MADISON, Wis. – While many of us take time to eat turkey, go shopping or travel on this holiday week, six Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's teams take to the ice for a busy week of play.

5-5-2-1 WCHA). Face-offs at AMSOIL Arena (6600) between the No. 2-ranked Badgers and Bulldogs are at 6:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday evenings. The Bulldogs are 29-28-10 all-time against the Badgers and split four games against UW last season.

There is a lot more action outside the conference, however, beginning Tuesday (November 26) night when Ohio State (3-8-2) hosts No. 10-ranked Robert Morris (12-3-1) of College Hockey America at 7:07 pm ET at the OSU Ice Rink (800) and Minnesota Duluth starts a busy week with an home exhibition game at 6:07 pm CT against Team Russia.

On Wednesday, the Russians, who are preparing to play in the Winter Olympics Games in Sochi, Russia in February, travel to Bemidji to face Bemidji State in an exhibition at Sanford Center (4373) at 7:07 pm CT. Then on Friday and Saturday, Team Russia faces North Dakota in a two-game series at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks, with puck drops both days at 2:07 pm CT. Team Russia then wraps up their collegiate tour by facing UMD again on Monday, December 2 at 6:07 pm CT in Duluth.

There are three non-conference series for WCHA-member teams this holiday weekend. On Friday and Saturday, St. Cloud State hosts ECAC Hockey-member Rensselaer (4-8-1) at Herb Brooks National Hockey Center (5371), with both game times at 3:07 pm CT. Then on Saturday and Sunday, Ohio State visits New Hampshire and top-ranked Minnesota plays host to Princeton.

The visiting Buckeyes will engage the UNH Wildcats (6-7-2) at 2:00 pm ET on November 30 and 1:00 pm ET on December 1. The host Gophers (15-1-0) will skate against Princeton (5-4-1) of ECAC Hockey at Ridder Arena (3400) at 4:07 pm CT on Saturday and 1:07 pm CT on Sunday.

Last weekend (November 22-23), in a collision of two of the top four teams in the country, Wisconsin and North Dakota played a tight-checking series in Grand Forks. The Badgers took five of six points behind the goaltending of Alex Rigsby and a stout defense. They now have a 10-game unbeaten streak, including four wins against ranked opponents during the streak, and three shutouts. This marks Wisconsin's longest unbeaten streak since the Badgers won 14 straight during the 2011-12 season.

Rigsby saved 54 of the 55 shots she faced from the North Dakota offense, which came into the series ranked third in the nation in scoring. In last Friday's scoreless tie, Rigsby made 34 saves and sent the game into a shootout, where she saved all three shots she faced before junior Blayre Turnbull scored the shootout winner in the third round. The shutout was Rigsby's

26th career whitewash, and her third of the 2013-14 season. In last Saturday's 3-1 triumph over UND, Rigsby made 20 saves. The only goal she allowed on Saturday was on an UND power-play, which ended a stretch of 167:14 of shutout hockey. With Saturday's win, Rigsby is now tied for the program lead with 91 career victories. Rigsby also leads the nation in save percentage (.959) and goals-against average (1.00).

In other WCHA action last weekend, Minnesota State got its first conference victories by sweeping Ohio State in Mankato. The sweep was the Mavericks' first over the Buckeyes since Nov. 12-13, 2010, and its first at home since Nov. 9-10, 2007. MSU claimed a 4-1 victory in last Friday's series opener behind three third-period goals from three different seniors in Kelsie Scott, Kari Lundberg, and Nicole Germaine. Saturday's series finale saw Ohio State jump out to a 1-0 first-period lead, before the Mavericks responded with a single goal in the second and third periods to secure the sweep. Mavericks' goaltender Danielle Butters had double digit saves in all six periods of the series and had 79 saves in the two wins.

In Duluth on November 22-23, host Minnesota Duluth split a two-game WCHA set with Bemidji State. After losing 3-0 Friday, Bemidji State bounced back with a 1-0 victory over the Bulldogs on Saturday, just the fourth ever for the Beavers vs UMD. In game one of the series, UMD center Ashleigh Brykaliuk scored the game-winner on a first period power-play at 15:13, right winger Zoe Hickel had two assists, and goaltender Kayla Black earned her second straight shutout with 17 stops. In game two, BSU defenseman Ivana Bilic's power-play goal at 19:45 of the third period broke up the scoreless tie while goaltender Brittni Mowat earned her first shutout in conference action and second overall, stopping 38 shots and snapping UMD's four-game unbeaten streak. The Beavers have now earned conference



points in four straight weekends, the first time they have done that since the 2011-12 season, and have surpassed their win total from last season with seven.

The current league standings show that defending champion Minnesota (15-1-0, 11-1-0-0 WCHA, 33 points) continues to lead second place North Dakota (9-3-2, 7-3-2-1 WCHA, 24 points) by nine points, but Wisconsin (11-2-1, 7-2-1-1 WCHA, 23 points) has two games in hand on both UM and UND. The Badgers are only one point out of second place. Minnesota Duluth (7-5-2, 5-5-2-1 WCHA, 18 points) is in fourth place, four points ahead of Bemidji State (7-7-2, 4-5-1-1 WCHA, 14 points). Ohio State (3-8-2, 2-8-2-0 WCHA, 8 points) stands alone in sixth place while Minnesota State (5-9-0, 2-8-0-0 WCHA, 6 points) and St. Cloud State (2-9-3, 1-7-2-1 WCHA, 6 points) are tied for seventh.

Outside the WCHA last weekend, defending national champion and top-ranked Minnesota won twice at ECAC Hockey-member Yale to boost the WCHA's non-conference record to 20-5-2 for a .778 winning percentage. In the series opener last Saturday, the Gophers, with Hannah Brandt netting the game-winner at 16:18 of the first period, took a 5-1 milestone victory. It was Coach Brad Frost's 200th win, occurring at the halfway point of his seventh season, and making him the quickest to reach that milestone. In the series finale on Sunday, the line of left wing Rachael Bona, center Hannah Brandt, and right wing Meghan Lorence each scored a goal and each had two assists as Minnesota took a 4-1 decision. With the two wins at Yale, Minnesota extended its road winning streak to 37 games, a stretch that dates back to Jan. 14, 2014.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday-Sunday, December 6-8, there are three WCHA series on the docket. On Friday and Saturday, St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota State. On Friday and Sunday, Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State. And on Saturday and Sunday, Minnesota plays at Ohio State. Two league teams – Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota – will head east for non-conference match ups. The Bulldogs will play at Hockey East Association-member Boston University while North Dakota will go up against Clarkson of ECAC Hockey.

In this week's (November 25) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is at No. 1 nationally, Wisconsin is No. 2 and North Dakota is No. 4. Also receiving votes was Minnesota Duluth.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll issued November 26, Minnesota is No. 1, Wisconsin is No. 2 and North Dakota is No. 4. Minnesota Duluth also received votes.

Minnesota's NCAA Division 1 Hockey Winning Streak Stretched to an Amazing 62 Games

Coach Brad Frost's Minnesota Golden Gophers stretched their NCAA Division 1 hockey record winning streak to 62 games before falling by a single goal – 3-2 – to North Dakota on Sunday, November 17.

The record winning streak, which included back-to-back NCAA Women's Frozen Four championships, dated back to Feb. 17, 2012, when the Gophers were upended 2-1 in overtime at home against North Dakota. The streak included the last eight games of 2011-12, all 41 games in 2012-13 and 13 more to launch the 2013-14 campaign. The Gophers' also compiled a record 39-game WCHA winning streak before being upended last Sunday, with their last previous conference defeat occurring Feb. 19, 2011 when they fell 5-3 at UND in the regular season finale.

"For everybody who has been a part of it, it's been a really special thing," said Frost of the winning streak. "I think they helped grow the game of women's hockey here in Minnesota and nation-wide, and that's a huge testament to them. There was a lot of pressure, a lot of media attention and a lot of



excitement every time we stepped on the ice, which was great, but it's over, and we're happy to have been a part of it."

Minnesota's 62-game winning streak toppled the previous NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey winning streak of 21 games set by Harvard and the Div. 1 women's unbeaten streak of 32 games set twice by Wisconsin. It also topped the NCAA Div. 1 men's hockey winning streak of 30 games held jointly by Rensselaer and Cornell and men's hockey unbeaten streak of 38 straight games set by Rensselaer.

2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji March 7-8

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the playoff championship for the women's league, will be held at Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minnesota on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

"We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue," said commissioner Sara Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. "The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players."

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championships as well as the last two NCAA Frozen Four titles. All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series February 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners will then play for the conference playoff championship at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, with two semifinals on Friday, March 7 and the championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Women's Hockey Tournament.

Ticket information will be announced in the near future.

Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (7-7-2, 4-5-1-1 WCHA, 14 points) earned a WCHA split at University of Minnesota Duluth Nov. 22-23. After losing 3-0 last Friday, BSU bounced back with a 1-0 victory over the Bulldogs Saturday. Saturday's victory over UMD was just the fourth ever for the Beavers.
- The Beavers have now earned conference points over four straight weekends. It is the first time they have done that since the 2011-12 season.
- With last Saturday's victory at UMD, BSU surpasses its win total from last season with seven.
- Bemidji State goaltender Brittni Mowat continues to have a stellar freshman campaign as she helped BSU earn a split against UMD. Mowat earned her first shutout in conference action and second overall on November 23, stopping 38 Bulldog shots. She is 7-6-2 this season. Mowat is two wins shy of tying the BSU record for most wins by a freshman goaltender with nine, which was set during the 1999-2000 season by Bre Detricson.
- BSU's sophomore class has accounted for the bulk of the Beavers' scoring so far this season. BSU's eight second-year players have posted 17 goals (52%) and 21 assists (44%) for 38 points, or 46% of the team's 82 points (33g, 49a).
- After finishing last in the WCHA last season on the power-play, Bemidji State has outscored its opponents with a man-advantage this season 10 to 8.
- Bemidji State leads the WCHA killing 56 opponent power-play opportunities this season.
- The Beavers rank sixth nationally in combined special teams at 56.4%.
- This week Bemidji State will take a week off of WCHA play as it will host the Russian National Team on Wednesday in an exhibition contest at the Sanford Center. Team Russia will also take on two fellow WCHA schools in preparation for the Olympic Winter Games as they will also play at Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota.



Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 1 Golden Gophers (15-1-0, 11-1-0-0 WCHA, 33 points) earned a non-conference road series sweep over Yale last weekend, picking up 5-1 and 4-1 victories.
- Hannah Brandt (2g, 2a) and Meghan Lorence (2g, 2a) led the Gophers with four points each against Yale. Rachael Bona had three points (1g, 2a) in last Sunday's game, and Sarah Davis, Milica McMillen and Brook Garzone each recorded two assists in the series. Minnesota outshot Yale, 57-20 and 52-18, in the two games. Five Gophers scored goals in last Saturday's 5-1 victory. Minnesota scored three first-period goals as Dani Cameranesi opened the scoring, Brandt scored the game-winner and Kelly Terry scored her team-leading 10th goal of the season. Goaltender Amanda Leveille made 19 saves and Shyler Sletta did not face a shot in six minutes of action. Last Sunday's game started the same as the Gophers again opened the game with a three-goal first period. Freshman Megan Wolfe scored on the power-play in the fourth minute before Bona and Brandt added goals to make it 3-0. Minnesota went ahead 4-0 on a PPG by Lorence before Yale scored to make it 4-1 at 4:51 of the second period. Leveille finished with 17 saves.
- With the two road wins at Yale, UM extended its road winning streak to 37 games, a stretch that dates back to Jan. 14, 2014.
- The Gophers return to Ridder Arena for another non-conference series when they host Princeton this weekend. Puck drop is at 4:07 pm Saturday, followed by a 1:07 pm face-off on Sunday. The series marks Minnesota's last home series of the first half of the season; the Gophers will return to action at Ridder Arena when they host Ohio State Jan. 10-11, 2014.
- Minnesota is pleased to host Skate with the Gophers following this Saturday's game. Saturday is also Thankful for Hockey Day. All fans wearing a hockey jersey will receive a \$4 general admission ticket.
- The Gophers have won their last 19 non-conference games. Their last non-conference loss was a 4-1 decision at Boston College in the 2011 NCAA Regional.
- Minnesota owns a 4-0-1 all-time mark against Princeton. The last meeting between the two teams was a 4-0 Gopher win in the 2006 NCAA Regional at Ridder Arena. The teams met three times in four games during the 1997-98 season, beginning with the first-ever meeting – a 6-1 Minnesota win at Princeton on Nov. 29, 1997.
- Through 16 games, Brandt (7g, 17a) leads the Gophers with 24 points. She is tied for sixth in the nation with 1.50 points per game. Terry is tied for the WCHA lead with 10 goals. Brandt's 17 assists are the most in the nation. Leveille is second in the league with a 1.39 goals-against average (fifth in the nation) and a .942 save percentage (sixth in the nation). She leads the WCHA with four shutouts.
- The Gophers lead the nation with a +2.94 scoring margin. UM has the nation's second-best offense, averaging 4.31 goals per game, and the fifth-best defense, allowing 1.38 goals per game.
- Brad Frost (201-37-16, .823) earned his 200th and 201st career wins as Minnesota's head coach on November 23-24.

- The Bulldogs (7-5-2, 5-5-2-1 WCHA, 18 points) split a WCHA series with Bemidji State over the weekend at AMSOIL Arena, winning 3-0 and losing 1-0.
- Minnesota Duluth recorded a goal in each period last Friday, including a power-play goal by Ashleigh Bryaliuk in the first period and a shorthanded goal by Emma Stauber, her first score of the year, in the second period. Sophomore center Hannah Bramm added a third goal with 1:52 remaining in the game. Kayla Black earned her second-consecutive shutout with 17 saves and the Bulldogs outshot the Beavers handily 42-17. Last Saturday night, UMD again put up shots against BSU, owning a 18-6 shot advantage in the first period alone. Despite outshooting the Beavers 38-16 in the skate, BSU snuck in a power-play goal with :15 seconds remaining to upset the Bulldogs 1-0.
- Last Saturday's loss snaps UMD's four-game unbeaten streak, as well as a 215:11 shutout streak the Bulldogs had dating back to Nov. 2. The setback also brings to an end the Bulldogs' five-game winning streak against the Beavers. UMD's last loss to BSU was on Feb. 11, 2012, a 2-0 defeat in Bemidji. All-time, the Bulldogs are 57-4-2 against the Beavers.
- Rookie blueliner Lara Stalder ranks fourth in the nation in both rookie scoring and defenseman scoring with four goals and 10 assists for 14 points through 14 games.
- Jamie Kenyon ranks fourth in power-play goals with four.
- Minnesota Duluth will host Team Russia in an exhibition game Tuesday evening at AMSOIL Arena before welcoming WCHA-rival Wisconsin on Friday and Saturday. The Bulldogs are 29-28-10 all-time against the Badgers and went 2-2 against UW last season.



Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (5-9-0, 2-8-0-0 WCHA, 6 points), idle this week, moved into a tie for seventh in the WCHA by sweeping visiting Ohio State by margins of 4-1 and 2-1 last weekend at All Seasons Arena. The sweep was the Mavericks first over the Buckeyes since Nov. 12-13, 2010, and its first at home since Nov. 9-10, 2007.
- MSU claimed a 4-1 victory in last Friday's series opener behind three third-period goals from three different seniors in Kelsie Scott, Kari Lundberg, and Nicole Germaine. Last Saturday's series finale saw Ohio State jump out to a 1-0 first-period lead, before the Mavericks responded with a single goal in the second and third periods to secure the sweep.
- MSU's power-play unit returned to form despite limited opportunities in the OSU series, converting on 2-of-5 chances with markers from Kelsie Scott and junior Kathleen Rogan. Meanwhile, the Maverick penalty-kill also had an improved showing, denying the Buckeyes on two-of-11 power-play chances in the series. The Purple and Gold power-play catapulted to fifth in the country with a 20.4% (11/54) efficiency led by Rogan's five PPGs which are tied for first in the country. Rogan's 5-4=9 on the man-advantage to date are tied for first in the league in power-play production.
- Senior netminder Danielle Butters was outstanding last weekend amassing 79 saves, a 1.00 goals-against average, and a .975 save percentage, while racking up double-digit saves in all six periods. She continues to rank second nationally in saves (449) and moved to seventh in minutes played (822:12).
- Seniors Kari Lundberg, Nicole Germaine and Tracy McCann all collected a goal and an assist in the OSU series with McCann's tally marking the game-winner last Saturday. Lundberg's 5-5=10 this season have already matched her point total from a year ago as she is on pace to set career-highs across the board. McCann and Rogan are now tied with Ryann Geldner for 10th all-time in scoring at Minnesota State having generated 30-30=60 and 31-29=60, respectively.
- Freshman Savannah Quandt continues to emerge for the Mavericks and opened the scoring in last Friday's OSU series opener by netting her first career goal. Quandt is also the first Mankato native to ever play for the Mavericks.
- Senior Lauren Barnes has moved from center back to defense for MSU, where she played a year ago, and tallied her team-leading seventh assist last Friday. Fellow blue-liner junior Shelby Moteyunas continues to pace all qualified MSU defensemen with 1-6=7 after garnering a helper in last weekend's series finale.
- MSU hopes to feature three Olympians in the upcoming 2014 Sochi Olympic Winter Games. Alumni Emilia Andersson and Nina Tikkinen are strong candidates to make the Swedish and Finnish National Teams, respectively, while freshman Anna Fiegert hopes to make the German National Team.

- No. 4-ranked North Dakota (9-3-2, 7-3-2-1 WCHA, 24 points) hosts the Russian Women's National Team for a pair of exhibition games this Thanksgiving weekend, on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 29-30. Both games will be played at 2:07 pm.
- North Dakota ran into a stifling Wisconsin defense in a WCHA series at home last weekend, playing the Badgers to a scoreless tie on Nov. 22, before dropping a 3-1 decision on Nov. 23. Michelle Karvinen scored the lone UND goal of the weekend, finishing off a string of passes from Amy Menke and Meghan Dufault on the power play. Shelby Amsley-Benzie recorded her first shutout of the season in the scoreless tie, making 21 saves, including 12 in the third and overtime periods combined.
- North Dakota's D-corps has created 12 goals and 21 assists. The 33 points is sixth in the nation for most points by a team's defense. Additionally, the UND defense is second in the nation in goals (12) and is fourth in shots on goal with 156 (11.14 per game).
- Gracen Hirschy is 11th among defensemen in the nation with 40 shots on goal, and Halli Krzyzaniak is 17th with 35 shots on goal. Hirschy is fourth among the nation's defensemen with a +15 plus/minus rating. Sam LaShomb is tied for ninth with a +11 rating while, Krzyzaniak is tied for 13th with a +9 rating.
- UND's freshmen have accounted for 41 points (13g, 28a) this season. The class leads the nation in freshman point scoring (41), assists (28), shots on goal (187) and power-play points (14). Susanna Tapani leads the UND class with four goals and nine assists. Her 13 points ranks second in the nation among freshmen, while her nine assists ranks third. Hirschy is second among the nation's freshmen with a +15 plus/minus rating. Krzyzaniak is tied for eighth with a +9 rating.
- Senior captain Michelle Karvinen is tied for fourth in the WCHA and tied for 11th in the nation with seven goals.

- Amsley-Benzie and Lexie Shaw have combined for 82 third-period saves.

- The Buckeyes (3-8-2, 2-8-2-1 WCHA, 8 points) host Robert Morris on Tuesday night. Game time is set for 7:07 pm ET at the OSU Ice Rink. OSU is 4-0-0 all-time against the Colonials with the last meeting between the teams coming in 2010.
- The Buckeyes then travel to Durham, N.H. this weekend for a non-conference series with New Hampshire. Game times are set for 2:00 pm ET Saturday and 1:00 pm ET Sunday. The Buckeyes have faced New Hampshire eight previous times and are 1-7-0 in those games, but the last meeting between the two came back during the 2002-03 season.
- The Buckeyes dropped a pair of WCHA games in Mankato over the Nov. 22-23 weekend to Minnesota State, losing 4-1 last Friday and 2-1 Saturday. After falling down a goal early on Friday, freshman Katie Matheny scored for the second consecutive week to tie the game with :10 seconds remaining in the second period. The Mavericks used a three-goal third period, including an empty-net score, to win the game. Redshirt senior goaltender Chelsea Knapp started Friday making 30 saves for OSU. The Buckeyes took a 1-0 lead in last Saturday's contest following a first period goal from senior Ally Tarr but Minnesota State got one in the second and the game-winner in the third. Senior goaltender Lisa Steffes got the start Saturday and made 31 saves. The goal for Matheny was the second of her career and assisted by sophomore Cara Zubko and senior Annie Svedin. Badgers University Wisconsin

- The No. 2 Badgers (11-2-1, 7-2-1-1 WCHA, 23 points) enter this weekend's WCHA series against Minnesota Duluth riding a 10-game unbeaten streak, which is tied for the nation's best. UW trails 28-29-10 in its series against UMD, and holds an 11-16-4 record in contests held in Duluth.
- During its unbeaten streak, Wisconsin has allowed an average of 0.90 goals per game while scoring 3.7 per game. Wisconsin has a conversion rate of .326 during the 10-game span. UW has outshot opponents by an average of 38.7 to 22.5, and has outscored opponents 37-9. Wisconsin also has four wins against ranked opponents during the streak, and has three shutouts. It marks UW's longest unbeaten streak since UW won 14 straight during the 2011-12 season.
- After playing to a 0-0 tie in regulation against league rival North Dakota last Friday, junior Blayre Turnbull scored in the third round to win the shootout for Wisconsin and to give the Badgers an extra point in the league standings. Wisconsin scored two power-play goals in the third period of last Saturday's game, and killed a penalty with less than three minutes to go to defeat UND 3-1. Last Friday's 0-0 tie was only the second scoreless tie in program history as Wisconsin and Bemidji State played to a 0-0 draw on Nov. 24, 2007 in Bemidji, Minn. Friday's shootout was UW's first shootout since Oct. 21, 2012. The Badgers improved to 9-6 in shootouts, including a 9-4 record in WCHA shootouts.
- The Badger's defense has been stout, allowing an average of 1.00 goals per game, which is the best mark in the nation. Wisconsin has three shutouts on the year, and has not allowed more than two goals in a game this year.
- Junior Brittany Ammerman ranks sixth in the nation in points per game averaging 1.50 points per contest. The River Vale, N.J., native also ranks in the top-15 in goals per game (0.71) and assists per game (0.79).
- Senior goaltender Alex Rigsby leads the country in save percentage with a .959 clip and in goals-allowed allowing an average of 1.00 goals per game. Rigsby collected her 91st career win against UND, and only needs one win to pass Jessie Vetter on the all-time list. Rigsby tallied her 26th career shutout against UND on Friday.
- The second period is where the Badgers have shined this season, outscoring opponents 20-4. Wisconsin has outshot opponents 212-119 in the second frame. UW has outscored teams 9-4 in the first periods, and 17-6 in third period action.
