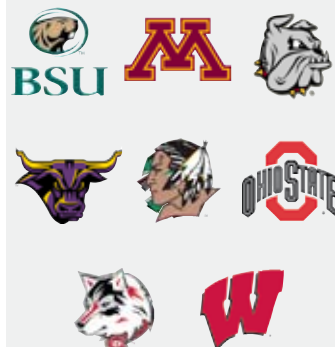

MADISON, Wis. – Top-ranked and league-leading Wisconsin will take a 10-game winning streak into Duluth this weekend as the two teams which have won the last five Division 1 national championships will make history by playing the first game by a Minnesota Duluth women's hockey team in new AMSOIL Arena (6,764) on Friday (Jan. 21) night. Face-off is 7:07 pm CT. The two rivals will then conclude their series on Saturday (Jan. 22) at 7:07 pm CT.

The Badgers (22-2-0, 16-2-0 WCHA) vs Bulldogs (12-6-2, 10-6-2 WCHA) series highlights a full slate of four Western Collegiate Hockey Association series set for Friday and Saturday, Jan. 21-22. In Columbus, Ohio State (12-10-2, 6-10-2-2 WCHA) will host Minnesota (16-6-1, 11-6-1-1 WCHA) at the OSU Ice Rink (800) at 7:07 pm ET Friday and 4:07 pm ET Saturday. At the National Hockey Center (5,371) in St. Cloud, St. Cloud State (0-22-1, 0-17-1-1 WCHA) will take on North Dakota (12-7-3, 10-6-2 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday. will entertain Minnesota State (6-15-3, 5-12-1 WCHA) in a pair of 2:07 pm CT matinees on Friday and Saturday.

The marquee matchup in the WCHA this week is definitely in Duluth where the defending national champions play their first game in the new \$80 million rink which opened in late December. The Bulldogs were 159-34-15 all-time for a .803 winning percentage in the DECC (Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center), where Minnesota Duluth also won two NCAA titles on its home ice.

Both the Badgers, who won national titles in 2006, 2007 and 2009, and the sixth-ranked Bulldogs, who won national crowns in 2008 and 2010, are contenders to win another WCHA crown, but UW is in the driver's seat after putting together 10 straight wins. The Badgers are 16-2-0 in WCHA play with 48 points, 13 points ahead of second place Minnesota and 16 better than UMD with 10 league games (or 30 points) still to be played by each team.

Wisconsin and Minnesota Duluth split two games in Madison over Thanksgiving weekend. The Badgers scored in the final :25 seconds of regulation and took a 3-2 overtime victory in the series opener on Nov. 26 while UMD came back and took a 3-1 victory in the series finale on Nov. 28. Minnesota Duluth leads the all-time series against Wisconsin with a 26-20-9 record and went 2-1-1 against the Badgers last season. In the 53 games between the two teams, there have only been seven shutouts while 18 games have gone to overtime.

Defending WCHA co-champion Minnesota, sporting a 12-2-0 mark since early November and in the midst of a seven-game unbeaten streak at 6-0-1, is 2-0 vs Ohio State this season after 6-0 and 2-1 (ot) wins in Minneapolis on Dec. 10 and 12.

North Dakota, currently on a five-game unbeaten streak at 4-0-1, is 2-0 vs St. Cloud State this season by virtue of 6-3 and 6-1 victories in Grand Forks on Nov. 19-20.

Bemidji State, meanwhile, stands 1-0-1 vs Minnesota State this season. The Beavers won 2-1 (ot) in Mankato on Dec. 10 followed by a 1-1 (ot) tie on Dec. 11, with BSU claiming the shootout, 2-1.

The current WCHA standings show Wisconsin on top with 48 points and a 16-2-0 league mark, Minnesota (16-6-1-1 WCHA) in second place with 35 points, and Minnesota Duluth (10-6-2-0 WCHA) and North Dakota (10-6-2 WCHA) tied for third with 32 points each. Bemidji State (8-5-3-2 WCHA) is in fifth place with 29 points with Ohio State (6-10-2-2 WCHA) standing sixth with 22 points. Minnesota State (5-12-1 WCHA) is in seventh place with 16 points and St. Cloud State (0-17-1-1 WCHA) is eighth with two points.

In conference action last weekend (Jan. 14-15), Wisconsin extended its winning streak to 10 games by defeating St. Cloud State twice, 10-0 and 6-0 in Madison. Hilary Knight had eight points (5 goals, 3 assists) and Meghan Duggan and Madison Packer each had four points (2 goals, 2 assists) in the series. The second game of the series

drew 3,854 fans to the Kohl Center.

At Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, host Minnesota took five of six points from Minnesota Duluth and went into second place. The teams tied 2-2 (ot) last Friday with the Golden Gophers winning the shootout. Sophomore goaltender Noora Rätty then made 31 saves and freshman forward Amanda Kessel posted two assists to lead UM to a 3-0 triumph last Saturday afternoon.

In Grand Forks last Sunday, sophomore Jocelyne Lamoureux, junior Alyssa Wiebe and sophomore Holly Perkins each scored two goals to help North Dakota complete a weekend sweep against Bemidji State with a 6-2 win at Ralph Engelstad Arena. Monique Lamoureux-Kolls, playing defense exclusively for the first time, had five points in the series, which began Saturday in Roseau, Minn. In that game, played at Rams Sports Center, the Sioux took a 5-2 victory from the Beavers as Lamoureux-Kolls had two of UND's four first period goals.

And at All Seasons Arena in Mankato last weekend, visiting Ohio State swept Minnesota State in a pair of 3-2 games. On Jan. 14, juniors Laura McIntosh and Natalie Spooner scored twice in the final 5:00 to score a come from behind win over the Mavericks. Spooner's unassisted game-winner with :72 seconds remaining was the 100th point of her collegiate career. Then on Jan. 15, junior forward Laura McIntosh scored at 11:13 of the third period to lift OSU to another one-goal win over MSU.

In this week's (Jan. 18) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll four of the WCHA's eight-member teams are ranked in the top ten while two others also received votes. Wisconsin is at No. 1, Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 4, Minnesota is No. 7 and North Dakota is No. 8. Also receiving votes were Bemidji State and Ohio State.

Looking ahead to next weekend, Friday (Jan. 28) and Saturday (Jan. 29) the four WCHA series on the docket will feature Minnesota at Wisconsin, Bemidji State at Minnesota Duluth, Ohio State at St. Cloud State, and Minnesota State at North Dakota.

There are five weeks remaining in the 2010-11 regular season and all games played will be league games. Through games of Jan. 17, the eight WCHA-member women's teams are a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play for a .671 winning percentage.

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play. In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

### 2011 WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Tournament

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27 with four, first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will all host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams. The No. 1 seed hosting the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed hosting the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed hosting the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed hosting the No. 5 seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which is set for March 4-5.

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday, with face-offs at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. The championship contest will then be played at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

From the north or south, take I-35W to the University Avenue exit and travel southeast to Oak Street. Turn left on Oak Street and travel one block north to Fourth Street.

From the west, take I-94 to 35W North and follow the above directions.

From the east, take I-94 to the Huron Boulevard exit. Follow Huron Boulevard north until it turns into Fourth Street at the intersection of Oak Street.

General parking is available in the Gopher lot across Oak Street from Mariucci Arena.

## WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

### Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers (8-7-3-2 WCHA 10-9-3 overall) return home after three straight weekends on the road to host Minnesota State.
- Earlier this season the Beavers took five out of six points from the Mavericks in Mankato over the Dec. 10-11 weekend in a series that saw two overtime games. In the first game of the weekend BSU came back after giving up the first goal of the game to claim an overtime victory. Montana Vichorek scored the game-winner just :56 seconds into the extra period. In the following game the two teams battled to a 1-1 draw after regulation and even after an overtime period no victor emerged. In the shootout, BSU's Erin Cody and Emily Erickson lifted the Beavers to the extra point.
- Overall the Beavers are 18-20-10 all time against Minnesota State. In the past eight meetings between the two teams, BSU a 5-0-3 record.
- Last weekend, the Beavers dropped two games to No. 8 North Dakota. The Lamoureux twins combined for nine points as the Beavers lost by scores of 5-2 and 6-2. The first game, played in Roseau, Minn., was a physical one with 34 penalty minutes in the game. The Sioux scored four goals in a 20-minute span to put the game out of reach. Annie Bauerfeld scored a shorthander for the Beavers in the first period while Erickson scored the final goal for BSU in the second period on the power-play. Marlee Wheelhouse and Erin Johnson assisted on Bauerfeld's goal, while Bauerfeld and Vichorek assisted on Erickson's. The next night in Grand Forks, the Sioux scored two goals each period to down the Beavers 6-2. Bauerfeld scored the first goal for BSU again, this time in the second period. In the waning minutes of the game BSU added a power-play goal from Cody. Tess Dusik picked up her second collegiate point assisting on Bauerfeld's goal, while Bauerfeld and Erin Johnson assisted on Cody's goal. The Beavers' special teams played well on the weekend, going 2-of-10 on the power-play and a perfect 7-for-7 on the penalty-kill.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Erickson has scored 31 of the 43 goals this year and have tallied 31 of the 76 assists so far. Cody leads the three with 14 goals and 14 assists, while Erickson has 12 goals and nine assists. Lundquist has five goals and eight assists. The trio has accounted for 62 of the 119 total points.
- Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova has made 480 saves so far this season. In 19 games she has recorded a .925 save percentage and a 2.15 goals-against average.
- Since starting the new year, Bauerfeld has had a hand in eight of the 10 goals scored by the Beavers. She has scored three and assisted on five. Against No. 8 UND, Bauerfeld had a hand in all four BSU goals, scoring two herself. In St. Cloud against the Huskies, Bauerfeld scored one goal and tallied three assists on the weekend to help the Beavers sweep SCSU.
- In WCHA games only, Bemidji State is ranked first with a 90.5% penalty-kill. They haven't allowed a power-play goal in 24-straight penalties, spanning to the Dec. 4 game against Minnesota.
- Also in conference games only, the Beavers are ranked third on the power-play having scored 12 goals on 63 opportunities (19%).

### Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 5 Golden Gophers (16-6-1 overall, 11-6-1-1 WCHA) earned five of six possible points over the Jan. 14-15 weekend as the Gophers tied (won shootout) and defeated Minnesota Duluth to move into second place in the WCHA standings.
- Minnesota scored three times in the third period to earn a 3-0 win over UMD last Saturday. Bethany Brausen broke the scoreless tie when she scored on her own rebound at 2:02 in the second period. Sarah Erickson scored her 11th goal of the season when she capitalized on a Gopher three-on-one odd-man rush at 5:44 in the second. Kelly Terry added her 10th goal of the season when she scored on a five-on-three power-play opportunity at 12:35 in the third. Kessel had the first shot, which was saved, while Terry added the rebound attempt. Anne Schleper held the second assist. Rätty stopped 14 shots in the first, eight in the second and

nine in the third for 31 saves. Of her 31 saves, 11 came on the Gopher penalty kill. With her eight shutouts, it ties Jody Horak's school record of shutouts in a season, set in 2004-05. Rätty now has 15 shutouts in her career.

- In last Friday's game, Erickson netted the first goal of the game when she tipped in a Megan Bozek shot at 7:55 in the first period. UMD's Brienna Gillanders scored her sixth power-play goal of the season to knot the game back at 1-1 and a tie. Jen Schoullis put the Gophers ahead when she scored on a rebound attempt at 12:50 in the second period. Katherine Wilson scored the Bulldogs' second power-play goal of the game and sent the game into overtime. In the overtime, Minnesota did not have a shot on goal and Rätty had five saves in the extra stanza to stop the Bulldogs. With the tie, the Gophers and Bulldogs each had three shooters set for the shootout. Kessel went first for the Gophers and scored. Jamie Kenyon for UMD went next and buried the puck past Rätty to tie it up. Erickson was the Gophers' next shooter and was stuffed by UMD's Jennifer Harss. UMD sent out Jessica Wong, who was also stopped by Rätty. Schleper was the Gophers' last shooter. She skated down and rifled a nice wrist shot past Harss. Down to the last shooter, UMD sent out Audrey Cournoyer. She went down deep, but Rätty poked the puck out of the way and stopped her without even get a shot off as the Gophers earned the shootout win.
- Last Friday's game (vs UMD) was the second time this season the Gophers competed in overtime and the first in a shootout. Since the adoption of the shootout in 2008-09, the Gophers are 5-2. Minnesota's longest shootout came against Bemidji State last year in Bemidji (Jan. 16, 2010) in six rounds. Minnesota's last loss in the shootout was against St. Cloud State (2/12/10). Minnesota is also 2-0 against UMD. The Gophers' previous UMD shootout win came on Jan. 24, 2009 in three rounds. Minnesota is now 1-0-1 on the season in overtime, defeating Ohio State, Dec. 12 in a 2-1 win.
- After a rough month to start the season, the Golden Gophers have gone 12-2 since the start of November. During that span, Minnesota split with Wisconsin (11/5-6) and Bemidji State (12/3-4), swept Minnesota State (twice), Harvard and Ohio State.
- After a two-week home stint, the Gophers hit the road for two weeks when they travel to Ohio State and Wisconsin. The Gophers visit Columbus, Ohio on Jan. 21-22, while traveling to Madison, Wis., Jan. 28-29.
- Minnesota's next home series will be Feb. 4-5 when St. Cloud State comes to Ridder Arena.

### Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 6 Bulldogs managed to earn just one point over the weekend against Minnesota, earning a 2-2 tie last Friday night before dropping the shootout, only to be held scoreless on Saturday 3-0. The loss snapped a seven-game unbeaten streak the Bulldogs had against Minnesota, dating back to Feb. 5, 2010.
- UMD battled from behind to a 2-2 tie against the Gophers last Friday night at Ridder Arena, before surrendering the extra WCHA point in the shootout. The Bulldogs are now 0-1-2 in overtime games this season, and 0-2 in league shootouts. Jennifer Harss picked up the tie for UMD; Harss is now 5-2-1 against Minnesota and 5-0-1 in her last six skates against the Gophers.
- Last Saturday's 3-0 loss was the second shutout the Bulldogs have suffered this season, and the second game in a row UMD found themselves outshot in a contest. The Bulldogs were 0-of-8 on the power-play; UMD has been unable to score a goal with an extra skater in three of its last four games, now having gone just 2-of-29 on the power-play over those four outings.
- Last Saturday's start by goaltender Kim Martin marked the first time Martin has been in net inside Ridder Arena since Oct. 27, 2007.
- The Bulldogs are now 23-27-6 all-time against Minnesota.
- All four Bulldog players who had scoring streaks intact prior to the Minnesota series were held scoreless in both games, with the exception

of Pernilla Winberg, who had an assist in last Friday's skate.

- Junior Haley Irwin, who was held scoreless in only her second and third games on the year, was also held scoreless in the first back-to-back games of the season. Irwin had an eight-game scoring streak prior to last Friday's contest, and had run up 24 points (9g, 15a) in those eight outings.
- While the Gophers snapped Irwin's streak, however, they also helped Laura Fridfinnson break her career-tying long six game scoreless streak. Fridfinnson, the 11th highest scoring player in UMD history, picked up an assist in last Friday night's draw. The converted defenseman has two assists in her last 15 games.
- Rookie Brienna Gillanders, who currently ranks No. 3 in the nation with six power-play tallies, is the eighth UMD freshman to have ever scored six power-play goals. With 11 total points and all six of her scores coming with the extra skater, Gillanders joins present teammates Pernilla Winberg (seven) and Fridfinnson (eight) who are the only currently rostered players who notched six or more power-play goals as rookies.
- Besides facing No. 1 Wisconsin this weekend in Duluth, the Bulldogs (26-19-9 all-time vs the Badgers), will make history by playing the first game by a UMD women's hockey team ever in AMSOIL Arena on Friday night. The new \$80 million rink opened in late December. The Bulldogs were 159-34-15 for a .803 winning percentage in the DECC, where UMD also won two NCAA titles on its home ice.

## Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks (6-15-3 overall, 5-12-1-0 WCHA) were swept in two games by Ohio State by identical 3-2 scores last weekend. MSU swept the Buckeyes on the road earlier this season.
- The Mavericks have not earned a victory since 11/13 at Ohio State and are 0-10-2 in their last 12 games.
- This past weekend, the Mavericks were outshot by Ohio State, 57-53 and both the Mavericks and Buckeyes each committed four penalties for eight minutes.
- Freshman Kelsie Scott recorded her first career goal, senior blueliner Amy Udvig recorded her first goal of the season, sophomore forward Lauren Smith fourth goal of the season and freshman forward Tracy McCann.
- Freshman netminder Danielle Butters started last Friday's game and finished with 23 saves, three goals allowed, and a .885 save percentage while junior goaltender Alli Altmann finished with 28 saves, three goals allowed and a .903 save percentage.
- In the series opener vs OSU last Friday, Minnesota State held a 2-1 lead heading into the third period, but the Buckeyes tallied two late goals to down MSU, 3-2. McCann put the Mavericks up by a 1-0 count 11:26 into the first period. Ohio State knotted things up at the 16:05 mark of the first when the Buckeyes forced a turnover in the neutral zone and a cross ice pass from junior Melissa Feste to junior Natalie Spooner set Spooner up for the goal. After Ohio State committed the first penalty of the game, Smith deflected a shot from junior Emmi Leinonen putting MSU up, OSU junior center Laura McIntoch tied the game with an unassisted goal at 15:28 of the third. The Mavericks again turned the puck over, this time in the neutral zone, allowing Spooner to skate in for the unassisted game-winner at 18:48 mark of the third. MSU finished the contest 1-for-2 with an extra skater, while Ohio State went 0-for-2. Ohio State netminder Lisa Steffes finished with a game-high 28 saves and Butters finished with 23.
- In the series finale vs Ohio State, Minnesota State held a 1-0 lead heading into the third period last Saturday and again saw the game slip away. After a scoreless first period, Scott tallied her first goal at the 5:08 mark of the second. OSU knotted the game as sophomore center Kim Theut beat Altmann at the 1:37 mark of the third. The Buckeyes then took the lead at the 4:27 mark when senior defensemen Shannon Reilly beat Altmann. Down one goal and 10:41 into the third period, Udvig ripped a slapper from the top of the left circle that tied the game at two goals. Ohio State then stole MSU's momentum less than a minute later, at the 11:13 mark, when OSU points leader Laura McIntosh scored the

game-winning goal. Both teams went 0-for-2 on the power-play. Altmann finished with a game-high 28 saves for the Mavericks, while the Buckeyes' Steffes stopped 21 MSU shots.

## North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (12-7-3 overall, 10-6-2 WCHA) skated to 5-2 and 6-2 victories over Bemidji State to extend their unbeaten streak to five games this past weekend.
- The Sioux opened the series hosting the Beavers at the Rams Sports Center in Roseau, Minn., in front of 725 fans before returning to the Ralph Engelstad Arena for the series finale. It was the first game at the REA for the Sioux since Dec. 5.
- Alyssa Wiebe led the Sioux with three goals this past weekend and added one assist for four points and was a +3. In last Sunday's 6-2 win, the junior scored twice to reach 79 career points – the most anyone has scored while wearing a Sioux uniform to become UND's all-time leading point scorer. She beat Melissa Jaques' (2005-09) previous point record of 78.
- Monique Lamoureux-Kolls led the Sioux with five points vs BSU, off two goals and three assists, and was also a +7 in her first weekend playing exclusively as a defenseman. Last Saturday, the sophomore scored two goals and one assist, including the first goal of the game which came unassisted. Last Sunday, Lamoureux-Kolls was a +5 and dished out two assists.
- It was the first home games for sophomore Holly Perkins since returning to the line-up after Christmas break and she had a three-point weekend. In her first game back playing in the Ralph Engelstad Arena she scored two goals including the first goal of the game.
- Jocelyne Lamoureux had two goals and two assists moving her within two points of 100 for her career. Her sister, Lamoureux-Kolls, scored her 100th career point Jan. 7 against Vermont.
- The Sioux had 11 skaters that were a +2 or higher vs BSU.
- Junior netminder Stephanie Ney started both games vs BSU, improving to 8-2-2 on the season and moving within one win of the single-season program record of nine wins. She now has a 1.97 goals-against average and a .925 save percentage.
- The Sioux are currently tied with defending national champion Minnesota Duluth for third place in the WCHA, just three points back of second-place Minnesota.
- The 11 goals scored by UND – and the six in one game – were both program bests against conference rival Bemidji State. It is also the most goals a team has scored against the Beavers in a two-game series this season.
- Extending their unbeaten streak to five games at 4-0-1, the Sioux tied their longest streak since they joined the WCHA in 2004. The program record unbeaten streak is six games. UND will try to reach that against St. Cloud State this weekend.

## Ohio State Buckeyes

- The Buckeyes posted two come-from-behind victories to sweep Minnesota State in a road series Jan. 14-15 at All Seasons Arena in Mankato, Minn. The Buckeyes won both games by scores of 3-2. The games were Ohio State's first wins this season after trailing at the second intermission (2-6-1).
- Ohio State, who entered the series tied with the Mavericks in the conference standings, picked up six much needed points in the WCHA.
- It was also a little revenge for an earlier matchup this season in which Minnesota State came to Columbus and won both games.
- The Buckeyes picked up their first sweep of a WCHA opponent since mid-October.
- Ohio State and Minnesota State split their season series at 2-2-0. The Buckeyes are 19-3-2 in Mankato and lead the all-time series with MSU at 39-9-4.
- OSU is now 12-4-0 when scoring three or more goals and 12-2-2 when allowing three or fewer goals.
- Down 2-1 in the third period the first game, Ohio State scored twice in

the last 5:00 minutes to rally for the win. Junior forward Natalie Spooner tallied the game-winner with 1:12 left in regulation to pick up her 100th career point after opening the scoring for the Buckeyes in the first period. Junior forward Laura McIntosh scored the game-tying goal with just 4:32 left in regulation. It was the first WCHA win for the Buckeyes since Nov. 27 (3-1 vs. Bemidji State). Spooner became the seventh Buckeye to reach the 100-point milestone. She is the second player to reach it this year as McIntosh also collected her 100th point. Spooner is the second-fastest Buckeye to 100 points, reaching it in 81 games - just one behind McIntosh.

- The next day, the Buckeyes rallied once again from a one-goal deficit in the third period for the 3-2 victory to complete the sweep of Minnesota State. Trailing 1-0 with 20 minutes to play, the Buckeyes came back in the opening five minutes of the third period. Junior forward Kim Theut evened things up 1:37 into the stanza then senior Shannon Reilly gave OSU its first lead at 4:27. The Mavericks battled back to tie the score again at 10:41, but just :32 seconds later, the Buckeyes regained the lead for the final time when McIntosh buried the puck on a one-timer
- Spooner moved into third in the Ohio State career goals category with 62. She now owns the Buckeye record for career game-winning goals with 11.
- Hokey Langan missed her first collegiate game last Saturday with an injury.
- Reilly tied her career-high for goals in a season with her sixth of the year.
- McIntosh tallied her 10th multiple-point game of the season. It was her third game-winning goal.
- Goaltender Lisa Steffes surpassed the 700-save total with 708. She is one of only two goalies in the nation to stop more than 700 shots this year. Steffes stopped 28 shots last Friday and 21 last Saturday for a total of 49 against the Mavericks.
- Hollowell had a season-high and tied her career-high with two assists in game two. It was her second multi-point outing this year.
- Up next, Ohio State returns to Columbus to host No. 6 Minnesota in a WCHA series Jan. 21-22. Games begin at 7 p.m. this Friday and 4 p.m. this Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink and admission, as always, is free. The Buckeyes fell to the Gophers in Minneapolis Dec. 10 and 12. After a tough 6-0 shutout, Ohio State battled Minnesota into overtime the next game but lost 2-1.

## St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (0-22-1, 0-17-1-1 WCHA) were swept in a two-game series in the Kohl Center, losing 10-0 to top-ranked Wisconsin in the series opener and 6-0 on Jan. 16.
- On Friday, Jan. 14, the Badgers upended the Huskies by a score of 10-0. The last time St. Cloud State gave up 10 goals to an opponent was on Feb. 7, 2003, when the Huskies lost to Minnesota Duluth by a score of 3-10 in the National Hockey Center. St. Cloud State's senior netminder Ashley Nixon earned the start between the pipes on Friday evening and made nine saves (five goals against) in 14:56 before junior Tayler VanDenakker came in for relief. VanDenakker backstopped SCSU with 18 saves in 37:58 minutes (five goals against) of action. Sophomore red-shirt Anna Donlan made her first career appearance and made one save in 7:05.
- Last Sunday afternoon, St. Cloud State skated to nearly a scoreless period with the Badgers in the first frame until Wisconsin's Meghan Duggan netted her 21st goal of the season at the 17:56 mark of the period. The Badgers added to their lead in the second period, gathering tallies from Brittany Ammerman and Hilary Knight to give Wisconsin a commanding 3-0 lead heading into the locker room for the second intermission. Wisconsin's defense was also strong on Sunday as the Badgers held St. Cloud State to a mere one shot on net after 40 minutes of action. SCSU tied a school team record for the fewest shots on net in a second period with zero. The last time SCSU was held to zero shots in a second period was back on March 7, 1999 at Minnesota. The final period had Wisconsin written all over it as the Badgers went on to score three more unanswered goals

and cruise to the 6-0 shutout victory. SCSU did however manage to fire off nine shots in the final period to bring its game total to 10 shots. Nixon played all 60 minutes in the contest and backstopped SCSU with 46 saves in the loss. The Huskies were out-shot in the loss, 52-10.

- St. Cloud State will return home to face nationally-ranked North Dakota on Friday and Saturday, Jan. 21-22, at 7:07 pm both nights in the National Hockey Center. Earlier this season, UND swept the Huskies by scores of 6-3 and 6-1 on Nov. 19-20 at the Ralph Engelstad Arena.

## Wisconsin Badgers

- The No. 1-ranked Wisconsin Badgers (22-2-0, 16-2-0 WCHA) remained atop the WCHA as the Badgers completed a weekend series sweep over St. Cloud State and heads north for a series at No. 4 Minnesota Duluth (12-6-2, 10-6-2 WCHA) this weekend. The puck drops at 7 p.m. both Friday and Saturday nights, and the series marks the Bulldog women's first in the new AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn.
- Wisconsin owns a 20-26-9 all-time record against Minnesota Duluth. The teams split a series at the Kohl Center Nov. 26-28, with Wisconsin earning a 3-2 overtime win in Friday's game before falling 3-1 to the Bulldogs in the series finale Sunday. Wisconsin went 1-2-1 against UMD last season, and the last series in Duluth saw the Bulldogs sweep UW with a 5-3 win and a 2-1 victory.
- UW swept St. Cloud State, outscoring the Huskies 16-0 in two games last weekend. The Badgers extended their winning streak to 10 games with a 10-0 win on Friday and a 6-0 victory in the series finale on Sunday.
- Hilary Knight led the Badgers with eight points on five goals and three assists in the SCSU series, while Meghan Duggan and Madison Packer each tallied four points on two goals and two assists.
- After erupting for six goals in the first period last Friday, Wisconsin cruised to a 10-0 victory over St. Cloud State. Knight recorded her third hat trick of the season and led all players with five points as 11 Badgers recorded points and seven different players scored.
- Last Sunday saw Knight again lead the Badgers, this time with three points in the 6-0 win over SCSU. Nine Badgers registered a point in the win, with Knight and senior Mallory Deluce each posting multi-point games.
- With the series sweep over SCSU, the Badgers improve to 11-1-0 at the Kohl Center this season.
- Sophomore Becca Ruegsegger earned last Friday's shutout with seven saves, and freshman Alex Rigsby improved to 15-1-0 on the season, stopping 10 shots for her fourth career shutout on Sunday.
- UW's 10-goal output against St. Cloud State (Jan. 15) ranks fourth in program history; the Badgers scored a record 14 goals against Bemidji State Nov. 18, 2000. The 10-goal margin of victory over the Huskies is also the third-best by Wisconsin all-time as UW has had two 11-goal victories.
- With six goals in the first period against St. Cloud State (Jan. 14), the Badgers tied the UW record for the third-most goals scored in a single period. The Badgers have now had five six-goal periods in program history with two in 2008, one in 2005 and one in 2003.
- Duggan became just the second Badger and 13th NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey player all-time to reach 200 career points when she recorded three points on one goal and two assists against St. Cloud State (Jan. 14). Duggan's 200th point came on Wisconsin's seventh goal of the game at 7:04 of the second period. Sara Bauer is the only other Badger to reach the career milestone with 218 points from 2003-07. Duggan is currently riding a 20-game point streak, tying the longest individual point streak in UW women's hockey history. Meghan Hunter's 20-game scoring run lasted from Oct. 14, 2000 to Jan. 12, 2001.
- In addition, Brianna Decker's current 15-game point streak ranks fifth all-time. In addition to Duggan and Decker, six other Badgers are currently riding multi-game point streaks. Notably, Packer and Brooke Ammerman are riding nine-game streaks, and Knight is on an eight-game streak.

## WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
