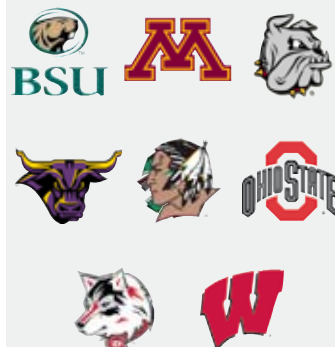

Conference Play Resumes with Three Jan. 7-8 Weekend WCHA Series as OSU Hosts UW, UM Hosts MSU, BSU Visits SCSU North Dakota Plays at Vermont in Non-Conference Set; Wisconsin Atop League Standings and Women's National Polls as Second Half Begins; Badgers Beat Mercyhurst at Easton Classic to Run Win Streak to Six; OSU Sweeps Wayne State; Five WCHA Teams Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 1, UMD No. 4, UM No. 7, UND No. 8, OSU No. 10 ... BSU Receives Votes; WCHA Teams Own 23-11-2 Non-Conference Record; Tickets Continue on Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, Set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – After a nearly four-week break from league play, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 112-game regular season schedule resumes this weekend, Friday, Jan. 7 and Saturday, Jan. 8, with three league series.

League-leading and No. 1-ranked Wisconsin (18-2-0, 12-2-0 WCHA) travels to Columbus to take on No. 10 Ohio State (10-8-2, 4-8-2-2 WCHA) at 7:07 pm ET Friday and 4:07 pm ET Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink. No. 7-ranked Minnesota (13-6-0, 8-6-0 WCHA) will play host to Minnesota State (6-11-3, 5-8-1 WCHA) at Ridder Arena at 6:07 pm CT Friday and 4:07 pm CT Saturday. And Bemidji State (8-7-3, 6-5-3-2 WCHA) visits St. Cloud State (0-18-1, 0-13-1-1 WCHA) and the National Hockey Center for a pair of 2:07 pm CT matinees.

In non-conference play, No. 8 North Dakota (9-7-2) plays at Hockey East Association-member Vermont (4-8-8) on Friday at 7:00 pm ET and Saturday at 2:00 pm ET. Through 36 non-conference games against Div. 1 opponents so far this season, WCHA-member teams are a combined 23-11-2 for a .667 winning percentage.

Idle again this week is No. 4-ranked Minnesota Duluth (12-5-1), with the Bulldogs set to resume on-ice competition on Jan. 14-15 at WCHA-rival Minnesota.

After the holiday break, first place Wisconsin has once again regained its spot as the top women's team in the country in the latest (Jan. 3) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Hockey Poll and five of the WCHA's eight teams are ranked in the top ten. In addition to the Badgers in the No. 1 slot, defending national champion Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 4, Minnesota is No. 7, North Dakota is No. 8 and Ohio State is No. 10.

The Badgers scored an impressive 7-4 victory over No. 5-ranked Mercyhurst on Sunday, Jan. 2 at the Easton Classic at St. Cloud, Minn., in a game that could have implications on seedings at NCAA tournament selection time. Hilary Knight had two goals and two assists to lead Wisconsin. Despite the importance of the game, both teams were missing players due to the MLP Cup in Switzerland – forwards Bailey Bram and Vicki Bendus for Mercyhurst, and Badger forwards Mallory Deluce and Carolyne Prévost, plus defensemen Brittany Haverstock and Stefanie McKeough – but Wisconsin extended its winning streak to six straight games.

The WCHA standings at the New Year show Wisconsin (12-2-0-0 WCHA, 18-2-0 overall) in first place with 36 points, five ahead of Minnesota Duluth (10-5-1-0 WCHA, 12-5-1 overall) and 10 better than North Dakota (8-6-2 WCHA, 9-6-1 overall). Minnesota (8-6-0 WCHA, 13-6-0 overall) is fourth with 24 points while Bemidji State (6-5-3-2 WCHA, 8-7-3 overall) in fifth with 23 points, seven better than Ohio State (4-8-2-2 WCHA, 8-8-2 overall). Minnesota State (5-8-1 WCHA, 6-11-3 overall) is in seventh place with 16 points while St. Cloud State (0-13-1-1 WCHA, 0-16-1 overall) is eighth with two points.

In other non-conference play over New Year's weekend at the Easton Classic, Mercyhurst bested St. Cloud State 8-1 on Jan. 1 and Northeastern edged the Huskies 2-1 on Jan. 2 despite 26 saves by goaltender Ashley Nixon. Also in St. Cloud, the line of Knight, Brianna Decker and Meghan Duggan accounted for four goals and nine assists to pace Wisconsin to a 7-2 win against Northeastern in the opening game of the Easton Holiday Showcase last Saturday.

In Columbus, Paige Semenza scored a goal and assisted on Tina Hollowell's game-winner as Ohio State earned a sweep of its weekend series against Wayne State with a 4-2 win on Friday, Dec. 31, at the OSU Ice Rink. Semenza also had a point in the Buckeyes' 3-2 victory over Wayne State on Dec. 30.

And in holiday exhibition play, North Dakota won two games at the inaugural Bison Hockey Holiday Classic in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play its first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for

7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (6-5-3-2 WCHA, 8-7-3 overall) travel to St. Cloud State this weekend of Jan. 7-8 to finish their 2010-11 regular season series against the Huskies. Earlier this season the Beavers picked up their only sweep of the season after defeating SCSU by scores of 3-2 and 4-0 in Bemidji over the Oct. 29-30 weekend.
- The games against St. Cloud State on Oct. 29-30 saw one of the best performances by senior forward Erin Cody as she tallied seven points, including a natural hat trick on Oct. 29. The following day Cody recorded two goals and two assists as the Beavers finished off the Huskies 4-0.
- The forward line of Erin Cody, Sadie Lundquist and Emily Erickson has scored 27 of Bemidji State's 34 goals this year and have tallied 27 of the team's 57 assists. Cody leads the three with 13 goals and 12 assists while Erickson has nine goals and eight assists. Lundquist has five goals and seven assists. The trio has accounted for 54 of the 91 total points on the season.
- Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova has 397 total saves this season. In nine games she has recorded a .934 save percentage and a 1.93 goals-against average.

- The No. 7-ranked Golden Gophers (13-6-0 overall, 8-6-0-0 WCHA), idle since concluding the first half of the 2010-11 season with a series sweep over the No. 10 Ohio State Buckeyes Dec. 10 and 12, return to action by hosting WCHA-rival Minnesota State this Friday (Jan. 7) and Saturday (Jan. 8) at Ridder Arena. The series opener is set for a 6:07 pm CT start, followed by a 4:07 pm CT start on Jan. 8 for the series conclusion.
- Heading into the holiday break, Kelly Terry led the Minnesota team in points with 22, followed by Amanda Kessel with 20, Sarah Davis with 16 and Sarah Erickson with 15.
- Sophomore goaltender Noora Raty entered the break with a 1.55 goals-against average and a .945 save percentage.
- The Gophers will be without the services of senior captain Emily West for the remainder of the season. She will undergo surgery, which will sideline her from competition this year. She will return to the Gopher lineup in 2011-12.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 4-ranked Bulldogs, idle since Dec. 11 when they closed down the historic Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center (DECC) with a WCHA series split against No. 8 North Dakota, will be back in action Jan. 14-15 when they face Minnesota at Ridder Arena for the first time since clinching the 2010 NCAA championship on the Gophers' home ice.
- UMD is 23-26-5 against Minnesota all-time, the only program in the nation the Bulldogs are sub-.500 against, although UMD has won the last six meetings between the two squads.
- Senior goaltender Kim Martin has 62 career victories – three shy of tying UMD's career wins record of 65.
- Senior blueliner Jocelyn Larocque is tied as the No. 1 scoring defenseman in UMD women's hockey history with 90 career points (15g, 75a) in 111 games after her third period goal on Dec. 10. Larocque is ranked No. 3 in the NCAA among leading-scoring blueliners, and first in the WCHA with 15 points (5g, 10a) in 16 skates.
- Junior forward Haley Irwin continues to stay on or next to the top of the NCAA scoring chart, ranking No. 2 with a 2.25 points per game average after scoring 36 points (17g, 19a) in 16 outings. Irwin is on an eight-game scoring streak that began back on Oct. 30. Over her last eight skates, Irwin has compiled nine goals and 15 assists for 24 points, and all eight games have been WCHA outings.
- Sophomore forward Pernilla Winberg is currently on a six game scoring spree (3g, 3a), while sophomore forward Jessica Wong has scored in five consecutive outings (4g, 3a).
- UMD leaves the DECC 159-33-15 all-time for a .803 winning percentage. The Bulldogs, who won two NCAA national titles, one WCHA playoff championship and two WCHA regular season titles at the DECC, will move into their new AMSOIL Arena this week. UMD will play its first game in the \$80 million rink against WCHA-rival Wisconsin on Jan. 21.

- The Mavericks (6-11-3 overall, 5-8-1-0 WCHA), idle since Dec. 11 and without a victory since Nov. 13 at Ohio State, return to action and play at league-rival Minnesota this weekend. The Mavericks have lost or tied eight straight games.
- Freshman forward Kathleen Rogan leads the Mavericks in points this season with 10-7=17. Senior forward Nina Tikkinen sits second on the team with 5-7=12, sophomore forward Lauren Smith has tallied 10 points (3g, 7a) and junior forward Moira O'Connor is next with 4-3=7. Three Mavericks have tallied six points so far this season in junior forward Emmi Leinonen (3g, 3a), sophomore forward Lauren Zrust (3g, 3a) and freshman forward Tracy McCann (3g, 3a).
- Kathleen Rogan's 10 goals is a team-best, while her, Smith and Tikkinen each own seven assists, team-bests.
- Emmi Leinonen leads the team in power-play goals with two while Tracy McCann owns a team-best two game-winning goals.
- Lauren Smith and Kathleen Rogan each own one shorthanded goal and two unassisted goals, team-bests. Tikkinen also owns one shorthanded goal.
- Lauren Smith has tallied a team-high 58 shots while Kathleen Rogan has taken 51 shots.
- Smith is also the owner of a team-best +7 plus/minus rating, Rogan and sophomore defenseman Erika Magnusson each have a +3 rating, and freshman defenseman Danielle Scholzen has a +2 rating.
- Rookie netminder Danielle Butters owns a team-best .583 winning percentage while junior goaltender Alli Altmann owns team-bests in all other goaltender categories with a 2.61 goals-against average, a .904 save percentage, 328 total saves and one shutout.

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (9-7-2 overall, 8-6-2 WCHA) open the New Year with a non-conference series at Vermont on Friday and Saturday. The Sioux hold an 6-1-1 all-time series lead against the Catamounts.
- UND will return to conference play hosting Bemidji State on Jan. 15-16. The first game will be played in Roseau, Minn., before returning to contest the series finale at the Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks on Saturday.
- Although competing with only 13 skaters, the Sioux went 2-0 at the inaugural Bison Holiday Classic on Dec. 30-31 hosted by the University of Manitoba. UND picked up a pair of 4-2 wins over Alberta and Manitoba in exhibition action.
- Alyssa Wiebe and Holly Perkins led the Sioux with one goal and one assist against Alberta. Mary Loken also provided two assists while Stephanie Ney made 18 saves on 20 shots for the win in net. The Sioux went 2-for-5 on the power-play while holding Alberta 0-for-5. On New Year's Eve, UND was outshot 26-20 but netminder Jorid Dagfinrud made 12 of her 24 saves in the first period to help the Sioux defensively. Although only gaining five shots on net in the opening frame, Allison Parizek was able to force a turnover in the Bison zone and score an unassisted goal to put the Sioux up 1-0. Loken would score the second periods lone goal and the Sioux wouldn't relinquish the lead adding a pair of goals by Kelsey Ketcher and Parizek in the third stanza.
- The Fighting Sioux concluded the first half of the season with a program-record eight conference wins and a .563 conference winning percentage. UND is third in the conference standings, also a program record at the half-way point.
- Through the first half of the 2010-11 season, the Sioux had the hardest strength of schedule with 12 of their 18 games against top-10 ranked teams. North Dakota went an impressive 6-5-1 in those games. According to USCHO.com, UND's strength of schedule was a 251.7 with Minnesota

Duluth second at 204.6.

- Sophomore forward Jocelyne Lamoureux currently ranks sixth in the nation averaging 1.07 goals per game.
- Junior forward Alyssa Wiebe is only four points shy of the program record of 78 career points as a member of the Sioux. She has 27 goals (nine shy of the program record) and 47 assists (holds the record).
- The Sioux continue to produce program record-breaking special teams numbers with a 16.3% conversion rate on the power-play and 90.7% on the penalty-kill (fifth in the nation).

Buckeyes

Ohio State University

- The No. 10 Buckeyes closed the books on a high note with a sweep of Wayne State, Dec. 30-31 at the OSU Ice Rink. The Buckeyes won 3-2 last Thursday and 4-2 last Friday in their final non-conference series of the season.
- The Buckeyes finish with a 6-0-0 mark in non-conference action, all against teams from College Hockey America – Robert Morris, Syracuse and Wayne State.
- Ohio State is 7-2-1 on home ice this season.
- The Buckeyes were without junior forwards and assistant captains Natalie Spooner and Laura McIntosh for the second game of the WSU series as they traveled to Switzerland to compete with the Canadian Under-22 National Team at the MLP Cup, Jan. 4-8. Ohio State also was without freshman defenseman Annie Svedin, who will be competing in the international tournament with the Swedish National Team. This was the first meeting between the Buckeyes and Warriors since 2001 (OSU leads 4-0-0).
- Natalie Spooner opened the second half of the season with three points to factor into all of the OSU goals in a 3-2 victory over Wayne State to open the series. She set up the first one scored by Paige Semenza and scoring the next two, including the game-winner with 5:00 minutes left. Along with Spooner, Melissa Feste, Tina Hollowell and Minttu Tuominen each had assists in the first game. Spooner now has 98 career points, tying her for eighth in the Ohio State records. She also tied the Buckeye record for career game-winning goals with 10, matching the mark set by Jeni Creary and Jennifer Desson (both 2002-05). It was Spooner's sixth game of the year with multiple goals and her 10th multi-point performance.
- In the second game vs Wayne State, the teams headed into final period tied at 1-1, but Ohio State scored three goals in the third, including an empty-netter, to pull away for the win. Semenza had a season-high two points and her linemates Tina Hollowell and Kim Theut also had a goal and assist, respectively. Jenna Kilpatrick assisted on the opening goal Friday for her first point of the season. Hokey Langan scored the empty-netter and moved into eighth in the Ohio State career goals category with 36, tying with Morgan Marziali (2006-09).
- Up next, Ohio State stays in Columbus for its first set of back-to-back home series this season. The Buckeyes take on No. 1-ranked Wisconsin in a WCHA series Jan. 7-8 at the OSU Ice Rink. Games begin at 7 p.m. Friday and 4 p.m. Saturday. The Buckeyes dropped both games earlier this season in Madison, falling 6-5 in overtime and 5-2 Oct. 22-23 at the Kohl Center. Langan and McIntosh led Ohio State with four points (1g, 3a) apiece. Spooner had three goals while Hollowell and Theut also lit the lamp. Rookie goalie Lisa Steffes made 87 saves in the two games.

St. Cloud State University

- Huskies (0-18-1 overall, 0-13-1-1 WCHA) entertained three nationally-ranked opponents in league rival #2 Wisconsin, #4/5 Mercyhurst College and #10 Northeastern during the 2011 Easton Holiday Showcase on Saturday and Sunday, Jan. 1-2, at the National Hockey Center.
- Last Saturday, #2 Wisconsin blew by #10 Northeastern by a score of 7-2. The following game, #4/5 Mercyhurst cruised past the host team, St. Cloud State, by a score of 8-1.
- The second day of the Showcase featured a face-off between #2 Wisconsin and #4/5 Mercyhurst. The game proved to be a thrilling match as the Badgers were able to pull away in the end, garnering a 7-4 non-conference victory over the Lakers. St. Cloud State completed the 2011 Showcase with a heart-breaking 2-1 loss to #10 Northeastern. St. Cloud State arguably played its best game of the season, out-shooting the NU Huskies 40-28 and holding them to just 1-of-4 on the power-play. Rookie forward Molli Mott scored the lone goal of the contest for SCSU while senior netminder Ashley Nixon backstopped the Huskies with 39 saves in net. UW posted a 6-5 overtime win and a 5-2 victory at the Kohl Center Oct. 22-23, 2010. The teams are 4-4 in the last eight meetings, and Wisconsin picked up a 3-2 win in its last game in Columbus, Ohio, Jan. 30, 2010.
- The Badgers picked up a pair of victories over No. 10 Northeastern and No. 4/5 Mercyhurst at the Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Minn., last weekend. Wisconsin skated past Northeastern, 7-2, before securing a 7-4 win over the Lakers. Hilary Knight led UW with eight points on the weekend, and Meghan Duggan picked up seven points on one goal and six assists. In last Friday's game, Duggan tallied five assists, and Brianna Decker and Knight each recorded four points. The Badgers scored three goals in the third period to break open a 4-2 game and earn the 7-2 win over Northeastern. Becca Ruegsegger made a season-high 26 saves and improved to 6-1-0 on the year in net for Wisconsin. Last Saturday saw another big third period from the Badgers as UW scored four third period goals en route to a 7-4 victory over Mercyhurst. The teams were locked at 3-3 after two periods, but Wisconsin took a 5-3 lead midway through the third. - Seven Badgers are currently riding point-scoring streaks, including three career-best marks. UW swept then-No. 10 Ohio State (Oct. 22-23) and then-No. 8 North Dakota (Dec. 4-5) and split two series with then-No. 8 Minnesota (Nov. 5-6) and then-No. 4 Minnesota Duluth (Nov. 26-28). UW was 4-3-1 against ranked opponents in 2009-10

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
