UNBEATEN, NO. 1-RANKED MINNESOTA HOSTS WISCONSIN, OHIO STATE HEADS TO MINNESOTA STATE, BEMIDJI STATE HOSTS MINNESOTA DULUTH IN THREE WCHA WEEKEND SERIES BORDER BATTLE BETWEEN GOPHERS, BADGERS MATCHES TWO STORIES PROGRAMS; UPCOMING NOV. 30-DEC. 2 WEEKEND NON-CONFERENCE MATCH UPS HAVE ST. MADISON, Wis. – One of the best rivalries in women's college hockey resumes this coming Saturday (Dec. 1) and Sunday (Dec. 2) in Minneapolis. It is more than just a resumption of the Border Battle between Minnesota and Wisconsin.

It is also a matchup of the No. 10-ranked Badgers (10-4-2, 6-4-2-2 WCHA), the defending Western Collegiate Hockey Association champions, and the No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (16-0-0, 10-0-0 WCHA), the defending national champions who are unbeaten this year, leading the WCHA and making history every weekend. Saturday's 2:07 pm CT game at Ridder Arena will be the first encounter Wisconsin has had against Minnesota since the Badgers lost to the Gophers in the 2012 NCAA Women's Frozen Four final. Since 2005, Wisconsin has played Minnesota in two national championship games (2006, 2012) and five WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championships (2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2011). The last time Wisconsin won in Ridder Arena was on March 5, 2011 during the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game. The

two rivals will conclude their weekend series on Sunday at 2:07 pm CT.

Minnesota returns 12 players that skated in last year's title game in Duluth against Wisconsin, while the Badgers return 14 players. Minnesota leads the Badgers, 31-26-8, in the all-time series.

The Golden Gophers played outside the conference over the Thanksgiving weekend and ran their NCAA record for most consecutive victories to 24 by winning 10-2 and 4-0 at Hockey East Association-member New Hampshire on Nov. 24-25. Another weekend meant another record for Minnesota, which has tied the NCAA record for most consecutive road wins at 15. Their last road loss was Jan. 13, 2012 against Minnesota Duluth. The Gophers have outscored opponents 98-10 this season.

The Gophers-Badgers series is one of three WCHA pairings this weekend. No. 10-ranked Ohio State (11-5-0, 8-4-0 WCHA) is at Minnesota State (5-9-2, 3-7-2-1 WCHA) and All Seasons Arena Friday at 7:07 pm CT and Saturday at 3:07 pm CT while Bemidji State (3-9-2, 2-7-1 WCHA) hosts Minnesota Duluth (5-8-1, 4-7-1 WCHA) at Sanford Center on Saturday at 7:07 pm CT and again Sunday at 2:07 pm CT.

Two WCHA teams also play non-conference series this Friday and Saturday with No. 8-ranked North Dakota (9-5-0) hosting RIT (6-5-2) of College Hockey America in a pair of 7:07 pm CT engagements at Ralph Engelstad Arena while St. Cloud State (4-11-1) is at College Hockey America's Lindenwood (1-11-0) at 7:00 pm CT on Nov. 30 and 2:00 pm CT on Dec. 1.

In league action last weekend, North Dakota ran its winning streak to five games and moved into a second place tie in the WCHA race with 24 points by sweeping Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 23-24. Ohio State split a non-conference series at Princeton of ECAC Hockey and stays in a share of second place, six points behind the Gophers. OSU and North Dakota are two points ahead of fourth place Wisconsin (22 points). Minnesota Duluth is in fifth place this week with 13 points, one point better than Minnesota State (12 points), who split a pair of home games last weekend with Bemidji State. The BSU win last Friday lifted the Beavers into seventh place with seven points, one point ahead of St. Cloud State (6 points).

The UMD Bulldogs were swept by North Dakota last weekend in Grand Forks for the first time in program history. It was a wild series, particularly last Friday when a tight game turned into a 4-3 North Dakota overtime win. UND's Josefine Jakobsen scored her first goal of the season in the final two minutes to break a 1-1 deadlock, and then hit an empty net a minute later to give North Dakota a 3-1 lead with just :47 seconds to go. But Minnesota Duluth's Jamie Kenyon put in a rebound with :13.4 seconds left and Katie Wilson scored with only one second left to send the game to overtime. The Bulldogs'

rally was snuffed out, however, when Monique Lamoureux got the overtime game-winner and North Dakota took a 4-3 win. Lamoureux then had a hat trick on Saturday as UND completed the sweep with a 5-2 victory.

Wisconsin stayed within shouting distance of second place by sweeping St. Cloud State 6-0 and 4-3 in Madison. Last season's Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Brianna Decker had seven points in the two games, including two goals in each contest. She also became the 15 player in the NCAA and only the third Badger to ever record 100 career goals with a score in last Friday's shutout. The loss moved St. Cloud State into last place since Bemidji State traveled to Mankato and won 4-3 over host Minnesota State last Friday on a Sadie Lundquist power-play goal in the third period. The senior forward also had assists on each of the other BSU goals. The Mavericks came back with a 4-1 victory last Saturday, though, as senior Lauren Smith had a four-point game, including a hat trick. The Mavs' third league victory equaled their win total of all of last season.

In non-conference play out East, Minnesota spanked New Hampshire by 10-2 and 4-0 scores on Nov. 24-25, making it 15 straight wins on the road and equaling the record set by Mercyhurst in 2002-03. Amanda Kessel, the nation's leading scorer with 45 points, had seven points in the series and freshman Hannah Brandt had three goals last Saturday. Brandt, who was held scoreless for the first time all season on Sunday against UNH, has 44 points. Ohio State, meanwhile, split at Princeton – rallying with four third period goals to take a 4-2 win last Friday behind Danielle Gagne and Ally Tarr, but falling 2-1 last Saturday.

Through 30 non-conference games played this season through Nov. 27, WCHA-member teams stand 20-8-2 (.700) against other Div. 1 opponents. The WCHA is 8-2 vs College Hockey America-member teams, 6-2 vs ECAC Hockey-member teams and 6-4-2 vs Hockey East Association clubs.

Looking to the schedule ahead, there are three WCHA series on the docket for the weekend of Friday, Dec. 7 through Sunday, Dec. 9

as St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota State (Friday/Saturday), Bemidji State entertains Minnesota (Friday/Saturday), and North Dakota visits Wisconsin (Saturday/Sunday). In non-conference action, Minnesota Duluth hosts Boston University of the Hockey East Association (Saturday/Sunday) and Ohio State hosts RIT of College Hockey America (Saturday/Sunday).

The women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association will then take a collective 22-day break over the December holidays before on-ice play resumes on Tuesday and Wednesday, Jan. 1-2, when Minnesota State travels to Lindenwood for a pair of non-conference tilts to launch the new year. On the first weekend of January, Friday the 4th and Saturday the 5th, St. Cloud State will host Bemidji State in conference play while a non-league match up has North Dakota playing at Lindenwood. In exhibition action, Ohio State will entertain Durham West on Jan. 5. Minnesota will resume play on Jan. 11-12 at home against North Dakota, Wisconsin will next Ohio State on Jan. 11-12, and Minnesota Duluth will next host St. Cloud State on Jan. 12-13.

WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 GAMES PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA REIGNS AS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF AND NCAA FROZEN FOUR CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW HOME IN LA BAHN ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of

the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA-member teams will also engage in a number of non-conference pairings this season. By team, those are:

Bemidji State: Oct. 5-6 @ Providence College; Nov. 9-10 vs University of Maine.

Minnesota: Sept. 28-29 vs Colgate University; Oct. 12-13 @ St. Lawrence University; Nov. 24-25 @ University of New Hampshire.

Minnesota Duluth: Oct. 26-27 @ Boston College; Dec. 8-9 vs Boston University.

Minnesota State: Oct. 12-13 vs Lindenwood University; Oct. 26-27 @ Mercyhurst College; Jan. 1-2 @ Lindenwood University.

North Dakota: Nov. 2-3 vs Clarkson University; Nov. 30-Dec. 1 vs RIT (Rochester Institute of Technology); Jan. 4-5 @ Lindenwood University.

Ohio State: Sept. 28-29 vs Lindenwood University; Nov. 23-24 @ Princeton University; Dec. 8-9 vs RIT (Rochester Institute of Technology).

Of note, the Buckeyes will also host league-rival Wisconsin on Nov. 16-17 at Schottenstein Center in Columbus.

St. Cloud State: Oct. 27-28 @ Providence College; Nov. 9-10 vs Lindenwood University; Nov. 30-Dec. 1 @ Lindenwood University.

Wisconsin: Oct. 5-6 @ Lindenwood University; Oct. 26 & 28 vs University of New Hampshire.

The WCHA also welcomes back a plethora of outstanding student-athletes for the 2012-13 campaign, including the likes of reigning Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner, WCHA Player of the Year and All-American First Team forward Brianna Decker of Wisconsin. Also back are two All-American First Team honorees in defenseman Megan Bozek of Minnesota and forward Jocelyne Lamoureux of North Dakota, who was also the WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year and league scoring champion, and two All-American Second Team selections in defenseman Monique Lamoureux of North Dakota and forward Amanda Kessel of Minnesota. Last season's WCHA Defensive Player of the Year returns in the Badgers' Stefanie McKeough as does the WCHA Rookie of the Year in forward Michelle Karvinen of North Dakota and the league's goaltending champion in Alex Rigsby of Wisconsin.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
