### OPENING FACE-OFF

- **Happy New Year!:** After the holiday break, the WCHA returns to action with seven non-conference games between Jan. 2-6.
- **Topping the Charts:** The WCHA enters the first weekend of the New Year with an NCAA-best four teams in both the USCHO.com and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* national rankings, which were last issued on Dec. 15 and 16. Minnesota and Wisconsin are Nos. 2 and 3, respectively, in both polls, while Minnesota Duluth is No. 6/7 and Bemidji State is No. 9.
- **Winning Hockey:** WCHA teams also own an NCAA-best four of the nation's top 10 winning percentages: Minnesota (2nd at .895, 16-1-2), Wisconsin (3rd at .875, 17-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (8th at .675, 12-5-3) and Bemidji State (t-10th at .575, 11-8-1).
- **Pairing Up:** The WCHA opens the second half of the 2014-15 season with six teams in the PairWise rankings: No. 2 Minnesota, No. 3 Wisconsin and No. 7 Minnesota Duluth are all in the top eight, followed by Bemidji State and Ohio State (tied for 11th), along with North Dakota (tied for 13th).
- **Streaking Along:** Several WCHA teams enter the second half riding hot stretches. Wisconsin's 12-game unbeaten streak (11-0-1) is the second-longest active streak in the country, while Minnesota is third with a nine-game winning streak. Minnesota Duluth is 11-1-1 in its last 13 contests, while Ohio State - which vaulted into fourth place in the WCHA standings with a sweep prior to the break, is 3-1-1 in its last five.
- **High Attendance Marks:** WCHA schools rank 1-4 in national attendance leaders, led by the fans at Mariucci Arena (Minnesota) LaBahn Arena (Wisconsin), Ralph Engelstad Arena (North Dakota) and AMSOIL Arena (Minnesota Duluth).

### BY THE NUMBERS

- **4 and 5:** The number of points separating the third through sixth place teams in the WCHA standings, along with the point differential between the top two teams, setting the stage for a thrilling second half race for the league regular season crown and postseason home-ice advantage (awarded to the top four finishers).
- **19:** The number of current and former WCHA student-athletes who participated in the USA Hockey Women's Winter Training Camp from December 27-31 at the Schwan's Super Rink in Blaine, Minn. A full list of WCHA participants can be found on page two of this release.
- **.779:** The WCHA's non-conference winning percentage (26-7-1), the best mark in the country.

### THE WEEK AHEAD

- **Non-Conference Games on Tap:** The WCHA kicks off the season's second half with seven non-conference games spread over five days: Bemidji State travels to Lindenwood on Jan. 2-3; Ohio State visits Penn State on Jan. 3 and 4; Minnesota State hosts St. Lawrence on Jan. 3; and Minnesota welcomes St. Lawrence on Jan. 4 and 6.

**HAPPY NEW YEAR! WCHA RESUMES PLAY**

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, the only women's league in the country with four teams ranked in the top 10, resumes the 2015 portion of the schedule with seven non-conference games from Jan. 2-6.

WCHA teams resume play Jan. 2-3 when Bemidji State plays a non-conference series at Lindenwood, while Ohio State visits Penn State Jan. 3-4. Minnesota State hosts St. Lawrence on Jan. 3, while Minnesota entertains the Saints on Jan. 4 and Jan. 6. The Beavers, Buckeyes, Mavericks and Gophers will look to improve on the WCHA's nation-leading .779 non-conference winning percentage (26-7-1).

Every team has completed half of their 28-game league schedule. The standings with two games remaining before the break show a two-team race for the league title, with a tight bunch for spots three through six.

League-leading Wisconsin (15-2-1-0, 40 points in the WCHA; 17-2-1 overall) takes a 12-game winning streak into 2015 and has a five-point lead on second place Minnesota, the two-time defending league champion (which has played two fewer games than the Badgers). The Gophers have an 11-1-2-0 league record (35 points), while they have also won nine in a row and now sport a 16-1-2 overall mark. The WCHA's top two teams meet in Minneapolis Jan. 10-11 in a key series.

There is a tight race for the final two home playoff spots, third and fourth place. Minnesota Duluth currently is in third place with 25 points and has gone 11-1-1 in its last 13 games. The Bulldogs (7-5-2-2 in league play and 12-5-3 overall) are one point ahead of Ohio State (7-7-2-1, 24 points; 10-8-2 overall). The Buckeyes jumped into fourth place with a sweep at Bemidji State right before the Holiday break.

Bemidji State (7-8-1-1, 11-8-1 overall) is in fifth place with 23 points, just one behind OSU and two points better than sixth place North Dakota (6-8-2-1, 21 points; 9-9-2 overall). All three teams are vying for fourth place and - with it - home-ice advantage for the first round of the playoffs.

The rest of the standings show that St. Cloud State (3-10-1-1, 11 points; 6-14-1 overall) is in seventh place and Minnesota State (0-13-1-0, 1 point; 0-15-1) in eighth.

**WEEKEND REWIND**

In the final series before the break, Dec. 19 and 20, Ohio State completed a regular season sweep of Bemidji State by winning twice at the Sanford Center. In game one, a 2-0 victory, OSU received goals from senior forward **Taylor Kuehl** and junior F **Julia McKinnon**, while Buckeyes' redshirt junior **Stacy Danczak** led the team to its fifth shutout of the season with a career-high 33 saves. Ohio State completed the sweep with a 2-1 victory in game two, courtesy of a two-goal effort from sophomore forward **Claudia Kepler**. Danczak completed her stellar weekend in goal by registering 22 saves.

## Beavers Bemidji State University

- The No. 9 Beavers (7-8-1-1, 23 points; 11-8-1) were swept at home by Ohio State Dec. 19-20. The Buckeyes defeated the Beavers 2-0 Friday before completing the sweep with a 2-1 victory Saturday.
- Despite the pair of losses, the Beavers have already matched their win total from last season (11) and were one win shy of tying a program record for the most wins before Christmas break (12).
- **Alexis Joyce** had the only goal in the series for the Beavers. The goal was the Joyce's third of the season, which ranks seventh in the conference for freshmen.
- Joyce's goal was also on the on the power-play, which snapped a 0-for-9 scoreless streak with a man advantage for the Beavers.
- The goal also ended an extended offensive dry spell for BSU as it went 137:49 minutes without scoring a goal.
- **Brittni Mowat** stopped 44 of 47 shots in the series for a .936 save percentage.
- Senior **Rachael Kelly** played in her 100th career game Saturday for Bemidji State. Kelly, who has 30 points (18g, 12a) in her career, became the 51st BSU player to play in 100 games.
- Head Coach **Jim Scanlan**, who is in his first season, has not only matched the Beavers' win total from last season (11), but is one win shy of tying the program record for the most wins by a first year head coach.
- Bemidji State returns to action with a non-conference series at Lindenwood Jan. 2-3.
- The Beavers are 4-0-0 in non-conference play this season.
- BSU is 4-0-1 all-time against Lindenwood, including a 3-0-1 mark last season.
- **Whitney Wivoda** has scored five points (2g, 3a) in five career games against Lindenwood. Wivoda posted a pair of assists in four games against the Lions last season.

## Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 2 Golden Gophers (11-1-2-0, 35 points, 16-1-2), return to action to host St. Lawrence on Sunday, Jan. 4 and Tuesday, Jan. 6.
- Minnesota is 8-1-1 all-time against St. Lawrence, including a two-game road sweep on Oct. 12-13, 2012.
- In its last series Dec. 5-6, Minnesota swept St. Cloud State, winning 12-0 and 7-0. **Hannah Brandt** (2g-7a), **Rachael Bona** (2g-4a), **Dani Cameranesi** (6a) and **Kelly Pannek** (6a) led the Gopher offense as 15 of Minnesota's 16 skaters recorded at least one point in the series and 11 different Gophers scored at least one goal. **Sidney Peters** and **Amanda Leveille** each earned one shutout win in net as well.
- Minnesota continues a seven-game homestand this weekend as the Gophers play their first five games of 2015 at home at Ridder Arena. The Gophers are 51-2-2 in their last 55 home games, dating back to Feb. 18, 2012. This season, Minnesota leads the nation in home attendance, averaging 1,917 fans per game in nine home games.
- Tickets for the 2015 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena March 20 and 22 are on sale now through MyGopherSports.com.
- As Minnesota begins the second half of the regular season, 10 Gophers are in double-figures for scoring, led by Brandt (16g-21a), Cameranesi (15g-15a) and Bona (6g-17a). All 18 skaters have at least one point, and 14 players have scored at least one goal.
- McMillen leads the NCAA with seven power-play goals each this season, and the Gophers have the nation's top power-play unit, converting on 27 of 74 opportunities for a .365 percentage.
- Cameranesi leads the nation with five game-winning goals.
- Brandt is closing in on becoming the seventh Gopher all-time tor reach the 200-point mark, entering the second half of the regular season with 184 career points (72g-112a). Meanwhile, **Maryanne Menefee** (41g-47a), **Meghan Lorence** (43g-41a) and McMillen (34g-49a) are all getting close to the 100-career point mark as well.
- The Gophers' defensemen lead the WCHA blue-liners in scoring, averaging 3.63 points per game. McMillen (10g-8a) ranks fifth in the nation and leads the WCHA defensemen with 18 points in 19 games for a 0.95 points per game average this year.
- Pannek (4g-16a) ranks third in scoring among the nation's rookies, averaging 1.05 points per game. She has 12 points (3g-9a) during a career-best five-game point streak.
- Leveille ranks second in the WCHA and sixth in the nation with a 1.29 goals against average. She also lands second in the league and fifth in the NCAA with a .942 save percentage. Leveille leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation with a .900 winning percentage (13-1-1).
- With 86 goals in 19 games, the Gophers' offense leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation (4.53 goals per game). Meanwhile, Minnesota's 1.11 goals against average is second in the WCHA and fourth in the NCAA.
- Minnesota is 111-4-4 in the team's last 119 games, a stretch that includes an NCAA-record 62-game winning streak (Feb. 28, 2012 through Nov. 17, 2013).

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 6 Bulldogs (7-5-2-2, 25 points; 12-5-3) will be off from outside competition until Jan. 10-11, when Bemidji State travels to AMSOIL Arena. UMD is 1-1 against the No. 9 Beavers this season.
- Before the break, UMD picked up four WCHA points Dec. 5-6 in Columbus against Ohio State with a 2-2 tie and shootout win Friday, followed by a 4-1 triumph over the Buckeyes on Saturday.
- On Friday night, UMD trailed OSU twice, finding the equalizers on goals from **Ashleigh Brykaliuk** and **Katerina Mrázová** to force the game in extra time after a 2-2 regulation. After a scoreless overtime, **Jenna McParland** kept the Bulldogs perfect in shootouts this season with the lone goal, while goaltender **Kayla Black** held OSU scoreless on three attempts.
- Saturday night, OSU again got on the board first with an early second period goal, but UMD scored three unanswered second period goals, including a shorthanded game-winner by **Meghan Huertas** 13:04 into the stanza, to bury the Buckeyes. **Zoe Hickel**, Mrázová and McParland had the games goals, while Brykaliuk had two assists.
- UMD is unbeaten in its last three games and has gone 11-1-1 in its last 13 games.
- Brykaliuk had four points in the series (1g, 3a), and now has seven games where she has recorded two or more points. She leads the Bulldogs with 22 points on 10 goals and 12 assists, tying her rookie output for points only 20 games into the current season. Brykaliuk is averaging 1.10 ppg for UMD.
- Hickel leads the Bulldogs in goals, with 12 tallies in 19 skates and has scored five goals in her last six outings. Hickel is currently tied for 12th in the NCAA for goals per game.
- Black is ranked fourth in the nation with six shutouts and is 10th with a 1.73 GAA. Black is one shutout shy of setting a single-season record for shutouts at UMD.

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (0-13-1-0, 1 point; 0-15-1), return to action January 3 when they host St. Lawrence at All Seasons Arena.
- In their last action prior to the break, the Mavericks dropped two contests at Bemidji State on Dec. 5-6.
- The 16-game winless streak is the longest to start a season in program history.
- The Mavericks scored four goals on Dec. 5 at Sanford Center. That total is the most goals in a single game all season.
- Freshman **Hannah Davidson** had one of her best weekends in a Maverick uniform against the Beavers. She tallied one goal and two assists with a +1 rating. She leads the team in scoring and is tied for sixth in the WCHA in scoring by a freshman, going 2-6--8 in 16 games played.
- Junior **Katie Johnson** had a stellar game Dec. 5 in Bemidji. Johnson scored two of MSU's four goals and added an assist. It's the first time in her career scoring two goals and having three points in a game.
- Freshman **Amanda Conway** recorded her first career points for the Mavericks in the Dec. 5 loss, tallying two assists.
- Junior **Erin Krichiver** had 62 saves against the Beavers. She has 480 total saves this season, ranking her third in the NCAA.

## University of North Dakota

- North Dakota (6-8-2-1, 21 points, 9-9-2) wrapped up the 2014 part of the schedule by sweeping College Hockey America's RIT over the Dec. 12-13 weekend in Rochester, N.Y.
- Senior forwards **Andrea Dalen** and **Josefine Jakobsen** led the way for UND, as the two turned in five-point and four-point efforts over the weekend, respectively.
- In the first game of the series against the Tigers, it took a while for UND to warm up. Jakobsen broke a 0-0 stalemate with less than two minutes remaining in the second period while on the power play. **Amy Menke's** man-advantage goal in the game's final three minutes was the game-winner, while Dalen would score on an empty net to secure the 3-1 win for UND.
- After going scoreless in the first period the day before, UND netted four first-period goals to open the game on Dec. 13. Dalen, **Gracen Hirschy**, Menke and Jakobsen all scored to give UND the 4-0 lead.
- **Meghan Dufault** scored her first of the weekend and Jakobsen netted her second of the game to give UND the 6-1 win.
- All of UND's 19 skaters have recorded a point this season, including 15 goal scorers. **Becca Kohler** leads UND in five major scoring categories, points (21), goals (8), assists (13), power-play goals (3) and game-winning goals (2).
- North Dakota is undefeated (7-0-1) this season when scoring three or more goals in a game.
- In the nation, Jakobsen is seventh among all skaters, first among forwards, with a total of 39 blocked shots (.95 blocks per game).
- Both Jakobsen and Kohler are tied for 15th in the nation with three power-play goals on the year. Additionally, with 21 points, Kohler is 33rd in the nation averaging 1.05 points per game.
- North Dakota's junior class is sixth in the nation in offensive production, having registered 64 points (22g, 42a). Boston College's junior class leads the nation with 130 points.
- UND has scored 11 goals on 53 power-play opportunities so far this season, and its .208 power-play efficiency ranks second in the WCHA. UND has also scored a total of two shorthanded goals so far this season.
- North Dakota is undefeated when scoring on the power play (7-0-0) and has scored more than one power-play goal in four games this season.
- With a .892 efficiency rate while shorthanded, UND has the nation's fifth best penalty-kill unit in the nation and third in the WCHA. North Dakota has conceded nine power-play goals in 83 opportunities.
- North Dakota is one win away from picking up its 100th all-time Western Collegiate Hockey Association victory. Head coach **Brian Idalski** has recorded 88 of UND's 99 conference wins.
- Attendance at North Dakota women's hockey home games has ranked in the top five of the nation for the past four years. So far this season, UND is averaging 1,061 fans per game at Ralph Engelstad Arena.
- With 88 points, Dufault is the closest to becoming the sixth member of the 100-point club at UND.

## Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The Buckeyes (7-7-2-1 WCHA, 24 points; 10-8-2) return to action after the holiday break to take on Penn State in University Park, Pa.
- Last season, the Buckeyes and Nittany Lions met for the first time in program history. Ohio State posted a series sweep with wins of 8-0 and 4-0 in games one and two, respectively.
- The Buckeyes faced Bemidji State Dec. 19-20 in Bemidji, Minn. Ohio State earned a series sweep in the matchup - the second of the season vs. the Beavers.
- In game one, redshirt junior **Stacy Danczak** led the team to its fifth shutout of the season with a career-high 33 saves. The match resulted in a 2-0 win for the Scarlet and Gray, behind goals from senior forward **Taylor Kuehl** and junior forward **Julia McKinnon**.
- In game two, Ohio State completed the sweep, 2-1, courtesy of a two-goal effort from sophomore forward **Claudia Kepler**. Danczak complete her weekend in goal, registering 22 saves.
- Danczak has suited up in nine games, earning a save percentage of .935 and a goals against average of 1.48. Against the Beavers, Danczak recorded 55 stops overall.
- Freshman **Kassidy Sauve** has started in 13 games in goal for Ohio State and holds a record of 6-7-0. The Whitby, Ontario, native retains a save percentage of .910 and a goals against average of 2.38.
- Ohio State is led in scoring by team captain **Sara Schmitt** (4-11-15). She ranks seventh on Ohio State's all-time list for scoring by a defenseman with 76 career points, two shy of passing Shannon Reilly for sixth all-time. In the WCHA, Schmitt ranks tied for third among defensemen in goals, fourth in points and sixth in assists.
- Nineteen players have recorded one or more points for the Buckeyes this season, including three rookies.
- Sophomore **Alexa Ranahan** has registered a team-best 38 blocks, which ranks fifth in the WCHA and eighth nationally. Averaging 1.90 blocks per game, Ranahan is joined on the back end by a Buckeye defensive unit credited with 139 blocks and 6.95 blocks per game.
- Three Buckeyes have garnered individual attention from the WCHA so far this season. Sauve received WCHA Rookie of the Week accolades twice (Oct. 17-18; Oct. 31-Nov. 2), while Danczak picked up WCHA Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 7-11) and Kepler earned WCHA Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 3-5).
- In special teams play, Ohio State is 11-for-92 on power play chances (.120) and 56-for-67 on the penalty kill (.836). Against BSU, the Buckeyes went 2-for-10 on the power play and 4-for-5 on the penalty kill.
- **Erin Selfe**, a fifth-grader at Liking Valley Intermediate, was adopted by the Buckeyes through Team IMPACT, a national nonprofit organization that matches children with life-threatening illnesses with college sports teams. Selfe signed her honorary letter of intent at a press conference following Ohio State's home matchup vs. Minnesota, making her an official Ohio State Buckeye.

- Amanda Arbogast scored the game-winning goal. It was her fourth goal of the season. Assists were awarded to **Jenna Redford**, getting her second, and **Lexi Slattery** with her third.
- Senior defenseman **Audrey Hanmer** scored a short-handed goal to extend the Huskies lead to 2-0 and **Lauren Hespeneide** scored an empty-net goal with just over a minute to play to solidify the Huskies' 3-0 win.

### University of Wisconsin

- The No. 3 Badgers (13-2-1-0, 40 points, 17-2-1) closed out their final series before its semester break with a sweep of North Dakota on Dec. 5 and 7, winning 2-1 on Friday before shutting out UND, 2-0 on Sunday afternoon.
- The Badgers now hold a 12-game unbeaten streak, their longest of the season. During UW's unbeaten streak, **Brittany Ammerman** has 15 points off five goals and ten assists, while **Annie Pankowski** has 13 points on eight goals and five assists.
- The Badgers rank third in the nation in scoring offense, averaging 4.05 goals per game. UW is also third in the nation in scoring defense, holding opponents to 1.10 goals per contest.
- Ammerman, **Sarah Nurse** and **Sydney McKibbon** are tied for 15th in the country in power-play goals with three.
- Three Badgers rank in the top-18 in points per game, as **Karley Sylvester** averages 1.32 points per contest, good for 12th in the nation, while Pankowski is averaging 1.26 points per game, which ranks 14th nationally. Ammerman has a 1.20 points per game average, good for 18th nationally. In addition, McKibbon is putting up 0.90 points per matchup, as teammates **Emily Clark** and Nurse are each averaging 0.88 points per contest.
- Pankowski leads all NCAA rookies in points per game, averaging 1.26 points per game, while Clark checks in at eighth with her 0.88 points per contest.
- **Ann-Renée Desbiens** enters the break with an 14-2-1 record this season, and a .853 winning percentage. Desbiens has a career record of 25-3-1, with her three losses coming at the hands of ranked opponents. Desbiens' ten career shutouts rank sixth on the Badgers' all-time list.
- Wisconsin's freshman class of Pankowski, Clark, **Baylee Wellhausen**, **Lauren Williams** and **Maddie Rolfes** is second in the NCAA in freshmen scoring, as the quintet has put up 20 goals, 33 assists, and 53 points so far this season for an average of 2.65 points per game.
- UW's sophomore class of Nurse, **Melissa Channell**, McKibbon, **Jenny Ryan** and **Mikayla Johnson** rank fourth in the NCAA in sophomore scoring, averaging 3.00 points per game.
- The Badgers' senior class of Ammerman, **Karley Sylvester**, **Blayne Turnbull**, **Katy Josephs** and **Katarina Zgraja** lead the NCAA in senior scoring, averaging 4.25 points per contest.
- The Badgers' lead the nation in shots on goal, averaging 42.30 shots on goal per contest. UW also ranks second in fewest shots against per game, holding opponents to an average of 18.65 shots per contest.
- Wisconsin leads the nation in shot margin, averaging 23.65 more shots per game than their opponents.
