Full Round of WCHA Series for Nov. 4-5 Have North Dakota at St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth at Minnesota, Bemidji State at Minnesota State, Wisconsin at Ohio State Minnesota Holds One Point Lead Over OSU in League Race as Buckeyes Sweep at MSU; Host UMD Earns Win and Tie Against Sioux; BSU Splits with Visiting UM; Badgers Claim Two Victories from Eastern Power Boston University; Five of Eight WCHA Teams Ranked in Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll with UW at No. 1, UM at No. 3, UMD Jumps to No. 4, UND at No. 7, BSU Debuts at No. 10 ... OSU Receives Votes; Nine WCHA Member Team Players to Compete in Four Nations Cup in Sweden Nov. 9-13

MADISON, Wis. – A full round of league series will be featured in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association this weekend, Nov. 4-5, as the race for the 2011-12 league title became a little more focused during Halloween weekend.

Minnesota has the league lead with 18 points, one better than Ohio State and three better than defending WCHA and national champion Wisconsin, but those top two teams have played two more games than the Badgers and fourth place Bemidji State, which has 10 points. North Dakota is currently fifth with seven points while Minnesota Duluth has five points but four games in hand over UM and OSU and two over UW, BSU and UND. Minnesota State and St. Cloud State have yet to record a point.

The No. 4-ranked Bulldogs (4-3-1, 1-2-1-1 WCHA) now get a chance to face the No. 3-ranked Golden

Gophers (8-2-0, 6-2-0-0 WCHA) in the league's marquee matchup this Friday (6:07 pm CT) and Saturday (4:07 pm CT) at Ridder Arena (3,400).

Also on the WCHA schedule this Friday and Saturday are two-game conference sets featuring No. 10-ranked Bemidji State (6-2-0, 3-2-1-0 WCHA) at Minnesota State (4-6-0, 0-4-0-0 WCHA) at All Seasons Arena (750), No. 7-ranked North Dakota (5-4-1, 2-3-1-1 WCHA) visiting St. Cloud State (1-8-1, 0-6-0-0 WCHA) and the National Hockey Center (5,371), and No. 1-ranked Wisconsin (9-1-0, 5-1-0-0 WCHA) traveling to Ohio State (5-2-1, 5-2-1 WCHA) and the OSU Ice Rink (800) in another matchup of current title contenders. The Beavers and Mavericks will face-off at 7:07 pm CT on Nov. 4 and 3:07 pm CT on Nov. 5. The Sioux and host SCSU Huskies will engage in a pair of 2:07 pm CT matinees. And the visiting Badgers and Buckeyes will get underway at 7:07 pm ET both Friday and Saturday.

Ohio State will have great momentum after sweeping two conference road games at Minnesota State last weekend. Ally Tarr had the game-winning goal in a 2-1 victory last Friday (Oct. 28) and goaltender Lisa Steffes recorded her first career shutout and Hokey Langan had the lone goal in the 1-0 series finale last Saturday (Oct. 29). Steffes made 44 total saves over two days, including 21 stops Friday and 23 Saturday. With the wins, she improved to 4-1-0 on the season.

Minnesota, meanwhile, split two WCHA games at Bemidji State. Jen Schoullis scored three goals last Friday to lead the Golden Gophers to a 4-1 victory over the host Beavers, but BSU goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova had 41 saves last Saturday to help the Beavers take a close-checking 2-1 victory from UM, gain a series split, and vault into this week's USCHO's.com top 10.

Minnesota Duluth also rose in the national polls after defeating league rival North Dakota 6-1 last Saturday (Oct. 29) and then tying the Sioux 2-2 (ot) last Sunday (Oct. 30) at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth. Katie Wilson had three goals and Audrey Cournoyer a pair of assists in the series opener for UMD. In game two, North Dakota rookie forward Michelle Karvinen scored with :17 seconds left in regulation to give the visiting Sioux a 2-2 tie, but after a scoreless overtime the Bulldogs' Pernilla Winberg scored in a shootout to give UMD the extra point in the standings.

In non-conference play last weekend, Wisconsin beat Boston University twice in a rematch of last season's NCAA title game at the Kohl Center in Madison. Wisconsin claimed 3-0 and 6-1 victories over the Terriers to conclude a 7-1 month of October that consisted of four series against four top-10 foes. Goaltender Alex Rigsby had a 20-save shutout and Brittany Ammerman had two goals in the series opener and Brianna Decker, currently on a 20-game point-scoring streak, had three goals and an assist in the final last Saturday.

In another non-league series contested Oct. 28-29, St. Cloud State opener its home schedule with a 2-2 (ot) tie with Robert Morris as Amanda Arbogast and Molli Mott had goals and then won the shootout 2-0 behind goalie Tayler VanDenaker. Senior forward Brittany Toor had a power-play goal but St. Cloud State was defeated by Robert Morris, 3-1, in the series finale at National Hockey Center.

The results convinced pollsters in this week's (Oct. 31) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll to rank five WCHA-member teams among the nation's top 10. Defending national champion Wisconsin is ranked first, Minnesota is ranked third, Minnesota Duluth is fourth, North Dakota is at No. 7 and Bemidji State is tied for No. 10. Ohio State also collected points in the poll meaning six of the 13 teams mentioned by pollsters are from the WCHA.

In this week's (Nov. 1) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Wisconsin is No. 1, Minnesota is No. 3, Minnesota Duluth is No. 4 and North Dakota is No. 7. Also receiving votes was Bemidji State.

Nine WCHA Players to Compete in Four Nations Cup Tournament Nov. 9-13 in Sweden

Nine Western Collegiate Hockey Association member-team players, including six from Team USA, will take a break from their collegiate careers next month to compete in the Four Nations tournament.

Ohio State senior forward Natalie Spooner, Wisconsin defenseman Stefanie McKeough and Minnesota Duluth forward Haley Irwin are three of 23 players selected to represent Team Canada at the 2011 Four Nations Cup, taking place Nov. 9-14 in Nyköping, Sweden.

The Four Nations Cup brings together the top four women's hockey countries in the world – Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States – for the international tournament. Former Wisconsin defenseman Bobbi Jo Slusar also is on Team Canada.

USA Hockey announced their first 20 players on Oct. 14, including Wisconsin's Hillary Knight and Brianna Decker, Minnesota's Amanda Kessel and Jen Schoullis, and North Dakota's Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Jocelyne Lamoureux for its roster for the U.S. Women's National Team. The U.S. will add two goaltenders to its final roster following its training camp in Hamden, Conn., Nov. 1-6. Former Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Jessie Vetter, the ex-Wisconsin netminder, is one of three goalies who will compete for the job.

The USA roster includes 15 players who won the gold medal for Team USA at the IIHF Women's World Championship this past April. That group includes former Wisconsin players Meghan Duggan, Molly Engstrom and Vetter, former Minnesota Duluth forward Jenny Potter, and ex-Minnesota player Gigi Marvin plus Knight, Decker and the Lamoureux twins.

Rosters for the Swedish and Finnish teams have yet to be announced.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

The No. 10-ranked Beavers (6-2-2, 3-2-1-0 WCHA, 9 points) split two home games with Minnesota last weekend ... They picked up their fourth-ever victory over No. 2-ranked Minnesota on Saturday ... Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova made 87 saves against UM on the weekend, including 41 last Saturday to help BSU to the 2-1 victory ... Tomcikova needs only one more win to tie the mark for most wins in program history set by Bre Dedrickson ... BSU received a strong performance from its "Smurf line" last Saturday as the trio of Lauren Williams, Abby Williams and Kristi King was put out on the ice with the one task of shutting down Minnesota's top line Jen Schoullis, Sarah Erickson and Amanda Kessel ... the "Smurfs" did just that as that top line accounted for no points after accounting for every Minnesota goal in last Friday's 4-1 victory ... Sadie Lundquist had two goals against the Golden Gophers, including the game-winner in last Saturday's upset win ... Lundquist leads the BSU team in points this season with six goals and 10 assists ... Lundquist's power-play goal last Saturday is the 13th of the season for BSU, who ranks fourth in the nation for power-play with a 33.3% success rate so far this season ... The Beavers are off to their best start ever with a 6-2-2 record ... The mark ties BSU's six wins in the first 10 games to begin the 1999-2000 season ... Last Saturday's win is the fourth of Coach Steve Sertich's BSU career over a top five opponent (No. 4 Wisconsin in 2009, No. 1 Mercyhurst in 2010, No. 3 Minnesota Duluth in 2010, No. 2 Minnesota in 2011) ... Bemidji State next plays at WCHA-rival Minnesota State this Friday and Saturday.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

The No. 3-ranked Golden Gophers (8-2-0, 6-2-0-0 WCHA, 18 points) split two games at Bemidji State last weekend, winning 4-1 in the series opener and dropping a 2-1 decision in the series finale ... The Gophers have outscored their opponents 44-9 in 10 games this season ... Amanda Kessel leads in the team in points with 21 (9g, 12a) ... Jen Schoullis got her first collegiate three-goal hat trick last Friday at Bemidji State; she has six goals on the season ... Goaltender Noora Rätty earned her 50th career win last Friday; she's the third goalie in Gopher history to reach the milestone ... Rätty leads the WCHA in goals-against average (1.04) and saves percentage (.948) and is fourth nationally in those two categories ... Minnesota is 38-of-40 on the penalty-kill this season, ranking first in the nation ... The Gophers host Minnesota Duluth this Friday night at 7:07 pm CT and Saturday evening at 6:07 pm ... Head coach Brad Frost has announced that former Gopher women's hockey player Nadine Muzerall will join the Minnesota coaching staff ... Muzerall, who played for Minnesota from 1997-2001, has been involved in hockey since leaving the University of Minnesota, and is taking on her first coaching job in the college ranks.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

The No. 4-ranked Bulldogs (4-3-1 overall, 1-2-1-1 WCHA, 5 points) picked up five points last weekend against visiting North Dakota with a 6-1 win Saturday followed by 2-2 (ot) tie and shootout win Sunday ... The Bulldogs used three second period goals, including a shorthanded tally by Pernilla Winberg to break open a scoreless game Saturday, and cemented the win with three more goals in the third period, with two scored by junior Katie Wilson, who nabbed her second career hat-trick ... UMD again got the jump on the scoreboard last Sunday, scoring two goals in the second period before giving up two in the third ... North Dakota rallied late, scoring with :17 seconds left to send the game into what would be a scoreless overtime ... Jennifer Harss stopped all three UND shooters in the shootout, while Winberg netted UMD's lone goal for the extra WCHA point ... With the win and tie, head coach Shannon Miller and the Bulldogs are now 34-4-1 all-time against North Dakota ... Senior forward Haley Irwin had her 12-game point-scoring streak ended last Sunday ... Irwin had compiled 19 points (3g, 16a) in 12 games dating back to Feb. 18 ... UMD junior forward Audrey Cournoyer has now scored in a career-long eight games ... Cournoyer has scored six goals and added seven assists for 13 points in eight outings and leads UMD in scoring ... UMD is 2-3-1 against teams ranked in the top-10 so far this season ... The Bulldogs will face No. 3 Minnesota in Minneapolis this weekend ... The Gophers are the only team in the NCAA that UMD is sub .500 against with a 23-28-6 all-time record between the two programs ... The Bulldogs went 2-2-1 against Minnesota last season, with the second loss (4-2) coming in the semifinals of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4 ... The Bulldogs are just 7-15-3 in Ridder Arena against the Gophers since Minnesota's first season there in 2002-03.

Mavericks

Minnesota State University

The Mavericks (4-6-0, 0-4-0-0 WCHA, 0 points) went 0-2 last weekend as they dropped two one-goal conference decisions, 2-1 on Friday and 1-0 on Saturday, to visiting Ohio State ... Two of the three goals that MSU let in were power-play goals ... Junior Lauren Smith leads the MSU team in points this season (1-8=9) ... Sophomore Kathleen Rogan has six goals this season in her eight games played ... Minnesota State has a 23% power-play conversion success rate ... The Mavericks have been outscored 30-28 in their 10 games ... Six of the 10 games have been one goal decisions as MSU owns a 2-4 record in those games ... Minnesota State owns a 3-3 record at home this season ... The Mavericks average 32.5 shots per game, letting up 28.5 shots per game ... MSU have given up four shorthanded goals this season but has killed off 35-of-43 opponent power-play opportunities ... Minnesota State plays Bemidji State this weekend as the all-time series is even at 20-20-10 in the 50 meetings between the schools ... The Mavericks are 4-2 when they score first and 0-4 when their opponents score first ... Emmi Leinonen (3-5=8) and Lauren Barnes (1-7=8) each have eight points this season ... Rogan and Emilia Andersson each have two power-play goals.

Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

The No. 7 Fighting Sioux travel to the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud this weekend for a Friday/Saturday series with St. Cloud State ... UND trails the all-time series 18-12-4, but has gone 6-3-1 in its last ten games including sweeping all four meetings last season ... Senior Alyssa Wiebe is UND's all-time leading scorer against the Huskies with seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points in 12 games ... Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls each have 15 points in eight career games against St. Cloud ... After losing 6-1 at UMD last Saturday, the Sioux struggled to create offensively this past weekend but secured one point in the WCHA standings with a late surge in the series finale on Sunday, a 2-2 tie ... Down two goals with under five minutes remaining, the Sioux scored twice to send the game into overtime ... Josefine Jakobsen scored her third goal of the season at with 4:48 remaining to cut the lead to 2-1 ... Michelle Karvinen notched her eighth goal of her rookie campaign with only 17 seconds left to even the game off a redirect ... Lamoureux and Lamoureux-Kolls recorded a point on all three of UND's goals ... Lamoureux leads the nation in points with 24 and Lamoureux-Kolls is third with 22 ... Karvinen is second in the nation with 16 points from a rookie ... The shootout against UMD on Sunday was the first for the Sioux since Nov. 13, 2010 ... UND has 13 different skaters with at least one goal already and 17 with at least one point.

Buckeyes Ohio State University

The Buckeyes (5-2-1, 5-2-1-1 WCHA) recorded their second series sweep of the season last weekend, picking up a pair of victories at Minnesota State ... The Buckeyes topped the Mavericks 2-1 last Friday and 1-0 last Saturday ... A trio of Buckeyes finished with two points on the weekend ... Senior Kelly Wild and junior Hokey Langan each had a goal and an assist while senior Laura McIntosh tallied two assists ... WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
