## First Round of WCHA Playoffs Get Underway Friday in Four Best-of-Three Series; League Champion Wisconsin Hosts Minnesota State; Minnesota Takes on St. Cloud State; North Dakota Hosts Bemidji State; Minnesota Duluth Plays Ohio State

**Four First Round Winners to Advance to 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, March 2-3 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth ... Tickets Continue on Sale; Bulldogs, Beavers Gain League Sweeps on Final Weekend of Regular Season; OSU Wins at UW; UND's Lamoureux is WCHA Scoring Champion, UW's Rigsby is Goaltending Champion; 12 WCHA Players Among 30 Nominees for Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award; Four of Nation's Top 10 from WCHA in Latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 1, UM No. 2, UND No. 6, UMD No. 10 ... BSU Receive Votes; WCHA-Member Teams 33-7-6 (.783) in Non-Conference Play**

MADISON, Wis. – No. 1-ranked Wisconsin clinched its second straight women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association championship and third in the last six seasons by breezing to a 7-1 victory over visiting Ohio State last Friday (February 17). But then the Buckeyes gave the defending national champions a reminder that upsets can happen late in February and in the playoffs with a 4-2 victory in the series finale on Saturday (February 18).

So now it's on to the second season for the eight WCHA teams, with four of those – Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth – ranked among the top 10 one of this week's national polls and

the rest looking to make some noise in the post-season.

The first round of the WCHA playoffs, a best-of-three series format, get underway this Friday, February 24. Game two of each series will be played on Saturday, February 25 while any game threes, if necessary, will be contested on Sunday, February 26.

Following the four first-round playoff series, the four winners will advance to the 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship, set for March 2-3 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn.

And after the conclusion of the league tournaments, the NCAA Regionals will be played the weekend of March 9-11 with the 2012 NCAA Women's Frozen Four to be held March 16 & 18 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth.

In this week's four first round WCHA playoff series (best-of-three) regular season champion and No. 1 seed Wisconsin (29-3-2) will host No. 8 seed Minnesota State (7-26-1) at Eagle's Nest in Verona (7:07 pm CT, 7:07 pm CT, 4:07 pm CT), regular season runner-up and No. 2 seed Minnesota (27-5-2) will entertain No. 7 seed St. Cloud State (5-27-2) at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis (7:07 pm CT, 4:07 pm CT, 4:07 pm CT), No. 3 seed North Dakota (20-10-3) will host No. 6 seed Bemidji State (17-15-3) at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks (2:37 pm CT, 2:37 pm CT, 2:37 pm CT), and No. 4 seed Minnesota Duluth (18-13-1) will go up against No. 5 seed Ohio State (16-14-4) at AMSOIL Arena (3:07 pm CT, 3:37 pm CT, 3:07 pm CT).

The top-seeded and No. 1-ranked Badgers, who have won the league title for the last two seasons, were victorious in all four regular season meetings against the Mavericks, who are 1-51-2 all-time against Wisconsin. In fact, the Badgers have won the last nine games head-to-head, spanning back to Feb. 14, 2010. Since then, Minnesota State has only scored more than one goal in a game twice. The Badgers started February off with two wins against Minnesota State to claim the season sweep. In the four games played between the two sides this year, Wisconsin has out-scored MSU by a total of 20-3. The narrowest margin of victory for the Badgers in those four games was a 5-2 win on Feb. 3 at the Kohl Center.

Seventh-seeded St. Cloud State heads an hour down Interstate 94 to take on No. 2-ranked and second-seeded Minnesota, a team that outscored the Huskies 29-1 in winning four games this season.

Coming off of a season-ending split at Minnesota, No. 5/6-ranked and No. 3 seed North Dakota hosts No. 6 seed Bemidji State for a second straight season and hopes to advance to a second straight FINAL FACE-OFF. Last season, the Beavers pushed UND to overtime in the decisive third game. North Dakota won three of their four regular-season meetings with the Beavers here in 2011-12 by a combined 15-8. UND swept the Beavers in Grand Forks by 5-2 and 3-1 scores, respectively, earlier this season.

Buoyed by its win in Madison, No. 5 seed Ohio State heads to Duluth for their first round set against No. 10-ranked and No. 4 seed Minnesota Duluth. UMD is 46-7-4 all-time against the Buckeyes and

split with OSU 2-2 on the season, including just two weeks ago at AMSOIL Arena. The Bulldogs are 17-2 in playoff opening league action and have never lost a first-round WCHA playoff best of three games series since the format made its debut in 2006.

Last weekend, February 17-18, Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth scored the only series sweeps of the final weekend of the regular season. UMD earned its fifth sweep of the season, taking two games from visiting Minnesota State, 4-1 and 7-1. In game one, the Bulldogs were led by junior left wing Audrey Cournoyer's two goals and senior center Haley Irwin's one goal and two assists. Irwin then surpassed the 200 career point mark with a goal in the first period last Saturday. She was the sixth player in UMD history to reach the milestone. Irwin also picked up point 201 on UMD's next goal, and is three points from No. 5 on the school's all-time scoring chart. Also for the Bulldogs in game two, left winger Jamie Kenyon had three points (2g, 1a).

Bemidji State earned its first sweep since Dec. 30-31 as they defeated host St. Cloud State 6-1 and 3-2 at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud. Bemidji State goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova moved past Molly Schaus of Boston College for third all-time in saves in NCAA history with 3,462 stops. Tomcikova also moved into second place all-time in WCHA history with 116 games played surpassing Jessie Vetter of Wisconsin. In last Saturday's game the BSU power-play unit of Montana Vichorek (D), Sadie Lundquist (C), Emily Erickson (RW), Marlee Wheelhouse (D) and Erika Wheelhouse (D) set the school record with five power-play goals (in six opportunities) – one short of the NCAA record. Vichorek (1g, 4a) and Erickson (2g, 3a) each had five points in Saturday's 6-1 win while Marlee Wheelhouse had four (2g, 2a).

Wisconsin wrapped up the regular season with a weekend split against visiting Ohio State, winning last Friday's game, 7-1, to clinch their fourth overall WCHA regular season title before dropping Saturday's contest, 4-2. The UW line of center Brianna Decker (2g, 3a), left wing Carlyne Prévost (2g, 2a) and right wing Brooke Ammerman (1g, 3a) led the way in the series opener as they combined for 13 points. Ohio State junior left winger Hokey Langan Langan scored a pair of goals and added an assist in the Buckeyes' win Saturday, opening with a power-play and game-winning goal at 11:44 in the first. She sealed the team win with an empty-net goal at 19:31 in the third. Langan and OSU senior captain and center Laura McIntosh finished with three points on the weekend as each scored two goals and had one assist over the two games. The win was the program's first victory over a top-ranked opponent in the regular season and the first win in Wisconsin since the Buckeyes upset the Badgers in the 2010 WCHA tournament.

In Minneapolis last weekend, Minnesota and North Dakota split two games at Ridder Arena. UND opened the series with a 2-1 overtime win last Friday. Freshman center Josefina Jakobsen scored a power-play goal with just :36 seconds remaining in the extra session to clinch the road victory for North Dakota. Right winger Jocelyne Lamoureux also scored for UND, reaching the 200 career points milestone as a junior. Her twin sister, defenseman Monique Lamoureux-Kolls, had

two assists on the weekend and is now within three points of her 200th. Golden Gophers defenseman Megan Bozek (1g, 3a) then had four points in Saturday's 5-2 Minnesota win, with points on four of five goals. She assisted on Minnesota's first three goals of the game, including right winger Sarah Erickson's game-winner in the second period. Bozek gave the Gophers a 4-1 lead when she got a power-play goal just 19 seconds into the third period.

Individually this season, North Dakota junior forward Jocelyne Lamoureux finished as the WCHA scoring champion (based on league games only) with 64 points on 27 goals and 37 assists. She was 10 points better than her nearest competitor – Wisconsin forward Brianna Decker – who had 54 (20g, 34a).

In the league goaltending race, Wisconsin sophomore Alex Rigsby emerged as the conference champion for 2011-12, sporting a 1.47 goals-against average over a league-leading 1,669:34 minutes of action. Rigsby also led in winning percentage at .857 on a 23-3-2 league mark and was first in save percentage at .951 (790 saves). Finishing second behind Rigsby was Minnesota junior Noora Rätty, who had a 1.57 goals-against average over 1,609:47 along with a 20-5-2 record and .933 save percentage (587 saves).

On the Div. 1 national scene, North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux is the top scorer at 2.39 points per game (33-46=79), Wisconsin's Brianna Decker is third (2.12, 32-36=68), UND's Monique Lamoureux-Kolls is fourth (2.06, 25-43=68), the Badgers' Brooke Ammerman is fifth (2.00, 27-41=68), Minnesota's Amanda Kessel is sixth (1.97, 26-41=67), Wisconsin's Carolyne Prévost is seventh (1.89, 24-27=51) and UND's Michelle Karvinen is ninth (1.81, 23-35=58).

In scoring among Div. 1 defensemen, UND's Monique Lamoureux-Kolls is first with 2.06 points per game (25-43=68), Minnesota's Megan Bozek is third with a 1.15 points per game average (13-26=39), Bemidji State's Montana Vichorek is sixth at 0.97 (8-23=31) and Minnesota Duluth's Jessica Wong is seventh at 0.91 (11-18=29).

And in national goaltending statistics, Wisconsin's Alex Rigsby is second in goals-against average (1.40), first in save percentage (.950), second in winning percentage (.882, 29-3-2) and tied for second in shutouts (7). Minnesota's Noora Rätty is fourth nationally in goals-against average (1.48), fifth in save percentage (.934) and fourth in winning percentage (.818, 26-5-2).

In the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll released for Feb. 21, four Western Collegiate Hockey Association teams were among the nation's top 10 ranked teams. Defending national champion Wisconsin was No. 1, Minnesota was No. 2, North Dakota was No. 6 and Minnesota Duluth was No. 10. Also receiving votes was Bemidji State.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll released on Feb. 20, the WCHA had three of the top 10 ranked teams and two that received votes. Wisconsin continued at No. 1, Minnesota is at No. 2, and North Dakota is at No. 5. Also receiving votes were both Minnesota Duluth and Bemidji State.

WCHA teams have a .778 winning percentage against opponents from other Division 1 conferences this season, WCHA teams are 33-7-6 overall. WCHA teams are 6-0-2 (.875) vs ECAC Hockey, 13-2-1 (.844) vs. the Hockey East Association, 8-5-3 (.594) vs. College Hockey America, and 6-0-0 vs. Independents.

Home to a record 12 consecutive national championship teams, including the latest NCAA Frozen Four crown won by Wisconsin last spring, the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association marks its 13th season in 2011-12.

## Twelve WCHA Players Among 30 Nominated for 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award

**Group Includes UM's Bozek, Kessel, Raty and Schoullis, UW's Rigsby, Knight and Decker, UND's Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls, BSU's Tomcikova, UMD's Irwin, OSU's Spooner**

A dozen Western Collegiate Hockey Association players, representing six member teams, are among the 30 skaters who have been nominated for the 15th annual Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, which is presented annually to the top women's player in Division 1 hockey.

Four of the 12 nominees are from Minnesota. They are junior defenseman Megan Bozek (Buffalo Grove, IL), sophomore forward Amanda Kessel (Madison, WI), junior goaltender Noora Rätty (Espoo, Finland), and senior forward Jen Schoullis (Erie, PA). Rätty was one of 10 finalists for the award a year ago.

Three nominees are from league champion Wisconsin in sophomore goaltender Alex Rigsby (Delafield, WI), senior forward Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID) – who was a top ten finalist last season – and junior forward Brianna Decker (Dousman, WI).

North Dakota has two nominees. They are twin sisters Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls of Grand Forks, ND. Both are juniors. Lamoureux is a forward while Monique has played at both forward and on the blue line.

Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth and Ohio State each have one nominee. Senior goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova (Bratislava, Slovakia), is the BSU nominee; senior forward Haley Irwin (Thunder Bay, ON) is UMD's nominee and senior forward Natalie Spooner (Scarborough, ON) is OSU's nominee.

The 34 Division 1 coaches will pick the 10 Patty Kazmaier finalists, which will be announced March 1. A 13-member selection committee will then select the final three, which will be announced March 8, and the winner, which will be announced March 17 at a brunch in Duluth in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Frozen Four.

## WCHA Announces Record Number of 110 Scholar-Athletes for 2011-12

### Seventh Annual Class Includes 54 Repeat Honorees; MSU's Lee, UMD's Reiter are Four-Time Recipients

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, Michigan Technological University Athletic Director Suzanne Sanregret (Chair, men's league) and University of Minnesota Faculty Representative Perry Leo (Chair, women's league) announced on Feb. 15 that a record total of 110 men's and women's student-athletes make up the seventh annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients for 2011-12. The previous record for honorees in one season was 90 in 2010-11.

"It is with a great deal of pride that we announce our seventh annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athletes," said McLeod, Martin, Sanregret and Leo (Chair, women's league) in a joint statement.

"This announcement has become one of the real highlights for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association each season as it focuses attention on a truly exceptional group of student-athletes. These outstanding young men and women have gone above and beyond to achieve great success both on and off the ice and their accomplishments are a testimony to the amount of dedication and hard work they put in throughout the school year. Together, they represent their teams and their league in a most impressive way and we could not be more proud of each and every one of them. On behalf of the entire WCHA, We wish them all the success in the world."

The WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for each of the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

Over the first seven years of the award, there have now been 525 honorees representing all 12 men's-member and all eight women's-member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 90 in 2010-11.

Fifty-four (54) of this season's 110 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including two four-time recipients and 15 three-time winners.

Earning this distinguished honor for the fourth time are Minnesota Duluth's Kenny Reiter (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12) and Minnesota State's Austin Lee (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12), who also become only the fourth and fifth conference student-athletes to do so. ### Bemidji State University

The Beavers (17-15-3 overall, 11-15-2-0 WCHA, 32 points) picked up their first sweep since Dec. 30-31 as they defeated St. Cloud State University in two WCHA games (6-1, 3-2) last weekend at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud ... The 2011-12 Bemidji State team became the first to finish .500 in a regular-season and the first to win over 15 games in a season in BSU history with the two wins on Feb. 17-18 ... BSU netminder Zuzana Tomcikova moved past Molly Schaus of Boston College for third all-time in saves in NCAA history with 3,462 stops ... Tomcikova also moved into second place all-time in WCHA history with 116 games played, surpassing Jessie Vetter of Wisconsin ... In last Saturday's game at SCSU, the BSU power-play unit of Montana Vichorek, Sadie Lundquist, Emily Erickson, Marlee Wheelhouse and Erika Wheelhouse set the school record with five power-play goals ... The mark fell just one short of the NCAA record of six ... Vichorek and Erickson each tallied five points in last Saturday's 6-1 win ... The No. 6-seed Beavers will open the WCHA playoffs on the road at No. 3-seed University of North Dakota in a rematch of last year's first round of playoffs with games beginning at 2:37 pm on Friday, Saturday and Sunday (if necessary) at Ralph Engelstad Arena from Feb. 24-26.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (27-5-2, 21-5-2-1 WCHA, 65 points) split two conference games with No. 5 North Dakota last weekend (Feb. 17-18), losing 2-1 in overtime and winning the final game of the regular season, 5-2 ... The second place Gophers will host No. 7 seed St. Cloud State in a best of three series at Ridder Arena this weekend, Feb. 24-26 ... Minnesota is 12-0 in WCHA First Round games in the current tournament format ... Megan Bozek leads the nation in points by a defenseman with 39, six more than her closest competitor ... Bozek had four points in last Saturday's 5-2 win, with points on four of five Gopher goals ... She assisted on Minnesota's first three goals of the game, including Sarah Erickson's game-winner in the second period ... Bozek gave the Gophers a 4-1 lead when she got a power-play goal just :19 seconds into the third period ... With the four points, she now has 86 career points and moved into fourth place on Minnesota's all-time list for scoring by defensemen ... goaltender Noora Rätty set the school record for wins in a season with her 26th victory last Saturday (vs UND).

The Bulldogs were led by junior forward Audrey Cournoyer's two goals and senior forward Haley Irwin's goal and two assists ... Senior goaltender Jennifer Hars made 24 saves ... 13 players registered a point in last Saturday's 7-1 victory over the Mzavericks, including two goals and an assist from sophomore forward Jamie Kenyon ... WCHA Playoff game times against the Beavers are set for 2:37 pm Friday, Saturday and Sunday (if necessary) at the Ralph Engelstad Arena ... North Dakota split its regular-season series finale at No. 2-ranked Minnesota last weekend ... The Sioux opened the series with a 2-1 overtime win on Feb. 17 ... Freshman Josefine Jakobsen scored a power-play goal with only :36 seconds remaining to clinch the victory ... forward Jocelyne Lamoureux also scored in the game, reaching the 200 career points milestone as a junior ... With the three points, McIntosh added to her Ohio State record of 168 career points ... She also added to her Ohio State career assists record and has 122 overall ... McIntosh scored the team's lone goal last Friday, scoring a shorthander at 9:48 in the second ... Her second score of the weekend came at 10:39 in the first period last Saturday and was the team's second goal of the game ... If a third game is needed the puck will drop at 4:07 pm once again on Sunday, Feb. 26 ... SCSU finished the regular season in seventh place in the WCHA standings with 12 points ... The Huskies have struggled against the Gophers this season, losing all four previous matchups by a combined score of 29 to 1 ... Minnesota also outshot SCSU 196-63 in those games ... Senior goaltender Tayler VanDenakker started both games for St. Cloud State when they played at Ridder, Oct. 7-8, on the opening weekend to the WCHA season ... In the two games played at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud on Feb. 2-3, it was freshman Julie Friend getting both starts ... Junior Jocelyn Zabrick and sophomore Molli Mott both scored for the Huskies and Friend had 35 saves but it was not enough to get the win ... Mott's goal was her team-leading ninth of the season ... ## Badgers University of Wisconsin

The No. 1-ranked Badgers (29-3-3, 23-3-2-1 WCHA, 72 points) start the first round of WCHA playoffs this weekend with a best-of-three series against No. 8 seed Minnesota State on Friday and Saturday at the Eagle's Nest Ice Arena in Verona, Wis. ... Both games will be played at 7:07 pm and if necessary a third game will be played on Sunday at 4:07 pm ... Brianna Decker is second in the nation in goals with 32 and has the second most points in the country (72) ... Her linemate Brooke Ammerman is third in the nation for points with 68 (27g, 41a) ... Alex Rigsby leads the nation with a .950 save percentage and is second in the country with a 1.41 goals-against average ... She also is tied for the second-most shutouts on the year with seven ... Minnesota State is coming off a Feb. 17-18 weekend sweep at the hands of Minnesota Duluth in Duluth ... The last four weekends have seen the Mavericks play against all top-four teams from the WCHA ... The last win MSU had was on Jan. 6 against Bemidji State and the last non-win was a 3-3 tie against North Dakota just two weeks ago on Feb. 11 ... Wisconsin has only suffered one loss at the hands of Minnesota State in the 54 games played between the two sides ... Wisconsin has currently won the last nine contests against the Mavericks, spanning back to Feb. 14, 2010 ... Since then, Minnesota State has only scored more than one goal in a game twice ... The Badgers started February off with two wins against Minnesota State to claim the season sweep ... In the four games played between the two sides this year, Wisconsin has out-scored MSU by a total of 20-3 ... The narrowest margin of victory for the Badgers in those four games was a 5-2 win on Feb. 3 at the Kohl Center ... The Badgers wrapped up the regular season on Feb. 17-18 with a weekend split against Ohio State, winning last Friday's game, 7-1, and dropping Saturday's contest, 4-2 ... Decker, Carolyne Prévost and Ammerman led the way on Friday as they combined for 13 points in the 7-1 win ... Prévost was the lone goal scorer in the first period as she put the Badgers up 1-0 within the first nine minutes of play ... UW then put up three goals in both the second and third periods to cruise to an easy win ... The only blemish on the day was a shorthanded goal scored by the Buckeyes in the second period ... On Saturday, the Badgers looked like they were going to cruise to another victory, dominating the glow of the game from the get-go ... However, the Buckeyes scored three goals on their first four shots on goal to build an early lead ... Wisconsin regained its footing after the stumble, but could only cut the deficit to one, before the Buckeyes scored in an empty-net to seal a 4-2 win over the Badgers ... A total of 30 players were nominated for the 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award ... Among those nominated were Wisconsin's Decker, Rigsby and Hilary Knight ... The group of Prévost, Decker, Ammerman and Knight have combined for a total of 111 goals and 134 assists so far this season ... The four account for over half (.593) of the team's point production and have scored more than two-thirds (.702) of the team's goals so far this season ... Compared to other team's top-four scorers, they are the highest scoring group in the nation with 245 points ... Rigsby leads the nation with a .950 save percentage, while

her 890 saves is the second most in the nation ... Rigsby also has the second-best goals-against average in the nation (1.42), but has the best GAA for goalies with more than 15 games ... Wisconsin has the best power-play and penalty-kill units in the conference ... The 25.5% on the power-play also ranks second nationally, while the 88.6% on the penalty-kill ranks third ... Knight has tied the program mark for most shorthanded goals in a season with three ... Her seven career shorthanders is also tied for the program's most ... With 1,330 total shots on goal so far this season, the Badgers are averaging 39 shots on goal per game, the third most in the nation ... Ammerman became the fourth Badger in program history to reach 200 career points, scoring on the power-play against St. Cloud State on Feb. 11 ... The senior is nine goals shy of becoming just the third player in program history to record both 100 career goals and assists ... Wisconsin leads the nation in women's hockey attendance, averaging 1,905 fans per game in 34 games ... UW also boasts the best home attendance in the nation with 2,883 fans per game ... Wisconsin players have posted eight hat tricks this season, coming from three different players.

### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
