Minnesota Tightens WCHA Championship Race, Heads to Minnesota Duluth for Key Series; League-Leading Wisconsin Visits North Dakota; BSU Hosts OSU; MSU Hosts SCSU

Gophers Take Four Points from Defending Champ UW, Face Bulldogs as Top-Ranked Team in Latest Poll; Spooner Becomes Ohio State's All-Time Scoring Leader in Split at SCSU; Tomcikova Sets Two BSU Goaltending Records in Split with MSU; WCHA-Member Teams Sport Impressive 33-7-6 (.783) Non-Conference Record; Five WCHA Teams Among Top 10 in Latest National Polls... UM No. 1, UW No. 2, UND No. 6, UMD No. 8, BSU No. 9; Ticket Packages on Sale for 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, March 2-3 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth

MADISON, Wis. – Last weekend Minnesota tightened up the 2011-12 Western Collegiate Hockey Association championship race by beating and tying defending national women's champion Wisconsin. This weekend, the Golden Gophers face an old rival, Minnesota Duluth, and want to prove their new rating atop one national poll is legitimate.

The UM at UMD series is one of four WCHA sets for Jan. 13-15, with Wisconsin visiting North Dakota (Saturday/Sunday), Bemidji State hosting Ohio State (Friday/Saturday), and Minnesota State entertaining St. Cloud State (Friday/Saturday).

The top-ranked Gophers (18-3-1, 12-3-1 WCHA) take the three-hour drive to Duluth for their two-game set with the host Bulldogs (11-8-1, 8-7-1-1 WCHA) on Friday (Jan. 13) and Saturday (Jan. 14) to face No. 8-ranked and fourth place UMD in a renewal of a long rivalry. Face-offs at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) are 7:07 pm CT each night. Minnesota swept Minnesota Duluth by 4-1 and 3-2 scores back on Nov. 4-5 at Ridder Arena. The Gophers are unbeaten over their last four games at 3-0-1 and 10-1-1 over their last 12 outings

while the Bulldogs enter the series with a three-game winning streak and a 6-1-0 mark over their last seven contests.

Over the first six years of the WCHA's existence, the Bulldogs and Gophers combined to win all six WCHA regular season and tournament titles, as well as each national championship. The head-to-head encounters remain as competitive as ever, with the Gophers holding a 30-23-6 advantage overall. Wisconsin's emergence as a national and league power has now also come into play, but this weekend's games are big because the Badgers, now ranked second in the national poll despite holding a four-point lead over Minnesota in the WCHA standings, play at third place North Dakota, ranked No. 6 in this week's USCHO.com Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll.

In Grand Forks, the Wisconsin-North Dakota series will be contested Saturday and Sunday (Jan. 15) afternoon at 2:07 pm CT each day at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634). The Badgers (19-2-1, 13-2-1-1 WCHA) are 2-0 against North Dakota (13-7-1, 9-6-1 WCHA) this season, after 5-2 and 3-2 (ot) victories on Oct. 8-9 at the Kohl Center in Madison.

Up at Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji, the No. 9-ranked BSU Beavers (13-8-2, 7-8-1 WCHA) will entertain the Ohio State Buckeyes (10-8-4, 7-8-1-1 WCHA) with just point separating the two rivals. Puck drops are 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday. Ohio State forged a 4-4 (ot) tie and 5-3 win over Bemidji State in their season-opening series on Oct. 7-8 at the OSU Ice Rink in Columbus. The Beavers are 3-1-0 over their last four games.

And in Mankato Friday and Saturday, Minnesota State (7-15-0, 3-13-0 WCHA) will engage visiting St. Cloud State (3-17-2, 2-14-0 WCHA) in a pair of contests at All Seasons Arena (750). Face-off for game one is 7:07 pm CT with the second contest set for 3:07 pm CT. The Mavericks and Huskies played their first two-game series roughly one month ago at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, with MSU claiming a 6-0 triumph on Dec. 9 and SCSU coming back to claim a 2-1 verdict on Dec. 10.

With 48 of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 112-game conference schedule now remaining, a look at the conference standings shows Wisconsin (13-2-1-1 WCHA) at the top with 41 points, four more than Minnesota (12-3-1-0 WCHA) with 37. North Dakota (9-5-1-0 WCHA) is in third place with 28 points and Minnesota Duluth (8-7-1-1 WCHA) is in fourth with 26. Ohio State (7-8-1-1 WCHA) is in fifth place this week with 23 points, one ahead of Bemidji State (7-8-1-0 WCHA) with 22. Minnesota State (3-13-0-0 WCHA) has nine points for the seventh spot while St. Cloud State (2-13-0-0 WCHA) is eighth with six points.

The WCHA schedule of 28 games per member team will conclude the weekend of Feb. 17-18. Following those final four series, the eight teams will be re-ranked No. 1 through No. 8 according to their regular season finish and advance to a first round of WCHA Playoffs.

The first round best-of-three series will be contested Friday-Sunday, Feb. 24-26, with No. 1 hosting No. 8, No. 2 hosting No. 7, No. 3 hosting

No. 6 and No. 4 hosting No. 5.

The four first round WCHA playoff winners will then advance to the 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for Friday, March 2 and Saturday, March 3 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn. There will be two semi-finals played on Friday at 4:37 pm and 7:37 pm CT with the championship contest slated for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday.

Following the WCHA tournament, there will be a March 9-11 round of NCAA Regionals at sites to be determined, followed by the 2012 NCAA Women's Frozen Four back at AMSOIL Arena on March 16 and 18.

In on-ice action last weekend (Jan. 6-7) Wisconsin completed its first two-game series without a win since the end of the 2009-10 season, after the Badgers tied (3-3 ot) and lost (1-0) at Minnesota. Friday's contest saw the Badgers take the lead three different times in the game, but each time the Gophers answered back to eventually force the tie. Center Hilary Knight scored the lone goal in the resulting shootout to give Wisconsin the extra point in the league standings. On Saturday, the Gophers used a first-period goal from defenseman Kelly Seeler and 32 saves from goaltender Noora Rätty to claim a 1-0 win. Rätty outdueled the UW's Alex Rigsby, who had made 41 saves, in a battle of elite goaltenders. The tie and win also gives Minnesota the edge in the regular-season series with a 2-1-1 record over the Badgers. Wisconsin saw its nation's best 14-game winning streak come to an end.

In other league play last weekend, Natalie Spooner had a record-breaking weekend in Ohio State's series split at St. Cloud State. The senior forward finished with three goals and one assist for four points for the Buckeyes en route to become Ohio State's all-time leading goal scorer. Only three goals away from breaking the record of 86 set by Jeni Creary (2002-05), Spooner tied the record last Friday as she scored both goals in OSU's 2-0 win over the Huskies. After the Buckeyes found themselves down 3-0 early last Saturday in an eventual 4-3 loss, the team fought back and tied the game at 3-3 on Spooner's record-breaking goal at 5:27 in the third. With those three goals, Spooner now leads all current and former Buckeyes with 87 goals in her career and also has 140 career points. That mark is fourth-best in the program's history and is six points shy of tying Creary's career point total of 146 for third. For St. Cloud State, right

winger Brittany Toor (1g, 1a) had the game-winning goal at 14:20 of the third period.

Up in Bemidji last weekend, visiting Minnesota State and Bemidji State also split two games. Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova set BSU school records for saves and minutes played in last Saturday's 4-0 shutout of the Mavericks. The shutout was the third of the season for Tomcikova and marked a school record 17th for her career. Tomcikova, who made 30 saves in the victory, picked up her ninth win of the season. In the series opener last Friday, the senior netminder notched 33 saves while giving up two late goals to the Mavericks in a 2-1 loss. Center Lauren Barnes and right winger Lauren Zrust had third period goals for the Mavericks in their third win of the WCHA season.

Outside the WCHA last week, North Dakota wrapped up its 2011-12 non-conference schedule with a 14-0 rout over independent Lindenwood University on Jan. 4 in Grand Forks. Left winger Monique Lamoureux-Kolls set new program records in points (eight), goals (four) and plus/minus rating (+8). UND also set new program records in largest margin of victory (14), most goals in a game (14), most goals in a period (3rd, 7), most shots in a game (62) and most even-strength goals in a game (10). Center Jocelyne Lamoureux also had a three-goal hat trick and totaled five points while senior defenseman Margot Miller had a career-high four-point game (1g, 3a).

North Dakota's win over Lindenwood last week gives the WCHA a 33-7-6 record and a .783 winning percentage against opponents from other Division 1 conferences this season. WCHA teams are 6-0-2 (.875) vs ECAC Hockey, 13-2-1 (.844) vs. the Hockey East Association, 8-5-3 (.594) vs. College Hockey America, and 6-0-0 vs. Independents.

Five WCHA-member teams are ranked among the nation's top 10 in this week's (Jan. 9) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, led by Minnesota as the new No. 1. Defending national champion Wisconsin is No. 2, North Dakota is at No. 6, Minnesota Duluth is at No. 8 and Bemidji State is at No. 9.

And in the latest (Jan. 10) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is No. 1, Wisconsin is No. 2, North Dakota is No. 6, Minnesota Duluth is No. 8 and Bemidji State is No. 9.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Jan. 20-21, there will again be four head-to-head WCHA series contested. Ohio State will host Minnesota State, Bemidji State travels to Minnesota, North Dakota entertains St. Cloud State and Minnesota Duluth visits Wisconsin.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
