## Full Slate of Four WCHA Series Set for Dec. 9-11 Weekend as UW Visits BSU, UND Hosts UMD, OSU Heads to UM, SCSU Hosts MSU Badgers Pad Lead in League Race with Sweep of Mavericks, Extend Winning Streak to 12; Bulldogs Win Twice Over SCSU as Haley Irwin has Hand in 10 of 15 Goals; Gophers Split at North Dakota; Buckeyes Tie and Win vs Niagara ... WCHA Sports Combined 30-7-4 (.780) Record vs Other Div. 1 Teams; Five WCHA Clubs Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Weekly Poll ... Wisconsin Unanimous at No. 1, Minnesota at No. 2, North Dakota at No. 5, Bemidji State Climbs to No. 7, Minnesota Duluth at No. 10 ... OSU Receives Votes

MADISON, Wis. – A full slate of four Western Collegiate Hockey Association series is on the docket for the upcoming weekend of Dec. 9-11 as the women's league arrives at the halfway point of the 112-game conference schedule for 2011-12.

League-leading and defending regular season champion Wisconsin (17-1-0, 11-1-0 WCHA), sporting a nation's best 12-game winning streak, hits the road again to take on fifth place Bemidji State (10-5-2, 6-5-1 WCHA) Friday and Saturday at Sanford Center (4,373), with face-offs commencing at 2:07 pm CT each afternoon. The No. 1-ranked Badgers and No. 7-ranked Beavers will then conclude their four-game series on Jan. 27-28 in Madison.

No. 2-ranked and second place Minnesota (15-3-0, 9-3-0 WCHA) will play host to fourth place Ohio State (9-5-2, 6-5-1-1 WCHA) at Ridder Arena (3,400) in Minneapolis on Saturday and Sunday in a pair of afternoon matinees that feature 2:07 pm CT puck drops. The four-game series will then conclude on Feb. 10-11 in Columbus.

Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks will be the setting as No. 5-ranked and third place North Dakota (11-6-1, 8-5-1 WCHA) entertains No. 10-ranked Minnesota Duluth (8-7-1, 5-6-1-1 WCHA) on Saturday and Sunday with face-offs set for 2:07 pm CT each afternoon. Back on Oct. 29, the host Bulldogs skated to a 6-1 victory over the Sioux while the two teams deadlocked at 2-2 (ot) on Oct. 30 (UMD won 1-0 shootout).

And at the National Hockey Center (5,371) on Friday (7:07 pm CT) and Saturday (2:07 pm CT), St. Cloud State (1-15-2, 0-12-0 WCHA) will engage visiting Minnesota State (5-11-0, 1-9-0 WCHA). The return match ups between the Huskies and Mavericks then come on Jan. 13-14 in Mankato.

A look at this week's WCHA standings shows Wisconsin in first place with 33 points (12 gp, 11-1-0), six more than Minnesota's 27 (12 gp, 9-3-0). North Dakota (14 gp, 8-5-1) is currently in third place with 25 points, Ohio State (12 gp, 6-5-1-1) occupies fourth place with 20 points, one ahead of Bemidji State (12 gp, 6-5-1, 19 points) in the battle for the final first round WCHA home playoff spot. Sixth place Minnesota Duluth (12 gp, 5-6-1-1) has moved to within three points of fourth with 17 points, Minnesota State (10 gp, 1-9-0-0) has three points for the seventh spot and St. Cloud State (12 gp, 0-12-0) is eighth with no points. UND has played the most league games to date with 14 while MSU has played the fewest with 10.

In conference play last weekend (Dec. 2-3), Wisconsin swept at Minnesota State, host Minnesota Duluth won twice over St. Cloud State, and Minnesota split at North Dakota.

At All Seasons Arena in Mankato, top-ranked Wisconsin skated past Minnesota State, 4-0 last Friday night and 5-1 on Saturday afternoon. The wins marked the fifth weekend this season that the Badgers have given up just one goal or fewer. Brianna Decker scored the opening goal for Wisconsin both days and extended her consecutive game-scoring streak to 29 games while Hilary Knight had two goals in each game. In the 4-0 decision, Knight had a hand in every goal as she scored twice and assisted on two more while Alex Rigsby made 16 saves to record her fourth shutout of the season.

At AMSOIL Arena in Duluth on Dec. 2-3, the Bulldogs' Haley Irwin had a memorable weekend as Minnesota Duluth picked up its first home series sweep of the season against St. Cloud State with 5-1 and 10-2 victories. Irwin, a senior forward, had a hand in 10 of the 15 UMD goals. The Bulldogs used two goals and an assist last Friday from rookie forward Jenna McParland in their 5-1 win with Irwin and Audrey Cournoyer each contributing three assists. Last Saturday night the Bulldogs erupted for seven goals in the second period against SCSU as Irwin tied a UMD record with six assists in the game and set a personal record for points with seven when she also added an unassisted goal. McParland scored her first collegiate three-goal hat trick and added an assist, and six players scored two or more points. Irwin was a +7 while McParland and Cournoyer were both +6. UMD's

first line of McParland, Irwin and Cournoyer picked up 16 points in the game.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks last weekend, No. 5 North Dakota split two games with No. 2 Minnesota. Jen Schoullis earned four points in the Gophers' 7-2 win over UND, including two goals and two assists. Schoullis' first goal of the game, at 16:51 of the first period, proved to be the game-winner. But on Saturday, the host Sioux battled back behind a 34-save shutout from goaltender Jorid Daginfrud, who was making her first start since Nov. 5, to post a 3-0 victory and gain the split. It was the first shutout of the season for the Fighting Sioux, who received two points (SHG, 1a) from defenseman Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and the game-winner right winger Andrea Dalen at 1:12 of the third period.

In non-conference play involving WCHA teams last weekend, host Ohio State tied Niagara 1-1 (ot) on Dec. 2 before producing a 5-2 triumph on Dec. 3. Senior forward Laura McIntosh had four assists and goaltender Lisa Steffes made 29 saves in the victory last Saturday at OSU Ice Rink.

Against opponents from other Division 1 conferences so far this season, WCHA-member teams are now 30-7-4 overall for a .780 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 6-0-0 (1.000) vs ECAC Hockey, 13-2-1 (.844) vs the Hockey East Association, 6-5-3 (.535) vs College Hockey America, and 5-0-0 vs Independents.

The overall strength of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is also again reflected in this week's (Dec. 5) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, which shows five of the league's eight teams ranked in the top 10 in the country, including the top two - Wisconsin at a unanimous No. 1 and Minnesota at No. 2. North Dakota stayed at the No. 5 spot nationally, Bemidji State moved up to No. 7, and Minnesota Duluth is at No. 10. Also receiving votes in the poll this week was Ohio State.

Looking ahead to next week just two league teams will be in action as Minnesota State plays host to Minnesota Duluth for a two-game WCHA set on Friday (Dec. 16) and Saturday (Dec. 17). Following that match up, there will be no games played between Dec. 18-30.

Home to a record 12 consecutive national championship teams, including the latest NCAA Frozen Four crown won by Wisconsin last spring, the WCHA marks its 13th season as a women's league in 2011-12.

# WCHA Team Weekly Notebooks

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

The No. 7-ranked Beavers (10-5-2, 6-5-1-0 WCHA, 19 points) were idle last week and take on No. 1-ranked Wisconsin this Friday (Dec. 9) and Saturday (Dec. 10) at Sanford Center in Bemidji ... The Beavers come into the series with four victories over nationally-ranked opponents this season including wins over No. 2 Minnesota, No. 6 North Dakota, No. 6 Minnesota Duluth and No. 10 Providence ... BSU's last win against the Badgers came on Feb. 7, 2010 in a 2-0 win in Madison ... The Beavers have picked up one previous win over a team ranked No. 1 in the country as they upset No. 1 Mercyhurst 5-3 on Oct. 16, 2010 in the opening weekend of Sanford Center ... BSU remains one of the nation's top power-play teams this season as they are currently ranked third in the nation with 23 goals on 75 power-play opportunities ... In their most recent series on Nov. 25-26, Bemidji State split a WCHA series with North Dakota, losing 5-2 in Crookston, Minn., that Friday and winning 3-2 at home that Saturday.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (15-3-0, 9-3-0-0 WCHA, 27 points) split two WCHA games at No. 5-ranked North Dakota last weekend, winning 7-2 on Friday and losing 3-0 on Saturday ... Minnesota is ranked No. 2 in the USCHO.com Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll this week ... The Gophers have outscored their opponents 84-22 in 18 games this season ... Amanda Kessel leads the team in points with 38 (18-20=38) and she ranks third in the WCHA in scoring ... Megan Bozek is first in the nation in scoring by a defenseman (21 points) ... goaltender Noora Rätty leads the nation in goals-against average at 1.29 ... The Gophers lead the nation in scoring defense, having allowed only 22 goals in 18 games ... Minnesota went 6-0 against non-conference opponents in the 2011-12 regular season, and is 6-2 against top 10-ranked teams so far this season.

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

The No. 10-ranked Bulldogs (8-7-1, 5-6-1-1 WCHA, 17 points) picked up their first home series sweep of the season last weekend against St. Cloud State with 5-1 and 10-2 triumphs ... UMD scored five goals last Friday night, including two from rookie forward Jenna McParland, who netted two tallies and added an assist to help the Bulldogs in their 5-1 win ... UMD – which leads the nation in penalty minutes – was served 31 minutes worth of infractions and opened the second period with eight of the first 10 minutes with a player in the box, but the Bulldogs still prevailed ... Three players had three points, including Haley Irwin (3a), McParland and Audrey Cournoyer (3a) ... Last Saturday night the Bulldogs erupted for seven goals in the second period to overwhelm St. Cloud State ... Irwin tied a UMD record with six assists in the game and set a personal record for points with seven when she added an unassisted goal ... McParland scored her first collegiate hat trick and added an assist, and six players scored two or more points ... Irwin was +7 while McParland and Cournoyer were +6 ... UMD's first line of McParland, Irwin and Cournoyer picked up 16 points ... Jennifer Harss' assist was the second of her career and first by a UMD goaltender since Kim Martin had one back on Feb. 11 ... The Bulldogs' 10 goals was the most since UMD netted 10 against Minnesota State at the DECC back on Nov. 24, 2007 ... Irwin is ranked No. 3 in the NCAA (Div. 1) for assists with an average of 1.43 a game on 20 assists in 14 skates ... McParland ranks No. 6 among all rookie scorers with 17 points in 16 games, and blue liner Jessica Wong sits third in the nation with 18 points in 16 outings ... UMD is averaging 4.12 goals a game this

season ... Irwin has scored three goals and 12 assists in her last six skates, scoring consecutively for her second longest streak of the season ... The Bulldogs will head to Grand Forks to face North Dakota this weekend ... UMD beat UND by a 6-1 count back on Oct. 29 before earning the WCHA shoot-out win on Oct. 30 after a 2-2 (ot) tie.

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

The Mavericks (5-11-0, 1-9-0-0 WCHA, 3 points) were swept by No. 1-ranked Wisconsin last weekend, 4-0 and 5-1 ... MSU junior forward Lauren Smith scored the lone goal for Minnesota State over the weekend and has now scored three of the last five goals for MSU ... Smith leads the team in points (4-8=12) ... Senior Jackie Otto and sophomore Lauren Barnes had assists on the Smith goal ... Sophomore Kari Lundberg tallied an MSU-best 10 shots on goal against Wisconsin ... The Mavericks went 0-of-8 with eight shots on the power-play against the Badgers and MSU now sits at 10-for-52 (19%) on the season ... Wisconsin was 3-of-9 on the power-play and forced 21 shots on net with the advantage ... MSU senior goaltender Alli Altmann made 47 saves against the UW on the weekend, owning a .921 saves percentage ... Sophomore goaltender Danielle Butters, who started last Saturday, made 35 saves and had a .875 saves percentage ... ### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
