#### OPENING FACE-OFF

- **2015 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF:** Arguably the premier conference tournament in women's college hockey, the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 7-8 at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, N.D. A quartet of nationally-ranked teams will vie for the league's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament, as top-seed Minnesota faces fourth-seed Bemidji State and second-seed Wisconsin skates against third-seed and host North Dakota in the two semifinals. For just the fourth time, the WCHA's league championship tournament features four 20-win teams (also in 2007, 2011 and 2012).
- **NCAA-Best Four in the Top 10:** The WCHA has an NCAA-best four teams (tied with the ECAC) in both the USCHO.com and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls. No. 2 Minnesota, No. 3 Wisconsin, No. 8 North Dakota are the same in both polls, while Bemidji State is 10th according to USCHO.com and Minnesota Duluth is 10th by *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* pollsters.
- **Three in the PairWise:** With just one week remaining until the NCAA Tournament field is selected, Minnesota (first), Wisconsin (fourth) and North Dakota (eighth) give the WCHA a trio of schools in the top eight of the latest PairWise rankings. Minnesota Duluth is just outside in the ninth spot (10th by tiebreaker), while Ohio State (13th) and Bemidji State (4th) round out the WCHA representation.
- **20 x 5:** For the first time in the league's illustrious 16-year history, the WCHA boasts five 20-win teams: Minnesota (31), Wisconsin (26), North Dakota (22), Minnesota Duluth (20) and Bemidji State (20).
- **Winning Hockey:** Further showcasing the league's impressive depth, the WCHA has an NCAA-best six of the nation's top 16 winning percentages (tied with the ECAC): Minnesota (2nd at .892, 31-2-4), Wisconsin (4th at .778, 26-6-4), North Dakota (9th at .653, 22-11-3), Minnesota Duluth (11th at .608, 20-12-5), Bemidji State (13th at .554, 20-16-1) and Ohio State (16th at .514, 17-16-3).
- **Hot at the Right Time:** Entering the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, Minnesota has the nation's longest current winning streak at seven games and is 23-1-2 in its last 25 contests. North Dakota has won six straight games, is 12-1-1 in its last 14 outings and has the nation's fourth-best record since Nov. 21 at 18-4-3 (.792). Wisconsin is 9-2-2 in its last 13 outings. Bemidji State, meanwhile, continues to add on to its program single-season victory record.
- **Three-Peat:** After compiling 72 points on the strength of a 22-2-4-2 league record, Minnesota secured its third straight WCHA regular season championship (ninth overall).
- **Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award Top-10 Finalists:** Four WCHA players are among the top-10 finalists for the 2015 Patty Kazmaier Award: UND's **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** (Jr., G), and Minnesota's **Hannah Brandt** (Jr., F), **Dani Cameranesi** (So., F) and **Rachel Ramsey** (Sr., D).
- **Humanitarian Award Finalists:** Two WCHA student-athletes - Wisconsin's **Brittany Ammerman** and Minnesota Duluth's **Zoe Hickel** - are among the five finalists for the 2015 Hockey Humanitarian Award.

#### 2015 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF

- **Nice to See You Again:** Last year, Minnesota I won its third-straight WCHA tournament championship (sixth overall). Wisconsin and North Dakota meet in the semis for the third-straight season, with UND eliminating the Badgers the last two seasons. UW will be looking for its fourth WCHA playoff title, while UND is pursuing its first. Bemidji State is back in the tournament for just the second time, after losing in the 2010 semifinals.
- **Goals at a Premium:** Wisconsin (2nd at 1.11 goals allowed per game), Minnesota (4th at 1.16), North Dakota (6th at 1.53) and Bemidji State (9th at 1.78) are all among the top-10 nationally for scoring defense.

## FOUR 20-GAME WINNERS COLLIDE AT 2015 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF

Four nationally-ranked teams, each of whom have recorded 20-win seasons, converge on Grand Forks, N.D this weekend for the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association's crown jewel: the 2015 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

Fourth-seed Bemidji State (20-16-1) will play regular season champion, three-time defending playoff champion and top-seeded Minnesota (31-2-4; ranked No. 2 nationally) in the first semifinal at 2 p.m. CT Saturday, March 7, at Ralph Engelstad Arena. Second-seed Wisconsin (26-6-4; ranked No. 3 nationally) will face third-seed North Dakota (22-11-3; ranked No. 9 nationally) in the second semifinal at 5 p.m. CT. Saturday at the Ralph. The two winners will play at 1 p.m. Sunday, March 8, for the WCHA playoff championship and an automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

The games will be televised live by Midco Sports Network® and all tournament games will be streamed by FASTHockey. The telecast feed from Ralph Engelstad Arena will be delivered to Midcontinent Communications® cable TV customers with access to Midco Sports Network 3, channel 323. The live stream, available for free, can be viewed at [wcha.fasthockey.com](http://wcha.fasthockey.com).

Last year, Minnesota won its sixth overall and third-straight WCHA postseason crown with a 3-1 win over North Dakota in the 2014 WCHA title game after defeating UMD, 4-1, in the semifinal round. Minnesota is 60-5-7 all-time against Bemidji State. This season, the Gophers are 2-1-1 against the Beavers, most recently sweeping BSU on the road with 3-2 and 4-2 wins on Feb. 20-21. In their first meeting this year, the Gophers and Beavers tied 2-2 in overtime (BSU shootout win) on Oct. 31 before BSU won a 1-0 decision on Nov. 1.

This will be the second-ever trip to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF for the Beavers, with the first coming after the 2009-10 season. BSU met Minnesota Duluth in its only FINAL FACE-OFF appearance and came up short, 7-3.

This will be the third straight year that Wisconsin and North Dakota collide in the FINAL FACE-OFF. UND beat the Badgers 2-1 in the semifinals in 2013 and took a 1-0 victory over UW last season. Wisconsin leads the all-time series with North Dakota, 42-6-3, but the series has been closer as of late, as UW has a 8-4-2 advantage in the last 14 meetings between the two squads. Wisconsin went 3-0-1 against North Dakota this season, but all four games were close, as the Badgers tallied a trio of one-goal triumphs against UND.

### WEEKEND REWIND

Last weekend, in a most compelling first round, best-of-three playoff series, **Kaitlyn Tougas** scored the game-winning goal 12:08 into overtime Sunday to give visiting Bemidji State a dramatic 2-1 victory over Minnesota Duluth at AMSOIL Arena and propel the fifth-seed Beaver to Grand Forks. Bemidji State beat UMD 3-2 on Friday behind two goals by **Stephanie Anderson** and 35 saves by goalie **Brittini Mowat**. The Bulldogs scored a 2-0 victory Saturday as **Ashleigh Brykaliuk** scored a pair of third period goals and **Kayla Black** made 29 saves in a shutout. On Sunday, **Brigitte Lacquette's** third-period goal gave the Bulldogs a lead until the final minute, when Bemidji tied the game with 33.9 seconds left in regulation on **Hanna Moher's** goal.

In other first-round series, Minnesota earned its 16th straight appearance in the semifinals by beating Minnesota State 10-0 and 5-1 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. **Dani Cameranesi** (2g-5a), **Maryanne Menefee** (3g-3a), WCHA regular-season scoring champ **Hannah Brandt** (4g-1a) and Megan Wolfe (4a) led the Gophers. Cameranesi brings a team-best seven-game point streak into this weekend's WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

Wisconsin swept its series with St. Cloud State by scores of 5-1 and 4-1 at LaBahn Arena in Madison to secure its fifth straight berth in the semis. Eight different Badgers scored in the sweep and **Kim Drake** had three assists in the Friday victory.

North Dakota, meanwhile, will play on its home ice in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF after ousting Ohio State, 5-2 and 2-1 (in triple overtime) to also earn its fifth straight trip to the semifinals. UND captain **Andrea Dalen** had three goals Friday. In game two, UND's **Samantha Hansen** and OSU's **Kayla Sullivan** traded second period goals, setting up the longest game of the season to date. **Kassidy Sauve** made 40 saves for the Buckeyes and **Shelby Amsley-Benzie**, who had the league's lowest goals against average during the regular season, made 37 stops for UND in the goaltending duel. **Amy Menke** ended the longest game in Ralph Engelstad Arena history with a goal at 3:17 of the third overtime.

### FAREWELL TO SHANNON MILLER

Sunday's game marked the final contest in the 16-year UMD tenure of Bulldogs head coach **Shannon Miller**. The only coach in UMD women's hockey history, Miller finishes with a 383-144-50 all-time record and is one of only two coaches in NCAA history to finish with 14 or more 20-win seasons. She is also the only women's head coach ever to do so and the only coach in the WCHA to have achieved that feat. She owns an NCAA-best five NCAA titles and remains the only head coach ever to win three-consecutive NCAA titles.

## Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (20-16-1) took two of the three games in its first round WCHA Playoff series against Minnesota Duluth Feb. 27-March 1. In doing so, the Beavers have advanced to the WCHA Final Faceoff next Saturday in Grand Forks, N.D.
- The Beavers won game one 3-2 behind 35 saves from **Brittini Mowat** and two goals from **Stephanie Anderson**. UMD forced a third game with a 2-0 victory Saturday with two goals from Ashleigh Brykaliuk. In the third and deciding game, the Beavers tied the score at 1-1 with 34 seconds remaining with a goal from **Hanna Moher** and **Kailtyn Tougas** delivered her third game-winning goal of the season in overtime to send Bemidji State to Grand Forks.
- This will be the second ever trip to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF for the Beavers with the first coming after the 2009-10 season. BSU met Minnesota Duluth in its only Final Faceoff appearance and came up short, 7-3.
- With the pair of wins against the Bulldogs over the weekend the Beavers improve to 8-62-2 all-time against Minnesota Duluth. BSU defeated UMD four times this season, which matched its win total against the Bulldogs in the previous 15 seasons combined.
- With Sunday's win, the Beavers notched their 20th win of the season. The 20 victories not only set a new program record for wins in a single season but it is also the first season a BSU hockey team has reached the 20-win plateau since the men's team posted 23 during the 2009-10 season.
- Anderson led the Beavers' offense against the Bulldogs with four points (2g, 2a). Anderson lit the lamp twice Friday in BSU's 3-2 win and tallied an assist on each of BSU's goals in the 2-1 overtime win Sunday.
- Ivana Bilic** led BSU's defensemen with a pair of points (2a) against the Bulldogs. Both of Bilic's points came in Friday's 3-2 win. She ranks seventh among WCHA defensemen with 23 points (5g, 18a) this season.
- Senior **Alex Citrowske** notched an assist on each of the game-winning goals last weekend versus UMD. Citrowske, who is an assistant captain on this season's team, is second among BSU's seniors with 10 points (4g, 6a) this season.
- Whitney Wivoda** scored BSU's first goal in the 3-2 win over UMD Friday. BSU is 11-0-0 when Wivoda scores a point in a game this season.
- Goaltender **Brittini Mowat** allowed four goals in the three games against UMD. Mowat is 18-12-1 with an 1.66 goals against average and .945 save percentage, which ranks eighth (wins), ninth and third in the nation, respectively.
- Saturday's matchup will be the eighth postseason meeting between the Beavers and Golden Gophers with the last coming after the 2012-13 season. BSU holds a 0-7-0 mark in playoff games versus Minnesota.
- BSU is 5-60-7 in the all-time series against Minnesota, which includes a 1-2-1 mark in 2014-15. Despite being 1-2-1, the Beavers have played Minnesota tightly with just two goals separating the two teams in the four games. The two-goal differential is the lowest among WCHA teams against Minnesota this season.

- The No. 2 Golden Gophers (31-2-4) face fifth-seeded Bemidji State (20-16-1) in the first semifinal of the 2015 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, N.D., at 2 p.m. CT Saturday.
- Minnesota enters the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF as the league's three-time defending tournament champions in search of the program's seventh overall WCHA postseason title. The Gophers advanced with a WCHA First Round sweep over eighth-seeded Minnesota State, winning 10-0 and 5-1.
- Last year, Minnesota won its sixth overall and third-straight WCHA postseason crown with a 3-1 win over North Dakota in the 2014 WCHA title game after defeating UMD, 4-1, in the semifinal round.
- Minnesota is 60-5-7 all-time against Bemidji State. This season, the Gophers are 2-1-1 against the Beavers, most recently sweeping BSU on the road with 3-2 and 4-2 wins on Feb. 20-21. In their first meeting this year, the Gophers and Beavers tied 2-2 in overtime (BSU shootout win) on Oct. 31 before BSU won a 1-0 decision on Nov. 1.
- Against the Mavericks in the WCHA First Round, **Dani Cameranesi** (2g-5a), **Maryanne Menefee** (3g-3a), **Hannah Brandt** (4g-1a) and **Megan Wolfe** (4a) led the Gophers. Cameranesi brings a team-best seven-game point streak into this weekend's WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF. She also needs two points to reach 100 career points as a Gopher.
- The 2015 NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be held at Ridder Arena March 20 and 22, and tickets are entirely sold out. Fans interested in being put on a waitlist should additional tickets be made available should contact the Gopher Sales & Service Department at 612-624-8080 (option 2).
- Three Gophers have been named 2015 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award top-10 finalists including three-time finalist Brandt, along with **Rachel Ramsey** and Cameranesi.
- Minnesota enters the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on a seven-game winning streak. The Gophers have a record of 127-5-5 in the team's last 137 games, a stretch that includes an NCAA-record 62-game winning streak (Feb. 28, 2012 through Nov. 17, 2013). Minnesota also travels to Grand Forks, N.D., with a 65-2-1 record in games away from Ridder Arena since Jan. 14, 2012.
- Four Gophers have hit the 40-point mark this season, led by Brandt (31g-36a), Cameranesi (23g-39a), **Kelly Pannek** (13g-29a) and Menefee (21g-20a). The Gophers' top-nine scorers all have at least 25 points, and all 18 skaters have at least one point on the year.
- Brandt leads the WCHA and is second in the nation with 67 points. Her 1.86 points per game is third in the NCAA. Cameranesi is on Brandt's heels in the national scoring race, ranked fourth with 62 points and 1.72 points per game.
- The Gophers have the nation's top power-play unit, converting on 38 of 124 opportunities for a .306 percentage. **Milica McMillen** and Cameranesi are tied for seventh in the nation with seven power-play goals each.
- Pannek leads the nation's rookies with 42 points (13g-29a) and 1.14 points per game.
- The Gophers rank fourth in the nation with a 1.16 goals against average, and Minnesota defensemen lead the nation's blue-liners in scoring, averaging 3.65 points per game. Ramsey (8g-23a) leads the WCHA and ranks third in the nation with 0.84 points per game, and McMillen (10g-15a) is third in the WCHA and tied for eighth in the nation with 0.76 points per game.
- Amanda Leveille** ranks third in the WCHA and fifth in the nation with a 1.17 goals against average. She is also second in the NCAA and second in the WCHA with a .947 save percentage. Leveille leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation with a .883 winning percentage (25-2-3) as well.

## Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 9 Bulldogs (20-12-5) suffered a 2-1 overtime loss Sunday against Bemidji State in the best of three series to end its 2014-15 season. It marks the second time in program history the Bulldogs have not advanced out of the first round of the WCHA playoffs, despite hosting the first round every year since the league went to the quarterfinal format in 2005.
- The Bulldogs finish 20-12-5 overall, posting their 14th season with at least 20 wins or more out of a possible 16 seasons.
- UMD fell 3-2 in the opening game of the series Friday, despite coming back twice from a two-goal deficit. Senior center **Brienna Gillanders** cut the lead to 2-1 16:39 into the second period, and after BSU netted its third goal at 8:52 of the third period, senior winger **Zoe Hickel** tipped a **Brigitte Lacquette** shot at 13:58 to draw the Bulldogs back within one at 3-2.
- Saturday the Bulldogs and Beavers were scoreless through the first 47:31 of the game until sophomore **Ashleigh Brykaliuk** buried a cross-crease pass from senior winger **Jenna McParland** to take over the game at 1-0. Brykaliuk was credited with a second goal as time expired in the 2-0 victory.
- Junior goaltender **Kayla Black** had 31 saves, picking up her 10th shutout of the season and 19th of her career (both already UMD records).
- Sunday the Bulldogs were just 33.9 away from extending their season before a BSU goal knotted the game at 1-1. Earlier, after another scoreless opening two periods, Lacquette scored off a drawn face-off play 4:42 into the third period.
- UMD again outshot BSU, posting a 36-27 advantage Sunday and an overall series mark of 101-80. The Bulldogs held BSU scoreless on 12 power play attempts in the series, while Black made 75 stops on the weekend.
- UMD is now 32-14 in the WCHA postseason play all-time and 18-6 in quarterfinal contests.
- Black finishes the season with 861 saves, the third most by a UMD goaltender in a single-season. It also bests Black's previous high of 842 in a season set during her sophomore year (2013-14). With 2,510 career saves, Black also takes over the No. 1 spot all-time for saves in a Bulldog career.
- Hickel finishes the season as the Bulldogs top scorer in points and goals, with 32 points in 36 games and 19 goals, both career season highs for the senior.
- Brykaliuk finished with 30 points on 16 goals and 14 assists, while Lara Stalder rounded out the top-three with 10 goals and 19 helpers for 29 points. Lacquette led all defenseman (and also finished fourth) with 25 points (7g, 18a).
- Lacquette finishes her career with 69 career points on 20 goals and 49 assists, good for seventh all-time in points for a defenseman. Her 20 goals ties her for third for goals, and she is also in a tie for sixth all-time for career blueliner assists.
- McParland will end up UMD's 14th all-time scorer with 116 points on 50 goals and 66 assists. Both McParland and Lacquette scored in their last five outings, with Lacquette posting six points (1g, 5a) in her last five skates, while McParland recorded five assists in those same five games.
- UMD will graduate Hickel, Gillanders, **Meghan Huertas**, McParland, Lacquette and senior defensemen **Emma Stauber** and **Tea Villila** this spring.
- Sunday marked the final game for head coach **Shannon Miller**, who has been the only coach of the UMD program for 16 seasons. Miller finishes 383-144-50 all-time and is one of only two coaches in NCAA history to finish with 14 or more 20 win seasons. She is also the only women head coach ever to do so and the only coach in the WCHA to have achieved that feat. She owns an NCAA-best five NCAA titles and remains the only head coach ever to win three-consecutive NCAA titles.

## University of North Dakota

- No. 7 North Dakota (22-11-3) hosts the 2015 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF this weekend, March 7-8, at Ralph Engelstad Arena. UND will take on No. 3 Wisconsin in the second semifinal game on Saturday at 5 p.m. (CT).
- North Dakota won its fifth-straight WCHA quarterfinal series, defeating Ohio State 5-3 on Friday and 2-1 in triple overtime on Saturday. The 103:17 long game was the longest collegiate game in Ralph Engelstad Arena history.
- **Josefine Jakobsen** scored in the first three minutes of Friday's game to give UND a 1-0 lead. Ohio State responded in the second period with two straight power-play goals; however, **Andrea Dalen** netted her first goal of the game in the final six seconds of the frame to tie the game at 2-2 heading into the final period. Dalen then added a second goal, and the game winner, halfway through the period to reclaim the UND lead. Dalen scored on the empty net in the final minute of for her first career hat trick.
- In the second game of the best-of-three series, UND scored first as **Samantha Hanson** recorded her third goal of the season to give UND a 1-0 lead nine minutes into the second period. In the third overtime period, **Becca Kohler** set up **Amy Menke** and **Meghan Dufault** on a two-on-one break. Dufault passed the puck to Menke who buried it past OSU's Cassidy Sauve for the game winner and UND's ticket to the WCHA Final Face-Off.
- Since the start of the new year, UND has the nation's third-best winning percentage with a record of 13-2-1 (.821).
- **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** leads the nation with a .954 save percentage. Additionally, her goals-against average of 1.15 ranks fourth nationally and second in the WCHA. In games played since Jan. 1, Amsley-Benzie leads the nation in save percentage (.970), goals-against average (0.70) and shutouts (8). Six of her shutouts have come in the past 10 games and she has only conceded 11 goals in her 15 games played since the start of the new year.
- This season Amsley-Benzie has become the sole owner of UND's goaltending records for career wins (51), career shutouts (14) and single-season shutouts (9). Also, with 18 wins, she is approaching her previous school record for single-season wins of 19 set in 2012-13. She is also set a program-record shutout streak spanning 297 minutes and 13 seconds, between the span of Feb. 7 and Feb. 27.
- UND is on the nation's second-best undefeated streak, having gone 6-0-0 since suffering a loss to #2 Minnesota on Feb. 7.
- Jakobsen surpassed Michelle Karvinen for the No. 3 spot on the program's career scoring and career-goals lists after a three point weekend Feb. 13-14. Jakobsen now has 137 points and 59 goals. Sophomore defenseman **Gracen Hirschy** is three points shy of becoming the second-leading defensive scorer in program history.
- All of UND's 19 skaters and one goaltender have recorded a point this season, including 16 goal scorers. Dufault leads the team in points with 31 and assists with 20. Jakobsen leads the team with 16 goals.
- North Dakota is undefeated (14-0-1) when scoring three or more goals in a game. North Dakota has lost once in its last 11 games (3-1-7) that have gone into overtime.
- In the nation, Jakobsen is tied for 10th among all skaters, first among forwards, with a total of 72 blocked shots, averaging 2.00 blocks per game. Defenseman **Tanja Eisenschmid** is 13th in the nation for blocked shots with 69. With 30 points through 32 games, Kohler is 30th in the nation averaging 0.94 points per game.
- UND has scored 19 goals on 99 power-play opportunities, and its .192 power-play efficiency ranks second in the WCHA and 12th in the nation. UND has scored a total of six shorthanded goals so far this season, tied for second in the nation.
- North Dakota is undefeated when scoring on the power play (12-0-1) and has scored more than one power-play goal in six games.

- The Buckeyes (17-16-3) concluded their season with an overall record of 17-16-3 and WCHA standing of 12-13-3-1.
- The Buckeyes and North Dakota met for the first time last weekend in a WCHA playoff series.
- In game one, the Buckeyes fell to North Dakota by a score of 5-2. Trailing 1-0 following the first period, Ohio State rebounded with two goals in the second. Senior **Kari Schmitt** lit the lamp first, scoring her seventh of the season on a power play at 10:02. Backed by senior captain **Sara Schmitt**, Ohio State tallied another power play goal three minutes later. North Dakota, however, fired back with a goal to end the second and three more in the third.
- In game two, the Buckeyes forced three overtimes before falling 2-1 to the eighth-ranked team in the nation, North Dakota. Senior **Kayla Sullivan** scored the Buckeyes' lone goal in the matchup, while rookie goalie **Kassidy Sauve** registered 40 saves.
- Sauve started in 20 games in goal for Ohio State and holds a record of 9-11-0. The Whitby, Ontario, native retains a save percentage of .925 and a goals against average of 1.98.
- Both Buckeye goalies – Sauve and redshirt junior **Stacy Danczak** – rank in the Top 10 in the conference in terms of save percentage. Sauve is sixth, while Danczak is seventh.
- Ohio State was led in scoring by senior **Taylor Kuehl**, who earned 24 points on 10 goals and 14 assists, and Kari Schmitt. Schmitt held a line of seven goals, 17 assists for 24 points.
- Kuehl ended her career ranked 14th on Ohio State's all-time career list in points (85) and 10th in points scored by a forward (85).
- 21 players recorded one or more points for the Buckeyes.
- Ohio State held a record of 11-2-0 when leading after the first period of play and a 14-2-1 standing when ahead after two periods. On the flip side, the Buckeyes were 0-8-2 when behind after the first period and 0-12-2 when trailing to end the second period.
- The Scarlet and Gray scored first in 21 games this season and are 16-4-1 with the opening goal.
- Team captain Sara Schmitt recorded five goals and 17 assists for 22 points. She ranks sixth on Ohio State's all-time list for scoring by a defenseman with 83 career points. Kari Schmitt, on the other hand, stands seventh on the list with 81 career points.
- Sophomore **Alexa Ranahan** registered a team-best 74 blocks, which ranks fourth in the WCHA and eighth nationally among defensemen.
- In special teams play, Ohio State finished 22-for-145 on power play chances (.152) and 87-for-104 on the penalty kill (.837).
- Sullivan was named one of the 15 nominees for the BNY Mellon Wealth Management Hockey Humanitarian Award, which is presented annually to college hockey's finest citizen – a student-athlete who makes significant contributions not only to his or her team but also to the community-at-large through leadership in volunteerism.

- The No. 3 Badgers (26-6-4), after earning a sweep of St. Cloud State in the first round of the WCHA playoffs, will head to Grand Forks, North Dakota for the 2015 WCHA Final Faceoff, held at the Ralph Engelstad Arena. The No. 3 Badgers meet No. 8 North Dakota on Saturday in a 5:07 p.m. contest.
- The Badgers defeated the Huskies 5-1 last Friday before earning a 4-1 win on Saturday. Eight different Badgers scored for UW during the sweep, while 17 players recorded at least a point.
- Wisconsin leads the all-time series with North Dakota, 42-6-3, but the series has been closer as of late, as UW has a 8-4-2 advantage in the last 14 meetings between the two squads. Wisconsin went 3-0-1 against North Dakota this season, but all four games were close, as the Badgers tallied a trio of one-goal triumphs against UND.
- Wisconsin is 52-18 in postseason contests, and has outscored its opponents 261-123 in postseason games.
- Wisconsin's defense has been stellar this year, as it ranks second nationally holding opponents to an average of 1.11 goals per game.
- Wisconsin leads the country in penalty killing, having killed 103 of its 107 penalties this season. The .963 conversion rate ranks as the school's best mark. UW's school record is .933, as UW let in 13 power play goals in 194 chances during the 2008-09 season.
- The Badgers offense, which ranks fifth nationally, has been balanced, as four players rank in the top-30 nationally in scoring. Freshman **Annie Pankowski** ranks 16th (1.11 ppg), **Blayne Turnbull** ranks 21st (1.03 ppg), **Karley Sylvester** ranks 24th (1.00) and **Brittany Ammerman** ranks 25th (1.00 ppg).
- The Badgers lead the nation in shots on goal, averaging 42.08 shots on goal per game. Wisconsin also ranks third nationally in shots against, holding opponents to an average of 19.14 shots on goal per contest.
- **Blayne Turnbull** now has 95 points in her career, and is five points away from becoming the 20th member of the century club at Wisconsin. Her 95 career points are the 20th most in program history.
- The Badgers' senior class of Ammerman, **Katy Josephs**, Sylvester, Turnbull and **Katarina Zgraja** rank second among senior classes nationally, scoring 3.61 points per game.
- UW's freshmen class of **Emily Clark**, Pankowski, **Maddie Rolfes**, **Baylee Wellhausen** and **Lauren Williams** ranks third among rookie classes, scoring an average of 2.39 points per contest.
- The Badgers lead the nation in shots on goal, averaging 42.08 shots on goal per game. UW peppered St. Cloud State last weekend, outshooting the Huskies 103-29. In addition, the Badgers rank third nationally in shots against, holding opponents to an average of 19.14 per contest.
- **Ann-Renee Desbiens** ranks second in the country in shutouts with 13 this season. Desbiens also ranks third in the country in goals against average (1.14) and seventh in save percentage (.941).
- Pankowski ranks second among NCAA freshmen in scoring, averaging 1.11 points per game, which ranks 16th among all NCAA players. Pankowski is on a hot streak, scoring nine goals in the past 11 games and her 18 goals this year are tied for the seventh-most goals in program history by a freshman.
- Ammerman is one of the five finalists for the 2015 BNY Mellon Wealth Management Hockey Humanitarian Award. The award is presented each year to college hockey's finest citizen, which is characterized by a student-athlete who makes contributions to both his or her team and the community as a whole through volunteerism. Ammerman is the first Wisconsin women's player to be a finalist for the prestigious award, as three Wisconsin men's hockey players have been finalists.
