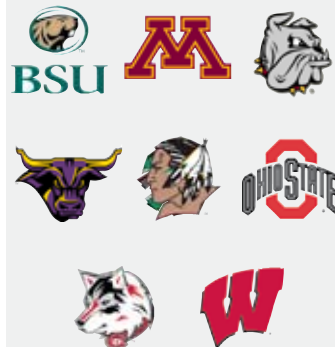

## First Half of WCHA Play for 2010-11 Concludes Dec. 10-11 with Four Series; It's OSU at UM, UND at UMD, UW at SCSU, BSU at MSU Badgers Sweep at UND Dec. 4-5 to Move into First Place in Conference Race; Irwin has Seven Points as UMD Gains Four Points at SCSU; Bemidji State Splits with Minnesota; Five WCHA-Member Teams Among Nation's Top 10 in Dec. 6 USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 2, UMD No. 4, UM No. 7, UND No. 9; OSU No. 10 ... BSU Receives Votes; Tickets On Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – The first half of the 2010-11 conference season concludes this coming weekend of Friday-Saturday, Dec. 10-11 with a full slate of four Western Collegiate Hockey Association series match ups.

League-leading and No. 2-ranked Wisconsin (14-2-0, 10-2-0-0 WCHA) will visit St. Cloud State (0-14-1, 0-11-1-1 WCHA) for a pair of 2:07 pm CT face-offs at the National Hockey Center. Defending NCAA and WCHA champion and No. 4-ranked Minnesota Duluth (11-4-1, 9-4-1-0 WCHA) will play host to third place and No. 9-ranked North Dakota (8-6-2, 7-5-2-0 WCHA) in the Bulldogs' final two games at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center (DECC), with start times at 7:07 pm CT both evenings. Bemidji State (7-7-2, 5-5-2-1 WCHA) will travel to Minnesota State (6-10-2, 5-7-0-0 WCHA) and All Seasons Arena for a 7:07 pm face-off Friday and a 3:07 pm CT start on Saturday afternoon. And No. 7-ranked Minnesota (11-6-0, 6-6-0-0 WCHA) will entertain No. 10 Ohio State (8-6-2, 4-6-2-2 WCHA) at Ridder Arena at 6:07 pm CT Friday evening and 2:07 pm CT Saturday afternoon.

Following this weekend's final WCHA series of calendar year 2010, all eight league-member teams will have played at least 14 of their 28 conference games, with both UMD and UND having played 16.

Wisconsin re-established itself as the team to beat in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association by opening an eight-game road trip with two victories at third place North Dakota on the penultimate

weekend before the Christmas break. The Badgers used a three-point performance by Brianna Decker (2g, 1a) to take a 4-3 victory over the Sioux last Saturday (Dec. 4) and then exploded for four second period goals in a 6-2 victory in the series finale last Sunday (Dec. 5). With two games left before the holiday break, the Badgers have opened up a two-point lead on second place Minnesota Duluth and a seven-point lead on North Dakota. The Badgers have also played two fewer games than each of their closest competitors.

Heading into the end of the first half of the league schedule this weekend the WCHA has five of its eight teams again ranked in the top 10 in the Dec. 6 USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Hockey Poll. Wisconsin is ranked second, Minnesota Duluth is fourth, Minnesota is at No. 7, North Dakota is at No. 9 and Ohio State is at No. 10. Bemidji State was one of four other teams which also received votes in this week's poll.

Last weekend (Dec. 3-5), Minnesota and Bemidji State split a series in Bemidji. Beavers' goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova made 29 saves for her fourth shutout of the season and Erin Cody scored twice in a 2-0 decision last Friday but freshman forward Kelly Terry had a goal and three assists to lead Minnesota to a 6-2 victory in the series finale last Saturday.

In St. Cloud, Huskies' goaltender Ashley Nixon made 39 saves and freshman Mollie Mott scored a goal power-play goal and the lone goal in the shootout as St. Cloud State earned a 1-0 shootout win after skating to a 2-2 (ot) tie with Minnesota Duluth. The Bulldogs roared back to take a 5-0 victory on Saturday, however, as Haley Irwin had a hand in all her team's goals. Irwin, the country's leading scorer, had three goals and two assists and scored a total of seven points in the series.

In non-conference play last weekend, host Minnesota State dropped a 2-1 decision to Robert Morris last Friday and then tied the Colonials 1-1 on Saturday in Mankato. Through games of Dec. 7, the eight WCHA-member women's teams are a combined 19-9-2 in non-conference play for a .667 winning percentage.

The WCHA standings this week show Wisconsin (10-2-0-0 WCHA) in first place with 30 points, two ahead of Minnesota Duluth (9-4-1-0 WCHA) and now seven better than North Dakota (7-5-2 WCHA). Minnesota (6-6-0-0 WCHA) and Bemidji State (5-5-2-1 WCHA) are currently tied for fourth place with 18 points each, two better than Ohio State (4-6-2-2 WCHA). Minnesota State (5-7-0-0 WCHA) is in seventh place with 15 points while St. Cloud State (0-11-1-1 WCHA) is eighth with two points.

There are no games scheduled for WCHA-member teams from Dec. 12-29. Ohio State will return to on-ice action on Dec. 30-31 when the Buckeyes host Wayne State for a non-conference series. North Dakota will play in the Bison Holiday Tournament in Winnipeg Dec. 30-31 against the University of Alberta and host University of

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

## 2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

**112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion**

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since its founding in 1999, released its 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play its first game in the new building on Oct.

15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

# WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

- The Beavers play the final games of the calendar year traveling to Mankato for a WCHA series against Minnesota State University. This will be the first meeting between the two teams this season.
- Last season saw the Beavers go 2-0-2 against the Mavericks, with both teams claiming a shootout victory over each other. The two wins over the Mavericks came by scores of 3-1 and 3-0.
- Overall the Mavericks hold a slight lead in the all-time record between the two teams. The Beavers are 17-20-9 against the Mavericks.
- The Beavers are unbeaten against MSU in the past six games going 4-0-2 in that stretch. The last Maverick win came on Nov. 1, 2008 with a score of 4-3.
- BSU split last weekend against No. 7-ranked University of Minnesota, winning the first game 2-0 and dropping the second 6-2. The win on Dec. 3 was the third ever in program history over the Golden Gophers and the first one to come at home.
- Zuzana Tomcikova earned her fourth shutout of the season, second against a nationally-ranked team, as she blanked the Golden Gophers 2-0 on Dec. 3. She turned away 29 shots including eight shots that came on UM power-plays. Besides successfully killing off all three BSU penalties, Tomcikova was forced to make saves on a handful of odd-man rushes. For the weekend she had a .923 save percentage making 36 saves. Tomcikova has 362 saves so far this season and in nine games she has recorded a .933 save percentage and a 2.11 goals-against average.
- After having a quiet weekend against Ohio State the previous week, Erin Cody came out firing and gave the Beavers an early lead in the Dec. 3 game. Cody later added another goal into an empty net to secure the win.
- The following night on Dec. 4, the Gophers scored five straight goals in the first two periods to force the weekend split. However, the Beavers were determined not to roll over and continue to battle against the No. 7 team in the nation. Bemidji State did just that as they out-shot the Gophers 8-5 in the final frame and managed to notch two goals, even while conceding one on the penalty-kill. Emily Erickson scored the first goal for the Beavers just 1:34 into the start of the third. Annie Bauerfeld scored the second goal for the Beavers on a two-on-one break with Cody.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist and Erickson has scored 25 of the 31 goals this year and have tallied 25 of the 51 assists. Cody leads the three with nine goals and 10 assists, while Erickson has seven goals and six assists. Lundquist has five goals and five assists. The trio has accounted for 50 of the 82 total points.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

- The No. 7 Golden Gophers (11-6-0 overall, 6-6-0-0 WCHA) traveled to Bemidji State University last weekend and split with the Beavers. After getting shut out, 2-0, last Friday, the Golden Gophers responded with a convincing 6-2 win on Saturday afternoon.
- With the split the Gophers and the Beavers remain in fourth place in the WCHA standings. Each team has 18 points.
- BSU dominated play last Friday afternoon, holding the Gophers scoreless for just the second time this season. BSU scored at 6:01 in the first period and added an empty-net goal at 19:31 in the third for the 2-0 win. Noora Raty was in goal for the Gophers and kept them in the game. She had 30 saves in 58:52 minutes played.
- Minnesota, however, responded with a 6-2 win last Saturday, including a 3-0 lead after the first period of play. Minnesota jumped out to the early lead when it scored three goals within 1:05 of each other. In Saturday's

game, the Gophers scored at 13:34 with a goal from Sarah Davis. Amanda Kessel scored just a minute later at 14:34, while Kelly Terry scored off of the center face-off just :05 seconds later. The :05 seconds became a new school record. Prior to Kessel and Terry combining for the fastest goal, Tracy Engstrom and Ambria Thomas combined for a six-second goal against Wisconsin on Nov. 19, 1999. Along with scoring three in the first, the Gophers scored twice in the second and once in the third for six goals.

- Minnesota's power-play has clicked in the last couple weeks. On the season, Minnesota has scored 18 power-play goals in 74 chances for a 24.3% success rate. Minnesota has also killed off 78-of-85 penalties for 91.8%. In conference play, the Gophers possess the league's best power-play percentage at 23.4% and the best penalty-kill percent at 89.5%.
- Minnesota is one of five WCHA teams currently ranked in the top 10. Wisconsin, Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota, North Dakota and Ohio State are all ranked, with all teams being beaten at least twice already in conference competition. Wisconsin has lost twice, with UMD dropping four, UND with five, Minnesota and Ohio State with six conference losses.
- Minnesota hosts No. 10-ranked Ohio State this weekend at Ridder Arena. The Gophers are 40-8-1 all-time against the Buckeyes, dating back to 1999. Last year, the Gophers went 4-0-0 in the regular season and won 5-4 in double overtime for a trip to the championship game of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 4 Bulldogs picked up a tie and a win against St. Cloud State last weekend.
- The Bulldogs first tie of the season came last Friday night, as UMD scored to come-from-behind goals to force the game into overtime. The overtime period, UMD's second in three games, was futile, and the Bulldogs lost the extra league point in a shootout. Sophomore forward turned defenseman Jessica Wong scored both UMD goals, while Haley Irwin assisted on both tallies.
- Irwin then led a 5-0 UMD rout over SCSU last Saturday night by netting her third hat trick of the season and assisting on both of the Bulldogs' other two goals. Three other players had two-point or more nights, including blueliner Jocelyne Larocque (1g, 2a), Elin Holmlov (2a), and rookie Brienna Gillanders (1g, 1a).
- Kim Martin picked up career shutout No. 14 and career win No. 61 last Saturday (at SCSU) and is now four wins away from tying the Bulldog record for career wins by a goaltender, currently 65.
- Irwin leads the WCHA in scoring and ranks No. 2 in the NCAA with a point per game average of 2.29, on 32 points – 17 goals and 15 assists – in 14 skates. With a goals per game average of 1.21, Irwin ranks third in the nation and is tied for fifth for assists with a 1.07 average a skate. Irwin's two power-play tallies against the Huskies raised her total to five on the season, the second most in the NCAA where she is tied with rookie Gillanders.
- Larocque is one point from tying the current record for career points by a blueliner, and two from becoming the all-time leading scoring defenseman in UMD history. Larocque is sitting at 90 career points (15g, 75) assists, and has a change to reach 100 points, something no other defenseman has ever done as a Bulldog.
- UMD will host North Dakota at the DECC this weekend, the last series the Bulldogs will ever skate in the old DECC, as UMD moves into the new AMSOIL Arena following the series. Over 12 seasons and 206 games played, UMD is 158-33-15 all-time on DECC ice for a .803 winning percentage. The Bulldogs also won their 2008 and 2003 NCAA national titles in the DECC, and the 2008 WCHA Tournament on their home sheet.
- UMD is 32-3-0 all-time against North Dakota and split with the Sioux earlier this season in Grand Forks.

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (6-11-1 overall, 5-7-0-0 WCHA) played host to Robert Morris University this past weekend and finished 0-1-1. The Mavericks lost their fifth straight game last Friday night, 2-1 and then ended the skid with a 2-2 tie on Saturday.
- MSU finished the season 1-3-2 against non-conference opponents and will start back up in the WCHA this weekend when it hosts Bemidji State.
- On the Dec. 3-4 weekend the Mavericks out shot Robert Morris, 51-28, but were out scored, 4-3. The Mavericks committed 10 penalties for 31 minutes to RMU's seven penalties for 14 minutes.
- Three Mavericks scored goals last weekend vs Robert Morris in freshman Melissa Klippenstein, freshman Kathleen Rogan and sophomore Lauren Zrust. Four Mavericks also finished with one helper each in sophomore Emmi Leinonen, sophomore Erika Magnusson, freshman Kelsie Scott and sophomore Lauren Smith.
- Rogan, a freshman, leads the Mavericks in points this season with 9-7=16. Senior forward Nina Tikkinen sits second on the team with 5-6=11. Smith has tallied nine points (3-6=9) while junior forward Moria O'Connor (3-3=6), freshman forward Tracy McCann (3-3=6), sophomore forward Zrust (3-3=6) and junior forward Emmi Leinonen (3-3=6) are all owners of six points. Two icers own five points on the season in junior blueliner Jackie Otto (5a) and rookie defenseman Nicole Germaine (1-4=5).
- Rogan's nine goals and seven assists are both team-bests.
- Leinonen leads the team in power-play goals with two while McCann owns a team-best two game-winning goals.
- Smith and Rogan each own one shorthanded goal and two unassisted goals, team-bests.
- Tikkinen also owns one shorthanded goal.
- Smith has tallied a team-high 52 shots while Rogan has taken 50.
- Smith is the owner of a team-best +5.
- Rookie netminder Danielle Butters owns a team-best .583 winning percentage, while junior goaltender Alli Altmann owns team-bests in all other goaltender categories: 2.85 goals-against average, .895 save percentage, 272 saves, one shutout.
- Last Friday, the Mavs fell at home to Robert Morris 2-1. Following a scoreless first period that saw MSU outshoot RMU 10-9, Rogan found the back of the net for the Mavericks at the 6:28 mark. RMU tied the game moments later, at the 10:19 mark, as Sara O'Malley beat Altmann on the glove side. RMU continued to ride the momentum early in the third frame as Delaney batted the puck out of the air to beat Altmann stick side for the game-winning goal. MSU outshot the Colonials 20-19. Altmann recorded 17 saves while Kristen DiCiocco tallied 19. The two teams then battled to a 2-2 (ot) tie last Saturday. The Mavericks jumped out to a 1-0 lead midway through the first frame when Klippenstein tipped Leinonen's shot past DiCiocco's glove side. The Colonials would steal the lead in the second period with a pair of tallies from Brianna Delaney. The first came at the 5:47 mark when Delaney kept the puck in the MSU zone and walked down the slot and beat Butters high on the glove side. Zrust knotted things up in the third at the 2:07 mark. Butters finished with eight saves while DiCiocco stopped 29 shots. The Mavericks outshot Robert Morris, 31-10. Robert Morris finished the game going 1-for-4 on the power-play while MSU finished 0-for-4.

## Fighting Sioux

### University of North Dakota

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (8-6-2 overall, 7-5-2 WCHA) were beaten twice by Wisconsin last weekend at the Ralph Engelstad Arena by scores of 4-3 and 6-2, respectively.
- The Sioux have now played 10 of their 16 games against top-10 ranked opponents and are 5-4-1 in those games.
- The Sioux fell victim to two big periods by the second-ranked Badgers giving up three goals in the first period last Saturday and four goals in the second period last Sunday.
- Sophomore Jocelyne Lamoureux added one goal in each game over the weekend for her team-leading 14th of the season. She currently ranks seventh in the nation averaging 1.08 goals per game and is tied for first on the team with 21 points.
- Sophomore Monique Lamoureux-Kolls was held off the scoreboard for only the second time all season last Saturday but rebounded on Sunday with one goal and one assist. She is tied for seventh in the nation with 13 assists and is tied with a team-leading 21 points.
- The Sioux continue to produce program record-breaking special teams numbers with a 17.2% conversion rate on the power-play while stopping 88.5% of opponent power-plays.
- After no goals and three assists in seven games, junior Alyssa Wiebe has rebounded with five goals and eight assists in her last nine games.
- Sophomore Jordan Slavin is tied for seventh in the nation for points per game from a defenseman averaging 0.75. She has four goals and five assists in 12 games played.
- The Fighting Sioux will close out the pre-Christmas part of the season at Minnesota Duluth this Friday and Saturday. The Sioux opened WCHA play against the Bulldogs on Oct. 8 and 10 and split the series with a 4-0 loss and 4-2 win, respectively.

## Buckeyes

### Ohio State University

- The No. 9 Buckeyes, idle last weekend in preparation for finals, wrap up the first half of their season with a road series at No. 7 Minnesota, Dec. 10-11. Games begin at 6 pm (CT) Friday and 2 pm (CT) Saturday at Ridder Arena. Both games will be broadcast through BigTenNetwork.com.
- The last time the Buckeyes and Gophers met was in the second WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF semifinal March 6. Minnesota won 5-4 in the double-overtime contest – the first double-OT game in Ohio State history as well as the longest game in program history at 83:06.
- The Buckeyes are looking to snap an 11-game losing streak to Minnesota. The last OSU win in the series was Oct. 20, 2007.
- Leading Ohio State offensively vs the Gophers are Natalie Spooner with nine points (3g, 6a) in seven games, Laura McIntosh with seven points (2g, 5a) in nine games and Hokey Langan who has five points (1g, 4a) in five games. McIntosh and Spooner were both selected for Canada's National Women's Under-22 Team that will compete at the 2011 MLP Cup, taking place Jan. 4-8 in Kreuzlingen, Switzerland. Hockey Canada released the 21-player roster Dec. 2.
- The Buckeyes will break for the holidays following the Minnesota series and return to the ice for a non-conference series vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31 at the OSU Ice Rink.

## Huskies

### St. Cloud State University

- The winless Huskies (0-14-1 overall, 0-11-1-1 WCHA) took two points from then No. 3-ranked Minnesota Duluth last weekend in a series at St. Cloud.
- Senior netminder Ashley Nixon backstopped the Huskies with 39 saves while rookie forward Molli Mott scored the lone goal of the shootout period to lift the Huskies past the Bulldogs in a 1-0 shootout victory on Friday, Dec. 3, in the National Hockey Center. Mott led the way for SCSU, scoring a goal and dishing out an assist in the 2-2 overtime tie against the Bulldogs while Nixon stopped all three UMD shots in the shootout to secure the extra league point for the Huskies.
- St. Cloud State is now a perfect 2-0 against Minnesota Duluth in shootouts. The first shootout win over UMD came back on Oct. 17, 2008, when SCSU edged UMD 2-1 in the shootout at the NHC.
- On the weekend, Nixon amassed 86 saves and a .925 save percentage after the Bulldogs blanked the Huskies 5-0 on Saturday, Dec. 4, to earn the weekend split.
- St. Cloud State's Julia Gilbert netted her second goal of the season early in the second frame at 1:03 last Friday evening.
- St. Cloud State's penalty-kill also came ready to play last Friday as the Huskies blanked the Bulldogs five times. Coming into the weekend series, UMD had a .246 power-play conversion percentage.
- St. Cloud State will continue home action as the Huskies play host to the No. 2-ranked Wisconsin Badgers this weekend, Friday and Saturday, Dec. 10-11, in the National Hockey Center. Both games are slated for 2:07 pm CT.
- Wisconsin leads the all-time series over St. Cloud State, 37-7-2, dating back to Oct. 29, 1999.
- Husky head coach Jeff Giesen has an all-time mark of 3-11-2 against the Badgers.

## Badgers

### University of Wisconsin

- No. 2 Wisconsin (14-2-0, 10-2-0 WCHA) travels to St. Cloud State (0-14-1, 0-11-1-1 WCHA) for its final series of the 2010 calendar year this Friday and Saturday. Both games are slated for 2 p.m. at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, Minn.
- In 46 games against St. Cloud State, Wisconsin owns a 37-7-2 all-time record. The teams split two series, 2-2-0, last season. Most recently, the Badgers fell to the Huskies, 4-3, at the Kohl Center Jan. 23, 2010 after posting a 5-3 victory over SCSU in the first game of the series. The teams split a series in St. Cloud Nov. 20-21, 2009 with the Badgers winning the first game 2-1 before falling 4-2.
- Wisconsin improved to 6-2-0 against ranked opponents this season with a sweep at then-No. 8 North Dakota last weekend. UW was 4-3-1 against ranked opponents in 2009-10.
- Last weekend, sophomore Brianna Decker led the Badgers to a 4-3 win with two goals and one assist in Saturday's game against the Fighting Sioux. Sunday, UW erupted for four goals in the second period to cruise past North Dakota, 6-2, after falling behind 1-0. In Saturday's game, the Badgers took a 3-0 lead after the first period. Despite a three-goal second period from North Dakota, Wisconsin never trailed as Decker netted her second goal of the game, which proved to be the game-winner, at 18:58 of the frame before UND's Alyssa Wiebe scored the final goal of the game :43 seconds later. Freshman Alex Rigsby stopped 25 of 28 shots, and North Dakota's Stephanie Ney made 28 saves. Last Sunday, North Dakota got on the board first after the teams skated through a scoreless first period. The Badgers responded with five-straight goals from Decker, Meghan Duggan, Brittany Ammerman, Kelly Nash and Brooke Ammerman to

take a 5-1 lead with 15:19 remaining in the third period. UW received 19 saves from Rigsby, who improved to 10-1-0 on the year; UND's Jorid Dagfinrud fell to 4-5-0, allowing six goals on 35 shots.

- After 11 different players tallied points in UW's 6-2 win over North Dakota last Sunday, four Badgers enter this weekend's series riding multi-game point streaks, led by Duggan's career-best 12-game point streak. Decker is currently on a career-best seven-game point streak.
- Hilary Knight leads the WCHA and ranks fifth in the country with 1.12 goals per game. She is tied with Decker for fourth in the league and 12th in the nation with 1.69 points per game. Decker ranks among the conference's top six players in points, goals, assists, shorthanded goals and game-winning goals.
- Duggan is third in the league in both points per game (1.75) and goals per game (0.94); she also ranks in the national top 10 in both categories.
- Rigsby leads the WCHA and is tied for third in the nation with a .909 winning percentage at 10-1-0.
- As a team, the Badgers lead the WCHA and are second in the nation with 5.00 goals per game, and UW is second in the league and sixth in the country in scoring defense, allowing 1.88 goals per game.

## WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
