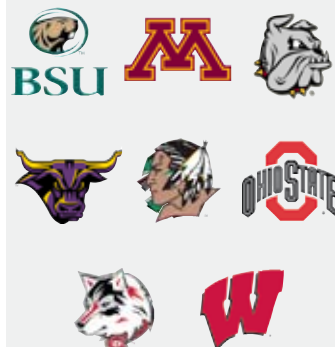

Wisconsin Tops in Latest National Poll; North Dakota, Minnesota Duluth Tied Atop WCHA Standings

Five WCHA Team Among Nation's Top 10 in USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 1, UMD No. 4, UND No. 6, UM No. 8, OSU No. 10; Sioux Score Historic Sweep at Minnesota to Gain Share of League Lead; Defending Champion UMD Sweeps MSU and Ohio State Takes Pair from St. Cloud State; Bemidji State Beats Top-Ranked Mercyhurst in New Arena; Oct. 22-23 Weekend WCHA Series Have North Dakota at Minnesota State, Ohio State at Wisconsin, Minnesota at St. Cloud State; UMD Entertains Connecticut in Non-Conference Series

MADISON, Wis. – It took nine years, but North Dakota found a way to beat Minnesota and establish itself as one of the early season leaders in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association. After losing the first 28 times they visited Ridder Arena, the visiting Sioux downed the Golden Gophers 4-3 on Friday, Oct. 15, and then did it again by within a span of 22 hours by a 3-1 count.

Sara Dagenais and Jordan Slavin had four-point weekends for the Sioux, who had split a series with defending national champion Minnesota Duluth the weekend before. It was first time since 2007 that the Gophers were swept at home. North Dakota (4-2-0, 3-1-0 WCHA) and UMD (3-1-0, 3-1-0 WCHA) are tied for first place in the WCHA race this week with nine points.

And both UND and UMD are also among the five WCHA teams which are ranked in this week's (Oct. 19) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Hockey Poll . Wisconsin is ranked as the top team in the country with Minnesota Duluth at No. 4, North Dakota at No. 6, Minnesota at No. 8 and Ohio State at No. 10.

The top-ranked Badgers (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA), who were idle last week, host No. 10-ranked Ohio State

(4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) in a premier conference matchup this weekend at the Kohl Center, Oct. 22-23.

In other league series this Friday and Saturday, No. 8-ranked Minnesota (3-2-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) visits St. Cloud State (0-5-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) and No. 6-ranked North Dakota (4-2-0, 3-1-0 WCHA) travels to Minnesota State (1-2-1, 0-2-0 WCHA).

In non-conference play this week, No. 4-ranked Minnesota Duluth hosts Hockey East Association-member Connecticut (1-4-0) for the first time in school history in a Saturday-Sunday series while Bemidji State (2-4-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) plays two exhibition games against the Minnesota Whitecaps -- Friday in Eveleth, Minn., at the historic Hippodrome and Saturday afternoon in Bemidji at the new Bemidji Regional Event Center.

Last weekend (Oct. 15-17), Bemidji State christened its new building by hosting what was then top-ranked Mercyhurst. The Lakers beat the Beavers 4-0 last Friday to open the arena, but BSU came back Saturday for its first ever win against a No. 1-ranked team behind the 56-save goaltending show by Alana McElhinney. The Beavers got all of their goals from the line of Erin Cody, Sadie Lundquist and Emily Erickson and snapped the Lakers' 36-game regular season winning streak.

In league play last weekend, host Ohio State stayed unbeaten with 3-1 and 6-1 victories over St. Cloud State. Laura McIntosh had a six-point weekend for the Buckeyes. After setting up the opening goal in last Friday's game, McIntosh tied the school record with five points (three goals, two assists) in the series finale.

Minnesota Duluth spotted Minnesota State two goals last Saturday before roaring back to take a 5-2 victory and then Jennifer Hars, who was pulled in the series opener, made 26 saves in blanking the Mavericks 6-0 on Sunday in Duluth. Elin Holmlov had a five-point weekend for the Bulldogs with two assists last Saturday and two goals and an assist Sunday.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Implements Three-Point Wins in League Standings

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play, Associate Commissioner Sara Martin announced.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that

loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings will show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.)

A team receives three points for winning a game in overtime (in regulation or overtime) and one point for an overtime tie. NCAA rules do not recognize shootout wins and for purposes to figure out a team's RPI, a game which ends tied after 65 minutes and prior to a shootout is recorded as a tie.

To reiterate the new WCHA women's league policy: Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play it's first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid

into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The BSU women's hockey team christened its new home, the Bemidji Regional Event Center, with a daunting task of hosting No. 1 Mercyhurst.
- In last Friday's contest the Beaver offense struggled and failed to get on the board as the Lakers blanked BSU 4-0 in the first game to be played in the new building. Zuzana Tomcikova was in net for the Beavers and made a total of 26 saves in the 60 minutes of work. Three of the four goals scored by the Lakers in the first game were scored on special teams plays; two came on the power-play, while one was scored with an extra attacker on a delayed penalty.
- Even though the Lakers were the No. 1 team in the nation, the Beavers weren't going to allow themselves to be swept in the opening weekend of their new home. Following up the next day, Bemidji State stunned the hockey community beating Mercyhurst 5-3.
- The offensive problems the Beavers had in Friday's game seemed to be a distant memory as BSU jumped out on fire netting the first four goals of the game.
- With the Beaver offense firing on all cylinders, the real story line, however, belonged to goaltender Alana McElhinney (Jr., Calgary, AB) who recorded a career-high 56 saves in the contest. Picking up her first win of the season in style, McElhinney denied Mercyhurst's captain and Olympic Gold Medal winner, Megan Agosta, from scoring a goal. She also set the school record for most saves in a win.
- The line of Erin Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Emily Erickson scored all five goals for the Beavers in the game and accounted for five of the six assists in the game. The trio also combined for five blocked shots.
- The first goal of the game at the 8:24 mark of the first period ended a 77-minute scoring drought.
- The win was BSU's first-ever over a No. 1 team.
- Bratislava, Slovakia native Zuzana Tomcikova has made a total of 126 saves so far in just three appearances this season. She started the season off on the right foot picking up the team's first win in a 3-0 shutout victory over Wayne State on Oct. 1. She turned away 27 shots in the contest, including 12 in the third period, to record her ninth-career shutout. For her efforts in the Oct. 1 game, she was honored as the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 6. Winning her eighth-career weekly honor, Tomcikova has now won more player of the weeks than any other BSU women's hockey player. The previous mark was set at seven by former goaltender Emily Brookshaw. After a stellar freshman campaign the Beaver goaltender made an even better sophomore debut gathering 795 saves on 848 shots. In her second year she recorded a .938 save percentage while recording a 2.06 goals-against average. Tomcikova returned from the 2010 Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver where she played in all five games for the Slovakian National Women's Hockey Team. In those five games she faced 235 shots on goal, more than any other goaltender, male or female, in the 2010 Winter Games. She was also named to the 2009-10 and 2008-09 All-WCHA Second Team, which was the highest individual award won by a BSU women's hockey player.
- The forward line of Erin Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Emily Erickson has scored nine of the 11 goals this year, three a piece, and have tallied 10 of the 16 assists so far. The trio has accounted for 19 of the 27 total points on the season.
- Sacrificing their bodies, the members of the BSU defense have combined to block a total of 98 shots on the season.
- The 56 saves made by Alana McElhinney on Oct. 16 against Mercyhurst were the most saves made by a BSU tender in a win. Of the 56 saves, 23 were made in the third period.
- The Beavers ended Mercyhurst's 36-game regular-season winning

streak when BSU defeated the top ranked Lakers on Oct. 16 by a score of 5-2.

- BSU has five freshmen this year: Tess Dusik (F, Oak Bluff, MB), Allie Duellman (D, Maplewood, MN), Alex Ehlert (D, Portage, WI), Emily McKnight (F, Roland, MB) and Danielle Williams (D, Waconia, MN). Ehlert recorded the first point of the five on Oct. 2 recording an assist on the second Beaver goal of the game against Wayne State.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

- The No. 8-ranked Golden Gophers (3-2-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) travel to St. Cloud State this Friday and Saturday after suffering their first losses of the season to North Dakota last weekend – 4-3 on Friday and 3-1 on Saturday at Ridder Arena. It was the first time Minnesota had ever loss to North Dakota after 28 Gopher victories.
- The Gophers were swept at home for the first time since 2007.
- In the series opener on Oct. 15, the Gophers allowed their first goal of the season, and three more in losing to UND for the first time ever. Minnesota gave up a goal to Margot Miller at 2:01 of the first period. It was the first goal allowed by the Gophers since last season's NCAA Frozen Four. The scoreless span covered 202:46.
- On Oct. 15, North Dakota's Jordan Slavin scored the game-winning goal :32 seconds into the third period. Becky Kortum, Jen Schoullis and Kelly Terry scored for the Gophers. Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Sara Dagenais scored the other goals for the Sioux.
- In the series finale, Lamoureux-Kolls gave the Sioux a 1-0 lead at 3:36 of the first period on a four-on-four attempt. Terry tied it 1-1 before Dagenais put the Sioux ahead at 10:12 of the first with an assist from Jocelyne Lamoureux. The Sioux, then ranked No. 8, added to their lead when Dagenais scored again at 3:55 of the third period. The Gophers had only three shots in the third to North Dakota's five. In nets, Alyssa Grogan had 15 saves for Minnesota and Stephanie Ney had 23 for the Sioux.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- No. 4 UMD (3-1-0, 3-1-0) earned a series sweep against Minnesota State at home at the DECC this past weekend, serving up 5-2 and 6-0 wins.
- The Bulldogs, who are 40-4-3 all-time against the Mavericks, fell behind 2-0 after one period of play last Saturday before scoring four unanswered goals in the second period. Three players had two or more point performances, including junior forward Haley Irwin (2g, 1a), senior forward Elin Holmlov (2g) and sophomore forward Jessica Wong (1g, 1a).
- Last Sunday's 6-0 WCHA win over Minnesota State was an offensive clinic for UMD, with two goals and an assist credited to Holmlov in just 1:50 of action in the second period to put the game out of reach. Pernilla Winberg also had a goal and an assist in the contest.
- Sophomore Jennifer Harss – making her second start in as many games – rebounded from her early first period exit last Saturday to make 26 saves for the Bulldogs en route to earning her 30 career win and sixth career shutout.
- Senior netminder Kim Martin picked up her 55th win last Saturday in relief of Harss. Martin is now 10 victories from tying Riitta Schaublin's career record of 65 wins as a Bulldog goaltender.
- UMD owns the No. 1 power-play in the country, a 33.3% success rate and four goals in 12 attempts.
- The Bulldogs are ranked sixth in the NCAA for scoring offense (4.25), defense (1.50) and penalty minutes (13.0). UMD also has the second-

highest scoring average in the WCHA.

- Holmlov is ranked No. 4 nationally in assists with a 1.25 per game average, while Irwin is No. 6 with a 1.25 goals per game average. Both Irwin and Holmlov have notched seven points so far this season and lead the Bulldogs in scoring.
- Five UMD players have a 1.00 points per game average or better.
- Irwin leads the team with a +10 plus/minus rating.
- UMD will step out of league play this weekend to host the University of Connecticut. The series will be the Bulldogs first against the Huskies in program history.

Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (1-2-1, 0-2-0-0 WCHA) were swept twice over the Oct. 16-17 weekend at defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.
- In last Saturday's 5-2 loss, junior forward Emmi Leinonen sent a slap shot past UMD goaltender Jennifer Harss putting MSU up, 1-0 just 5:57 into the game. Not long after, 9:19 into the first, sophomore forward Lauren Zrust moved the puck from behind the UMD goal, centered it to rookie Kathleen Rogan who found the back of the net for the first goal of Rogan's career with the Mavericks. The Bulldogs' Jessica Wong scored just :50 into the second period, followed by forward Pernilla Winberg finding the back of the net at 2:39 and UMD took the lead 13:58 into the second courtesy of Laura Fridfinnson's power-play goal. The Bulldogs then added to their lead when Elin Holmlov scored an even-strength goal at the 19:04 mark. UMD added a fifth goal in the third, Irwin's shorthander. The Bulldogs outshot MSU, 42-19 and both teams finished one-for-three on power-play chances. Junior netminder Alli Altmann finished with a season-high 37 saves.
- In last Saturday's contest it was all Bulldogs as they downed MSU, 6-0. Altmann saved the first 13 shots, but Irwin converted a turnover for an unassisted tally at the 7:45 mark. UMD added to their lead at the 15:05 mark when sophomore forward Gina Dodge stole the puck and put it under Altmann's glove, putting UMD up 2-0 after the first. Minnesota Duluth increased its lead to 6-0 in the second on two goals by Holmlov and one each by Winberg and Katie Wilson.
- Captain and forward Moira O'Connor (2-1=3) and rookie forward Rogan (1-2=3) each own three points on the year, team-bests.

Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

- It took North Dakota into its ninth season to beat the Minnesota Gophers and last weekend the Sioux did it twice within the span of 22 hours. The No. 6 Sioux swept the Gophers by scores of 4-3 and 3-1 at Ridder Arena to improve 4-2-0 and 3-1-0-0 in league play.
- Both Sara Dagenais and Jordan Slavin had four-point weekends for the Sioux.
- Last Friday (Oct. 15), the Sioux were the first team to score back-to-back goals after trading goals through the first three periods proving enough for the 4-3 win. Margot Miller and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls scored in the first period as the two teams entered the first intermission square at 2-2. Kelly Terry scored her first of a two-goal weekend for the Gophers in the second period but Dagenais answered with her first of her own two-goal weekend. Mary Loken would score what would prove to be the game-winner only :32 seconds in the final frame, swatting in a rebound off a shot by Slavin.
- Lamoureux-Kolls scored her team-leading fifth goal of the season only 3:36 into last Saturday's (Oct. 16) game to give the Sioux an early lead. Dagenais would again answer a Gopher goal by Terry to send the Sioux into the opening break up 2-1. After the first scoreless period of the weekend, Slavin was able to cash in on a power-play opportunity to score the game's final goal at 3:55 of the third period. UND finished the game with 18 blocked shots, 13 of which came in the third stanza.

- For the second straight weekend since Sioux netminder Stephanie Ney returned from an injury, UND has split game time between Ney and Jorid Dagfinrud. Dagfinrud picked up the win at UM last Friday making 30 saves while allowing three goals. Ney made 23 saves while allowing one goal in the win on Saturday to improve to 2-0-0 on the season with a 1.50 goals against average and a .946 save percentage.
- The Sioux went 8-for-8 in penalty-kill situations at Minnesota, improving to 22-for-25 on the season which is 11th in the nation.
- The Sioux also went 1-for-7 with the man-advantage in each game to improve to 5-for-37 on the season on the power-play.
- The Sioux return to the road this weekend to take on league rival Minnesota State in a Friday/Saturday series. The Mavericks lead the all-time series, 19-6-5.

Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The No. 10 Buckeyes opened their home and WCHA schedule with a sweep of St. Cloud State, Oct. 15-16 at the OSU Ice Rink.
- Ohio State took the first game by a score of 3-1 last Friday before a third-period outburst in a 6-1 win Saturday. Ohio State regains the lead in the all-time series with the Huskies by a 24-23-6 edge. The Buckeyes had not swept SCSU since Oct. 7-8, 2005 in Columbus.
- Ohio State has started the season by winning its first four games for just the second time in team history (also in 2005-06).
- Laura McIntosh wrote her name in another category of the Ohio State record books last Saturday (Oct. 16), becoming just the fifth Buckeye in team history to have five points in a game as she scored a hat trick and added two assists. McIntosh joins Hokey Langan (vs. Bemidji State, Jan. 22, 2010), Tessa Bonhomme (vs. North Dakota Jan. 5, 2008), Emma Laaksonen and Kelli Halcisak (both vs. Wayne State, March 2, 2001) as Buckeyes who have scored five points in a game. The hat trick was the second by McIntosh in her career. She also scored three times vs. Minnesota State, Feb. 20, 2008. McIntosh also extended her point streak to 12 games, carrying it over from the end of the 2009-10 season. It is the third-longest streak in team history. Through four games, McIntosh has 10 points (5g, 5a). The junior assistant captain is only six points away from 100 after collecting 26 goals and 68 assists in 77 career games.
- McIntosh was not the only Buckeye with multiple points in the second game vs SCSU as juniors Natalie Spooner and Kelly Wild had a goal and assist apiece and Langan tallied two assists. A total of nine Buckeyes had a point in the game.
- Spooner, McIntosh and Langan have a point in each game this season. Spooner is on an eight-game point streak and has at least two points in each game this year. She also has a point in 18 consecutive series.
- Senior defenseman Shannon Reilly now has 14 points (3g, 11a) in 17 career games against St. Cloud State after scoring twice and adding an assist in the sweep.
- Ohio State scored six of nine goals in the third period vs. SCSU and is outscoring opponents 8-1 in the third period so far this season.
- Freshman goalie Lisa Steffes improved to 4-0-0 after making 37 saves in the SCSU series. The Amherstburg, Ont., native has limited opponents to a single goal in each game and has a .951 save percentage after stopping 77 of 81 shots faced.
- The Buckeyes will continue conference play with a road series at top-ranked Wisconsin, Oct. 22-23. Games begin at 7 pm (CT) both Friday and Saturday at the Kohl Center in Madison.
- OSU defeated the Badgers four times during the 2009-10 season (4-2-0). The teams split their regular-season meetings and the Buckeyes then swept the Badgers during the WCHA First Round Playoff series with both wins coming in overtime in Madison. Before last season, Ohio State had just three total wins over Wisconsin in the previous 10 seasons.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- The Huskies (0-5-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) suffered two losses to Ohio State University on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 15-16, in the OSU Ice Rink.
- St. Cloud State's rookie forward Julia Gilbert netted her first goal in the Huskies' 3-1 loss to Ohio State last Friday while sophomore forward Alex Nelson netted her first goal of the season in a 6-1 loss to the #10 Buckeyes last Saturday.
- Senior goaltender Ashley Nixon surrendered both losses to the Buckeyes, backstopping the Huskies with 70 saves in 120 minutes of ice time. Nixon's goals-against average this season is 5.46 with a save percentage of .859.
- First-year players Molli Mott and Amanda Monkman posted their initial career points this past weekend at OSU with assists.
- Ohio State has now regained a slight advantage in the all-time series with St. Cloud State, 24-23-6, dating back to Oct. 22, 1999.
- SCSU returns home for Homecoming Weekend to face eighth-ranked Minnesota on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 22-23. Game times are 7:07 pm both nights in the National Hockey Center.
- St. Cloud State has scheduled its 5th Annual Alumni Game for this Saturday, October 23, at 4:00 pm in the National Hockey Center.

Badgers

University of Wisconsin

- The top-ranked Badgers, idle last weekend, continue league play when they host No. 10 Ohio State (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) at the Kohl Center this weekend.
- The Badgers take on their first ranked opponent of the season this weekend. The last time UW defeated a ranked opponent was Feb. 19, 2010 when Wisconsin posted a 4-3 overtime victory at then-No. 2 Minnesota.
- Wisconsin owns a 39-7-6 all-time record against Ohio State.
- The Badgers are 2-4-0 in their last six meetings with the Buckeyes, splitting the four regular season games last season before dropping two games to OSU in the WCHA first round best-of-three series in 2009-10. Of the six games, five were decided by one goal, and the two postseason games went to overtime.
- Prior to last season, Wisconsin had won eight-straight against the Buckeyes. UW was unbeaten against OSU in 21 games from Feb. 11, 2005 to Oct. 23, 2009.
- The Badgers earned the No. 1 ranking in this week's USCHO.com national poll after spending last week as the No. 3 team. Wisconsin's No. 1 national ranking marks the first time the Badgers find themselves atop the national polls since opening the 2009-10 season as No. 1 in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine preseason poll. UW was last ranked No. 1 by USCHO.com in the final poll of 2008-09, taking the top spot in both national polls on March 9-10, 2009. Wisconsin spent 15 weeks as USCHO.com's No. 1 pick during the 2008-09 season, including 11 consecutive weeks from Oct. 14, 2008 to Jan. 5, 2009.
- Wisconsin posted two victories over Bemidji State in its WCHA-opening weekend at the Kohl Center Oct. 8 and 10. UW won its league-opener, 7-1, before following up with a 2-0 victory over the Beavers to complete the series sweep.
- UW is 202-61-27 all-time in WCHA games for a .743 winning percentage.
- Junior Carolynne Prevost has a team-high six goals and leads the nation with three game-winning goals.
- With two shutouts in as many appearances, sophomore goaltender Becca Ruegsegger is tied for the national lead with a 0.00 goals-against average and a 1.000 saves percentage. Ruegsegger and freshman Alex Rigsby are among eight goaltenders in the nation with a perfect 1.000 win percentage so far this season.

- As a team, the Badgers and Mercyhurst are tied for the national scoring lead, averaging 5.50 goals per game.
- UW also leads the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 0.25 goals per game.
- The Badgers hold the top spot with a +5.25 scoring margin in four games.
- Wisconsin continues its season-opening eight-game home stand this weekend. With four consecutive wins at home to open the season, the Badgers improved to 109-22-12 (.804 winning percentage) all-time at the Kohl Center.
