OPENING FACE-OFF

- **Topping the Charts:** For the fifth straight polling week, the WCHA has an NCAA-best four teams in both the USCHO.com and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* national rankings. Minnesota and Wisconsin are Nos. 2 and 3, respectively, in both polls, while Minnesota Duluth is No. 7 and Ohio State checks in at No. 10.
- **Winning Hockey:** WCHA teams also own an NCAA-best four of the nation's top 10 winning percentages: Minnesota (2nd at .905, 18-1-2), Wisconsin (t-3rd at .875, 17-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (8th at .675, 12-5-3) and Ohio State (10th at .591, 12-8-2). Bemidji State is 11th at .568 (12-9-1).
- **Streking Along:** Several WCHA teams are riding extended hot stretches. Wisconsin's 12-game unbeaten streak (11-0-1) is the second-longest active streak in the country, while Minnesota is right behind with its own 11-game winning streak. Minnesota Duluth is 11-1-1 in its last 13 contests, while Ohio State - which has vaulted into fourth place in the WCHA standings and 10th in the national rankings - has won four straight games and is 5-1-1 in its last seven contests.
- **Nations Cup:** Continuing a longstanding tradition of international success, 23 current or former WCHA players (representing seven member institutions and playing for five countries) participated in the just-concluded Nations Cup in Füssen, Germany. Current WCHA student-athletes **Ann-Renée Desbiens** and **Sarah Nurse** (UW), along with **Meghan Dufault** and **Becca Kohler** (UND), all won gold with Canada's National Women's Development Team. The roster for silver medalist Sweden featured **Johanna Fällman** of UND, **Caroline Markström** of SCSU, and UMD teammates **Linnea Hedin**, **Maria Lindh** and **Michelle Löwenhielm**. Fellow Bulldog **Lara Stalder** played for Switzerland, while UND's Tanja Eisenschmid and MSU's **Anna-Maria Fiegert** skated for Germany. Eleven alumni also played for Canada, Finland, Germany, Sweden and Switzerland.

BY THE NUMBERS

- **4 and 5:** The number of points separating the third through sixth place teams in the WCHA standings, along with the point differential between the top two teams, setting the stage for a thrilling second half race for the league regular season crown and postseason home-ice advantage (awarded to the top four finishers).
- **12:** Victories by Bemidji State (12-9-1) under first-year head coach **Jim Scanlan**, the Beavers' most wins in a single season since 2011-12 (17).
- **26 and 24:** Points by Wisconsin forward Annie Pankowski and Minnesota forward Kelly Pannek, who stand 1-2 among all NCAA freshmen.
- **.768:** The WCHA's non-conference winning percentage (31-9-1), the best mark in the country.

THE WEEK AHEAD

- **Border Battle:** No. 2 Minnesota hosts No. 3 Wisconsin this weekend in the latest installment of the Gophers-Badgers Border Battle rivalry. The Gophers, who have won the last 13 straight meetings between the two teams (including a road sweep in Madison in October), enters the weekend trailing the WCHA-leading Badgers by five points. Wisconsin comes to Ridder Arena, a 24-game road unbeaten streak, the longest such streak in program history. Saturday night's game will be televised live on Big Ten Network (4:30 p.m. CT puck drop).
- **Two Key WCHA Series:** No. 10 Ohio State brings its four-game winning streak into a series at St. Cloud State. No. 7 Minnesota Duluth opens the second half by hosting Bemidji State, whom the Bulldogs lead by two points in the standings.
- **Nonconference Tests:** Minnesota State plays a trio of games at Lindenwood, while North Dakota hosts Syracuse.

BORDER BATTLE HIGHLIGHTS RETURN TO WCHA PLAY

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, the only women's league in the country with four teams ranked in the top 10, resumes conference play in the 2015 portion of the schedule with a clash between the top two teams in the league.

League-leading Wisconsin travels to two-time defending champion Minnesota for a pair of games that could very well determine the WCHA champion. Saturday's game at Ridder Arena will air live on the Big Ten Network at 4:30 p.m. CT. The series finale is Sunday at 2 p.m. CT.

No. 2 Minnesota enters this weekend's series with a 42-26-8 all-time mark against No. 3 Wisconsin. The Gophers have won the last 13 straight meetings between the two teams, including a road sweep in Madison in October. The Gophers won the first game 4-1 before coming from behind in a 2-1, overtime win in game two of the series.

Minnesota's senior class is 14-1-1 against Wisconsin, and the juniors, sophomores and freshmen have never lost to the Badgers. Wisconsin goes to Minneapolis with a 24-game road unbeaten streak, the longest such streak in program history. Wisconsin's last road loss came at Minnesota, when UW dropped a 2-0 contest on Oct. 12, 2013.

In other league series this weekend, St. Cloud State hosts Ohio State Jan. 9-10 and Minnesota Duluth entertains Bemidji State Jan. 10-11. The Beavers and Bulldogs split their series earlier this season in Bemidji. UMD holds the edge in the all-time series over BSU, 60-5-2. All five of BSU's victories have come in the last five seasons. Ohio State holds the edge in the all-time series with St. Cloud, posting a record of 36-24-7. Earlier this season, the Buckeyes split a two-game series with the Huskies.

Minnesota State starts off a busy week of action when it plays Lindenwood at St. Charles, Mo. tonight, Jan. 7, and again Friday and Saturday, Jan. 9-10. North Dakota ends its holiday break with a non-conference series in Grand Forks, N.D. against Syracuse.

Every team has completed at least half of their 28-game league schedules and the standings show a two-team race for the league title with a tight bunch for spots three through six.

Wisconsin (15-2-1-0 and 40 points in the WCHA and 17-2-1 overall) takes a 12-game winning streak into 2015 and has a five-point lead on second place Minnesota, the two-time defending league champion. The Gophers, who are 11-1-2-0 in WCHA play (35 points), have played two fewer league games than the Badgers. Minnesota has won 11 in a row and has an 18-1-2 overall mark.

There is a tight race for the final two home playoff spots, third and fourth place. Minnesota Duluth currently is in third place with 25 points. UMD is unbeaten in its last three games and has gone 11-1-1 in its last 13 contests. The Bulldogs are 7-5-2-2 in league play (12-5-3 overall) and one point ahead of Ohio State (7-7-2-1, 24 points; 12-8-2), which jumped into fourth place with a sweep over Bemidji State right before Christmas.

Bemidji State (7-8-1-1, 12-9-1 overall) is in fifth place with 23 points, just one behind OSU and two points better than sixth place North Dakota (6-8-2-1, 21 points, 9-9-2 overall).

WEEKEND REWIND

In games Jan. 2-4, Ohio State won two games at Penn State, Bemidji State split a pair of games at Lindenwood, Minnesota State remained winless, falling 3-1 to St. Lawrence at home, while Minnesota beat St. Lawrence twice at Ridder Arena (10-0 and 5-1).

Last weekend at Penn State, Ohio State outshot the Nittany Lions 35-9 and **Hayley Studler** scored her first two goals as a Buckeye in a 3-1 win on Saturday. **Kassidy Sauve** made 23 saves and the Buckeyes got goals from six different

players in a 6-0 victory Sunday. **Taylor Kuehl** had three points for OSU in the series finale.

In Missouri, Bemidji State dropped its fourth straight game when it fell to Lindenwood on Friday, 1-0, but the Beavers rebounded and took a 6-0 victory over the Lions Saturday. After scoring only once during the losing string, the Beavers' scoring burst included sophomore **Lauren Miller's** hat trick and two assists by freshman **Emma Terres**. BSU's **Brittini Mowat** had 30 saves in her seventh career shutout.

Senior **Kathleen Rogan** returned to the Minnesota State lineup and scored her first goal of the season, but it wasn't enough as St. Lawrence took a narrow victory. The Mavericks' 17-game winless streak is the longest to start a season in program history.

After beating Minnesota State in Mankato on Saturday, St. Lawrence ran into a buzzsaw in Minnesota on Sunday and fell 10-0 as **Kelly Pannek** had five points, including a hat trick, and **Rachael Bona** added three goals of her own. In the series finale Tuesday, Bona had two goals and an assist in Minnesota's 5-1 victory. The Gophers completed the non-conference season 7-0.

Bona had five goals and an assist in Minnesota's two victories over St. Lawrence on Sunday and Tuesday. The senior from Coon Rapids, Minn. recorded her second career hat trick in Sunday's 10-0 win, netting three goals – including the game-winner just 1:20 into the game – on six shots. Bona then scored a pair of late third-period goals Tuesday to break open a close game in an eventual 5-1 Gophers win. With her consecutive three-point games, Bona now is third in the WCHA and sixth nationally with 29 points (11g, 18a) on the season.

She also added a goal in Tuesday night's 5-1 victory and now has a career-best seven-game point streak (7g, 11a, 18pts). Pannek leads all NCAA rookies with 26 points, while her 1.25 points per game average is second-best.

Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (7-8-1-1, 23 points; 12-9-1) split a road series against Lindenwood University last weekend. The Beavers dropped the series opener, 1-0 before defeating the Lions 6-0 in the series finale.
- The 6-0 victory Saturday gave Bemidji State its 12th win of the season, which is the most wins in a single season for BSU since 2011-12 (17).
- **Lauren Miller** spearheaded the Beavers' offensive outburst Saturday with her first collegiate hat trick. Miller became just the 12th BSU player to have a hat trick and the first since **Erin Cody** Jan. 28, 2011 against University of Minnesota Duluth.
- Freshman **Emma Terres** not only scored her first collegiate point against the Lions but also tacked on two more as the New Hope, Minn. native tallied two assists. The three helpers were the second-most by a defenseman in a single game in program history.
- **Madison Hutchinson** tallied a pair of assists in Saturday's victory, which was the third multi-assist game of her career. Despite being just a sophomore, Hutchinson already ranks seventh in program history for the most assists by a defenseman (18).
- Senior **Rachael Kelly** also notched a two-assist game against Lindenwood Saturday. It was Kelly's second career multi-assist game and fourth career multi-point game.
- Goaltender **Brittini Mowat** made 30 saves to earn her seventh career shutout in Saturday's 6-0 victory. Mowat's seven shutouts rank second in program history behind **Zuzana Tomcikova** (18).
- The six-goal outburst Saturday was the second-highest total by the Beavers this season. The only game BSU scored more was Dec. 5 against Minnesota State when it scored seven.
- BSU closes out non-conference play with a 5-1-0 record.
- Bemidji State will return to conference action next weekend as it travels to play nationally-ranked Minnesota Duluth Jan. 10-11.

- Minnesota returns to WCHA action and hosts No. 3 Wisconsin (17-2-1, 13-2-1-0 WCHA) at Ridder Arena at 4:30 p.m. CT Saturday and 2 p.m. CT Sunday.
- Minnesota enters this weekend's series with a 42-26-8 all-time mark against Wisconsin. The Gophers have won the last 13-straight meetings between the two teams, including most recently a road sweep in Madison in October. The Gophers won the first game 4-1 before coming from behind in a 2-1 overtime win in game two of the series.
