WCHA TAKES 22-DAY HOLIDAY HIATUS; DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPION, UNBEATEN, NO. 1 MINNESOTA OWNS 13-POINT LEAD IN LEAGUE RACE; OSU, UW, UND RUN SECOND, THIRD, FOURTH NEXT GAMES SET FOR NEW YEAR; CONFERENCE PLAY RESUMES JAN. 4-5; LATEST WOMEN'S DIVISION 1 NATIONAL COLLEGE HOCKEY POLLS HAVE MINNESOTA NO. 1, WISCONSIN NO. 8, NORTH DAKOTA NO. 9, OHIO STATE NO. 10 ... MINNESOTA DULUTH ALSO RECEIVES VOTES; WCHA TEAMS STAND 26-8-4 IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association has reached the halfway mark of the 2012-13 women's season with Minnesota, the defending national champions, as the unbeaten leader and clearly the team to beat, but a spirited race sets up after New Year's for the three other home playoff spots.

In the last league series played before the holiday break, the top-rated Golden Gophers extended their NCAA-record winning streak to 28 games by beating Bemidji State, 5-1 and 5-0, at Sanford Arena in Bemidji. That sweep gives Minnesota (20-0-0, 14-0-0 WCHA, 42 points) a comfortable 13-point lead over second place Ohio State.

The No. 10-ranked Buckeyes (14-5-1, 9-4-1-1 WCHA, 29 points), meanwhile, are one point ahead of defending WCHA regular season champion, No. 8-ranked and third place Wisconsin (12-6-2, 8-6-2-2 WCHA, 28 points) and five better than No. 9 North Dakota (11-7-0, 8-6-0 WCHA, 24 points), which is in fourth place. The top four teams in the final standings will host first round conference playoff series.

Minnesota Duluth (7-8-3, 6-7-1 WCHA, 19 points), in fifth place, and Minnesota State (6-11-3, 4-9-3-1 WCHA, 16 points), in sixth, enter the second half of the season with thoughts of gaining home ice for the playoffs. St. Cloud State (7-12-1, 3-11-0 WCHA, 9 points) and Bemidji State (3-13-2, 2-11-1 WCHA, 7 points) are in seventh and eighth place, respectively, at the break.

There are no games scheduled for WCHA-member teams until Tuesday, Jan. 1 and Wednesday, Jan. 2 when Minnesota State visits College Hockey America-member Lindenwood for a non-conference set.

Then on the weekend of Friday, Jan. 4 and Saturday, Jan. 5, conference play resumes with just one series when St. Cloud State hosts Bemidji State at the National Hockey and Event Center. Outside the WCHA, North Dakota will travel to Lindenwood for a two-game series while in exhibition play, Wisconsin hosts the Minnesota Whitecaps in a single game on Jan. 4 in Madison.

THIS WEEK IN THE WCHA

No Games Scheduled. Play Resumes Jan. 1.

The next round of full WCHA play occurs Friday-Sunday, Jan. 11-13, when Minnesota hosts North Dakota, Ohio State plays is at Wisconsin, Minnesota State visits Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth entertains St. Cloud State.

Last weekend, Dec. 7-8, forward Amanda Kessel led Minnesota's WCHA sweep at Bemidji State with six points (3g, 3a). She had her second three-goal hat trick of the season in last Saturday's 5-0 victory. Dating back to last season, Kessel has now scored a point in 27-straight games. She has scored a goal in each of the past seven games, and there have only been two games this season that she hasn't scored. The shutout posted by UM goaltender Noora Rätty was her eighth this season and the 34th of her collegiate career, which is five behind the NCAA record of 39. The two victories also gives Rätty 94 career wins, which is six from tying the NCAA record of 100. Minnesota has outscored teams 114-12 this season.

Wisconsin ended North Dakota's program-best seven-game winning streak last weekend, sweeping 3-2 and 3-1 at LaBahn Arena. The Badgers' Brianna Decker, the reigning Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner, and Madison Packer each had a goal and an assist in each game and the Badgers held UND's talented Lamoureux sisters, Monique and Lamoureux, to one point combined. The Badgers scored three unanswered goals on Saturday, coming back from a two-goal deficit to win 3-2. In game two on Sunday, the Badgers scored three goals in the second period to claim a 3-1 victory for the sweep. UW goaltender Alex Rigsby made 59 saves in the series.

Minnesota State and St. Cloud State split their WCHA series in St. Cloud. The visiting Mavericks used two third-period goals to overcome a one-goal deficit and capture a 2-1 victory in last Friday's series opener, but were plagued by five second-period penalties in a 5-2 loss to the Huskies in last Saturday's finale. Lauren Smith had the game-winning goal and Danielle Butters made 30 saves for the Mavs, who are now just one shy of their total of their seven wins last season. Haylea Schmidt then had two goals and two assists in St. Cloud State's victory and had a five-point weekend.

In non-conference play Dec. 8-9, Ohio State won a pair of games from visiting RIT of College Hockey America, 3-1 and 6-2. Hokey Langan scored a goal and had an assist last Saturday in Columbus while Ally Tarr and Julia McKinnon both scored twice in Sunday's triumph.

And up in Duluth, Minnesota Duluth faced off with Hockey East Association-member Boston University for the first time and tied twice in overtime – 2-2 on Saturday and the first-ever 0-0 scoreless tie for the Bulldogs in 14 years on Sunday. Zoe Hickel had a late goal for UMD on Saturday, only to see Kathryn Miller score her first goal of the season to salvage a tie for the visiting Terriers. On Sunday, goaltenders Kerrin Sperry of BU and the Bulldogs' Kayla Black posted shutouts. It was the third whitewash for Black this season.

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA IS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF & NCAA CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW LABAHN ARENA

Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), got underway on the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomed two-time defending league champion Wisconsin.

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, Wisconsin will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room,

offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
