## FULL SET OF FOUR WCHA SERIES SET FOR FRIDAY AND SATURDAY AS OHIO STATE HOSTS ST. CLOUD STATE, BEMIDJI STATE VISITS MINNESOTA DULUTH, MINNESOTA HEADS TO MINNESOTA STATE, NORTH DAKOTA HOSTS WISCONSIN; SIX WEEKS REMAIN IN 2012-13 REGULAR SEASON

**TOP-RANKED, LEAGUE-LEADING GOLDEN GOPHERS REMAIN UNDEFEATED, UNTIED AFTER JAN. 11-12 SWEEP OF NORTH DAKOTA; WISCONSIN WINS TWICE AGAINST OHIO STATE TO TAKE OVER SECOND PLACE; MINNESOTA DULUTH DOWNS SCSU TWICE TO MOVE INTO FOURTH; BEMIDJI STATE, MINNESOTA STATE SPLIT; WCHA'S 2012-13 NON-CONFERENCE MARK STANDS AT 30-8-4 FOR .782 WINNING PERCENTAGE; LATEST DIVISION 1 NATIONAL POLLS HAVE MINNESOTA CONTINUING AT NO. 1, WISCONSIN AT NO. 7/8, OHIO STATE AT NO. 9 ... NORTH DAKOTA ALSO RECEIVES VOTES; 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF PLAYOFF CHAMPIONSHIP SET FOR MARCH 8-9 AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS**

MADISON, Wis. – After strengthening its hold on first place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, Minnesota takes aim at the women's record for the longest winning streak in NCAA history. The unbeaten, untied and No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers travel to Minnesota State later this week for a Friday and Saturday conference series. Face-offs at All Seasons Arena in Mankato are at 7:07 pm CT and 3:07 pm CT.

Minnesota (22-0-0, 16-0-0 WCHA) stands 2-0 vs Minnesota State (9-12-3, 5-10-3-1 WCHA) this season, after a 3-0, 9-1 sweep in Minneapolis back on November 16-17.

The defending national champions beat visiting North Dakota twice by identical 6-3 scores last weekend (Jan. 11-12) at Ridder Arena and extended its winning streak to 30 games, which is two off the NCAA unbeaten streak held by league rival Wisconsin. Gophers' forward Amanda Kessel had a 10-point

weekend in Minnesota's 11th two-game sweep of the season.

The Gophers-Mavericks inter-state rivalry in Mankato is one of four conference series which will be contested this weekend, January 18-19. The rest of the schedule has North Dakota hosting No. 7/8-ranked Wisconsin, Bemidji State traveling to Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud State at No. 9-ranked Ohio State.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, North Dakota (13-9-0, 8-8-0 WCHA) will go up against the defending regular season Badgers (14-6-2, 10-6-2-2 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday. The two clubs played their first two-game set on December 8-9 in Madison, with Wisconsin prevailing by 3-2 and 3-1 scores. The Badgers are currently on a four-game winning streak.

At AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, streaking Minnesota Duluth (9-8-3, 8-7-1 WCHA) takes on Bemidji State (5-12-2, 4-13-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT puck drops. The Bulldogs, who sport a six-game unbeaten streak, defeated the Beavers twice, 4-2 and 4-1, in their first meetings back on December 1-2 in Bemidji.

And at the OSU Ice Rink in Columbus, Ohio State (14-7-1, 9-6-1-1 WCHA) will play host to St. Cloud State (8-15-1, 4-14-0 WCHA) at 7:07 pm ET Friday evening and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. The Buckeyes dropped the Huskies by 3-2 and 4-2 counts back on Nov. 2-3 in St. Cloud.

Minnesota (16-0-0 WCHA, 48 points) holds a 14-point lead over second place Wisconsin (10-6-2-2 WCHA, 34 points). The Badgers, the defending WCHA champions who swept Ohio State last weekend, are five points ahead of the third place Buckeyes (9-6-1-1, 29 points). Minnesota Duluth (8-7-1-0, 25 points) took two victories from St. Cloud State last weekend and moved into fourth place, one point ahead of fifth place North Dakota (8-8-0, 24 points). The top four teams in the final regular season standings will host first round WCHA playoff series. Minnesota State (5-10-3-1, 19 points) is in sixth place this week while Bemidji State (4-13-1-0, 13 points) jumped ahead of St. Cloud State (4-14-0-0, 12 points) into seventh place.

In last weekend's (January 11-12) WCHA marquee series in Minneapolis, Minnesota scored identical four-goal victories in its first sweep over UND since 2009-10, but with different scenarios. Amanda Kessel scored four goals and had two assists in last Friday's victory. It was the junior's third hat trick of the season and eighth of her collegiate career. Last Saturday, Rachel Ramsey scored the tie-breaking goal with 11 minutes left in the game and then Kessel added two goals in the final minute. Minnesota scored five goals in the third period to overcome three North Dakota power-play goals. A crowd of 2,703 at Ridder Arena saw UM goaltender Noora Räty record her 96th career win and make 22 saves. She is now only four wins away from tying the NCAA record for career victories (100). For North Dakota, forward Michelle Karvinen had two goals in the

series finale. The Gophers have now allowed 18 goals in 22 games this season, and nine of them have come in the four games against UND. North Dakota, incidentally, is the last team to have defeated Minnesota – on Feb. 17, 2012.

Minnesota State and Bemidji split a wild series in Bemidji. In the series opener, the host Beavers recorded their second straight 2-0 victory. Goaltender Jessica Havel posted her second consecutive shutout and made 10 saves. Ericka Wheelhouse led a stout defense with 13 blocked shots. Bemidji State outshot the Mavericks 41-10 in recording its first home victory of the season. Last Saturday, BSU spotted the visiting Mavericks a 3-0 lead, only to see the Beavers score three third period goals, two by Kaitlyn Tougas, and tie the game. But Lauren Zrust's overtime goal at 2:35 gave Minnesota State a 4-3 victory and three valuable points in the standings. Danielle Butters had 36 saves for the Mavericks.

In Madison, Wisconsin ran its home winning streak to 11 games and beat Ohio State, 4-1 and 2-1 at LaBahn Arena. In the series opener, Brianna Decker had a hand in three-of-the-four Badger goals, including the game-winner on a shorthanded breakaway. Wisconsin senior forward Alev Kelter, who also had a shorthanded goal in Friday's game, scored the game-winner on Saturday. Ally Tarr had both Ohio State goals in the series.

Up in Duluth, Minnesota Duluth ran its unbeaten streak to six games (4-0-2) with a WCHA series sweep over St. Cloud State at AMSOIL Arena. Senior Jessica Wong moved from defense to forward and, centering Jamie Kenyon and Jenna McParland, their line accounted for seven goals in the 3-1 and 8-2 wins. Kenyon scored two goals and freshman goaltender Kayla Black made 24 saves in the Bulldogs' series opening victory, a 3-1 decision. In the series finale, UMD scored four first period goals and cruised as Wong and Kenyon each had two goals.

Looking ahead to next week's WCHA schedule, there will be three league series contested over the January 25-27 period. On Friday and Saturday, Ohio State will entertain Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud State hosts North Dakota, while Wisconsin hosts Minnesota on Friday and Sunday. Bemidji State and Minnesota State will both be idle.

All eight WCHA-member teams have completed their respective non-conference regular season slates for 2012-13. And through 42 non-conference games as of January 15, WCHA teams are 30-8-4 against other Division 1 opponents for a .762 winning percentage. The WCHA is 6-4-4 vs. Hockey East, 6-2 vs. ECAC and 18-2 vs. College

Hockey America.

In the most recent USCHO.com Women's Division 1 College Hockey Poll issued on January 14, Minnesota continued as a unanimous No. 1, Wisconsin was at No. 7 and Ohio State was at No. 9. Also receiving votes this week was North Dakota.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Division 1 College Hockey Poll issued on January 15, Minnesota was a unanimous No. 1, Wisconsin was at No. 8 and Ohio State was at No. 9. North Dakota also received votes.

## WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA IS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF & NCAA CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW LABAHN ARENA

Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), got underway on the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomed two-time defending league champion Wisconsin.

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, Wisconsin will call LaBahn Arena their new

home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

Bemidji State improved to 3-3-1 with junior defenseman Allie Duellman in the lineup and 4-3-1 when scoring first ... BSU also had its second penalty-free game of the season and finished the weekend with just one penalty; Bemidji State went 69:10 without a penalty, its second-longest streak of the season ... Minnesota State handed the Beavers their first overtime loss of the season last Saturday, 4-3 ... MSU led 3-0 with 11:07 to play, but Kaitlyn Tougas became the first Bemidji State player to score two goals in a game this season by scoring twice in a 5:32 span ... Captain Erika Wheelhouse, who had 18 blocked shots on the weekend and now leads BSU with 102, scored her first goal of the season with :11.8 seconds left to tie the score ... It was BSU's second goal scored with an extra attacker on the ice this season ... Kari Lundberg's goal 10:26 into regulation for the Mavericks snapped a 132:53 shutout streak for Havel ... Ironically, it was the first MSU overtime victory since Nov. 4th, 2011 when the Mavericks captured a 2-1 overtime victory over Bemidji State ... Senior defenseman Emilia Andersson registered a career-high three points off a goal and two assists in the win for MSU ... Andersson is now tied for fifth in the WCHA with 12 points as a defenseman and is also tied for 17th nationally in the same category ... Additionally, senior Lauren Barnes collected a season-high two points with a goal and an assist in the victory, while freshman Katie Johnson picked up her first career point with an assist in the contest ... Junior Danielle Butters continued her sensational season between the pipes for the Mavericks as she earned 75 saves on the weekend and her ninth victory of the season ...
