### OPENING FACE-OFF

- **NCAA-Best Four in the Top 10:** The WCHA concluded the regular season with an NCAA-best four teams (tied with the ECAC) in both the USCHO.com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls: No. 2 Minnesota, No. 3 Wisconsin, No. 8 North Dakota and No. 9 Minnesota Duluth.
- **Three in the PairWise:** With just two weeks remaining until the NCAA Tournament field is selected, Minnesota (second), Wisconsin (third) and Minnesota Duluth (eighth) give the WCHA a trio of schools in the top eight of the latest PairWise rankings. North Dakota is just outside in the ninth spot, while Ohio State (t-12th) and Bemidji State (t-14th) round out the WCHA representation.
- **Winning Hockey:** Showcasing the league's impressive depth, the WCHA has an NCAA-best six of the nation's top 15 winning percentages (tied with the ECAC): Minnesota (2nd at .886, 29-2-4), Wisconsin (4th at .765, 24-6-4), Minnesota Duluth (t-9th at .632, 19-10-5), North Dakota (t-9th at .632, 20-11-3), Bemidji State (t-14th at .544, 18-15-1) and Ohio State (t-12th at .544, 17-14-3).
- **Better than Ever:** For the first time in the league's 16 seasons, the WCHA has six teams that have posted at least 17 wins: Minnesota (29), Wisconsin (24), North Dakota (20), Minnesota Duluth (19), Bemidji State (18) and Ohio State (17). The possibility remains for the WCHA to have a quartet of 20-win teams, which would mark the fifth occurrence in league annals.
- **Hot at the Right Time:** Entering the WCHA postseason, Minnesota is 22-1-2 in its last 25 games. North Dakota is 10-1-1 in its last 12 contests and has the nation's fourth-best record since Nov. 21 at 16-4-3 (.773). Wisconsin is 7-2-2 in its last 11 outings, while Minnesota Duluth is coming off a season-ending sweep.
- **Three-Peat:** After compiling 72 points on the strength of a 22-2-4-2 league record, Minnesota secured its third straight WCHA regular season championship (ninth overall).
- **First-Year Successes:** Under the leadership of first-year head coach Jim Scanlan, Bemidji State set a program record for most WCHA victories (13) and has a chance to add to its school standard for overall wins (18). With first-year bench boss Eric Rud at the helm, St. Cloud State doubled its overall win total from a year ago (8, up from 4).
- **Humanitarian Award Finalists:** Two WCHA student-athletes - Wisconsin's Brittany Ammerman and Minnesota Duluth's Zoe Hickel - are among the five finalists for the 2015 Hockey Humanitarian Award.
- **See You at the Rink:** Wisconsin (LaBahn Arena), Minnesota (Ridder Arena), North Dakota (Ralph Engelstad Arena) and Minnesota Duluth (AMSOIL Arena) finished the regular season 1-4 in national attendance, with the Badgers and Gophers tying for top honors.

### BY THE NUMBERS

- **267:11:** The program-record shutout streak by North Dakota junior goaltender Shelby Amsley-Benzie, who enters the postseason with four consecutive shutouts and six blankings in her last eight contests.

### THE WEEK AHEAD

- **WCHA Quarterfinals:** The first round (quarterfinals) of the 2015 WCHA playoffs take place, with best-of-three series at the home sites of the top four seeds: (1) Minnesota hosts (8) Minnesota State at Ridder Arena; (2) Wisconsin welcomes (7) St. Cloud State at LaBahn Arena; (3) North Dakota entertains (6) Ohio State at Ralph Engelstad Arena; and, (4) Minnesota Duluth hosts (5) Bemidji State at AMSOIL Arena. The winners of the four quarterfinal series advance to the 2015 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, held March 7-8 at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, N.D.

## WCHA PLAYOFFS OPEN WITH FOUR COMPELLING MATCHUPS

The women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association's playoff season opens with a very recognizable look: the top four seeds are the same. For the third straight season, Minnesota won the regular season championship, followed by Wisconsin, North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth. All four will host series this weekend.

But the first round of the WCHA playoffs, which will be held Feb. 27-March 1, will have a new wrinkle as all the opponents for this weekend's best-of-three series have been shuffled from last season.

Top-seed Minnesota (22-2-4-2, 72 points; 29-2-4) will face No. 8 seed Minnesota State (1-26-1-0, 4 points; 3-30-1) at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. Minnesota is 69-3-3 all-time against Minnesota State. The Gophers swept the Mavericks in two home-and-home series this season. Minnesota won 5-1 and 4-0 in November before recording back-to-back, seven-goal games in 7-3 and 7-1 wins in January.

Second-seed Wisconsin (19-6-3-1, 61 points; 24-6-4) will host No. 7 seed St. Cloud State (5-22-1-1, 17 points; 8-26-1) in a repeat of last weekend's series at LaBahn Arena in Madison. The Badgers are coming off a split vs. SCSU, as UW dropped the first game of their series, 2-1 before blanking the Huskies, 5-0 last Saturday. UW's loss to St. Cloud State last Friday marked the end of a 22-game winning streak against the Huskies. The Badgers lead their series with the Huskies 60-8-2, and are 33-3-0 against St. Cloud State in Madison.

Third-seed North Dakota (16-9-3-2, 53 points; 20-11-3) welcomes sixth-seeded Ohio State (12-13-3-1, 40 points; 17-4-3) to Ralph Engelstad Arena. UND won the regular-season match up against Ohio State, going 3-0-1 against the Buckeyes. In the first half of the season, Ohio State forced a 2-2 tie in the first game of the series in Grand Forks before UND claimed a 4-3 win to close out the weekend. In January, UND posted a pair of 1-0 shutouts over the Buckeyes in Columbus.

Bemidji State (13-14-1, 18-15-1) earned the No. 5 seed and will travel to Duluth, Minn. to take on fourth-seeded Minnesota Duluth (14-10-4-2, 48 points; 19-10-5) at AMSOIL Arena. It is the fifth time BSU has drawn the No. 5 seed for the postseason, which ties a program record for the highest finish. This will be just the third time the Beavers and Bulldogs have matched up in the postseason and the first since the 2011 WCHA Final Face-Off. The two teams split the season series 2-2-0, with each team winning in the other's home building once. UMD is 61-6-2 all-time against Bemidji. All six of BSU's wins in the series have come in the last five seasons.

The winners of the first round series advance to the 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF March 7-8 in Grand Forks, N.D. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

With the regular season complete, Minnesota's Hannah Brandt was crowned the league's scoring champion and North Dakota's Shelby Amsley-Benzie was the league's top goaltender.

Brandt, a junior from Vadnais Heights, Minn. and the reigning WCHA Player of the Year, is second in the nation with 62 points and third with 1.82 points per game overall. Brandt led the WCHA with 50 points in 27 league games, tallying 21 goals and 29 assists.

Amsley-Benzie, a junior from Warroad, Minn. leads the nation with a .955 save percentage. Additionally, her goals-against average of 1.17 in 22 league games led the WCHA. In games played since Jan. 1, Amsley-Benzie leads the nation in save percentage (.974), goals-against average (0.61) and shutouts (8). Six of her shutouts have come in the past eight games, while she enters the postseason riding a program-record shutout streak of 267 minutes and 11 seconds.

## WEEKEND REWIND

Last weekend, North Dakota earned the third seed by blanking Minnesota State twice, 7-0 and 2-0, behind the shutout goaltending of **Shelby Amsley-Benzie**, who recorded 24 saves on the weekend. **Josefine Jakobsen** and **Andrea Dalen** each had a goal and two assists in the series opener and **Marissa Salo** had the game-winner in the series finale.

Minnesota Duluth beat Ohio State, 3-1 and 5-2 to assure home ice for the playoffs for the 16th straight season. **Kayla Black** made 35 saves on Friday, while **Brigitte Lacquette** had three assists as the Bulldogs rallied from two goals down with five goals over the final 20:17 on Sunday. Lacquette was one of five Bulldogs (**Zoe Hickel**, **Lara Stalder**, **Brianna Gillanders** and **Katerina Mrázová**) to record two or more points in the season finale.

Minnesota closed out the regular season with a road sweep at Bemidji State and denied the Beavers a chance at home ice for the playoffs. Minnesota won 3-2 on a late **Rachael Bona** goal on Friday before skating to a 4-2 win on Saturday. **Dani Cameranesi** (2g-2a) led all players with four points in the series. She had a goal and an assist each day. **Megan Lorence** recorded her 100th career point with a power-play goal in game two of the series, while **Amanda Leveille** and **Sidney Peters** each earned a win in net.

St. Cloud State caught Wisconsin's attention before this week's playoff series by upsetting the Badgers, 2-1, on Friday. **Julie Friend** made 52 saves and kept UW off the scoreboard until the final 16 seconds. **Alyssa Erickson** and **Payge Pena** gave Friend offensive support with goals. Wisconsin came back Sunday to win 5-0. **Ann-Renée Desbiens** recorded her 13th shutout, which is second best nationally.

Cameranesi earned her second straight honor after leading Minnesota with four points (tied for most in the WCHA) in a road sweep at Bemidji State. The sophomore from Plymouth, Minn. was on the ice for five of the Gophers' seven goals, while recording two goals, two assists, nine shots on goal, one blocked shot and a +1 rating. In Friday's 3-2 win, Cameranesi scored the game-tying goal in the second period, and assisted on the go-ahead score just 3:17 later. Saturday, she set up Maryanne Menefee's game-winning goal at 1:24 of the third period before sealing the victory with an empty-netter. Cameranesi ranks fourth in the nation with 55 points and is third with 34 assists.

Amsley-Benzie remained perfect between the pipes for North Dakota last weekend against Minnesota State, recording her third- and fourth-consecutive shutouts as UND clinched third place and home ice for the first round of the WCHA playoffs. The junior from Warroad, Minn. turned away all 24 shots she faced, helping UND go a perfect six-for-six on the penalty kill. Amsley-Benzie ends the regular season as the WCHA's leading goaltender with a save percentage of .955 and goals against average of 1.17 in league play. She enters the playoffs riding a program-record shutout streak of 267 minutes and 11 seconds.

## Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (13-14-1-1, 41 points; 18-15-1) were swept by Minnesota last weekend by scores of 3-2 and 4-2 at Sanford Center. The Beavers finish their home schedule with a 9-7-0 record, their highest win total at home since the 2010-11 season when they also had nine wins.
- With the pair of losses, the Beavers move to 5-60-7 all-time against Minnesota, including 2-28-3 in Bemidji, Minn.
- Bemidji State finishes the regular season with an 18-15-1 record overall and a 13-14-1 mark in WCHA play. Both win totals are the most in program history for the Beavers.
- Defense has been a major contributor to BSU's success this season as it ranks in the top 10 nationally in several major defensive categories including: blocked shots (1st, 611), penalty-kill percentage (4th, .907) and scoring defense (9th, 1.79).
- Junior **Kaitlyn Tougas** tallied a goal in Friday's 3-2 loss to Minnesota. Tougas leads the team with 26 points (12g, 14a), which is the most for a BSU skater since 2011-12 when former Beaver Sadie Lundquist had 35 points.
- Ivana Bilic notched an assist on Tougas' goal Friday. Bilic ranks seventh in the WCHA among defensemen with 21 points (5g, 16a) and leads the nation with 611 blocked shots
- Senior **Alex Citrowske** closed out her career at Sanford Center with a pair of points (1g, 1a) against Minnesota. Citrowske, who is a captain, has eight points (4g, 4a).
- Goaltender **Brittini Mowat** finished the regular season with a 16-11-1 record with an 1.70 goals against average and .943 save percentage. Despite being a sophomore, Mowat already has entered BSU's goaltending career record book for several categories including: games (61, t-5th), minutes played (3543:05, 5th), shutouts (9, 2nd), wins (26, 3rd) and saves (1,650, 5th).
- Defenseman **Alexis Joyce** leads BSU freshmen with 17 points (4g, 13a) this season. Her 17 points rank second behind Lisa Peters (27 points) on the all-time freshman defenseman scoring list. Joyce also ranks second nationally with 108 blocked shots behind teammate **Ivana Bilic** (129).
- Bemidji State has earned the No. 5 seed for the first round of the WCHA Playoffs and will travel to Duluth, Minn. to take on the No. 4 seed University of Minnesota Duluth Feb. 27-March 1 in a best-of three series. It is the fifth time BSU has drawn the No. 5 seed for the postseason, which ties a program record for the highest finish.
- This will be just the third time the Beavers and Bulldogs have matched up in the postseason and the first since the 2011 WCHA Final Faceoff. The two teams split the season series 2-2-0 with each team winning in the other's home building once.
- BSU is 6-61-2 all-time against Minnesota Duluth with two of the victories coming this season. All six of BSU's wins in the series have come in the last five seasons.
- **Stephanie Anderson** is a player to watch this weekend as she has scored three goals in four games against UMD this season. Anderson scored a goal in each game of the series the Beavers played earlier this season in Duluth, Minn.

## Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 2 Golden Gophers (22-2-4-2, 72 points; 29-2-4), host eighth-place Minnesota State (3-30-1, 1-26-1-0 WCHA) in a WCHA first round playoff series at Ridder Arena this weekend.
- Minnesota, the WCHA regular season champion, is 69-3-3 all-time against Minnesota State. The Gophers swept the Mavericks in two home-and-home series this season. Minnesota won 5-1 and 4-0 in November before recording back-to-back seven-goal games in 7-3 and 7-1 wins in January.
- The Gophers closed out the regular season with a road sweep at Bemidji State. Minnesota won 3-2 on a late **Rachael Bona** goal on Friday before skating to a 4-2 win on Saturday. **Dani Cameranesi** (2g-2a) led all players with four points in the series. **Megan Lorence** recorded her 100th career point with a power-play goal in game two of the series, and **Amanda Leveille** and **Sidney Peters** each earned a win in net.
- The 2015 NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be held at Ridder Arena March 20 and 22, and tickets are sold out. Fans interested in being put on a waitlist should additional tickets be made available should contact the Gopher Sales & Service Department at 612-624-8080 (option 2).
- The Gophers are on a five-game winning streak. Minnesota is 125-5-5 in the team's last 135 games, a stretch that includes an NCAA-record 62-game winning streak (Feb. 28, 2012 through Nov. 17, 2013). The Gophers are 58-2-4 in their last 64 home games, dating back to Feb. 18, 2012. This season, Minnesota is 14-1-3 at home and leads the nation in home attendance at 1,984 fans per game in 18 home games.
- Seven Gophers have hit the 30-point mark this season, led by **Hannah Brandt** (27g-35a), Cameranesi (21g-34a) and **Kelly Pannek** (12g-27a). **Maryanne Meneffee** (18g-17a) and Bona (13g-22a) are also among the Gophers' top-five scorers. Thirteen Gophers are in double-figures for scoring, and all 18 skaters have at least one point.
- Brandt leads the WCHA and is second in the nation with 59 points. Her 1.82 points per game is third in the NCAA. Brandt leads the WCHA with 27 goals and 35 assists as well. Cameranesi is second to Brandt in the WCHA with 21 goals, 34 assists and 55 points.
- The Gophers have the nation's top power-play unit, converting on 37 of 119 opportunities for a .311 percentage. **Milica McMillen** and Cameranesi are tied for fifth in the nation with seven power-play goals each.
- Pannek leads the nation's rookies with 39 points (12g-27a).
- Cameranesi (40g-51a) and McMillen (34g-56a) are approaching the century mark for career scoring.
- The Gophers' defensemen lead the nation's blue-liners in scoring, averaging 3.43 points per game. **Rachel Ramsey** (8g-23a) leads the WCHA and ranks third in the nation with 0.89 points per game, and McMillen (10g-15a) is third in the WCHA and seventh in the nation with 0.78 points per game.
- Leveille ranks third in the WCHA and fifth in the nation with a 1.23 goals against average. She is also third in the WCHA and fourth in the NCAA with a .943 save percentage. Leveille leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation with a .875 winning percentage (23-2-3) as well.

## Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 9 Bulldogs (14-10-4-2, 48 points; 19-10-5) cemented home playoff ice for the 16th consecutive time in program history over the weekend with a series sweep in Duluth over Ohio State by 4-1 and 5-2 scores.
- Friday night senior **Zoe Hickel** scored in the opening 23 seconds of the second period. After OSU equalized, it was rookie defenseman **Jessica Healey** with a bouncing shot from the left point that found the net and the game-winning goal at 17:26 mark. Sophomore **Michela Cava**, who already had an assist on Healey's score, netted her own power play goal 1:15 into the third period to ice the game at 3-1 for UMD.
- The Bulldogs found themselves down 2-0 Sunday before finally getting on the scoreboard with 17 seconds remaining in the second stanza on a goal by **Katerina Mrázová**. Healey again found the twine, this time knotting the game at 2-2 at 8:59 of the third period. From there, UMD would offensively overwhelm the Buckeyes with three more goals, including a game-winning tip from **Brienna Gillanders** on a **Brigitte Lacquette** blast at 12:56 for the 3-2 lead. Hickel and **Lara Stalder** would each add empty netters to pad the final 5-2 score.
- The series sweep was UMD's seventh of the year, the most by a Bulldog squad since the 2010-11 season.
- UMD is now 61-12-3 all-time against OSU. UMD finishes the regular season 3-0-1-1 against the Buckeyes and the Bulldogs are unbeaten versus OSU in their last five skates, and have gone 7-1-3 in their last 11 head-to-head contests.
- Seven players posted two or more points in a game against OSU over the weekend, including five that did so Sunday (Lacquette, Hickel, Stalder, Gillanders and Mrázová).
- With three assists, Lacquette has climbed to the seventh all-time scoring defenseman with 67 points and is tied with Jessica Wong for the seventh most assists by a blue liner. Lacquette ranks 8th in the nation among all scoring defenseman with 23 points on six goals and 17 helpers.
- Hickel has 92 career points after a one goal, two assist weekend (45g, 47a) and leads UMD in both scoring with 31 points and goals with 18 in just 33 games.
- Sophomore goaltender **Kayla Black** surpassed Jennifer Harss for third on the career saves list, with a total of 2,437 after the weekend sweep. Black has played 99 career games, (10 more played than Harss) and is now tied with Kim Martin with the second most games played by a UMD netminder in a career. Riitta Schaublin has the record with 104.
- **Jenna McParland's** three assists against OSU push her into sole possession of 14th place on UMD's all-time career scoring chart with 114 points (50 goals, 64 assists).
- UMD will continue its home WCHA playoff streak next weekend when it hosts the Beavers at AMSOIL Friday, Saturday and if needed, Sunday. The Bulldogs went 2-2 against BSU during the regular season.

## University of North Dakota

- For the fifth-straight season, No. 7 North Dakota (16-9-3-2, 53 points; 20-11-3) will host the first round of WCHA playoffs. Third-seed UND welcomes the sixth-seeded Ohio State Buckeyes to Ralph Engelstad Arena for a three-game series this weekend, Feb. 27-March 1.
- UND won the regular-season match up against Ohio State, going 3-0-1 against the Buckeyes. In the first half of the season, Ohio State forced a 2-2 tie in the first game of the series in Grand Forks before UND claimed a 4-3 win to close out the weekend. In January, UND posted a pair of 1-0 shutouts over the Buckeyes in Columbus.
- North Dakota secured home ice and a third-place finish in the WCHA with a 7-0 win against Minnesota State last Friday. UND then finished off the weekend series posting its fourth-straight shutout in a 2-0 win, which also marked the fifth-straight 20-win season and 100th WCHA win for head coach **Brian Idalski**.
- 10 skaters recorded points for UND in the 7-0 routing of Minnesota State. **Andrea Dalen** and **Josefine Jakobsen** recorded three-point outings with one goal and two assists each. The forward line of **Meghan Dufault**, **Becca Kohler** and **Amy Menke** produced three goals and three assists, with each forward tallying one goal and one assist each. Defenseman **Samantha Hanson** and **Sam LaShomb** also scored one goal each.
- In the series finale, **Marissa Salo** scored her third collegiate goal and her first game-winner in the second period. **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** recorded her third-set of back-to-back shutouts.
- All of UND's 19 skaters and one goaltender have recorded a point this season, including 16 goal scorers. Kohler leads the team in points with 29, while she and Dufault both lead the team in assists with 18. **Josefine Jakobsen** leads the team with 15 goals.
- Amsley-Benzie leads the nation with a .955 save percentage. Additionally, her goals-against average of 1.15 ranks is tied for second nationally and tied for first in the WCHA. In games played since Jan. 1, Amsley-Benzie leads the nation in save percentage (.974), goals-against average (0.61) and shutouts (8). Six of her shutouts have come in the past eight games and she has conceded eight goals in her 13 games played since the start of 2015.
- Amsley-Benzie has become the sole owner of UND's goaltending records for career wins (49), career shutouts (14) and single-season shutouts (9). Also, with 16 wins this season, she is approaching her previous school record for single-season wins of 19 set in 2012-13. She is also on a program-record shutout streak spanning 267 minutes and 11 seconds. The last goal she conceded came in the second period against Minnesota on Feb. 7.
- Jakobsen is on a six-game point streak, having tallied five goals and two assists since Jan. 30. It ties her previous career-best streak of six games when she registered 11 points between Nov. 18, 2012 to Dec. 8, 2012.
- Jakobsen surpassed Michelle Karvinen for the No. 3 spot on the program's career scoring and career-goals lists after a three point weekend Feb. 13-14. Jakobsen now has 136 points and 58 goals.
- Sophomore defenseman **Gracen Hirschy** is three points shy of becoming the second-leading defensive scorer in program history. She ranks third in career-points for defensemen at UND with 39 points.
- Jakobsen is tied for ninth among all skaters, first among forwards, with a total of 68 blocked shots, averaging 2.00 blocks per game. Defensemen **Tanja Eisenschmid** is 12th in the nation for blocked shots with 65. With 29 points through 30 games, Kohler is 27th in the nation (0.97 points per game).
- UND has scored 19 goals on 93 power-play opportunities and its .204 power-play efficiency ranks second in the WCHA and ninth in the nation. UND has also scored a total of six shorthanded goals so far this season, tied for second in the nation. North Dakota is undefeated when scoring on the power play (12-0-1) and has scored more than one power-play goal in six games.

- The Buckeyes (12-13-3-1, 40 points; 17-14-3) will suit up against No. 3 seed North Dakota this weekend in the 2015 WCHA Playoffs.
- The playoff series marks the first between Ohio State and North Dakota. The Buckeyes and UND have met four times this season, with the Buckeyes falling in three contests and tying in another.
- Most recently, the Buckeyes battled No. 9 Minnesota Duluth on the road. The Bulldogs swept the Scarlet and Gray in the final series of the regular season by scores of 3-1 and 5-2.
- In game one, the Buckeyes held the Bulldogs scoreless in the first period before giving up two goals in the second. Senior **Kari Schmitt** responded with her sixth goal of the season for Ohio State; however, UMD sealed the score at 3-1 early in the third.
- In game two, sophomore forward **Claudia Kepler** put Ohio State up 2-0 midway through the second period, securing her 12th goal of the season. Minnesota Duluth took the reins in the third, scoring four goals - two of which were on an empty net.
- Rookie goalie **Kassidy Sauve** has started in 19 games in goal for Ohio State and holds a record of 9-10-0. The Whitby, Ontario, native retains a save percentage of .923 and a goals against average of 2.05. Sauve's six shutouts rank eighth nationally and fourth in the WCHA. Among her freshmen peers, Sauve is third in the nation. Against Duluth, she made 33 stops in game one.
- Redshirt junior **Stacy Danczak** has suited up in 17 games this season, earning a goals against average of 1.69 and save percentage of .923. She now has eight wins on the season, with four losses and three ties.
- Both Buckeye goalies - Sauve and Danczak - rank in the Top 10 in the conference in terms of save percentage. Danczak is sixth, while Sauve is seventh.
- OSU is led in scoring by senior **Taylor Kuehl**, who has 24 points on 10 goals and 14 assists. Kuehl is climbing the ranks on Ohio State's all-time career lists, ranking 14th in points (85) and 10th in points scored by a forward (85).
- 21 players have recorded one or more points for the Buckeyes.
- Ohio State is 11-2-0 when leading after the first period of play and a 14-2-1 standing when ahead after two periods. The Scarlet and Gray have scored first in 21 games this season and are 16-4-1 with the opening goal.
- Team captain **Sara Schmitt** has recorded four goals and 16 assists for 20 points on the season. She ranks sixth on Ohio State's all-time list for scoring by a defenseman with 81 career points. With five more points, Schmitt will pass Emily Hudak for fifth all-time. **Kari Schmitt**, on the other hand, stands seventh on the list with 79 career points.
- In the WCHA, Kari Schmitt ranks fifth among defensemen in points (22) and Sara Schmitt is ninth (20). Kari is fifth in the league in terms of goals (6), while Sara is ninth (4). In assists, Kari and Sara are tied in seventh with 16.
- Sophomore **Alexa Ranahan** has registered a team-best 62 blocks, which ranks seventh in the WCHA and 16th nationally among defensemen. Averaging 1.82 blocks per game, Ranahan is joined on the backend by a Buckeye defensive core credited with 209 blocks and 6.15 blocks per game this season.
- Senior forward **Kayla Sullivan** was named one of the 15 nominees for the BNY Mellon Wealth Management Hockey Humanitarian Award, which is presented annually to college hockey's finest citizen - a student-athlete who makes significant contributions not only to his or her team but also to the community-at-large through leadership in volunteerism.
- In special teams play, Ohio State is 20-for-139 on power play chances (.144) and 81-for-98 on the penalty kill (.827).

- As the Badgers pressed for a comeback with just minutes left to play, sophomore forward, **Payge Pena**, found a way to put the puck in the open net and extended St. Cloud's lead to 2-0.
- Wisconsin broke Friend's shutout with 16 seconds left, but the Huskies strong defense prevailed and stole the win from one of the best teams in the nation.
- Wisconsin came with a vengeance on Sunday, taking the series finale, 5-0. Junior goaltender, **Katie Fitzgerald**, was busy in nets as she faced 14 shots in both the first and second, and 16 in the third for a total of 44 shots on net.
- The Huskies will return to Madison's Labahn Arena on Friday, Feb. 27 to start the first round of playoffs against Wisconsin.

### University of Wisconsin

- After facing St. Cloud State in the final series of the regular season, the No. 3 Badgers (19-6-3-1, 61 point; 24-6-4) welcome the Huskies back to Madison for the first round of the WCHA Playoffs.
- The Badgers are coming off of a series split vs. SCSU, as UW dropped the first game of their series, 2-1 before blanking the Huskies, 5-0.
- UW's loss to St. Cloud State last Friday marked the end of a 22-game winning streak against the Huskies.
- The Badgers lead their series with the Huskies 60-8-2, and are 33-3-0 against St. Cloud State in Madison. UW has posted three shutouts against St. Cloud State this year, and have outscored the Huskies 13-2.
- Wisconsin is 50-18 in postseason contests, and has outscored its opponents 252-121 in postseason games.
- In postseason contests with St. Cloud State, Wisconsin is a perfect 6-0, and have bested the Huskies in their previous two WCHA first round series.
- It marks the second-straight year UW has opened the WCHA playoffs against the same team it wrapped up regular season play against, as Wisconsin ended the 2013-14 regular season on the road at Minnesota State before hosting the Mavericks for the first round of the WCHA playoffs.
- The Badgers have recorded as many shorthanded goals this season (4) as it has given up on its opponents power-plays (4).
- The Badgers lead the nation in penalty killing, with a conversion rate of .962 and is also tied for the NCAA lead in scoring defense, holding opponents to an average of 1.12 goals per contest.
- The Badgers are 33-14 all-time in the WCHA playoffs, and have advanced to the WCHA Final Faceoff the past three seasons.
- The Badgers lead the nation in shots on goal, averaging 41.53 shots on goal per game. Wisconsin also ranks third nationally in shots against, holding opponents to an average of 19.53 shots on goal per contest. UW peppered St. Cloud State last weekend, outshooting the Huskies 97-27.
- Wisconsin is tied for the nation's lead in home attendance, as both UW and Minnesota have averaged 1,984 fans per home game.
- **Ann-Renee Desbiens** ranks second in the country in shutouts with 13 this season and is one shutout shy of tying Jessie Vetter's school record of 14 set during the 2008-09 season.
- **Annie Pankowski** leads all NCAA freshmen in scoring, averaging 1.12 points per game, which ranks 13th among all NCAA players. Pankowski is on a hot streak, scoring nine goals in the past nine games and her 18 goals this year are tied for the seventh-most goals in program history by a frosh.
- Pankowski, along with former UW standouts Brianna Decker, Meghan Duggan, Alex Rigsby, Hilary Knight and Jessie Vetter, were each selected to represent the United States at the 2015 IIHF Women's World Championship, March 28 to April 4, in Malmo, Sweden. Decker, Duggan, Knight, Rigsby and Vetter were all part of the 2013 IIHF Women's World Championship team, and Decker, Duggan, Knight and Vetter helped the U.S. win silver at the 2014 Winter Olympics. Pankowski was a member of the U.S. National Team leading up to the 2014 Winter Olympics and represented the U.S. at the 2014 Four Nations Cup.
- **Brittany Ammerman** was announced Friday as one of the five finalists for the 2015 BNY Mellon Wealth Management Hockey Humanitarian Award. The award is presented each year to college hockey's finest citizen, which is characterized by a student-athlete who makes contributions to both his or her team and the community as a whole through volunteerism. Ammerman is the first Wisconsin women's player to be a finalist for the prestigious award, as three Wisconsin men's hockey players have been finalists.
