OPENING FACE-OFF

- **Gophers, Badgers in the NCAA Tournament:** Two of the conference's league-record five 20-win teams, Minnesota and Wisconsin, will represent the WCHA in the 2015 NCAA Tournament as both seek the fifth Frozen Four championship in their respective school histories (Minnesota also won an AWCHA title). The Gophers, who earned the top seed in the NCAA tournament for the third straight year after entering as an at-large selection, will host CHA playoff champion RIT this Saturday at 4 p.m. at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. The Badgers, tabbed as the tournament's fourth seed after winning the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, will welcome Boston University to LaBahn Arena for a 2 p.m. faceoff Saturday.
- **No. 15 on the Horizon?:** Minnesota and Wisconsin will also be seeking the WCHA's record 15th national championship in the league's 16-year history. The Gophers previously won the AWCHA (American Women's College Hockey Alliance) title in 2000, along with NCAA crowns in 2004, 2005, 2012 and 2013. The Badgers captured the Frozen Four championship in 2006, 2007, 2009 and 2011.
- **Frozen Four at Ridder Arena:** All eight teams in the NCAA Quarterfinals will be trying to earn a berth in the 2015 Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20 and 22 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. The Gophers' home facility, the first in the nation dedicated solely to women's college hockey, also hosted the event in 2010 and 2013.
- **FINAL FACE-OFF Champions:** For the fifth time in school history, Wisconsin is WCHA playoff champions following its 4-0 victory over Bemidji State last Sunday. The Badgers also defeated North Dakota, 4-1, in a semifinal contest.
- **NCAA-Best Four in the Top 10:** The WCHA has an NCAA-best four teams (tied with the ECAC) in both the USCHO.com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls. The two sets of rankings have discrepancies, however, with Minnesota earning top billing in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine ledger and No. 2 in the USCHO.com poll. Both Wisconsin (No. 3 and No. 4) and North Dakota (No. 8 and No. 9) are higher in the USCHO.com rankings, while Bemidji State is 10th in both.
- **20 x 5:** For the first time in the league's illustrious 16-year history, the WCHA boasts five 20-win teams: Minnesota (31), Wisconsin (28), North Dakota (22), Bemidji State (21) and Minnesota Duluth (20).
- **Brandt Named Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award Top-3 Finalist:** For the second consecutive season, Minnesota's Hannah Brandt has been named a top-3 finalist for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, joining Boston College junior forward Alex Carpenter and Boston University senior forward Marie-Philip Poulin. The junior, who was also named as a top-10 finalist her freshman season, leads the WCHA and is third nationally with 1.81 points per game (31g, 36a, 67pts. in 37 games). Fellow Minnesota teammates Dani Cameranesi (So., F) and Rachel Ramsey (Sr., D), along with North Dakota junior goaltender Shelby Amsley-Benzie, were also among the top-10 finalists. The winner will be announced Saturday, March 21 as part of Frozen Four festivities in Minneapolis.
- **Humanitarian Award Finalists:** Two WCHA student-athletes - Wisconsin's Brittany Ammerman and Minnesota Duluth's Zoe Hikkel - are among the five finalists for the 2015 Hockey Humanitarian Award. The winner will be announced April 10 as part of Men's Frozen Four festivities in Boston.

BY THE NUMBERS

- **17-3:** Wisconsin's scoring margin during its 4-0 start to the 2015 postseason. FINAL FACE-OFF Most Outstanding Player Sarah Nurse has scored five goals (along with two assists), while Ann-Renée Desbiens has a 0.57 GAA and .958 save percentage.
- **.939:** Minnesota's home winning percentage (60-2-4) since Feb. 18, 2012. The Gophers are riding a 12-game unbeaten streak at Ridder Arena (12-0-2), went 16-1-3 at the facility overall this season and are second nationally with an average of 1,913 fans per game.
- **.965:** Wisconsin's NCAA-leading penalty kill percentage (109-for-113). In fact, the Badgers have scored as many short-handed goals (four) as they have allowed on the power-play (four). The all-time NCAA penalty kill record belongs to the 2003-04 Harvard Crimson, which posted a .957 conversion rate (112-for-117).

GOPHERS, BADGERS TO REPRESENT WCHA IN 2015 NCAA TOURNAMENT

Two familiar postseason faces will represent the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) in the 2015 NCAA Division 1 Women's Ice Hockey Championship: Minnesota and Wisconsin, which each have won four NCAA Division I national championships, will both host quarterfinal games Saturday, March 14.

Top-seeded Minnesota (31-3-4), the WCHA's regular season champion for the last three seasons, will host College Hockey America (CHA) playoff champion RIT (15-18-5) at 4 p.m. at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. Wisconsin, which won the WCHA's postseason title, the FINAL FACE-OFF championship March 8 in Grand Forks, N.D., will host Hockey East playoff champion Boston University (25-8-3) at 2 p.m. Saturday at LaBahn Arena in Madison, Wis.

Minnesota is making its eighth consecutive appearance (13th overall) in the NCAA tournament. The Gophers are looking to earn a fourth-straight trip to the national championship game, winning two of the last three NCAA titles. Minnesota is 7-2-0 in quarterfinal games since the NCAA tournament expanded to eight teams in 2005.

The Gophers secured the top seed in the championship for the third-straight season and received one of four at-large berths to the national tournament after falling to Bemidji State 1-0 in the semifinal round of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF last weekend.

Saturday's game marks the first-ever meeting between Minnesota and RIT. The Tigers are making their first appearance in the NCAA Division I Tournament in just their third season as a DI program. RIT won the Division III National Championship in 2012 and enters Saturday's game on a five-game winning streak.

The Badgers (28-6-4) are making their ninth NCAA appearance. They are 4-0 all-time against BU, including a 4-1 victory in the 2011 national title game, one of four championships secured by UW. The Terriers won their fourth-straight Hockey East playoff title by bumping off then No.1-ranked Boston College, 4-1, Sunday.

The most recent meeting between the two schools came last season in Vail, Colorado, as the Badgers defeated the Terriers, 5-0, on Nov. 16, 2013 at the Dobson Ice Arena.

This marks the second-straight year UW has hosted a NCAA playoff game at LaBahn Arena. The Badgers beat Harvard, 2-1, last year to advance to the program's seventh NCAA Frozen Four. In the NCAA tournament, the Badgers are 17-4 for a winning percentage of .810.

Wisconsin, Hockey East champion Boston University and ECAC champion and No. 3 seed Harvard joined CHA champion RIT in securing automatic berths, and No. 2 seed Boston College, Clarkson, Quinnipiac and Minnesota were selected to fill the remaining four places.

The quarterfinal winners advance to the 2015 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, hosted by Minnesota, at Ridder Arena. Semifinal games will be played at 5 p.m. and 8 p.m. CDT on Friday, March 20 and the championship game will be played at 3 p.m. CDT on Sunday, March 22.

WEEKEND REWIND

Last weekend, Wisconsin won its fifth WCHA playoff title, defeating Bemidji State, 4-0, in Sunday's WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, N.D.. Saturday, the tournament two-seed Badgers posted a semifinal victory over third-seed North Dakota, 4-1.

The Badgers' **Sarah Nurse** was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after scoring six points, with two goals in each game and two assists.

Nurse scored twice in the opening period of the title game against upset-minded Bemidji State and added a third-period assist. **Ann-Renée Desbiens** made 15 saves for her 15th shutout of the season, tying a school record. **Karley Sylvester** and **Katarina Zgraja** had the other Wisconsin goals.

Nurse also had two goals and an assist as Wisconsin ended North Dakota's stretch drive for an NCAA berth with a 4-1 victory. **Melissa Channell** gave the Badgers a first-period lead and **Sydney McKibbon** doubled it in the next stanza. Desbiens made 26 saves in another outstanding effort, yielding just a third-period **Tori Williams** goal for UND.

Bemidji State reached the first FINAL FACE-OFF championship game in program history by blanking Minnesota 1-0 for the second time this season in the tournament's first semifinal contest. **Stephanie Anderson** scored the game's lone goal in the third-period, while **Brittini Mowat** made 37 saves in recording a school-best seventh shutout.

Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (21-17-1) advanced to their first ever appearance in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship last weekend with an 1-0 win over No. 2 Minnesota Saturday. The Beavers' season came to an end Sunday against No. 3 Wisconsin, 4-0.
- The Beavers finished the season 21-17-1 overall and 13-14-1 in WCHA action. Both win totals are new program records for BSU.
- BSU's success this season can be traced in large part to its defense. The Beavers allowed just 70 goals in 39 games this season, which is the fewest they have allowed in the single season. The previous record was 85 goals allowed in the 2011-12 season.
- Three members of the squad were given awards from the WCHA following the season. Head Coach **Jim Scanlan** was named WCHA Coach of the Year, while **Brittini Mowat** was named All-WCHA First Team and **Alexis Joyce** was named to the All-WCHA Rookie squad.
- Junior **Kaitlyn Tougas** led the Beavers with 27 points (13g, 14a). Tougas, who led the team with 22 points last season, becomes just the fourth BSU player to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back seasons joining Erin Cody, Amber Fryklund and Kelly Hart.
- **Stephanie Anderson** was BSU's top goal scorer this season with 14. Anderson's 14 goals is the seventh-most by a Beaver in single season in program history.
- **Ivana Bilic** finished the season as the nation's leader in blocked shots with 147. Bilic finished third on the team with 23 points (5g, 18a) this season.
- Joyce was named to the All-WCHA Rookie Team after leading the country among freshmen with 116. Joyce also led all WCHA freshman defensemen with 18 points (4g, 14a).
- Mowat turned in the best season by a BSU net minder in program history this season. Mowat set new single season records in shutouts (7), wins (19), goals against average (1.68) and save percentage (.945).
- Bemidji State will graduate: **Kristine Grenier, Kaleigh Chapman, Rachael Kelly, Jenessa Philipczyk** and **Alex Citrowske**. The five seniors tallied a combined 42 points in their final season.

- The Golden Gophers (31-3-4), the nation's top-ranked team in the latest *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll, will host CHA champion RIT (15-8-5) in the quarterfinals of the 2015 National Collegiate Women's Ice Hockey Championship at 4 p.m. this Saturday at Ridder Arena. The Gophers secured the top seed in the championship for the third-straight season.
- The Gophers received one of four at-large berths to the national tournament after falling to Bemidji State 1-0 in the semifinal round of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF last weekend. WCHA champion and No. 4 seed Wisconsin, Hockey East champion Boston University and ECAC champion and No. 3 seed Harvard joined CHA champion RIT in securing automatic berths, and No. 2 seed Boston College, Clarkson, Quinnipiac and Minnesota were selected to fill the remaining four places.

RIT won the Division III National Championship in 2012 and enters Saturday's game on a five-game winning streak.
- The NCAA quarterfinal winners advance to the 2015 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena March 20 and 22. Frozen Four tickets are entirely sold out. Fans interested in being put on a waitlist should additional tickets be made available should contact the Gopher Sales & Service Department at 612-624-8080 (option 2).
- WCHA Player of the Year **Hannah Brandt** is a top-three finalist for the 2015 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award. WCHA Defensive Player of the Year **Rachel Ramsey** and **Dani Cameranesi** joined Brandt among the top-10 finalists for the award.
- Four Gophers have hit the 40-point mark this season, led by Brandt (31g-36a), Cameranesi (23g-39a), **Kelly Pannek** (13g-29a) and **Maryanne Menefee** (21g-20a). The Gophers' top-nine scorers all have at least 25 points, and all 18 skaters have at least one point on the year.
- Brandt is second in the nation with 67 points. Her 1.81 points per game is third in the NCAA. Cameranesi is ranked fourth with 62 points and sixth with 1.68 points per game. Pannek leads the nation's rookies with 42 points (13g-29a) and 1.11 points per game.
- The Gophers have the nation's top power-play unit, converting on 38 of 126 opportunities for a .302 percentage. **Milica McMillen** and Cameranesi are tied for seventh in the nation with seven power-play goals each.
- Defensively, the Gophers rank third in the nation with a 1.16 goals against average, and Minnesota defensemen lead the nation's blue-liners in scoring, averaging 3.55 points per game. Ramsey (8g-23a) leads the WCHA and ranks fourth in the nation with 0.82 points per game.
- Goaltender **Amanda Leveille** ranks second in the nation with a .946 save percentage and a .855 winning percentage (25-3-3).

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 9 Bulldogs (20-12-5) suffered a 2-1 overtime loss March 1 against Bemidji State in the best of three series to end its 2014-15 season. It marks the second time in program history the Bulldogs have not advanced out of the first round of the WCHA playoffs, despite hosting the first round every year since the league went to the quarterfinal format in 2005.
- The Bulldogs finish 20-12-5 overall, posting their 14th season with at least 20 wins or more out of a possible 16 seasons.
- UMD fell 3-2 in the opening game of the series Feb. 27, despite coming back twice from a two-goal deficit. Senior center **Brienna Gillanders** cut the lead to 2-1 16:39 into the second period, and after BSU netted its third goal at 8:52 of the third period, senior winger **Zoe Hickel** tipped a **Brigitte Lacquette** shot at 13:58 to draw the Bulldogs back within one at 3-2.
- On Feb. 28, the Bulldogs and Beavers were scoreless through the first 47:31 of the game until sophomore **Ashleigh Brykaliuk** buried a cross-crease pass from senior winger **Jenna McParland** to take over the game at 1-0. Brykaliuk was credited with a second goal as time expired in the 2-0 victory.
- Junior goaltender **Kayla Black** had 31 saves, picking up her 10th shutout of the season and 19th of her career (both already UMD records).
- Sunday the Bulldogs were just 33.9 away from extending their season before a BSU goal knotted the game at 1-1. Earlier, after another scoreless opening two periods, Lacquette scored off a drawn face-off play 4:42 into the third.
- UMD again outshot BSU, posting a 36-27 advantage Sunday and an overall series mark of 101-80. The Bulldogs held BSU scoreless on 12 power play attempts in the series, while Black made 75 stops on the weekend.
- UMD is now 32-14 in the WCHA postseason play all-time and 18-6 in quarterfinal contests.
- Black finishes the season with 861 saves, the third most by a UMD goaltender in a single-season. It also bests Black's previous high of 842 in a season set during her sophomore year (2013-14). With 2,510 career saves, Black also takes over the No. 1 spot all-time for saves in a Bulldog career.
- Hickel finishes the season as the Bulldogs top scorer in points and goals, with 32 points in 36 games and 19 goals, both career season highs for the senior.
- Brykaliuk finished with 30 points on 16 goals and 14 assists, while Lara Stalder rounded out the top-three with 10 goals and 19 helpers for 29 points. Lacquette led all defenseman (and also finished fourth) with 25 points (7g, 18a).
- Lacquette finishes her career with 69 career points on 20 goals and 49 assists, good for seventh all-time in points for a defenseman. Her 20 goals ties her for third for goals, and she is also in a tie for sixth all-time for career blueliner assists.
- McParland will end up UMD's 14th all-time scorer with 116 points on 50 goals and 66 assists.
- UMD will graduate Hickel, Gillanders, **Meghan Huertas**, McParland, Lacquette and senior defensemen **Emma Stauber** and **Tea Villila** this spring.
- Sunday marked the final game for head coach **Shannon Miller**, who has been the only coach of the UMD program for 16 seasons. Miller finishes 383-144-50 all-time and is one of only two coaches in NCAA history to finish with 14 or more 20 win seasons. She is also the only women head coach ever to do so and the only coach in the WCHA to have achieved that feat. She owns an NCAA-best five NCAA titles and remains the only head coach ever to win three-consecutive NCAA titles.
- On March 9, UMD athletic director **Josh Berlo** announced a 10-member search advisory committee, including Brykaliuk and defenseman **Sidney Morin**, which will help in the selection of a new coach. Berlo hopes to have a coach employed by June 15.

- The Mavericks (3-32-1) fell in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs to Minnesota by scores of 10-0 and 5-1, respectively.
- With the loss the Mavericks season comes to a close with a 3-32-1 overall record and a 1-26-1 record in league play.
- Senior forward **Kathleen Rogan** finishes her career with 39-43--82 ranking fourth all-time at MSU in goals and points.
- Senior defenseman **Shelby Moteyunas** finishes her career at Minnesota State with 7-19--26 ranking fourth all-time in career points by a defenseman for the Purple and Gold.
- Senior netminder **Erin Krichiver** finished this season with the fourth most saves in a single season in program history with 996. She finishes her career with 1408 ranking fifth all-time among goalies at MSU.
- Freshman **Nicole Schammel** totaled 11-11--22 and led the team in each one of those categories. The 22 points she produced this season is the sixth most by a freshman in program history.
- Coach **Eric Means** announced his resignation March 4. Means, who just finished his sixth season as the Mavericks head coach, will stay on the job until the end of his contract in May. He had a record of 48-161-16. Means has been an MSU hockey coach for 20 years, spending his first 14 as an assistant for the men's team.

University of North Dakota

- No. 8 North Dakota (22-12-3) concluded the 2014-15 season with a 4-1 loss to No. 3 Wisconsin in the semifinal round of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 7.
- North Dakota made its fifth-straight FINAL FACE-OFF appearance, taking on Wisconsin in the semifinals for the third-consecutive season. After beating the Badgers two years in a row at the tournament, this year Wisconsin would score first and build a 3-0 advantage before UND could get on the board. Senior defenseman **Tori Williams** scored with an extra attacker to cut into the Badgers' lead in the closing minutes of the game. However, Wisconsin added an empty netter to secure the win.
- Since the start of the new year, UND put together the nation's fourth-best winning percentage with a record of 13-3-1 (.794).
- Junior goaltender **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** leads the nation with a .952 save percentage. Additionally, her goals-against average of 1.21 ranks fifth nationally and third in the WCHA. In games played since Jan. 1, Amsley-Benzie leads the nation in save percentage (.964), goals-against average (0.84) and shutouts (8).
- This season Amsley-Benzie has become the sole owner of UND's goaltending records for career wins (51), career shutouts (14) and single-season shutouts (9). Also, with 18 wins this season, she approached her previous school record for single-season wins of 19 set in 2012-13. She also set a program-record shutout streak spanning 297 minutes and 13 seconds, between the span of Feb. 7 and Feb. 27.
- **Josefine Jakobsen** surpassed Michelle Karvinen for the No. 3 spot on the program's career scoring and career-goals lists after a three point weekend Feb. 13-14. Jakobsen ended her career with 137 points and 59 goals.
- Sophomore defenseman **Gracen Hirschy** is three points shy of becoming the second-leading defensive scorer in program history. She ranks third in career-points for defensemen at UND with 39 points. Jordan Slavin sits in second with 41, while Monique Lamoureux holds the top spot with 190.
- All of UND's 19 skaters and one goaltender recorded a point this season, including 17 goal scorers. **Meghan Dufault** led the team in points with 31 and assists with 20. Jakobsen led the team with 16 goals, while **Amy Menke** led the team with three shorthanded goals and five game-winning goals. Dufault, Jakobsen and **Becca Kohler** all had four power-play goals each.
- North Dakota went undefeated (14-0-1) when scoring three or more goals in a game.
- North Dakota's junior class is sixth in the nation in offensive production, as the class registered 114 points (38g, 76a). Boston College's junior class leads the nation with 229 points.
- Dufault became the newest, and sixth overall, member of the 100-point club at UND, recording two assists against Ohio State on Feb. 28, 2015. Last season, Jakobsen eclipsed 100-point mark and currently has 137 points. Only four other players in program history have eclipsed the century mark, Jocelyne Lamoureux (220), Monique Lamoureux (190), Karvinen (131) and Alyssa Wiebe (115).
- In the nation, Jakobsen is tied for 11th among all skaters, first among forwards, with a total of 74 blocked shots, averaging 2.00 blocks per game. Defensemen **Tanja Eisenschmid** is 15th in the nation for blocked shots with 69. With 30 points through 33 games, Kohler is 32nd in the nation averaging 0.91 points per game.
- UND scored 19 goals on 102 power-play opportunities this season, and its .186 power-play efficiency ranked second in the WCHA and 12th in the nation.
- UND scored six shorthanded goals, tied for second in the nation. North Dakota went undefeated when scoring on the power play (12-0-1) and scored more than one power-play goal in six games this season.

- The Buckeyes (17-16-3) concluded their season with an overall record of 17-16-3 and WCHA standing of 12-13-3-1.
- The Buckeyes and North Dakota met for the first time last weekend in a WCHA playoff series.
- In game one, the Buckeyes fell to North Dakota by a score of 5-2. Trailing 1-0 following the first period, Ohio State rebounded with two goals in the second. Senior **Kari Schmitt** lit the lamp first, scoring her seventh of the season on a power play at 10:02. Backed by senior captain **Sara Schmitt**, Ohio State tallied another power play goal three minutes later. North Dakota, however, fired back with a goal to end the second and three more in the third.
- In game two, the Buckeyes forced three overtimes before falling 2-1 to the eighth-ranked team in the nation, North Dakota. Senior **Kayla Sullivan** scored the Buckeyes' lone goal in the matchup, while rookie goalie **Kassidy Sauve** registered 40 saves.
- Sauve started in 20 games in goal for Ohio State and holds a record of 9-11-0. The Whitby, Ontario, native retains a save percentage of .925 and a goals against average of 1.98.
- Both Buckeye goalies – Sauve and redshirt junior **Stacy Danczak** – rank in the Top 10 in the conference in terms of save percentage. Sauve is sixth, while Danczak is seventh.
- Ohio State was led in scoring by senior **Taylor Kuehl**, who earned 24 points on 10 goals and 14 assists, and Kari Schmitt. Schmitt held a line of seven goals, 17 assists for 24 points.
- Kuehl ended her career ranked 14th on Ohio State's all-time career list in points (85) and 10th in points scored by a forward (85).
- 21 players recorded one or more points for the Buckeyes.
- Ohio State held a record of 11-2-0 when leading after the first period of play and a 14-2-1 standing when ahead after two periods. On the flip side, the Buckeyes were 0-8-2 when behind after the first period and 0-12-2 when trailing to end the second period.
- The Scarlet and Gray scored first in 21 games this season and are 16-4-1 with the opening goal.
- Team captain Sara Schmitt recorded five goals and 17 assists for 22 points. She ranks sixth on Ohio State's all-time list for scoring by a defenseman with 83 career points. Kari Schmitt, on the other hand, stands seventh on the list with 81 career points.
- Sophomore **Alexa Ranahan** registered a team-best 74 blocks, which ranks fourth in the WCHA and eighth nationally among defensemen.
- In special teams play, Ohio State finished 22-for-145 on power play chances (.152) and 87-for-104 on the penalty kill (.837).
- Sullivan was named one of the 15 nominees for the BNY Mellon Wealth Management Hockey Humanitarian Award, which is presented annually to college hockey's finest citizen – a student-athlete who makes significant contributions not only to his or her team but also to the community-at-large through leadership in volunteerism.

Badgers University of Wisconsin

- The No. 3 Badgers (28-6-4), fresh off of winning the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, open up the 2015 NCAA Tournament with a home contest against No. 5 Boston University. Faceoff on Saturday at LaBahn Arena is set for 2 p.m.
- Wisconsin won its fifth WCHA playoff title on Sunday after blanking Bemidji State, 4-0. **Sarah Nurse** tallied two first period goals before seniors **Karley Sylvester** and **Katarina Zgraja** added goals in the second and third periods, respectively. UW advanced to the championship tilt after defeating North Dakota, 4-1, on its home ice. Sophomores **Melissa Channell** and **Sydney McKibbin** got the Badgers on the board before Nurse tallied two third-period goals to lift UW to the title game.
- Nurse was named the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Most Outstanding Player after scoring four goals while adding two assists on the weekend. In addition, Nurse, McKibbin, Channell and **Ann-Renée Desbiens** were named to the WCHA All-Tournament team.
- This weekend's NCAA contest marks a rematch of the 2011 NCAA Championship, as Wisconsin defeated BU, 4-1, to win the program's fourth NCAA title. The Badgers are 4-0-0 all-time against the Terriers, and in the two team's most recent matchup, the Badgers blanked Boston University, 5-0, on Nov. 16, 2013, in Vail, Colorado.
- Wisconsin's defense has been stellar this year, as it is tied for the nation's lead holding opponents to an average of 1.08 goals per game.
- The Badgers offense, which ranks fifth nationally, has been balanced, as four players rank in the top-30 nationally in scoring. Freshman **Annie Pankowski** ranks 17th (1.08 ppg), **Blayre Turnbull** ranks tied for 21st (1.00 ppg), Sylvester is also tied for 21st (1.00) and **Brittany Ammerman** ranks 26th (0.97 ppg).
- The Badgers lead the nation in shots on goal, averaging 41.65 shots on goal per game. Wisconsin also ranks third nationally in shots against, holding opponents to an average of 19.35 shots on goal per contest.
- In the NCAA tournament, the Badgers are 17-4 for a winning percentage of .810. UW has outscored its opponents 67-31 in NCAA postseason contests. Wisconsin is 54-18 in postseason contests, and has outscored its opponents 264-124 in postseason games.
- Wisconsin has been spectacular on the penalty kill, as UW has killed 109 of its 113 opponent's power plays for a conversion rate of .965, the nation's best mark. The Badgers have not allowed a power play goal in their past six games, and have allowed only one during the 2015 calendar year. The all-time NCAA penalty kill record belongs to Harvard, as the Crimson allowed only five power play goals in 117 opportunities for a conversion rate of .957 during the 2003-04 season.
- In postseason play this season, the Badgers have outscored their opponents 17-3. Nurse leads the UW offense with seven points off five goals and two assists, while linemates **Katy Josephs** and McKibbin have five and four points, respectively.
- Turnbull has 96 points in her career, and is four points away from becoming the 20th member of the century club at Wisconsin.
- The Badgers' senior class of Ammerman, Josephs, Sylvester, Turnbull and Zgraja rank second among senior classes nationally at 3.61 points per game.
- UW's freshmen class of **Emily Clark**, Pankowski, **Maddie Rolfes**, **Baylee Wellhausen** and **Lauren Williams** ranks third among rookie classes, scoring an average of 2.29 points per contest.
- Desbiens tied the Wisconsin school record for shutouts with her 14th blank slate on Sunday against Bemidji State. Her 14 shutouts this season are the second-most in the country. Her goals against average of 1.10 goals per game ranks second nationally, while her .943 save percentage ranks fourth.
