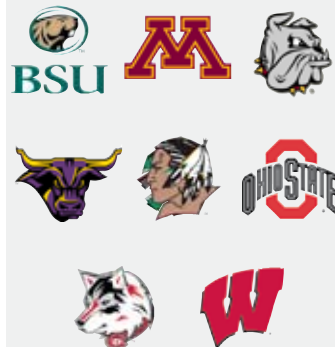

## Two WCHA Series for Nov. 12-13 have Bemidji State

### Hosting North Dakota, Minnesota State at Ohio State

**UM, UMD, SCSU, UW All Idle This Week; Mavericks Move Up WCHA Ladder with Nov. 5-6 League Sweep; Badgers, Gophers Split Border Battle; BSU Wins First-Ever vs UMD in Split; Sioux Collect Three Points vs OSU; Five WCHA Team Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 1, UMD No. 3, UM No. 7, UND No. 8, OSU No. 9; Tickets on Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis**

MADISON, Wis. – As the top-ranked teams in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's standings traded victories over the Nov. 5-7 weekend, Minnesota State scored its first series sweep of the season and moved into a tie for fourth place in the league race.

This week, Minnesota State hits the road for a two-game series at league rival Ohio State, one of only two match ups on Nov. 12-13. The Mavericks and host Buckeyes will face-off at the OSU Ice Rink in Columbus at 7:07 pm ET both Friday and Saturday.

The other WCHA series on the docket features Bemidji State hosting North Dakota on Friday and Saturday at Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minn. The Beavers and Sioux play at 2:07 pm CT each afternoon.

Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth, St. Cloud State and Wisconsin are all idle this week.

Minnesota State senior forward Nina Tikkinen racked up five points last weekend, three in the 4-1 victory over visiting St. Cloud State on Nov. 5 and two in the 4-2 win over the Huskies on Nov. 6. In last Friday's game, Tikkinen recorded assists on MSU's first three scores and then on Saturday, Tikkinen gave the Mavericks a 2-0 lead after a highlight-reel score and assisted on their fourth score, netted by junior forward Emmi Leinonen. The two victories gave the Mavericks their first home series sweep since Oct. 31-Nov. 1, 2008 when they beat Bemidji State and elevated them (3-5-0, 4-5-1 WCHA, 9 points) into a

fourth place tie in the WCHA.

All three teams ahead of the Mavericks in the current standings are nationally-ranked. For the fourth straight week, the WCHA has five teams ranked in the top 10 in the USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll. League-leading Wisconsin still tops the poll and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth, ranked behind Cornell, is at No. 3. Minnesota is at No. 7, North Dakota is at No. 8 and Ohio State ranks No. 9.

This week's league standings are a bit different. Wisconsin owns sole-possession of first place in the WCHA with 21 points at 7-1-0-0 in conference play and 9-1-0 overall. Minnesota Duluth is second with 18 points (8-2-0, 6-2-0-0 WCHA) and North Dakota is third with 16 points (6-3-1, 5-2-1-0 WCHA). Minnesota State, Bemidji State (5-5-0, 3-3-0 WCHA) and Minnesota (6-5-0, 3-5-0 WCHA) are tied for fourth place with nine points apiece, one better than Ohio State (5-3-1, 2-3-1-1 WCHA). St. Cloud State is winless at 0-11-0 overall and 0-8-0-0 in league play.

In other WCHA action last weekend, Bemidji State split two games at home with Minnesota Duluth, beating the Bulldogs for the first ever time last Friday 1-0 behind Emily Erickson's third period goal and the 38-save goaltending of Zuzana Tomcikova. UMD, with just 14 skaters because of injuries and players away preparing to represent their countries at the Four Nations Tournament, battled back and took a 3-1 victory on Saturday in Bemidji as Kim Martin made 27 saves in goal and rookie Brienna Gillanders had a goal and an assist.

Host Minnesota handed Wisconsin its first loss of the season on Nov. 5 by a 7-5 count in the opening game of the Border Battle as Emily West returned to the lineup for the first time in seven games and scored two goals. Sarah Erickson also had two goals for the Gophers. In the series finale on Nov. 6, freshman Alex Rigsby made a career high 25 saves and recorded her second shutout while former WCHA player of the year Hillary Knight had two goals to help Wisconsin take a 5-0 victory and gain a road split at Ridder Arena.

And in Grand Forks, North Dakota gained three points in an exciting, hard-fought series with Ohio State. Alyssa Wiebe's goal with :14 seconds left in overtime gave the Sioux a 3-2 victory last Saturday and the teams nearly staged a replay on Sunday. UND's Jordan Slavin sent the game into overtime with a goal in the final :74 seconds of regulation to tie the game 2-2, but OSU took a 2-0 shootout win on goals by Laura McIntosh and Ally Tarr and gained three points. North Dakota got one point in the series finale.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Nov. 19-20, three Western Collegiate Hockey Association two-game series will have Minnesota Duluth hosting Ohio State, Minnesota traveling to Minnesota State and North Dakota entertaining St. Cloud State. In

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Implements Three-Point Wins in League Standings

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play, Associate Commissioner Sara Martin announced.

## WCHA Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

### 2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

**112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion**

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that

will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play its first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (ex).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday

at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

# WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

- The Beavers will finish their five-week homestand when they host the University of North Dakota this coming weekend of Nov. 12-13.
- Last season the Beavers went 3-1 against the Sioux, in which two of the victories came by shutout. BSU out-scored UND 7-4 in those four games.
- Erin Cody scored four of the seven BSU goals against the Sioux last season, including an overtime game-winner on Dec. 6, 2009.
- Both Beaver goalies Zuzana Tomcikova and Alana McElhinney posted a shutout over the Sioux last year.
- In the overall history, the BSU-UND series record is tied at 15-15-2.
- Bemidji State ended an 11-year winless streak to Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 5 after the Beavers shutout the No. 3-ranked Bulldogs 1-0. Netting two goals over the weekend, Emily Erickson scored one of the biggest goals in BSU history netting the game-winner in last Friday's match on the power-play with under seven minutes left to play.
- In last Saturday's game vs UMD, just :18 seconds after UMD opened the scoring, Erickson netted the lone BSU goal in response to tie the game back up. For the weekend, Erickson finished with a +1 plus/minus rating with 11 shots on goal and blocking one on defense.
- Zuzana Tomcikova made 38 saves in blanking the Bulldogs 1-0 on Nov. 5. The shutout was the 11th of her collegiate career and third of the season. On the following night (Nov. 6), Tomcikova made 34 saves in a 3-1 loss to UMD and also set the school record for longest shutout sequence of 149:30 which started on Oct. 29 in the third period and extended to Saturday's second period. Tomcikova has made a total of 238 saves this season and in eight games she has recorded a .930 save percentage.
- Tomcikova's work was made easier as the BSU defensive corps blocked 47 shots over the weekend, including 13 by Marlee Wheelhouse and 10 by Montana Vichorek. The BSU defense has blocked a total of 186 shots on the season.
- The BSU special teams went 6-of-8 on the penalty-kill vs UMD last weekend and was a perfect 3-of-3 in last Friday's win.
- The forward line of Erin Cody, Sadie Lundquist and Emily Erickson has scored 17 of the 20 BSU goals this season and have tallied 17 of the 35 assists so far. Cody leads the three with eight goals and eight assists, while Erickson has five goals and five assists. Lundquist has four goals and five assists. The trio has accounted for 35 of the 55 total points on the season.
- The Beavers have claimed two victories over top 3 teams. The 5-3 victory over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst on Oct. 16 was the first time Bemidji State has ever defeated a top ranked team.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

- The No. 7-ranked Golden Gophers (6-5-0 overall, 3-5-0 in the WCHA) are idle this weekend after splitting two games at home with Wisconsin on Nov. 5-6, winning 7-5 and losing 5-0 at Ridder Arena.
- After missing seven games due to a leg injury, Emily West returned to the lineup last Friday night and scored two goals and assisted on another to help the Gophers to a 7-5 win over No. 1 and previously unbeaten Wisconsin. After sitting out since the start of the season, West scored her first goal of the year at 12:38 in the first period and again just seven seconds into the opening of the second period to give Minnesota a 4-1 lead. She also assisted on Sarah Erickson's insurance goal at 10:24 in the third period.
- Sarah Erickson also had two goals in the series opener while rookie Kelly Terry scored a goal and tallied two assists, tying a career-high

three points Terry scored a goal at 18:28 in the first period to go up, 3-1 and set up West in both of her goals to help the Gophers to their third conference win of the season. Wisconsin's Meghan Duggan opened the scoring when she netted a power-play goal at 3:11 in the first period. Minnesota, however, answered back with three goals of its own. Amanda Kessel scored her fifth goal of the season at 5:43 to tie the game at 1-1. ## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 3-ranked Bulldogs will have a week off from NCAA competition while six UMD players (Haley Irwin, Jocelyne Larocque, Elin Holmlöv, Kim Martin, Pernilla Winberg, and Mariia Posa) suit up for their respective national teams in the 2010 Four Nations Cup.
- The Maroon and Gold will be back at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center on Nov. 19 and 20, when the Bulldogs host WCHA rival Ohio State. Game time Friday, Nov. 19 is at 7:37 pm while Saturday, Nov. 20, is slated for 7:07 pm.
- The Bulldogs, down to 14 players due to national team commitments and injuries, set back Bemidji State 3-1 in Bemidji last Saturday (Nov. 6) to salvage the series split. With the win, UMD improves to 8-2-0 and 6-



2-0 in WCHA play. The Bulldogs also move to 48-1-2 all-time against the Beavers.

- After being shutout 1-0 last Friday night for the first time this season by BSU, UMD found its way back to the net Saturday. The Bulldogs scored a power-play tally just :23 seconds into the second period to take a 1-0 lead on Audrey Cournoyer's fifth goal of the season. BSU would equalize just :17 seconds later, however, with Beaver Emily Erickson's second goal in as many games. The Bulldogs capitalized on another power-play at 10:07 to take a 2-1 lead and one UMD would not relinquish. Rookie forward Brienna Gillanders – who had an assist on Cournoyer's goal – netted her first mark in a Bulldog jersey, with assists to Jessica Wong and a second of the night to Holmlov. - The Bulldogs suffered their first setback at the hands of the Beavers by a score of 1-0 last Friday night at the Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minn. The loss snaps UMD's winning streak of six-straight games prior to the skate and drops the Bulldogs to 7-2-0 overall and 5-2-0 in Western Collegiate Hockey Association action. UMD is now 47-1-2 all-time against the Beavers. Missing current scoring leader junior forward Haley Irwin and blueline stalwart Jocelyne Larocque to Team Canada duty, as well as senior defenseman Tara Gray (out due to a concussion suffered last weekend), the Bulldogs were shutout on the road for the first time since Oct. 17, 2009. Erickson scored a power-play goal at 13:25 of the third period to stun the Bulldogs. The Bulldogs were 0-of-3 with the man-advantage, while BSU was 1-of-5. Martin made 30 saves while Tomcikova turned away 38 Bulldog attempts.

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (4-5-1 overall, 3-5-0-0 WCHA) swept St. Cloud State at home last weekend with a 4-1 win Friday and a 4-2 win on Saturday. The series sweep gave the Mavericks their first home series sweep since Oct. 31-Nov. 1, 2008 when they swept Bemidji State. The Mavericks outscored the Huskies, 8-3 on the weekend and outshot them 51-47. The Mavericks finished the series going 3-for-7 (.429) on power-play chances, while the Huskies went 1-for-9 (.111).
- So far this season, rookie Kathleen Rogan is leading the Mavericks in points with 10 (6g, 4a), goals with six and is second on the team in assists with four.
- Leading MSU in the assists category is senior forward Nina Tikkinen who is the owner of five.
- Rookie forward Tracy McCann leads the Mavericks in plus/minus with a +4 and owns 3-1=4 on the year.
- Last Friday, Minnesota State used two first period goals to down SCSU 4-1. Tikkinen recorded her first career three-point game to set the tone for Minnesota State. Her three helpers came on the Maverick's first three goals. Maverick captain Ariel Mackley recorded her first goal of the season and third of her career, all of which have come against the Huskies. MSU continued to gain early momentum as Rogan beat Ashley Nixon stick-side for her sixth goal of the season at 9:58 and the scoring barrage continued 4:54 into the second period when junior forward Moira O'Connor found the back of the net. SCSU got on the scoreboard at the 8:24 mark of the second frame as they converted a power-play opportunity when Lisa Martinson beat MSU netminder Alli Altmann from the blue line. Rookie forward Darion Bruyere lit the lamp midway through the third to close the scoring for both sides. The Mavericks outshot the Huskies, 27-18. MSU finished 1-of-3 on power play chances, while SCSU went 1-for-4. Altmann finished with 17 saves, while Nixon recorded 23 saves.
- In the series finale on Nov. 6, the 4-2 win gave the Mavericks their first

home series sweep since Oct. 31-Nov. 1, 2008 when they swept Bemidji State. Freshman winger Tracy McCann netted the opening goal of the contest at the 7:56 mark of the first to put Minnesota State in front early. The Mavericks took a 2-0 lead 11:18 into the second period when senior Tikkinen tallied her first goal of the season and McCann tallied her second goal of the game at the 17:52 mark of the second, giving MSU a 3-0 lead heading into the final period. The Huskies found the back of the net twice in the final period to cut the Mavericks lead to one. SCSU's first score came just :32 into the third when forward Molli Mott collected her first goal of the season. Haylea Schmid also scored her first goal of the season with the help from Mott to move the score to 3-2 at the 9:41 mark. The Mavericks put the game away with their fourth goal of the contest at the 16:24 mark in the final period. Junior forward Emmi Leinonen recorded her third goal on the season, a power-play tally. The Huskies outshot the Mavericks, 29-24. MSU finished 2-of-4 on power-play chances while SCSU went 0-for-5. MSU goaltender Danielle Butters finished with 27 saves while SCSU's Taylor VanDenakker recorded 20 saves. The Mavericks tied a season-high by scoring four goals for the third time this season.

## Fighting Sioux

### University of North Dakota

- The No. 7-ranked Sioux earned four out of a possible six points this past weekend (Nov. 6-7) in the WCHA standings as it played to a 3-2 win and 2-2 tie against ninth-ranked Ohio State.
- The Sioux used a trio of unassisted goals to edge OSU in an overtime thriller last Saturday. The Sioux controlled much of the game outshooting the Buckeyes 30-17 but were only able to crack OSU netminder Lisa Steffes twice in regulation. Monique Lamoureux-Kolls circled the neutral zone, split a pair of Ohio State defenders and deked for the goal at 2:19 of the first period while Jocelyne Lamoureux sniped a wrist shot off the joint of the crossbar and post for a 2-1 lead at 9:14 of the second frame. The Buckeyes looked as if they would at least gain a tie in the game with under :30 seconds remaining and control of the puck in the Sioux zone, but Wiebe was able to block a shot from the point, beat the defender back to the puck and on a breakaway wristed a shot past Steffes with only :14 seconds remaining.
- The Sioux lost their leading scorers in the Lamoureux twins for last Sunday's game (they are competing for U.S. in the Four Nations tournament and will also miss this weekend's series against Bemidji State), but they barely skipped a beat as the game. UND outshot the Buckeyes 32-19 and through two periods the Buckeyes only had seven even-strength shots on goal. But after Allison Parizek scored the lone goal of the first period, OSU responded with the next two goals to lead late in the third period. Jordan Slavin joined the play as an extra skater as the Sioux pulled goaltender Stephanie Ney with 1:25 left on the clock. Slavin picked the high glove-side corner of the net just :07 seconds after stepping on the ice for the game-tying goal. The Sioux would spend the remainder of 2:28 of the overtime period on the power-play (including :11 seconds of 5-on-3) but struggled to get anything going as the clock ran out. The Buckeyes, who also played with three players missing to the Four Nations tournament, would gain the extra point in the standings with a 2-0 shootout win.
- Last Friday's overtime goal by Wiebe broke a 13-game goal drought for UND's leading point scorer from last season.
- Sioux goaltenders Jorid Dagfinrud and Stephanie Ney continue to share time in net. Dagfinrud improved to 3-3-0 while Ney remained unbeaten in the tie with a new mark of 3-0-1.
- The Sioux return to the road this weekend for a Friday/Saturday WCHA series against Bemidji State. Both games are scheduled for a 2:07 pm opening face-off. UND's all-time series record against the Beavers is tied 15-15-2 after going 5-4-1 in the last 10 meetings.

## **Buckeyes**

### **Ohio State University**

- The No. 9-ranked Buckeyes left Grand Forks with two WCHA points in a series at No. 7 North Dakota, Nov. 6-7 at Ralph Engelstad Arena. The Buckeyes won a shootout, 2-0, in the second game Sunday, following a 2-2 overtime tie on Saturday. The opening game also went into overtime, with North Dakota scoring the game-winning goal with just :14 seconds left for the 3-2 victory.
- Ohio State was without top goal-scorer Natalie Spooner for the series at UND, while Minttu Tuominen and Annie Svedin missed the second game. All three are preparing with their respective national teams for the Four Nations Cup and will miss the Minnesota State series while competing in the tournament.
- Rookie goalie Lisa Steffes continued her strong start by making 27 saves last Saturday and 30 saves on Sunday.
- The Buckeyes rallied twice to tie the first game at UND and send it into overtime with goals by sophomore Paige Semenza and freshman Ally Tarr. It was the first of the season for Semenza and first of her career for Tarr.
- In the second game, seniors Christina Mancuso and Shannon Reilly scored for Ohio State. The goal by Mancuso was set up by sophomore Amanda Boskovich for her second point in as many weeks – and her first goal and assist of her career. Laura McIntosh and Tarr scored for the Buckeyes in the shootout. It was the first shootout in the WCHA this season and the Buckeyes move to 4-2 all-time in shootouts. UND again played spoiler in the second game, scoring an extra-skater goal with 1:18 left in regulation to send it into overtime. It was the second shootout goal scored by McIntosh who also had an assist in both games.
- Hockey Langan ended her point streak at 11 games, dating back to the last two games of the 2009-10 season. She was held without a point for the first time this season last Sunday. It was just the ninth time in 47 career games she did not have a point.
- Tina Hollowell had an assist on the second goal last Saturday. She already has six points 10 games into this season after a total of four (1g, 3a) in all 37 games last year.
- Ohio State had a tough power-play weekend at UND, going 0-for-5. On the flipside, the Buckeye penalty-kill was a perfect 9-of-9.

## **Huskies**

### **St. Cloud State University**

- The Huskies suffered a series sweep on the road at league rival Minnesota State University, Mankato on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 5-6. The Huskies are now 0-11-0 in 2010-11 with an 0-8-0 mark in the WCHA.
- The Huskies fell 4-1 to Minnesota State on Friday, Nov. 5 at MSU's All Seasons Arena. St. Cloud State's Lisa Martinson answered with her first goal of the season and third of her young career on the power-play at 8:24 to cut the MSU lead to two goals. Sophomore Kylie Lane and rookie Julia Gilbert assisted on the lone Husky score of the contest. Ashley Nixon backstopped the Huskies with 23 saves in net as she fell to 0-8-0 overall in 2010-11.
- The following day SCSU dropped a tough 4-2 loss to the Mavericks. Rookie forward Molli Mott netted her first career goal to cut the Maverick lead to 3-1. Just before the midway point of the period, SCSU's sophomore forward Haylea Schmid put away her first goal of the season at 9:41 to bring the Huskies to within one goal. Mott dished out the helper on the Schmid tally to gain her second point of the contest while Schmid's goal

was the first of her career. SCSU's junior netminder Tayler VanDenakker suffered the loss between the pipes, falling to 0-3-0 on the season. VanDenakker totaled 20 saves in 58:46 minutes of ice time.

- St. Cloud State will be idle this coming weekend and return to WCHA action on Nov. 19-20 with a league series at the University of North Dakota.

## **Badgers**

### **University of Wisconsin**

- The top-ranked Badgers (9-1-0, 7-1-0 WCHA) are off this weekend and have two weeks to prepare for their Nov. 19-20 non-conference series against Robert Morris at the RMU Island Sports Center in Pittsburgh.
- Wisconsin split a WCHA series at Minnesota on Nov. 5-6. The Gophers snapped UW's season-opening eight-game winning streak as the Badgers dropped a 7-5 decision in last Friday's game. Wisconsin rebounded with a decisive 5-0 victory over Minnesota to conclude the series Saturday.
- Last Friday, the Badgers came back from trailing 4-1 and 5-2 by scoring four goals in the second period, but Minnesota hung on for a 7-5 victory. Eight Badgers earned a point in the team's first road game of the year, with three players recording multi-point games in Hilary Knight, Meghan Duggan and Carlyne Prevost.
- Last Saturday freshman Alex Rigsby record a career-high 25 saves to lead the Badgers to a 5-0 shutout victory over the Gophers and earn the series split. Duggan led the Badgers with three points on one goal and two assists, and Knight scored two goals. Prevost and sophomore Stefanie McKeough both added one goal and one assist.
- Wisconsin owns sole-possession of first place in the WCHA with 21 points at 7-1-0-0. Minnesota Duluth is second with 18 points (6-2-0-0), and North Dakota is third with 16 (5-2-1-0).
- UW is 207-62-27 all-time in WCHA games for a .745 winning percentage.
- With their 6-1 win over Minnesota State on Oct. 30, the Badgers tied the best start in program history with an eight-game winning streak. UW also started the 2008-09 campaign at 8-0-0 before tying Minnesota in their ninth game; Wisconsin was unbeaten in its first 21 games at 19-0-2 to start that season.
- The Badgers are 3-1-0 against ranked opponents this season, posting two wins over then-No. 10 Ohio State on Oct. 22-23 and splitting a series with then-No. 8 Minnesota on Nov. 5-6. UW was 4-3-1 against ranked opponents in 2009-10.
- Of the Badgers' six newcomers this season, five have already had their first taste of collegiate competition. Brittany Ammerman and Kelly Jaminski have played in all 10 games, while Madison Packer and Laurel Miller have both played in eight. Rigsby has made six appearances in net.

### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
