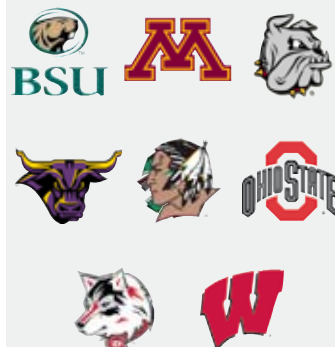

MADISON, Wis. – The University of Wisconsin remained atop the women's Div. 1 national rankings and also moved into a first place tie in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association standings by using Brianna Decker's hat trick and taking a thrilling 6-5 overtime victory over visiting and No. 10-ranked Ohio State on Friday, Oct. 22, and then completing the sweep over the Buckeyes with a 5-2 victory on Oct. 23.

The Badgers, who wrap up a season-opening eight-game homestand against Minnesota State (2-3-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) this Friday and Saturday afternoons (Oct. 29-30) at the Kohl Center, are 6-0-0 overall and 4-0-0 in the WCHA with 12 points, tied with North Dakota for the WCHA lead.

Wisconsin is one of only three unbeaten teams in the country and one of five Western Collegiate Hockey Association teams ranked in this week's (Oct. 26) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Hockey Poll. Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth, which shutout Connecticut 8-0 and 4-0 in Duluth last weekend to run its record to 5-1-0 overall, is ranked third behind Cornell. Minnesota is tied for No. 6, North Dakota

is at No. 8 and Ohio State remains at No. 10 in this week's poll.

Two of those top 10 teams, in-state rivals Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth, collide in Duluth Friday and Saturday in the WCHA's premier matchup this week. UMD (3-1-0 and in third place in the WCHA with nine points) has a four-game winning streak against the Golden Gophers, including a 3-2 win at Minnesota's Ridder Arena last season in the 2010 NCAA Frozen Four.

The Gophers (5-2, 2-2-0) won their first conference games of the season by blanking St. Cloud State 5-0 and 3-0 last weekend in St. Cloud as defenseman Anne Schleper collected six points and goaltender Noora Raty, who hasn't allowed a goal in four games this season, had back to back shutouts and 32 saves.

In the one other league series this Halloween weekend, St. Cloud State (0-7-0, 0-4-0 WCHA) travels to Bemidji State (2-4-0, 0-2-0 WCHA).

In non-conference play this week, Ohio State (4-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) hosts Syracuse Friday and Saturday in Columbus. North Dakota (5-3, 4-2-0 WCHA) is idle.

Last weekend, North Dakota split two games at Mankato. The Mavericks' Kathleen Rogan had a hat trick and Minnesota State won the opener, 4-2 and UND's Jocelyne Lamoureux had three goals in the series finale and the Sioux took a 5-1 decision.

In exhibition play Oct. 22-23, Bemidji State split two games with the Minnesota Whitecaps, losing 3-1 in Eveleth, Minn., and winning at home, 5-1.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Nov. 5 (Friday), Nov. 6 (Saturday) and Nov. 7 (Sunday) there will be a full slate of four Western Collegiate Hockey Association series contested. On Friday and Saturday, Minnesota plays host to Wisconsin, Bemidji State entertains Minnesota Duluth, and Minnesota State hosts St. Cloud State. On Saturday and Sunday, North Dakota welcomes Ohio State.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Implements Three-Point Wins in League Standings

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play, Associate Commissioner Sara Martin announced.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that

loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings will show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.)

A team receives three points for winning a game in overtime (in regulation or overtime) and one point for an overtime tie. NCAA rules do not recognize shootout wins and for purposes to figure out a team's RPI, a game which ends tied after 65 minutes and prior to a shootout is recorded as a tie.

To reiterate the new WCHA women's league policy: Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play it's first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Beavers, who split two exhibition games with the Minnesota Whitecaps last weekend, return to conference play as they host St. Cloud State on Friday and Saturday at the Bemidji Regional Event Center.
- The last time the two teams faced-off was in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs last season. In game one the Huskies shutout the Beavers 3-0, but BSU bounced back, winning games two and three with scores of 2-1 and 4-1, respectively. Montana Vichorek scored the series-winning goal in game three, while picking up two assists in game two. Annie Bauerfeld had two goals in the series.
- BSU is 18-26-7 all-time against the SCSU Huskies, with the series going 3-3-1 last season.
- The Beavers lost in Eveleth, Minn., as part of the USA Hockey Hall of Fame game weekend. Iya Gavrilova and Jenny Potter both scored to lift the Whitecaps to a 3-1 victory over the Beavers. Jamie Hatheway scored the lone goal for the Beavers. Bouncing back the next day, the Beavers claimed a 5-1 victory over the Whitecaps in the Bemidji Regional Event Center. The Whitecaps opened the scoring, netting a goal on their first shot, but Beaver tender Zuzana Tomcikova clamped down stopping the next 25 shots on goal. Emily Erickson had a hat trick, while Erin Cody and MacKenzie Thurston netted the two other BSU goals.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

- The Golden Gophers earned back-to-back WCHA wins against St. Cloud State last weekend. After starting the conference season out 0-2-0, the Golden Gophers are now 2-2-0 in the WCHA and 5-2-0 overall.
- On the Oct. 22-23 weekend, Anne Schleper had six points, while Davis and Kelly Terry had four and Becky Kortum had three.
- After a week hiatus, Noora Raty returned between the pipes and played to perfection, holding the Huskies scoreless in the series. Playing the full 120 minutes on the weekend, Raty had 32 saves and recorded back-to-back shutouts. In four games played this season, Raty has yet to allow a goal, holding a perfect 1.000 save percentage and a 0.00 goals-against average.
- In last Saturday's game, Minnesota scored three power-play goals en route to a 3-0 shutout win. Megan Bozek recorded the first Gopher power-play at 4:11 in the first period. Kortum added to the lead when she scored her third goal of the weekend at 15:45 in the second period, also on the power-play. Davis netted a power-play goal of her own when she scored at 10:11 in the third period. Davis received a great feed from Terry, while Schleper started the play from the top of the left circle. The goal was a five-on-three power-play advantage.
- Last Friday, the Gophers had scoring from four different individuals and Kortum netted her first multiple-goal game of her career in a 5-0 win over St. Cloud. Minnesota scored two goals in the first period when Davis and Schleper scored to put the game at 2-0 after one. Davis scored her first goal as a Golden Gopher when she capitalized on a power-play goal at 5:36. Schleper scored a goal of her own at 11:35 in the first. Kortum then found the net twice in the second period when she scored back-to-back goals at 4:31 and 10:42 to put the game at 4-0 after two. After setting up two, Kelly Terry scored her own as she used her rebound attempt to score her third goal in three games at 6:22 in the third.
- In last Saturday's game, the Gophers rattled off 55 shots on goal. Along with the 55 shots on goal, Minnesota attempted a total of 85 shots. The Gophers only allowed 24 total shots attempted and 18 on goal. The Gophers rang off the post four times in Saturday's game as well.
- Kortum has been a sniper this year. After scoring four goals and 10

assists last year as a freshman, she's already surpassed her goal production from a year ago. Kortum has scored a goal in four of the Gophers' seven games. With seven points on the season, she's already half way to tying her freshman mark last year.

- Minnesota will face in-state and arch rival Minnesota Duluth this weekend. Both games are set for 7:07 pm CT starts at the DECC.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 3 Bulldogs earned their second-straight series sweep and pushed their current winning streak to four with two victories over the University of Connecticut at the DECC this past weekend.
- The Bulldogs beat up the Huskies last Saturday afternoon with an 8-0 offensive outburst, led by sophomore forward Jessica Wong and her first collegiate hat-trick. Eleven (11) players picked up a point, with six skaters scooping up two or more points including a three point performance by Audrey Cournoyer (1g, 2a). UMD held UConn to a new Bulldog program low for shots in a game, allowing just nine shots on goaltender Jennifer Harss, who earned the 31st win of her career and seventh shutout.
- The Bulldogs again held UConn scoreless last Sunday afternoon, beating the Huskies 4-0 behind two goals from Cournoyer and Haley Irwin. Wong and Jocelyne Larocque also picked up two assists in the contest, win No. 56 for netminder Kim Martin, as well as career shutout No. 13.
- The series – UMD's first ever against Connecticut – leaves the Bulldogs 15-2-0 all-time against Hockey East opponents, with 15 consecutive wins in the past 11 years.
- Head coach Shannon Miller is four wins shy from her 300th win at UMD. Miller is on pace to become the fastest NCAA Division 1 women's hockey coach ever to reach that milestone.
- Eight Bulldog players have recorded five or more points in just six skates, including five with seven or more. Irwin leads UMD with 12 points (8-4=12) and not only has a six-game scoring streak intact, but has scored a tally in each of her first six contests. Irwin is tied for the NCAA's second spot for goals with an 1.33 goals per game average, and is also tied for the most goals scored in the WCHA. Irwin is averaging 2.00 points per game, ranking her sixth in the NCAA. Wong is averaging 1.67 points per game and ranks second among all Bulldog scorers only to Irwin. Senior forward Elin Holmlöv is No. 6 in the NCAA with seven assists in six skates, and also tied for first in the WCHA.
- Both UMD netminders are ranked in the top-five in the nation in goals-against average, with Harss ranked fourth with a 0.93 in 128:56 minutes and Martin ranked fifth with a 1.04 in 230:29 of action. Harss also owns the third-ranked saves percentage in the NCAA, a .969.
- The Bulldogs are averaging a blistering 4.83 goals a game and are tied with Minnesota for the nation's lowest goals-against average of 1.00 a contest.
- UMD owns the nation's third-ranked power-play and the WCHA's best percentage of 30.4, now 7-of-23 with the extra skater.
- UMD faces I-35 rival Minnesota at the DECC this weekend. It is a team the Bulldogs bounced four times last season in six meetings. UMD has a four-game winning streak against the Gophers, including a 3-2 win at Ridder Arena last season in the 2010 NCAA Frozen Four, where the two teams met for the first-time ever on college hockey's biggest stage on March 19. Minnesota remains the one team in all of the NCAA that UMD is not over .500 against. The Bulldogs are 21-26-5 for a .451 winning percentage against the Gophers. UMD and coach Miller have faced Minnesota 52 times – the second most meetings the Bulldogs have had against any program except Wisconsin (53 meetings).

Mavericks

Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks split two games with No. 6-ranked North Dakota this past weekend (Oct. 22-23), winning 4-2 in the series opener last Friday, but dropping Saturday's contest, 5-1.
- Rookie forward Kathleen Rogan sparked the Mavericks offense last Friday, tallying a hat trick, finding the back of the net in each period. Rogan's first tally came in the first period and was assisted by sophomore center Lauren Smith. Her next two goals were unassisted break away goals.
- Two other rookies tallied firsts for the Mavericks vs UND. Nicole Germaine tallied both her first assist last Friday and first goal on Saturday, while rookie Tracy McCann tallied her first goal in last Friday's contest.
- Rookie goaltender Danielle Butters also tallied her first career win last Friday vs North Dakota, stopping 62 shots on the weekend with a 3.50 goals-against average and a .899 save percentage.
- Three other Mavericks tallied assists, including junior center Moria O'Connor and senior defenseman Amy Udvig.
- As a team last weekend, MSU was outshot 69-39 by North Dakota, earned five assists to UND's 11 assists, finished 0-of-5 on power-play chances (while UND went 4-of-12), had two power-play shots (compared to UND's 25 power-play shots), and had twice as many penalties as UND (14 to 7).
- Rogan's hat trick vs UND on Oct. 22 marks the first for an MSU player since former Maverick Ashley Young tallied three goals against Bemidji State in 2008. Rogan finished the weekend with a +2 rating and a team-high nine shots.

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

- The Sioux settled for a split this past weekend at Minnesota State to close out its first month of the 2010-11 season. The Sioux end October play with a 5-3-0 overall record and 4-2-0 WCHA record.
- In Mankato, Minn., last Friday, the Sioux dropped a 4-2 decision to Minnesota State. The Sioux hit its first bump in the season as the outshot the Mavericks 30-21 (62-32 shots attempted) but allowed a hat trick by Kathleen Rogan and Danielle Butters to pick up her first collegiate win with 28 saves. All of Rogan's goals came on odd-man rushes with two of them on breakaways. UND's Jocelyne Lamoureux had two points in the game with one goal and one assist while Allison Parizek added the second goal for the Sioux.
- North Dakota then answered with a 5-1 win over Minnesota State at All-Seasons Arena last Saturday led by a hat trick by Lamoureux. Kelsey Ketcher and Parizek also added goals. The Sioux outshot the Mavericks 15-2 in the first period leading to a 2-0 advantage, but the Mavericks were the lone team able to score in the second period to cut the lead to one goal despite trailing 29-11 in shots. In the third period, UND blew it open. Lamoureux had a pair of goals and Parizek added her second of the weekend. Stephanie Ney stopped 17 of 18 shots to earn the win and improve to 3-0 on the year with a 1.33 goals-against average and .946 save percentage.
- Jocelyne Lamoureux's hat trick (vs MSU) was the first recorded by a Sioux since Cami Wooster accomplished the three-goal mark on Oct. 22, 2005.
- Alyssa Wiebe recorded three assists in the game giving her 42 in her career. She is now tied with Melissa Jaques for the program's career record.
- The Sioux have a much-needed weekend off before returning to action at the Ralph Engelstad Arena on Nov. 6-7 in a WCHA series against Ohio State.

Buckeyes

Ohio State University

- The No. 10-ranked Buckeyes fell in both games at No. 1/2-ranked Wisconsin, Oct. 22-23 in Madison. The Buckeyes lost in overtime by a score of 6-5 Friday before a 5-2 defeat Saturday.
- The losses were the first for the Buckeyes this season.
- Ohio State and Wisconsin are tied at 4-4-0 in their last eight meetings dating back to last season. Six of the last eight games between the Buckeyes and Badgers have been decided by one goal.
- After a 1-0 Buckeye lead at the first intermission in game one, it was a barnburner after that with the teams exchanging 10 goals the remaining 40 minutes. For the second-consecutive game, junior Laura McIntosh led the Buckeyes offensively with four points on a goal and three assists. Sophomore Hokey Langan scored the game-tying goal with 1 minute left in regulation and added two assists for three points, while junior Natalie Spooner scored the opening two goals for Ohio State.
- The OSU special teams were clicking Friday with four power-play goals on seven chances and a perfect 4-of-4 mark on the penalty-kill. The last time Ohio State scored four power-play goals in a game was Oct. 6, 2006 vs. Northeastern (4-of-4).
- Kim Theut had a goal and Minttu Tuominen had an assist for their first points of the season last Friday.
- Ohio State cut its deficit to one goal twice in the second period, but Wisconsin pulled away with two goals in the last three minutes of regulation, including an empty-netter, for the 5-2 victory last Saturday.
- Freshman goalie Lisa Steffes made 43 saves Saturday after stopping 44 last Friday night for a total of 87 in the series. She is 4-2-0 after starting all six games this year. Steffes' 44 saves last Friday and 43 saves Saturday rank as the fifth- and sixth-most in a game by a Buckeye goalie.
- Tina Hollowell got the Buckeyes on the board last Saturday by scoring her first goal of season. The goal was the first allowed by Wisconsin goaltender Becca Ruegsegger after seven scoreless periods to open the season.
- With two goals last Friday and another lamplighter Saturday, Spooner extended her point streak to 10 games – the longest of her career and fourth-longest in Ohio State history. Her three goals upped her career total to 51; she is just the fourth Buckeye to reach the 50-goal mark. Spooner has a goal in all six games this season. Added to her goal from the final game of the 2009-10 season, she has set the Ohio State record for consecutive games with a goal at seven. Spooner also has a point in 19-consecutive series, dating back to the second series of last year.
- Laura McIntosh was held without a point for the first time this season ending her career-long point streak at 13 games. It is the third-longest streak in OSU history. McIntosh is two points away from her 100th. She is tied for seventh in all-time scoring with 98 points and moved to fourth in career assists with 71. McIntosh tallied nine points (4g, 5a) over five-period span, scoring a hat trick with two assists Oct. 16 vs SCSU then scoring a goal and adding three assists in the opening two periods of the Oct. 22 game at Wisconsin.
- Meanwhile, Hokey Langan continued her point streak with her assist on the opening goal. She has at least a point in eight-consecutive games.
- Shannon Reilly has five points (3g, 2a) in the first six games this season. She totaled 11 points in all 37 games last year.
- Up next, the Buckeyes welcome Syracuse (4-2-1) to the OSU Ice Rink for a non-conference series Oct. 29-30. Games begin at 7 pm Friday and 4 pm Saturday. This is the first meeting between the two programs.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- Despite the play of the Huskies' senior goalie Ashley Nixon, St. Cloud State remained winless. Nixon stood on her head last Saturday, Oct. 23, in the National Hockey Center, backstopping the Huskies with a season high 52 saves in a 3-0 loss to the No. 7/8-ranked Minnesota Gophers.
- With the weekend series sweep, the Gophers improve to 5-2-0 overall and 2-2-0 in the WCHA while the Huskies fall to 0-7-0 and 0-4-0 in the league.
- Nixon was spectacular between the pipes, giving up only power-play scores to the Gophers. With the loss, Nixon falls to 0-5-0 in her senior season.
- The Gophers continue to dominate the all-time series with the Huskies, 43-3-2, dating back to Jan. 9, 1999.
- The Gophers blanked the St. Cloud State women's hockey squad by a score of 5-0 last Friday night (Oct. 22) in the NHC. St. Cloud's junior netminder Tayler VanDenakker stopped 31 of Minnesota's 36 shots on the evening, falling to 0-2-0 on the young 2010-11 season.
- Before last Saturday's game against the Gophers, the Huskies hosted their annual youth clinic and also the 5th Annual Alumni Game, all in part of Homecoming Weekend at St. Cloud State.
- St. Cloud State will now hit the road for three straight weekends, starting at Bemidji State University this Friday and Saturday, Oct. 29-30.

Badgers

University of Wisconsin

- The top-ranked and unbeaten Badgers (6-0-0, 4-0-0 WCHA) wrap up their season-opening eight-game homestand and hosts Minnesota State (2-3-1, 1-3-0 WCHA) at the Kohl Center this Friday and Saturday at 2 p.m. each day at the Kohl Center.
- Wisconsin is tied with North Dakota (5-3-0, 4-2-0 WCHA) for first place in the conference with 12 points.
- UW is 204-61-27 all-time in WCHA games for a .744 winning percentage.
- Wisconsin owns a 43-1-2 all-time record against Minnesota State. The Badgers went 3-1-0 against MSU last season, winning the most recent meeting, 6-0, in Madison on Feb. 14, 2010. The Mavericks posted their first win over UW in the first game of the series when they skated to a 5-3 victory on Feb. 12, 2010.
- The Badgers retained the No. 1 ranking in this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's National Poll after moving into the top spot last week.
- UW extended its season-opening winning streak to six games with a series sweep over then-No. 10 Ohio State Oct. 22-23. The Badgers won a 6-5 overtime thriller last Friday before following up with a 5-2 victory over the Buckeyes last Saturday.
- Last Friday night, sophomores Brianna Decker and Stefanie McKeough led Wisconsin to a 6-5 overtime win over Ohio State. Decker earned her second career hat trick, including the game-winner in overtime to seal the victory after the Badgers fought back from 2-0, 3-1 and 4-2 deficits, and McKeough scored her first two goals of the season.
- Game two of the Oct. 22-23 series saw the Badgers hold OSU scoreless on the power-play after allowing four power-play goals the night before. Senior Meghan Duggan and junior Hilary Knight led the Badgers with two goals apiece. Duggan also earned an assist to finish with a team-high three points.
- Becca Ruegsegger and Alex Rigsby again split time in goal vs OSU. Both earned their third wins of the season as Rigsby made a career-high 17 saves last Friday night before Ruegsegger stopped 16-of-18 shots, including nine in the third period, on Saturday. Both have now made three starts on the season while combining for 75 saves with a 1.33 goals-against average, a .904 saves percentage and three shutouts.
- With two wins over Ohio State, the Badgers are a perfect 2-0-0 against

ranked opponents this season. The Badgers went 4-3-1 against ranked opponents in 2009-10.

- In three series so far this season, three different Badgers have recorded hat tricks as Knight scored three goals against RPI, Carolynne Prevost tallied a hat trick against Bemidji state, and Decker delivered a three-goal performance against Ohio State.
- Ruegsegger is second in the nation with a 0.67 goals-against average and fourth with a .950 save percentage. Ruegsegger and Rigsby are among seven goaltenders with a perfect 1.000 win percentage so far this season. The Badgers are the only team in the nation with two unbeaten goaltenders.
