## Two WCHA Series Set for November 8-9 as Top-Ranked Minnesota Plays at St. Cloud State, Ohio State Hosts Bemidji State Unbeaten, League-Leading Golden Gophers Look to Extend NCAA-Record 59-Game Winning Streak; UMD, MSU, UND and UW Idle This Week; Four Nations Cup Set for November 5-9 in Lake Placid, NY; WCHA Teams Stand 15-4-2 (.762) in Non-Conference Play; Latest National Poll Has Minnesota No. 1, Wisconsin No. 2, North Dakota No. 4 ... OSU Receives Votes; 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Set for March 7-8 at Sanford Center in Bemidji

MADISON, Wis. – Half of the teams in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association take a break to watch many of the world's best women's players in the Four Nations Cup tournament this week, but Minnesota, the two-time defending national champions, will try to extend its NCAA-record winning streak to 60 games this Friday when the Gophers take on host St. Cloud State in the first game of a league series. The two face-offs at Herb Brooks National Hockey Center (5371) will be at 3:07 pm CT on November 8 and 3:07 pm CT on November 9.

Minnesota's NCAA-record Division 1-record 59-game winning streak dates back to February 17, 2012, when the Gophers were upended 2-1 in overtime at home against North Dakota. The streak includes the last eight games of 2011-12, all 41 games in 2012-13 and 10 so far in 2013-14. The Gophers' have also compiled a record 36-game WCHA winning streak, with their last conference defeat occurring February 19, 2011 when they fell 5-3 at North Dakota in the regular season finale.

The match up between the league-leading Gophers (10-0-0, 8-0-0 WCHA) and improving Huskies

(1-6-3, 1-5-2-1 WCHA) is one of just two league series on the docket this week. The other November 8-9 set will have Ohio State hosting Bemidji State. The Buckeyes (3-3-1, 2-3-1 WCHA) and Beavers (3-6-1, 0-4-0 WCHA) will skate at OSU Ice Rink (800) at 7:07 pm ET on Friday night and 4:07 pm ET on Saturday afternoon.

The other four WCHA teams – North Dakota, Minnesota State, Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin – are all idle this week. North Dakota has three current players at the Four Nations Cup while Minnesota State and Minnesota Duluth each have two current players there.

The Four Nations Cup is an annual four-team tournament that features the United States, Canada, Sweden and Finland. This year's tourney is being held November 5-9 in Lake Placid, N.Y.

Defending WCHA champion Minnesota (10-0-0, 8-0-0-0 WCHA, 24 points) continues to be four points up in the league race on second place North Dakota (8-1-1, 6-1-1-1 WCHA, 20 points), which is off to the best start in school history. Wisconsin (8-2-0-0, 6-2-0 WCHA, 18 points) has won six games in a row and is in third place with 18 points, nine points ahead of Minnesota Duluth (4-4-2, 2-4-2-1 WCHA, 9 points). Ohio State (2-3-1-0, 3-3-1 WCHA, 7 points) is in fifth place, one point ahead of sixth place St. Cloud State (1-6-3, 1-5-2-1 WCHA, 6 points). Minnesota State (3-7-0, 0-6-0-0 WCHA, 0 points) and Bemidji State (3-6-1, 0-4-0-0 WCHA, 0 points) are tied for seventh place.

Last weekend (November 1-3), Minnesota kept its NCAA-record winning streak alive with 4-1 and 7-0 WCHA victories in the home-and-home series with Minnesota State. Thirteen Gophers recorded points against the Mavericks, led by senior Kelly Terry's seven-point series (3g, 4a). Junior defenseman Rachel Ramsey had a goal and four assists in the series, including the game-winning goal last Friday. Sophomore goaltender Amanda Leveille improved to 10-0-0 on the season, combining for 37 saves in the two wins. She made 13 saves in last Friday's 4-1 victory before stopping all 24 shots in last Saturday's shutout. Terry led the way in the series finale with five points, including a three-goal hat trick. Sara Davis earned her 100th career point with an assist on Saturday.

In Duluth, St. Cloud State took four of six points from host UMD. Minnesota Duluth outshot St. Cloud State, 53-28, last Friday but fell 4-1. Amy Olson scored two goals in a four-goal second period outburst for the Huskies and Julie Friend made 52 saves between the pipes, including 30 in the third period to snap UMD's 13-game winning streak against the Huskies. Last Saturday, the Bulldogs again outshot SCSU, 40-23, but they had

to settle for a 1-1 tie when Julia Gilbert scored with :22 seconds left in the third period and an extra attacker on the ice. UMD, however, got the extra point by winning the shootout.

Up in Bemidji, visiting North Dakota didn't have the services of Michelle Karvinen or Susanna Tapani, who were with Team Finland in preparation for this week's Four Nations Cup, but Megan Dufault picked up the slack on Friday with three goals, including two shorthanders, in a 6-2 victory. Then in the series finale last Saturday, freshman Amy Menke scored her first two collegiate goals in a 5-1 triumph.

And in Madison, host Wisconsin stretched its winning streak to six with 4-1 and 3-2 victories over Ohio State. Ohio State freshman Claudia Kepler got the first goal each day, but Blayne Turnbull led the Badgers' comebacks with two points per game, including a pair of goals on Sunday. Turnbull and Brittany Ammerman collected five of UW's seven goals, and combined for eight points on the weekend. Turnbull had an efficient weekend, scoring three goals on seven shot attempts.

In non-conference play so far this season, the WCHA has gone 15-4-2 in 21 games against other Division 1 opponents.

Looking ahead to next week's schedule, there will be three conference series contested over the November 15-17 weekend as Bemidji State hosts Minnesota State (Friday/Saturday), Ohio State entertains Minnesota Duluth (Friday/Saturday) and Minnesota hosts North Dakota (Saturday/Sunday). Outside the league, Wisconsin and St. Cloud State travel to Vail, Colo., to participate in a November 15-16 Division 1 women's college hockey weekend event at Dobson Ice Arena. On Friday, St. Cloud State will play Boston University and Wisconsin will take on Northeastern. Then on Saturday, the Huskies skate against Northeastern while the Badgers go up against Boston University.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll issued November 4, Minnesota is again a unanimous No. 1, Wisconsin is No. 2 and North Dakota is No. 4. Also receiving votes was Ohio State.

## 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji March 7-8

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the playoff championship for the women’s league, will be held at Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minnesota on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

“We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue,” said league commissioner Sara Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. “The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players.”

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championships as well as the last two NCAA Frozen Four titles. The Gophers beat North Dakota, 2-0, to win the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF in Minneapolis.

All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series February 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners will then play for the conference playoff championship at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, with two semifinals on Friday, March 7 and the championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league’s automatic berth into the NCAA Women’s Hockey Tournament.

Ticket information for the 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be announced in the near future.

## WCHA Weekly Team Notebooks



### Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State Beavers (3-6-1, 0-4-0-0 WCHA, 0 points) dropped a pair of conference games last weekend (November 1-2) at home against No. 4-ranked North Dakota by scores of 6-2 and 5-1.
- The six goals yielded last Friday is the most BSU has allowed all season.
- The sophomore class has led the Beavers' offense this year. Twenty-three points of the 48 total points scored by BSU have been by a sophomore. One of those sophomores, forward Hanna Moher has been the leading goal-scorer for the Beavers this season with four and points with six.
- The Beavers have also had good production out of their five freshman and two newcomers to the program. The new players have contributed 10 points thus far.
- Bemidji State ranks fourth in the WCHA in penalty-killing with a percentage of 83.8% in 37 attempts.
- The Beavers have struggled in the first and second periods in allowing goals. They have allowed 10 and 14 goals in the first and second periods, respectively, which is the most in the WCHA.
- Bemidji State hits the road this coming weekend and travels to Ohio State University. The Beavers have only played one road series so far this season and that was against Lindenwood University. BSU went 1-0-1 in the series. The Buckeyes are 30-18-10 all-time against the Beavers, including a 3-1 mark last season. The lone victory BSU had over the Buckeyes last season was the last conference victory for the Beavers and that was at the Sanford Center. Bemidji State's last win at Ohio State came on Jan. 23, 2010 by a score of 1-0.



### Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (10-0-0, 8-0-0-0 WCHA, 24 points) improved to 10-0-0 and extended their NCAA-record winning streak to 59 games with a WCHA series sweep over Minnesota State last weekend. The Gophers topped the Mavericks, 4-1 and 7-0, in the home-and-home series.
- Thirteen Gophers recorded points against the Mavericks last weekend, led by the senior Kelly Terry's seven-point series (3g, 4a). Junior Rachel Ramsey (1g, 4a), Hannah Brandt (1g, 3a), Sarah Davis (3a), Brook Garzone (2g), Rachael Bona (2a) and Milica McMillen (1g, 1a) all had multiple points.
- Sophomore goaltender Amanda Leveille improved to 10-0-0 on the season, combining for 37 saves in the two wins over MSU. She made 13 saves in last Friday's 4-1 win before stopping all 24 shots in Saturday's shutout. Leveille leads the WCHA with a 1.20 goals-against average (third in nation) and a .951 save percentage (fourth in nation). She is tied for the national lead with four shutouts.
- Last Friday saw the Gophers top the Mavs 4-1 at Ridder Arena, led by Ramsey's two-points. The junior scored the game-winning goal on the power-play and had an assist. Davis and Terry each finished with two assists as well. Last Saturday in Mankato, Minnesota recorded its fourth shutout of the season with a 7-0 win. Terry led the way with five points, including a hat trick. Ramsey had three assists, including one on Hannah Brandt's game-winning goal.
- Sarah Davis earned her 100th career point last weekend with an assist. Brandt is closing in on 100 career points as well (37-61=98).
- The Gophers scored four goals in the third period of Saturday's 7-0 win at MSU, marking the highest scoring output they have had in a period since scoring four in the first period vs Colgate (Oct. 5).
- Gopher freshmen have combined for 19 points (6g, 13a) in their first 10 games led by Dani Cameranesi (4g, 3a) and Kelsey Cline (0g, 5a). Minnesota's freshman class is tied for fifth in the nation with 1.90 points per game.
- Minnesota travels to St. Cloud State this weekend. Puck drop is set for 3:07 pm both Friday and Saturday at Herb Brooks National Hockey Center. Minnesota is 56-3-2 all-time vs SCSU, dating back to Nov. 15, 1997. The Gophers have won the last 14 meetings between the two teams. Most recently, Minnesota shut out the Huskies 2-0 and 3-0 in St. Cloud (Feb. 22-23, 2013).
- The Gophers have the nation's second-best offense, averaging 4.40 goals per game. UMinnesota has allowed 1.20 goals per game in 10 games, good for fourth in the NCAA. Minnesota's power-play is the WCHA's best, converting on 13 of 38 attempts (34.2%).
- Hannah Brandt is second in the league with 16 points and third in the nation with 1.20 assists per game. Ramsey is tied for the scoring lead among WCHA defensemen with 11 total points and tied for sixth in the nation with 1.10 points per game.
- Head coach Brad Frost is closing in on 200 career wins at Minnesota. In six seasons, Frost's career record to 196-36-16.

### Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs (4-4-2, 2-4-2-1 WCHA, 9 points) managed two points last weekend (Nov. 1-2), suffering a loss and tie at AMSOIL Arena to St. Cloud State.
- UMD is 48-10-4 all-time now against the Huskies and prior to last Friday's 4-1 loss had not been defeated by SCSU since Nov. 9, 2009.
- UMD surrendered a 13-game winning streak over SCSU last Friday before picking up a tie and the shootout win last Saturday night by a score of 1-1. The Bulldogs put 53 shots on net Nov. 1, including a program-high of 31 in the third period, but could not find the twine. Lara Stalder had the lone UMD goal in the third period and three players had six or more shots in the contest (Jamie Kenyon and Zoe Hickel with seven, Sidney Morin with six).
- Jenna McParland had UMD's lone goal last Saturday, a power-play tally in the second period, as well as the second goal in the shootout. Overall in the series UMD outshot SCSU, 93-51, but were outscored 5-2.
- The Bulldogs were without junior defenseman Tea Villila for both games vs SCSU due to Team Finland commitments and are also without senior center Brienna Gillanders who is out indefinitely due to injury. UMD played with five defensemen on Saturday night and just three complete lines.
- Jamie Kenyon continues to lead the NCAA with four power-play goals in 10 skates.
- Rookie blueliner Lara Stalder is ranked No. 6 among scoring defensemen with a 1.10 points per game average on 11 points (3g, 11a). Stalder also ranks fifth in rookie scoring with those same 1.10 ppg.
- Minnesota Duluth owns the NCAA's sixth most potent power-play this season, with a 23.7% success rate, with nine goals on 38 attempts.
- The Bulldogs are off this coming weekend from competition, but junior defenseman Tea Villila will be suiting up for Finland for the Four Nations Cup this weekend. Junior redshirt defenseman Bridgette Lacquette will also be hitting the ice at the Four Nations Cup with Team Canada. In all, seven current and former Bulldogs will be playing in the international tournament November 5-9 in Lake Placid, NY.



### Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (3-7-0, 0-6-0 WCHA, 0 points) remained winless in league play after last weekend's home and home series with No. 1 Minnesota. This series was the final preview before the 2014 Hockey City Classic which takes place on Jan. 17, 2014 at TCF Bank Stadium.
- MSU and UM were knotted 1-1 through one period in last Friday's series opener at Ridder Arena, but the Golden Gophers responded with three straight goals, including two on the power-play, to claim a 4-1 victory. Last Saturday's series finale at All Seasons Arena was a one-goal game for the first 39 minutes until Minnesota struck for two goals in the final :30 seconds of the second period and added four additional markers in the third frame to walk away with a 7-0 win.
- The Mavs' special teams struggled to contain the Golden Gophers as the MSU penalty-kill finished just four-of-eight (50.0%) while the power-play converted once on six opportunities (16.7%) in the two-game set.
- Senior goaltender Danielle Butters was terrific in the Minnesota series opener on Nov. 1, amassing a career-high 48 saves, just one shy of the MSU single-game top-10 list. Butters added an additional 40 stops in last Saturday's contest. Butters ranks second nationally in saves with 311 to date and stands fifth in the country with 583:50 minutes played.
- Senior Tracy McCann netted her first power-play goal of the year for MSU in the series opener against Minnesota last Friday, bringing her season total to 2-3=5.
- Senior Nicole Germaine continues to have a career year as she has collected 3-5=8 this season to tie for the team-lead in assists and rank second in total points. She is one assist and point away from matching her career-bests in both categories.
- Junior Shelby Moteyunas tallied her fifth helper of the year in the two-game set against Minnesota, giving her 1-5=6 on the season as she continues to lead all Maverick blue-liners in assists and points.
- Junior Kathleen Rogan was shut out of the scoring column vs UM for just the second series this season, ending her point streak at four games. Rogan continues to lead the team in goals and points with 5-4=9. The Vancouver, B.C., product is tied for fifth nationally in PPGs and tied for second in GWGs. She owns sole possession of 12th in career scoring at Minnesota State with 29-28=57.
- Minnesota State's power-play ranks 10th in the country while converting at a 20.5% (8/39) rate.
- Minnesota State hopes to feature three Olympians in the upcoming 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. Alums Emilia Andersson and Nina Tikkinen are strong candidates to make the Swedish and Finnish National Teams, respectively, while freshman Anna Fiegert hopes to make the German National Team.
- The Mavericks are idle this week before heading north to battle Bemidji State Nov. 15-16 at the Sanford Center. MSU is 24-25-10 all-time against the Beavers.

### University of North Dakota

- No. 4 North Dakota (8-1-1, 6-1-1-1 WCHA, 20 points) takes a weekend off and sends three players to the Four Nations Cup in Lake Placid, N.Y. Michelle Karvinen and Susanna Tapani will be competing for Team Finland, while Johanna Fallman will be competing for Team Sweden.
- The following week, North Dakota travels to Minneapolis to take on No. 1-ranked Minnesota on Saturday-Sunday, Nov. 16-17. Both games will begin at 2:07 pm.
- North Dakota picked up its second-straight road sweep, downing Bemidji State by scores of 6-2 and 5-1, Nov. 1-2. UND was missing forwards Karvinen and Tapani, but still managed to score a season-high 11 goals over the weekend. UND received goals from eight different players in the series, with 14 players recording points. Meghan Dufault recorded her second career hat trick on Nov. 1 and tied an NCAA record with two shorthanded goals in the contest. Freshman Amy Menke scored her first two collegiate goals in the finale, as freshman netminder Lexie Shaw made her second career start in net and picked up the win stopping 22 of 23 shots.
- With a record of 8-1-1 (.850), North Dakota is enjoying its best start through 10 games in program history. The previous record through 10 games was set in 2008-09 when UND started 7-2-1.
- A total of 19 of 20 skaters that have seen action this year have recorded points. Additionally, 17 skaters have recorded at least one goal this season.
- North Dakota's D-corps has created 11 goals and 20 assists. The 30 points leads the nation for most points by a team's defense. Additionally, the UND defense leads the nation in goals (11) and in shots on goal with 131, (13.10 per game).
- Halli Krzyzaniak is tied for fifth among defensemen in the nation with 32 shots on goal. Gracen Hirschy is second among the nation's defensemen with a +13 plus/minus rating. Krzyzaniak is tied for third with a +12 rating.
- UND's freshmen have accounted for 35 points (10g, 25a) this season. The class leads the nation in freshman point scoring (35), assists (25), shots on goal (146) and power-play points (11). Tapani leads the UND class with 3-8=11. Her 11 points and eight assists is also tied for third in the nation among freshmen. Hirschy and Krzyzaniak lead the nation's freshmen with a +13 and +12 plus/minus rating, respectively. UND's freshmen accounted for 13 points (2g, 11a) during the opening weekend against Lindenwood, Oct. 4-5.
- North Dakota is tied with the second-best scoring margin in the third period among all teams in the nation, with a +14 margin. UND has scored a total of 15 third period goals, the third most in the nation, while being the only team in the country to have conceded one third period goal. Shelby Amsley-Benzie and Shaw have combined for 50 third period saves.



### Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The Ohio State Buckeyes (3-3-1, 2-3-1-1 WCHA, 7 points) host WCHA-rival Bemidji State Nov. 8-9 at the OSU Ice Rink in the beginning of a two-week homestand. The Buckeyes then play host to Minnesota Duluth Nov. 15-16 at Value City Arena at the Schottenstein Center.
- The Buckeyes are coming off a pair of losses in Madison against Wisconsin. OSU lost 4-1 last Saturday and 3-2 Sunday. Wisconsin native Claudia Kepler scored :17 seconds into Saturday's game and with :28 seconds remaining in the first period of Sunday's game. They were the first and second career goals for the OSU rookie. Senior Ally Tarr had the lone assists on each of the Kepler goals. Junior defenseman Kari Schmitt scored her team-leading fourth goal of the season in the loss on Sunday.
- Redshirt senior goaltender Chelsea Knapp started both games for OSU at Wisconsin, stopping 64 of 71 shots faced.
- Ohio State is 32-16-10 all-time against Bemidji State and 17-6-4 in games played in Columbus. The Buckeyes went 3-1-0 vs. BSU last season, sweeping at the OSU Ice Rink 4-1 and 10-1 and winning game one in Bemidji 2-1 in overtime. They dropped the finale 2-1. In the 10-1 win over the Beavers the Buckeyes set program records for points in a game, assists in a game, and goals in a period. Taylor Kuehl recorded her first career hat trick in the game.
- Tarr is now tied with junior Sara Schmitt for the team lead in points with nine. Tarr has a team-leading eight assists on the season.
- Knapp has 2,264 career saves, five shy of passing former Buckeye Erika Vanderveer for second all-time at OSU and eight shy of passing former Buckeye Melissa Glaser for first. Knapp needs three wins to pass Vanderveer for most career victories all-time at OSU.
- Five of seven games this season for OSU have come against nationally-ranked teams.

### Huskies St. Cloud State University

- The Huskies (1-6-3, 1-5-2-1 WCHA, 6 points) skated to their first victory of the 2013-14 season with a 4-1 win over host Minnesota Duluth last Friday (Nov. 1) at AMSOIL Arena and came out with the 1-1 overtime tie last Saturday (Nov. 2).
- In the series opener at UMD, senior Julia Gilbert, playing in her hometown area, put the Huskies ahead at the 1:27 mark of the second period. Assists went to senior Molli Mott and sophomore Skye Kelly. The Huskies scored three more goals in the second period to lead the Bulldogs 4-0. St. Cloud's second goal came on a power-play opportunity as senior captain Amy Olson collected her first collegiate goal at the 9:30 mark. The Huskies made it a 3-0 game at 13:42 as Mott fired a shot from between the face-off circles. Olson quickly got her second goal at the 16:27 mark of the second period to cap a four-goal burst. Duluth made it a 4-1 game early in the third but St. Cloud held on to earn their first victory over UMD in 13 match-ups. Junior goaltender Julie Friend recorded 52 saves for the win and improved her record to 1-4-2.
- Last Saturday at UMD, the host Bulldogs were first to score early in the second period to take the first lead of the game, 1-0. St. Cloud State didn't even the score until pulling the goalie for an extra attacker. Julia Gilbert brought the Huskies back, tying the game 1-1 from right in front of the net with :22 seconds left in the regulation. Mott and Olson were credited with the assists. After a scoreless overtime, Minnesota Duluth won the shootout, 2-0. Goalie Katie Fitzgerald recorded 39 saves and saw her record move to 0-2-1 on the season.
- St. Cloud State next hosts top-ranked Minnesota at the Herb Brooks National Hockey Center for a Nov. 8-9 WCHA set. Game times are 3:07 pm both days.



### Badgers University Wisconsin

- The No. 2-ranked Badgers (8-2-0-0, 6-2-0 WCHA, 18 points) enter a bye week riding a six-game winning streak, which is the second-longest streak in the nation trailing only No. 1 Minnesota.
- Wisconsin earned its fourth sweep of the season as the Badgers swept No. 10-ranked Ohio State last weekend in two WCHA games at LaBahn Arena. After trailing 1-0 heading into the first intermission last Saturday, Wisconsin scored four unanswered goals to defeat Ohio State, 4-1. With the score tied 2-2 in Sunday's game, Brittany Ammerman scored the game-winner in the third and the Badgers held off a furious OSU attack at the end to hold onto a 3-2 triumph.
- During the weekend sweep over Ohio State, Blayre Turnbull and Brittany Ammerman collected five of UW's seven goals, and combined for eight points on the weekend. Turnbull had an efficient weekend, scoring three goals on seven shot attempts (.429).
- The Badger's defense has been stout this year, allowing an average of 1.10 goals per game, which is the second-best mark in the nation.
- Ammerman is tied for the nation's lead in points with 17 points, and her 1.70 points per game average ranks fourth nationally.
- Senior goaltender Alex Rigsby ranks sixth in the country in save percentage with a .949 clip and fifth in goals-against average, allowing an average of 1.25 goals per game. Rigsby collected her 89th career win last Sunday, and needs three wins to pass Jessie Vetter on the all-time list.
- The Badgers are 22-3-1 in LaBahn Arena. In the Badgers' 26 games at the new barn, UW has outscored opponents 91-31 and has posted seven shutouts. Wisconsin has won 12 straight games at LaBahn Arena, which is the longest winningest streak in rink history. In addition, UW's sweep of OSU marked the third time the Badgers have swept a nationally-ranked opponent in LaBahn.
- The second period is where the Badgers have shined this season, outscoring opponents 15-1. Wisconsin has outshot opponents 166-79 in the second frame. UW has outscored teams 7-4 in the first periods, and 13-6 in third period action.
- Wisconsin's special teams rank in the top-five in the nation in all three categories. UW is third in the power-play, converting its chances 27.5% of the time, while the Badgers are killing penalties at a 94.6% clip, which also ranks third nationally. Wisconsin's combined special teams rank fourth in the country.
- The Badgers are third in scoring margin, outscoring opponents by an average of 2.40 goals per contest.
- Wisconsin's penalty-kill is one of the nation's best, as its 91.3% clip is fifth-best in the country.
- UW ranks sixth in scoring offense (3.50 goals per game) and third on the power-play (21.7%).
