November 1-3 Weekend Features Full Slate of Conference Games in WCHA

No. 1 -Ranked Gophers Play Home and Home Set vs Minnesota State; Ohio State Visits Wisconsin; North Dakota Heads to Bemidji State; Minnesota Duluth Hosts St. Cloud State; UM, UMD, UND Post October 25-26 Conference Road Sweeps; North Dakota Off to Best Start in Program History at 6-1-1; WCHA Teams 15-4-2 (.762) in Non-Conference Play as Badgers Down Lindenwood Twice; Five WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest National Polls ... UM No. 1, UW No. 2, UND No. 4, UMD No. 9, OSU No. 10; 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Set for March 7-8 at Sanford Center in Bemidji

MADISON, Wis. – Most teams in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association have reached the quarter pole of the women's season, but the first weekend of November (1-3) will be the first time all eight clubs will be engaged in league play.

One of the top match ups has league-leading and top-rated Minnesota facing off against Minnesota State in a home-and-home series. Friday's game will be at Ridder Arena (3400) in Minneapolis at 7:07 pm CT while Saturday's contest will be held at All Season's Arena (750) in Mankato, at 3:07 pm CT. The Golden Gophers are the two-time defending national champions and are in the midst of a NCAA-record 57-game winning streak.

The other league series set for November 1-2 have North Dakota at Bemidji State and St. Cloud State at Minnesota Duluth. Face-offs at Sanford Center (4373) in Bemidji are at 2:07 pm CT both

days while puck drops at AMSOIL Arena (6600) in Duluth are at 6:07 pm CT both evenings. In Madison, Wisconsin entertains Ohio State in a November 2-3 series at LaBahn Arena (2273) with game times being 2:07 pm CT Saturday afternoon and 12:07 pm CT on Sunday.

League-leading Minnesota (8-0-0, 6-0-0 WCHA, 18 points) heads into November 1-3 weekend play with 18 points and took advantage of its two games at hand last weekend to move six points up on Wisconsin (6-2-0, 4-2-0 WCHA, 12 points), which is now in third place, two points behind second place North Dakota (6-1-1, 4-1-1 WCHA, 14 points). Ohio State (3-1-1, 2-1-1 WCHA, 7 points) was idle last weekend and is tied for fourth place with Minnesota Duluth (4-3-1, 2-3-1 WCHA, 7 points). St. Cloud State (0-6-2, 0-5-1-1 WCHA, 2 points) is in sixth place with two points, followed by Minnesota State (3-5-0, 0-4-0 WCHA, 0 points) and Bemidji State (3-4-1, 0-2-0, 0 points) tied for seventh.

Three WCHA teams recorded league sweeps on the road last weekend (October 25-26). No. 1 Minnesota extended its record winning streak at Bemidji State with 4-0 and 4-3 victories. Meghan Lorence had two goals and Amanda Leveille made 19 saves in her third shutout last Friday. Leveille is tied with Quinnipiac's Chelsea Laden and Amanda Makela of Mercyhurst for the national lead in whitewashes. Then last Saturday, Hannah Brandt's second goal of the game proved to be the game-winner in the one-goal game. The sweep dropped BSU's all-time record against Minnesota to 4-56-6.

North Dakota got a four-goal weekend from a veteran in its first league road series and notched 2-1 and 6-1 wins at St. Cloud State. Michelle Karvinen scored both UND goals in the weekend opener, with the game-winner breaking a tie with just over 5:00 left. Karvinen then scored twice more last Saturday when North Dakota broke open a 1-1 with four second-period goals.

In Mankato, host Minnesota State scored the first goal both days only to have Minnesota Duluth battle back to win twice and post their first WCHA wins since Feb. 10 of last season. The Bulldogs scored three power-play goals in last Friday's 6-2 victory and had two goals from both Jamie Kenyon and Zoe Hickel. Last Saturday, freshman blue liner Sydney Morin scored two goals, including one from the point with 2:56 remaining in regulation for the game-winner to defeat the Mavericks 3-1. Kenyon has her second multiple point game on the weekend with a goal and an assist. The Bulldogs are now 51-7-1 all-time against the Mavericks.

The eight teams in the WCHA have now gone a collective 15-4-2 in non-conference games so far this season after

Wisconsin swept visiting College Hockey America-member Lindenwood, 5-1 and 4-1, on October 25-26 in Madison. Courtney Burke and freshmen Sarah Nurse and Sydney McKibbin all had three-point games. Freshman defenseman Mellissa Channell scored in each game and forward Mikayla Johnson, the daughter of UW head coach Mark Johnson, scored her first collegiate goal.

Following this week's full round of league series, the upcoming weekend of Friday-Saturday, November 8-9, will find only four league teams in action. Those two conference series have St. Cloud State hosting Minnesota and Bemidji State traveling to Ohio State. Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State, North Dakota and Wisconsin will all be idle.

The weekend of November 15-17 will feature three Western Collegiate Hockey Association as Minnesota State travels to Bemidji State (Friday/Saturday), Ohio State welcomes Minnesota Duluth (Friday/Saturday) in two games that will be played at Schottenstein Center, and Minnesota entertains North Dakota (Saturday/Sunday). Outside the WCHA, Wisconsin and St. Cloud State will head to Vail, Colo., for a Friday-Saturday tournament against a pair of Hockey East Association-member teams at Dobson Ice Arena. On November 15, the Huskies will face-off against Boston University at 4:07 pm MT followed by Wisconsin vs Northeastern at 7:07 pm MT. On November 16, St. Cloud State takes on Northeastern at 2:07 pm MT while the Badgers skate against Boston University at 5:07 pm MT.

2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji Next March

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will take one of the showcases in women’s hockey to northern Minnesota next season.

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be held at the Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minn. on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8, as announced by WCHA women’s commissioner Sara Martin on June 18, 2013.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

“We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue,” said Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. “The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players.”

In the 13 years of NCAA-sponsored women’s national championships, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams have won all 13 titles – Minnesota Duluth has five while Minnesota and Wisconsin each have four. Minnesota also won the first ACHA Women’s Division 1 title in 2000.

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA playoff championships and last two NCAA titles. The Gophers beat North Dakota, 2-0, to win the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF in Minneapolis.

All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series Feb. 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners from that weekend will play for the conference playoff championship with the semifinals on Friday, March 7. Friday’s two winners will then play for the tournament championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league’s automatic berth into the NCAA Division 1 Women’s Ice Hockey Tournament.

Ticket information for the 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be announced at a later date.

Located on the south shore of Lake Bemidji, the Sanford Center provides the people of northern Minnesota with a signature sports and entertainment facility. The home of Bemidji State men’s and women’s hockey, the facility has enabled Bemidji to attract a variety of civic, convention and entertainment events and enhance its position as a regional center for northern Minnesota.

The Sanford Center encompasses approximately 185,000 square feet and include all amenities required to host concerts, family shows, trade shows and community events. It has also been designed as an elite Division 1 hockey facility, providing the BSU programs with one of the finest home venues in the nation.

The arena seats 4,373 around a 200’x85’ ice sheet for hockey and can be reconfigured to accommodate approximately 6,000 guests for concerts and trade shows. Seating includes a club level and 26 luxury suites, and all areas of the arena have access to full-featured concessions areas. The building also includes convention facilities, featuring a 10,000-square-foot dividable ballroom and 4,000 square feet of meeting space. Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (3-4-1, 0-2-0 WCHA, 0 points) dropped a pair of conference games last weekend at home against No. 1-ranked Minnesota by scores of 4-0 and 4-3. The sweep dropped BSU's all-time record against Minnesota to 4-56-6.
- The Beavers blocked 64 shots in the October 25-26 series and the Gophers blocked just 28. The defensive effort was spearheaded by senior captain Alex Ehlert, who led the team with nine blocks.
- Goaltender Brittni Mowat has been between the pipes for all eight of BSU's games this season. The freshman has a 3-4-1 record with .917 save percentage and a 2.12 goals-against average.
- Junior Alex Citrowske had her second two-assist game in last Saturday's contest against Minnesota. Citrowske leads the Beavers with four assists.
- Sophomore forward Hanna Moher has been the leading goal scorer for the Beavers with four. Three of those four goals have come in Bemidji State's last three contests.
- The Beavers have been one of the conference's stingiest defenses in the third period this season. BSU has allowed just two goals in the third period – second only to North Dakota.
- 15 different Bemidji State players have registered points in the first eight games this season, including three freshmen.
- This weekend the Beavers welcome No. 4-ranked North Dakota to the Sanford Center for another two-game WCHA series. UND has held the advantage against the Beavers as it has won nine of the prior 10 meetings between the two schools. BSU is 28-18-3 all-time against North Dakota. BSU head Coach Steve Sertich is 14-22-2 against North Dakota.



Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (8-0-0, 6-0-0 WCHA, 18 points) remained perfect on the season with a WCHA series sweep over Bemidji State last weekend. The Gophers topped the Beavers, 4-0 and 4-3, to extend their NCAA-record winning streak to 57 games.
- Thirteen Gophers recorded points against the Beavers on October 25-26, led by the line of sophomore Maryanne Menefee (2a), sophomore Hannah Brandt (2g, 1a) and junior Rachael Bona (1g, 2a). Junior Meghan Lorence (2g), junior Rachel Ramsey (1g, 1a) and sophomore Brook Garzone (2a) also had multiple points in the series.
- Sophomore goaltender Amanda Leveille improved to 8-0-0 on the season, combining for 37 saves in the two wins at BSU. She made 19 saves in last Friday's shutout win before stopping 18 shots in Saturday's victory.
- Last Friday, Minnesota recorded its third shutout of the season with a 4-0 win at Bemidji State. Lorence scored two goals, including the game-winner, and fellow junior Rachel Ramsey had a two-point game with one goal and one assist. Freshman Kate Schipper scored her first collegiate goal. Last Saturday's 4-3 win saw sophomore Brandt lead the Gophers with three points. She scored the game-winning goal with 7:19 remaining in the third period to break a 3-3 tie after scoring the first goal of the game and assisting Rachael Bona on Minnesota's third goal. Senior Kelly Terry tied the game at 2-2 late in the first period after BSU took a 2-1 lead. The Beavers again tied the game at 3-3 before Brandt scored the game-winner.
- Freshmen have combined for 16 points (4g, 12a) for UM in their first eight games led by Dani Cameranesi (3g, 3a) and Kelsey Cline (0g, 5a). Cameranesi is tied for third in WCHA freshmen scoring.
- Minnesota faces Minnesota State in a home-and-home WCHA series this coming weekend. Puck drop is set for 7:07 pm Friday at Ridder Arena and 3:07 pm Saturday at All Seasons Arena in Mankato. Minnesota is 61-3-3 all-time vs Minnesota State. The Gophers have won the last 16 meetings between the two teams, dating back to the 2009-10 season.
- Leveille ranks sixth in the nation and second in the WCHA among goalies with a .947 save percentage. She is fourth in the nation and second in the WCHA with a 1.38 goals-against average.
- Minnesota has held opponents scoreless on the power-play in the last five games. The Gophers have killed off their last 15 penalties, dating back to the second period vs Wisconsin (Oct. 11). The penalty-kill is third in the WCHA and eighth in the nation at 90% (27/ 30).
- The Gophers have the nation's second-best offense, averaging 4.12 goals per game. Minnesota has allowed 1.38 goals per game in eight games, good for fourth in the NCAA.
- Bona is tied for the national lead with 13 points this season and is tied for second in the NCAA with two game-winning goals. Brandt is tied for the national lead with nine assists. Ramsey is tied for 15th in the country among defensemen with 0.75 points per game.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The Bulldogs (4-3-1, 2-3-1 WCHA, 7 points) picked up the WCHA series sweep against Minnesota State over the October 25-26 weekend in Mankato by scores of 6-2 and 3-1. Those were UMD's first WCHA wins since Feb. 10 of last season (also against MSU).
- The Bulldogs scored three power-play goals in last Friday's 6-2 win at MSU and had two goals from both Jamie Kenyon and Zoe Hicckel. On Saturday, rookie blue liner Sidney Morin netted two goals, including one from the point with 2:56 remaining for the game-winner to defeat the Mavericks 3-1. Kenyon has her second multiple point game on the weekend with a goal and an assist. The Bulldogs are now 51-7-1 all-time against the Mavericks.
- UMD scored four power-play goals last weekend, with two coming from Kenyon. Kenyon leads the NCAA with four power-play goals in her first eight games and has helped push the Bulldogs into the No. 7 spot in the nation with an extra skater.
- Zoe Hicckel's shorthanded goal last Friday night was her second of the season and UMD's third.
- Ranked seventh in the NCAA, the Bulldogs' penalty-kill units sit at 90.2%, shutting down 37 of 41 opponent power-plays. UMD has been perfect on the penalty-kill six out of its eight games so far this season.
- With the nation's fifth most potent offense and third highest in the WCHA, the Bulldogs are averaging 3.88 goals a game, scoring 31 in their first eight skates.
- Junior winger Jenna McParland leads UMD with 12 points on five goals and seven assists and currently owns a three-game scoring streak with one goal and five assists.
- Kenyon, who ranks second in scoring (5g, 5a) along with rookie blueliner Lara Stalder (2g, 8a), also has recorded points in her last three outings, having netted three goals and two assists for five points. Stalder ranks as the third highest scoring rookie in the nation, having compiled 10 points in eight skates for a 1.25 ppg average, which also ranks her sixth in the nation in scoring among all defensemen. With eight assists in eight games, Stalder also sits seventh in the NCAA with a 1.00 assist per game average.
- The Bulldogs host St. Cloud State this weekend at AMSOIL Arena for Friday and Saturday night WCHA encounters. UMD is 48-9-3 all-time against the Huskies and own a 13-game unbeaten streak against SCSU after sweeping the season last year. The Bulldogs outscored the Huskies 20-5 in four games in 2012-13.



Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (3-5-0, 0-4-0 WCHA, 0 points) were unable to secure their first league points when they opened up the home portion of the WCHA schedule against Minnesota Duluth last weekend. A pair of seniors helped the Mavericks light the lamp first in both contests. However, three straight Bulldog PPGs proved insurmountable in last Friday's 6-2 defeat. Last Saturday's series finale was deadlocked at 1-1 with just under 3:00 remaining in regulation when UMD scored and went on to win, 3-1.
- MSU looked strong at even-strength and five-on-five for a majority of the October 25-26 weekend, outshooting the Bulldogs 31-27 in the series opener and three-of-six periods in the two-game set. MSU's power-play converted only one-of-10 (10%) opportunities and the penalty-kill surrendered four goals on eight UMD chances.
- Junior Kathleen Rogan registered a point in each contest vs UMD, stretching her point-scoring streak to four games with 3-4=7. Rogan scored her team-leading third PPG of the year last Friday and added a second assist on MSU's lone goal Saturday. The Vancouver, B.C., product paces the Mavericks with 5-4=9 and is tied for first in power-play points (6), tied for second in PPGs and GWGs (2), tied for fourth in the WCHA in goals, and tied for 10th in points. Rogan's PP and GWG totals tied her for third and second in the nation.
- Senior Kari Lundberg notched the first goal of the series vs UMD last Friday, extending her goal-scoring streak to three games, but she was blanked in the series finale. Lundberg's 3-3=6 this season tie her for second on the team in goals and place her fourth in points. She has already surpassed her goal total from last season.
- Senior Nicole Germaine tallied the lone goal for MSU last Saturday, her third goal of the year. The Mississauga, Ont., native's 3-4=7 to date ties her for second on the squad in goals and points.
- Senior Lauren Barnes has gone step-for-step with Germaine all season, owning 2-5=7 after assisting on MSU's only PPG last weekend. Her five assists are a team-high and she is tied for 11th in the WCHA in helpers and tied with Rogan for first in PP points (6).
- Junior Shelby Moteyunas paces Maverick blue-liners in assists and points as she recorded one helper last weekend bringing her season total to 1-4=5. Her four assists are a single-season career-high.
- Senior Danielle Scholzen earned her first point of the year with an assist on Lundberg's goal last Friday and was +2 last week, elevating her season total to +4, a team-best. Sophomore Katie Johnson was the only other Maverick to register a point vs UMD with an assist on Lundberg's October 25 goal. She has a career high 1-3=4 to date.
- Goaltender Danielle Butters stopped 21 shots vs UMD on Oct. 25 and a game-high 36 in the Oct. 26 finale while allowing just three even-strength goals. She has started all eight contests this season with a 2.72 GAA and .914 SV%.
- The Mavericks play the top-rated team in the country this week. MSU heads to Minnesota Friday at 7:07 pm, before the two teams return to Mankato for the series finale Saturday at 3:07 pm.

- No. 4 North Dakota (6-1-1, 4-1-1-1 WCHA, 14 points) plays at Bemidji State in a Nov. 1-2 weekend WCHA series. Both games are scheduled to start at 2:07 pm.
- North Dakota picked up its first conference sweep of the season, downing St. Cloud State by scores of 2-1 and 6-1 on Oct. 25-26.
- F Michelle Karvinen recorded a five-point weekend at SCSU, notching two goals in both games.
- Freshman goaltender Lexie Shaw made her first collegiate start in nets on Oct. 26, recording 22 saves in the 6-1 win.
- With a record of 6-1-1 (.812), North Dakota is enjoying its best start through eight games in program history. The previous best record through eight games was set in 2008-09 when UND started 5-2-1.
- North Dakota's D-corps has created seven goals and 14 assists this season. The 21 points is tied for the fourth-highest scoring defense in the nation. Additionally, the UND defense leads the nation with 112 shots on goal (14.00 per game).
- Halli Krzyzaniak is fourth among defensemen in the nation with 31 shots on goal.
- Gracen Hirschy leads the nation's defensemen, and freshmen, with a +10 plus/minus rating.
- UND's freshmen have accounted for 28 points (7g, 21a) this season. The class leads the nation in freshman point scoring (28), assists (21) and shots on goal (125). Susanna Tapani leads the UND class with three goals and eight assists. Her 11 points and eight assists is also second-most in the nation among freshmen.
- Senior captain Michelle Karvinen leads the WCHA and is tied for the most goals in the nation with seven.
- Junior forward Josefine Jakobsen leads the nation with three game-winning goals. Jakobsen has game-winners against Lindenwood (Oct. 4), Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 12) and St. Cloud State (Oct. 26).
- The 2013-14 North Dakota roster features players from seven different countries. Six players hail from outside of North America: Andrea Dalen (Norway), Tanja Eisenschmid (Germany), Johanna Fallman (Sweden), Jakobsen (Denmark), Karvinen (Denmark) and Tapani (Finland).
- North Dakota will have a total of seven current and former players competing at the 2014 Winter Olympic Games in Sochi, Russia. Team USA will feature recent grads Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux, while Team Germany will roster former player Susanne Fellner (2010) along with current sophomore defenseman Eisenschmid. Senior forward Karvinen and freshman forward Tapani will play for Team Finland, while junior defenseman Fallman will skate for Team Sweden.



Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The No. 10-ranked Buckeyes (3-1-1, 2-1-0-1 WCHA, 7 points) were idle last week after splitting a WCHA series at North Dakota and travel to Wisconsin this Saturday and Sunday.
- The Buckeyes went 1-3-0 last season against the Badgers and are 9-49-6 in the all-time series.
- Julia McKinnon and Taylor Kuehl each had two-goal performances last year against Wisconsin. Ally Tarr was the only Buckeye to score in Madison last season, scoring the lone Buckeye goals each day. Danielle Gagne also scored a goal against the Badgers last season in Columbus.
- In their last series, the Buckeyes fought back from an early three-goal deficit October 18 in Grand Forks to make it 3-2 after two periods but eventually fell 5-2. McKinnon scored her first goal of the season in the loss. Junior Sara Schmitt scored the other OSU goal. Both came while on the power-play. - The No. 2-ranked Badgers (6-2-0, 4-2-0 WCHA, 12 points) are riding a four-game winning streak entering this weekend's home WCHA series against Ohio State.
- After home sweeps against St. Cloud State and Lindenwood, the Badgers have outscored their opponents 19-3.
- UW's scoring defense has been stout this season, allowing an average of 1.00 goals per game, which is tied for the nation's lead.
- Wisconsin ranks second nationally in the penalty-kill at 93.3%.
- Senior goaltender Alex Rigsby ranks fourth in the country in save percentage with a .951 clip and third in average goals allowed at 1.17.
