BEMIDJI STATE HOSTS MAINE, ST. CLOUD STATE ENTERTAINS LINDENWOOD IN ONLY ON-ICE ACTION FOR NOVEMBER 9-10 WCHA PLAY BREAKS FOR FOUR NATIONS CUP WEEK; UNBEATEN, LEAGUE-LEADING MINNESOTA OFF TO PERFECT 8-0 RECORD; GOPHERS, OHIO STATE, WISCONSIN POST NOV. 2-3 WEEKEND CONFERENCE SWEEPS; NORTH DAKOTA SPLITS WITH CLARKSON; LATEST NATIONAL POLL HAS MINNESOTA AGAIN AT NO. 1, OHIO STATE AT NO. 9, NORTH DAKOTA AT NO. 10 ... WISCONSIN ALSO RECEIVES VOTES; WCHA TEAMS STAND 15-6-1 (.705) IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

MADISON, Wis. – As six teams take this week off for the Four Nations Cup in Finland, one thing clearly has been determined in the first quarter of the 2012-13 women's campaign: defending national champion Minnesota is the team to beat in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association.

The only two teams in action this coming weekend are Bemidji State and St. Cloud State, who will both host non-conference series. The Beavers (2-5-1) will take on Hockey East Association-member Maine (1-7-0) at Sanford Center on Friday and Saturday in a pair of 7:07 pm CT face-offs while the Huskies (2-7-1) will entertain College Hockey America-member Lindenwood (0-8-0) in two 2:07 pm CT matinees.

The No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (12-0-0, 8-0-0 WCHA, 24 points) are off to their best start in school history after a pair of Nov. 2-3 weekend victories at Minnesota Duluth, 4-1 and 4-0. Dating back to last season, the Maroon & Gold are on a 20-game winning streak, which equals the second longest in program history (between Feb. 21, 2003 and Nov. 19, 2004). The previous two times that Minnesota arrived at the Four Nations Cup week with perfect records were in 2003 and 2004. The Gophers went on to claim NCAA titles in each of those seasons.

Senior Megan Bozek not only led the Gophers' offense with three goals in the two wins at Duluth, but the defenseman also helped hold UMD to just one goal in two games. She started the weekend off by scoring a power-play goal in the third period of the Gophers' 4-1 win last Friday. She then had two goals,

including a power-play goal, in the second game – a 4-0 win last Saturday that featured goaltender Noora Rätty's 31st career shutout. Amanda Kessel and Hannah Brandt had four points in Minnesota's first sweep at UMD since Oct. 26-27, 2007.

Ohio State (9-3-0, 7-3-0-0 WCHA, 21 points) kept within three points of the Gophers in the WCHA race by taking two road victories from St. Cloud State, although the Buckeyes have played two more league games than UM. St. Cloud State was happy just to be back home, in both hockey and overall. Due to renovations being performed at the National Hockey & Event Center, the OSU series was the home opener and the Huskies were almost late for the game as Hurricane Sandy kept them in from Providence the previous weekend. The Huskies' return to St. Cloud was delayed until Wednesday.

The spunky Huskies battled back to tie OSU last Friday before Tina Hollowell scored in the third period to give the Buckeyes a 3-2 win, but Saturday Ohio State rallied with three third period goals and took a 4-2 victory over SCSU on goals by Paige Semenza, Danielle Gagne and Hollowell.

Wisconsin (7-3-2, 3-3-2-2 WCHA, 13 points) scored its first ever sweep at new LaBahn Arena by blanking Minnesota State 2-0 and 5-0 last Friday and Saturday. Junior goaltender Alex Rigsby posted back-to-back shutouts against the visiting Mavericks, making a total of 36 saves for the weekend sweep. She made 14 saves in Friday's game before turning away 22 shots in the series finale. Rigsby has posted three-consecutive shutouts, and the shutout streak is the longest of her career, spanning a total of 189:29 minutes.

The sweep allowed the Badgers, the defending WCHA champions, to jump into third place with 13 points, eight behind Ohio State and 11 behind the high-flying Gophers. North Dakota (5-5-0, 4-4-0-0 WCHA, 12 points) is in fourth in the current WCHA standings, three points ahead of fifth place Minnesota State (4-6-2, 2-6-2-1 WCHA, 9 points). Minnesota Duluth (3-6-1, 2-5-1-0 WCHGA, 7 points) is in sixth place with seven points, one ahead of St. Cloud State, while Bemidji State (2-5-1, 1-4-1-0 WCHA, 4 points) is in eighth place with four points.

In non-conference play last weekend, North Dakota split a home series with Clarkson. On Friday, Danielle Skirrow scored the game-winner for the visitors during a 5:00 power-play, and Clarkson got an insurance goal from Jamie Lee Rattray to win, 3-1. But North Dakota came back on Saturday, capitalizing on two third period power-plays to salvage a split with a 3-2 triumph. Jocelyne Lamoureux scored twice and freshman Meghan Dufault had one goal.

Through a total of 22 non-conference games through Nov. 6, WCHA-member teams now stand 15-6-1 (.705) against other Div. 1 opponents.

2012 FOUR NATIONS CUP ROSTER FOR TEAM USA ANNOUNCED BY USA HOCKEY 13 SKATERS HAVE WCHA TIES

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Twelve Olympians highlight the 23-player U.S. Women's National Team roster that will compete in the 2012 Women's Four Nations Cup in Vantaa and Kerava, Finland from Nov. 5-10.

Also included are 13 skaters with WCHA ties. They are goaltenders Alex Rigsby (UW), Jessie Vetter (UW alum), defensemen Megan Bozek (UM), Lisa Chesson (OSU alum), Gigi Marvin (UM alum), Anne Schleper (UM alum), and forwards Brianna Decker (UW), Meghan Duggan (UW alum), Sarah Erickson (UM), Amanda Kessel (UM), Hilary Knight

(UW alum), Jocelyne Lamoureux (UND), and Monique Lamoureux (UND).

"We've got a terrific team assembled to compete in the Four Nations Cup," said Katey Stone (Arlington, MA), head coach of Team USA. "I feel this tournament will provide an excellent gauge of where we are as a team as we continue to evaluate players and progress toward the 2014 Olympics."

Among the 12 Olympians are Julie Chu (Fairfield, CT), who has not only played in three Olympic Winter Games, but also in 10 previous Four Nations Cups. Others include defensemen Kacey Bellamy (Westfield, MA), Lisa Chesson (Plainfield, IL), and Gigi Marvin (Warroad, MN); forwards Meghan Duggan (Danvers, MA), Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID), Jocelyne Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Monique Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH), and Karen Thatcher (Blaine, WA); and goaltenders Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) and Jessie Vetter (Cottage Grove, WI).

"From the veteran Olympians to the newcomers, we are confident in this team's ability to give our program a great start to the 2012-2013 season," said Reagan Carey (Colorado Springs, CO), director of women's hockey for USA Hockey.

Prior to the start of the Four Nations Cup, the team will participate in a training camp at the New York Rangers' Madison Square Garden Training Facility in Tarrytown, N.Y., from Oct. 30 - Nov. 4.

The camp will include 12 players from the team headed to the Four Nations Cup and select skaters from the 2012 U.S. Women's Under-18 Select Team player pool. At the conclusion of the camp, the 11 NCAA players who complete the U.S. roster will meet the rest of the team in Finland.

CANADA'S NATIONAL WOMEN'S TEAM ROSTER ANNOUNCED FOR 2012 FOUR NATIONS CUP SEVEN PLAYERS HAVE WCHA TIES

CALGARY, Alta. – Hockey Canada announced on Oct. 10 the 23 players that have been selected for Canada's National Women's Team for the 2012 4 Nations Cup, taking place November 6-10 in Kerava and Tikkurila, Finland.

Canada's roster for the 2012 4 Nations Cup includes three goaltenders, seven defencemen and 13 forwards, who were selected following Canada's National Women's Team September Camp/Fall Festival, which took place Sept. 22-29 in Calgary, Alta. Seven of those players have Western Collegiate Hockey Association ties in defensemen Tessa Bonhomme (OSU), Jocelyne Larocque (UMD), Meaghan Mikkelson (UW) and Bobbi Jo Slusar (UW) and forwards Haley Irwin (UMD), Caroline Ouellette (UMD), and Natalie Spooner (OSU).

The 2012 4 Nations Cup will bring together four top women's hockey countries in the world – Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States – for the 17th annual international tournament. Canada's National Women's Team has won the gold medal at the event a total of 12 times, and has claimed silver on four occasions.

(Agosta, Apps, Bendus, Birchard, Bonhomme, Bram, Hefford, Irwin, Jenner, Johnston, Labonté, Lacasse, Larocque, Mikkelson, Ouellette, Poulin, Spooner, Szabados, Wakefield, Ward and Wickenheiser) ... 13 members of Canada's gold medal-winning team from the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, BC (Agosta, Apps, Bonhomme, Hefford, Irwin, Johnston, Labonté, Mikkelson, Ouellette, Poulin, Szabados, Ward and Wickenheiser) ... 17 players who represented Canada at the 2012 4 Nations Cup in Nyköping, Sweden (Agosta, Apps, Bendus, Birchard, Hefford, Irwin, Jenner, Johnston, Labonté, Larocque, Ouellette, Poulin, Slusar, Spooner, Szabados, Wakefield and Wickenheiser).

"As always, there are no easy decisions when it comes to naming the roster for Team Canada, but we believe we've assembled a strong team for this year's 4 Nations Cup," said Dan Church, head coach of Canada's National Women's Team. "There is a good mix of veterans and young players. We look forward to seeing all of them represent Canada in November."

Church will be joined behind the bench at the 2012 4 Nations Cup by assistant coaches Danielle Goyette (St-Nazaire, Que./University of Calgary, CIS) and Lisa Haley (Westville, N.S./Ryerson University, CIS), who also served alongside him at Canada's National Women's Team September Camp/Fall Festival.

The 2012 4 Nations Cup will serve as an evaluation opportunity for Canada's National Women's Team coaching staff and Hockey Canada scouts, led by head scout of women's national team programs Melody Davidson, for the 2013 IIHF Women's World Championship in Ottawa, Ont., and 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. Players will continue to be evaluated with their club teams during the 2012-13 season.

The 2013 IIHF Ice Hockey Women's World Championship, taking place April 2-9 at SBP Arena and the Nepean Sportsplex, will mark the sixth time Canada has hosted the tournament. Canada also hosted in 1990 in Ottawa, 1997 in Kitchener, Ont., 2000 in Mississauga, Ont., 2004 in Halifax, N.S., and 2007 in Winnipeg, Man.

2012-13 WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR TO BE HELD AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE LAUNCHES SEPT. 28-29 AS MINNESOTA STATE HOSTS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP WISCONSIN; MINNESOTA REIGNS AS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF AND NCAA FROZEN FOUR CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW HOME IN LABAHN ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-

13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

"The Association looks forward to putting another action-packed, highly-competitive product on the ice in 2012-13," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the guiding force of the women's league since its founding in 1999. "The commitment to fielding top-quality programs and the dedication to success that our member institutions continue to display has resulted in some of the most entertaining women's hockey in the world over the past 13 seasons and we know that will continue in the future.

"I have no doubt this coming season's league race will be one of the most intriguing yet. We anticipate our teams will improve across the board and be both competitive and successful against opponents across the country. Last season, we had four teams ranked among the nation's top 10, four of our teams win at least 21 games overall, six finish at .500 or above and six win at least 11 games in league play. We also look forward to a tremendous post-season next March when both our WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four are showcased at UM's Ridder Arena. The University of Minnesota and the facility itself have a distinguished tradition of hosting first-class events."

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, precede to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
