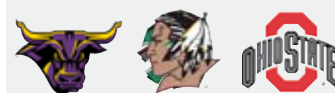

# Wisconsin Sweeps to Take Five-Point Lead in WCHA Race at the Holiday Break; Defending Champ UMD Second, UND Third Badgers Win Twice on Road at SCSU Behind Six-Point Weekends by Ammerman, Duggan; Minnesota Sweeps at Home vs OSU after Weather Causes First Postponement in School History; Sioux Upend Bulldogs in Final Game at DECC to Gain Series Split; Bemidji State Earns Five Points at MSU; Four WCHA-Member Teams Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 2, UMD No. 5, UM No. 7, UND No. 8; Tickets on Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – The University of Wisconsin heads into the holiday break as the team to beat in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association after the Badgers swept a pair of conference road games at St. Cloud State on Dec. 9-10. With the eight-member WCHA teams sidelined from league play because of final exams and the holidays until Jan. 7, the Badgers have a five point lead over defending conference champion Minnesota Duluth.

There are no games scheduled for WCHA-member teams between Dec. 13-29.

With the 112-game league season now half over, Wisconsin has 36 points on a 12-2-0 WCHA mark, Minnesota Duluth is second with 31 points and a 10-5-1 league slate, North Dakota is third with 26 points at 8-6-2 and Minnesota is fourth with 25 points on a 8-6-0 WCHA record. Both the Bulldogs and Fighting Sioux have played 16 of their 28 conference games, while Wisconsin and Minnesota have played in 14.

The WCHA has four of its teams ranked in the top ten in the latest (Dec. 12) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Hockey Poll, led by Wisconsin at No. 2. Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth is fifth, Minnesota is at No. 7 and North Dakota is at No. 8. Ohio State and Bemidji State also received votes in this week's poll.

On the final weekend (Dec. 10-12) of league play for calendar year 2010, Wisconsin and Minnesota both earned sweeps, Bemidji State gained five points and host Minnesota Duluth split with North Dakota. The visiting Badgers beat St. Cloud State 5-0 last Friday behind goaltender Alex Rigsby's 22-save shutout. Then on Saturday, Brooke Ammerman had a three-goal hat trick in the UW's 6-1 victory. No Games Scheduled thru December 29

and Meghan Duggan each had six points in the series.

Up in Duluth, at the final series ever played at the DECC (Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center), host Minnesota Duluth split with North Dakota. UMD got three assists from Haley Irwin on Friday and took a 4-1 decision in the series opener. The Bulldogs scored three goals in :21 seconds in the Saturday game, but the Sioux roared back to take a 4-3 victory as Stephanie Ney made 41 saves and Mary Loken scored the game-winner.

At Mankato, visiting Bemidji State picked up five points in a series with Minnesota State. The Beavers won 2-1 over the Mavericks last Friday on Montana Vichorek's overtime game-winner. The two teams then tied 1-1 (ot) last Saturday before BSU won the shootout, 2-1, to move into fifth place.

And at Minnesota, a winter storm interrupted the series between the host Golden Gophers and Ohio State and forced the postponement of the series finale Saturday. Minnesota's Amanda Kessel had four assists in the Gophers' 6-0 victory last Friday. After the first postponement in program history Saturday, Meghan Bozek got the game-winner as on Sunday as Minnesota took a 2-1 overtime decision from the Buckeyes.

The WCHA standings at the holiday break show Wisconsin (12-2-0-0 WCHA, 16-2-0 overall) in first place with 36 points, five ahead of Minnesota Duluth (10-5-1-0 WCHA, 12-5-1 overall) and 10 better than North Dakota (8-6-2 WCHA, 9-6-1 overall). Minnesota (8-6-0 WCHA, 13-6-0 overall) is fourth with 24 points with Bemidji State (6-5-3-2 WCHA, 8-7-3 overall) in fifth with 23 points, seven better than Ohio State (4-8-2-2 WCHA, 8-8-2 overall). Minnesota State (5-8-1 WCHA, 6-11-3 overall) is in seventh place with 16 points while St. Cloud State (0-13-1-1 WCHA, 0-16-1 overall) is eighth with two points.

There are no games scheduled for WCHA-member teams until Dec. 30. Ohio State will return to on-ice action Thursday-Friday, Dec. 30-31 when the Buckeyes host Wayne State for a non-conference series. North Dakota will play in the Bison Holiday Tournament in Winnipeg, Manitoba on Dec. 30-31 against the University of Alberta and host University of Manitoba. St. Cloud State (and Wisconsin) will return to play on Saturday-Sunday, Jan. 1-2 when the Huskies host the Badgers, Northeastern and Mercyhurst in the Easton Holiday Showcase at the National Hockey Center. On Saturday, Wisconsin will take on Northeastern while the SCSU Huskies will face-off against Mercyhurst. On Sunday, the UW takes on Mercyhurst while St. Cloud State faces-off against Northeastern.

Through games of Dec. 13, the eight WCHA-member women's teams are a combined 19-9-2 in non-conference play for a .667 winning percentage.

The next action for Bemidji State will be on Jan. 7-8 at St. Cloud

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

### 2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

**112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion**

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play its first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for

7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

### Beavers

#### Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (6-5-3-2 WCHA, 8-7-3 overall) will be idle until traveling down to St. Cloud State Jan. 7-8 to finish the regular season series against the Huskies.
- Earlier this season the Beavers picked up their only sweep of the season after defeating the SCSU Huskies by scores of 3-2 and 4-0 in Bemidji over the Oct. 29-30 weekend. The games against St. Cloud State saw one of the best performances by senior forward Erin Cody as she tallied seven points, including a natural hat trick on Oct. 29. The following day she recorded two goals and two assists as the Beavers finished off the Huskies 4-0.
- The Beavers picked up five conference points on the road last weekend against a pesky Minnesota State team. Both games went into overtime as the first game was a 2-1 BSU win, with the second game ending in a 1-1 tie and Bemidji State taking the extra point from the shootout victory.
- The Dec. 10 game at MSU was the first overtime victory of the season. Montana Vichorek netted the game-winning goal just :56 seconds into overtime and with :04 seconds left on a BSU power-play. In the first period the two teams skated fairly even with BSU out-shooting the Mavericks 11-10, but it was MSU that took the first advantage at the 16:13 mark. With the one goal deficit, the Beavers outshot the Mavericks 9-5 in the second and went on the prowl for a game-tying goal and Emily Erickson tapped home her ninth goal of the season.
- The Dec. 11 game was the fourth overtime game and third shootout of the season for BSU as the Beavers and host Mavericks battled to a 1-1 tie. The Beavers then went on to take the shootout 2-1 in three rounds. With 3:17 left in the second period, Cody's 12th goal of the season was Bemidji's lone score.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Erickson has scored 27 of the team's 34 goals this year and have tallied 27 of the Beavers' 57 assists. Cody leads the three with 13 goals and 12 assists while Erickson has nine goals and eight assists. Lundquist has five goals and seven assists. The trio has accounted for 54 of the 91 total points on the season.
- Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova has 397 saves this season. In nine games she has recorded a .934 save percentage and a 1.93 goals-against average.

### Golden Gophers

#### University of Minnesota

- The No. 7-ranked Golden Gophers (13-6-0 overall, 8-6-0 WCHA) concluded the first half of the season with a series sweep over the No. 10 Ohio State Buckeyes, Dec. 10 and 12.
- With the wins, the Gophers are now in sole possession of fourth place in the WCHA standings with 24 points. Minnesota trails Wisconsin (36 points), Minnesota Duluth (31 points) and North Dakota (26 points) in the WCHA standings. Both Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota have played in 16 conference games, while Wisconsin and Minnesota have played in 14.
- Heading into the holiday break, Kelly Terry leads the team in points with 22, followed by Amanda Kessel with 20, Sarah Davis with 16 and Sarah Erickson with 15.
- Sophomore goaltender Noora Raty enters the break with a 1.55 goals-against average and a .945 save percentage.
- The Gophers will be without the services of senior captain Emily West for the remainder of the season. She will undergo surgery, which will sideline her from competition this year. She will return to the Gopher lineup in 2011-12.
- In last Friday's game, Amanda Kessel had four assists while seven others tallied points to lead the Gophers to a 6-0 win over No. 10 Ohio State. Jen Schoullis had two goals, while Erickson, Terry, Becky Kortum

and Anne Schleper all netted one en route to the Golden Gophers' 12th win of the season. Minnesota scored twice in the first, twice in the second and twice in the third for the 6-0 final. Erickson scored the game-winning goal at 8:38 in the first. Terry gave the Gophers a 2-0 advantage when she scored a short-handed goal at 15:52 in the first. She scored on a breakaway for her eighth goal of the season. It was the first shorthanded goal scored for the Gophers this season. The last time the Gophers scored a shorthanded goal dates back to Nov. 28, 2009 against Clarkson when West accomplished the feat. Schoullis added a goal at 1:24 in the second when she placed the puck in the top right corner. Kortum lit the lamp at 15:45 in the second period when she scored off a rebound attempt. Minnesota found the net another two times to put the game at a 6-0 final. Schleper scored her fourth goal of the season when her deflected off an OSU defenseman at 15:37 in the third. Schoullis added the final blow at 19:18 when she scored her second goal of the game and seventh of the season. Kessel tied a career-high four points in a game, her first coming against Clarkson in the opening game this season. Raty collected her sixth shutout of the season when she stopped all 28 Buckeye shots on goal. She held OSU scoreless when she stopped 12 shots in the first, seven in the second and nine in the third.

- For the first time in school history, the Gophers postponed a home game Saturday due to weather. The Gophers pushed back both the women's and men's games Saturday to Sunday afternoon starts. On Sunday, Megan Bozek scored at 3:14 in overtime to lift the Gophers to a 2-1 win over No. 10 Ohio State. The two teams went scoreless after two periods. OSU scored a five-on-three goal at 6:58 in the third to break the scoreless game when Hokey Langan netted her 10th goal of the season. The Langan goal was the first allowed by the Gophers and goalie Noora Raty of the weekend. She held the Buckeyes scoreless for over five periods of play. Following the OSU goal, the Gophers started peppering Buckeye goalie Lisa Steffes. Kelly Seeler wound up and one-timed the puck at 10:19 in the third period for her fourth goal of the season. The Seeler goal forced the game into overtime. In the extra stanza, Bozek received the puck from Davis and fired a shot from the left point. It was Bozek's second game-winning goal of the season.
- Last Sunday's game marked the first time the Gophers played in overtime this season. It was the fifth overtime game for the Buckeyes as they now sit, 0-3-2 in the extra stanza.
- Minnesota is now idle until Jan. 7 when Minnesota State comes to town for a WCHA set. The game is set for a 6:07 pm start, followed by a 4:07 pm start on Jan. 8 for the series conclusion.

### Bulldogs

#### University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 6 Bulldogs closed down the historic Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center this past weekend with a series split against No. 8 University of North Dakota.
- UMD turned in a 4-1 decision last Friday night, downing the Sioux in a very physical game and despite going 0-of-6 on the power-play. Junior forward Haley Irwin had three assists in the contest, while Jessica Wong and Eling Holmlöv each picked up a goal and an assist. Four UMD players were +4 on the evening, including Holmlöv, Pernilla Winberg and Jocelyne Larocque. Between them, the two teams racked up 42 minutes worth of penalties, with 13 of the 21 penalties in the game called in the final period of play.
- The 23 saves Kim Martin made for the Bulldogs last Friday gives her 62 career victories – three shy of tying UMD's career wins record of 65.
- UMD allowed the Sioux to crawl back in the contest Saturday after scoring three goals in just :21 seconds between 17:02 and 17:23 of the first period. The three tallies – the quickest three goals ever strung together in Bulldog program history – gave UMD a 3-1 lead after the opening stanza. North Dakota netted two goals in the third period, including one with just four over minutes remaining in the contest that trickled through



Martin's five-hole, to complete the comeback. Katie Wilson, Wong and Winberg scored the three goals for the Bulldogs, who outshot the Sioux 44-27 in the outing.

- Over the series, UMD was a painful 0-of-13 on the power-play, and spent 30 minutes in the penalty box in the series, while the Sioux spent 36 minutes in the box.
- The Bulldogs, who are now 34-4-0 all-time against UND, and in the last 16 outings between the two teams, UMD is averaging 16.5 minutes worth of penalties a game, while North Dakota is averaging 17.9.
- Senior blueliner Larocque is tied as the No. 1 scoring defenseman in UMD's history with 90 career points (15g, 75a) in 111 games after her third period goal last Friday. Larocque is ranked No. 3 in the NCAA among leading-scoring blueliners and first in the WCHA with 15 points (5g, 10a) in 16 skates.
- Haley Irwin continues to stay on or next to the top of the NCAA scoring chart, ranking No. 2 with a 2.25 points per game average after scoring 36 points (17g, 19a) in 16 outings. Irwin is currently on an eight-game scoring streak that began back on Oct. 30. Over her last eight skates, Irwin has compiled nine goals and 15 assists for 24 games, and all eight games have been WCHA outings.
- Pernilla Winberg is currently on a six game scoring spree (3g, 3a), while Wong has scored in five consecutive outings (4g, 3a).
- UMD leaves the DECC with a 159-33-15 record all-time for a .803 winning percentage. The Bulldogs, who won two NCAA national titles, one WCHA Playoff championship and two WCHA Regular season titles on the famously pro-UMD ice, will move into AMSOIL Arena this week. UMD will play its first game in the 80 million dollar rink against Wisconsin on Jan. 21.
- The Bulldogs will be back in action Jan. 14-15 when they face league rival Minnesota at Ridder Arena for the first time since clinching the 2010 NCAA national championship on the Gophers' home ice. UMD is 23-26-5 against Minnesota all-time, the only program in the nation the Bulldogs are sub-.500 against, although UMD has won the last six meetings between the two squads.

## Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (6-11-3 overall, 5-8-1-0 WCHA) played host to Bemidji State this past weekend and finished 0-1-1.
- The Mavericks have not earned a victory since 11/13 at Ohio State. They have lost or tied eight straight games.
- The Mavericks were outshot by Bemidji State, 59-37, and outscored, 2-1 last Friday and played a 1-1 tie last Saturday. The Mavericks committed seven penalties for 14 minutes to Bemidji State's six penalties for 12 minutes.
- Two Mavericks scored a goal last weekend in junior forward Moria O'Connor and freshman forward Kathleen Rogan. Four Mavericks finished with one helper each in sophomore blueliner Emilia Andersson, junior defenseman Ariel Mackley, sophomore forward Lauren Smith and senior forward Nina Tikkinen.
- Rookie Kathleen Rogan leads the Mavericks in points this season with 10-7=17. Nina Tikkinen sits second on the team with 5-7=12 and Lauren Smith has tallied 10 points (3g, 7a) while O'Connor is next with seven (4g, 3a). Three Mavericks have tallied six points in junior forward Emmi Leinonen (3g, 3a), sophomore forward Lauren Zrust (3g, 3a) and freshman forward Tracy McCann (3g, 3a).
- Rogan's 10 goals is a team-best, while her, Smith and Tikkinen each own a team-best seven assists.
- Emmi Leinonen leads the team in power-play goals with two while Tracy McCann owns a team-best two game-winning goals. Smith and Rogan each own one shorthanded goal and two unassisted goals, team-bests. Tikkinen also owns one shorthanded goal.
- Smith has tallied a team-high 58 shots, while Rogan has taken 51 shots.
- Smith is the owner of a team-best +7, Rogan and sophomore defenseman Erika Magnusson each have a +3 rating and freshman

defenseman Danielle Scholzen has a +2 rating.

- Rookie netminder Danielle Butters owns a team-best .583 winning percentage, while junior goaltender Alli Altmann owns team-bests in all other goaltender categories with a 2.61 goals-against average, a .904 save percentage, 328 saves and one shutout.
- Minnesota State dropped an overtime contest to Bemidji State last Friday, 2-1, Rogan put Minnesota State up 1-0 at the 16:13 mark of the first period. The Beavers answered at the 15:35 of the second frame when forward Lauren Williams' shot was stopped, but sophomore forward Emily Erickson put in the rebound past Altmann. Then just :56 seconds into overtime, the Beavers capitalized on a power-play tally netted by forward Montana Vichorek. Altmann finished the game with 31 saves, while Tomcikova stopped 17. Bemidji State outshot the Mavericks, 33-18 and went 1-for-3 on power-play chances, while MSU went 0-for-3.
- In the series finale vs BSU, the Mavericks and Beavers skated to a 1-1 tie last Saturday afternoon with Bemidji State earning the extra point with the shoot out win. After a scoreless first period, the Beavers opened the scoring at the 16:43 of the second when senior forward Erin Cody tipped an Erika Wheelhouse shot from the point past Altmann. The Mavericks knotted things up at the 11:01 mark of the third period. Smith brought the puck into BSU's zone, and then slid the puck across the net to O'Connor who put it past Beaver netminder Zuzana Tomcikova on the forehand. Neither team was able to capitalize in overtime, so the two teams tied and went to a shoot out for the extra WCHA point. MSU's first attempt was made by Rogan who scored, but was answered when Bemidji State's Erin Cody beat Altmann. Smith missed for the Mavericks and the Beavers earned the extra point when Erickson scored. Bemidji State outshot MSU, 26-19. MSU went 0-for-2 and the Beavers went 0-for-3. Altmann finished with 25 saves, while Tomcikova had 18.

## Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (9-7-2 overall, 8-6-2 WCHA) concluded its pre-Christmas action this weekend with a series split against defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.
- UND opened the series with a 4-1 loss as Minnesota Duluth received goals from four different players. After the Bulldogs pulled a 2-0 lead in the second period, Candace Molle was able to cut the lead to one goal at 12:38 of the middle frame on the power-play but it was all UMD on the scoreboard after that.
- In the last collegiate hockey game to be played at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center, the Sioux spoiled the mood last Saturday night as UMD said farewell with a ceremony after the game. Jocelyne Lamoureux scored her team leading 15th and 16th goals of the season (also added an assist) while Stephanie Ney made 41 saves to lead the Sioux to a season split with the Bulldogs. Lamoureux scored the game's first goal but UMD answered by scoring a program record three goals in 21 seconds to conclude the first period. That would be all they would get though as UND scored three unanswered goals to complete the come-from-behind win. MaryLoken scored the game-winner (unassisted) while Sara Dagenais tied the game in the third period with Lamoureux picking up the assist.
- The Fighting Sioux conclude the first half of the season with a program-record eight conference wins and a .563 conference winning percentage. UND is third in the conference standings, also a program record at the half-way point.
- Through the first half of the season, the Sioux had the hardest strength of schedule with 12 of their 18 games against top-10 ranked teams and going 6-5-1 in those games. According to USCHO.com, UND's strength of schedule was a 251.7 with Minnesota Duluth second at 204.6.
- With her two goals last Saturday, Lamoureux currently ranks tied for fourth in the nation averaging 1.07 goals per game.
- The Sioux continue to produce program record-breaking special teams numbers with a 16.3% conversion rate on the power-play and 90.7% on the penalty-kill (fifth in the nation).
- UND will return to action on Dec. 30-31 taking part in the Bison Holiday

Tournament in Winnipeg, Manitoba, where they will face off against the Universities of Manitoba and Alberta in exhibition action.

- The Sioux open the New Year against Vermont on Jan. 7-8 and return to WCHA play against Bemidji State on Jan. 15-16.

## **Buckeyes**

### **Ohio State University**

- The No. 9 Buckeyes dropped both games of a WCHA series at No. 7 Minnesota, Dec. 10 and 12 at Ridder Arena. Ohio State and Minnesota were originally scheduled to play a Friday-Saturday series, but the second game was postponed because of the snow storm in the Twin Cities area. It was the first time Ohio State had a game postponed in 12 years of the program. Ohio State is winless in its last 13 games against Minnesota.
- The Buckeyes have faced Olympic goalies in their last five games – Minnesota Duluth's Kim Martin (Sweden), Bemidji State's Zuzana Tomcikova (Slovakia) and Minnesota's Noora Raty (Finland).
- Coming off a bye week, the Buckeyes had a tough time with the Golden Gophers LAST Friday night in a 6-0 loss. Freshman Lisa Steffes did what she could in the OSU net with 28 saves, but Minnesota scored two goals in each period to pull away throughout the game. It was the second time the Buckeyes were shutout this season. Steffes made several outstanding saves and stopped a total of 39 shots.
- Ohio State fell in a tough overtime game to Minnesota, 2-1, last Sunday. Game two remained scoreless into the third. It only took :11 seconds for the Buckeyes to capitalize on a 5-on-3 power-play, when sophomore Hokey Langan deflected in a shot from the point by senior defenseman Shannon Reilly. Junior Laura McIntosh picked up the second assist. Minnesota evened things up at 10:19 when Kelly Seeler scored. Megan Bozak then got the win for the Gophers 3:14 into overtime. Steffes posted her 10th game with 30-plus saves just 18 games into this season.
- Rookie goaltender Lisa Steffes heads into the break leading the NCAA in total saves with 559. She is on her way to becoming the first Buckeye goalie to make 1,000 saves in a season.
- With her assist, McIntosh set the Ohio State record for the career assists in WCHA-only games with 68. She surpassed the previous mark of 67 set by Jana Harrigan (2003-06). McIntosh is now tied for second in career assists (86) and career WCHA points (93) in the Buckeye record books.
- Natalie Spooner's streak of consecutive series with a point ends at 22. The last time she was held without a point in a series was the opening weekend of last year, Oct. 2-3, 2009 at Boston University. It is only the fifth time in her career she was held without a point in a series.
- Ohio State's penalty-kill has held opponents scoreless on 30 of their last 33 power-play opportunities. The PK was a perfect 4-of-4 in the Minnesota series.
- This was just the sixth overtime game between the Buckeyes and Gophers in 51 meetings.
- Ohio State will be off the next two weeks for the holiday, returning to the ice Dec. 30-31 for a non-conference series with Wayne State at the OSU Ice Rink.

## **Huskies**

### **St. Cloud State University**

- The Huskies (0-16-1 overall, 0-13-1-1 WCHA) suffered a home sweep to the No. 2-ranked Wisconsin Badgers on Friday and Saturday, Dec. 10-11, in the National Hockey Center.
- In the first game, Wisconsin blanked the Huskies 5-0. Senior goalie Ashley Nixon led the Huskies with 43 saves in the loss.
- The following afternoon, Wisconsin's Brooke Ammerman (3g, 1a) and Meghan Duggan (1g, 4a) combined for nine points to lead the Badgers past St. Cloud State by a score of 6-1. Senior alternate captain Courtney Josefson sparked the Huskies with her first goal of the season at 6:38 of the final period to erase all hopes of a Wisconsin shutout. The goal, which marked the second of Josefson's career, was the first goal for the Huskies in eight periods of play.

- Goaltender Ashley Nixon was also on top of her game on Saturday despite giving up six goals, four of which were on the power-play. She made 39 saves in the second game and totaled 82 in the weekend tilt against Wisconsin.

- Rookie Kayla Capistrant dished out her first career helper on Josefson's goal. Sophomore blueliner Lisa Martinson was also credited an assist on the scoring play, which marked Martinson's first assist of the season.
- St. Cloud State will now take two weeks off for the holiday break before hosting the Easton Holiday Showcase, scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, Jan. 1-2, in the National Hockey Center. Teams participating in the Showcase this year are Wisconsin, Mercyhurst and Northeastern.

## **Badgers**

### **University of Wisconsin**

- The No. 2 Badgers (16-2-0, 12-2-0 WCHA) are idle until Jan. 1-2, 2011 when they travel to St. Cloud for the Easton Holiday Showcase against Northeastern (10-4-4) and No. 4 Mercyhurst (13-3-0).
- Wisconsin swept St. Cloud State on the road Dec. 10-11, topping the Huskies 5-0 in Friday's game and recording a 6-1 win Saturday. Junior Brooke Ammerman and senior Meghan Duggan each tallied six points on the weekend, and a dozen Badgers picked up at least one point.
- In last Friday's game, freshman goaltender Alex Rigsby made 22 saves to earn her third career shutout as UW skated to a 5-0 victory over SCSU. Five Badgers earned multi-point games led by freshman Brittany Ammerman and Madison Packer, who both had two points on one goal and one assist. Last Saturday, Duggan led the Badgers with five points and Brooke Ammerman recorded her second hat trick of the season as the Badgers earned the series sweep with a 6-1 win. In addition to multi-point efforts from Duggan and Brooke Ammerman, Brianna Decker had two goals and one assist and Hilary Knight added two assists. Sophomore goaltender Becca Ruegsegger made 15 saves and improved to 5-1-0 on the season.
- On the weekend, Wisconsin went 5-of-6 on the power-play vs SCSU, including a perfect 4-of-4 with the man-advantage on Saturday. The Badgers held St. Cloud State scoreless on five power-plays. UW outshot the Huskies, 93-38, in the two games.
- With five assists against SCSU, Duggan became the third Badger to earn 100 career assists; she now ranks third in the UW career record book behind career leader Sara Bauer (2003-07) with 138 assists and Erika Lawler (2005-09) with 119.
- After seven different Badgers tallied points in UW's 6-1 win over St. Cloud State (Dec. 11), five Badgers close out the 2010 calendar year riding multi-game point streaks, led by Duggan's career-best 14-game point streak. Decker is currently on a career-best nine-game point streak. Packer and Brooke Ammerman are on three-game streaks and Knight has at least one point in the last two games.
- Duggan and Brooke Ammerman are tied for the national lead with six power-play goals each.
- Duggan and Carolyne Prevost are tied for second in the country with two shorthanded goals each.
- At 11-1-0 on the year, Rigsby's .917 winning percentage tops the WCHA and is fourth in the nation.
- As a team, the Badgers are second in the nation with 5.06 goals per game and UW is fourth in the country in scoring defense, allowing 1.72 goals per game. The Badgers rank second with a +3.33 scoring margin in 18 games. UW leads the nation with a 27.3 power play percentage (21-of-77).
- Wisconsin players have recorded six hat tricks this season, coming from four different players. Most recently, Brooke Ammerman posted a hat trick at SCSU (Dec. 11). The three-goal effort marked Ammerman's fourth career hat trick and included two power-play goals and the game-winner.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
