## MINNESOTA VS NORTH DAKOTA SERIES HIGHLIGHTS FULL SLATE OF WCHA MATCH UPS FOR JANUARY 11-13 WEEKEND

**UNDEFEATED, TOP-RANKED GOLDEN GOPHERS TAKE ON UNDA AT RIDDER ARENA FRIDAY AND SATURDAY; NO. 9/10 OHIO STATE VISITS NO. 8 WISCONSIN; MINNESOTA STATE TRAVELS TO BEMIDJI STATE; MINNESOTA DULUTH HOSTS ST. CLOUD STATE SATURDAY-SUNDAY; BSU SPLITS LEAGUE SET AT SCSU JAN. 4-5; MSU, UND POST RECENT SWEEPS AT LINDENWOOD AS WCHA'S 2012-13 NON-CONFERENCE MARK MOVES TO 30-8-4; LATEST DIVISION 1 NATIONAL POLLS HAVE MINNESOTA AGAIN NO. 1, WISCONSIN NO. 8, OHIO STATE NO. 9/10 ... NORTH DAKOTA ALSO RECEIVES VOTES; 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF PLAYOFF CHAMPIONSHIP SET FOR MARCH 8-9 AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS**

MADISON, Wis. – While half of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's eight member teams brought in 2013 by playing games last week, conference play resumes in earnest this weekend, Friday-Sunday, January 11-13, with a full round of league series.

The slate shows that No. 1-ranked Minnesota hosts North Dakota, No. 9/10-ranked Ohio State plays at No. 8-ranked Wisconsin, Minnesota State visits Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth entertains St. Cloud State. But there is no doubt the highlight of the weekend is the match up at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

Minnesota (20-0-0, 14-0-0 WCHA), the defending national champions, reached the holiday break as the undefeated WCHA leader and clearly the team to beat for the conference regular season title. The top-rated Golden Gophers have a NCAA winning streak of 28 games. North Dakota (13-7-0, 8-6-0 WCHA) was swept in Grand Forks by the Gophers earlier in the season by scores of 5-1 and 4-2, but UND is the only team to have not been shutout in at least one game of a series by Minnesota this year. North Dakota is also the last team to have defeated Minnesota coming last season on Feb. 17, 2012, and was the only team to defeat the Gophers twice during its national championship season. Face-offs at Ridder Arena (3,400) are at 7:07 pm CT on Friday night and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon.

At LaBahn Arena (2,273) in Madison, defending WCHA champion Wisconsin will play host to Ohio State in a pair of 7:07 pm CT puck drops Friday and Saturday evenings. The Badgers (12-6-2, 8-6-2-2 WCHA) and Buckeyes (14-5-1, 9-4-1-1 WCHA) split their first two meetings this season back on Nov. 16-17 in Columbus, with Wisconsin winning 4-2 in the opener and OSU taking game two, 3-1.

At Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji, Bemidji State welcomes Minnesota State at 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. The Beavers (4-14-2, 3-12-1 WCHA) and Mavericks (8-11-3, 4-9-3-1 WCHA) split back on Nov. 23-24 in Mankato, with BSU claiming a 4-3 victory on Friday and MSU coming back for a 4-1 win on Saturday.

And on Saturday and Sunday at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) in Duluth, Minnesota Duluth (7-8-3, 6-7-1 WCHA) will take on visiting St. Cloud State (8-13-1, 4-12-0 WCHA) in a pair of 3:07 pm CT face-offs. The Bulldogs swept the Huskies in St. Cloud on Nov. 16-17 by identical 4-1 counts. The Minnesota Duluth women and men will each hold their second annual Pink Game on Saturday against St. Cloud State and Michigan Tech, respectively. Both Bulldog clubs that day will wear special-edition pink jerseys, which will be auctioned off with proceeds going to benefit the Essentia Health Foundation. A special pregame ceremony and in-game announcements will be made recognizing those who have survived, been affected by, or have known someone in the battle against breast cancer. In 2011-12, the Bulldog men and women helped raise nearly \$25,000 in support of breast cancer.

Heading into the final seven weeks of the regular season, Minnesota (14-0-0 WCHA, 42 points) holds a 13-point lead over second place Ohio State (9-4-1-1 WCHA, 29 points). Since the women's WCHA expanded the conference slate from 24 games to 28 beginning with the 2004-05 season, the best league records posted by member teams are as follows: Minnesota (25-1-2, .929) in 2004-05; Wisconsin (23-1-4, .893) in 2006-07, Wisconsin (24-2-2-2, .893) in 2010-11; Wisconsin (24-3-1, .875) in 2005-06; Minnesota (23-2-3-2, .875) in 2008-09; and Minnesota Duluth (24-4-0, .857) in 2007-08.

The Buckeyes are one point ahead of third place Wisconsin (8-6-2-2 WCHA, 28 points) and five points better than North Dakota (13-7-0, 8-6-0-0, 24 points), which is in fourth place. The top four teams host first round, best-of-three, playoff series over the weekend of March 1-3. Minnesota Duluth (6-7-1 WCHA, 19 points) and Minnesota State (4-9-3-1 WCHA, 16 points) enter the second half of the season with thoughts of home ice for the playoffs. They are in fifth and sixth place, respectively. St. Cloud State (4-12-0 WCHA, 12 points) and Bemidji State (3-12-1 WCHA, 10 points) are currently in seventh and eighth place.

Last week, Bemidji State split two games at St. Cloud. The Huskies won for the fourth time in their last five games overall by taking a 4-2 victory in the series opener, scoring three goals in the final 7:57

to secure its third victory against the Beavers this season. Freshman Hanna Brodt tied the game up with her first collegiate goal and SCSU took a 3-2 lead at the 12:52 mark of the third period with a power-play goal by Molli Mott. An empty-net goal by Julia Gilbert sealed the victory. Then last Saturday, the visiting Beavers snapped a six-game losing streak Saturday with a 2-0 victory over their hosts. Goaltender Jessica Havel posted her first career shutout, recording 21 saves while Allie Duellman and Emily Erickson scored second period goals for BSU.

The WCHA also padded its impressive non-conference record last week as both Minnesota State and North Dakota swept Lindenwood in Wentzville, Mo. Minnesota State scored 6-1 and 6-0 victories over the Lady Lions on Jan. 1-2. Nicole Germaine and Lauren Smith each had two goals in the New Year's Day victory and Kathleen Rogan had three goals (all in the second period) and an assist in the series finale. It was Rogan's third collegiate hat trick, a school record. Goaltender Danielle Butters made 29 saves and recorded her fourth shutout of the season.

North Dakota scored a 7-3 victory at Lindenwood on Jan. 4 as freshman Megan Dufault had four goals and two assists and UND then finished the sweep with an 8-4 victory on Jan. 5 as Jocelyne Lamoureux scored four goals and added an assist. Lamoureux had eight points in the series and moved into the sole position of sixth place in the NCAA record book for career scoring with 242 points (112-130=242). She also moved into third all-time by a WCHA player, trailing only Minnesota's Natalie Darwitz (102-144=246) and Wisconsin's Hilary Knight (143-119=262). Monique Lamoureux moved into ninth all-time and fifth by a WCHA player and will collect her 100th collegiate goal with her next score (99-133=232).

Through 42 non-conference games as of January 7, WCHA-member teams are 30-8-4 against other Division 1 opponents for a .762 winning percentage. The WCHA is 6-4-4 vs. Hockey East, 6-2 vs. ECAC and 18-2 vs. College Hockey America.

Looking ahead to next week's schedule, there will again be a full slate of four WCHA series contested on Friday and Saturday, January 18-19. Ohio State will host St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth will entertain Bemidji State, Minnesota State hosts Minnesota and North Dakota welcomes Wisconsin.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association announced an all-new mobile website for the 2012-13 season that includes significant updates and upgrades to the previous platform.

The WCHA's men's and women's mobile site, which has been launched at the same URL as before ([www.wcha.com/mobile](http://www.wcha.com/mobile)) now includes more visually appealing pages, a better navigation system and improved mobile box scores among other changes. The pages can be viewed on a regular web browser, but are optimized for mobile browsers.

## WCHA WOMEN'S SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE FEATURES 28 PER TEAM; WISCONSIN IS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP; MINNESOTA IS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF & NCAA CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW LABAHN ARENA

Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), got underway on the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomed two-time defending league champion Wisconsin.

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, Wisconsin will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90

ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

Bemidji State sophomores Natasha Kostenko and Kristin Huber tallied goals :29 seconds apart to break a 115:56 scoreless drought against SCSU and a 107:40 goalless stretch for the team overall for the team dating back to Dec. 7 ... Bemidji State is now 7-5-2 since 2000 in its first game of a new calendar year ... The Beavers snapped a six-game, 44-day losing streak last Saturday with a 2-0 victory at SCSU ... Netminder Jessica Havel posted her first career shutout, recording 21 saves ... BSU and St. Cloud State played a scoreless first period for the third consecutive meeting ... Allie Duellman gave the Beavers their first goal in the first two periods in four games against the Huskies this season, snapping a personal 29-game goalless drought that dated back to Nov. 26, 2010 ... Bemidji State is 2-3-1 this season with Duellman in the lineup and is 4-5-1 on the road this season ... Emily Erickson ended a string of seven games without a goal later in the middle frame, giving BSU its fourth two-goal lead of the season ... By completing the 2-0 win, the Beavers held onto a multiple-goal lead for the first time all season, registered its first win of 2012-13 by more than one goal, and posted its second team shutout ... The Gophers finished the first half of the 2012-13 season by winning two games at Bemidji State, their 10th series sweep ... UM enters the second half of the season 20-0-0 overall and on a 28-game winning streak ... Minnesota went 37-2-2 during the 2012 calendar year ... Five current and three former Minnesota players were selected to participate in the 2012 U.S. Women's National Team Winter Camp in Blaine, Minn., Dec. 26-31 ... Freshmen Hannah Brandt, Lee Stecklein and Milica McMillen, Bozek, a senior, and junior Amanda Kessel represented the current Gopher squad, while Sarah Erickson, Gigi Marvin and Anne Schleper are Minnesota alums ... Kelly Terry and Sarah Davis spent holiday break participating on Canada's National Women's Under-22/Development Team for the Meco Cup,

Terry and Davis, who are both juniors, were part of a 22 player roster that will face senior women's national teams from Germany, Finland, Russia, Sweden and Switzerland ... Davis, who has nine points (4g, 5a) this year with Minnesota, made her second appearance at the Meco Cup after receiving bronze last winter ... Terry, who has 18 points (5g, 13a) this season with the Gophers, made her first trip as a U-22/Development player.

### MINNESOTA DULUTH

The Bulldogs (7-8-3, 6-7-3 WCHA, 19 points) return from a month-long hiatus and host St. Cloud State in the "Pink Game" Saturday and Sunday ... UMD swept the Huskies earlier this season in St. Cloud by two identical scores of 4-1 ... The Bulldogs will wear pink jerseys that will be up for auction during the game, with proceeds from the auction will support the Essentia Health Breast Health Program ... Fans can bid on the jerseys prior to midnight Jan. 11 at umdbulldogs.com and need not be present to win ... In addition, an on-site silent auction for the jerseys will take place during the game and a meet-and-greet with the Bulldogs will take place afterwards ... In 2011-12, the Bulldog men and women helped raise nearly \$25,000 in support of breast cancer ... Before the holiday break, UMD played No. 7 Boston University to two overtime ties, 2-2 and 0-0, on Dec. 8-9 ... On that Saturday, the Bulldogs trailed the Terriers for almost two periods of play before sophomore blueliner Brigette Lacquette ripped a shot from the left point to knot the game at 1-1 ... In doing so, the Burnsville, Minn. product moved into sole possession of third place all-time on the Minnesota State scoring chart ... Smith is the active single-season record holder with 1.18 points/game, two goals shy of the single-season record of 18, six power-play goals away from the career record, and five helpers shy of the MSU career assists mark ... Sophomore Kathleen Rogan used three second-period goals in last Wednesday's series finale to record her third career hat trick which set a program record for most hat tricks by a single player ... Junior Nicole Germaine garnered a career-high three points with two goals and an assist in the series opener before following that up with a career-high two assists in last Wednesday's 6-0 whitewash ... Fellow junior Kari Lundberg scored her first marker of the season and added an assist in the series to run her point scoring streak to four consecutive games ... Additionally, freshman Giulianna Pallotta tallied the first points of her collegiate career with two assists in last Wednesday's victory, while junior netminder Danielle Butters picked up her fourth shutout of the season – which ranks second nationally – to pull her one short of the MSU single-season record ... North Dakota (13-7-0, 8-6-0 WCHA, 24 points) returns to WCHA action Friday and Saturday at top-ranked and undefeated Minnesota ... UND was swept in Grand Forks by the Gophers earlier in the season by scores of 5-1 and 4-2 ... UND is the only team to have not been shutout in at least one game of a series by Minnesota this year ... North Dakota is the last team to have defeated Minnesota, coming last season on Feb. 17, 2012, and was the only team to defeat the Gophers twice during its national championship season ... UND's Meghan Dufault scored her first and second collegiate goals against Minnesota (Oct. 28) ... UND currently has eight players on multi-game scoring streaks with Michelle Karvinen leading the way at nine and Meghan Dufault following on a six-game point streak ... Senior Jocelyne Lamoureux had eight points last weekend and moved into sole position of sixth place in the NCAA record book for career scoring with 242 points (112-130=242) ... She also moved into third all-time by a WCHA player, trailing only Natalie Darwitz (102-144=246) and Hilary Knight (143-119=262) ... Monique Lamoureux moved into ninth all-time and fifth by a WCHA player and will collect her 100th collegiate goal with her next score (99-133=232) ... North Dakota opened its 2013 action last weekend with a series sweep at Lindenwood ... UND opened the

series with a 7-3 decision on Jan. 4 as Dufault had a historic night with a six-point game including four goals (tied the program record for goals in a game) and factored into all but one UND goal ... After falling behind in the first period, UND answered with three goals within a :90-second span to take a 3-1 lead into the first intermission ... UND dominated the second period as it out shot the Lions 27-7 (matching a program record for shots in a period) and Dufault tallied all three goals ... Jocelyne Lamoureux scored the UND's lone goal of the third period ... UND finished with a 60-22 advantage in shots, two shy of its all-time record set last season against the Lions ... UND jumped all over the Lions in the series finale on Jan. 5 with a four-goal first period that saw it for the second-consecutive game tie its single-period record with 27 shots on goal ... UND added three goals in the second period and one in the third period to match its single-game high of eight goals this season ... UND concluded the game 4-for-7 on the power-play while holding the Lions 0-for-7 ... Sophomore Josefina Jakobsen contributed one goal and three assists ... UND outshot the Lions 54-28 in the game and 114-50 in the series ... LU's netminder Nicole Hensley made 99 saves over the weekend ... North Dakota recruits had strong showings at the 2013 U18 World Championship as Canadian Halli Krzyzaniak was voted the tournament's best defensive player and was tied for the lead in points by a defenseman (2-5=7) while winning a gold medal and USA's Gracen Hirschy was eighth in points by a defenseman (0-3=3), Amy Menke finished third in scoring (4-5=9) and goaltender Lexi Shaw went 2-0-0 with two shutouts.
