0 overall. Minnesota blanked St. Cloud State twice last weekend, winning 6-0 on Oct. 7 and 8-0 Oct. 8. Amanda Kessel had five goals and an assist in the series. She had a natural hat trick (three straight goals) in the series finale on the same day her brother, Phil, an ex-Gopher, had a hat trick for the NHL's Toronto Maple Leafs. Kessel (11 points overall) and her linemates Jen Schoullis and Sarah Erickson have accounted for half of the goals for the Gophers so far this 2011-12 season, who have outscored their opponents 24-1.

The Badgers scored a 5-2 victory over No. 7-ranked North Dakota in their WCHA season opener last Saturday behind three goals by Carolyn Prévost and then secured the series sweep with a comeback 3-2

overtime victory last Sunday despite never leading until the game ended in sudden death. UW fell behind 2-0 in the second period when the Fighting Sioux power-play converted for the second time, answered :57 seconds later on a Brianna Decker goal, and got the equalizer on a power-play by Brooke Ammerman with a minute remaining in regulation. Hilary Knight got the game-winning goal at 3:03 of overtime and extended UW's winning streak – covering last season and this season – to 31 games (29-0-2).

No. 6-ranked Minnesota Duluth opened its regular season by splitting a series with No. 5 Boston College at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth. Jessica Wong had five points in the Bulldogs' season-opening 7-2 victory last Saturday, but BC denied the sweep with a two-goal rally to score a last second 3-2 victory in the series finale. The Bulldogs nursed the lead to inside of three minutes to go in the contest, but Emily Pfalzer tied it up, and Alex Carpenter won it for the Eagles in the final second with another shorthander.

The weekend results influenced pollsters in the Oct. 10 U.S. College Hockey Online (USCHO.com) poll to rank four WCHA teams in the top seven for the second straight week. Defending national champion Wisconsin is unanimously ranked first. Minnesota is ranked third while Minnesota Duluth moved up to sixth and North Dakota (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) fell to No. 7. Both Ohio State and Bemidji State also collected points in the poll after the Buckeyes took five of six league points from the Beavers in Columbus, Ohio last weekend.

Natalie Spooner scored all four goals and got the shootout game-winner in a 4-4 decision last Friday with Bemidji State to give Buckeyes' new coach Nate Handrahan his first points in the WCHA standings. Then last Saturday, sophomore Ally Tarr scored her first career hat trick to lead Ohio State to a 5-3 victory and give Handrahan his first win. With the victory, Ohio State concludes its first weekend series of the year with a 1-0-1 overall mark and a 1-0-1-1 record in the WCHA. Bemidji State falls to 1-1-2 overall and 0-1-1-0 in the conference despite six assists in the series from defenseman Erika Wheelhouse.

Ohio State next hosts St. Cloud State (1-3-0 and 0-2-0) in WCHA action this Friday and Saturday.

In non-conference series this Friday and Saturday, No. 6-ranked Minnesota Duluth travels to Connecticut, Minnesota State heads to Robert Morris and Bemidji State visits Maine. No. 7-ranked North Dakota, after opening the season with a four-game road swing at the two teams that were in the national championship game last season in Boston University and Wisconsin, returns to the Ralph Engelstad Arena this weekend to host Vermont in non-conference action Saturday and Sunday.

Last weekend Minnesota State split two games with No. 8-ranked Mercyhurst last weekend in Mankato with both games being decided by one goal. The Mavericks won 3-2 in overtime last Friday on Nicole Germaine's game-winner with :49 seconds left and dropped a 5-4 decision Saturday.

## 2011-12 WCHA Head Coaches Pre-Season Poll

There will be no surprises from the coaches who have seen its league win the last 12 women's national championships. The University of Wisconsin swept to the national championship in a memorable season last year (2010-11) and, according to a preseason poll of league coaches, the Badgers are the pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's title again in 2011-12.

The Badgers, who won the WCHA regular season crown and the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF a year ago before beating Boston University 4-1 to win the national title, return 18 players this season. Wisconsin collected six first place votes and 47 points in the poll of the league's eight head coaches.

Minnesota finished second with 43 votes, including two first place votes. Minnesota Duluth, with 37 points, was selected to finish third. Like Wisconsin, UMD qualified for the NCAA tournament last season.

North Dakota was picked to finish fourth, followed by Ohio State in fifth place, Bemidji State in sixth, Minnesota State in seventh and St. Cloud State in eighth.

Wisconsin senior forward Hilary Knight, a member of the women's U.S. Olympic Hockey Team in 2010, received six votes and is the head coaches' pick to be preseason WCHA Player of the Year. An AHCA Division 1 First Team All-American as a sophomore and junior, Knight was also a Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award Top 10 finalist in 2010-11 and has scored 112 goals in her first three seasons. Brianna Decker, Knight's teammate on Wisconsin, also received two votes.

Three players – North Dakota forward Michelle Karvinen, Minnesota forward Meghan Lorence and Minnesota Duluth defenseman Brigette Lacquette – are the head coaches' choice as pre-season WCHA Rookie of the Year. Minnesota's Rachel Ramsey and Minnesota Duluth's Jenna McParland also had one vote each.

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

The Beavers proved they were poised in the face of adversity over the weekend as they mounted two comebacks against Ohio State and got one point out their WCHA season opening series ... Last Friday, the Beavers were down 3-0 early in the second period but scored four goals in the span of seven minutes in the second period and early third period to go ahead 4-3 ... The Beavers tied the Buckeyes 4-4 in OT before falling in a shootout, 1-0 ... Last Saturday, BSU was down 4-1 early in the third and tallied two goals in the span of three minutes to pull within 4-3, but the Buckeyes would fend off Saturday's comeback ... Erika Wheelhouse tallied six assists on the weekend ... The mark falls one short of her season total from the 2010-11 campaign ... Wheelhouse assisted on three goals in the second period last Friday to help get BSU back into the game after being down 3-0 early in the second period ... In addition, Wheelhouse was credited with six blocks on the weekend including five in Friday's 4-4 tie ... Emily Erickson was held scoreless in BSU's first series of 2011-12 against Providence College but her scoreless streak didn't last long ... Erickson was vital in BSU's comeback last Friday as she scored two goals and added one assist ... Erickson came into the season as BSU's most likely replacement for the graduated Erin Cody ... Erickson tallied 16 goals and 11 assists last season ... Despite two shootout losses, BSU can sure say they are already shootout veterans four games into the season ... BSU went to a shootout in their season opener against No. 10 Providence and in their first game of the Ohio State series.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

The No. 3-ranked Golden Gophers travel to top-ranked Wisconsin for a Friday-Sunday WCHA series at the Kohl Center ... Minnesota and Wisconsin are the only 2-0 teams in the WCHA ... Minnesota is 28-25-7 all-time against Wisconsin ... The Gophers have outscored their opponents 24-1 in four games this season ... Amanda Kessel leads the team in points with 11, including six against St. Cloud State last weekend ... Last Saturday, Kessel had the first natural hat trick for the Gophers in nearly two years as she netted three goals in eight minutes in Minnesota's 8-0 win over the visiting Huskies ... Her brother, Phil Kessel, had a hat trick for the Toronto Maple Leafs on the same day ... The Gophers have outshot their opponents, 194-51, in the first four games, including a 109-25 mark against the Huskies ... Freshman forward Meghan Lorence scored her first career goals against St. Cloud State last weekend ... Minnesota's top line of Kessel, Jen Schoullis and Sarah Erickson has produced 12 of 24 goals this season.

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

The No. 6-ranked Bulldogs split a pair of season-opening games at AMSOIL Arena with Boston College on Oct. 8-9 ... the Bulldogs used four second period goals to bury No. 5 Boston College 7-2 in the season opener for both squads ... UMD is now 12-1 all-time in season openers ... After a silent first period, the Bulldogs erupted offensively in the second period with four goals ... Senior Haley Irwin started the scoring landslide with a power-play tally at 3:15, followed by Katie Wilson's first strike of the season at 8:49 ... Junior defenseman Jessica Wong stretched the UMD lead to three goals at 15:05, and rookie forward Zoe Hickel netted the first goal of her Bulldog career 2:10 later, an unassisted tally that gave the Maroon and Gold a 4-0 lead heading into the second intermission ... The Eagles attempted to mount a comeback with a power-play goal by Blake Bolden a mere :25 seconds into the third period but Pernillia Winberg and UMD muted that effort with a power-play tally 1:58 later to give the Bulldogs back the four goal lead of 5-1 ... BC struck again in traffic at 7:44, Meagan Mangene's first goal of the season, but :16 seconds later Wong carried the puck end to end to score her second goal of the night and seal UMD's opening night delight ... The Bulldogs benefitted hugely from Jennifer Harss' netminding effort, as the senior made 33 saves, including 18 in the final period alone ... The win was No. 38 for Harss ... Eagle goaltender Corinne Boyles made 30 saves for BC ... Wong's five point outing (2-3=5) was a career-high for the junior defenseman in points ... Wong's point outburst is the most points by a Bulldog since Winberg rang up five points with four goals and an assist last season against St. Cloud State on Feb. 18, 2011 ... Four Bulldog players notched two or more points in the game and nine players in all registered points, including three freshmen ... UMD has now won eight-consecutive season openers dating back to the 2003-04 season and is 16-2 all-time against Hockey East opponents ... The Bulldogs lost to a Hockey East member for the first time since the 1999-2000 inaugural season when Boston College rallied with the final three goals, including a shorthanded score with one second to play, to defeat Minnesota Duluth 3-2 last Sunday afternoon ... UMD (1-1) led 1-0 after one period on an Audrey Cournoyer goal and was up 2-0 just :83 seconds into the second period as freshman defenseman Brigette Lacquette scored her first collegiate goal ... A shorthanded goal got Boston College within 2-1 after two periods ... Emily Pfalzer scored with 2:51 to play, and Alex Carpenter got the game-winner just before time expired ... Harss had 23 saves and Boyles of the Eagles had 27 ... Irwin extended her current scoring streak to seven games with two assists ... Irwin has now registered 14 points (2-12=14) in her last seven skates ... The Bulldogs are on the road this Friday and Saturday in a non-conference series at Connecticut.

### Mavericks

#### Minnesota State University

The Mavericks split two games with nationally-ranked Mercyhurst last weekend in Mankato with both games being decided by one goal ... The Mavs won 3-2 in overtime last Friday and dropped a 5-4 decision last Saturday ... The Mavericks are averaging 46 shots per game through the first two series this season ... MSU has outshot opponents 184-90 this season ... Minnesota State has outscored opponents 21-12 and has a 26% power-play conversion rate ... Sophomore forward Kathleen Rogan has five goals and one assist this season ... Lauren Smith has seven assists in four games so far this season ... Sophomore forward Kathleen Rogan has notched two of the four power-play goals this season ... Senior goalkeeper Alli Altmann leads the team in the nets with a 2.42 goals-against average and a .889 save percentage in her two games played ... MSU will face Robert Morris this weekend in Pittsburgh, Pa., in which MSU sports a 2-1 record in the all-time series ... Through four games in 2011-12, Minnesota State has eight players who have five points or higher.

### Fighting Sioux

#### University of North Dakota

The seventh-ranked Fighting Sioux finally play a home game this week ... After opening the season with a four-game road swing at the two teams that were in the national championship game last season in Boston University and Wisconsin, the Sioux (1-3-0) return to the Ralph Engelstad Arena this weekend to host Vermont in non-conference action ... UND is 7-1-2 (.750) all-time against the Catamounts ... The Sioux went 1-0-1 in Burlington, Vt., last year with a 4-1 win to open the series before tying the finale 3-3 although outshooting UV, 39-25 ... The Sioux will be looking to rebound from a pair of losses at top-ranked Wisconsin last weekend ... The Badgers used a big third period to pull away from the Sioux for a 5-2 decision last Saturday ... UND outshot the Badgers 25-17 through the first two periods but still found themselves trailing by a 2-1 margin heading into the final frame ... Wisconsin scored three goals in the third period to pull away ... Carolyn Prevost led the Badgers with a hat trick while Jocelyne Lamoureux and Allison Parizek (shorthanded) scored for the Sioux ... Special teams finally clicked for UND on the season last Sunday, who entered the game 1-for-17 on the power-play, but Wisconsin scored late in the third period to even the game before winning it in overtime ... UND scored two power-play goals to open a 2-0 lead, including Andrea Dalen's first collegiate goal and Jocelyne Lamoureux's second goal of the weekend ... Wisconsin would cut the lead to one goal halfway through the second stanza and score a power-play goal with :60-seconds remaining in regulation to send it to overtime ...
