## FIRST HALF PLAY CONCLUDES THIS WEEKEND WITH THREE WCHA SERIES FOR DECEMBER 7-9 AS UNBEATEN UM HEADS TO BSU, UW HOSTS UND, MSU VISITS SCSU

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association closes out the first half of the season with three inter-league match ups December 7-9 and everyone in women's college hockey asking the same thing: Can anyone beat Minnesota, the defending national champions who are unbeaten this year and comfortably leading the WCHA?

On tap in the conference on Friday and Saturday are Minnesota at Bemidji State and Minnesota State at St. Cloud State while on Saturday and Sunday Wisconsin will play host to North Dakota.

The top-rated and defending national champion Golden Gophers (18-0-0, 12-0-0 WCHA, 36 points) extended their NCAA winning streak to 26 games by beating defending league champ Wisconsin twice last weekend, 4-1 and 2-0, at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. It was Minnesota's first sweep of the Badgers since 2005 and the first time the teams have met since last March's NCAA title game in Duluth.

Forward Amanda Kessel led the Gophers with three points (2g, 1a) against the Badgers. In the opening

game of the series last Saturday (Dec. 1), the Madison, Wis. native netted the game-winning goal in the Gophers' 4-1 win. The junior then sealed Minnesota's 2-0 win in game two with an empty-netter in the closing seconds of the defensive battle. Dating back to last season, Kessel has scored a point in 25-straight games. She has scored a goal in each of the past five games, and there have only been two games this season that she hasn't scored. UM goaltender Noora Rätty recorded 41 saves and allowed one goal in the UW series. In the first game, Rätty allowed one goal in the third period and denied 22 Badger shots. She came back on Sunday (Dec. 2) and shut out UW while making 19 saves. It was her seventh shutout of the season and 33rd of her career, which is six behind the NCAA Women's Div. 1 record of 39. The sweep also gives Rätty 92 career victories, which is eight from tying the NCAA record of 100. Last Saturday's game drew 3,400 fans at Ridder Arena, a school record, and the Border Battle attracted 5,532 fans.

On Friday and Saturday, Dec. 7-8, the Golden Gophers, who have outscored opponents 104-11 this season, travel north to face Bemidji State – in one of three WCHA series this weekend. The marquee series of the weekend has streaking North Dakota (11-5-0, 8-4-0 WCHA, 24 points), winners of a school-record seven games in a row, playing at Wisconsin (10-6-2, 6-6-2-2 WCHA, 22 points) in a Saturday (2:07 pm CT) and Sunday (1:07 pm CT) set while Minnesota State (5-10-3, 3-8-3-1 WCHA, 13 points) travels to St. Cloud State (6-11-1, 2-10-0 WCHA, 6 points) Friday (2:07 pm CT) and Saturday (2:07 pm CT).

Outside the WCHA, Minnesota Duluth (7-8-1) hosts Hockey East Association-member Boston University (11-3-1) at AMSOIL Arena on Saturday at 3:07 pm CT and Sunday at 3:07 pm CT while Ohio State (12-5-1) entertains RIT (6-7-2) of the Atlantic Hockey Association on Saturday at 7:07 pm ET and Sunday at 2:07 pm ET at the OSU Ice Rink.

Ohio State climbed past North Dakota and into second place by taking five of six points from Minnesota State last weekend in Mankato. OSU goaltender Chelsea Knapp and Minnesota State's Danielle Butters were the stars last Friday (Nov. 30) in a scoreless tie as Knapp made 34 saves and Butters 45. For the shootout to determine the extra point, the Mavericks changed goaltenders but were unable to stop OSU's shooters Hokey Langan, Ally Tarr and Taylor Kuehl. In the series finale, Langan scored twice, including her 50th career goal for OSU and Julia McKinnon scored a power-play goal to break a 3-3 tie in the second period to run the Buckeyes' league record to 9-4-1-1 with 29 points, seven points behind the Gophers and five ahead of North Dakota.

Wisconsin (6-6-2-2 WCHA, 22 points) is in fourth place this week, three points ahead of Minnesota Duluth (6-7-1 WCHA, 19 points). Minnesota State (3-8-3-1 WCHA, 13 points) is in sixth place while

Bemidji State (2-9-1 WCHA, 7 points) is in seventh, one point ahead of St. Cloud State (2-10-0 WCHA, 6 points).

Minnesota Duluth swept Bemidji State last weekend in Bemidji. The Bulldogs are now 55-3-2 all-time against Bemidji State. In the series opener on Dec. 1, the Bulldogs scored four unanswered goals after the host Beavers had staked themselves to a 2-0 lead in the second period to win 4-2. Pernilla Winberg started the comeback with a second period goal, which cut the lead to 2-1. Emma Stauber scored the tying goal at 2:53 of the third period and Zoe Hickel gave UMD the lead five minutes later. Jenna McParland iced the victory with an empty-net goal. Then on Sunday (Dec. 2), freshman center Aleksandra Vafina of Chelyabinski, Russia, scored her first two collegiate goals as Minnesota Duluth defeated Bemidji State 4-1. Hickel and Jamie Kenyon each had three point weekends for UMD, which has now won four of their last six games.

In non-conference play this past weekend, St. Cloud State completed a four-game season sweep over Lindenwood, winning 3-1 last Friday and 3-2 last Saturday in suburban St. Louis, Mo. Alex Nelson had three goals for the Huskies, including the game-winner in the final minute on Dec. 1 and the first two goals on Nov. 30. North Dakota also kept rolling, but needed a power-play goal from Monique Lamoureux in the third period to gain a 3-2 win over RIT last Friday and posting 8-2 triumph last Saturday. Lamoureux and Michelle Karvinen, who had a goal and four assists in game two, each collected seven points in the series. UND is 6-0 since Karvinen returned from the injury list and she has 17 points in those six starts.

Through 34 non-conference games played this season through Dec. 4, WCHA-member teams stand 24-8-2 (.735) against other Div. 1 opponents. The WCHA is 12-2 vs College Hockey America-member teams, 6-2 vs ECAC Hockey-member teams and 6-4-2 vs Hockey East Association clubs.

Following this week's three league series and two non-conference two-game match ups, the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association will then take a collective 22-day break over the holidays before on-ice play resumes on Tuesday and Wednesday, Jan. 1-2, when Minnesota State travels to Lindenwood for a pair of non-conference tilts to launch the new year. On the first weekend of January, Friday the 4th and Saturday the 5th, St. Cloud State will host Bemidji State in conference play while a non-league match up has North Dakota playing at Lindenwood. In exhibition action, Ohio State will entertain Durham West on Jan. 5. Minnesota will resume play on Jan. 11-12 at home against North Dakota, Wisconsin will next Ohio State on Jan. 11-12, and Minnesota Duluth will next host St. Cloud State on Jan. 12-13.

In the latest USCHO.com Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll for Dec. 3, Minnesota remains a unanimous No. 1, North Dakota is at No. 8 and Wisconsin is up to No. 9. Also receiving votes was Ohio State.

And in this week's USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll issued Dec. 4, Minnesota is No. 1, North Dakota is No. 8 and Wisconsin is No. 9. Ohio State also received votes.

## WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

### WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 GAMES PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA REIGNS AS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF AND NCAA FROZEN FOUR CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW HOME IN LA BAHN ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title



contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA-member teams will also engage in a number of non-conference pairings this season. By team, those are:

Bemidji State: Oct. 5-6 @ Providence College; Nov. 9-10 vs University of Maine.

Minnesota: Sept. 28-29 vs Colgate University; Oct. 12-13 @ St. Lawrence University; Nov. 24-25 @ University of New Hampshire.

Minnesota Duluth: Oct. 26-27 @ Boston College; Dec. 8-9 vs Boston University.

Minnesota State: Oct. 12-13 vs Lindenwood University; Oct. 26-27 @ Mercyhurst College; Jan. 1-2 @ Lindenwood University.

North Dakota: Nov. 2-3 vs Clarkson University; Nov. 30-Dec. 1 vs RIT (Rochester Institute of Technology); Jan. 4-5 @ Lindenwood University.

Ohio State: Sept. 28-29 vs Lindenwood University; Nov. 23-24 @ Princeton University; Dec. 8-9 vs RIT (Rochester Institute of Technology).

Of note, the Buckeyes will also host league-rival Wisconsin on Nov. 16-17 at Schottenstein Center in Columbus.

St. Cloud State: Oct. 27-28 @ Providence College; Nov. 9-10 vs Lindenwood University; Nov. 30-Dec. 1 @ Lindenwood University.

Wisconsin: Oct. 5-6 @ Lindenwood University; Oct. 26 & 28 vs University of New Hampshire.

The WCHA also welcomes back a plethora of outstanding student-athletes for the 2012-13 campaign, including the likes of reigning Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner, WCHA Player of the Year and All-American First Team forward Brianna Decker of Wisconsin. Also back are two All-American First Team honorees in defenseman Megan Bozek of Minnesota and forward Jocelyne Lamoureux of North Dakota, who was also the WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year and league scoring champion, and two All-American Second Team selections in defenseman Monique Lamoureux of North Dakota and forward Amanda

Kessel of Minnesota. Last season's WCHA Defensive Player of the Year returns in the Badgers' Stefanie McKeough as does the WCHA Rookie of the Year in forward Michelle Karvinen of North Dakota and the league's goaltending champion in Alex Rigsby of Wisconsin.

Returning All-WCHA honorees include first teamers in Decker (F) of Wisconsin, Jocelyne Lamoureux (F) of North Dakota and Bozek (D) of Minnesota, second teamers in Kessel (F) of Minnesota, Monique Lamoureux (D) of North Dakota, McKeough (D) of Wisconsin and Rigsby (G) of Wisconsin, and third teamers in Karvinen (F) of North Dakota, Jessica Wong (D) of Minnesota Duluth and Noora Rätty (G) of Minnesota.

Four WCHA-member teams ranked among the nation's top 10 in the final two weekly national polls for 2011-12. In the USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, the WCHA had national champion and WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion Minnesota at No. 1, WCHA regular season champion Wisconsin at No. 2, North Dakota at No. 6 and Minnesota Duluth at No. 10. And in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll, UM was No. 1, UW was No. 2, UND was No. 6 and UMD was No. 10 ... The WCHA also had the top four teams in attendance for the women's college hockey. Buoyed by the biggest crowd to ever watch a collegiate game – the 12,402 who saw Wisconsin win over Bemidji State at the Kohl Center Jan. 28, 2012 – the Badgers attracted 56,471 to home games (2,689 per game). North Dakota was second in home attendance nationally (drawing 28,218 for an average of 1,455 per game), followed by Minnesota (27,658/1,307 per game) and Minnesota Duluth (22,435/1,181 per game).

### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, precede to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

## WCHA TEAM NOTEBOOKS

### BEMIDJI STATE

The Beavers (3-11-2, 2-9-1 WCHA, 7 points) was swept at home by Minnesota Duluth, losing 4-2 on Saturday and 4-1 Sunday ... BSU is now 3-55-2 against the Bulldogs all-time ... UMD scored four unanswered goals after the Beavers staked themselves to a 2-0 lead in the second period to win 4-2 Saturday ... BSU has led by two or more goals three times this season and is 1-2-0 in such games; the opponent has rallied to at least tie the score each time ... Bemidji State freshman Megan Lushanko notched her first collegiate goal in the game, while first-year forward Hanna Hoher picked up her first assist and sophomore Alex Citrowske earned her first career point, an assist, on the play ... BSU pulled its goalie for the extra attacker for the sixth time this season in the game and allowed its first empty-net goal ... Freshman goaltender Alexane Rodrigue made her first college start in Sunday's game, allowing four goals on 33 shots ... Erika Wheelhouse and Ivana Bilic assisted Natasha Kostenko's goal and both now have three points on the season ... The assist was the first of Bilic's career and the goal was Kostenko's team-leading fifth of the season ... BSU tied a season-high in penalties and penalty minutes, taking seven penalties for 14 minutes ... It took 9:47 for the Beavers to record their first shot of the third period and they scored their lone goal on the second shot of the period on the power-play ... After Kayla Black replaced Sofia Carlstrom at the 4:26 mark of last Saturday's game, Black stopped the first 46 total shots she faced ... In the opening game of the series last Saturday, the Madison, Wis. native netted the game-winning goal in the Gophers' 4-1 win ... She also assisted Maryanne Menefee on the first goal of the game ... The junior forward sealed Minnesota's win in game two with an empty-netter in the closing seconds of the game ... Dating back to last season, Kessel has scored a point in 25-straight games ... She has scored a goal in each of the past five games, and there have only been two games this season that she hasn't scored ... Wisconsin held the Gophers scoreless through the first two periods of last Sunday's game, which hadn't happened in nearly a year (Dec. 3, 2011 vs North Dakota) ... Noora Rätty recorded 41 saves and allowed one goal on the weekend ... In the first game, Rätty allowed one goal in the third period and denied 22 Badger shots, including a remarkable glove save while lying on the ice early in the second period when the score was still knotted 0-0 ... The Finnish native came back on Sunday and shutout UW while making 19 saves ... It was her seventh shutout of the season and 33rd of her career, which is six behind the NCAA record of 39 ...
