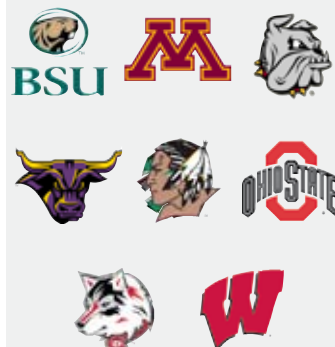

## UMD Bulldogs, UW Badgers Renew Rivalry Over Thanksgiving Holiday Weekend of Nov. 26-28 in One of Two WCHA Series; Ohio State Hosts Bemidji State

**Non-Conference Match Ups Have Minnesota Entertaining Harvard, Minnesota State at Wayne State; North Dakota Sweeps into First Place with Two Wins but Wisconsin, Minnesota Duluth on Heels Heading into Showdown in Madison; OSU Splits at UMD; Top-Ranked UW Wins Twice at RMU; Five WCHA-Member Teams Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 1, UMD No. 4, UM No. 7, UND No. 8; OSU No. 10; Tickets On Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, Set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis**

MADISON, Wis. – North Dakota used a six-point series by Jocelyn Lamoureux to win a pair of conference home games over St. Cloud State last weekend and move into first place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. But the Sioux are idle this Thanksgiving holiday weekend of Nov. 26-28 and will watch, along with many fans, as top-ranked Wisconsin (11-1-0, 7-1-0-0 WCHA) and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth (9-3-0, 7-3-0-0 WCHA), the two most dominant teams in women's Div. 1 the last five years, go head to head this Friday and Sunday at the Kohl Center in Madison with first place at stake. Game times are 2:07 pm CT both days.

Both the Badgers, who won national titles in 2006, 2007 and 2009, and the fourth-ranked Bulldogs, who won national crowns in 2008 and 2010, have 21 points in the league standings and trail league-leading North Dakota (8-4-2, 7-3-2-0 WCHA) by two points. But both powers have played fewer games than UND and points this weekend would catapult either or both teams ahead of North Dakota as the

end of the first half of the season approaches. The other 2010-11 regular season series between the UW and UMD will occur on Jan. 21-22 in Duluth.

Minnesota Duluth leads the all-time series against Wisconsin with a 25-19-9 record and went 2-1-1 against the Badgers last season. In the 53 games between the two teams, there have only been seven shutouts while 17 games have gone to overtime.

The only other Western Collegiate Hockey Association series on the docket this weekend finds Bemidji State (6-5-1, 4-3-1-1 WCHA) traveling to Ohio State (7-6-1, 3-6-1-1 WCHA). Face-offs at the OSU Ice Rink in Columbus are 7:07 pm ET both Friday and Saturday. The Beavers and Buckeyes, currently separated by three points, will then play their final two-game set of the regular season on Feb. 18-19 in Bemidji.

Outside the WCHA over the holiday weekend, Minnesota (8-5-0) hosts Harvard (4-2-2) of ECAC Hockey on Friday at 6:07 pm CT and Sunday at 1:07 pm CT at Ridder Arena while Minnesota State (6-7-1) travels to College Hockey America-member Wayne State (5-7-0) for Friday (7:00 pm ET) and Saturday (2:00 pm ET) games. So far this season, WCHA-member teams are 17-6-1 in 24 games vs other Div. 1 opponents for a .729 winning percentage.

Once again this week, the WCHA has five of its eight-member teams ranked in the top ten in the Nov. 22 USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll. In addition to Wisconsin at No. 1 and Minnesota Duluth at No. 4, Minnesota is at No. 7, North Dakota is No. 8 and Ohio State is No. 10. Bemidji State was one of four other teams which also received votes in this week's poll.

The league standings, heading into Thanksgiving, show North Dakota with a 7-3-2 record (8-3-1 overall) with 23 points and one two-game series with Wisconsin left before the Christmas break. Wisconsin (7-1-0-0 WCHA, 11-1-0 overall) and Minnesota Duluth (7-3-0-0 WCHA, 9-3-0 overall) are tied for second with 21 points each. Wisconsin plays at UND and St. Cloud State before the halfway mark while UMD plays at St. Cloud State in its final league series of the first half.

Minnesota (5-5-0-0 WCHA, 8-5-0 overall) and Minnesota State (5-7-0-0 WCHA, 6-7-1 overall) are tied for fourth place this week with 15 points apiece, but the Gophers have two games in hand on the Mavericks. Bemidji State (4-3-1-1 WCHA, 6-5-1 overall) is in sixth place with 14 points, three ahead of Ohio State (3-6-1-1 WCHA, 7-6-1 overall) while St. Cloud is eighth (0-10-0 WCHA, 0-13-0 overall). Like Wisconsin, Bemidji State has played fewer games than the other contenders.

In league action last weekend (Nov. 19-20), Minnesota received shutout goaltending and 27 saves from Noora Rätty in the series opener to snap Minnesota State's four-game winning streak with a 1-0 decision and Sarah Erickson, who had a three-goal weekend, scored twice in a 6-2 victory in the series finale at Mankato, Minn. North Dakota beat visiting St. Cloud State twice as Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique

Lamoureux-Kolls returned to the lineup after missing three games taking part in the Four Nations Cup and helped lead the Sioux to a series sweep. It was the first time in program history the Sioux put up a six-spot in back-to-back games after defeating the Huskies 6-3 last Friday and 6-1 last Saturday. Lamoureux led the team with a hat trick while Alyssa Wiebe added a pair of goals and Lamoureux-Kolls scored one in the opener while Lamoureux had a goal and two assists and her sister had three assists in the series finale. In Duluth, Natalie Spooner scored two goals to help Ohio State surprise host Minnesota Duluth 4-2 in the series opener just one night after the Bulldogs received their national championship rings. But the Bulldogs roared back on Saturday to take a 8-0 decision, outshoot the Buckeyes 58-11. Haley Irwin had three goals and three assists for UMD, which had a 22-1 shot advantage in the first period.

And in non-conference play on Nov. 19-20, visiting Wisconsin beat Robert Morris twice by identical 7-1 scores as Hilary Knight had five goals and Brooke Ammerman had six goals in the series at Pittsburgh.

Looking ahead to the first weekend of December (3-5), WCHA series have Minnesota Duluth traveling to St. Cloud State (Friday/Saturday), Bemidji State hosting Minnesota (Friday/Saturday), and Wisconsin venturing to North Dakota (Saturday/Sunday). In non-conference play next week, Minnesota State will entertain Robert Morris on Friday and Saturday.

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

## 2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

**112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion**

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play its first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for

7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

# WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

- The Beavers, idle last weekend, will make their second conference road trip this season heading to Columbus, Ohio to take on the No. 10 Ohio State Buckeyes on Friday and Saturday.
- The Beavers have won five of their last seven games, going 5-1-1 in that span.
- This will be the first match up between the two teams this season. Last season Bemidji State went 1-2-1 against the Buckeyes, with the one win coming on the road. Overall in the series against the Buckeyes the Beavers have gone 15-24-7.
- One of the keys to success for the Beavers vs OSU will be to try to contain the potent offensive line up of Laura McIntosh, Natalie Spooner and Hokey Langan. The three have provided over half of the offensive production for the Buckeyes this season.
- In its last action over the Nov. 12-13 weekend, BSU beat then-No. 8 North Dakota 2-1 on Friday before picking up a shootout win on the following day. The win in the first meeting was the Beavers' third over a nationally-ranked team this season. Erin Cody opened the scoring after netting a breakaway goal. The Sioux battled back in the second period, out-shooting BSU, and tied the game at 1-1 before heading into the third period. Special teams made the difference in the final period as Emily Erickson scored the game-winner on the power-play. However, after taking back the lead, the Beavers had to kill off a four-minute man-advantage for the Sioux, which included a two-minute span of five-on-three within those four minutes. Zuzana Tomcikova recorded 22 saves in the contest and the assist on Cody's goal was the first point of her collegiate career. In the second game of the weekend the Beavers again jumped out on top first, this time with a goal from Sadie Lundquist. The Sioux would find the back of the net on the power-play in the third period to force an overtime, which was scoreless. In the shootout, Lundquist scored for the Beavers in the first round and Beaver goalie Alana McElhinney made all three stops on the Sioux. It was the Beavers' first shootout victory of the season.
- Zuzana Tomcikova has made 260 saves this season and has a .932 save percentage. Tomcikova became the fifth goalie in BSU history to record a point after picking up an assist against North Dakota on Nov. 12.
- Erin Cody has had a hand in each of BSU's past 16 goals, spanning back to the second goal in the 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst on Oct. 16. In the past seven games she has scored eight goals and tallied eight assists. Cody sits 10 points shy of the 100 career-point mark. There have only been two players in BSU history to eclipse the century mark: Kelly Hart (100) and Amber Fryklund (122).
- Alana McElhinney picked up her first collegiate point last season when she notched an assist on Jan. 29, 2010 at St. Cloud State.
- The forward line of Cody, Lundquist and Erickson has scored 20 of the 23 goals this year and have tallied 21 of the 41 assists. Cody leads the trio with nine goals and 10 assists, while Erickson has six goals and six assists. Lundquist has five goals and five assists. The trio has accounted for 41 of the 64 total points on the season.
- Sacrificing their bodies, the members of the BSU defense have combined to block a total of 222 shots on the season.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

- The No. 7 Golden Gophers (8-5-0 overall, 5-5-0 WCHA) earned six points in the WCHA standings when they swept Minnesota State last weekend. With a 1-0 and 6-2 win, the Golden Gophers now have 15 points in the WCHA standings, tied for fourth overall with Minnesota State.
- In last Friday's game, Sarah Erickson scored the contest's lone goal at

8:22 in the second period. Erickson capitalized on a wraparound attempt for her fourth goal of the weekend. Noora Rätty collected her fifth shutout of the season when she stopped all 27 MSU shots on goal.

- Last Saturday, the Gophers scored once in the first, three times in the second and twice in the third for the 6-2 final over the Mavericks. Becky Kortum and Erickson each netted two goals, while Sarah Davis and Kelly Terry also scored for the final. Rätty held the Mavericks scoreless on the weekend until the 1:16 mark of the third period on Saturday. Freshman defenseman Baylee Gillanders established a career-high three assists in the win.
- Minnesota hosts the Harvard Crimson this weekend, Friday night and Sunday afternoon. The weekend marks the third time the two teams have met during the Thanksgiving weekend. The first time dates back to the 2004-05 season when Minnesota played in the Harvard Tournament and defeated the Crimson, 5-3. Two years ago, Harvard visited Ridder Arena, Nov. 28-29, and won both games, 3-1 and 3-2.
- The last time Minnesota and Harvard faced each other was Dec. 4-5 of last year as the Gophers were defeated 1-0 and tied 0-0 in Cambridge, Mass. After two scoreless periods, Liza Ryabkina broke the tie and scored just :33 seconds into the third period. Although Minnesota called a timeout and pulled Rätty in the closing minutes, Harvard held on for the win. In the second game, Rätty had 39 saves as the Gophers and Crimson skated to a 0-0 tie. Rätty was later named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week for stopping 59 shots on goal during the series.
- Minnesota heads north to Bemidji State University, Dec. 3-4. Playing in the newly constructed Sanford Center, it will be the first time the Gophers and Beavers face each other this year. The face-offs are set for 2:07 pm both days. The Golden Gophers will close out the semester hosting Ohio State, Dec. 10-11.

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

- The then-No. 3 Bulldogs split a pair of games with Ohio State at the DECC on Nov. 19-20. One night after receiving their 2010 NCAA championship rings, UMD was reminded how hard it was to earn them and fell 4-2 in the series opener. Without sophomore forward Pernilla Winberg (illness) and senior defenseman Tara Gray (concussion) in the line-up, the Bulldogs still jumped out to a 1-0 lead a mere :13 seconds into the game on a goal by senior blueliner Jocelyne Larocque. OSU equalized on a Natalie Spooner score at 9:43 and the two teams took a 1-1 tie into the first intermission. Elin Holmlov scored her fifth goal of the season and notched her second point of the night at 3:15 of the second period to give UMD a 2-1 lead. The Bulldogs' lead was fleeting, however, as Spooner struck again just 1:16 later to knot the contest at 2-2. OSU went ahead for good on a Paige Semenza goal at 18:26, and scored a power-play goal with 1:14 left in the skate to cement the victory. UMD, which owned the WCHA's best power-play entering Friday's game, was held scoreless in five attempts against OSU. The Buckeyes were 1-of-7 with the man-advantage, but the Bulldogs outshot OSU 33-27. Bulldog netminder Jennifer Harss made 23 saves, while her Buckeye counterpart Lisa Steffes turned away 31 pucks for OSU.
- In the series finale, UMD outshot the Buckeyes 58-11, including 22-1 in the first period and took an 8-0 decision to split the series. It started off with a goal by junior Haley Irwin who had three goals and three assists. The former Canadian Olympian scored just :28 seconds into the game. UMD's second tally came from freshman Brienna Gillanders, who scored off a Irwin shot from the center circle at 9:09 in the first stanza to give the Bulldogs a 2-0 lead. UMD used a shorthanded goal from Irwin and another by sophomore Katie Wilson in the second period to stretch the advantage to 4-0. Gillanders notched her second goal of the game on a power-play :21 seconds into the third period, while Irwin, Audrey Cournoyer and Elin Holmlov added goals in the final 20 minutes of action. Irwin picked up

a total of six points and had a hand in six of UMD's eight goals. Irwin's haul is the most she has recorded in her Bulldog career, knocking off her former best of five points in a skate, something the junior forward has done four other times in her UMD career, and most recently against OSU back on Feb. 14, 2009. Four other Bulldog players registered two point nights, including Holmlov, who turned in a three goal performance (1g, 2a), while Gillanders has now had at least a point (two points in each game this weekend ) in her last three games. UMD's Kim Martin made 11 saves to earn her ninth career win against the Buckeyes. Martin is unbeaten against OSU with a record of 9-0-1 and UMD is 42-5-4 overall against Ohio State. Buckeye netminder Lisa Steffes made 50 saves on the night.

- UMD is on the road at Wisconsin in games Friday and Sunday. The Bulldogs are 25-19-9 all-time record against Wisconsin and went 2-1-1 against UW last season, most recently winning two games in Duluth Jan. 16-17, 2010.

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (6-7-1 overall, 5-7-0-0 WCHA) were swept last weekend by the University of Minnesota. The Mavericks fell 1-0 in last Friday's contest and then lost Saturday's game, 6-2. The sweep was the first this season.
- Five Mavericks recorded one point in second game vs UM which was a team-high: freshman forward Kathleen Rogan (1g), sophomore forward Lauren Zrust (1g), sophomore defenseman Emilia Andersson (1a), freshman forward Tracy McCann (1a) and sophomore forward Lauren Smith (1a). Two Mavericks finished with a team-high +1 rating: Smith and senior blueliner Amy Udvig.
- Minnesota State was out shot by UM on the weekend, 59-56. Both of MSU's goals came on Saturday, the first when Gopher goaltender Noora Raty turned away rookie Tracy McCann's backhand attempt, but Zrust was right there to bury the rebound, and the second when sophomore Lauren Smith led an MSU rush, passed it to Rogan, who beat Raty blocker-side from the right circle; the goal was scored 9:33 into the third.
- In last Friday's 1-0 loss, junior netminder Alli Altmann finished the contest with 23 saves and a .958 save percentage.
- So far this season, Kathleen Rogan leads the Mavericks in points with 15 on eight goals and seven assists. Senior forward Nina Tikkinen sits second on the team with 5-6=11 and Smith ranks third on the team with eight (3g, 5a) points.
- Amy Udvig is the owner of a team-best +5 plus/minus rating.
- Alli Altmann (3-5-1) owns team-bests in many goaltender categories: 219 saves, 2.87 goals-against average, .901 save percentage and one shutout.
- Rookie goaltender Danielle Butter (3-2-0) is the owner of a team-best .600 winning percentage.
- In last Friday's 1-0 loss to sixth-ranked Minnesota, Gopher forward Sarah Erickson scored on a wrap-around goal at the 8:22 mark of the third period for the only goal. Altmann seemed to be in place for the save, but the puck found its way to the back of the net, sliding past her skate. Altmann stopped 23 pucks for MSU while the Gophers' Noora Raty earned 27 saves. MSU finished the contest 0-4 on the power-play while Minnesota went 0-for-3 with an extra attacker. On Saturday, on their first power-play chance, the Gophers jumped out to a 1-0 lead at the 5:17 mark. Defenseman Anne Schleper made a pass from the top of the right circle down to winger Becky Kortum at the top of the crease and Kortum beat a stick-less Altman. Minnesota added three more in the second, putting the Gophers up, 4-0. Erickson scored at the 5:03 mark, Kortum netted her second goal 10:59 into the second and center Sarah Davis tallied the third goal of the period at the 15:26 mark. Minnesota State cut its deficit down early in the third (1:16) to three goals when Raty turned away rookie Tracy McCann's backhand attempt, but sophomore Zrust was right there to bury the rebound. Erickson netted her second goal, a power-play tally, at 8:28 of the third. Rogan and Kelly Terry traded

late goals. Altmann played the first two periods for MSU and totaled 22 saves. Butters finished the game and added seven saves. Raty finished with 27 stops. Minnesota went 2-for-2 on power-play chances while MSU went 0-for-3.

## Fighting Sioux

### University of North Dakota

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (8-4-2 overall, 7-3-2 WCHA), currently in first place, are idle over Thanksgiving weekend and will return to action on Dec. 4-5, hosting top-ranked Wisconsin at the Ralph Engelstad Arena. Wisconsin is the only conference team the Sioux have yet to play in 2010-11.
- In their last action, Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls returned to the lineup after missing three games taking part in the Four Nations Cup and helped lead the Sioux to a series sweep over St. Cloud State on Nov. 19-20.
- For the first time in program history the Sioux put up a six-spot in back-to-back games defeating the Huskies 6-3 on Friday and 6-1 on Saturday.
- In the first game vs SCSU Lamoureux led the team with a hat trick while Alyssa Wiebe added a pair of goals and Lamoureux-Kolls scored one. UND scored four goals in the first period, the single most in a period this season, but allowed the Huskies to score two and also the lone goal in the second period to take a one-goal lead into the third period. In the third period UND added two goals to pull away.
- UND completed the sweep over SCSU last Saturday as nine different players collected at least one point and Ney again was solid in net nearly completing her first shutout of the season making 22-of-23 saves. Sara Dagenais scored a game-high two goals while Wiebe (1-2=3), Lamoureux (1-2=3) and Lamoureux-Kolls (0-3=3) all had three-point games. In a physical game, the two teams combined for 19 penalties and 60 minutes in the box. Each team was called for a checking from behind penalty including game misconducts. The 5:00-minute majors were a key in the game as UND held the Huskies scoreless on their attempt (outshooting them 3-2) while the Sioux scored two power-play goals and one 4-on-4 goal in their attempt.
- Goaltender Stephanie Ney remains unbeaten with a 4-0-2 record, a 1.30 goals-against average and a .946 save percentage and ranks third in the nation in both categories.
- The Lamoureux twins continue to pace each other on the season tied with a team-leading 19 points which ranks ninth in the nation at 1.73 per game. Lamoureux has 12 goals (fourth in the nation) and Lamoureux-Kolls has 12 assists (fifth in the nation).
- Wiebe has her best series of the season last weekend with three goals and two assists while freshman Madison Kolls also added three assists.
- The Sioux have scored a goal within the first six minutes of the game in 9-of-14 games this season. UND is 7-2-1 in games when scoring first.

## Buckeyes

### Ohio State University

- The No. 10 Buckeyes split a road series at No. 3 Minnesota Duluth, Nov. 19-20 at the DECC. The Buckeyes upset the Bulldogs the first game in a 4-2 win before falling the second game, 8-0.
- The victory Friday gave Ohio State back-to-back wins against Minnesota Duluth for the first time in 50 meetings. The Buckeyes handed UMD its last loss of the 2009-10 season before they won the NCAA championship.
- Four of Ohio State's five wins against the Bulldogs have been in Duluth.
- The Buckeye penalty-kill held opponents scoreless in 21 consecutive opportunities over five-plus games. UMD scored on the power-play last Saturday to end the streak that dated back to Oct. 30.
- Natalie Spooner posted her third-consecutive two-goal performance, scoring the opening goals for the Buckeyes. Paige Semenza tallied the

game-winner at the end of the second period and Hokey Langan sealed the victory with an empty-netter with 1:14 left.

- Natalie Spooner has scored multiple goals in five of 10 games played this season. She leads the team and is tied second in the WCHA overall with 14 goals. With two goals last Friday, Spooner extended her point streak to 13 games and her goal streak to 10 games – both of which came to an end in the second game. Her 13-game point streak tied for the third-longest in Buckeye history. Spooner continues another streak though with a point in 21-consecutive series dating back to the second series of last year.
- Hokey Langan had a goal and assist in the first game for a string of three-consecutive two-point games with five goals in that span.
- Laura McIntosh, who had a 14-game point streak earlier this season, was on a seven-game point streak that ended last Saturday.
- Spooner came back to the Buckeyes after missing the last two series while with the gold medal-winning Canadian Women's National Team at Four Nations Cup. Also returning to the Buckeyes after missing three games with their national teams were sophomore forward Minttu Tuominen (Finland) and freshman defenseman Annie Svedin (Sweden).
- Freshman Lisa Steffes has made 30-plus saves in four of the last five games. She has seven games with 30-plus saves in just 14 games this season. Steffes became just the third Buckeye to make 50 or more saves in a game Saturday. She stopped 50 shots for the first 50-save game since Deidre Facklis had as many Dec. 9, 2007 and was only four shy of tying the record set by April Stojak Jan. 28, 2000. All three performances were set against Minnesota Duluth. She also made 31 saves in the win Friday night for a total of 81 against the Bulldogs. Steffes also picked up her third assist of the year on Spooner's second goal last Friday.
- Up next, Ohio State returns to home ice to host Bemidji State Nov. 26-27. Games begin at 7 p.m. both Friday and Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink.
- The Buckeyes and Beavers tied for fifth in the WCHA last season, but Ohio State won the tie-breaker leading the 2009-10 series 2-1-1.
- Spooner leads Ohio State in scoring against BSU with nine points (4g, 5a) in eight games against the Beavers. McIntosh has eight assists in eight meetings and Shannon Reilly also has eight points (2g, 6a). Langan scored five goals and six points in four meetings with the Beavers last season.

## Huskies

### St. Cloud State University

- The winless Huskies (0-13-0, 0-10-0-0 WCHA) suffered a series sweep as the #8/9 ranked University of North Dakota upended SCSU 6-1 on Saturday, Nov. 20, in the Ralph Engelstad Arena, and 6-3 the previous night (Nov. 19).
- Junior alternate captain Brittany Toor led the Huskies with two goals in the UND series to up her season scoring total to three points (3g, 0a).
- The other Husky to post multiple points on the weekend was sophomore blue-liner Kate Allen. Allen dished out two assists last Friday in the loss and she now has three helpers in 2010-11.
- Also scoring goals for St. Cloud at UND were sophomore forwards Callie Dahl and Alex Nelson.
- Senior netminder Ashley Nixon earned both starts at North Dakota on Nov. 19-20. She had 43 saves in 97:10 minutes of ice time (11 goals against) before behind relieved by junior Tayler VanDenakker late in the second period on Saturday (Nov. 20). VanDenakker gave up just one goal in 22:48 minutes of action against UND.
- Despite the setbacks, SCSU continues to lead the all-time series over North Dakota, 19-10-5, dating back to Dec. 14, 2002.
- The Huskies' three goals scored last Friday night marked the most goals scored in a game this season for SCSU.
- The Huskies will be idle over Thanksgiving weekend and return to action on Friday and Saturday, Dec. 3-4, with a league series against nationally-ranked Minnesota Duluth in the National Hockey Center.

## Badgers

### University of Wisconsin

- The top-ranked Badgers (11-1-0, 7-1-0 WCHA) return to WCHA action this weekend when they host No. 4 Minnesota Duluth (9-3-0, 7-3-0 WCHA) in a Friday/Sunday series at the Kohl Center. Puck drop is set for 2:07 pm CT both games.
- Wisconsin owns a 19-25-9 all-time record against Minnesota Duluth. The Badgers went 1-2-1 against UMD last season, most recently dropping two games in Duluth Jan. 16-17, 2010. Before that, UW skated to a 5-1 victory over the Bulldogs in semifinal round of the 2009 NCAA Frozen Four. In the 53 games between the two teams, there have only been seven shutouts and 17 games have gone to overtime.
- Wisconsin posted back-to-back 7-1 victories in a series sweep at Robert Morris Nov. 19-20. Junior Brooke Ammerman led the Badgers with six points on the weekend and freshman goaltender Alex Rigsby improved to 7-0-0 with two victories. Last Friday, Ammerman recorded a hat trick and sophomore Brianna Decker tallied three points to lead Wisconsin past RMU. In addition to three-point efforts from Ammerman and Decker, junior Hilary Knight scored two goals, and sophomore Stefanie McKeough posted two assists. Senior Meghan Duggan had one goal and one assist as well. On the defensive end, Rigsby made a career-best 26 saves to improve to 6-0-0 on the year. Saturday saw a nearly identical game as UW again skated away with a 7-1 win. The Badgers netted two SHGs for the second straight night and five players had a multi-point game led by Knight's second hat trick of the season.
- Duggan is tied for the national lead with five power-play goals. Her two SHGs place her in a tie for second in the country, tied with Prevost. Duggan is seventh in the nation with 0.92 goals per game and eighth with 1.83 points per game. She is also tied for 13th in assists per game (0.92) with Ammerman.
- Knight leads the nation with 1.42 goals per game and ranks fifth with 1.92 points per game. Her three game-winning goals are tied for fourth; Prevost also has three game-winners.
- Rigsby is one of two goaltenders in the nation with a perfect 1.000 win percentage. Rigsby (7-0-0) joins Holy Cross' Monique Gallant (3-0-0) with an unblemished record.
- As a team, the Badgers lead the nation with 5.50 goals per game, and UW is fourth in the country in scoring defense, allowing 1.67 goals per game. The Badgers rank No. 1 with a +3.83 scoring margin in 12 games.
- Wisconsin leads the nation with a shot margin of +22.42; the Badgers have outshot their opponents 478-209 on the season.
- The Badgers' .917 winning percentage leads the nation. UW (11-1-0) joins Cornell (8-1-0) as the country's two teams with only one loss on the season.
- Wisconsin currently leads the nation in women's hockey attendance, averaging 1,563 fans per game in 12 games this season. At home, UW also boasts the national lead with 2,049 fans per game.
- The Badgers' victory over Robert Morris on Nov. 19 marked the UW women's hockey program's 300th win. It was the 221st win under head coach Mark Johnson.
- Wisconsin players have posted five hat tricks this season, coming from Knight (2), Prevost, Decker and Ammerman. Three different Badgers recorded hat tricks in UW's first three series of the 2010-11 season and Knight and Ammerman each tallied hat tricks vs Robert Morris.
- This weekend, Wisconsin returns to the comfort of the Kohl Center after posting an eight-game winning streak during an eight-game homestand to open the 2010-11 season. The Badgers are 113-22-12 (.810 winning percentage) all-time at the Kohl Center.

### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
