Full Slate of Conference Games Set for Oct. 20-22 ... MSU at UM, SCSU at BSU, UW at UMD, League-Leading OSU at UND Buckeyes Give New Coach Handrahan First WCHA Sweep; Golden Gophers Upend Top-Ranked UW; Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll has UW No. 1, UM No. 2, UMD No. 6, UND No. 7; Four WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Polls ... UW No. 1, UM No. 2, UMD No. 5/6, UND No. 7 ... OSU, BSU Receive Votes; Nine WCHA Players to Compete in Four Nations Cup Nov. 9-13 in Sweden

MADISON, Wis. – Defending national champion Wisconsin and Minnesota are ranked No. 1 and No 2 in the country after splitting two early-season 3-2 decisions in Madison on Oct. 14-16, but it is unbeaten Ohio State which is the leader in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association race.

The Buckeyes, under new coach Nate Handrahan, took a pair of 5-1 home-ice WCHA victories over St. Cloud State in Columbus last weekend and will take a 3-0-1 record (3-0-1-1 WCHA and 11 points in league play) into No. 7-ranked North Dakota this weekend in one of the marquee series in a full round of conference games.

In other league series this week, Minnesota (5-1-0, 3-1-0-0 WCHA, 9 points) hosts Minnesota State (4-2-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) in a rare Thursday (Oct. 20)-Friday (Oct. 21) series at Ridder Arena. On Friday and Saturday, St. Cloud State (1-5-0, 0-4-0-0 WCHA) travels to Bemidji State (3-1-2, 0-1-0-0 WCHA, 1 point) for a pair of matinees and No. 5/6-ranked Minnesota Duluth (3-1-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) opens league play against Wisconsin (5-1-0, 3-1-0-0 WCHA, 9 points). Wisconsin plays 12 of their next 14 WCHA games on the road.

Last Friday (Oct. 14), the host Badgers got two goals in the first four minutes, including the first of two goals from Carolyn Prévost, and edged the Gophers, 3-2, in the series opener. The win allowed UW to tie the national record for longest unbeaten streak (32 games – 30-0-2.) But Wisconsin then dropped its

first game of the season last Sunday (Oct. 16) afternoon as visiting Minnesota jumped out to a two-goal lead and forced a weekend split with a 3-2 victory at the Kohl Center as forward Amanda Kessel had a goal and an assist.

Ohio State senior forward Laura McIntosh had a record-breaking weekend in the sweep over St. Cloud State. The Waterloo, Ont., product had two goals and two assists in the series and became OSU's all-time leader in career WCHA points with 113, three better than Jana Harrigan. She tied the record and tallied her first goal of the season last Friday, giving Ohio State a 2-1 lead at 6:06 in the first period. The goal ended up being the game-winner in the 5-1 victory. In the series finale last Saturday, the Buckeyes jumped out to a 3-0 lead and held on behind one goal and an assist by McIntosh, forwards Natalie Spooner and Ally Tarr, and defenseman Annie Svedin.

In non-conference play last weekend, Minnesota Duluth went on the road and swept Hockey East Association-member Connecticut. Forward Haley Irwin's third period goal secured a 5-4 UMD victory last Friday and freshman forward Jenna McParland's first two collegiate goals keyed a 6-1 Bulldogs' victory in the series finale.

Bemidji State took a pair of wins at Hockey East-member Maine. Junior forward Emily Erickson scored the tying goal and sophomore forward Tess Dusik had the game-winner in a comeback 3-2 victory for the visiting Beavers in the series opener while goaltender Alana McElhinney, in her first start of the season, made 17 saves and recorded her third career shutout in a 7-0 BSU victory last Saturday.

North Dakota returned home to power past visiting Vermont of Hockey East twice at Ralph Engelstad Arena last weekend, winning 9-1 last Saturday (Oct. 15) and 4-1 last Sunday (Oct. 16). In the series opener, the line of left wing Monique Lamoureux-Kolls (2a), center Jocelyne Lamoureux (2g, 3a) and right wing Michelle Karvinen (2g, 1a) combined for 10 points and the Sioux outshot UV, 50-15. Then on Sunday, the trio combined for six more points, with Monique Lamoureux-Kolls notching the game-winner as UND outshot the Catamounts 37-15 and completed the sweep.

Minnesota State went on the road last weekend, splitting two non-conference games at College Hockey America-member Robert Morris. The host Colonials scored three straight goals last Friday to take a 4-3 victory in overtime, but the Mavericks bounced back and took a 3-1 decision last Saturday as senior defenseman Jackie Otto got the game-winning goal.

Those Oct. 14-16 weekend results convinced pollsters in the USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll to rank four WCHA teams in the top seven for the third straight week. Defending national champion Wisconsin is unanimously ranked first. Minnesota jumped ahead of

Nine WCHA Players to Compete in Four Nations Cup Tournament Nov. 9-13 in Sweden

Nine Western Collegiate Hockey Association member-team players, including six from Team USA, will take a break from their collegiate careers next month to compete in the Four Nations tournament.

Ohio State senior forward Natalie Spooner, Wisconsin defenseman Stefanie McKeough and Minnesota Duluth forward Haley Irwin are three of 23 players selected to represent Team Canada at the 2011 Four Nations Cup, taking place Nov. 9-14 in Nyköping, Sweden.

The Four Nations Cup brings together the top four women's hockey countries in the world—Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States—for the international tournament. Former Wisconsin defenseman Bobbi Jo Slusar also is on Team Canada.

USA Hockey announced their first 20 players on Oct. 14, including Wisconsin's Hillary Knight and Brianna Decker, Minnesota's Amanda Kessel and Jen Schoullis, and North Dakota's Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Jocelyne Lamoureux for its roster for the U.S. Women's National Team. The U.S. will add two goaltenders to its final roster following its training camp in Hamden, Conn., Nov. 1-6. Former Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Jessie Vetter, the ex-Wisconsin netminder, is one of three goalies who will compete for the job.

The USA roster includes 15 players who won the gold medal for Team USA at the IIHF Women's World Championship this past April. That group includes former Wisconsin players Meghan Duggan, Molly Engstrom and Vetter, former Minnesota Duluth forward Jenny Potter, and ex-Minnesota player Gigi Marvin plus Knight, Decker and the Lamoureux twins.

Rosters for the Swedish and Finnish teams have yet to be announced.

The Beavers beat Maine 3-2 and 7-0 and picked up their first series sweep since picking up two wins over Minnesota State University Jan. 21-22 ... BSU's 7-0 rout of University of Maine Saturday marks the most goals BSU has scored since tallying eight goals Oct. 26, 2001 against St. Cloud State ... In the victory, BSU got points (goals and assists) from 12 different players ... Emily Erickson led the way this weekend for BSU with three goals and one assist ... The junior tallied the game-tying goal in the final two minutes of last Friday's contest in order to help setup BSU's come-from-behind win over the Black Bears ... Erickson also tallied a shorthanded goal on the weekend ... The Beavers continued to be strong on the power-play as all three of their goals last Friday were power-play goals ... Freshman forward Rachael Bona scored her first career goal against Wisconsin ... Freshman Rachel Ramsey is leading the team in plus/minus rating this season with a +11 ... Minnesota is 27-of-28 on the penalty-kill so far this season, and has successfully killed every penalty in the last five games.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

The No. 6-ranked Bulldogs swept the University of Connecticut in Storrs, Conn., this past weekend by scores of 5-4 and 6-1 ... The Bulldogs, now 3-1-0 overall, are 4-0 all-time against the Huskies and 18-3 in program history against teams from the Hockey East Association ... UMD took the early lead in the first period of the series opener on a goal from junior forward Katie Wilson and then used tallies by Vanessa Thibault and Audrey Cournoyer in the second period to help forge a 3-1 advantage ... Goals by Jessica Wong late in the second period and Haley Irwin's last third period score helped secure Friday night's 5-4 win ... Goaltender Jenny Harss made 17 saves for UMD, while the Bulldogs outshot the Huskies 39-21 ... Both Wilson and Cournoyer has two points in the skate with a goal and an assist apiece ... The Bulldogs got two goals from rookie Jenna McParland last Saturday and Wong and Mariia Posa added a tally each ... Pernilla Winberg and Kacy Ambroz added scores of their own to help UMD with the 6-1 outcome ... Three players had two point nights, including McParland, Irwin (2a) and Winberg (1g, 1a) ... UMD shelled the Huskies 48-24 and was 2-of-4 on the power-play while holding UConn to 0-of-7 with the extra skater ... Harss made 21 saves and senior goaltender Lana Steck had two in six minutes of work ... The Bulldogs will welcome No. 1-ranked Wisconsin to AMSOIL Arena this weekend for the Maroon and Gold's first WCHA action of the season ... UMD is 26-22-10 all-time against the Badgers and last faced Wisconsin back on March 12 in the NCAA Regional Quarterfinals, a 2-1 loss suffered by UMD ... Overall, the Bulldogs were 1-3-1 against the Badgers last season and 6-8-2 against teams ranked in the top-ten.

Minnesota State University

The Mavericks split a non-conference road series last weekend at Robert Morris, losing in overtime 4-3 last Friday before winning 3-1 on Saturday ... Robert Morris scored three unanswered goals to beat MSU in overtime in the series opener ... MSU is 7-of-24 on the power-play this season and has killed off 23-of-26 penalties ... Junior defenseman Emilia Andersson scored two power-play goals last weekend against the Colonials ... Last season the Mavericks were 9-of-112 on the power-play ... Minnesota State has outscored opponents 27-17 so far this season ... Sophomore Kathleen Rogan has six goals and one assist this season ... Sophomore Lauren Barnes and junior Lauren Smith each have one goal and seven assists ... Andersson and Rogan both have two power-play goals ... MSU has given up four shorthanded goals in its six games ... The Mavericks have outshot opponents in five of the six games this season ... Minnesota State opens 2011-12 WCHA action this Friday and Saturday and is 3-53-3 against Minnesota ... As a team, Minnesota State is +26 on the season while 17 players have at least one point this season ... The Mavericks have 27 goals in its six games as last season it took 12 games to get to 27 goals scored.

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

The seventh-ranked Fighting Sioux return to league play this weekend as it hosts Ohio State at the Ralph Engelstad Arena ... The Fighting Sioux trail the all-time series 17-8-3, but lead in the last 10 games 5-4-1 ... The Fighting Sioux are unbeaten in their last five games against the Buckeyes, going 4-0-1 ... UND is currently 3-3-0 on the season and 0-2-0-0 in league play ... Junior Jocelyne Lamoureux leads the Sioux with 13 points off five goals and eight assists ... 15 skaters have already recorded at least one point this season for UND ... The Fighting Sioux special teams are finding their stride as the season progresses and are now clipping at 24.1% power-play rate and killing off 87.9% of opponents power-plays for a combined 58.1% successful conversion rate ... The Fighting Sioux have outshot their opponents 224-157 on the season ... They are averaging 3.83 goals per game while giving up 2.50 ... UND skated to its most lopsided win in program history last Saturday at the Ralph Engelstad Arena with a 9-1 victory over the Vermont Catamounts ... Lamoureux also tied the school record with a five-point game (2-3=5) ... The nine goals also set a new high for the program, having scored eight twice including a 8-2 win over Vermont on Jan. 6, 2003 ... The eight-goal differential was also a record for the Sioux ... Stephanie Ney made 14 saves in the win, carrying a shutout into the third period until the Catamounts scored with 3:23 remaining on the clock ... The Fighting Sioux outshot UVM 50-15 in the game, reaching the 50 shot mark for the first time since Oct. 4, 2008 ... UND skated to the sweep on Sunday with a 4-1 decision over the Catamounts ... UVM got out to a quick start in the series finale and got on the scoreboard first with a goal at 6:19 of the opening frame ... UND played from behind until the 19:52 mark of the period when Kelsey Ketcher scored the first of two power-play goals for the Sioux in the game ... Monique Lamoureux-Kolls scored the second period's only goal and eventual game-winner at even-strength ... UND, after the first stanza, outshot the Catamounts 25-5 through the final two periods for a 37-15 advantage for the game ... Sara Dagenais nabbed her first goal of the season on the power-play early in to the third period to put the Sioux up 3-1 ... Lamoureux sealed the game for the Sioux with her third goal and seventh point of the weekend at 18:49 of the third frame ... Junior Jorid Dagfinrud finished the game with 14 saves and picked up the win in her first start since Feb. 13, 2011.

Ohio State University

The Buckeyes improved to 3-0-1 both overall and in WCHA play after picking up a pair of victories over St. Cloud State at the OSU Ice Rink, Oct. 14-15 ... After giving up a goal in the early minutes, Buckeyes rallied to down SCSU, 5-1, last Friday ... The Badgers went 30-0-2 between Dec. 4, 2010 and Oct. 14, 2011 ... The old mark was also set by the Badgers back in 2007, which oddly enough also lasted until Oct. 14 ... Junior forward Brianna Decker has a 16-game point streak ... In those 16 games, she has scored 18 goals and tallied 24 assists to give her 42 points since Feb. 11, 2011 ... In her first four games this season, Carlyne Prévost has recorded a total of nine points (5g, 4a) including a hat trick in her first game against North Dakota ... The weekend series will be the first conference games for the Bulldogs, who have played Boston College and Connecticut so far this season ... With a .535 win percentage against the Badgers, the Bulldogs own the best record of WCHA teams against Wisconsin ... The Badgers currently trail in the overall series, 22-26-10 ... However, UW is unbeaten against UMD in the past three meetings ... WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
