MADISON, Wis. – Unbeaten and untied Minnesota is the hottest team in Division 1 women's college hockey and the defending national champions will try to make history this weekend when the Golden Gophers and Wisconsin renew their Border Battle rivalry this weekend at LaBahn Arena (2,273) in Madison. Face-offs are at 2:07 pm CT Friday afternoon and 2:07 pm CT on Sunday afternoon.

This is a resumption of one of the best rivalries in women's college hockey. It is also a match up of the No. 8-ranked Badgers (15-7-2, 11-7-2-2 WCHA), the defending Western Collegiate Hockey Association champions, and the Golden Gophers (24-0-0, 18-0-0 WCHA), the unanimous No. 1 team in the country who have outscored their opponents 140-19 in posting 12 series sweeps. Minnesota leads the WCHA with a perfect 54 points in 18 games, 17 points better than second place Wisconsin.

Minnesota enters the weekend having tied Wisconsin's NCAA Div. 1 women's record for longest undefeated streak at 32 games. Wisconsin set the record twice with 32-game undefeated streaks between Nov. 25, 2006-Oct. 14, 2007 and Dec. 4, 2010-Oct. 14-2011.

The Border Battle in Madison is one of three WCHA series which will be contested this weekend, Jan. 25-27. The rest of the schedule has Minnesota Duluth at Ohio State in a key battle between teams looking at top four finishes and home ice for the first round of league playoffs while North Dakota, also vying for a top four finish, is at St. Cloud State. Both Bemidji State and Minnesota State are idle this week.

The No. 9/10-ranked OSU Buckeyes (15-7-2, 10-6-2-2 WCHA) and UMD Bulldogs (11-8-3, 10-7-1 WCHA) will play at the OSU Ice Rink (800) 2:07 pm ET on Friday afternoon and again at 2:07 pm ET on Saturday afternoon. Ohio State swept Minnesota Duluth at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth on the opening weekend of the season on Oct. 5-6 by 3-1 and 3-2 scores.

The two-game series between host St. Cloud State (8-16-2, 4-15-1 WCHA) and No. 9/10-ranked North Dakota (14-10-0, 9-9-0 WCHA) at the National Hockey & Events Center (5,371) will be contested at 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening and 2:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. UND won twice over the Huskies back on Oct. 19-20 in Grand Forks by 3-1 and 1-0 counts.

The Golden Gophers beat the Badgers in the 2012 NCAA Frozen Four Final in Duluth, Minn. Since 2005, Wisconsin has played Minnesota in two national championship games (2006, 2012) and five WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championships (2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2011). Minnesota leads the Badgers, 33-26-8, in the all-time series. Wisconsin's last win against Minnesota was on Oct. 14, 2011 at the Kohl Center. Since then the Badgers have gone 0-5-1 against the Gophers.

While the Badgers did suffer a sweep at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, back on Dec. 1-2, Wisconsin's defense kept the Gophers scoreless for the longest stretch to start a game this season, as Minnesota went scoreless for the first 49 minutes of the Dec. 2 game, a 2-0 Gophers' victory.

Not only is Minnesota the hottest team, but the Gophers have the hottest scorer in forward Amanda Kessel, who returns to her hometown of Madison with 17 points in her last four games. Kessel leads the nations in points (71), goals (34) and assists (37). Gopher freshman Hannah Brandt is second in the nation in points (58) and assists (35), and third in goals (23). Defensively, Minnesota is led by veteran goaltender Noora Rätty, who has a goals-against average of 0.94 and a .956 save percentage. She is two wins away from tying the NCAA record for career victories (100).

Minnesota (18-0-0 WCHA, 54 points) is the runaway leader atop the conference standings with a tight race for second place behind the Gophers. The Badgers remain in second place in the WCHA with 37 points. Ohio State is three points behind in third, while Minnesota Duluth is six points back in fourth. However, Wisconsin has played two more games than both OSU and UMD.

Wisconsin (11-7-2-2 WCHA, 37 points) split a road series at North Dakota last weekend (Jan. 18-19) and are holding off Ohio State (10-

6-2-2 WCHA, 34), which took five of six points with a tie and a victory over St. Cloud State last weekend and Minnesota Duluth (10-7-1-0 WCHA, 31 points). UMD beat Bemidji State twice last weekend and the Bulldogs currently have an eight-game unbeaten streak (6-0-2. UMD is four points ahead of fifth place North Dakota (9-9-0 WCHA, 27 points). The top four teams host first round playoff series. There are five weeks left in the regular season.

Minnesota State (9-14-3, 5-12-3-1 WCHA, 19 points) is in sixth place this week while Bemidji State (5-17-2, 4-15-1 WCHA, 13 points) and St. Cloud State (4-15-1 WCHA, 13 points) are tied for seventh place.

In last weekend's WCHA action, Minnesota kept rolling, sweeping Minnesota State 8-1 and 6-0 in Mankato. Kessel scored four goals last Friday and had three assists Saturday to bring her career point total to 201.

Up in Duluth, UMD put up its fifth series sweep of the season, beating Bemidji State 3-0 and 4-2. Goaltender Kayla Black made 17 saves in her fourth shutout of the season. Juniors Brienna Gillanders and Jamie Kenyon, and senior forward Pernilla Winberg scored goals and senior Katie Wilson became the 18th member of the Bulldogs' 100-point club with an assist on Winberg's goal. On Saturday, an AMSOIL Arena women's record crowd of 4,095 watched Brigitte Lacquette, Jenna McParland, Winberg and Gillanders scored the Bulldogs goals. The Bulldogs are 4-0 against the Beavers this year and are now 56-3-2 all-time against BSU.

In Grand Forks on Jan. 18-19, freshman goaltender Shelby Amsley-Benzie turned away 19 shots and led North Dakota to a 3-0 win over visiting Wisconsin Friday, the fifth time the Badgers have been blanked this season. Jocelyne Lamoureux scored twice and had an assist. The Badgers rebounded last Saturday, though, winning by a score of 2-1. Wisconsin received goals from Katy Josephs and Madison Packer, while goaltender Alex Rigsby made a total of 55 saves on the weekend.

And in Columbus, Ohio State took five points from St. Cloud State in a hard fought series. In nets, OSU's Chelsea Knapp saved 54 of the 56 shots she faced, outdueled SCSU's Julie Friend in a goaltending battle and was the Buckeyes' dominant player in a 1-1 (ot) tie and 3-1 win. Junior Ally Tarr had a pair of goals on Saturday after scoring the only goal of the shootout on Friday to give OSU the valuable bonus point in the WCHA standings.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday, February 1 and Saturday,

February 2 there will again be three, two-game WCHA series contested. Ohio State travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota hosts Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State entertains North Dakota.

All eight WCHA-member teams have completed their respective non-conference regular season slates for 2012-13. Through 42 non-conference games as of January 22, WCHA teams are 30-8-4 against other Division 1 opponents for a .762 winning percentage. The WCHA is 6-4-4 vs. Hockey East, 6-2 vs. ECAC and 18-2 vs. College Hockey America.

In the most recent USCHO.com Women's Division 1 College Hockey Poll issued on January 21, Minnesota continued as a unanimous No. 1, Wisconsin is at No. 8, Ohio State is No. 9 and North Dakota is No. 10. Also receiving votes was Minnesota Duluth.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Division 1 College Hockey Poll issued on January 22, Minnesota was a unanimous No. 1, Wisconsin was at No. 8, North Dakota was at No. 9 and Ohio State was at No. 10. Minnesota Duluth also received votes.

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA IS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF & NCAA CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW LABAHN ARENA

Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), got underway on the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomed two-time defending league champion Wisconsin.

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, Wisconsin will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

BEMIDJI STATE

The Beavers (5-17-2, 4-15-1 WCHA, 13 points) were swept in their final January series – falling 3-0 and 4-2 at Minnesota Duluth ... UMD leads 56-3-2 in the all-time series after taking all four regular-season contests from the Beavers this season ... Last weekend marked just the second time BSU was swept on the road in 2012-13 ... In the first game of the Jan. 18-19 weekend, Bemidji State conceded one goal in the first and two goals in the second and was shut out for the third time this season after posting 17 shots on goal ... Sophomore goaltender Abby Ryplanski made 24 saves in her second start of the 2013 calendar year ... Senior Emily Erickson and sophomore Natasha Kostenko each had four-game point streaks snapped ... The Beavers came out stronger in the final game of the series and took a 1-0 lead with Rachael Kelly's first goal since Oct. 21 at Wisconsin ... UMD went on to score four consecutive goals before the end of the second period and Ryplanski replaced starter and senior Jessica Havel in the third period; Havel stopped 18 of 22 shots ... Ryplanski, who entered a game in which she didn't start for the first time, turned aside all eight shots she faced ... Alex Ehlert scored her first goal since opening night Oct. 5 to cut BSU's deficit to 4-2 ... Kostenko had an assist in the game and now has at least a point in seven of her last nine games played; BSU was shut out in the two games in which she didn't score ... Bemidji State took seven penalties on the weekend and remained the second-least penalized team in the nation (behind Quinnipiac) with 6.8 penalty minutes per game ... The Beavers do not play this week and will kick-off February with a home series against the only team to sweep them on the road (aside from UMD) in Ohio State ... BSU will then leave the state of Minnesota for the first time since Oct. 27 to play at North Dakota and will conclude the regular season against Minnesota on the road and against Wisconsin at home.

The No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (24-0-0, 18-0-0 WCHA, 54 points) have tied the NCAA unbeaten streak record of 32 games after winning two games at Minnesota State, 8-1 and 6-0 ... They share the record with a pair of historic Wisconsin teams, but the Gophers are the only team to reach the milestone with all 32 games being wins ... Amanda Kessel became the 24th player in NCAA history to tally 200 career points and only the ninth player to do so in her junior season ... She is also the 6th player in Minnesota history to reach the milestone ... The junior scored seven points (3g, 4a) and had the team's second highest plus/minus ratio of +6 ... In last Friday's game, Kessel inched towards the milestone by netting her fourth hat trick of the season and ninth of her career while also chipping in an assist ... All three of her goals were tallied in a different fashion with the first being shorthanded, the second on a power-play and the final one with the teams having even skaters ... She came back on Saturday just two points shy of the mark, and just 5:04 into the second period, she assisted Hannah Brandt on a goal to acquire her 200th point ... Kessel leads the nations in points (71), goals (34) and assists (37) ... Brandt is second in the nation in points (58) and assists (35), and third in goals (23) ... Defenseman Megan Bozek notched five points (2g, 3a) on the weekend ... In last Friday's game, the senior defenseman assisted Kessel on her third goal of the night ... Bozek came back strong on Saturday to notch two goals and a pair of assists ... Bozek had a plus/minus ratio of +5 for the weekend ... Goaltender Noora Rätty is two wins shy of the NCAA career wins record of 100 ... Rätty

is also four shutouts from tying the NCAA record for career shutouts ... She has recorded a goals-against average of 0.94 and a .956 save percentage ... The Gophers face Wisconsin this weekend (Friday and Sunday at 2:07 pm CT) in Madison, and the Badgers are the only team this season to hold Minnesota scoreless through the first two periods (Dec. 2 when the Gophers won 2-0).

MINNESOTA DULUTH

The Bulldogs (11-8-3, 10-7-3 WCHA, 31 points) stretched their unbeaten streak to eight games, the fourth longest in the NCAA with their fifth season sweep over Bemidji State last weekend ... The Bulldogs shutout their fourth opponent last Friday in a 3-0 win, with goals from juniors Brienna Gillanders and Jamie Kenyon, as well as senior forward Pernilla Winberg ... Eight different players had points, while Kayla Black turned away all 17 shots she faced ... Senior Katie Wilson became the 18th member of the Bulldogs 100 point club with an assist on Winberg's goal ... Wilson is the fourth player on the current roster to reach the milestone ... UMD triumphed 4-2 Saturday, helped by a three-goal second period ... Brigette Lacquette, Jenna McParland, Winberg and Gillanders had the Bulldogs goals, all three of whom also added assists on the night ... Again, eight players recorded points and UMD held BSU scoreless in seven power-play attempts for a total of 12 in the series ... Rookie forward Hannah Bramm missed both games for UMD due to a reoccurring injury ... The Bulldogs set an AMSOIL Arena regular season record for attendance with 4,095 fans last Saturday ... The Bulldogs are 4-0 against the Beavers this year and are now 56-3-2 all-time against BSU ... Winberg scored a goal in each game and has netted a goal in each of her last four skates ... UMD is averaging the third most penalty minutes in the NCAA with 11.6 an outing ... She is tied for fourth in the NCAA with four shutouts ... McParland leads UMD with 17 points (7g, 10a), while Zoe Hickel has 16 points with eight goals and eight assists ... The Mavericks will now enjoy a week off before wrapping up a four-game home stand Feb. 1-2 when they welcome the University of North Dakota to Mankato for the two programs' final regular-season series of 2012-13 ... The two teams each picked up one win during a two-game set Oct. 5-6 at Ralph Englestad Arena that saw the Mavericks score three third-period goals to earn a 3-2 victory in the series opener before UND rebounded for a 4-1 win in the series finale.

No. 10-ranked North Dakota (14-10-0, 9-9-0 WCHA, 27 points) returns to the road this weekend for a Friday and Saturday WCHA series at St. Cloud State ... UND swept St. Cloud State on Oct. 19-20 at the Ralph Engelstad Arena by 3-1 and 1-0 scores, respectively ... Senior Jocelyne Lamoureux had a two goals last Friday and scored the lone goal in the series finale last Saturday while Jorid Dagfinrud allowed picked up both wins in net allowing just one goal ... The Huskies hold the edge in the all-time record with a 19-18-5 advantage, but North Dakota has won the last 10 meetings between the two squads ...
