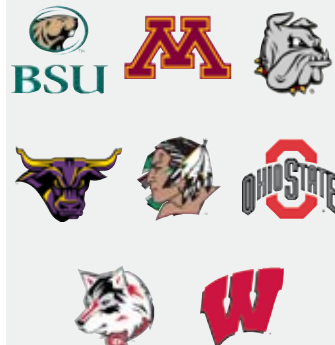

Full Slate of WCHA Series on Tap This Week; Jan. 14-16 Match Ups Have UMD at UM, BSU at UND, SCSU at UW, OSU at MSU Badgers Sweep at OSU to Run Win Streak to Eight, Secure Lead in League Race ... Knight Becomes All-Time UW Goal Scorer; Beavers, Golden Gophers Record Sweeps as Battle for Home Playoff Berths Intensifies; UND Gets Win and Tie at Vermont as WCHA's Non-Conference Record Jumps to 24-11-3 (.671); Four WCHA Teams Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Poll ... Wisconsin No. 1, UMD No. 4, UM No. 7, UND No. 8 ... BSU, OSU Receive Votes; Tickets On Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – The University of Wisconsin secured its first place standing in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association and the top spot again in the weekly USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll (Jan. 10) by extending its winning streak to eight games – all on the road – by defeating Ohio State, 6-2 and 5-3 last weekend in Columbus, Ohio.

With six weeks and 12 conference games left in the 2010-11 regular season, the Badgers have a commanding 11 point lead over defending WCHA co-champion and national champion Minnesota Duluth and a 12-point advantage over both defending WCHA co-champion Minnesota and Bemidji State, who both also recorded league sweeps on Jan. 7-8 to bolster their positions in the hunt for a top four finish and home ice for the first round of WCHA playoffs. North Dakota, who won and tied at Vermont in non-conference play last weekend, is still also solidly in the hunt for an upper division finish.

This week finds a full slate of four WCHA series on the docket for Friday (Jan. 14), Saturday (Jan. 15) and Sunday (Jan. 16). League-leading Wisconsin (20-2-0, 14-2-0 WCHA, 42 points) will play host to St. Cloud

State (0-20-1, 0-15-1-1 WCHA, 2 pts) at the Kohl Center on Friday at 7:07 pm CT and Sunday at 2:07 pm CT. The Badgers, who will be playing at home for the first time since Thanksgiving weekend, won twice at St. Cloud State back on Dec. 10-11 by 5-0 and 6-1 scores.

Second place Minnesota Duluth (12-5-1, 10-5-1-0 WCHA, 31 pts) returns to action for the first time since Dec. 11 when the Bulldogs head to Minnesota (15-6-0, 10-6-0-0 WCHA, 30 pts) and Ridder Arena for a rematch of last season's WCHA regular season co-champions. Face-offs are 7:07 pm CT Friday evening and 4:07 pm CT Saturday afternoon. In the first series between the two clubs this season, Oct. 29-30 in Duluth, UMD swept the Golden Gophers 3-2 and 4-2. Minnesota enters the series on a five-game winning streak.

Another big match up this week will have fourth place Bemidji State (10-7-3, 8-5-3-2 WCHA, 29 pts) taking on host and fifth place North Dakota (10-7-3, 8-6-2-0 WCHA, 26 pts). The two teams will play at Rams Sports Center in Roseau, Minn., on Saturday night at 7:07 pm CT and then back at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks on Sunday afternoon at 4:07 pm CT. BSU and UND, separated by three points, are both in the midst of unbeaten streaks – the Beavers are 3-0-1 over their last four and the Sioux are 2-0-1 over their last three. In the first two-game set between the foes in Bemidji, Bemidji State claimed a 2-1 victory on Feb. 12 followed by a 1-1 (ot) tie on Nov. 13, with the Beavers grabbing a 1-0, three-round, shootout decision.

And at All Seasons Arena in Mankato this weekend, Minnesota State will host Ohio State at 7:07 pm CT Friday and 3:07 pm CT Saturday. The Mavericks (6-13-3, 5-10-1-0 WCHA, 16 pts) and Buckeyes (10-10-2, 4-10-2-2 WCHA, 16 pts) are currently deadlocked in sixth place. In their first match up back on Nov. 12-13 in Columbus, Minnesota State earned a sweep with 5-3 and 4-3 wins.

This week's WCHA standings show Wisconsin (14-2-0-0 WCHA, 20-2-0 overall) in first place with 42 points, 11 ahead of Minnesota Duluth (10-5-1-0 WCHA, 12-5-1 overall). Minnesota (10-6-0 WCHA, 15-6-0 overall) is in third place with 30 points with Bemidji State (8-5-3-2 WCHA, 10-7-3 overall) in fourth with 29 points, three better than North Dakota (8-6-2 WCHA, 10-7-1 overall). Ohio State (4-10-2-2 WCHA, 10-10-2 overall) and Minnesota State (5-10-1 WCHA, 6-13-3 overall) are tied for sixth place with 16 points while St. Cloud State (0-15-1-1 WCHA, 0-20-1 overall) is eighth with two points.

Last weekend (Jan. 7-8), Wisconsin extended its winning streak to eight games with a road sweep of No. 10 Ohio State in Columbus, winning 6-2 and 5-3. The line of Brianna Decker, Meghan Duggan and Hilary Knight combined for 15 points in the series with five each, and Alex Rigsby improved to 14-1-0 with two wins in nets. Knight scored two goals in the series finale to become Wisconsin's all-time leading goal scorer. The junior winger has 91 goals, two more than Jinelle Zaugg, who played from 1994-98.

In Minneapolis, goaltender Noora Raty made 16 saves and Minnesota took a 4-0 victory Friday while senior forward Laura May

scored two goals and three other players registered two-point games as Minnesota swept its weekend series against Minnesota State with a 5-1 win on Saturday at Ridder Arena.

At St. Cloud, visiting Bemidji State won two games over host SCSU by identical 3-1 scores. Senior forwards Erin Cody, Erin Johnson and Annie Bauerfeld each registered a goal and an assist to lead BSU to Friday afternoon's victory and Erickson scored twice and Johnson had a goal and an assist to propel the Beavers to the decision last Saturday afternoon.

And in non-conference action, North Dakota went on the road and beat and tied Vermont, 4-1 and 3-3. Sophomore forward Monique Lamoureux-Kolls scored two goals – to bring her weekend total to five tallies – as the Fighting Sioux skated to a 3-3 (ot) tie with the Catamounts on Saturday afternoon at Gutterson Field House. Lamoureux-Kolls had a three-goal hat trick and added an assist as UND earned a 4-1 win over Vermont last Friday evening.

Through games of Jan. 10, the eight WCHA-member women's teams are now a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play for a .671 winning percentage.

In this week's (Jan. 10) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll four of the WCHA's eight-member teams are ranked in the top ten while two others also received votes. Wisconsin is at No. 1, Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 4, Minnesota is No. 7 and North Dakota is No. 8. Also receiving votes were Bemidji State and Ohio State.

Looking ahead to next weekend, Friday, Jan. 21 and Saturday, Jan. 22, there will again be a full complement of four WCHA series contested as Bemidji State entertains Minnesota State, Ohio State hosts Minnesota, North Dakota travels to St. Cloud State, and Minnesota Duluth hosts Wisconsin in what will mark the Bulldogs' first home league series in their new AMSOIL Arena.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league

play.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

The 2011 Post-Season WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Tournament

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, Feb. 25, Saturday, Feb. 26 and Sunday, Feb. 27 (if necessary) with four, first round conference playoff series.

The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will all host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams. The No. 1 seed hosting the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed hosting the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed hosting the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4

seed hosting the No. 5 seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which is set for March 4-5.

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

“We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association’s automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field.”

There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday, with face-offs at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. The championship contest will then be played at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women’s Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women’s Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers (8-5-3-2 WCHA, 10-7-3 overall) face North Dakota in a Saturday-Sunday series. Saturday's game will be held at Rams Sports Center in Roseau, Minn, and will be played at 7:07 pm. Sunday's game will be in Grand Forks, N.D. at the Ralph Engelstad Arena and will be played at 4:07 pm.
- Earlier this season the Beavers picked up five points against North Dakota at home in the Sanford Center. The Sioux were without their two Olympians Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls during that earlier series against the Beavers. On Nov. 12, Bemidji State claimed a 2-1 victory over the Sioux as Erin Cody and Emily Erickson scored the two goals. The following day Sadie Lundquist scored the lone goal for the Beavers as the two teams tied 1-1. BSU went on to win the shootout with Lundquist scoring the shootout win.
- With the win and the tie earlier this season the Beavers improved their all-time record over the Fighting Sioux to 16-15-3, the only winning record Bemidji State has against a WCHA opponent.
- BSU picked up the regular season sweep over St. Cloud State, downing the Huskies 3-1 both nights over the Jan 7-8 weekend. In the first game of the weekend, Erin Cody opened up the scoring with :16 seconds left in the first period. Emily Erickson and Montana Vichorek were credited with the assists on the play. The Huskies evened the score early in the second period, but the Beavers retorted on their first power-play opportunity of the game. Just :07 seconds into the man-advantage, Erin Johnson was set up in the slot for a one-timer. Her shot beat the SCSU goalie over the glove and gave the Beavers back their one goal lead. Later in the third period, Tess Dusik and Johnson set up Annie Bauerfeld with a breakaway pass. Alone with the goalie, Bauerfeld buried the puck to secure the Beaver victory. On the following night the Beavers had two goals from Erickson and one from Johnson to topple the Huskies by another 3-1 score. Erickson opened the scoring on the power-play after she batted a deflected puck out of midair to score her 10th goal of the season. Johnson later added to the BSU lead scoring her second goal of the weekend. After the Huskies cut the Bemidji State lead to one in the third period, Erickson later capped the scoring off with one-timer goal from Sadie Lundquist and Cody.
- The forward line of Cody, Lundquist, and Erickson has scored 29 of the 39 goals this year and have tallied 31 of the 69 assists so far. Cody leads the three with 13 goals and 14 assists, while Erickson has 11 goals and nine assists. Lundquist has five goals and eight assists. The trio has accounted for 60 of the 108 total points on the season.
- Goalie Zuzana Tomcikova has made 437 saves. In 17 games she has recorded a .936 save percentage and a 1.82 goals-against average.
- Erin Cody sits five points shy of the 100 career-point mark. There have only been two players in BSU history to eclipse the century mark – Amber Fryklund (122) and Kelly Hart (100).

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 7 Golden Gophers (15-6-0 overall, 10-6-0-0 WCHA) opened 2011 with a pair of wins against Minnesota State last weekend. The Golden Gophers earned a 4-0 win last Friday and a 5-1 win on Saturday to sweep the Mavericks.
- With the pair of victories, the Gophers are now in third place in the WCHA standings.
- Since Minnesota added hockey as a varsity sport in 1997-98, a three-week break has taken place in December, with games resuming in the first or second week of January. The Golden Gophers hold a 21-4-1 all-time series/game record coming out of the break. The last time Minnesota fell in its opening game of the semester dated back to 2006-07 when it fell in a two-game series to Wisconsin.
- In last Friday's game, Minnesota opened the scoring with a goal from Sarah Davis at 12:02 in the first period. Minnesota added to its lead when Sarah Erickson scored the Gophers' first power-play goal of the game just

:36 seconds into the second period. The Gophers then tacked on their second power-play goal of the period when Amanda Kessel received a cross-ice pass from Anne Schleper at 12:19 in the second. Laura May netted her first goal of the season on an unassisted play at 2:15 in the third period. The Davis goal would be all that starting goaltender Noora Rätty would need to collect her seventh shutout of the season and 14th of her career. Rätty had six saves in the first period, seven in the second and five in the third for a three-period total of 18.

- In last Saturday's victory, the Gophers jumped out to a 2-0 lead after the first period when Kessel and Jen Schoullis each netted a goal. MSU scored its first goal of the weekend when Moira O'Conner scored at 7:35 in the second period to cut the Gopher lead to one. May, however, put the game back to a two-goal lead when she scored her first of two goals at 12:09 in the second. Bethany Brausen was behind the goal line and fed May the puck, who was alone in the slot. May notched her second goal of the game and third of the weekend at 16:01 in the second when she tipped in a Sam Downey shot. Kelly Terry netted her ninth goal of the year when she received a great pass from Sarah Davis at 18:00 in the third period. In all, eight players tallied points in the win. May, Kessel, Schoullis and Brausen all tallied two points, while Downey, Erickson, Davis and Terry tallied one. Rätty finished the game with 26 saves and was the third star of the game.
- On the season, Minnesota has scored 20 power-play goals in 87 chances for 23.0%. Minnesota has also killed off 95 of 103 penalties for a 92.2 penalty-kill percent. Minnesota ranks first in the WCHA in penalty-kill, while trailing only No. 1 Wisconsin on the power-play. The Gophers hold the nation's third-best penalty-kill and fourth-best power-play percentage.
- Minnesota hosts in-state rival Minnesota Duluth next weekend. The Gophers will play UMD at 7 p.m. next Friday and 4 p.m. next Saturday. UMD swept the Gophers, 3-2 and 4-2 at the end of October.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 4-ranked Bulldogs, idle since Dec. 11 when they closed down the historic Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center with a series split against No. 8 North Dakota, will be back in action Jan. 14-15 when they face Minnesota at Ridder Arena for the first time since clinching the 2010 NCAA national championship on the Gophers' home ice.
- UMD is 23-26-5 against Minnesota all-time, the only program in the nation the Bulldogs are sub-.500 against, although UMD has won the last six meetings between the two squads.
- Senior goalie Kim Martin has 62 career victories – three shy of tying UMD's career wins record of 65.
- Senior blueliner Jocelyn Larocque is tied as the No. 1 scoring defenseman in UMD's history with 90 career points (15g, 75a) in 111 games after her third period goal last Friday. Larocque is ranked No. 3 in the NCAA among leading-scoring blueliners and first in the WCHA with 15 points (5g, 10a) in 16 skates.
- Haley Irwin continues to stay on or next to the top of the NCAA scoring chart, ranking No. 2 with a 2.25 points per game average after scoring 36 points (17g, 19a) in 16 outings. Irwin is on an eight-game scoring streak that began back on Oct. 30. Over her last eight skates, Irwin has compiled nine goals and 15 assists for 24 games, and all eight games have been WCHA outings.
- Jessica Wong has scored in five consecutive outings (4g, 3a).
- UMD leaves the DECC with a 159-33-15 all-time mark for a .803 winning percentage. The Bulldogs, who won two NCAA national titles, one WCHA Playoff Championship and two WCHA Regular season titles at the DECC, will move into AMSOIL Arena this week. UMD will play its first game in the \$80 million rink against Wisconsin on Jan. 21.
- University of Minnesota Duluth sophomores Wong, Mariia Posa and Jennifer Harss spent last week in Switzerland for the 2011 MLP Cup, while their Bulldog counterparts are back on the ice to get the second-half of the 2010-11 season underway. Suiing up for Canada's National Women's Under-22 Team, Wong won her second MLP gold in as many

years. Defenseman Posa played for Finland while Harss suited up for Team Germany.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks (6-13-3 overall, 5-10-1-0 WCHA) were swept by Minnesota for the second time this season last weekend (Jan. 7-8).
- The Mavericks have not earned a victory since Nov. 13 at Ohio State and are 0-8-2 in their last 10 games.
- This past weekend, the Mavericks were outshot by Minnesota, 72-45 and outscored, 9-1. The Mavericks committed nine penalties for 18 minutes to Minnesota's 11 penalties for 22 minutes.
- Junior forward Moria O'Connor tallied MSU's only goal of the Jan. 7-8 weekend and was assisted by sophomore forward Lauren Smith.
- Junior goaltender Alli Altmann finished with 63 saves and nine goals allowed against Minnesota, with a .875 save percentage and a 4.50 GAA in her 120:00 minutes of play.
- In the series opener at Minneapolis, Minnesota State was blanked, 4-0. The Gophers were able to net the opening goal at the 12:02 mark when rookie forward Sarah Davis tossed the puck towards the net, and the puck then deflected off a MSU defenseman and past Altmann. Minnesota did not wait long to tally its second goal. Golden Gopher junior Sarah Erickson found the back of the net 36 seconds into the second period. The Gophers added a third goal at the 12:19 mark of the second frame when Amanda Kessel beat Altmann top shelf. At the 2:15 mark of the third period the Gophers added a fourth goal, scored by shots senior forward Laura May. Minnesota finished with 39 to MSU's 18, and the Gophers went 2-for-5 on the power-play, while the Mavericks went 0-for-5. Altmann finished with 35 saves while Minnesota's netminder Noora Raty finished with 18. In the series finale, Minnesota defeated Minnesota State 5-1 last Saturday. Minnesota used a couple of even-strength tallies to take a 2-0 lead after the first frame. Kessel tallied the opening goal at the 9:51 mark and the second was scored by junior center Jen Schoullis at the 14:28 mark. The Mavericks pulled within one goal 7:35 into the second period when Smith gained possession of the puck behind the net, found O'Connor shot the puck off of Gopher blueliner Sam Downey's skate and past Raty for the score. The Gophers didn't wait long to jump back out to a two-goal lead. At the 12:09 mark of the second, May ripped a slapper from the slot that beat Altmann stick side. May added another at the 16:01 mark, putting Minnesota up, 4-1. Kelly Terry added the final goal for Minnesota, which outshot the Mavericks, 33-27. Altmann finished with 28 saves, while Raty stopped 26 shots.
- Freshman forward Kathleen Rogan leads the Mavericks in points this season with 10-7=17. Senior forward Nina Tikkinen sits second on the team with 5-7=12. Smith has tallied 11 points (3g, 8a) and O'Connor eight (5g, 3a). Three Mavericks have tallied six points: junior forward Emmi Leinonen (3-3=6), sophomore forward Lauren Zrust (3-3=6) and freshman forward Tracy McCann (3-3=6) are owners of six points. Two icers own five points on the year including junior blueliner Jackie Otto (5a) and rookie defenseman Nicole Germaine (1g, 4a).
- Rogan's 10 goals is a team-best, while Smith's eight assists are team-bests. Leinonen leads the team in power-play goals with two while McCann owns a team-best two game-winning goals. Smith and Rogan each own one shorthanded goal and two unassisted goals, team-bests. Tikkinen also owns one shorthanded goal. Smith has tallied a team-high 62 shots, while Rogan has taken 59 shots.
- Smith is the owner of a team-best +7 and freshman defenseman Danielle Scholzen has a +2 rating, second best on the team.
- Rookie netminder Danielle Butters owns a team-best .583 winning percentage while Altmann owns team-bests in all other goaltender categories: 2.86 goals-against average, .899 save percentage, 391 saves and one shutout.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (10-7-3 overall, 8-6-2 WCHA) return to conference play this weekend with a weekend series against Bemidji State. Saturday's game will be played at Rams Sports Center in Roseau, Minn., before concluding the series at the Ralph Engelstad Arena on Sunday.
- With all eight teams now having played 16 games in conference play, the Sioux dropped to fifth place with 26 points, which is three behind this weekend's opponent in the fourth-place Beavers.
- The Fighting Sioux opened the 2011 calendar year with a non-conference series at Vermont last Friday and Saturday. UND opened the series with a 4-1 win before settling for 3-3 tie in the finale. UND outshot the Catamounts 80-37 in the series.
- Sophomore forward Monique Lamoureux-Kolls scored her 100th career point last Friday as she scored a hat trick and added an assist collecting a point on all four UND scores. Sophomore Jocelyne Lamoureux scored the fourth goal for the Sioux, which was the game-winner. Junior netminder Stephanie Ney allowed a goal on a 3-on-2 rush only one minute into the game and on UVM's first shot, but stopped all 11 shots the rest of the way to improve to 6-2-2 on the season. She now has a 1.97 goals-against average and a .946 save percentage.
- Junior Alyssa Wiebe moved within three points of the program's all-time leading point scorer with the game's first goal last Saturday, a shorthanded effort. Lamoureux-Kolls would add her fourth and fifth of the weekend with two goals in the third period, but after each UND goal the Catamounts were able to answer with the last coming with only 22 seconds remaining and their goalie pulled.
- The Fighting Sioux concluded the first half of the season with a program-record eight conference wins and a .563 conference winning percentage.
- Through the first half of the season, the Sioux had the hardest strength of schedule with 12 of their 18 games against top-10 ranked teams going 6-5-1 in those games. According to USCHO.com, UND's strength of schedule was a 251.7 with Minnesota Duluth second at 204.6.
- Sophomore Jocelyne Lamoureux ranks fifth in the nation averaging 1.00 goals per game.
- Wiebe is only three points shy of the program record of 78 career points as a member of the Sioux. She has 28 goals (eight shy of the program record) and 47 assists (holds the record).

Ohio State Buckeyes

- The No. 10 Buckeyes dropped both games in a home series against No. 1 Wisconsin, Jan. 7-8 at the OSU Ice Rink.
- Ohio State scored twice in the third period to erase the shutout last Friday for a 6-2 final. On Saturday, the Buckeyes scored twice to tie the game, including at 3-3 score early in the third period, but the Badgers regained the lead and then tacked on an empty-netter for the 5-3 win. The Buckeyes conclude their season series with Wisconsin at 0-4-0.
- In the first game, just when the Buckeyes should have been at their toughest point of the game, trailing 6-0 and killing off a 5:00 minute penalty, they buckled down and not only held top-ranked Wisconsin scoreless on the power-play but scored two shorthanded goals. The two shorthanded goals were Ohio State's first of the season. They also were the first career SHG scored by Paige Semenza and Hokey Langan. In the second game vs Wisconsin, Ohio State was inches away from overtime. Down a goal with under a minute left and an extra skater on the ice, the Buckeyes set up in the UW zone and a slap shot by defenseman Kelly Wild pinged off the crossbar. It was a back-and-forth game throughout with the Buckeyes battling back twice to tie the score. Freshman goaltender Lisa Steffes stood on her head and made several outstanding saves, finishing with 42 overall. On the other end of the ice, junior Melissa Feste tied her career high with two goals. Langan tallied the other OSU goal.
- Feste entered the game with one goal this season. It was her third two-goal game in her career and first since last January vs. Robert Morris. Feste is the fourth Buckeye to score multiple goals in a game this season.
- Senior defenseman Shannon Reilly set up the second and third Buckeye

goals. It was her second multiple-assist game of the year. She ranks third on the Buckeyes with 11 assists and leads the WCHA overall in defenseman scoring with 16 points.

- Sophomore forward Minttu Tuominen led the Buckeyes with six blocked shots in the UW series. Ohio State blocked a total of 35 shots in the two games.
- Steffes totaled 73 saves in the series (31 last Friday and 42 Saturday). She has made 30-plus saves in 12 games and has five games with over 40 saves. Steffes leads the NCAA with 659 saves this season and is one of only three goalies in the nation with over 600 saves. She also leads in the NCAA in minutes played at 1334:50. In the second game, Steffes stopped 13 shots alone from top WCHA goal-scorer Hilary Knight.
- Langan has scored a goal in each of the last three games and in four of the last five. Langan moved to seventh in Ohio State's WCHA-only records with 31 goals against conference opponents. With two goals against the Badgers, she passed Tessa Bonhomme (2004-08).
- Semenza has three goals and four points overall in the last four games. She had five points the first 18 games of the season.
- The OSU penalty-kill was good on 6-of-7 chances vs Wisconsin, including the 5:00 major, and scored twice. The power-play was 1-of-5, scoring on its lone chance Saturday.
- Ohio State was without point leader Laura McIntosh and top goal-scorer Natalie Spooner as well as freshman defenseman Annie Svedin for the Badger series. The three faced off in the championship game of the MLP Cup Saturday in Switzerland with the McIntosh and Spooner on the Canadian Under-22 Team winning gold and Svedin earning silver with the Swedish National Team.
- Up next, the Buckeyes travel to Minnesota State for a WCHA series Jan. 14-15. Games begin at 7 p.m. (CT) Friday and 3 p.m. Saturday at All Seasons Arena in Mankato. Ohio State is looking for a little revenge as the Mavericks came to Columbus and swept the Buckeyes by scores of 5-3 and 4-3, Nov. 12-13. Langan had four goals in that series and McIntosh had four assists. Reilly also had three points on a goal and two assists.

St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (0-20-1, 0-15-1-1 WCHA) dropped two games to Bemidji State by identical 3-1 scores on both Friday and Saturday, Jan. 7-8, in the National Hockey Center. The Huskies were led by rookie forward Sydney Burghardt who dished out two helpers in the weekend series. Forwards Julia Gilbert and Haylea Schmid carded the two goals for SCSU against the Beavers. Senior netminder Ashley Nixon backstopped the Huskies with 53 saves in the two losses.
- The Beavers have now defeated the Huskies the last six straight meetings, dating back to the first round of the 2010 WCHA Playoffs. SCSU continues to lead the all-time series however over BSU, 28-22-7, dating back to Jan. 22, 1999.
- On a brighter note, St. Cloud State assistant women's hockey coach Jennifer Kranz, along with future Husky Abby Ness, were members of the U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team which captured the gold medal at the 2011 International Ice Hockey Federation World Women's U18 Championship on Saturday, Jan. 8, with a 5-2 win over Canada at Stora Mossen Arena. Team USA finished the tournament undefeated with a 5-0-0-0 record to claim its third world title in four years.
- St. Cloud State will head to Madison for a two-game tilt at the #1-ranked University of Wisconsin on Friday and Sunday, Jan. 14 & 16, at the Kohl Center. Friday night's game is slated for 7:07 pm. Both teams will take Saturday off from action and complete the weekend series on Sunday at 2:07 pm in the Kohl. The Badgers lead the all-time series over SCSU, 39-7-2, dating back to Oct. 29, 1999. Earlier this season Wisconsin swept the Huskies by scores of 5-0 and 6-1 on Dec. 10-11 in the NHC.

Wisconsin Badgers

- The No. 1 Badgers (20-2-0, 14-2-0 WCHA) return to action at the Kohl Center when they host St. Cloud State (0-20-1, 0-15-1 WCHA) this weekend. Friday's game begins at 7 p.m., and the teams conclude the series at 2 p.m. Sunday.
- Wisconsin owns a 39-7-2 all-time record against St. Cloud State. The Badgers swept the Huskies on the road in St. Cloud, Minn., Dec. 10-11, with a 5-0 shutout win and a 6-1 victory. The teams split two series, 2-2-0, last season. The last meeting between UW and SCSU at the Kohl Center saw St. Cloud State earn a 4-3 win on Jan. 23, 2010.
- Wisconsin extended its winning streak to eight games with a road sweep of No. 10 Ohio State in Columbus last weekend, winning 6-2 and 5-3. The line of Brianna Decker, Meghan Duggan and Hilary Knight combined for 15 points on the weekend with five each, and Alex Rigsby improved to 14-1-0 with two wins in net. The Badgers raced out to a 3-0 lead after the first period en route to Friday night's 6-2 victory over OSU. UW led 6-0 with 4:38 remaining, but the Buckeyes scored a pair of late shorthanded goals to spoil the shutout. Decker led the way with two goals and an assist, while Knight added a goal and a pair of assists. Rigsby stopped 25 of 27 shots to improve to 13-1 on the season. Wisconsin used a record-setting day from Knight to complete the sweep of Ohio State with a 5-3 win on Saturday. Knight scored twice to become Wisconsin's career goal-scoring leader, and Duggan led all players with three points. Rigsby made 27 saves for her sixth-straight win.
- This weekend, UW returns to the Kohl Center ice for the first time since dropping a 3-1 decision to Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 28. Wisconsin is 9-1-0 at home this season after opening the season with an eight-game home winning streak. The Badgers have a 114-23-12 (.805 winning percentage) all-time at the Kohl Center.
- Wisconsin's 5-3 victory over Ohio State (Jan. 8) marked the team's 20th win of the season. This year is the Badgers' 10th 20-win season in program history. UW last reached the 20-win platform in 2008-09, when the team finished 34-2-5. Head coach Mark Johnson's teams have secured at least 20 wins in each of his eight seasons leading the Badgers.
- Knight is Wisconsin's new career goal-scoring leader with 91 tallies. With three goals against OSU last weekend, she surpassed the previous record of 89 goals held by Jinelle Zaugg, who played at Wisconsin from 2004-08.
- Eight Badgers are currently riding point streaks, including three career-best marks. Duggan extended her career-best point streak to 18 games after tallying points in both of UW's games last weekend. Decker also continued her career-best streak to 13 straight games. Madison Packer is riding a career-high seven-game streak as well.
- Four Badgers won gold with Canada's National Women's Under-22 Team at the 2011 MLP Cup in Kreuzlingen, Switzerland last week. Mallory Deluce, Carolyne Prevost, Brittany Haverstock and Stefanie McKeough combined for 13 points on four goals and nine assists in four shutout wins for Canada. Prevost and Deluce led the way with five points apiece as Canada topped Sweden, 6-0, in the gold-medal game.
- Duggan, Knight and Decker all rank in the national top 10 in points per game, led by Duggan's third-ranked 2.09 points per game. Knight leads the nation with 1.18 goals per game, and Duggan is third with 1.23 assists per game. Duggan also owns the national lead with seven power-play goals; Brooke Ammerman is tied for second with six power-play scores. Prevost and Duggan are tied for second in the country with two short-handed goals each as well. Decker is tied for the national lead with seven game-winning goals. Brittany Ammerman ranks 11th in the nation among rookies with 0.82 points per game. Rigsby leads the country with a .933 winning percentage at 14-1-0. She is 18th with a 2.09 goals-against average and is tied for 26th with a .914 save percentage.
- As a team, the Badgers are second in the nation with 5.27 goals per game, and UW is eighth in the country in scoring defense, allowing 1.91 goals per game. The Badgers rank second with a +3.36 scoring margin in 22 games. UW leads the nation with a 25.6 power-play percentage (23-of-90).

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
