OPENING FACE-OFF

- **A Look at the Polls:** The WCHA continues to be a fixture in the national rankings, with three teams in both the USCHO.com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine national rankings: No. 2 Minnesota, No. 3 Wisconsin and No. 6 Minnesota Duluth.
- **Three in the Pairwise:** With four weeks remaining in the regular season, Minnesota (second), Wisconsin (third) and Minnesota Duluth (sixth) give the WCHA a trio of schools in the top eight of the latest Pairwise rankings. North Dakota (11th), Ohio State (12th) and Bemidji State (14th) round out the WCHA representation.
- **Winning Hockey:** Showcasing the league's depth, the WCHA has an NCAA-best five of the nation's top 12 winning percentages: Minnesota (2nd at .907, 23-1-3), Wisconsin (5th at .788, 19-4-3) and Minnesota Duluth (t-6th at .712, 17-6-3), along with North Dakota (t-11th at .577, 14-10-2).
- **Streaking Along:** Several WCHA teams are riding extended hot stretches. Minnesota's 17-game unbeaten streak (16-0-1) is the second-longest active streak in the country. Minnesota Duluth has won five straight games and is 16-2-1 in its last 19 contests, while Wisconsin is 13-2-3 in its last 18 outings. North Dakota has won four straight, seven of its last eight games and is 10-3-1 since Nov. 21.
- **Nonconference Success:** The WCHA wrapped up its 2014-15 regular season nonconference schedule with an NCAA-best 35-11-2 (.750) mark. In fact, the WCHA is the only D-I league to own a winning nonconference record.
- **See you at the Rink:** Wisconsin (LaBahn Arena), Minnesota (Ridder Arena), Minnesota Duluth (AMSOL Arena) and North Dakota (Ralph Engelstad Arena) rank 1-4 nationally in attendance.
- **Team Canada:** Seven players with WCHA ties are participating this week at Canada's National Women's Team training camp, including current student-athlete **Brigitte Lacquette** (Minnesota Duluth), along with former league standouts **Sarah Davis** (Minnesota), **Jocelyne Larocque** (Minnesota Duluth), **Caroline Ouellette** (Minnesota Duluth), **Natalie Spooner** (Ohio State), **Kelly Terry** (Minnesota) and **Jessica Wong** (Minnesota Duluth). Additionally, UMD assistant coach Laura Schuler is serving in the same capacity for Team Canada.

BY THE NUMBERS

- **8 and 17:** Shutouts this season by Minnesota Duluth junior goaltender **Kayla Black**, setting the school single-season record; and, Black's career blankings, tied with Riitta Schaublin for most in UMD annals.
- **43:** Career victories for North Dakota junior goaltender **Shelby Amsley-Benzie**, most in school history. Amsley-Benzie, who leads the WCHA and is second nationally with a .947 save percentage overall, is 7-1-1 with two shutouts, a .961 save percentage and 0.99 GAA over her last nine starts.
- **350:** Career wins for Wisconsin head coach **Mark Johnson**, who reached the plateau with a 4-0 victory Sunday over defending national champion Clarkson. Johnson, who has spent his entire 12-year head coaching career in Madison, owns a 350-68-33 record. The other three coaches to reach 350 wins are Katey Stone (Harvard), Michael Sisti (Mercyhurst) and **Shannon Miller** (Minnesota Duluth).

THE WEEK AHEAD

- **Trio of WCHA Series:** Six WCHA schools compete against each other in full weekend series, while St. Cloud State visits Minnesota State in a rare Monday night, single-game matchup. No. 6 Minnesota Duluth hosts North Dakota in a matchup of streaking teams; No. 3 Wisconsin travels to Minnesota State; and, No. 2 Minnesota - with an eight-point lead in the standings - welcomes Ohio State to Ridder Arena.

**STREAKING NORTH DAKOTA AND MINNESOTA DULUTH COLLIDE IN KEY WCHA SERIES**

North Dakota, which has won four games in a row, travels to Minnesota Duluth this weekend in a collision of teams fighting for a home playoff spot with four weeks left in the regular season. It is the marquee matchup among the three league series this weekend (Jan. 30-31) in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA).

Third place UMD has won five games in a row, is 16-2-1 in its last 19 contests and holds a seven-point lead over fourth place North Dakota. Winners of seven of its last eight games, UND is trying to hold off both Ohio State and Bemidji State and guarantee a top-four finish in the standings, assuring home ice advantage for the first round of the league playoffs. The Bulldogs split with North Dakota earlier in the season in Grand Forks, with a 2-1 overtime loss on Oct. 17 before rebounding for a 1-0 triumph on Oct. 18. Additionally, five of the last 10 games between Duluth and UND have gone into overtime, with UND scoring two OT goals and three games ending in ties.

In other WCHA series this weekend, Minnesota, which has vaulted into the league lead and positioned itself to win a third-straight WCHA regular season title, hosts Ohio State, while second place Wisconsin visits Minnesota State. Minnesota is 60-8-2 all-time against OSU, including a road sweep over the Buckeyes in November when the Gophers won 4-2 and 5-3. Wisconsin holds great success over the Mavs as well, winning a pair of games in Madison, 8-2 and 8-0, in November. Wisconsin leads the all-time series with Minnesota State 64-2-3.

While Bemidji State and St. Cloud State are idle this weekend, the Huskies return to action for a rare Monday night game when it faces Minnesota State Feb. 2 in Mankato, Minn.

WEEKEND REWIND

Last weekend, Minnesota padded its league lead with two wins at St. Cloud State. **Hannah Brandt** had three assists to become only the fourth Gophers' player to ever record 200 points for her career and **Maryanne Menefee** had a pair of goals in a 4-0, series-opening victory. The Gophers completed the sweep with a 7-1 victory. Minnesota was led by Brandt (one goal, four assists), Menefee (three goals, one assist) and **Kelly Pannek** (one goal, three assists). **Shyler Sletta** made 18 saves to earn her second career shutout in her second career start. Sletta has yet to yield a goal in her 10 collegiate appearances.

Minnesota Duluth swept Minnesota State convincingly in Mankato. The Bulldogs cruised to a 12-0 win in the opener, as **Brigitte Lacquette** scored a hat trick. **Lara Stalder**, Lacquette and **Katerina Mrázová** each had four points. UMD won 4-0 Saturday as junior goaltender **Kayla Black** made 25 saves, and **Zoe Hickel** and **Ashleigh Brykaliuk** had both a goal and an assist. With the shutout Saturday, Black took over sole possession of UMD's single-season shutout record with her eighth on the year. She also is now tied with **Riitta Schaublin** with 17 career shutouts. Black ranks second in the NCAA with eight shutouts this season.

North Dakota delighted the home crowd and swept Bemidji State, 4-1 and 5-1, to move into fourth place. **Amy Menke** scored twice, the first short-handed, on Saturday and Menke had a goal and an assist in the series finale. **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** made 23 saves the first day and posted her 43rd career victory in the series finale, besting **Stephanie Ney's** all-time UND mark of 42. She made 21 saves, including seven on the penalty kill. Amsley-Benzie has not given up more than one goal in her last six starts.

In nonconference play involving nationally-ranked teams in Madison, Wis., Wisconsin tied defending national champion Clarkson 1-1 and beat the Golden Knights 4-0 to present coach **Mark Johnson** with his 350th career victory. **Karley Sylvester** had a goal in each game and Johnson became only the fourth coach to reach the coaching milestone on the strength of **Annie Pankowski's** three goals. **Ann-Renée Desbiens** made 24 stops and earned her eighth shutout of the season, which is tied for second in the nation. Johnson joined UMD's Shannon Miller, Harvard's Katey Stone and Mercyhurst's Mike Sisti on the 350-win list.

Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (9-12-1-1, 26 points; 14-13-1) were swept over the weekend by the University of North Dakota by scores of 4-1 and 5-1.
- With the pair of losses, the Beavers drop to 20-35-4 all-time against North Dakota and 9-22-2 in Grand Forks, N.D.
- BSU sits in sixth place in the WCHA standings with 29 points. The Beavers have finished in sixth place in two of the last three seasons.
- The Beavers' streak of 27 successful penalty kills was snapped Sunday when UND's Sam LaShomb netted a power-play goal. The penalty-kill streak dated back to Dec. 19 versus Ohio State. Despite the streak being disrupted, the Beavers still rank fourth nationally and second in the WCHA with a .906 penalty-kill percentage.
- Bemidji State leads the nation with 495 blocked shots. The Beavers have led the country in blocked shots each of the past two seasons.
- Junior **Stephanie Anderson** netted her team-leading ninth goal of the season Saturday. Anderson's nine goals are the most for a BSU player in a single season since former Beaver Natasha Kostenko had 10 during the 2012-13 season.
- Senior **Kayleigh Chapman** notched her third career assist against North Dakota Saturday. The Virden, Manitoba native has seven career points (1g, 6a).
- Kaitlyn Tougas** tallied her 20th point with an assist Saturday afternoon. The assist came in Tougas' 27th game, which is the fastest a BSU player has reached the 20-point plateau since 2011-12 when five different Beavers reached the mark: Sadie Lundquist (13 games), Emily Erickson (14 games), Montana Vichorek (20 games), Erika Wheelhouse (21 games) and Marlee Wheelhouse (23 games).
- Hanna Moher** netted her sixth goal of the season Sunday, which is one shy of her career-high (seven goals) that she set last season.
- Bemidji State has 14 victories, which is the third-most by a BSU squad in program history. Only the 2011-12 (17 wins) and 1999-00 (15 wins) teams have more wins than this season's squad.
- BSU will be idle this weekend. This will be the last bye week of the season for the Beavers. After the bye week, Bemidji State makes its 2015 home debut Feb. 6-7 against St. Cloud State University. BSU is 7-5-0 on its home ice this season.
- The Beavers and Huskies split their series earlier this season in St. Cloud, Minn. Bemidji State took the opening contest 4-1 before falling in the series finale, 3-0.

- The No. 2 Golden Gophers (16-1-3-1, 52 points; 23-1-3) return home to host Ohio State (14-10-2, 9-9-2-1) at Ridder Arena at 7 p.m. Friday and 2 p.m. Saturday.
- Minnesota is 60-8-2 all-time against OSU, including a road sweep over the Buckeyes in November. The Gophers won 4-2 and 5-3, and **Meghan Lorence** scored her first career hat trick in game two of the series. **Amanda Leveille** earned both wins in net for the Gophers.
- The Gophers enter this weekend's series after picking up a road sweep over St. Cloud State. Minnesota was led by **Hannah Brandt** (one goal, four assists), **Maryanne Menefee** (three goals, one assist) and **Kelly Pannek** (one goal, three assists) as the Maroon & Gold won 4-0 and 7-1 over the Huskies. **Shyler Sletta** made 18 saves to earn her second career shutout in her second career start in game one of the series.
- The 2015 NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be held at Ridder Arena March 20 and 22, and tickets are almost entirely sold out. Only all-session standing-room only tickets remain available through MyGopherSports.com for \$20.
- Thirteen Gophers are in double-figures for scoring, led by Brandt (23g-33a), **Dani Cameranesi** (17g-30a) and Pannek (10g-24a). All 18 skaters have at least one point, and 16 players have scored at least one goal.
- Milica McMillen** is tied for third in the nation with seven power-play goals this season, and the Gophers have the nation's top power-play unit, converting on 31 of 98 opportunities for a .316 percentage.
- Cameranesi is tied for second in the nation with five game-winning goals this season.
- Brandt became the seventh Gopher to surpass the 200-career point mark over the weekend. She enters this weekend's series against Ohio State ranked sixth among all-time Gophers with 203 points on 79 goals and 124 assists. Meanwhile, Lorence (46g-48a) and McMillen (34g-52a) are getting close to the 100-career point mark as well.
- The Gophers' defensemen lead the nation's blue-liners in scoring, averaging 3.63 points per game. McMillen (10g-11a) and **Rachel Ramsey** (6g-17a) rank sixth and seventh in the nation with 0.88 and 0.85 points per game, respectively. The duo also ranks second and third in the WCHA.
- Pannek leads the nation's rookies with 34 points (10g-24a) and a 1.26 points per game average.
- Leveille leads the WCHA and ranks third in the nation with a 1.15 goals against average. She is second in the WCHA and third in the NCAA with a .946 save percentage. Leveille leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation with a .905 winning percentage (18-1-2) as well.
- With 131 goals in 27 games, the Gophers' offense leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation, averaging 4.85 goals per game behind Boston College (5.62). Meanwhile, Minnesota's 1.07 goals against average leads the WCHA and ranks second in the NCAA behind Quinnipiac (0.96).
- Minnesota is 119-4-4 in the team's last 127 games, a stretch that includes an NCAA-record 62-game winning streak (Feb. 28, 2012 through Nov. 17, 2013). The Gophers are 55-2-3 in their last 60 home games, dating back to Feb. 18, 2012.
- The Gophers are 55-0-1 in their last 56 true road games (not including neutral-site games); Minnesota's last true road loss was a 4-2 loss at Minnesota Duluth on Jan. 13, 2012. Including all games away from Ridder Arena, Minnesota is 62-1-1 since Jan. 14, 2012.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 6 Bulldogs (12-6-2-2, 34 points; 17-6-3) earned their sixth series sweep of the season by beating host Minnesota State by scores 12-0 and 4-0.
- Friday night, the Bulldogs scored the most goals in a game since 2002, blowing open the game with five second period goals. Five players recorded three or more points, including three - **Brigette Lacquette** (3g, 1a) **Lara Stalder** (2g, 2a) and **Katerina Mrázová** (4a) - who notched four points. UMD's five power play goals Friday night was the most by a Bulldog squad since netted five against St. Cloud State on Feb. 19, 2011 en route to a 9-0 victory. UMD's record for power play goals scored in a game is six, set against Ohio State back on Dec. 9, 2009.
- With three power play goals Friday night, Lacquette tied a UMD record for most power play goals in a game. Both Jenny Potter and Caroline Ouellette also reached that mark.
- With the shutout in Saturday's 4-0 win, junior goaltender **Kayla Black** took over sole possession of the single-season shutout record with her eighth of the year. She also is now tied with Riitta Schaublin with 17 career shutouts. Black ranks second in the NCAA with eight shutouts and 13th in both GAA (1.67) and saves percentage (.936). Of players in the top-15 in the nation, only one goaltender has recorded more saves than Black has (567). Black is now 10th all-time in the UMD record books with her 567 saves.
- With 16 wins this season after the weekend, Black jumps into a tie for the 8th most wins in a season by a UMD netminder. It is also a career season-high for Black.
- Black also contributed an assist Saturday on **Ashleigh Brykaliuk's** second period goal. That marked Black's fifth career assist -- she already owned a UMD record for that -- and first since Oct. 4, 2013.
- In all five players registered four or more points in the series, including four that recorded five (Hickel 2g, 3a, Stalder 3g, 2a, Mrázová 1g, 4a and Lacquette 3g, 2a).
- UMD owns eight-straight wins against MSU, dating back to the 2012-13 season and is 57-6-4 all-time against the Mavericks.
- **Zoe Hickel** extended her scoring streak to seven games, her second longest scoring spree this season. (Hickel had a 10-game scoring streak between Oct. 26 and Nov. 22). Hickel has now compiled four goals and six assists for 10 points over those last seven outings.
- Lacquette's busy weekend on the scoresheet catapulted her into a tie for fourth for career goals by a defenseman (19), sole possession of eighth place in blueliner assists (44) and seventh among all scoring defensemen with 63 career points.
- The Bulldogs are currently on the nation's fifth-longest winning streak with five games. UMD owns the ninth ranked scoring offense (3.15 gpg) and the ninth ranked scoring margin (1.42). The Bulldogs have the NCAA's fifth most dangerous power play at 22.2% (24/108) and the nation's seventh-best winning percentage at .712 with a record of 17-6-3.
- Hickel was one of 15 nominees named for the 2015 BNY Mellon Wealth Management Hockey Humanitarian Award and one of only six women's college players nominated overall.
- Lacquette and assistant coach **Laura Schuler** will miss the entire week due to Team Canada Winter Camp duties. Both are expected back before the Bulldogs hit the ice against North Dakota Friday.
- UMD hosts UND this weekend, the team it currently has a seven point lead over in the WCHA standings for third place. The Bulldogs split with North Dakota earlier in the season in Grand Forks, with a 1-2 overtime loss on Oct. 17 before rebounding for a 1-0 triumph on Oct. 18.

Additionally, five of the last 10 games between Minnesota Duluth and UND have gone into overtime, with UND scoring two OT goals and three games ending in ties. In the three ties, Minnesota Duluth has won two of the shootouts.
- Coming off a road sweep of Ohio State, UND continued its winning ways in a home sweep of Bemidji State last weekend. The North Dakota offense scored nine goals on the weekend, the most the Beavers have given up in a weekend this season. A total of 14 different skaters recorded a point for UND in the series. Additionally, junior goaltender **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** became the program's all-time-wins leader picking up her 43rd career win on Sunday.
- In Saturday's contest, **Amy Menke** got UND on the board with her first shorthanded goal and her seventh of the season, before scoring again in the period to give UND the one-goal lead heading into the third period. **Josefine Jakobsen** and **Meghan Dufault** also scored in a 4-1 win.
- On Sunday, **Andrea Dalen**, **Shannon Kaiser**, **Sam LaShomb**, Menke and **Halli Krzyzaniak** all scored in the 5-1 victory..
- Amsley-Benzie is second in the nation, and leads the WCHA, with a .947 save percentage. She is second only to Boston College's Katie Burt who has a .948 save percentage, but averages 8 less saves per game than Amsley-Benzie.
- North Dakota has only lost once in its last nine games (2-1-6) that have gone into overtime.
- North Dakota picked up its 100th all-time Western Collegiate Hockey Association victory with the 1-0 win against No. 9/10 Ohio State on Jan. 16, 2015.
- Five UND skaters enter the weekend with at least a two-game point streak. Dalen (1g, 1a), Dufault (1g, 2a), **Samantha Hanson** (0g, 3a) and Menke (3g, 1a) all recorded a point in the past two games, while **Becca Kohler** (0g, 4a) has recorded a point in her last three games.
- Jakobsen needs seven points to surpass Michelle Karvinen for the No. 3 spot on the program's career scoring list. Jakobsen currently has 125 points, while Karvinen ended her career with 131 points. Sophomore defenseman **Gracen Hirschy** is five points shy of becoming the second-leading defensive scorer in program history. She ranks fourth in career-points for defensemen at UND with 37 points. North Dakota pushed ahead 1-0 in the opening stanza courtesy of a goal at 9:39 from UND junior Tanja Eisenschmid. For the game, Ohio State outshot North Dakota, 26-15.
- Similar to game one of the series, the Buckeyes were unable to come away with coveted conference points in the series, falling by the same margin to UND, 1-0. An evenly matched opening to the game, the Buckeyes and UND were scoreless until the final minute of the first period. With coincidental penalties called at the 18-minute mark, the teams were skating four-on-four when North Dakota's Gracen Hirschy found an opening in the Buckeye defense and scored over the shoulder of goalie **Stacy Danczak** at 19:28.
- Danczak has suited up in 13 games, earning a save percentage of .936 and a goals against average of 1. Against UND, Danczak recorded 39 stops overall. She has six wins on the season, with three losses and two ties.
- Rookie goalie **Kassidy Sauve** has started in 15 games in goal for Ohio State and holds a record of 8-7-0. The Whitby, Ontario, native retains a save percentage of .920 and a goals against average of 2.06. Sauve's total of five shutouts ranks tied for sixth nationally and tied for third in the WCHA. Among her freshmen peers, Sauve is tied for second in the nation.
- Ohio State is led in scoring by **Claudia Kepler**, who has contributed a line of 9-10-16. A balanced scoring attack, 21 players have recorded one of more points for the Buckeyes.
- Ohio State holds a record of 8-1-0 when leading after the first period of play and a 12-1-1 standing when ahead after two periods. On the flip side, the Buckeyes are 0-6-1 when behind after the first period and 0-9-1 when trailing to end the second period.

- Wisconsin leads the all-time series with Minnesota State 64-2-3. In their previous 67 contests against Minnesota State, the Badgers have scored 326 goals against the Mavericks for an average of 4.57 goals per contest.
- The Badgers took the series against the Mavericks in Madison, winning the opener 8-2 before blanking MSU, 8-0, in the series finale. 10 different Badgers lit the lamp during the series, led by Pankowski who tallied four goals against the Mavericks.
- With a win this weekend against Clarkson on Sunday, Wisconsin head coach **Mark Johnson** became the fourth coach in NCAA Division I women's hockey history to win 350 games. Johnson enters the weekend with a 350-68-33 record. The other three coaches to reach 350 wins are Katey Stone (Harvard), Michael Sisti (Mercyhurst) and Shannon Miller (Minnesota Duluth).
