FOUR WCHA SERIES FOR NOV. 16-18 FIND MINNESOTA STATE AT MINNESOTA, NORTH DAKOTA AT BEMIDJI STATE, MINNESOTA DULUTH AT ST. CLOUD STATE, WISCONSIN AT OHIO STATE UNBEATEN GOPHERS CONTINUE TO LEAD WCHA RACE ... TEAM STANDS 12-0 OVERALL, 8-0 IN CONFERENCE PLAY; BUCKEYES, BADGERS COLLIDE IN FIRST-EVER WOMEN'S GAMES AT VALUE CITY ARENA IN COLUMBUS; ST. CLOUD STATE SWEEPS LINDENWOOD NOV. 9-10 WHILE BSU LOSES AND TIES VS MAINE; LATEST NATIONAL POLLS HAVE MINNESOTA NO. 1, OHIO STATE NO. 8/9, NORTH DAKOTA NO. 10 ... WISCONSIN, MINNESOTA DULUTH ALSO RECEIVE VOTES; WCHA TEAMS STAND 17-7-2 IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

MADISON, Wis. – Much of the conference took a week off and kept an eye on the Four Nations Cup in Finland last week, but the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association season cranks up robustly again this weekend, Nov. 16-18, with four league series featuring all eight league-member teams.

Unbeaten and top-ranked Minnesota (12-0-0, 8-0-0 WCHA), the defending national champions, returns to action at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis when they welcome Minnesota State (4-6-2, 2-4-2-1 WCHA) for a two-game series while Wisconsin (7-3-2, 3-3-2-2 WCHA), the defending WCHA regular season champions, travels to No. 8/9-ranked Ohio State (9-3-0, 7-3-0 WCHA) for the first women's games ever played at Value City Arena in Columbus. Face-offs for the Gophers vs Mavericks series are at 6:07 pm CT Friday and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday while puck drops for the Buckeyes vs Badgers set are at 2:07 pm ET both afternoons.

At the National Hockey & Event Center, St. Cloud State (4-7-1, 2-6-0 WCHA) will entertain Minnesota Duluth (3-6-1, 2-5-1 WCHA) on Friday at 7:07 pm CT and Saturday at 2:07 pm CT while up at Sanford

Center, Bemidji State (2-6-2, 1-4-1 WCHA) plays host to No. 10-ranked North Dakota (5-5-0, 4-4-0 WCHA) in a Saturday-Sunday series. Puck drops in Bemidji are at 2:07 pm CT both days.

The Golden Gophers, at 12-0-0 overall, are off to the best start in program history and are in first place. Dating back to last season, the Maroon & Gold are on a 20-game winning streak, which equals the second longest in program history (between Feb. 21, 2003 and Nov. 19, 2004). The previous two times that Minnesota arrived at the Four Nations Cup week with perfect records were in 2003 and 2004. The Gophers went on to claim NCAA titles in each of those seasons.

Ohio State is in second place in the conference race with 21 points, three points behind the Gophers, but OSU has played two more league games. Wisconsin, which has logged three straight shutouts and hasn't allowed a goal in a span of 189:29 minutes, stands in third place with 13 points, eight behind OSU and 11 behind the high-flying Gophers. With 12 points, North Dakota is in fourth place in the WCHA standings, three points ahead of fifth place Minnesota State (9 points). Minnesota Duluth is in sixth place with seven points, one ahead of St. Cloud State (6 points), while Bemidji State is currently eighth place with four points.

The only games played by league-member teams this past weekend of Nov. 9-10 were two non-conference sets involving St. Cloud State and Bemidji State. The Huskies swept Lindenwood in a two-game series at the National Hockey Center, taking a 2-0 victory last Friday and then beating the Lions, 7-2 Saturday. Julia Gilbert and Haylea Schmid scored in the series opener for SCSU to support goaltender Julie Friend, who recorded 21 saves to earn her second shutout of the season. The Huskies then rolled over the Lions in game two behind two goals apiece by Gilbert and Schmidt.

Bemidji State finished up non-conference play by losing to and tying visiting Maine last weekend. The Beavers lost the first game by a single goal at 4-3, despite owning a 3-0 advantage heading into the third period and posting 60 shots on goal. Kaitlyn Tougas and Kristin Huber each had two-point nights and freshman Hanna Moher scored her first career goal. The Beavers and Black Bears then skated to a 2-2 overtime tie last Saturday. Lauren Merkley put Bemidji State ahead in the second period with her first collegiate goal and MacKenzie Thurston had the game-tying goal. The Beavers did not have any penalties in the game, the team's first penalty-free game since Nov. 4, 2011.

Through a total of 26 non-conference games played this season through Nov. 12, WCHA-member teams stand 17-7-2 (.692) against other Div. 1 opponents. The WCHA is 8-2 vs College Hockey America-member teams, 5-1 vs ECAC Hockey teams and 4-4-2 vs Hockey East Association clubs.

While two teams played outside the conference, the WCHA had seven players on the United States' team roster which won the Four Nations Cup in Finland. Minnesota's Amanda Kessel, Megan Bozek and Milica McMillan, Wisconsin's Alex Rigsby and Brianna Decker, and North Dakota's Monique and Jocelyne Lamoureux all were key contributors the the U.S. success at the Four Nations Cup last week.

U.S. CLINCHES FOUR NATIONS CUP TITLE AS JESSIE VETTER BLANKS CANADA

VANTAA, Finland – The U.S. Women's National team captured the 2012 Four Nations Cup title by defeating Canada, 3-0, on Saturday evening, Nov. 10 at Tikkurila Valtti Arena.

"I'm very happy as to how our team came together this week," said Katey Stone (Arlington, MA), head coach of Team USA. "We played tough, we played smart, we made some adjustments, we had great goaltending, and we played strong (defensively). I'm happy and proud of how (we) played."

Kendall Coyne (Palos Heights, IL) scored the game-winning shorthanded goal for the U.S. after picking up a loose puck in the neutral zone and burying her chance at 12:46 of the first period.

Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID) and Anne Schleper (St. Cloud, MN) contributed insurance goals for Team USA in the second and third periods, respectively. Both goals were point shots on power-play opportunities.

U.S. goaltender Jessie Vetter (Cottage Grove, WI) turned away 26 shots and the Team USA penalty-kill denied all seven power-play chances for Canada to preserve the shutout.

NOTES: Kendall Coyne was chosen as Team USA's Player of the Game ... The U.S. has now won five Four Nations Cup titles (1997, 2003, 2008, 2011, 2012) ... Team USA will next come together for a training camp in late December at the National Sports Center in Blaine, Minn.

WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 GAMES PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA REIGNS AS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF AND NCAA FROZEN FOUR CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW HOME IN LA BAHN ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

"The Association looks forward to putting another action-packed, highly-competitive product on the ice in 2012-13," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the guiding force of the women's leagues since it's founding in 1999. "The commitment to fielding top-quality programs and the dedication to success that our member institutions continue to

display has resulted in some of the most entertaining women's hockey in the world over the past 13 seasons and we know that will continue in the future.

"I have no doubt this coming season's league race will be one of the most intriguing yet. We anticipate our teams will improve across the board and be both competitive and successful against opponents across the country. Last season, we had four teams ranked among the nation's top 10, four of our teams win at least 21 games overall, six finish at .500 or above and six win at least 11 games in league play. We also look forward to a tremendous post-season next March when both our WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four are showcased at UM's Ridder Arena. The University of Minnesota and the facility itself have a distinguished tradition of hosting first-class events."

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA-member teams will also engage in a number of non-conference

pairings this season. By team, those are:

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will also welcome back a plethora of outstanding student-athletes for the 2012-13 campaign, including the likes of reigning Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner, WCHA Player of the Year and All-American First Team forward Brianna Decker of Wisconsin. Also back are two All-American First Team honorees in defenseman Megan Bozek of Minnesota and forward Jocelyne Lamoureux of North Dakota, who was also the WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year and league scoring champion, and two All-American Second Team selections in defenseman Monique Lamoureux of North Dakota and forward Amanda Kessel of Minnesota. Last season's WCHA Defensive Player of the Year returns in the Badgers' Stefanie McKeough as does the WCHA Rookie of the Year in forward Michelle Karvinen of North Dakota and the league's goaltending champion in Alex Rigsby of Wisconsin.

Returning All-WCHA honorees include first teamers in Decker (F) of Wisconsin, Jocelyne Lamoureux (F) of North Dakota and Bozek (D) of Minnesota, second teamers in Kessel (F) of Minnesota, Monique Lamoureux (D) of North Dakota, McKeough (D) of Wisconsin and Rigsby (G) of Wisconsin, and third teamers in Karvinen (F) of North Dakota, Jessica Wong (D) of Minnesota Duluth and Noora Rätty (G) of Minnesota.

Members of the All-WCHA Rookie Team a season ago were Karvinen (F) of North Dakota, Jenna McParland (F) of Minnesota Duluth, Josefine Jakobsen (F) of North Dakota; Rachel Ramsey (D) of Minnesota, Brigette Lacquette (D) of Minnesota Duluth, and Julie Friend (G) of St. Cloud State University.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, precede to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
