WCHA RESUMES PLAY ON NEW YEAR'S DAY; CONFERENCE ACTION RETURNS JANUARY 4-5

MINNESOTA STATE SKATES AT LINDENWOOD JAN. 1-2 IN NON-CONFERENCE PAIR; FIRST CONFERENCE SERIES OF CALENDAR YEAR 2013 HAS ST. CLOUD STATE HOSTING BEMIDJI STATE ON FRIDAY AND SATURDAY; NORTH DAKOTA VISITS LINDENWOOD JAN. 4-5; WISCONSIN HOSTS MINNESOTA WHITECAPS FRIDAY IN EXHIBITION ACTION; MOST RECENT WOMEN'S DIVISION 1 NATIONAL COLLEGE HOCKEY POLLS HAVE MINNESOTA NO. 1, WISCONSIN NO. 8, NORTH DAKOTA NO. 9, OHIO STATE NO. 10 ... MINNESOTA DULUTH ALSO RECEIVES VOTES; WCHA-MEMBER TEAMS STAND 26-8-4 IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY THIS SEASON

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association resumes women's play and brings in 2013 when Minnesota State visits College Hockey America-member Lindenwood for a non-conference set New Year's Day and Jan. 2 in Wentzville, Mo. The Mavericks, who are 6-11-3 on the season and the Lady Lions, who are 1-14-1, face-off at 7:00 pm CT Tuesday evening and 2:00 pm CT on Wednesday afternoon.

Conference play also picks up in the WCHA this coming weekend after a 22-day hiatus with one series when St. Cloud State (7-12-1, 3-11-0 WCHA) hosts Bemidji State (3-13-2, 2-11-1 WCHA) at the National Hockey and Event Center on Friday and Saturday. Puck drops are at 2:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday.

Outside the WCHA, North Dakota (11-7-0) will travel to Lindenwood for a two-game non-conference series Jan. 4-5 while in exhibition play, Wisconsin hosts the Minnesota Whitecaps in a single game on Jan. 4 at LaBahn Arena in Madison. UND will play at 7:00 pm CT on Friday and 2:00 pm CT on Saturday while the Badgers skate at 7:07 pm CT.

The next round of full league play occurs the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Jan. 11-13, when Minnesota hosts North Dakota, Ohio State plays at Wisconsin, Minnesota State visits Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth entertains St. Cloud State.

Minnesota, the defending national champions, reached the 2012-13 holiday break as the unbeaten WCHA leader and clearly the team to beat for the conference title. The top-rated Golden Gophers (20-0-0, 14-0-0 WCHA, 42 points) have a NCAA winning streak of 28 games and hold a 13-point lead over second place Ohio State (14-5-1, 9-4-1-1 WCHA, 29 points) at the halfway point. The Buckeyes are one point ahead of defending WCHA champion Wisconsin (12-6-2, 8-6-2-2 WCHA, 28 points) and five better than North Dakota (11-7-0, 8-6-0 WCHA, 24 points), which is in fourth place. The top four teams host first round conference playoff series.

Minnesota Duluth (7-8-3, 6-7-1 WCHA, 19 points) and Minnesota State (6-11-3, 4-9-3-1 WCHA, 16 points) enter the second half of the season with thoughts of home ice for the playoffs. They are in fifth and sixth place, respectively. St. Cloud State (7-12-1, 3-11-0 WCHA, 9 points) and Bemidji State (3-13-2, 2-11-1 WCHA, 7 points) are in seventh and eighth place.

Since the women's WCHA expanded the conference slate from 24 games to 28 beginning with the 2004-05 season, the best league records posted by member teams are as follows: Minnesota (25-1-2, .929) in 2004-05; Wisconsin (23-1-4, .893) in 2006-07; Wisconsin (24-2-2-2, .893) in 2010-11; Wisconsin (24-3-1, .875) in 2005-06; Minnesota (23-2-3-2, .875) in 2008-09; and Minnesota Duluth (24-4-0, .857) in 2007-08.

Following this week's schedule, there will be no more non-conference games over the final seven weeks of the regular season schedule. Through 38 non-conference games as of Dec. 31, WCHA-member teams are 26-8-4 against other Division 1 opponents for a .737 winning percentage. The WCHA is 6-4-4 vs. Hockey East Association-member teams, 6-2 vs ECAC Hockey clubs and 14-2 vs College Hockey America-member teams.

Looking ahead to next week's schedule, there will be a full slate of four Western Collegiate Hockey Association two-game series contested Friday, Jan. 11 through Sunday, Jan. 13. Minnesota will host North Dakota (Friday/Saturday), Ohio State travels to Wisconsin (Friday/Saturday), Bemidji State hosts Minnesota State (Friday/Saturday) and Minnesota Duluth entertains St. Cloud State (Saturday/Sunday).

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA IS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF & NCAA CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW LABAHN ARENA

Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), got underway on the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomed two-time defending league champion Wisconsin.

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, Wisconsin will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room,

offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, precede to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
