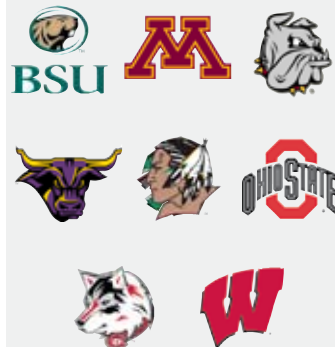

MADISON, Wis. – Three Western Collegiate Hockey Association series are on the docket for the upcoming weekend of Friday-Sunday, Dec. 3-5, as league co-leader Minnesota Duluth travels to St. Cloud State, co-leader Wisconsin heads to North Dakota, and Minnesota visits Bemidji State. All three match ups mark the initial meetings of the respective clubs here in the 2010-11 season.

The No. 3-ranked Bulldogs (10-4-0, 8-4-0-0 WCHA) will take on the Huskies (0-13-0, 0-10-0-0 WCHA) at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud on Friday and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. The No. 2-ranked Badgers (12-2-0, 8-2-0-0 WCHA) and No. 8 Fighting Sioux (8-4-2, 7-3-2-0 WCHA) will skate against each other at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks in a pair of Saturday and Sunday matinees at 2:07 pm CT. And the No. 7-ranked Golden Gophers (10-5-0, 5-5-0-0 WCHA) and Beavers (6-6-2, 4-4-2-1 WCHA) will play at the new Sanford Center in Bemidji at 2:07 pm CT on Friday and 2:07 pm CT on Saturday.

Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth got a 25-save performance from goaltender Kim Martin and secured a 3-1 victory over top-ranked Wisconsin this past Sunday (Nov. 28), gaining a Thanksgiving

weekend series split in Madison and moving into a first place tie with the Badgers in the tight WCHA women's standings.

In non-conference action this week, Minnesota State (6-9-1) returns home to engage Robert Morris (2-12-1) of College Hockey America at All Seasons Arena in Mankato. Face-offs there are 7:07 pm CT Friday evening and 3:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. To date, the eight WCHA-member women's teams are a combined 19-8-1 in non-conference play for a .696 winning percentage.

Idle from on-ice competition this week is No. 9-ranked Ohio State (8-6-2).

Heading into the end of the first half of the league schedule, the WCHA has never been more balanced. Just nine points separate the top seven teams in the standings and the WCHA has five of its eight teams ranked in the top ten in the (Nov. 29) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Hockey Poll. Wisconsin is ranked second, Minnesota Duluth is tied for third, Minnesota is at No. 7, North Dakota is No. 8 and Ohio State is No. 9. Bemidji State was one of four other teams which also received votes in this week's national poll.

The bunched standings show Wisconsin (8-2-0-0 WCHA) and UMD (8-4-0-0 WCHA) in a first place tie with 24 points apiece with North Dakota (7-3-2 WCHA) standing third with 23 points. The Badgers do, however, have two games in hand on both the Bulldogs and the Sioux. Ohio State (4-6-2-2 WCHA) occupies fourth place this week with 16 points, while Bemidji State (4-4-2-1 WCHA), Minnesota (5-5-0-0 WCHA) and Minnesota State (5-7-0-0 WCHA) are tied for fifth with 15 points each. St. Cloud State is eighth (0-10-0-0 WCHA).

Last weekend, the Bulldogs knocked the Badgers out of the top spot in the poll in another intense renewal of the two powers who have won the last five national titles. The Badgers, who won NCAA crowns in 2006, 2007 and 2009, won a thriller at the Kohl Center in Madison last Friday (Nov. 26) as Meghan Duggan scored the game-tying goal with :25 seconds left in regulation and Brianna Decker's second goal of the game, just :10 seconds into overtime, provided a 3-2 victory. The Bulldogs, who won national championships in 2008 and 2010, saw Martin give up an early goal to Duggan on Sunday, but her teammates didn't take a penalty and scored three unanswered goals to gain the split. Minnesota Duluth tied the game at the 9:54 mark of the second as Jamie Kenyon scored on a breakthrough. The Bulldogs took the lead just :57 seconds later on a goal from Jocelyne Larocque and Katie Wilson extended the lead to 3-1 with 15:43 remaining in the game.

In the other league series, Nov. 26-27, Bemidji State tied Ohio State 2-2 but lost in a shootout in the series opener. Juniors Laura McIntosh and Natalie Spooner had a goal and assist apiece and freshman goaltender Lisa Steffes stopped 34 of 35 shots faced as Ohio State defeated Bemidji State, 3-1, in the series finale. Buckeyes five points for the weekend to vault them from seventh to fourth in the WCHA standings. McIntosh factored into four of the Buckeyes' five goals in the Bemidji State series, while Steffes made a total of 67 saves.

In non-conference play over the Thanksgiving weekend, Minnesota stayed unbeaten in non-conference action by sweeping visiting Harvard, 3-0 and 4-2. Jen Schoullis had two goals in the 3-1 victory last Friday and the Gophers got goals from four different players in the 4-2 decision on Sunday. Minnesota State, meanwhile, traveled to Detroit and was shut out twice, 5-0 and 1-0, by Wayne State.

The first half of league play concludes the following weekend of Friday-Saturday, Dec. 10-11 when Wisconsin visits St. Cloud State, North Dakota plays at Minnesota Duluth in the final college games ever at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center (DECC), Ohio State is at Minnesota and Bemidji State is at Minnesota State.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that

will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play its first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday

at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- After making a road trip and losing 3-1 last Saturday after a 2-2 tie and shootout loss to Ohio State last Friday in Columbus, Ohio, the Beavers return home to host the No. 7-ranked Minnesota Gophers for their final home weekend of the 2010 calendar year.
- The Beavers have never defeated the Gophers at home and have only two wins in program history against them. The two wins came on Jan. 7, 2006 and Feb. 9, 2007.
- In last year's home games against Minnesota, Bemidji State claimed back-to-back ties with both games ending in 1-1 scores. In that series BSU goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova made 69 saves on 71 shots en route to a .972 series save percentage. In her career against the Gophers she has recorded a .917 save percentage.
- Last season Erin Cody led the Beavers in scoring against Minnesota with two goals and one assist. Others recording multiple points last season against the Gophers were Emily Erickson (2g) and Erika Wheelhouse (2a).
- Bemidji State went winless over the Thanksgiving weekend, recording one draw and one loss against No. 9/10 Ohio State. Last Friday's game saw the Beavers fall behind in the first period, only to battle back. They scored two goals in the second period to take the lead heading into the third. Erickson scored on a breakaway during a BSU power-play. It was her seventh goal of the season. Just three minutes later the Beavers scored again, this time getting a goal from freshman defender Allie Duellman who fired a slap shot from the point that beat the OSU tender five hole. Even though the Beavers had the lead in the third, the Buckeyes were able to tie the game up and force an overtime. After a scoreless 5:00 overtime the Beavers failed to score in the shootout and conceded the extra point.
- Last Saturday night at OSU, the Beaver offense struggled. The lone goal scored came from freshman Danielle Williams in the second period. Ohio State found its success at the end of each period as all three of the Buckeye's goals came within the final minute of the given period.
- Over the weekend and in the OSU series, Tomcikova made 66 saves and recorded a .943 save percentage. The Beaver defense blocked a total of 33 shots including nine by Montana Vichorek.
- So far this season, Tomcikova has made a total of 326 saves and recorded a .934 save percentage.
- Cody had a hand in 16 consecutive goals, spanning from Nov. 13 back to the second goal in the 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst on Oct. 16. In the past seven games she has scored eight goals and tallied eight assists.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Erickson has scored 21 of the 26 goals this year and have tallied 21 of the 41 assists. Cody leads the three with nine goals and 10 assists while Erickson has seven goals and six assists. Lundquist has five goals and five assists. The trio has accounted for 42 of the 71 total points on the season.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

- The No. 7 Golden Gophers (10-5-0 overall, 5-5-0-0 WCHA) played in their final non-conference games of the season as they hosted No. 9 Harvard last Friday (Nov. 26) and Sunday (Nov. 28). Minnesota earned 3-0 and 4-2 wins over the Crimson.
- In last Friday's game, Jen Schoullis scored two goals to help the Gophers to a 3-0 triumph. The Golden Gophers got on the board at 15:56 in the first period when Mira Jalosuo netted her first goal of the season. With the goal, it was the first goal the Gophers scored against the Crimson in 150:31 minutes played. Minnesota went scoreless against Harvard last

year in a 1-0 loss and 0-0 overtime tie in Cambridge, Mass. Prior to that time, the Gophers had not scored a goal against HU since Nov. 29, 2008, also on a Schoullis goal to earn a 3-2 win. Minnesota added to its lead when Schoullis capitalized on a rebound attempt at 1:33 in the second period. Schoullis added her second goal of the game at 3:21 in the third period to put the game at 3-0. Although Noora Raty started the game, she suffered an injury and was pulled at the 10-minute mark of the second period. Jenny Lura kept the shutout intact when she stopped all 10 shots since the second period. She had three saves in the second and seven in the third for 10. It was Lura's first game action since Feb. 13, 2010.

- In last Sunday's contest, the Gophers had scoring from four different individuals for a 4-2 win over visiting Harvard. The Golden Gophers went up 2-0 after the first period of play. Kelly Seeler scored her third goal of the season at the 14:25 mark of the first period. Sarah Erickson added to the Minnesota lead when she scored a power-play goal at 18:01 in the first. Minnesota added another two when Mira Jalosuo scored her second power-play goal of the weekend at 8:15 in the second. Bethany Brausen closed out the Gopher scoring when netted her first goal as a Golden Gopher at 12:44 in the second. Harvard cut the Gopher lead to three when Kate Buesser scored a power-play goal at 17:58 in the third period. She added her second goal of the game at 17:51 when she scored on her own rebound. The assists were credited to Ali Baumgartner and Josephine Pucci. It was the only scoring during the third period. Harvard outshot the Gophers, 8-4 in the period. Jalosuo scored her first goal of the season and the second of her career on Friday night. She scored the game-winning goal at 15:56 in the first. It was also the first power-play goal of her career.

- Minnesota has relied on its freshmen class to put up points on the board. The rookies haven't disappointed as three are the Gophers' top three scorers. Kelly Terry has scored 15 points while Amanda Kessel and Sarah Davis follow with 13. Erickson has 12, while Becky Kortum and Anne Schleper each have 11.

- Davis has done a great job in the faceoff circle for Minnesota. In 14 games played, Davis has won 209 draws in comparison to 99 losses this season. She holds a win percentage of .679.

- Minnesota's power-play clicked in the last two games against Harvard. The Gophers went 2-for-4 in Friday's game while holding a 2-for-6 mark in Sunday's contest. On the season, Minnesota has scored 17 power-play goals in 68 chances for 25%.

- Minnesota has also killed off 71 of 78 penalties for a 91% penalty-kill mark.

- Head coach Brad Frost has announced four Minnesota natives have signed National Letters of Intent. Forward Stephanie Anderson (North St. Paul), forward Rachael Bona (Coon Rapids), forward Meghan Lorence (Mounds View) and defenseman Rachel Ramsey (Chanhasen) have all signed and will join the Golden Gopher program next fall.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 3-ranked Bulldogs split their Thanksgiving weekend series against then top-ranked Wisconsin, getting edged in overtime last Friday 3-2, before bouncing back to take a 3-1 win on Sunday.

- The Bulldogs and Badgers played their 18th overtime game after UMD conceded two unanswered goals, including one with :25 seconds remaining in regulation.

- Senior goaltender Kim Martin and UMD then battled back after a one goal deficit Sunday to upset Wisconsin 3-1, behind the stellar play of Martin, who with 25 saves held the nation's top-scoring team to a single goal. Jocelyne Larocque, Jamie Kenyon and Katie Wilson all had goals in the win for the Bulldogs, who are now 26-20-9 all-time against Wisconsin, including 5-4-9 in overtime. Last Sunday's win was also the first by a UMD squad in the Kohl Center since Dec. 1, 2007.

- With no penalties in the Nov. 28 contest, UMD did something it hadn't done since Nov. 5, 1999 – finish a game without a single penalty.
- The Bulldogs' win at Wisconsin last Sunday also leaves UMD 5-3-0 against top-10 teams so far this season.
- Haley Irwin leads the WCHA and ranks third in the NCAA with a point per game average of 2.08 with 25 points (14g, 11a) in just 12 outings, and owns the nation's second most game-winning goals with four.
- Elin Holmlöv ranks third in the nation and second in WCHA with an average of 1.14 assists per game, with 16 in 14 games, while rookie forward Brienna Gillanders has scored the fifth most power-play goals in the country with four.
- Jocelyne Larocque's 87 career points are just four shy of UMD's all-time scoring record by a defenseman. She also ranks No. 2 among defensemen in the NCAA with a 0.92 points per game average.
- Goaltender Kim Martin ranks second in the country and first in the WCHA in goals-against average with a 1.23 mark and a save percentage of .950.
- The stingiest defensive team in the WCHA, UMD is allowing just 1.43 goals per game while averaging 3.86 themselves.
- The Bulldogs next travel to St. Cloud State to face the Huskies, a team UMD is 39-9-2 for a .800 winning percentage against all-time.

Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (6-9-1 overall, 5-7-0-0 WCHA) were beaten twice by Wayne State in Detroit last weekend. The Mavericks fell 6-0 on Friday evening followed by a 1-0 loss on Saturday.
- MSU is now 1-1-2 against non-conference opponents this season and will play its final non-conference opponent this weekend when they host Robert Morris.
- On the weekend the Mavericks outshot the Warriors, 67-45, but were out scored, 7-0. The Mavericks gave up three goals in the first period, three in the second period and one in the third period. Lauren Smith led MSU with a team-high 11 shots.
- Freshman forward Kathleen Rogan leads the Mavericks in points this season with 8-7=15. Senior forward Nina Tikkinen sits second on the team with 5-6=11. Smith has tallied eight points (3-5=8), while junior forward Moria O'Connor (3-3=6) and freshman forward Tracy McCann (3-3=6) are owners of six points each. Four icers own five points on the year including junior forward Emmi Leinonen (3-2=5), junior blueliner Jackie Otto (0-5=5), sophomore forward Lauren Zrust (2-3=5) and rookie defenseman Nicole Germaine (1-4=5).
- Rogan's eight goals and seven assists are both team-bests.
- Leinonen leads the team in power-play goals with two, while McCann owns a team-best two game-winning goals.
- Smith and Rogan each own one shorthanded goal and two unassisted goals, team-bests. Tikkinen also owns one shorthanded goal.
- Smith has tallied a team-high 49 shots while Rogan has taken 47.
- Smith is the owner of a team-best +4, while McCann, Germaine, Rogan and senior defenseman Amy Udvig each own a +2.
- Tikkinen has taken the most penalties on the team, nine for 18 minutes.
- Rookie netminder Danielle Butters owns a team-best .600 winning percentage, while junior goaltender Alli Altmann owns team-bests in all other goaltender categories: 2.92 G.G.A., .865 save percentage, 256 saves and one shutout.

Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (8-4-2 overall, 7-3-2 WCHA), idle over Thanksgiving weekend, return to action on Dec. 4-5 hosting top-ranked Wisconsin at the Ralph Engelstad Arena. Wisconsin is the only conference team the Sioux have yet to play in 2010-11 and are in first place.
- The Sioux split with the Badgers in 2009-10 with both teams winning and losing one game on the road. The Sioux played their home series against the Badgers at the Urban Plains Center (Fargo, ND) that year.
- In their last action, Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls returned to the lineup after missing three games taking part in the Four Nations Cup and helped lead the Sioux to a series sweep over St. Cloud State. For the first time in program history the Sioux put up a six-spot in back-to-back games defeating the Huskies 6-3 on Nov. 19 and 6-1 on Nov. 20. In the first game Lamoureux led the team with a hat trick while Alyssa Wiebe added a pair of goals and Lamoureux-Kolls scored one. UND scored four goals in the first period, the single most in a period this season, but allowed the Huskies to score two and also the lone goal in the second period to take a one-goal lead into the third period. UND added two goals in the third period. UND completed the sweep as nine different players collected at least one point and Stephanie Ney was solid in net nearly completing her first shutout of the season making 22-of-23 saves. Sara Dagenais scored a game-high two goals while Wiebe (1-2=3), Lamoureux (1-2=3) and Lamoureux-Kolls (0-3=3) all had three-point games. In a physical game, the two teams combined for 19 penalties and 60 minutes in the box.
- Stephanie Ney remains unbeaten on the year with a 4-0-2 record, a 1.30 goals-against average, and a .946 save percentage and ranks third and fourth in the nation, respectively.
- The Lamoureux twins continue to pace each other on the season tied with a team-leading 19 points which ranks 16th in the nation at 1.73 per game. Lamoureux has 12 goals (sixth in the nation) and Lamoureux-Kolls has 12 assists (fifth in the nation).
- Wiebe had her best series of the season with three goals and two assists while freshman Madison Kolls also added three assists earning her WCHA Rookie of the Week honors.
- Defenseman Jordan Slavin has three goals and five assists in 10 games since returning from an off-season injury.
- The Sioux have scored a goal within the first six minutes of the game in 9-of-14 games this season. UND is now 7-2-1 in games when scoring first.
- North Dakota has already played eight games against top-10 ranked teams this season and the Sioux have gone 5-2-1 in those games.

Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The No. 9-ranked Buckeyes gained five points in a WCHA series against Bemidji State, Nov. 26-27 at the OSU Ice Rink.
- Ohio State rallied to tie the first game vs BSU 2-2, then won the shootout 1-0 in three rounds last Friday. The Buckeyes then won the second game 3-1 on Saturday. Junior assistant captains Laura McIntosh and Natalie Spooner had a goal and assist apiece and freshman goaltender Lisa Steffes stopped 34 of 35 shots faced.
- Ohio State improves to 5-2-1 at the OSU Ice Rink this season.
- OSU is 5-2 all-time in shootouts over the last three years. The Buckeyes have won both shootouts they have competed in this season, also with a 2-0 shootout win at North Dakota (Nov. 7).
- Goaltender Lisa Steffes has made 30-plus saves in four-consecutive games with a total of 148 saves in that span. She has made 30 or more saves nine times already just 16 games into her young career. Steffes has 492 saves total – good for second in the NCAA. She averages 30.75 saves per game.
- Laura McIntosh factored into four of five OSU goals in the recent BSU

series. The junior forward from Waterloo, Ont., set up the first goal and scored the game-tying goal with 3:36 left in regulation in game one. She then scored the opening goal Saturday and set up the game-winner. Just 16 games into the 2010-11 season, McIntosh leads the Buckeyes with 30 points and 22 assists. Both lead the WCHA overall. She also has a league-high 13 power-play points. McIntosh has tied the Ohio State record for career assists in WCHA games with 67. She is tied with former All-American Jana Harrigan (2003-06).

- Natalie Spooner scored her 15th goal of the season, second-most in the WCHA, and it also was her sixth power play goal of the year, first in the conference. She also scored the lone shootout goal Friday. Spooner now has 95 career points (58g, 37a) to tie for ninth all-time in the OSU record books. With two points the second game, Spooner extended her consecutive series with a point to 22 (dating back to the second series of last year).
- Hokey Langan has nine points, including six goals, in six career games against Bemidji State. Overall this season, the sophomore forward has 25 points and 16 assists to rank second on the team in both categories.
- Defensemen Shannon Reilly and Kelly Wild rank first and second (tie) overall in the WCHA with 12 and 11 points, respectively.
- Ohio State killed off six of seven penalties against the Beavers last weekend, including a 3-of-3 performance in the second game. The OSU penalty-kill has been perfect in 10 games this year and is operating at 85.2% overall this year (52-of-61).
- The Buckeyes are off this week in preparation for finals before closing the first half of the season at Minnesota, Dec. 10-11.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- The winless Huskies (0-13-0, 0-10-0-0 WCHA), idle on Thanksgiving weekend, return to action on Friday and Saturday, Dec. 3-4, with a league series against nationally-ranked Minnesota Duluth in the National Hockey Center. The Huskies are 9-39-2 all-time against UMD.
- In their last games, the Huskies were swept in Grand Forks, N.D. as the #8/9-ranked University of North Dakota upended the Huskies 6-1 on Saturday, Nov. 20, in the Ralph Engelstad Arena, and 6-3 the previous night (Nov. 19). Junior alternate captain Brittany Toor led the Huskies with two goals in the series to up her season scoring total to three points (3g).
- The other Husky to post multiple points on the weekend vs SCSU was sophomore blue-liner Kate Allen. Allen dished out two assists on Friday in the loss. She now has three helpers in 2010-11.
- Also scoring goals for St. Cloud at UND were sophomore forwards Callie Dahl and Alex Nelson.
- Senior netminder Ashley Nixon earned both starts at North Dakota on Nov. 19-20. She had 43 saves in 97:10 minutes of ice time (11 goals against) before being relieved by junior Tayler VanDenakker late in the second period on Saturday (Nov. 20). VanDenakker gave up just one goal in 22:48 minutes of action against UND.
- SCSU continues to lead the all-time series over North Dakota, 19-10-5, dating back to Dec. 14, 2002.
- The Huskies' three goals on Nov. 19 marked the most goals scored in a game this season for SCSU.

Badgers

University of Wisconsin

- The top-ranked Badgers (11-2-0, 8-2-0-0 WCHA) begin an eight-game road swing this weekend when they travel to No. 8 North Dakota (8-4-2, 7-3-2 WCHA) for a Saturday/Sunday series at Engelstad Arena. Puck drop is set for 2 p.m. both games.
- The Badgers own a 26-2-0 all-time record against North Dakota.
- Both of Wisconsin's losses to UND came last season as the teams

split two series, 2-2-0. A series at the Kohl Center in early October saw UW fall 2-0 before posting a 3-0 victory over the Fighting Sioux. In early January, Wisconsin dropped a 3-1 decision in Fargo, N.D., before concluding the series with a 2-0 win at Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks.

- Three Badgers are currently riding point streaks, led by senior Meghan Duggan's career-best 10-game point streak. Duggan had an impressive multi-point streak from Oct. 22-Nov. 26 where she had at least two points in each of nine games. Hilary Knight is currently on a seven-game point streak and Brianna Decker has tallied points in five-straight games.
- UW split a series with Minnesota Duluth at the Kohl Center last weekend. The Badgers won a dramatic 3-2 overtime game Friday but fell to the Bulldogs, 3-1, in Sunday's game. Friday's game saw Duggan score the game-tying goal with :25 seconds remaining before Decker put the game away just :10 seconds into overtime as Wisconsin topped Minnesota Duluth, 3-2 in overtime. The Badgers rallied with three unanswered goals after trailing 2-0 after the first period. Alex Rigsby made a career-high 37 saves in goal for UW. Last Sunday, UW got on the board first as Duggan scored her 13th goal of the season, but the Bulldogs used three unanswered goals to earn a 3-1 victory over Wisconsin. Rigsby made 32 saves as the Bulldogs outshot the Badgers, 35-26.
- Knight is third in the nation with 1.21 goals per game and ranks eighth with 1.86 points per game.
- Duggan's five power-play goals are tied for second in the country. She also ranks ninth with 0.93 goals per game and 11th with 1.79 points per game. Duggan's two shorthanded goals place her in a tie for second in the country, tied with Carlyne Prevost.
- Goaltender Becca Ruegsegger ranks seventh in the nation with a 1.51 goals-against average, while Rigsby is fourth with a .889 win percentage at 8-1-0.
- As a team, the Badgers are second in the nation with 5.00 goals per game and UW is fifth in the country in scoring defense, allowing 1.79 goals per game.
- The Badgers rank second with a +3.21 scoring margin in 14 games.
- UW ranks third in the nation with a 24.6 power-play percentage (15-of-61).
- The Badgers are 4-2-0 against ranked opponents this season, posting two wins over then-No. 10 Ohio State (Oct. 22-23) and splitting two series with then-No. 8 Minnesota (Nov. 5-6) and then-No. 4 Minnesota Duluth (Nov. 26-28). UW was 4-3-1 against ranked opponents in 2009-10.
- With nine home wins this season, the Badgers improved to 114-23-12 (.805 winning percentage) all-time at the Kohl Center.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
