THREE LEAGUE SERIES HIGHLIGHT UPCOMING THANKSGIVING WEEKEND OF NOVEMBER 23-25 AS MSU HOSTS BSU, UMD HEADS TO UND, SCSU VISITS UW

MADISON, Wis. – After winning the national championship last season, Minnesota is staging quite an encore. The Golden Gophers are unbeaten and ranked No. 1 in the country among women's college hockey teams and they continue to hold a healthy lead in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association standings. They also are making history.

Minnesota (14-0-0, 10-0-0 WCHA, 30 points) beat Minnesota State twice, 3-0 and 9-1, last weekend at Ridder Arena and broke the NCAA women's Div. 1 record for most consecutive victories with 22, which began on Feb. 18, 2012 with a 5-2 win over North Dakota at home. The record was previously held by Harvard, who set the standard during the 2008 season. Amanda Kessel posted a team-high six points (2g, 4a) and Megan Bozek had five points (2g, 3a) in the sweep over the visiting Mavericks – one of three during WCHA play last weekend, Nov. 16-18.

No. 8-ranked Ohio State (10-4-0, 8-4-0 WCHA, 24 points) split a weekend series with defending WCHA champion Wisconsin at Value City Arena in Columbus to stay in second place, six points behind the

Gophers, but OSU has played two more league games than Minnesota.

No. 10-ranked North Dakota (7-5-0, 6-4-0 WCHA, 18 points) is in third in the WCHA standings, two points ahead Wisconsin (8-4-2, 4-4-2-2 WCHA, 16 points), after taking two wins at Bemidji State last Saturday and Sunday.

Minnesota Duluth (5-6-1, 4-5-1 WCHA, 13 points), meanwhile, earned back-to-back league road victories at St. Cloud State and moved into fifth place, four points better than Minnesota State (4-8-2, 2-6-2-1 WCHA, 9 points). St. Cloud State (4-7-1, 2-8-0 WCHA, 6 points) is in seventh place this week and Bemidji State (2-8-2, 1-6-1 WCHA, 4 points) is in eighth place.

There are three league series scheduled for Friday and Saturday, Nov. 23-24, and a pair of teams in non-conference action during the Thanksgiving holiday weekend. St. Cloud State travels to Wisconsin for a pair of 2:07 pm CT face-offs at LaBahn Arena, Bemidji State travels to Minnesota State for a 7:07 pm CT puck drop Friday evening and a 3:07 pm CT start Saturday afternoon, and Minnesota Duluth visits North Dakota for two 7:07 pm CT face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena.

Outside the WCHA this weekend, Ohio State is at ECAC Hockey-member Princeton (3-5-2) on Friday at 7:00 pm ET and Saturday at 4:00 pm ET and Minnesota visits New Hampshire (5-7-1) of the Hockey East Association for a Saturday (2:00 pm ET) and Sunday (2:00 pm ET) set.

Through 26 non-conference games played this season through Nov. 20, WCHA-member teams stand 17-7-2 (.692) against other Div. 1 opponents. The WCHA is 8-2 vs College Hockey America-member teams, 5-1 vs ECAC Hockey teams and 4-4-2 vs Hockey East Association clubs.

In Columbus last weekend, special teams were the key on Friday (Nov. 16) in the first women's game ever played at Value City Arena, a 4-2 Wisconsin victory over host Ohio State. The Badgers scored two shorthanded goals and added a penalty-shot goal by Karley Sylvester that was drawn via another breakaway while shorthanded. The Buckeyes then earned the split Saturday behind two goals by Taylor Kuehl, the OSU leader with 11 goals, in a 3-1 triumph.

It seemed like old times for North Dakota in winning 3-1 and 7-3 at Bemidji State, UND's first road sweep of the year. Monique Lamoureux ended a career long eight-game scoreless streak with a four-point weekend (3g, 1a). Her twin sister Jocelyne Lamoureux had a seven-point weekend, including three goals and two assists in the series finale, and Michelle Karvinen, last year's WCHA Rookie of the Year, made her season debut with six points in the series. The seven goals scored by the team on Sunday is three more than the previous one-game high for the year.

Minnesota Duluth scored four goals in a game for the first time this

season and they did so in each game, winning 4-1 and 4-1, over St. Cloud State at the National Hockey and Event Center. Four different players scored in the series opener, including Hannah Bramm, who became the first Bulldog rookie to record a goal this season. Jenna McParland also had a goal in each game for the visiting Bulldogs, including the game-winner last Saturday.

Upcoming in the WCHA over the weekend of Friday, Nov. 30 to Sunday, Dec. 2, there will be three conference two-game series contested as Ohio State travels to Minnesota State, Minnesota hosts Wisconsin (Saturday/Sunday) and Bemidji State entertains Minnesota Duluth (Saturday/Sunday). In non-conference play, St. Cloud State plays at College Hockey America-member Lindenwood and North Dakota hosts College Hockey America-member RIT.

In this week's (Nov. 19) USCHO.com Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll, unbeaten Minnesota remains a unanimous No. 1, Ohio State is at No. 8 and North Dakota is at No. 10. Also receiving votes this week was Wisconsin.

The pages can be viewed on a regular web browser, but are optimized for mobile browsers.

WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 GAMES PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA REIGNS AS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF AND NCAA FROZEN FOUR CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW HOME IN LA BAHN ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

"The Association looks forward to putting another action-packed, highly-competitive product on the ice in 2012-13," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the guiding force of the women's league since its founding in 1999. "The commitment to fielding top-quality programs and the dedication to success that our member institutions continue to display has resulted in some of the most entertaining women's hockey in the world over the past 13 seasons and we know that will continue in the future.

"I have no doubt this coming season's league race will be one of the most intriguing yet. We anticipate our teams will improve across the board and be both competitive and successful against opponents across the country. Last season, we had four teams ranked among the nation's top

10, four of our teams win at least 21 games overall, six finish at .500 or above and six win at least 11 games in league play. We also look forward to a tremendous post-season next March when both our WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four are showcased at UM's Ridder Arena. The University of Minnesota and the facility itself have a distinguished tradition of hosting first-class events."

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA-member teams will also engage in a number of non-conference pairings this season. By team, those are:

North Dakota: Nov. 2-3 vs Clarkson University; Nov. 30-Dec. 1 vs RIT (Rochester Institute of Technology); Jan. 4-5 @ Lindenwood University.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will also welcome back a plethora of outstanding student-athletes for the 2012-13 campaign, including the likes of reigning Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner, WCHA Player of the Year and All-American First Team forward Brianna Decker of Wisconsin. Also back are two All-American First Team honorees in defenseman Megan Bozek of Minnesota and forward Jocelyne Lamoureux of North Dakota, who was also the WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year and league scoring champion, and two All-American Second Team selections in defenseman Monique Lamoureux of North Dakota and forward Amanda Kessel of Minnesota. Last season's WCHA Defensive Player of the Year returns in the Badgers' Stefanie McKeough as does the WCHA Rookie of the Year in forward Michelle Karvinen of North Dakota and the league's goaltending champion in Alex Rigsby of Wisconsin.

Returning All-WCHA honorees include first teamers in Decker (F) of Wisconsin, Jocelyne Lamoureux (F) of North Dakota and Bozek (D) of Minnesota, second teamers in Kessel (F) of Minnesota, Monique Lamoureux (D) of North Dakota, McKeough (D) of Wisconsin and Rigsby (G) of Wisconsin, and third teamers in Karvinen (F) of North Dakota, Jessica Wong (D) of Minnesota Duluth and Noora Rätty (G) of Minnesota.

In the USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, the WCHA had national champion and WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion Minnesota at No. 1, WCHA regular season champion Wisconsin at No. 2, North Dakota at No. 6 and Minnesota Duluth at No. 10. And in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll, UM was No. 1, UW was No. 2, UND was No. 6 and UMD was No. 10 ... The WCHA also had the top four teams in attendance for the women's college hockey. Buoyed by the biggest crowd to ever watch a collegiate game – the 12,402 who saw Wisconsin win over Bemidji State at the Kohl Center Jan. 28, 2012 – the Badgers attracted 56,471 to home games (2,689 per game). North Dakota was second in home attendance nationally (drawing 28,218 for an average of 1,455 per game), followed by Minnesota (27,658/1,307 per game) and Minnesota Duluth (22,435/1,181 per game).

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, precede to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

BEMIDJI STATE

The Beavers (2-8-2, 1-6-1 WCHA, 4 points) resumed conference play and suffered a pair of losses to North Dakota on Nov. 17-18 ... BSU lost 3-1 last Saturday and 7-3 Sunday, falling to UND for the fifth and sixth consecutive times ... Last Saturday's game marked the fourth time in a row that North Dakota beat the Beavers by a two-goal margin dating back to last year ... Three of those games finished with 3-1 scores ... Senior forward Emily Erickson scored Bemidji State's only goal, her first of the season ... Ivana Bilic's slashing penalty at 11:34 of the second period snapped a BSU streak of 110:49 without a penalty ... The Beavers won 40 of 58 (69.0%) of their face-offs in the game, including the first 10 ... Last Sunday's game was the second of three games on that day of the week for Bemidji State in 2012-13 ... The seven goals scored by North Dakota against BSU marked the most goals by either team in 47 all-time meetings against each other ... Emily Erickson, MacKenzie Thurston, and Sadie Lundquist led the Beavers with a goal and an assist each ... Thurston now leads Bemidji State with 10 points ... Erickson became the second player at BSU this season to score a goal in back-to-back games and Thurston extended her BSU-best point streak to four games ... The Beavers' six goals against in the second period was a season-worst ... Freshman goaltender Alexane Rodrigue stopped nine of 10 shots in her collegiate debut after replacing Jessica Havel in goal ... All 27 non-redshirt players on the BSU roster have now seen game action ... Senior captain and blocked shots leader Erika Wheelhouse missed a game for the first time in her collegiate career after playing in 111 straight ... She assisted freshman Hannah Brandt on the game-winning goal for last Friday's 3-0 win over the Mavericks ... She came back with a five-point game last Saturday, scoring two goals ... The first one came late in the second period and the second coming late in the third ... Kessel added three assists as well with two going to senior Megan Bozek and one to Maryanne Menefee ... Bozek had five points (2g, 3a) while also leading a defensive group that allowed only one goal, which came when Minnesota was two players down ... She assisted on each of Brandt's goals in the Gophers 3-0 win over MSU ... In game two of the series, the Buffalo Grove, Ill. native added two goals of her own, with one coming on a power-play ... She also assisted Brandt on the game-winning goal ... Brandt assisted Minnesota in sweeping Minnesota State by tallying five points (3g,

The Schmitt sisters combined for six assists in the two games against the Badgers, with Kari Schmitt tallying four ... Redshirt junior goaltender Chelsea Knapp stopped 64 of 68 shots faced against Wisconsin, good for a .941 saves percentage ... Knapp has started all 14 games for Ohio State this season ... Kuehl has scored at least one goal in every series for the Buckeyes this season ... Kuehl has a team-leading 11 goals this season and is tied for second on the team for points (15) with senior Hokey Langan ... Langan has a team-leading 13 assists ...
