The Record Streak is Over, But the WCHA Race Goes On

After Ending Top-Ranked Minnesota's Historic 62-Game Winning Streak, No. 4-Ranked North Dakota Welcomes No. 2 Wisconsin in Key WCHA Series; Ohio State Travels to Minnesota State and Minnesota Duluth Hosts Bemidji State November 22-23; Minnesota Plays Non-Conference Series at Yale; Minnesota, Wisconsin, North Dakota Run No. 1, No. 2 and No. 4 in Latest National Polls ... Minnesota Duluth Also Receives Votes; Badgers, Huskies Win Three of Four Games in Vail Tournament to Raise League's Non-Conference Mark to 18-5-2; NCAA Honors Former UND Star Lamoureux; 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF March 7-8 at Sanford Center in Bemidji

MADISON, Wis. – The streak is over. Now it is time to get on with seeing if Minnesota can hold off Wisconsin and North Dakota, the team which ended the longest winning streak in college hockey, and win another women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association title.

Minnesota's historic 62-game winning streak came to an end on Sunday, Nov. 17 as the host Gophers suffered a 3-2 conference loss to North Dakota in front of 2,435 fans at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. But the Gophers, the two-time defending national champions, still have a 10-point lead over UND and 15-point bulge on Wisconsin in the WCHA standings. However both North Dakota and the Badgers have games in hand on the Gophers, who play outside the WCHA this

Wisconsin (10-2-0, 6-2-0 WCHA) and North Dakota (9-2-1, 7-2-1-1 WCHA) go head-to-head this weekend in a key WCHA series in Grand Forks. Face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) are at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday evenings.

In other series league this Friday and Saturday, two teams coming off sweeps, Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth, meet in Duluth while Minnesota State hosts Ohio State in Mankato.

At AMSOIL Arena (6600) in Duluth, the host Bulldogs (6-4-2, 4-4-2-1 WCHA) and Beavers (6-6-2, 3-4-1-1 WCHA) will start up at 7:37 pm CT on Friday night and 6:07 pm CT on Saturday evening.

And at All Seasons Arena (750) in Mankato this weekend, the two-game series between the Mavericks (3-9-0, 0-8-0 WCHA) and visiting Buckeyes (3-6-2, 2-6-2 WCHA) will get underway at 7:07 pm CT Friday evening and 1:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon.

The Minnesota Gophers (13-1-0), still riding a 35-game road winning streak, travel to Hamden, Conn., for a two-game non-conference series at ECAC Hockey-member Yale (2-5-1) Saturday and Sunday. Puck drops are at 4:00 pm ET for game one and 12:00 noon ET for game two.

Idle from competition this week is St. Cloud State (2-9-3).

North Dakota, basking in the glow of ending Minnesota's record winning streak, is off to its best start in school history. UND's freshmen led the charge in last Sunday's 3-2 road victory over the Gophers, as Kayla Gardner, Gracen Hirschy and Susanna Tapani scored the team's three goals, while freshman netminder Lexie Shaw made a career-high 32 saves in the contest. Senior Sarah Davis and junior Rachael Bona each recorded two points for the Gophers, who allowed three first-period goals for the first time since surrendering three in the opening period against Minnesota Duluth in a 4-2 loss on Jan. 13, 2012.

The Gophers started and ended their streak against North Dakota as the historic run began with a 5-2 win over UND on Feb. 28, 2012. North Dakota was also the last team to defeat the Gophers as UND topped Minnesota 2-1 in overtime on Feb. 17, 2012.

In the series opening game last Saturday, Minnesota beat North Dakota 6-1 as freshman Megan Wolfe scored her first two

collegiate goals and sophomore Hannah Brandt recorded her 100th collegiate point in front of 1,915 fans at Ridder Arena.

In other action last weekend, Minnesota Duluth won a pair of conference road games at Columbus, Ohio. It was the Bulldogs' second WCHA sweep of the season and second sweep in a month on the road. Last Friday, UMD used three first period goals by Jamie Kenyon, Lara Stalder and Jenna McParland and beat Ohio State 3-2. The Buckeyes outshot the Bulldogs 31-22 in the game. That trend continued in the series finale last Saturday as sophomore goaltender Kayla Black turned away all 36 shots she faced to grab her sixth career shutout, helping Minnesota Duluth defeat the Buckeyes 2-0. The series was played in Value City Arena, the first time this season the Buckeyes have played in the facility that is home to the OSU men's hockey and basketball programs.

In Bemidji, Minn., Bemidji State swept Minnesota State, 4-1 and 3-2 on Nov. 15-16 as Hanna Moher had two goals in the series. The back-to-back victories marked the first WCHA sweep for the Beavers since Oct. 21-22, 2012 versus St. Cloud State. The Beavers have earned 10 conference points the past two weekends after not earning any in their first two weekends of WCHA action. With the win over MSU last Saturday, Bemidji

State now has the same number of wins overall (6) as it had all of last season.

The current WCHA standings show that league-leading Minnesota (13-1-0, 11-1-0 WCHA, 33 points) has a 10-point lead on second place North Dakota (9-2-1, 7-2-1-1 WCHA, 23 points). Wisconsin (10-2-0-0, 6-2-0 WCHA, 18 points) has won eight games in a row and is in third place and three points ahead of Minnesota Duluth (6-4-2, 4-4-2-1 WCHA, 15 points). Bemidji State (6-6-2, 3-4-1-1 WCHA, 11 points) has moved up to fifth place, three points ahead of Ohio State (3-6-2, 2-6-2 WCHA, 8 points). St. Cloud State (2-9-3, 1-7-2-1 WCHA, 6 points) is in seventh and Minnesota State (3-9-0, 0-8-0 WCHA, 0 points) is in eighth place.

Through 25 games this season, WCHA-member teams have gone 18-5-2 (.760) in non-conference games. Wisconsin and St. Cloud added to that total last weekend (Nov. 15-16) by going a combined 3-1 against Hockey East Association opponents in a tournament in Vail, Colo.

Wisconsin won twice, getting a late third-period rally to down Northeastern, 3-2, last Friday. Brittany Ammerman scored the tying goal and assisted on the game-winner by Jenny Ryan. The Badgers then blanked Boston University, 5-0, on Saturday as five different Wisconsin players scored and Alex Rigsby had 19 saves in her 25th collegiate shutout.

St. Cloud State, meanwhile, split their two non-conference games in Vail. Last Friday, Boston University received 28 saves from Kerrin Sperry and won a goaltending duel from the Huskies' Julie Friend (31 saves) in a 2-0 victory. But last Saturday, Julia Gilbert broke a 2-2 tie midway through the second period and gave St. Cloud State a 3-2 triumph over Northeastern, 3-2.

Looking ahead to next week's schedule of games, there is just one Western Collegiate Hockey Association series over the Thanksgiving holiday as Minnesota Duluth entertains Wisconsin on Friday (Nov. 29) and Saturday (Nov. 30). In non-conference match ups, Ohio State hosts Robert Morris of College Hockey America in a single game on Tuesday (Nov. 26), St. Cloud State welcomes Rensselaer of ECAC Hockey on Friday and Saturday, Ohio State heads east to take on Hockey East Association-member New Hampshire Saturday and Sunday, and Minnesota hosts ECAC Hockey-member Princeton, also on Saturday and Sunday.

Three conference clubs – Minnesota Duluth, Bemidji State and North Dakota – will play host to Team Russia in a series of exhibition games next week. The Bulldogs entertain Team Russia on both Nov. 26 and Dec. 2, the Beavers host Team Russia on Nov. 27, and North Dakota hosts Team Russia on both Nov. 29 and Nov. 30.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll issued Nov. 18, Minnesota remains No. 1, Wisconsin is at No. 2 and North Dakota is at No. 4. Also receiving votes from the WCHA was Minnesota Duluth.

And in the Nov. 19 USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is No. 1, Wisconsin is No. 2, and North Dakota is No. 4. Minnesota Duluth also received votes.

Minnesota's NCAA Div. 1 Hockey Record Winning Streak Ends at a Phenomenal 62 Games

Coach Brad Frost's Minnesota Golden Gophers, after extending their NCAA Div. 1 hockey record winning streak to 62 games with a 6-1 victory over visiting North Dakota last Saturday (Nov. 16), fell by a single goal – 3-2 – to UND last Sunday (Nov. 17).

The record winning streak, which included back-to-back NCAA Women's Frozen Four championships, dated back to Feb. 17, 2012, when the Gophers were upended 2-1 in overtime at home against North Dakota. The streak included the last eight games of 2011-12, all 41 games in 2012-13 and 13 more to launch the 2013-14 campaign. The Gophers' also compiled a record 39-game WCHA winning streak before being upended last Sunday, with their last previous conference defeat occurring Feb. 19, 2011 when they fell 5-3 at UND in the regular season finale.

"For everybody who has been a part of it, it's been a really special thing," said Frost of the winning streak. "I think they helped grow the game of women's hockey here in Minnesota and nation-wide, and that's a huge testament to them. There was a lot of pressure, a lot of media attention and a lot of excitement every time we stepped on the ice, which was great, but it's over, and we're happy to have been a part of it."

Minnesota's 62-game winning streak topped the previous NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey winning streak of 21 games set by Harvard and the Div. 1 women's unbeaten streak of 32 games set twice by Wisconsin. It also topped the NCAA Div. 1 men's hockey winning streak of 30 games held jointly by Rensselaer and Cornell and men's hockey unbeaten streak of 38 straight games set by Rensselaer.

NCAA Gives Top Honor to Former North Dakota Star Jocelyne Lamoreux

Former University of North Dakota forward Jocelyne Lamoreux was recognized by the NCAA with one of its highest honors, being named a recipient of the NCAA Today's Top 10 Award.

The NCAA Today's Top 10 Award recognizes student-athletes who completed their athletics eligibility during the 2012-13 academic year for their success on the fields and courts, in the classroom, and in the community.

The NCAA Honors Committee selects the honorees. The committee is composed of athletics administrators at member



institutions and nationally distinguished citizens who are former student-athletes.

Lamoureux and the other nine recipients will be recognized at the Honors Celebration on Jan. 17 during the NCAA Convention in San Diego.

Lamoureux is the second UND student-athlete to receive the prestigious award. Former hockey and softball standout Casie Hanson received the award in 2011 when it was known as the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award. The NCAA Honors Committee expanded the award to honor 10 student-athletes to recognize the increased number of student-athletes, sports and championship opportunities.

Lamoureux graduated following the 2012-13 as the leading scorer in the history of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association with 285 points in 149 career games. The Grand Forks, N.D. native earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was a Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award finalist after ranking third in the national scoring race with 81 points (35g, 46a) in 39 games.

In the classroom, she earned both a bachelor's degree in physical education, exercise science and wellness and master's degree in kinesiology while at UND and was a two-time Academic All-American and two-time WCHA Most Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year. Last May, Lamoureux received a NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

Lamoureux will play for the United States at the 2014 Winter Olympic Games in Sochi, Russia, in February.

2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji March 7-8

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the playoff championship for the women's league, will be held at Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minnesota on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

"We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue," said commissioner Sara Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. "The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players."

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championships as well as the last two NCAA Frozen Four titles. All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series February 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners will then play for the conference playoff championship at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, with two semifinals on Friday, March 7 and the championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Women's Hockey Tournament.

WCHA Weekly Team Notebooks



Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (6-6-2, 3-4-1-1 WCHA, 11 points) swept Minnesota State over the weekend. The sweep was the first WCHA sweep for the Beavers since Oct. 21-22, 2012 versus St. Cloud State.
- Bemidji State now holds the edge over Minnesota State in the all-time series 26-24-10.
- The Beavers have earned ten conference points the past two weekends after not earning any in their first two weeks of WCHA action.
- With the win last Saturday over Minnesota State, Bemidji State now has the same number of wins overall (6) as it had all of last season.
- Sophomore Hanna Moher continues to lead the Bemidji State offense as she posted two goals in the Nov. 15-16 WCHA sweep over Minnesota State. Moher leads the Beavers in both goals (7) and points (9). Moher ranks fourth in the WCHA in goals.
- Bemidji State goaltender Brittni Mowat started both games against Minnesota State and played every minute of the two victories. Mowat is now 6-5-2 overall with a 2.19 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage in 14 games played.
- BSU's sophomore class has accounted for the bulk of the Beavers' scoring this season. BSU's eight second-year players have posted 16 goals (50%) and 21 assists (44%) for 37 points, or 46% of the team's 80 points (32g, 48a).
- BSU has now scored a power-play goal in five straight games. Bemidji State ranks sixth nationally with a 20.5% power-play rate.
- Bemidji State ranks second in the conference in penalty-killing with 49 kills in 56 opportunities (87.5%).
- This weekend, the Beavers travel to University of Minnesota Duluth for a two-game conference set against the Bulldogs. The Beavers are 3-56-2 in the all-time series versus the Bulldogs. All three of Bemidji State's victories in the series have been in the last 12 meetings. Bemidji State has beaten the Bulldogs just once in Duluth with that lone victory coming Nov. 20, 2011 by a 4-3 score.
- The Beavers rank fourth nationally in combined special teams at 58%.



Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (13-1-0, 11-1-0 WCHA, 33 points) split with No. 4 North Dakota last weekend, picking up a 6-1 win before dropping a 3-2 decision at home. With the loss, the Gophers' NCAA-record winning streak came to an end at 62 consecutive victories.
- Minnesota's streak began and ended with North Dakota, as the historic run started with a 5-2 win over UND on Feb. 28, 2012 and the final win was Saturday's 6-1 victory. Losses to North Dakota bookend the streak (2-1 OT loss on Feb. 17, 2012 and 3-2 loss on Nov. 17, 2013). UM's 62-game run bested the previous NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey winning streak (21, Harvard) and unbeaten streak (32, Wisconsin, twice), and surpassed the Div. 1 men's hockey winning streak (30, RPI and Cornell) and unbeaten streak (38, RPI).
- Sarah Davis (1g, 3a) and Rachael Bona (4a) led the Gophers with four points each against North Dakota last weekend. Hannah Brandt had three points (1g, 2a), and Rachel Ramsey and Megan Wolfe each recorded two goals in the series. Last Saturday, the Gophers defeated UND 6-1, led by Wolfe's two-goal effort, including the game-winner, for her first two collegiate tallies. Brandt had three points (1g, 2a), which pushed her over 100 career points (38g, 64a), and Amanda Leveille made 34 saves in the win. On Sunday, Minnesota could not overcome a three-goal deficit and fell 3-2. Trailing 3-0 after one, the Gophers rallied with two PPGs by Ramsey and Davis in the second period, but the comeback fell short. Leveille had 21 saves in her first loss as a Gopher.
- The Gophers are still riding a 35-game road winning streak, which began Jan. 14, 2012. Minnesota will put that streak on the line in New Haven, Conn., for a non-conference series at Yale this weekend. UM's last non-conference loss was a 4-1 defeat at Boston College in a 2011 NCAA regional. The Gophers and Bulldogs meet for the first time in nearly six years. Minnesota is 1-0-0 all-time vs Yale, winning the lone meeting 2-1 on the road on Jan. 18, 1998.
- Through 14 games, Bona (7g, 13a) and Brandt (5g, 15a) lead the Gophers with 20 points each. The duo is tied for ninth in the nation with 1.43 points per game. Kelly Terry is tied for the WCHA lead with nine goals. Leveille is second in the league with a 1.43 goals-against average (sixth in the nation) and a .942 save percentage (fifth in the nation). She is tied for third in the nation with four shutouts.
- The Gophers lead the nation with a 2.86 scoring margin. UM has the nation's second-best offense, averaging 4.29 goals per game, and the fifth-best defense, allowing 1.43 goals per game.
- Minnesota's power-play is the WCHA's best, converting on 16 of 53 attempts (30.2%).
- UM has the second-highest scoring defensive corps in the nation with 38 points (12g, 26a), led by Ramsey's 15 points (6g, 9a). She is sixth in the nation among defensemen with 1.07 points per game.
- Brad Frost is one win shy of 200 career wins as Minnesota's head coach. Last Saturday's win over UND moved his career record to 199-36-16.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The Bulldogs (6-4-2, 4-4-2-1 WCHA, 15 points) swept Ohio State in Columbus over the weekend, notching their second WCHA sweep of the season and second sweep in a month on the road.
- Last Friday afternoon UMD scored three first period goals (Jamie Kenyon, Lara Stalder and Jenna McParland), enough to keep the Buckeyes at bay, 3-2. OSU outshot UMD 31-22 in the game, including 12-8 in the opening stanza, but the Bulldogs outshot OSU 7-6 in the third period. In the second game, sophomore goaltender Kayla Black turned away all 36 shots she faced to grab her sixth career shutout, helping UMD defeat the Buckeyes 2-0. Two rookies held down the scoring for UMD, including Ashleigh Brykaliuk in the first period and Bailey Wright in the second stanza. The Buckeyes outshot the Bulldogs 14-6 in the second period and 15-8 in the third period for a shot advantage of 36-25 on the game.
- With a goal and two assists in the series sweep at OSU, senior winger Kenyon has now notched a point in her last three games (1g, 3a).
- Blueliner Tea Villila had three assists against OSU, while rookie forward Wright figured in both UMD scores last Saturday with a goal and an assist.
- McParland and Kenyon have 14 points each to top the Bulldogs in scoring, with McParland at seven goals and seven assists and Kenyon with six goals and eight assists. Stalder ranks third with 13 points on four goals and nine assists. Both Kenyon and McParland have two game-winning goals, good for fourth in the NCAA, while Kenyon's four PPGs continues to lead the nation in extra skater goals. Stalder ranks fourth among defensemen and rookies in the NCAA in scoring with a 1.08 points per game average. Currently Stalder is also the highest scoring defenseman in the WCHA with her 13 points.
- As a team, UMD ranks eighth in the country with a 3.17 goals per game average and fifth in penalty minutes with 12.8 per game.
- Minnesota Duluth next hosts WCHA-rival Bemidji State this weekend at AMSOIL Arena on Friday and Saturday night. The Bulldogs are 56-3-2 all-time against Bemidji State and went 4-0 last season. UMD owns more wins against the Beavers than any other team in both the WCHA and NCAA.



Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (3-9-0, 0-8-0 WCHA) are still searching for their first point in league play after suffering two losses to host Bemidji State last weekend at Sanford Center.
- The Mavericks and Beavers were deadlocked at 1-1 after one period in the series opener, before BSU scored three unanswered goals in the final two periods to claim a 4-1 victory. Last Saturday's series finale saw MSU open a 1-0 lead after 20:00, only to have the Beavers rally for three second-period goals to win 3-2.
- MSU's special teams units continued their struggle as of late. The power-play mustered one goal in 10 opportunities at BSU while the penalty-kill denied BSU on four-of-six chances on the weekend (66.7%). The Maverick power-play ranks 13th in the country while converting at an 18.5% (9/49) rate.
- Senior goaltender Danielle Butters continues to pile up the saves and minutes in nets for MSU. Butters registered 37 saves last Friday at BSU and 59 for the weekend as she remains second in the nation in saves (370) and ninth in minutes played (702:12) this season.
- Senior Tracy McCann posted her second multiple-point game of the season with a primary assist and goal in last Saturday's 3-2 loss at BSU. McCann stands fifth on the team in points, fourth in assists, and third in goals with 3-4=7 to date. She is also tied with junior Kathleen Rogan for 12th in career scoring at MSU with 29-29=58 in her four years. Rogan, who has produced 30-28=58, continues to pace the Purple and Gold in goals and points after netting her fourth power-play marker in last weekend's series finale. Rogan has generated 6-4=10 while tying for first nationally in power-play goals and fourth in game-winning goals (2). Rogan is tied with senior Lauren Barnes for the league-lead in power-play points as the duo have collected 4-3=7 and 2-5=7, respectively.
- Barnes' second assist on Rogan's power-play marker last weekend gives her a team-best six on the season in addition to tying for second on the team in points with 2-6=8.
- Senior captain Kari Lundberg also appears to be finding her groove offensively. Lundberg scored the lone MSU goal last Friday – unassisted – and added an assist on Saturday.
- Minnesota State hopes to feature three Olympians in the upcoming 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. Alums Emilia Andersson and Nina Tikkinen are both strong candidates to make the Swedish and Finnish National Teams, respectively, while freshman Anna Fiegert hopes to make the German National Team.
- The Mavericks return to All Seasons Arena this weekend to challenge Ohio State Friday night and Saturday afternoon. The Purple and Gold went 0-2-2 vs OSU last season, going 0-1-1 both in Mankato and at Columbus. One of the games at All Seasons Arena was a 0-0 draw, with Butters stopping a then-career-high 45 saves. MSU dropped both shootouts in the pair of ties. MSU sits 9-47-6 all-time against OSU.

University of North Dakota

- After a month away from home, No. 4 North Dakota (9-2-1, 7-2-1-1 WCHA, 23 points) returns to Ralph Engelstad Arena, hosting No. 2 Wisconsin for a league series, Nov. 22-23. Both games will begin at 7:07 pm.
- After losing to Minnesota 10-consecutive times, North Dakota finally became the team to end No. 1 Minnesota's record winning streak at 62 games. After a 6-1 defeat last Saturday, North Dakota rebounded to use a three-goal first period for a 3-2 win against the Gophers on Sunday. Freshmen led the charge for UND on Sunday, as Kayla Gardner, Gracen Hirschy and Susanna Tapani scored goals while freshman netminder Lexie Shaw made a career-high 32 saves. Freshman defenseman Halli Krzyzaniak assisted on Tapani's game-winner as well.
- North Dakota was the bookend for Minnesota's record 62-game winning streak. UND was the first and last team to have beaten the Gophers before and after the streak, along with being the first and last team that the Gophers beat during the streak. UND beat the Gophers on Feb. 17, 2012, before losing to them the next night as Minnesota started the streak. 61 games later, UND lost, 6-1, on Nov. 16, 2013, before beating the Gophers the next night, 3-1.
- With a record of 9-2-1 (.792), North Dakota is enjoying its best start through 12 games in program history. The previous record through 12 games was set in 2008-09 and 2011-12 when UND started 7-4-1.
- Lexie Shaw has recorded a perfect 3-0-0 record in her three starts in nets this season. Her biggest win of the year came when she made a career-high 32 saves against No. 1 Minnesota on Nov. 17, to end the Gophers' historic winning streak. While having only played 29% of the team's minutes in net, not meeting the minimum 33% requirement for statistical ranking, her .952 save percentage would rank second in the nation and her 1.12 goals-against average would rank third.
- 19-of-20 skaters that have seen action for UND this season have recorded points. Additionally, 17 skaters have at least one goal.
- North Dakota's D-corps has created 12 goals and 21 assists. The 33 points is fourth in the nation for most points by a team's defense. Additionally, the UND defense leads the nation in goals (12) and is third in shots on goal with 138 (11.5 per game). Krzyzaniak is 15th among D1 defensemen with 34 shots on goal. Hirschy is third among D1 defensemen with a +13 plus/minus rating. Sam LaShomb is eighth with a +11 rating while Krzyzaniak is ninth (tie) at +10.
- UND freshmen have accounted for 40 points (13g, 27a) already this season. They lead the nation in freshman point scoring, assists and power-play points (13). Tapani leads the class with 4-9=13 and her 13 points ranks second in the nation among freshmen. Hirschy leads the nation's freshmen with a +13 plus/minus rating. Krzyzaniak is tied for fourth with a +10 rating.



Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The Buckeyes (3-6-2, 2-6-2-1 WCHA, 8 points) travel to Mankato for a conference series with Minnesota State Nov. 22-23.
- The Buckeyes were swept in a series against Minnesota Duluth at home last weekend (Nov. 15-16). The series was played in Value City Arena, the first time this season the Buckeyes have played in the facility that is home to OSU men's hockey and basketball.
- Freshman Katie Matheny scored her first career goal in the 3-2 loss last Friday.
- Junior Sara Schmitt tied her sister Kari Schmitt for the team lead in goals scored as she found the back of the net in last Friday's contest. Kari had an assist on the play along with Julia McKinnon. Sara and Kari are 1-2 on the team in points with Sara having 11 and Kari 10.
- Sara Schmitt still leads the WCHA in points-per-game for defensemen at 1.10 and also in total power-play points-per-game at 0.60.
- Redshirt senior goaltender Chelsea Knapp started last Friday and stopped 19 shots for OSU while senior Lisa Steffes started Saturday, making 23 saves.
- Ohio State outshot the visiting Bulldogs each day and had a combined 67-47 shots on goal advantage in the series. OSU has outshot its opponent in the last four games, two against Bemidji State and two against UMD, by a combined 52 shots, but was unable to pick up a victory going just 0-3-1.
- The Buckeyes' penalty-kill was a perfect 8-of-8 in the Nov. 15-16 series with Minnesota Duluth.
- The Buckeyes went 2-0-2 versus Minnesota State last season. Knapp had one of her three shutouts last season at Minnesota State in a 0-0 tie. Ally Tarr scored three goals in games against MSU last season while Julia McKinnon, Taylor Kuehl and Melani Moylan all scored on the Mavericks as well. OSU holds a 49-9-6 all-time record when facing the Mavericks.

- Last weekend SCSU headed to the Rockies for the Vail Tournament on Nov. 15-16. St. Cloud started the weekend off last Friday against #8 Boston University, as they were shutout 2-0. On Saturday the Huskies topped Northeastern with a final score of 3-2.
- In the tourney opener in Vail, St. Cloud State and BU kept the first period scoreless until the 6:04 mark as the Terriers gained the first lead of the game 1-0 and then extended their lead 2-0 in the second period. Huskies' goaltender Julie Friend recorded 31 saves and saw her record move to 1-6-2 on the season. SCSU and BU both went 0-4 on the power-play.
- Against Northeastern last Saturday in Vail, St. Cloud got on the board early with a power-play goal by Cari Coen at the 4:16 mark of the first period. Charting the assists on the goal were Audrey Hanmer and Amy Olson. With the game tied 1-1, the Huskies were back on the power-play later in the period and found a way to capitalize as Skye Kelly fired a shot from the left faceoff circle taking a 2-1 lead at the 14:29 mark. This was Kelly's first goal of the season. Assisting on the goal was Michelle Burke and Abby Ness. After Northeastern tied the game, St. Cloud State senior Julia Gilbert found the back of the net shooting right between the face-off circles off a pass from Michelle Burke at the 11:46 mark of the second. The Huskies held Northeastern to only five shots on goal in the third period to earn a 3-2 victory. St. Cloud sophomore goalie Katie Fitzgerald recorded 25 saves for her first victory of the season. Fitzgerald has a record of 1-3-1. SCSU ended the game going two-for-two on the power-play and outshot Northeastern, 29-27.



Badgers University Wisconsin

- The No. 2 Badgers (10-2-0-0, 6-2-0 WCHA, 18 points) travel to Grand Forks, N.D., to take on No. 4 North Dakota this weekend. UW and UND face-off on Friday at 7:07 pm and on Saturday at 7:07 pm.
- The Badgers enter the weekend on an eight-game winning streak. During the streak, UW has outscored its opponents 34-8 and has outshot its opponents 341-170. Wisconsin has beaten three ranked opponents during the streak, and has two shutouts.
- North Dakota and Wisconsin rank first and second, respectively, in shots on goal per game. UND is averaging 39.42 shots per contest, while UW averages 39.00 shots per game.
- Wisconsin won both its games in Vail, Colo., against non-conference opponents Nov. 15-16. The Badgers earned a 3-2 win against Northeastern last Friday as freshman Jenny Ryan scored her first goal with less than three minutes remaining to win the game. Wisconsin then blanked No. 8 Boston University, 5-0, last Saturday as goaltender Alex Rigsby earned her 90th career win and 25th career shutout. Eight different players scored for Wisconsin during the tournament in Vail.
- The Wisconsin defense has been stout, allowing an average of 1.08 goals per game, which is the second-best mark in the nation.
- Wisconsin also ranks second in scoring margin, outscoring its opponents by an average of 2.50 goals per game.
