OPENING FACE-OFF

- **Topping the Charts:** For the sixth straight polling week, the WCHA has an NCAA-best four teams in both the USCHO.com (tied) and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* national rankings. Minnesota and Wisconsin are Nos. 2 and 3, respectively, in both polls, while Minnesota Duluth is No. 7 and Ohio State checks in at No. 10/9. Bemidji State is receiving votes in both ledgers.
- **Winning Hockey:** WCHA teams also own an NCAA-best four of the nation's top 10 winning percentages: Minnesota (2nd at .891, 19-1-3), Wisconsin (4th at .818, 17-3-2), Minnesota Duluth (9th at .659, 13-6-3) and Ohio State (10th at .625, 14-8-2). Bemidji State is 11th at .562 (13-10-1).
- **Streaking Along:** Several WCHA teams are riding extended hot stretches. Minnesota's 13-game unbeaten streak (12-0-1) is the second-longest active streak in the country. Ohio State is tied for fourth in that category with a six-game run (6-0-0, all on the road), part of a longer 7-1-1 stretch. Minnesota Duluth is 12-2-1 in its last 15 games, while Wisconsin is 11-1-2 in its last 14 contests.
- **Nonconference Success:** With just two out-of-league contests remaining on the 2014-15 regular season schedule, the WCHA remains the only D-I league to own a winning nonconference record at 34-11-1 (.750).

BY THE NUMBERS

- **1:** A single point separates No. 3 Wisconsin and No. 2 Minnesota atop the WCHA standings. The Badgers have 10 league games remaining, while the Gophers have 12.
- **6:** Consecutive road wins for No. 10/9 Ohio State, establishing a program record. The Buckeyes swept at Bemidji State (Dec. 19-20), at Penn State (Jan. 3-4) and at St. Cloud State (Jan. 9-10). OSU returns home this weekend, before traveling to Ridder Arena to face Minnesota on Jan. 30-31.
- **6 (again):** The number of WCHA teams in the top 10 nationally for scoring defense (Minnesota - 2, Wisconsin - 4, Bemidji State - 6, Ohio State - 8, Minnesota Duluth - 9 and North Dakota - 10). Not surprisingly, all six of those teams have a goaltender in the top 10 for save percentage, led by BSU sophomore **Brittini Mowat** (2nd at .951) and Minnesota junior Amanda Leveille (3rd at .947). UND junior Shelby Amsley-Benzie is seventh (.936), OSU redshirt junior Stacy Danczak is eighth (.933), UW sophomore Ann-Renée Desbiens is ninth (.933) and UMD junior Kayla Black is 10th (.930).
- **9:** Points separating the third through sixth place teams in a four-way battle for the final two home-ice positions for the WCHA playoffs (awarded to the top four finishers).
- **13:** Wins this season by Bemidji State (13-10-1), the fourth-highest single season total in program history.
- **192:** Career points by Minnesota junior forward **Hannah Brandt**, who is eight shy of becoming the seventh Gopher to reach the 200-point plateau. A reigning All-American and Patty Kazmaier Award top-three finalist, Brandt has 77 career goals and 115 collegiate assists.

THE WEEK AHEAD

- **Full Slate of WCHA Series:** The second-half league race heats up with a return to full-time WCHA play, as all eight teams will skate in league series this weekend. No. 10/9 Ohio State puts its six-game winning streak on the line when it hosts North Dakota; No. 2 Minnesota and Minnesota State play a home-and-home set; Bemidji State visits No. 3 Wisconsin in a rematch of two one-goal Badger wins earlier this year; and, No. 7 Minnesota Duluth hosts St. Cloud State.

WCHA RACE RESUMES WITH FULL SLATE OF LEAGUE GAMES

The exciting women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) race, which features a tight chase at the top and a four-way battle for the final two home ice positions, resumes with a full weekend of league games this weekend, Jan. 16-18.

Two-time defending champion Minnesota, coming off a series when it took five of six points from league-leading Wisconsin, faces Minnesota State. The second-ranked Gophers beat Minnesota State twice earlier this season (winning 5-1 in Mankato, Minn., and earning a 4-0 win at Ridder Arena) and have an all-time series record of 67-3-3 against the Mavericks. The teams will play Friday night at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and Saturday afternoon at All Seasons Arena in Mankato. The Gophers have won 22-straight games against the Mavericks, dating back to the 2009-10 season. The Mavericks' last win over the Gophers was a 4-3 victory on Jan. 20, 2007.

Elsewhere around the league, streaking Ohio State hosts North Dakota on Friday and Saturday; Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State and St. Cloud State visits Minnesota Duluth on Saturday and Sunday. Earlier this season, UMD swept the Huskies, 6-1 and 1-0, in St. Cloud, while Wisconsin swept the Beavers, 2-1 and 4-3, in Bemidji. Wisconsin leads the series with BSU 55-4-3 and has won the past eight meetings with the Beavers. Ohio State holds the edge in the all-time series with North Dakota, posting a record of 22-16-4. Earlier this season, the Buckeyes tied UND, 2-2, in game one before falling 4-3 in game two.

The standings show a two-team race for the league title, with Wisconsin (15-3-2-0 and 41 points in the WCHA; 17-3-2 overall) retaining a point lead over second-place Minnesota (12-1-3-1, 40 points; 19-1-3 overall). However, the Gophers hold two games in hand.

There is a tight race for the final two home playoff spots, third and fourth place. Ohio State (9-7-2-1, 30 points; 14-8-2 overall) has won six games in a row - all on the road - and catapulted into third place, two points ahead of Minnesota Duluth, which has played two fewer games than OSU. UMD (8-6-2-2, 28 points; 13-6-3 overall) has a 12-2-1 record in its last 15 games.

Bemidji State (8-9-1-1; 13-10-1 overall) is in fifth place with 26 points, five points better than sixth place North Dakota (6-8-2-1, 21 points; 9-11-2 overall).

The rest of the standings show that St. Cloud State (3-12-1-1, 11 points; 6-16-1 overall) is in seventh place and Minnesota State (0-13-1-0, 1 point; 2-17-1) is in eighth place.

WEEKEND REWIND

Last weekend, Minnesota maintained its unbeaten streak against Wisconsin, beating the Badgers 4-1 in the series opener carried on the Big Ten Network. The teams tied 1-1 Sunday with the Gophers taking the extra point in the standings by winning the shootout, 1-0. The two games matching the No. 2 and No. 3 ranked teams in the country attracted 5,169 fans to Ridder Arena.

The Gophers got two goals and an assist from **Hannah Brandt**, last season's WCHA player of the year, in Saturday's game. Brandt had Minnesota's lone goal when UW ended a 14-game losing streak against Minnesota with the tie Sunday, while she scored again in the shootout to give the Gophers five of a possible six points on the weekend. **Karley Sylvester** had a goal each day for the Badgers

Ohio State moved its record to 7-1-1 in the last nine games with a road sweep at St. Cloud State, 3-1 and 4-0. **Julia McKinnon** had the game-winning goal and an assist in the opener and **Kari Schmitt** added a goal. Schmitt scored twice on Saturday when **Kassidy Sauve** recorded OSU's seventh shutout of the season by making 17 saves.

Minnesota Duluth split with Bemidji State in a battle for teams vying for home ice for the playoffs. The visiting Beavers took the opener, 4-1, for their 13th victory of the season, fourth best in school history. **Kaitlyn Tougas** had a goal and an assist, and **Brittini Mowat** made 37 saves for the Beavers. UMD got 23 stops

In nonconference play, North Dakota a split a series with Syracuse in Grand Forks. **Layla Marvin** had a pair of goals in UND's 4-1 victory. Syracuse earned a split at North Dakota with a 2-1 win on Sunday as Orange goalie Jenn Gilligan made 44 saves.

Minnesota State got its first victories of the season, taking two of three games from Lindenwood. **Anna Keys**, **Hannah Davidson** and the first collegiate goal for **Amanda Conway** helped the visiting Mavericks jump out to a 3-0 lead in the series opener, while **Erin Krichiver** made 26 saves in backstopping the season's first victory. **Nicole Schammel** had a couple of assists.

The Mavs made it two in a row over Lindenwood with a 3-2 win Friday. Conway and Davidson led a comeback from 2-0 down with goals, and **Emma Wittchow** scored with under 12 minutes to play to give the Mavs the lead for good. Schammel, a freshman who leads the team in scoring, again had two assists. The Lady Lions salvaged the final game of the three-game series, 3-1.

Brandt led No. 2 Minnesota with four points (3g, 1a) as the Gophers captured five of six points from third-ranked Wisconsin last weekend at Ridder Arena. The junior from Vadnais Heights, Minn. scored the game-winning goal with a tie-breaking strike late in the second period on Saturday, before adding an assist and a second goal in the third period of Minnesota's 4-1 victory. Brandt then scored the game-tying goal at the 13:28 mark of the third period Sunday and potted the lone goal in the Gophers' 1-0 shootout win. She finished the weekend with a +3 rating, 13 shots on goal and a .767 faceoff winning percentage (33-of-43). A reigning All-American and Patty Kazmaier Award top-three finalist, Brandt ranks second nationally and leads the WCHA with 45 points (21g, 24a).

Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (8-9-1-1, 26 points; 13-10-1) split a road series against No. 7 University of Minnesota Duluth last weekend. The Beavers took the series opener 4-1 before falling in the finale, 2-1.
- With the split, the Beavers move to 6-61-2 all-time against UMD. In addition, the Beavers and Bulldogs split the season series (2-2-0).
- The 4-1 victory Saturday gave the Beavers their 13th victory of the season, which is the fourth-most by a BSU team in program history. The only seasons that Bemidji State had more wins were: 2011-12 (17), 1999-00 (15) and 2010-11 (14).
- Kaitlyn Tougas** led Bemidji State's offense over the weekend with three points (1g, 2a). Tougas notched her fourth multi-point game of the season with a goal and assist in Saturday's victory.
- Junior **Ivana Bilic** tallied a pair of assists against the Bulldogs, which gives her 17 points (5g, 12a). Bilic ranks second in the nation for points (4g, 6a) for a defenseman since Nov. 28.
- Goaltender **Brittini Mowat** went 1-1-0 despite stopping 74 of 77 shots faced over the weekend. With the victory, Mowat has a record of 11-7-1 this season. The 11 wins are the third-most victories in a single season by a goaltender in program history. - The No. 2 Golden Gophers (12-1-3-1, 40 points, 19-1-3 WCHA) wrap up their 2014-15 regular-season meetings against Minnesota State with a home-and-home series this weekend. The Gophers host the Mavericks at 7 p.m. Friday, Jan. 16 before traveling to Mankato, Minn., to conclude the series at 4 p.m. Saturday.
- Minnesota is 67-3-3 all-time against Minnesota State. The Gophers swept the Mavericks in a home-and-home series earlier this season, winning 5-1 in Mankato, Minn., and earning a 4-0 win at Ridder Arena. The Gophers have won 22-straight games against the Mavericks, dating back to the 2009-10 season. The Mavericks' last win over the Gophers was a 4-3 victory on Jan. 20, 2007.
- Minnesota took five of six WCHA points from Wisconsin last weekend with a 4-1 win followed by a 1-1 overtime tie and 1-0 shootout win at Ridder Arena. **Hannah Brandt** led the Gophers with four points (3g-1a) in the series. She had three points in Saturday's 4-1 win, scored the game-tying goal in Sunday's 1-1 tie and scored the lone goal in the 1-0 shootout win. **Amanda Leveille** combined for 55 saves on 57 shots in the series.
- Ten Gophers are in double-figures for scoring, led by Brandt (21g-24a), **Dani Cameranesi** (16g-22a) and **Rachael Bona** (11g-18a). All 18 skaters have at least one point, and 14 players have scored at least one goal.
- Milica McMillen** is tied for the national lead with seven power-play goals this season. The Gophers own the nation's top power-play unit, converting on 27 of 83 opportunities for a .325 percentage, despite not scoring a power-play goal in their last four games.
- Cameranesi ranks second in the nation with five game-winning goals this season.
- Brandt is eight points away from becoming the seventh Gopher all-time to reach the 200-point mark with 192 career points on 77 goals and 115 assists. - Leveille leads the WCHA and ranks fourth in the nation with a 1.17 goals against average. She is second in the WCHA and third in the NCAA with a .947 save percentage. Leveille leads the WCHA and ranks third in the nation with a .895 winning percentage (16-1-2).
- With 106 goals in 23 games, the Gophers' offense leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation, averaging 4.61 goals per game behind Boston College (6.05). Meanwhile, Minnesota's 1.04 goals against average leads the WCHA and ranks second in the NCAA behind Quinnipiac (0.77).
- Minnesota is 115-4-4 in the team's last 123 games, a stretch that includes an NCAA-record 62-game winning streak (Feb. 28, 2012 through Nov. 17, 2013). The Gophers are 54-2-3 in their last 59 home games, dating back to Feb. 18, 2012.
- The Gophers are 52-0-1 in their last 53 true road games (not including neutral-site games); Minnesota's last true road loss was a 4-2 loss at Minnesota Duluth on Jan. 13, 2012. Including all games away from Ridder Arena, Minnesota is 59-1-1 since Jan. 14, 2012.

- North Dakota scored three-straight goals, one each period, to open a 3-0 lead in the first game of the series. With a short lineup due to illness, defenseman **Gracen Hirschy** and **Tori Williams** played as forwards for the weekend and Hirschy opened the scoring with her sixth goal of the season with just under a minute remaining in the first period. The halfway through the second period while on the power play, **Layla Marvin** scored her first of the season to put UND up 2-0. Just after the halfway point in the third, Kayla Gardner added a third for UND. In the final minute of play, Marvin added an empty-netter to secure the win for UND.
- On Sunday, Syracuse goaltender Jenn Gilligan posted a career-high 44 saves to backstop the Orange to a 2-1 win over UND. Hirschy scored her second of the weekend, to cut UND's deficit in half before the close of the second period.
- North Dakota is one win away from picking up its 100th all-time Western Collegiate Hockey Association victory. The weekend sweep against St. Cloud State (Nov. 29-30) gave UND its 98th and 99th WCHA victories. Head coach **Brian Idalski** has recorded 88 of UND's 99 conference wins.
- Junior forwards **Meghan Dufault** and **Becca Kohler** helped the Canadian National Women's Development Team claim gold at the 2015 Nations Cup in Füssen, Germany. Kohler scored the game-winning goal in the gold-medal game against Sweden on Jan. 6. She also scored her team's fourth goal in a 5-1 win against Russia, Jan. 4. - North Dakota's junior class is currently seventh in the nation in offensive production having registered 69 points (24g, 45a). Boston College's junior class leads the nation with 152 points.
