OPENING FACE-OFF

- **NCAA-Best Four in the Top 10:** The WCHA has an NCAA-best four teams (tied with the ECAC) in both of the national opinion polls. Minnesota, Wisconsin and Minnesota Duluth are Nos. 2, 3 and 6, respectively, in both the USCHO.com and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls, while North Dakota is No. 8/9.
- **Three in the PairWise:** With four weeks remaining until the NCAA Tournament field is selected, Minnesota (second), Wisconsin (third) and Minnesota Duluth (seventh) give the WCHA a trio of schools in the top eight of the latest PairWise rankings. North Dakota is just outside in the ninth spot, while Ohio State (12th) and Bemidji State (14th) round out the WCHA representation.
- **Winning Hockey:** Showcasing the league's impressive depth, the WCHA has matched the ECAC with an NCAA-best six of the nation's top 16 winning percentages: Minnesota (2nd at .871, 25-2-4), Wisconsin (3rd at .800, 22-4-4), Minnesota Duluth (9th at .650, 17-8-5), North Dakota and Ohio State (t-12th at .583, 16-11-3) and Bemidji State (16th at .550, 16-13-1).
- **Streking Along:** Several WCHA teams are riding extended hot stretches. Wisconsin is second in the nation with a seven-game unbeaten streak (5-0-2) and is 16-2-4 in its last 22 contests. Minnesota (18-1-2 in its last 21 games) and North Dakota (6-1-1 in its last eight and 12-4-3 since Nov. 21) both snapped each other's unbeaten runs last weekend, but have been among the hottest teams in the country.
- **The Championship Chase:** Minnesota and Wisconsin have both secured home ice advantage for the first round of the 2015 WCHA playoffs, while the Gophers have a five-point lead with four games to play. Any combination of three Minnesota wins and/or Wisconsin losses would give the Gophers their third-straight WCHA regular season crown.
- **Race for Home Ice:** Four teams - Minnesota Duluth (42 points), North Dakota (41), Ohio State (37) and Bemidji State (35) are still alive for the final two home ice spots.
- **Nonconference Success:** The WCHA finished its 2014-15 regular season nonconference schedule with an NCAA-best 35-11-2 (.750) mark. In fact, the WCHA is the only D-I league to own a winning nonconference record.
- **Next Generation:** The WCHA has five of the nation's top 20 scoring freshmen in Minnesota's **Kelly Pannek** (1st at 1.23 points per game), Wisconsin's **Annie Pankowski** (2nd, 1.17) and **Emily Clark** (10th, 0.85), and Minnesota State's **Nicole Schammel** (17th, 0.66) and **Hannah Davidson** (20th, 0.56).
- **See you at the Rink:** Wisconsin (LaBahn Arena), Minnesota (Ridder Arena), North Dakota (Ralph Engelstad Arena) and Minnesota Duluth (AMSOIL Arena) rank 1-4 nationally in attendance. Last weekend, 2,273 attended the UMD at UW game on Saturday, while 4,418 were in attendance for Friday's Minnesota at UND contest.

BY THE NUMBERS

- **0:** As in goals allowed. Shutouts have been en vogue this season, with WCHA goaltenders posting a combined 53 clean sheets. UMD's **Kayla Black** (9) and UND's **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** (5) have both set school single-season records, while UW's **Ann-Renée Desbiens** (11), OSU's **Kassidy Sauve** (6) and BSU's **Brittini Mowat** (5) are all second in school annals.
- **16:** Wins this season by Bemidji State (16-13-1), just one shy of the program record established by the 2011-12 Beavers (17-17-3).

**TWO HOME PLAYOFF SPOTS STILL OPEN;
FULL ROUND OF WCHA SERIES AHEAD**

The women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) heads into the penultimate week of the regular season with a torrid race going on amidst four teams vying to finish in the top four spots in the standings and gain home ice advantage for the league playoffs. A full round of league games this weekend (Feb. 13-14) will try to sort out the picture for the first round of the playoffs, which begin later this month.

Minnesota, the two-time defending league champion and current conference leader, hosts third-place Minnesota Duluth at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. The Gophers, who have already clinched home ice for the playoffs, are 42-24-7 all-time against Minnesota Duluth, including a 3-0 win and 3-3 overtime tie (shootout loss) to the Bulldogs in Duluth, Minn. in the second week of the season.

Wisconsin, the WCHA's second-place team and already assured of home ice for the playoffs, goes on the road to face fifth-place Ohio State in Columbus, Ohio. Wisconsin, which is 16-2-4 in its last 22 games, swept the Buckeyes by scores of 6-0 and 3-0 on Oct. 10 and Oct. 12.

Fourth-place North Dakota visits St. Cloud State for the final series of the season at the Herb Brooks National Hockey Center. North Dakota hosted St. Cloud State, Nov. 29-30, and swept the Huskies by scores of 6-1 and 3-1. UND has won the last 18 games against St. Cloud State and last lost to the Huskies on Jan. 15, 2010.

Sixth-place Bemidji State, still clinging to home ice aspirations, travels to Minnesota State for the final games at All Seasons Arena in Mankato, Minn. The Beavers lead the all-time series against the Mavericks 29-24-10 and swept Minnesota State earlier this season in Bemidji, Minn. by scores of 7-4 and 2-0.

Minnesota State follows up a busy weekend by traveling to St. Cloud State for a Monday night game, Feb. 16.

WEEKEND REWIND

Last weekend, Wisconsin took five of six points from Minnesota Duluth in a battle of two nationally-ranked heavyweights at LaBahn Arena in Madison, Wis. The teams played a scoreless tie Friday and the Badgers picked up the extra point by winning the shootout. It was the 23rd overtime game between the teams, but first 0-0 tie between the Bulldogs and Badgers in program history. In the series finale, **Blayne Turnbull**, playing on Senior Night, scored three times on the power play and assisted on another power-play goal as the Badgers won 5-0. **Courtney Burke** had assists on all four power play goals and **Ann-Renee Desbiens** had 20 stops in recording her 11th shutout of the season and second of the weekend. UMD's **Kayla Black** has nine shutouts after her whitewash Friday.

North Dakota got a shutout from **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** and handed Minnesota its second loss of the season - and first in a true road game since Jan. 13, 2012. A crowd of 4,818 saw **Amy Menke** score twice and **Josefine Jakobsen** add an unassisted goal, while Amsley-Benzie turned away 25 shots for her fifth shutout and fourth in the last eight games. The Gophers, however, solved Amsley-Benzie in the series finale and took a 3-1 victory. **Dani Cameranesi**, **Hannah Brandt** and **Rachel Ramsey** had goals for the Gophers.

Ohio State stayed on UND's heels in the race for fourth place by sweeping Minnesota State, 3-2 and 6-0, in Columbus, Ohio. **Lauren Spring** scored the series opening game-winner late in the third period, just 39 seconds after Minnesota State's **Nicole Schammel**'s second goal of the game had tied it. **Alexa Ranahan** assisted on all three OSU scores Friday. In the series finale, the Buckeyes got nine points from its fourth line and freshman **Kassidy Sauve** made 14 saves in compiling her sixth shutout. **Maggie Rothgery** had two goals and two assists, linemate **Katie Matheny** also scored twice and **Bryanna Neuwald** had three assists.

Bemidji State kept pace with Ohio State by sweeping St. Cloud State in Bemidji. **Kaitlyn Tougas** scored in each game and **Brittini Mowat** turned in a 14-save shutout. Mowat's 14 victories are the most by a BSU goaltender in a single season in program history and the Beavers are one win shy of tying the program record for the most wins in a single season. The 2011-12 BSU squad holds the record with 17 victories.

Turnbull stole the show on Senior Night in Madison, netting her first career hat trick while also tallying an assist in No. 3 Wisconsin's 5-0 blanking of No. 7 Minnesota Duluth in a top-10 showdown. In the process, Turnbull became the first player in school history to collect three power-play goals in a single game. The senior from Stellarton, Nova Scotia not only has the school single-game power-play record, she also shares the UW standard for the most shorthanded goals in a game (2). On Sunday, Turnbull was also instrumental in helping the Badgers kill all four of UMD's power-plays, as UW leads the nation in penalty killing with a .968 conversion rate.

Desbiens had a pair of shutouts and was stellar in net for No. 3 Wisconsin against No. 7 Minnesota Duluth, stopping all 43 shots she faced to help the Badgers take five of six points in the pivotal WCHA clash between top-10 teams. The sophomore from La Malbaie, Québec stopped 23 shots in a scoreless tie Friday and turned back three of UMD's four skaters in the shootout to propel UW to the extra league point. Desbiens earned her 11th shutout of the year Saturday night, making 20 saves in a 5-0 win. Her 11 shutouts this season are not only the second-most in the country, but also in program history, as only former Patty Kazmaier Award winner Jessie Vetter had more (14) in a single season. Desbiens leads the WCHA and ranks third nationally with a 1.13 goals against average, while ranking fourth nationally with a .942 save percentage and fifth with a .778 winning percentage.

The Bulldogs weathered a 41-23 UW shot advantage, and generated plenty of their own scoring chances. **Zoe Hickel** led UMD with five shots.
- Junior goaltender **Kayla Black** had 41 saves Friday, racking up her ninth shutout on the season (she already had the UMD singl-season shutout record) and recorded her 18th career shutout, setting a Bulldog career record for clean sheets.
- Saturday night the penalty box was UMD's second opponent, and the Badgers netted three first period power play goals en route to a 5-0 blanking of the Bulldogs. In all, Wisconsin's first four scores (and four of the five) came with an extra skater, tying a previous UMD opponent record for most power goals surrendered in a game. - North Dakota picked up three crucial points toward hosting home playoffs with a weekend split against No. 2 Minnesota, delivering the Gophers just their second loss on the season with a 3-0 shutout on Friday night. Minnesota rebounded on Saturday to force the split with a 3-1 decision.
- **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** made 25 saves to record her fifth shutout of the year, fourth in the last eight games, and the 10th of her career on Friday. She now owns the program records for career shutouts and single-season shutouts.
- **Amy Menke** got UND on the board near the end of the second period after getting on a breakaway during a penalty kill with help from **Tanja Eisenschmid**. **Josefine Jakobsen** scored less than two minutes later to put UND up by two before the end of the second period, while Menke added an empty net goal in the final eight seconds of play.
- Amsley-Benzie leads the nation with a .950 save percentage. Her goals-against average of 1.37 ranks third in the WCHA and fifth nationally.
- In games played since Jan. 1, Amsley-Benzie has recorded a .967 save percentage and a 0.88 goals-against average. She has conceded eight goals in her nine games played since the start of the new year. Amsley-Benzie has become the sole owner of UND's goaltending records for career wins (45), career shutouts (10) and single-season shutouts (5).
