BUNCHED AT THE TOP; OHIO STATE TAKES WCHA LEAD; FOUR WCHA SERIES ON TAP FOR UPCOMING OCT. 19-21 WEEKEND

MADISON, Wis. – Parity seems to have come to the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association in the first weeks of the young season. Parity for everyone so far except defending national champion and top-ranked Minnesota, which has outscored opponents 40-1 in posting six straight wins, but only two in league play.

The No. 1 Gophers (6-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) run into the team ahead of them in the standings this weekend, Oct. 19-20, when league-leading and No. 6-ranked Ohio State (5-1-0, 3-1-0 WCHA) comes to Ridder Arena in the marquee match ups for a full round of league games. The Gophers-Buckeyes series is a Friday-Saturday pair, as is St. Cloud State (2-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) at No. 10-ranked North Dakota (2-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) and Minnesota Duluth (2-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) at Minnesota State (3-2-1, 1-2-1 WCHA). Bemidji State (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) goes on the road to help No. 9-ranked Wisconsin (3-2-1, 1-2-1-1 WCHA) open its home season in grand style in a Friday night-Sunday afternoon series. The Badgers' home opener in the newly constructed LaBahn Arena (2,723) is set for Friday. LaBahn Arena is the new home for both the Badger men's and women's hockey teams. The rink, which features a 200' x 90' ice surface, serves as the main practice facility for both squads and will be the primary home venue for the women's team.

Last weekend (Oct. 13-14), Minnesota Duluth held visiting Wisconsin without a goal in a series for the first time since 2001 and took a pair of shutout victories, 2-0 and 1-0, at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth. Freshman goaltender Kayla Black had 56 saves in the series, including 31 last Saturday and 25 on Sunday.

St. Cloud State also swept a pair of WCHA games, wrecking the home opener at Bemidji State. Freshman Katie Fitzgerald made 34 saves in the Huskies' 3-1 victory last Friday and sophomore goalie Julie Friend made 39 saves in Saturday's whitewash. It was St. Cloud's first series sweep since last January. The Huskies join Wisconsin as the only road teams to sweep at the Sanford Center since the Beavers moved into their new home two seasons ago.

Ohio State climbed to No. 6 in the latest USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll and moved into first place in the bunched up standings by splitting with North Dakota at home. Paige Semenza had three goals in the Buckeyes' 5-3 victory last Friday to give them five straight victories at the start of the season for the first time in program history. North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux had both goals and Jorid Dagfinrud had 12 saves in UND's 2-0 victory over OSU last Saturday.

The split gave OSU nine points while there is a four-way tie for second as Minnesota Duluth, North Dakota, Minnesota and St. Cloud State all have six points, one more than Wisconsin and two more than Minnesota State in the balanced WCHA standings.

In non-conference play last weekend, Minnesota took two games from St. Lawrence, 5-0 and 6-0, behind the shutout goaltending of Noora Rätty, who played five of the six periods at Canton, N.Y. Minnesota is one of six unbeaten teams in the country and, through six games, have the nation's leading goaltender (Rätty), the top-scoring power-play, the top-scoring defenseman (Meghan Bozek), and the top-scoring rookie (Hannah Brandt). On the penalty-kill, Minnesota is a perfect 100%, with four shorthanded goals to their credit already.

Minnesota State also scored a sweep last weekend and downed the Lady Lions of Lindenwood, 3-0 and 4-1, in their first non-conference series of the 2012-13 season. Junior goaltender Danielle Butters posted 20 saves last Friday to earn her first career shutout. The Mavericks completed the sweep last Saturday behind two goals from sophomore forward Casey Hirsch and four assists by junior Kathleen Rogan. Junior forward Melissa Klippenstein collected a goal and two assists while Butters stopped 30 of 31 shots to earn her third win of the season.

Looking ahead to next week's schedule, there will be two WCHA series on the docket as Ohio State hosts Bemidji State (Oct. 26-27) and Minnesota travels to North Dakota (Oct. 27-28). Outside the league, non-conference series find Minnesota Duluth heading east

to take on Boston College in non-conference play on Thursday and Friday, Minnesota State playing at Mercyhurst on Friday and Saturday, Wisconsin hosting New Hampshire on Friday and Sunday, and St. Cloud State taking on host Providence College on Saturday and Sunday.

In this week's (Oct. 15) USCHO.com Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is again a unanimous No. 1, Ohio State is ranked No. 6, Wisconsin is at No. 9 and North Dakota is No. 10. Also receiving votes from the WCHA this week was Minnesota Duluth.

2012 FOUR NATIONS CUP ROSTER FOR TEAM USA ANNOUNCED BY USA HOCKEY 13 SKATERS HAVE WCHA TIES

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Twelve Olympians highlight the 23-player U.S. Women's National Team roster that will compete in the 2012 Women's Four Nations Cup in Vantaa and Kerava, Finland from Nov. 5-10.

Also included are 13 skaters with WCHA ties. They are goaltenders Alex Rigsby (UW), Jessie Vetter (UW alum), defensemen Megan Bozek (UM), Lisa Chesson (OSU alum), Gigi Marvin (UM alum), Anne Schleper (UM alum), and forwards Brianna Decker (UW), Meghan Duggan (UW alum), Sarah Erickson (UM), Amanda Kessel (UM), Hilary Knight (UW alum), Jocelyne Lamoureux (UND), and Monique Lamoureux (UND).

"We've got a terrific team assembled to compete in the Four Nations Cup," said Katey Stone (Arlington, MA), head coach of Team USA. "I feel this tournament will provide an excellent gauge of where we are as a team as we continue to evaluate players and progress toward the 2014 Olympics."

Among the 12 Olympians are Julie Chu (Fairfield, CT), who has not only played in three Olympic Winter Games, but also in 10 previous Four Nations Cups. Others include defensemen Kacey Bellamy (Westfield, MA), Lisa Chesson (Plainfield, IL), and Gigi Marvin (Warroad, MN); forwards Meghan Duggan (Danvers, MA), Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID), Jocelyne Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Monique Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH), and Karen Thatcher (Blaine, WA); and goaltenders Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) and Jessie Vetter (Cottage Grove, WI).

"From the veteran Olympians to the newcomers, we are confident in this team's ability to give our program a great start to the 2012-2013 season," said Reagan Carey (Colorado Springs, CO), director of women's hockey for USA Hockey.

Prior to the start of the Four Nations Cup, the team will participate in a training camp at the New York Rangers' Madison Square Garden Training Facility in Tarrytown, N.Y., from Oct. 30 - Nov. 4.

The camp will include 12 players from the team headed to the Four Nations Cup and select skaters from the 2012 U.S. Women's Under-18 Select Team player pool. At the conclusion of the camp, the 11 NCAA players who complete the U.S. roster will meet the rest of the team in Finland.

CANADA'S NATIONAL WOMEN'S TEAM ROSTER ANNOUNCED FOR 2012 FOUR NATIONS CUP SEVEN PLAYERS HAVE WCHA TIES

CALGARY, Alta. – Hockey Canada announced Tuesday the 23 players that have been selected for Canada's National Women's Team for the 2012 4 Nations Cup, taking place November 6-10 in Kerava and Tikkurila, Finland.

Canada's roster for the 2012 4 Nations Cup includes three goaltenders, seven defencemen and 13 forwards, who were selected following Canada's National Women's Team September Camp/Fall Festival, which took place Sept. 22-29 in Calgary, Alta. Seven of those players have Western Collegiate Hockey Association ties in defensemen Tessa Bonhomme (OSU), Jocelyne Larocque (UMD), Meaghan Mikkelson (UW) and Bobbi Jo Slusar (UW) and forwards Haley Irwin (UMD), Caroline Ouellette (UMD), and Natalie Spooner (OSU).

The 2012 4 Nations Cup will bring together four top women's hockey countries in the world – Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States – for the 17th annual international tournament. Canada's National Women's Team has won the gold medal at the event a total of 12 times, and has claimed silver on four occasions.

(Agosta, Apps, Bendus, Birchard, Bonhomme, Bram, Hefford, Irwin, Jenner, Johnston, Labonté, Lacasse, Larocque, Mikkelson, Ouellette, Poulin, Spooner, Szabados, Wakefield, Ward and Wickenheiser) ... 13 members of Canada's gold medal-winning team from the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, BC (Agosta, Apps, Bonhomme, Hefford, Irwin, Johnston, Labonté, Mikkelson, Ouellette, Poulin, Szabados, Ward and Wickenheiser) ... 17 players who represented Canada at the 2012 4 Nations Cup in Nyköping, Sweden (Agosta, Apps, Bendus, Birchard, Hefford, Irwin, Jenner, Johnston, Labonté, Larocque, Ouellette, Poulin, Slusar, Spooner, Szabados, Wakefield and Wickenheiser).

"As always, there are no easy decisions when it comes to naming the roster for Team Canada, but we believe we've assembled a strong team for this year's 4 Nations Cup," said Dan Church, head coach of Canada's National Women's Team. "There is a good mix of veterans and young players. We look forward to seeing all of them represent Canada in November."

Church will be joined behind the bench at the 2012 4 Nations Cup by assistant coaches Danielle Goyette (St-Nazaire, Que./University of Calgary, CIS) and Lisa Haley (Westville, N.S./Ryerson University, CIS), who also served alongside him at Canada's National Women's Team September Camp/Fall Festival.

The 2012 4 Nations Cup will serve as an evaluation opportunity for Canada's National Women's Team coaching staff and Hockey Canada scouts, led by head scout of women's national team programs Melody Davidson, for the 2013 IIHF Women's World Championship in Ottawa, Ont., and 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. Players will continue to be evaluated with their club teams during the 2012-13 season.

The 2013 IIHF Ice Hockey Women's World Championship, taking place April 2-9 at SBP Arena and the Nepean Sportsplex, will mark the

sixth time Canada has hosted the tournament. Canada also hosted in 1990 in Ottawa, 1997 in Kitchener, Ont., 2000 in Mississauga, Ont., 2004 in Halifax, N.S., and 2007 in Winnipeg, Man.

COACHES TAB DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMP MINNESOTA AS WCHA FAVORITE FOR 2013 DEFENDING CONFERENCE CHAMP WISCONSIN AND NORTH DAKOTA CHOSEN SECOND IN ANNUAL PRESEASON WCHA HEAD COACHES' POLL; BADGERS' RETURNING PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD WINNER AND FORWARD BRIANNA DECKER PICKED AS PRESEASON WCHA PLAYER OF THE YEAR ... MINNESOTA FORWARD HANNAH BRANDT IS UNANIMOUS CHOICE FOR LEAGUE ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

When in doubt, go with the defending national champions. That is the message from the coaches who have seen their league win the last 13 Division 1 women's national championships. The University of Minnesota swept to the NCAA Women's Frozen Four crown in a memorable playoff run last season (2011-12) and, according to a preseason poll of the league's head coaches released Sept. 25, the Golden Gophers are the pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association title again in 2012-13.

The Gophers, who also won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship a year ago before beating WCHA regular season champion Wisconsin 4-2 to win the national title, return 15 players this season. Minnesota collected six first place votes and 48 points in the poll of the league's eight head coaches.

Wisconsin and North Dakota, another NCAA tournament qualifier last season, finished tied for second place in the poll with 40 votes, including one first place vote apiece. Minnesota Duluth, with 32 points, was selected to finish fourth, followed by Ohio State in fifth place, Bemidji State in sixth, Minnesota State in seventh and St. Cloud State in eighth.

Wisconsin senior forward Brianna Decker, the 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner as women's college hockey's outstanding player and reigning WCHA Player of the Year, was the coaches' pre-season choice for WCHA player of the year. She had four votes, while Minnesota forward Amanda Kessel and North Dakota forward Jocelyne Lamoureux, last season's league scoring champion, each received two votes. Minnesota freshman forward Hannah Brandt is the head coaches' unanimous choice as pre-season WCHA Rookie of the Year.

WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR TO BE HELD AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE LAUNCHES SEPT. 28-29 AS MINNESOTA STATE HOSTS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP WISCONSIN; MINNESOTA REIGNS AS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF AND NCAA FROZEN FOUR CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW HOME IN LABAHN ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

"The Association looks forward to putting another action-packed, highly-competitive product on the ice in 2012-13," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the guiding force of the women's league since its founding in 1999. "The commitment to fielding top-quality programs and the dedication to success that our member institutions continue to display has resulted in some of the most entertaining women's hockey in the world over the past 13 seasons and we know that will continue in the future.

"I have no doubt this coming season's league race will be one of the most intriguing yet. We anticipate our teams will improve across the board and be both competitive and successful against opponents across the country. Last season, we had four teams ranked among the nation's top 10, four of our teams win at least 21 games overall, six finish at .500 or above and six win at least 11 games in league play. We also look forward to a tremendous post-season next March when both our WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four are showcased at UM's Ridder Arena. The University of Minnesota and the facility itself have a distinguished tradition of hosting first-class events."

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring

in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

Last season's WCHA Defensive Player of the Year returns in the Badgers' Stefanie McKeough as does the WCHA Rookie of the Year in forward Michelle Karvinen of North Dakota and the league's goaltending champion in Alex Rigsby of Wisconsin.

League-member clubs went 7-0-2 (.889) vs ECAC Hockey, 14-2-1 (.853) vs. the Hockey East Association, 9-5-3 (.618) vs. College Hockey America, and 6-0-0 vs. Independents ... Four WCHA-member teams ranked among the nation's top 10 in the final two weekly national polls for 2011-12. In the USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, the WCHA had national champion and WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion Minnesota at No. 1, WCHA regular season champion Wisconsin at No. 2, North Dakota at No. 6 and Minnesota Duluth at No. 10. And in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll, UM was No. 1, UW was No. 2, UND was No. 6 and UMD was No. 10 ... The WCHA also had the top four teams in attendance for the women's college hockey. After returning from their longest trip of the season with a split at Providence, the Beavers (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA, 0 points) were swept by St. Cloud State in their WCHA openers last weekend, 3-1 and 1-0 ... BSU had won 10 straight games against the Huskies entering the weekend and was swept by SCSU for the first time since Nov. 21-22, 2008 ... St. Cloud State now leads the all-time series 28-26-7 ... Bemidji State was shutout four times last season, including a scoreless tie in its first game of the year against Providence and its last game of 2011-12, a 2-0 playoff loss to North Dakota ... Sophomore Whitney Wivoda potted the team's only goal of the weekend, her first of the season ... Wivoda now leads the team with three points in four games ... In goal, senior Jessica Havel allowed three goals on 29 shots in the first game against SCSU for her first career loss in her first career home start last Friday, while sophomore Abby Ryplanski dropped to 0-2-0 on the year despite playing well on Saturday, stopping 27 of 28 shots ... Two top-six forwards, senior Emily Erickson and sophomore Kristin Huber, went without a point last weekend after making their season debuts on Friday ... Erickson led Saturday's contest with six shots on goal ... Freshman defenseman Lauren Merkley made her collegiate debut and sophomore Rachael Kelly also saw her first game action of the season ... Bemidji State will take its third-longest road trip of the season this weekend to open up Wisconsin's new LaBahn Arena this Friday and Sunday before taking its second-longest trip of the year to play at Ohio State the following week ... The Beavers will leave the state of Minnesota just once after October, to play at North Dakota on Feb. 8-9 ... BSU is 3-47-2 all-time against the Badgers and last defeated Wisconsin on Feb. 7, 2010, 2-0 in Madison ... Bemidji State defeated every opponent on its 2011-12 schedule at least once, except for Wisconsin ... The Badgers beat BSU in all four meetings last year, 3-1 and 6-1 in Bemidji and 3-2 (ot) and 1-0 in Madison ... The 6-1 defeat to UW on Dec. 10 of last year marked the most goals the Beavers allowed on the season.

MINNESOTA

The top-rated Golden Gophers (6-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA, 6 points) are 6-0 for the fifth time in program history with the last time being the start of the 2009-10 season ... In those six wins, the Gophers have outscored their opponents 40-1, which is the largest goal differential for the first six games in Minnesota history ... Only one other time have the Maroon & Gold scored more goals to start a season, and that was in 1998-99 (41) ... Last weekend, Minnesota went on the road and defeated St. Lawrence, 5-0 and 6-0 ... Senior forward Paige Semenza recorded her first career hat trick in the win ... Semenza leads Ohio State with 11 points and seven goals scored, and is +7 while on the ice through six games ... Freshman forward Julia McKinnon netted her second goal of her collegiate career early in the opening period ... Senior forward Tina Hollowell found the back of the net for the eventual game-winner late in the second period, her third goal of the season ... The Buckeyes fell for the first time in 2012-13 last Saturday, 2-0 ...
