Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota to Represent WCHA in 2012 NCAA Division 1 Women's Hockey Championship Tournament; League Owns Record 12 Consecutive National Titles Defending National Champion, WCHA Regular Season Winner UW is Top Seed and Will Host Mercyhurst Saturday; 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Champion Minnesota to Host First-Time Entrant North Dakota Saturday; Two Other NCAA Regional Match Ups March 10 Feature St. Lawrence at Boston College, Boston University at Cornell; Noora Rätty's Two Shutouts Lead Golden Gophers to First WCHA Playoff Championship Since 2005; Six WCHA Players Among 10 Finalists for 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award; Latest Women's National Polls Have UW No. 1, UM No. 2, UND No. 5/6, UMD No. 10; WCHA-Member Teams 33-7-6 (.783) in Non-Conference Play

MADISON, Wis. – Three teams from the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, winners of the last 12 national championships, have been selected to play in the quarterfinals of the 2012 NCAA Division 1 Women's Ice Hockey Championships on Saturday, March 10.

Defending national champion, 2011-12 WCHA regular season champ, No. 1-ranked and No. 1 seed Wisconsin (31-4-2) will host College Hockey America regular season champ Mercyhurst University (23-7-3) of Erie, Pa., in the quarterfinal round. Puck drop is 7:00 pm CT Saturday evening at the Kohl Center.

2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion, No. 2-ranked and No. 2 seed Minnesota (31-5-2) will host No. 5/6-ranked North Dakota (22-11-3) at Ridder Arena at 4:00 pm CT on Saturday afternoon in Minneapolis. The Golden Gophers earned the WCHA's automatic berth to the national tourney after winning the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth on March 2-3. Minnesota beat Minnesota Duluth 2-0 in the championship game and North Dakota 6-0 in the semifinals.

This is the first NCAA tournament appearance for North Dakota, which received one of the four at-large berths.

North Dakota at Minnesota (NC), 4:00 pm CT; Mercyhurst at Wisconsin (NC), 7:00 pm CT; St. Lawrence at Boston College (NC), 1:00 pm ET; Boston University at Cornell (NC), 2:00 pm ET.

The Gophers' meeting with North Dakota will be the sixth this season, with Minnesota having won three of the previous five meetings. The last meeting between the teams was last Friday (March 2) in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF semifinals in Duluth, when Minnesota earned a 6-0 shutout win. In regular season games this season, Minnesota and North Dakota are even at 2-2, splitting the series in Grand Forks in December and the series in Minneapolis in February. Minnesota leads the all-time series 32-5-0, but North Dakota has won five of the last nine games.

Minnesota is making its 10th appearance in the 12-year history of the NCAA Championship, and has qualified for the tournament for a fifth-straight season. The Gophers have a 9-8-1 overall record in the NCAA Tournament, with a 4-1 record in NCAA quarterfinal games. The NCAA first included quarterfinal games in 2005 after expanding the tournament field to eight teams.

The Badgers are making their seventh NCAA national tournament appearance and begin the quest for their fifth national championship after taking home the title in 2006, 2007, 2009 and 2011. UW has a 13-2-0 record in the national tournament.

After winning the College Hockey America regular-season championship, Mercyhurst, which is making its eighth straight NCAA appearance, is coming off a loss to Robert Morris in the CHA tournament final. Against common opponents this season, Mercyhurst went 5-1-0, splitting with Minnesota State and winning four against Lindenwood while the Badgers went 6-0 vs. the Mavericks and 2-0 vs. Lindenwood. The Lakers went 4-3-0 against teams that made the selection for this year's NCAA tournament. Wisconsin and Mercyhurst have met in the NCAA tournament twice before, the last time being in the 2009 national championship game, when the Badgers posted a 5-0 victory in Boston. Mercyhurst has only played Wisconsin seven times, with the Badgers taking all seven games. The closest game in the series was a 2-1 double-overtime win for the Badgers in the 2006 NCAA quarterfinals which was held at Capital Ice in Middleton, Wis.

The other NCAA tournament pairings on Saturday have Boston University (23-13-1) at No. 2 Cornell (29-4-0) and St. Lawrence (24-9-4) at No. 4 Boston College (23-9-3).

The quarterfinal winners will advance to the 2012 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for Friday, March 16 and Sunday, March 18 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn. The two semifinal games will be held on Friday and the national title game on Sunday.

In the 11 years of NCAA-sponsored tournaments, WCHA members have won all 11 titles – UMD has five, Wisconsin has four and Minnesota two. Wisconsin defeated Boston University 4-1 in the 2011 championship game at Tullio Arena in Erie, Pa. Five of this year quarterfinalists are repeaters from last year's field, including UW and Minnesota.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll released on March 5, the WCHA had four of the top 10 ranked teams in the nation. Wisconsin continued at No. 1, Minnesota was at No. 2, North Dakota was at No. 6 and Minnesota Duluth was No. 10.

Goaltender Noora Rätty Helps Minnesota Win First WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Title Since 2005

DULUTH, Minn. – Noora Rätty, Minnesota's junior goaltender who says she believes that the goalie should never allow a goal, continued her amazing season Saturday (March 3) night by stopping all 28 Minnesota Duluth shots and anchoring the Golden Gophers' 2-0 victory in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game at AMSOIL Arena.

Rätty, who shut out North Dakota 6-0 in Friday's (March 2) semifinals, recorded her third straight shutout, and 26th for her three-year career by blanking the Bulldogs. It was Minnesota's first league playoff title since 2005, and boosts the Golden Gophers to 31-5-2, while UMD drops to 21-13-1.

Minnesota outshot UMD 35-28 for the game, and had its hands full trying to get anything past Jennifer Harss in the UMD goal. The Gophers finally scored when Emily West drew a penalty, then scored on the power-play late in the second period. West, in fact, was involved in virtually everything that the Gopher offense could muster, including drawing a penalty shot, which she missed.

Raty took over in the third, holding the slim 1-0 lead until Megan Bozek scored into an empty net with just six seconds remaining. West was even involved defensively at the finish, twice making key blocks of UMD blasts to help preserve the shutout.

"We're ecstatic to be champions of the WCHA tournament," said Minnesota coach Brad Frost. "It was a great hockey game; both teams laid it on the line. We played well tonight, and they played very well. After the game, Haley Irwin shook my hand and said, 'Brad, it's been a lot of fun playing against your team for four years. I thought that was pretty special, and she's a special player."

"Our team played so hard, and this was good for us; we need to be in games like this, where we have to play through it. We've scored a lot of goals, but the strength of our team is our defense, which starts with Noora. And our seniors. We've got seven fantastic seniors, and each brings something special to the table."

Minnesota Duluth came out with the same fire displayed in the 3-1 upset of No. 1-ranked Wisconsin in the semifinals.

"I'm extremely proud of our team," said UMD head coach Shannon Miller. "We had to empty our tank to beat the No. 1 team in the country yesterday, and today I wasn't sure if we had anything left in the tank. But we played great again. Minnesota is the fastest team in the country that we've seen, without a doubt. But it was such a close game that one team got a bounce, and one didn't."

Rätty was named all-tournament goaltender and most valuable player, and was joined on the all-tournament team by teammates

West, Sarah Davis, and defenseman Anne Schleper, plus UMD center Haley Irwin and Bulldogs' defenseman Bridgette Lacquette.

"One of our seniors told a freshman that when you win a championship like this, you think it's supposed to happen. But it doesn't," said Frost. "It's been seven long years since the Gophers won the league playoffs, so I told the players to enjoy the moment."

Six WCHA Players Among 10 Finalists for 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award

Six players from the WCHA are among the 10 finalists for the 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, presented by Easton Foundations.

The award, annually bestowed upon the top player in NCAA Division I women's ice hockey, will be presented at a brunch ceremony on March 17 at the Greysolon Ballroom in Duluth, Minn., in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Frozen Four.

The 10 finalists are (in alphabetical order): senior forward Bailey Bram (Ste. Anne, MB/Mercyhurst College), junior forward **Brianna Decker** (Dousman, WI/University of Wisconsin), junior defenseman Laura Fortino (Hamilton, ON/Cornell University), senior forward Rebecca Johnston (Sudbury, ON/Cornell University), junior forward **Amanda Kessel** (Madison, WI/University of Minnesota), senior forward **Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, ID/University of Wisconsin), junior forward **Jocelyne Lamoureux** (Grand Forks, ND/University of North Dakota), junior forward/defenseman **Monique Lamoureux-Kolls** (Grand Forks, ND/University of North Dakota), senior goaltender Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland/Northeastern University) and senior forward **Natalie Spooner** (Scarborough, ON/Ohio State University).

The top-10 class for the 15th annual Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, presented by Easton Foundations, represents all four women's college conferences – College Hockey America, ECAC Hockey, Hockey East Association and the Western Collegiate Hockey Association.

The award selection process began in late February, when NCAA Division I women's ice hockey coaches were asked to nominate players for the award. Players who were nominated by two or more coaches were then placed on an official ballot, which was then sent back to the coaches to vote for the top 10 finalists. The independent accounting firm PricewaterhouseCoopers, LLP, tabulated the ballots.

The three finalists, including the recipient of the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, will be chosen by a 13-member selection committee comprised of NCAA Div. I women's ice hockey coaches, representatives of the print and broadcast media, an at-large member and a representative of USA Hockey, the national governing body for the sport of ice hockey in the United States.

Notes: The three finalists for this year's award will be announced on Thursday, March 8 ... Wisconsin's Brianna Decker Named Player of the Year, North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux is Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year to Highlight 2011-12 WCHA Individual Awards

Regular Season Champion Wisconsin, Minnesota Place Pair on All-WCHA First Team; Head Coaches Vote UW's Stefanie McKeough WCHA Defensive Player of the Year; North Dakota's Michelle Karvinen Named WCHA Rookie of the Year; Wisconsin's Mark Johnson is WCHA Coach of the Year; UND's Jocelyne Lamoureux is WCHA Scoring Champion; UW's Alex Riggsby is WCHA Goaltending Champion; 98 Earn All-WCHA Academic Team Honors

MADISON, Wis. – The University of Wisconsin and the University of Minnesota were atop the league standings and national polls most of the regular season and the teams' success is reflected in the 2011-12 post-season women's honors announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association today (March 1) at a league awards ceremony held in Duluth, Minn., in conjunction with the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF tournament championship. The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is being held Friday and Saturday, March 2-3, at AMSOIL Arena.

Two members of the Badgers' high-scoring power-play and a pair of players from the University of Minnesota defense corps lead the All-WCHA First Team as selected by coaches and team captains. Wisconsin's Brianna Decker, who scored 20 goals and 34 assists for 54 points in 28 conference games, was named the WCHA's Player of the Year. She is also one of six WCHA players named as top 10 finalists for the 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award earlier today by the USA Hockey Foundation, given annually to the top collegiate player. The junior from Dousman, Wis., was joined on the All-WCHA First Team at forward by teammate Hilary Knight, a senior from Sun Valley, Idaho who had 22 goals and 43 points in league play, the University of North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux, a junior from Grand Forks, N.D., who led the league in scoring with 27 goals, 37 assists and 64 points, and Ohio State University senior Natalie Spooner from Scarborough, Ont., who had 25 goals and 39 points in league competition. All three of

those players – Knight, Lamoureux and Spooner – were also named as finalists for this season's Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award. Knight was a WCHA Offensive Player of the Week on Dec. 14 and Feb. 15, Lamoureux earned the honor on both Nov. 9 and Jan. 25, and Spooner won the weekly award on both Nov. 30 and Jan. 11.

The All-WCHA First Team for 2011-12 also includes Minnesota defenseman Anne Schleper (28 gp, 4-19=23), a senior from St. Cloud, Minn., and teammate Megan Bozek (28 gp, 10-23=33), a junior defenseman from Buffalo Grove, Ill. The All-WCHA First Team goaltender is Bemidji State University senior Zuzana Tomcikova, a senior from Bratislava, Slovakia who had a 2.43 goals-against average in league play and a .929 conference saves percentage. Tomcikova shared WCHA Player of the Year honors as a sophomore. Schleper was a WCHA Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 15, Bozek was a Defensive Player of the Week on Dec. 7, and Tomcikova earned the weekly honor on both Oct. 5 and Feb. 15.

Decker, Knight and Schleper are all repeat selections on the all-league squad and it is the third straight season Schleper has been honored.

Wisconsin's Stefanie McKeough, a junior defender from Carlsbad Springs, Ont., was honored as the WCHA Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of the league's head coaches. She scored four goals, had 14 assists and 18 points in 19 league contests for the regular season champion Badgers.

The WCHA Coach of the Year Award for 2011-12 went to Wisconsin's Mark Johnson, who led the Badgers to a 23-3-2-1 conference record and to the regular season title. It is the fifth time Johnson has either won or shared the award. Under Johnson's tutelage, Wisconsin has won four NCAA titles, four WCHA playoff titles and three WCHA regular season crowns. Johnson and the Badgers were the first team ever to land in the NCAA championship game in four consecutive seasons and win the title three times (2006, 2007, 2009). The former 'Miracle on Ice' hero and gold medalist in the 1980 Winter Olympics is also three-time national Division 1 coach of the year. In his eight years at Wisconsin, Johnson has an .820 winning percentage. He took a sabbatical to coach the United States team to a silver medal at the Winter Olympics in Vancouver 2010.

North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux was honored as the WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year in addition to earning the league's scoring title and All-WCHA First Team accolades. She maintains an outstanding grade-point average of 3.877 (4.0 scale), majoring in Physical Education, Exercise Science and Wellness, and has been on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll, the Dean's List and the President's Honor Roll at UND. She has been a WCHA Scholar-Athlete in both 2010-11 and 2011-12 as well as a member of the All-WCHA Academic Team. Lamoureux is actively involved with service activities on campus and in the Grand Forks community, including reading to elementary students and Special Olympic events.

Her twin sister Monique Lamoureux-Kolls (Grand Forks, N.D.), a defenseman who produced 53 points (17g, 36a) in 28 league games, leads the All-WCHA Second Team which includes McKeough, Wisconsin goaltender Alex Rigsby, a sophomore from Delafield, Wis., who was the league's goaltending champion with a 1.47 goals-against average and went 23-3-2 in league play, and Minnesota forwards Jen Schoullis (27 gp, 18-22=40), a senior from Erie, Pa., and Amanda Kessel (28 gp, 17-34=51), a sophomore from Madison, Wis. Kessel's brother, Phil, is a former Minnesota athlete who currently is a National Hockey League all-star with the Toronto Maple Leafs. Both Lamoureux-Kolls and Kessel also earned the distinction of being among the top 10 finalists for this season's Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award. Lamoureux-Kolls was the WCHA Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 25 as well as the Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 8, Rigsby earned three Defensive Player of the Week awards on Oct. 19, Oct. 25 and Feb. 1

while Kessel was the league's Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 12, Nov. 23 and Feb. 8.

North Dakota forward Michelle Karvinen of Rodovre, Denmark was named the WCHA Rookie of the Year. She scored 21 goals and added 31 assists and 52 points and was named to the All-WCHA Rookie Team as well as to the All-WCHA Third Team. Karvinen was also honored as the WCHA Rookie of the Week on four occasions during the regular season – Oct. 19, Oct. 25, Nov. 9 and Feb. 8.

The All-WCHA Third team also features Minnesota Duluth senior forward Haley Irwin (26 gp, 11-32=43) of Thunder Bay, Ont., Wisconsin senior forward Brooke Ammerman (28 gp, 20-32=52) of River Vale, N.J., Minnesota Duluth sophomore defenseman Jessica Wong (28 gp, 7-15=22) of Baddeck, Nova Scotia, Bemidji State senior defender Montana Vichorek (27 gp, 5-21=26) of Moose Lake, Minn., and Minnesota junior goaltender Noora Rätty (20-5-2, 1.57, .933). Irwin was a two-time WCHA Offensive Player of the Week (Dec. 7 and Feb. 22), Ammerman earned the honor once (Feb. 22), Vichorek was the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 22, and Rätty earned that distinction on both Nov. 9 and Jan. 11.

WCHA Announces Record Number of 110 Scholar-Athletes for 2011-12

Seventh Annual Class Includes 54 Repeat Honorees; MSU's Lee, UMD's Reiter are Four-Time Recipients

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, Michigan Technological University Athletic Director Suzanne Sanregret (Chair, men's league) and University of Minnesota Faculty Representative Perry Leo (Chair, women's league) announced on Feb. 15 that a record total of 110 men's and women's student-athletes make up the seventh annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients for 2011-12. The previous record for honorees in one season was 90 in 2010-11.

"It is with a great deal of pride that we announce our seventh annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athletes," said McLeod, Martin, Sanregret and Leo (Chair, women's league) in a joint statement.

"This announcement has become one of the real highlights for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association each season as it focuses attention on a truly exceptional group of student-athletes. These outstanding young men and women have gone above and beyond to achieve great success both on and off the ice and their accomplishments are a testimony to the amount of dedication and hard work they put in throughout the school year. Together, they represent their teams and their league in a most impressive way and we could not be more proud of each and every one of them. On behalf of the entire WCHA, We wish them all the success in the world."

The WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for each of the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

Over the first seven years of the award, there have now been 525 honorees representing all 12 men's-member and all eight women's-member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 90 in 2010-11.

Fifty-four (54) of this season's 110 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including two four-time recipients and 15 three-time winners.

Earning this distinguished honor for the fourth time are Minnesota Duluth's Kenny Reiter (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12) and Minnesota State's Austin Lee (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12), who also become only the fourth and fifth conference student-athletes to do so. The Beavers (17-17-3 overall) finished the 2011-12 season with its best ever win total of 17 ... The Beavers also achieved their first-ever ranking during the season and rose as high as No. 7 before dropping out of the polls ... BSU received votes or was ranked in every national poll from Oct. 1 until Feb. 27 when they were knocked out of the WCHA Playoffs ... Bemidji State was led by Zuzana Tomcikova, their netminder who was nominated for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award and who set every school record as a senior this season ... Tomcikova finished her career ranked 3rd all-time in saves in NCAA history ... BSU picked up five wins over ranked opponents during the course of the season ... The Beavers also played in front of the largest crowd in NCAA history against No. 1-ranked Wisconsin at the Kohl Center, the total attendance was 12,402 ... The Beavers graduate six seniors ... Tomcikova and Montana Vichorek were named to the All-WCHA teams this season as announced by the conference office at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 1 in Duluth ... Tomcikova was selected All-WCHA First Team while Vichorek earned All-WCHA Third Team accolades ... Tomcikova is the first player in program history to be named to the first team ... In addition, 14 Bemidji State players were selected to the All-WCHA Academic team.

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (31-5-2) meet No. 6-ranked North Dakota at 4:00 pm CT this Saturday (March 10) in the quarterfinals of the NCAA tournament ... Minnesota scored a 2-0 victory over Minnesota Duluth and earned an automatic bid to the 2012 NCAA Championship with their win at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF in Duluth last weekend ... Minnesota is the No. 2 seed in the tournament. ... "We are excited to host this season," said Gopher coach Brad Frost. "At this point in the season, you're in a one-and-done situation, so you have to play your best every single game. We look forward to playing North Dakota." ... The Gophers' meeting with North Dakota will be the sixth this season, with the Gophers having a slight edge at 3-2 in the previous five meetings ... The last meeting between the teams was last Friday in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF semifinals, when Minnesota earned a 6-0 shutout win when Sarah Davis had a hat trick and Emily West scored two goals ... In regular season games this season, Minnesota and North Dakota are even at 2-2, splitting the series in Grand Forks in December and the series in Minneapolis in February ... Minnesota is making its 10th appearance in the 12-year history of the NCAA Championship, and has qualified for the tournament for a fifth-straight season ... The Gophers have a 9-8-1 overall record in the NCAA Tournament, with a 4-1 record in NCAA quarterfinal games ... The NCAA first included quarterfinal games in 2005 after expanding the tournament field to eight teams ... Goaltender Noora Rätty, the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF most outstanding player after back to back shutouts, has three straight shutouts in the playoffs and has 26 career shutouts, a school record ... Sophomore Amanda Kessel is a finalist for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, which goes to the best player in women's college hockey ... Defensemen Anne Schleper and Megan Bozek were named to the All-WCHA First Team and Kessel and Jen Schoullis were named to the All-WCHA Second Team ... Rätty joined West, Davis and Schleper on the all-tournament team for the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

Minnesota Duluth

The No. 10-ranked Bulldogs (21-14-1 overall) played very well at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, beating No. 1-ranked Wisconsin 3-1 in the semifinal March 2, but fell 2-0 to No. 2-ranked Minnesota in the final of the WCHA playoff championships and failed to get an invitation to the NCAA tournament for the first time in eight years ... "From a coaching perspective, there is no question we should be in the top-eight," said head coach Shannon Miller when asked if she thought her team belonged in the tournament. "We were 9-2 in our last 11 games and we are playing our best hockey right now. The point is to get the best teams in the country right now. Three of our five losses since Christmas were against the number one team in the country. So I think if you are paying attention and also recognize that our strength of schedule is the strongest in the country, and the significant wins we have, then I can't image we won't be." ... After a scoreless first period, Minnesota's Emily West was granted the first penalty shot against UMD since Bemidji State got the nod back on Feb. 19, 2010 ... West tried to beat Jennifer Harss low to the left side, but Harss stretched for the pad save and stayed unbeaten on penalty shots over her UMD career (2-of-2) ... The Bulldogs handed Minnesota its second power-play of the period with two minutes remaining in the stanza, and just :16 seconds into their extra skater advantage, the Gophers cashed in ... West walked in from the circle and put a wrist shot on net through traffic that beat Harss at the 19:16 mark ... The Bulldogs threw everything they had at the Gophers in the third period, outshooting Minnesota 10-8, but never scored ... Harss had a tremendous weekend for UMD, making 63 saves on 68 shots ... Noora Rätty made 28 stops between the pipes for Minnesota ... The Bulldogs are 32-9 in the WCHA playoffs ... Senior forward Haley Irwin became the fifth-highest scorer in Bulldog program history with 205 points (79g, 126a) and was named to the All-WCHA Third Team ... Freshman winger Jenna McParland's 21 goals is the seventh most goals scored by a rookie in UMD history ... She and defenseman Brigette Lacquette were named to the All-WCHA Rookie Team.

Minnesota State

The Mavericks (7-28-1) season came to an end on Feb. 25 after they were swept in the opening round of the WCHA playoffs by Wisconsin in Verona, Wis. ... The Mavericks suffered a 7-0 loss on that Friday (Feb. 24) ... UW's Brooke Ammerman scored four goals in the game ... Sophomore goaltender Danielle Butters started both playoff games before being relieved between the pipes by senior Alli Altmann ... On that Saturday, MSU had multiple scoring chances but couldn't score on UW goalie Alex Rigsby after it fell behind 3-0 after the first period for the second straight night ... The Mavericks held Wisconsin to four goals on Feb. 25 and outshot them 20-17 in the final two periods ... Minnesota State went scoreless on its 48 total shots on the weekend ... Senior defenseman Jackie Otto became the all-time leaders in games played at MSU with 142 as she never missed a game in her four-year career ... Otto's senior defensive partner, Ariel Mackley, finished tied in second place in games played ... Junior's Lauren Smith (9-10=19) and Lauren Zrust (6-13=19) led the team in points this season with 19 each ... Smith sits at seventh on the all-time charts for assists at MSU with 37 ... MSU will graduate six seniors but return 18 players, including its top four scorers.

Jocelyne Lamoureux finished the regular season as the nation's scoring leader, Monique Lamoureux-Kolls led the nation in points from a defenseman and Michelle Karvinen led all rookies in scoring.

Ohio State

The Buckeyes (16-16-4) concluded its season with a pair of losses at Minnesota Duluth in the opening rounds of the WCHA Playoffs, Feb. 24-25 ... The fifth-seeded Buckeyes dropped a 4-3 decision Friday vs. the fourth-seeded Bulldogs and followed with a 3-2 overtime loss Saturday in AMSOIL Arena ... Ohio State finished fifth in the conference standings with 41 points and senior Natalie Spooner was named to the All-WCHA First Team as a forward ... The senior trio of Spooner, Laura McIntosh and Kelly Wild had two points on the weekend to lead the team ... Spooner notched a pair of power-play goals on Friday (Feb. 24), while McIntosh had a goal and assist the same day ... Wild nabbed an assist in both games ... Spooner's first goal at 1:51 was her 30th goal of the season, breaking Jeni Creary's 2004-05 record of 29 goals in a season ... The Scarborough, Ont., product tallied her 31st goal of the year late in the third at 17:23 ... Spooner ends her Ohio State career on top of four Buckeye records including the season goals record broken ... She finished her four years as Ohio State's only student-athlete to score 100 goals in her career and she had a program-best 16 career game-winning goals ... In WCHA play, she led all current and former Buckeyes with 75 goals scored ... Spooner finished the season with a team-best 50 points on 31 goals and 19 assists ... Her 50 points finished tied for third all-time in points scored in a season at Ohio State ... She had 12 power-play goals on the year, which is also third-best in the program ... With two points, McIntosh concluded her career as the program's all-time leading points scorer and leader in career assists, finishing with 170 career points with 123 career assists ... Against WCHA opponents, she led all current and former Buckeyes with 136 career points and 98 assists ... McIntosh totaled 60 power-play points (7g, 53a) in her

career to finish tied for third all-time in Ohio State history ... McIntosh had 39 points on the year for second best on the team. She tallied 12 goals and 27 assists ... Wild finished her career as one of the program's top defenders, tallying 63 points to come in seventh overall in points by a defenseman ... Junior goaltender Noora Rätty earned the shutout for the Gophers making 15 saves ... Freshman Julie Friend started for the Huskies and made 41 saves ... Senior goaltender Tayler VanDenakker gave up the final goal to Kessel ... Huskies were outshot 47-15 in the game ... SCSU finishes the season with a record of 4-24 in the 28-game WCHA schedule ... The game was the last for the three seniors, Brittany Toor, Jaclyn Daggit and VanDenakker. ... Friend was named the goaltender on the All-WCHA Rookie Team.

Badgers

University of Wisconsin

The No. 1-ranked Badgers (31-4-2) earned the No. 1 seed in the 2012 NCAA tournament and will host Mercyhurst in the quarterfinals Saturday, March 10, at 7:00 pm at the Kohl Center ... Mercyhurst has played Wisconsin a total of seven times, with the Badgers taking all seven games ... The closest game in the series was a 2-1 double-overtime win for the Badgers in the 2006 NCAA Quarterfinals which was held at Cap Ice in Middleton, Wis. ... Wisconsin and Mercyhurst have met in the NCAA tournament twice before, the last time being in the 2009 national championship game, as the Badgers went on to post a 5-0 victory against the Lakers ... Outside of post-season play, the last time the two teams played against each other was in St. Cloud at the Easton Holiday Showcase last season ... Hilary Knight and Brooke Ammerman combined for four goals in a 7-4 win over Mercyhurst ... After winning the College Hockey America regular-season championship, Mercyhurst enters the national tournament following a loss to Robert Morris in the CHA tournament championship game ... It is the eighth consecutive year that Mercyhurst has received a berth into the NCAA tournament ... Against common opponents this season, Mercyhurst went 5-1-0, splitting with Minnesota State and winning four against Lindenwood ... The Lakers went 4-3-0 against teams that made the selection for this year's NCAA tournament ... Mercyhurst ranks 11th nationally in most penalty minutes, averaging 11.6 minutes per game ... However, their 28.3% efficiency on the power-play is the best in the nation ... The Lakers are led by Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award top-10 finalist Bailey Bram, who has netted 27 goals and tallied 41 helpers on the season ... Her 68 points ranks sixth overall in the nation and second in points per game (2.19) ... Along with Bram, the Lakers also have three other 40-plus point scorers this season in Christine Bestland (24g, 34a), Kelley Steadman (32g, 20a) and Jess Jones 13g, 35a) ... Wisconsin dropped a 3-1 decision to Minnesota Duluth in the semifinals of the 2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF last Friday (March 2) ... Skating on their home ice, the Bulldogs took the lead in the first period off a broken play ... Wisconsin's Brianna Decker tied the game at 1-1 in the second period, but the Bulldogs took back the lead before the end of the period ... Wisconsin then went on a power-play in the final minute of play and opted for an empty net to have a six-on-four man-advantage ... However, UMD scored on the empty net to complete the upset ... The Badger power-play continued to struggle and only scored once on nine opportunities ... There were a total of 17 penalties called in the contest, seven assessed against Wisconsin ... Five Wisconsin women's hockey players earned All-WCHA honors, highlighted by Decker taking home the league's top honor as the 2012 WCHA Player of the Year ... Decker also earned All-WCHA First Team honors ... Junior defenseman Stefanie McKeough was named the Defensive Player of the Year and sophomore Alex Rigsby took home the league's Goaltending Champion award ... Both McKeough and Rigsby were also named All-WCHA Second Team ... Senior forward Knight joined Decker among the four forwards awarded All-WCHA First Team honors ... Ammerman was named All-WCHA Third Team and Head coach Mark Johnson rounded out the awards being named the WCHA Coach of the Year for the fifth time in his career ... This season the Badgers have out-scored their opponents 19-5 after coming off a loss ... Wisconsin beat Minnesota Duluth, 4-3, after losing to Minnesota on Oct. 16, beat North Dakota, 8-2, after losing to Minnesota on Jan. 7, and beat Minnesota State, 7-0, after losing to Ohio State on Feb. 18 ... Decker continues to lead the nation in goals with 36 and has the

second most points in the country (78) ... Her linemate Ammerman is third in the nation for points with 74 (32g, 42a) ... The group of Prévost, Decker, Ammerman and Knight have combined for a total of 121 goals and 141 assists so far this season ... The four account for over half (.597) of the team's point production and have scored more than two-thirds (.712) of the team's goals so far this season ... Compared to other team's top-four scorers, they are the highest scoring group in the nation with 262 points ... Rigsby leads the nation with a .952 save percentage, while her 973 saves is the second most in the nation ... Rigsby also has the third-best goals against average in the nation (1.36) ... Wisconsin has the fourth-best power-play and best penalty-kill units in the nation ... The Badgers have scored 40 goals on 169 chances for a 23.7% efficiency with the man-advantage ... With an 89.6% efficiency on the penalty-kill, the Badgers have successfully killed 120 of 134 penalties ... Knight has tied the program mark for most shorthanded goals in a season with three ... Her seven career shorthanded goals is also tied for the program's most ... With 1483 total shots on goal so far this season, the Badgers are averaging 39 shots on goal per game, the third most in the nation.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
