WCHA Conference Season Opens October 4-5 as Wisconsin Hosts Minnesota State North Dakota, St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth Host Non-Conference Series While Minnesota Puts NCAA Record 49-Game Winning Streak on Line at Colgate; Ohio State Travels to Mercyhurst; WCHA Teams Go 3-0-1 in Exhibition Series against Japan National Team; Minnesota State Splits with Mercyhurst and Bemidji State Registers Win and Tie in First Non-Conference Series of the 2013-14 Season

Madison, Wis. – The women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association starts playing for keeps this weekend.

The 112-game conference schedule for 2013-14 gets underway during the upcoming weekend of Friday and Saturday, October 4-5, when Minnesota State visits Wisconsin for a pair of WCHA games at LaBahn Arena in Madison.

Three other league teams will host non-conference series this weekend with Minnesota Duluth facing the University of Connecticut at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, North Dakota hosting Lindenwood University at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks and St. Cloud State playing Quinnipiac University at the newly-renovated Herb Brooks National Hockey Center in St. Cloud while top-ranked Minnesota opens defense of its national title and places its NCAA-record 49-game winning streak

on the line at Colgate University. Ohio State plays its season opener at Mercyhurst on Saturday.

League play, which is comprised of 28 games per each of the WCHA's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – against each of other seven members), begins in earnest October 11-12 when Wisconsin plays at Minnesota and St. Cloud State visits Ohio State while North Dakota hosts Minnesota Duluth October 12-13. Bemidji State plays its first WCHA series of the new campaign on October 25-26 at home against Minnesota.

Minnesota State comes into the WCHA opener with momentum, having split two home games with No. 7-ranked Mercyhurst last weekend, September 27-28. The Mavericks (1-1-0) opened the 2013-14 season with a 4-2 home victory last Friday before losing Saturday's 3-2 decision. Sophomore Katie Johnson and junior Natalie Stoltz each scored their first career goal – with Johnson's being the game-winner – last Friday as four different Mavericks scored in the win.

Bemidji State (1-0-1) opened its season the road, scoring a win and a tie at Lindenwood. Kaitlyn Tougas had the game-winner last Friday in a 3-2 victory while freshman goalie Brittni Mowat made 27 saves in securing a 1-1 tie in the series finale.

Last week, WCHA teams went 3-0-1 in games against the Japanese national team, which is preparing to compete in the Winter Olympic Games in Sochi, Russia in February. Wisconsin scored a 3-0 victory over Team Japan on Monday, September 23 at LaBahn Arena in the exhibition opener. St. Cloud State skated to a 3-3 tie and won the shootout against Japan on September 25 in St. Cloud and the next night Minnesota blanked the Japanese team, 6-0, at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. Minnesota Duluth finished Japan's grueling schedule September 28 by taking a 6-2 decision.

That same weekend North Dakota smothered the Pursuit of Excellence Hockey Academy, 12-1, in an exhibition game at Grand Forks and Minnesota blanked British Columbia, 7-0, on September 27 in an exhibition at Minnesota. On September 28, the Toronto Aeros edged Ohio State, 2-1, in overtime in an exhibition game in Columbus while St. Cloud State christened its remodeled rink by shutting out British Columbia, 3-0. Minnesota State ended British Columbia's exhibition tour of the WCHA on September 30 by scoring a 4-1 victory.

In the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Women's National Poll Minnesota is a unanimous No. 1, North Dakota is No. 4, Wisconsin is No. 6 and Minnesota Duluth is No. 10.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday-Sunday, October 11-13, WCHA series will find St. Cloud State visiting Ohio State (Friday/Saturday), Minnesota hosting Wisconsin (Friday/Saturday) and North Dakota entertaining Minnesota Duluth (Saturday/Sunday). Outside the league, Bemidji State will host Robert Morris and Minnesota State travels to Lindenwood.

2013-14 WCHA Head Coaches' Preseason Poll

It's never a bad choice to pick a team that has won 49 games in a row. That is the message from the hockey coaches who have seen their league win the last 14 Division 1 women's national championships.

The University of Minnesota has swept to the NCAA Women's Frozen Four title in each of the last two seasons and, according to a preseason poll of the league's head coaches, the Golden Gophers are the pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association title again in 2013-14.

The Gophers, who also won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship the last two seasons and are the defending WCHA regular season champions, collected seven first place votes and 49 points in the poll of the league's eight head coaches. Last season Minnesota outscored their opponents 216 to 36 and became the first women's hockey team to ever post an unbeaten season, going 41-0-0. They have 49 straight victories dating back to a 2-1 (ot) loss to North Dakota on Feb. 17, 2012.

Wisconsin placed second in the coaches poll with 42 points



and one first place vote and North Dakota, another NCAA tournament qualifier last season, finished in third place in the poll with 36 votes. Ohio State, with 31 points, was selected to finish fourth, followed by Minnesota Duluth in fifth place and Minnesota State in sixth. Bemidji State and St. Cloud State tied for seventh place.

Minnesota sophomore forward Hannah Brandt, an All-WCHA First Team performer last season, was the coaches' pre-season choice for WCHA Player of the Year. She had five votes, while Wisconsin goaltender Alex Rigsby, the league's goaltending champion in 2011-12, received three votes. Minnesota freshman forward Dani Cameranesi is the head coaches' choice as pre-season WCHA Rookie of the Year, edging out Wisconsin forward Sarah Nurse in the balloting.

2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji Next March

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will take one of the showcases in women's hockey to northern Minnesota next season.

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be held at the Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minn. on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8, as announced by WCHA women's commissioner Sara Martin on June 18, 2013.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

"We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue," said Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. "The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players."

In the 13 years of NCAA-sponsored women's national championships, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams have won all 13 titles – Minnesota Duluth has five while Minnesota and Wisconsin each have four. Minnesota also won the first AWCHA Women's Division 1 title in 2000.

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA playoff championships and last two NCAA titles. The Gophers beat North Dakota, 2-0, to win the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF in Minneapolis.

All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series Feb. 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners from that weekend will play for the conference playoff championship with the semifinals on Friday, March 7. Friday's two winners will then play for the tournament championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division 1 Women's Ice Hockey Tournament.

Ticket information for the 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be announced at a later date.

Located on the south shore of Lake Bemidji, the Sanford Center provides the people of northern Minnesota with a signature sports and entertainment facility. The home of Bemidji State men's and women's hockey, the facility has enabled Bemidji to attract a variety of civic, convention and entertainment events and enhance its position as a regional center for northern Minnesota.

The Sanford Center encompasses approximately 185,000 square feet and include all amenities required to host concerts, family shows, trade shows and community events. It has also been designed as an elite Division 1 hockey facility, providing the BSU programs with one of the finest home venues in the nation.

The arena seats 4,373 around a 200'x85' ice sheet for hockey and can be reconfigured to accommodate approximately 6,000 guests for concerts and trade shows. Seating includes a club level and 26 luxury suites, and all areas of the arena have access to full-featured concessions areas. The building also includes convention facilities, featuring a 10,000-square-foot dividable ballroom and 4,000 square feet of meeting space. Bemidji State Beavers

The Beavers went 1-0-1 in their opening series against Lindenwood University ... BSU won the season opener last Friday, 3-2 and skated to a 1-1 tie last Saturday ... The Beavers' all-time record against Lindenwood is now 2-0-1 ... With the season opening 3-2 win over Lindenwood, BSU is 3-0-1 in the past four season openers ... Under head coach Steve Sertich, the Beavers are now 4-3-1 in season openers ... Sertich's non-conference record improves to 17-15-6 with the results from the opening weekend ... Six players got their first action for the green and white, including four freshmen ... One of those freshmen, Brittini Mowat got both of the starts in between the pipes against LU ... Mowat allowed three goals in two games and all of those were on a power play ... Another newcomer, Kristine Grenier got her first goal for the Beavers in their victory ... Grenier is a transfer from Mercyhurst ... Over the weekend, the Beavers got two goals from their defensemen ... Captain Allie Duellman and Ivan Bilic had the goals ... For both players, it was their third career goal ... Kaitlyn Tougas also scored a goal for the Beavers against Lindenwood ... The goal was Tougas' eighth of her career which makes her tied for the active leader for career goals for BSU ... After struggling last season on the power-play, the Beavers got off to a good start in their first series ... BSU scored on two of the four power-play attempts they had ... Bemidji State returns to action on October 11-12 as it opens its home schedule against Robert Morris University ... The Beavers and the Colonials have met six times before with Bemidji State winning five of the six meetings.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

The No. 1-ranked Golden Gopher women's hockey team enters the 2013-14 season on a NCAA-record 49-game winning streak ... Under the direction of head coach Brad Frost, Minnesota claimed back-to-back national titles in 2012 and 2013 ... Minnesota opens the regular season on the road at Colgate this week ... The Gophers are 2-0-0 all-time against the Raiders after sweeping them at Ridder Arena last season ... Colgate posted an 11-21-3 overall record in 2012-13, finishing eighth in the ECAC Hockey standings ... Senior forward Bethany Brausen has been named Minnesota's captain this season ... Fellow seniors Sarah Davis, Baylee Gillanders and Kelly Terry will serve as assistant captains ... Minnesota returns 14 players from last year's national championship team while losing six seniors and welcoming seven new freshmen ... The Gophers are without 2013 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Amanda Kessel and Lee Stecklein, who are currently training with the U.S. Women's National Team in hopes of competing for Team USA at the 2014 Olympic Games ... The Gophers return six of their top 10 scorers from last season, led by sophomore Hannah Brandt ... In her rookie season, Brandt was second on the team with 82 points (33g, 49a) ... Minnesota also returns sophomore Maryanne Menefee, who was fourth on the team with 38 points last season (16g, 22a) ... Rachael Bona (32 points), Terry (32 points), Rachel Ramsey (29 points) and Milica McMillen (26 points) all surpassed the 25-point mark during the 2012-13 season and return this year ... Rookie

forwards Dani Cameranesi, Kate Flug, Kate Schipper and Megan Wolfe will debut in Maroon and Gold this year ... Cameranesi, the WCHA Preseason Rookie of the Year, was named the 2013 Minnesota Ms. Hockey after leading Blake to the Minnesota Class A State championship with 95 points as a senior ... Flug was a three-time all-state honoree at Roseville Area High School while Schipper led Breck to three Minnesota Class A State Tournament ... Wolfe was the 2013 Pioneer Press Player of the Year after recording 71 points as a senior at Eagan High School ... Senior Gillanders, junior Rachel Ramsey and sophomore Milica McMillen will anchor the Gophers' defensive corps ... Freshmen defensemen Kelsey Cline and Paige Haley will contribute immediately, and sophomore Brook Garzone and junior Jordyn Burns will likely see action at the blue line ... The Gophers are young in goal, led by sophomore Amanda Leveille, who saw action in seven games with three starts during the 2012-13 season ... Junior Shyler Sletta also returns in net, and freshman Sidney Peters is a newcomer with U.S. Under-18 Team and USA Hockey Development Camp experience ... The trio will be tasked with filling the void left by the graduation of three-time All-American goaltender Noora Rätty ... Minnesota won two exhibition games in preparation for the 2013-14 regular season, defeating the Japan National Team, 6-0, and blanking the University of British Columbia, 7-0 ... Junior Meghan Lorence led the Gophers with five points (2g, 3a) in the two games ... Terry recorded four points (1g, 3a), while Bona (3g) and Brausen (3a) each added three points ... Leveille went 2-0-0 in net and made 21 saves in four periods of exhibition action, while Sletta stopped the lone shot she faced in two periods of play against British Columbia.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

The Bulldogs beat Team Japan 6-2 last Saturday at AMSOIL Arena in an exhibition skate, a first time meeting between UMD and Japan in program history ... Two players picked up four points during regulation, including senior forward Jamie Kenyon with a hat-trick and an assist and rookie center Ashleigh Brykaliuk, who turned in a goal and three assists in her first skate as a Bulldog ... UMD outshot Japan 50-16 ... Bulldog sophomore netminder Kayla Black made 14 stops and made two saves in the Olympic-style shootout ... The Bulldogs host the University of Connecticut at AMSOIL this weekend ... The two programs last clashed during the 2011-12 season, with UMD sweeping an away series by scores of 5-4 and 6-1 on Oct. 14-15, 2011 ... All-time UMD is 4-0 against the Huskies and 17-4-2 against Hockey East Association members ... Head coach Shannon Miller is sitting at an overall record entering her 15th season at UMD of 348-119-39, just two shy of the 350 win mark ... Miller is one of two active NCAA Division 1 coaches to have coached 500 contests with 504.

Minnesota State Mavericks

The Mavericks (1-1-0) opened the 2013-14 season with a 4-2 home victory over No. 7 Mercyhurst last Friday before losing Saturday's 3-2 decision ... Last Friday's win marked the largest margin of victory for MSU in the all-time series and snapped a three-game losing streak to MU ... Sophomore Katie Johnson and junior Natalie Stoltz each scored their first career goal – with Johnson's being the game-winner – last Friday as four different Mavericks found the back of the net in win ... Senior Nicole Germaine led the Purple and Gold with three points (1-2=3) and a +2 plus/minus rating on the weekend as nine different Mavericks tallied a point in the series, while junior Kathleen Rogan generated a team-best two goals ... Rogan (26-24=50) is tied for 13th in career scoring at Minnesota State, and senior Tracy McCann (26-26=52) sits in 12th after delivering a first assist on Johnson's game-winning goal last Friday ... Senior netminder Danielle Butters was outstanding between the pipes totaling 71 saves – including 39 in last Friday's victory and 18 on the penalty-kill for the weekend – while allowing a mere three even-strength goals ... Butters boasts a 2.53 goals-against average and .934 saves percentage through two contests this year ... The Minnesota State power-play finished 2-of-10 (20.0%) in the series as junior Shelby Moteyunas and Rogan picked up markers on the man-advantage with Rogan's of the four-on-three variety ... MSU also stifled the Laker power-play all weekend as MU finished 2-of-11 and was denied twice in the final six minutes of Minnesota State's 4-2 win in the season opener ... The Mavericks head to Madison for a Friday-Saturday WCHA series with the host Badgers ... Minnesota State went 0-3-1 against Wisconsin a year ago with three of the four contests decided by two goals or less ... McCann led all returning Mavericks with two points (1-1=2) in four games played against UW a year ago.

North Dakota

North Dakota starts off the regular season by hosting Lindenwood for a weekend series this Friday and Saturday ... Both games will have 7:07 pm start times at Ralph Engelstad Arena ... A total of 17 players recorded a point in the 12-1 exhibition win against the Pursuit of Excellence Hockey Academy on Sept. 27 ... The team spread the wealth as 10 players scored the 12 goals, as both Michelle Karvinen and Josefine Jakobsen scored twice ... Jakobsen led the team with two goals and four assists in the outing ... Goaltending duties were split amongst Shelby Amsley-Benzie, Lexie Shaw and Amanda Koep ... Amsley-Benzie made a total of five stops in the first period, while Shaw made four saves and conceded the lone goal on a breakaway in the second period ... Koep played the third and overtime periods, needing to only make one save in OT ... Koep also faced all of the shooters in a five-round shootout, stopping four, as UND won 2-1 ... Attendance at North Dakota women's hockey home games has ranked in the top five of the nation for the past three years ... In 2012-13 a total of 24,468 fans came to Ralph Engelstad Arena to watch UND, an average of 1,223 fans per game, the fourth-best average in the nation ... The 2013-14 roster features players

from seven different countries ... Six players hail from outside of North America: Andrea Dalen (Norway), Tanja Eisenschmid (Germany), Johanna Fallman (Sweden), Josefine Jakobsen (Denmark), Michelle Karvinen (Denmark), and Susanna Tapani (Finland) ... North Dakota will have a total of seven current and former players competing at the 2014 Winter Olympic Games in Sochi, Russia ... Team USA will feature recent grads Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux, while Team Germany will roster former player Susanne Fellner (2010) along with current sophomore defenseman Eisenschmid ... Senior forward Karvinen and freshman forward Tapani will play for Team Finland, while junior defenseman Fallman will skate for Team Sweden ...
